3. Terms agreed upon—

(1) The construction of the following item of the necessary work, namely, a right bank spill at level 98.00 up to the estimated cost of Rs. 400 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following item of work free of all charges, namely, raising of bund to level 101.00—550 cubes at 13 cubes per annum per amunam of paddy sowing extent. All such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

2. Extent and nature of lands irrigable under the scheme :—

Private lands under cultivation .. 6 acres approximately

Crown lands under cultivation .. —

Crown lands not under cultivation .. 44 acres approximately

3. Terms agreed upon—

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, construction of a 125 feet masonry spill together with excavation for approach and tail channels up to the estimated cost of Rs. 1,150 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following item of work free of all charges, namely, 365 cubes earthwork in closing the present left and right bank spills by extending the bund to high ground (the work to be completed in 3 years). All such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommittable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.

RULES under section 11 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the Pulmoddai Irrigation District in the Trincomalee District of the Eastern Province, at a meeting duly held on May 13, 1933, and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 19 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

Rules.

1. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “Vaddai” means a tract or a series of tracts of fields;
- “Vaddai Vidanai” means the Irrigation Headman for any tract or area, elected or appointed under sections 20 and 21 of the Ordinance;
- “Irrigation Superintendent” means the officer seconded from service in the Irrigation Department to superintend the maintenance of major irrigation works and the construction and maintenance of minor irrigation works under the supervision of the Assistant Government Agent;
- “Cultivation Officer” means the officer appointed by the Assistant Government Agent to supervise cultivation in all irrigable lands, and may or may not be identical with the Irrigation Superintendent.

PART I.

2. It shall be the duty of a Vaddai Vidanai—

- (a) to reside during the cultivation season within 3 miles of his Vaddai, and in the event of his absenting himself during such season or at any time when his services are required, to make special arrangements for the discharge of his duties to the satisfaction of the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer;
- (b) to supervise all paddy cultivation within his Vaddai under the control, and in accordance with the instructions of, the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer;
- (c) to prepare lists of proprietors and others liable to perform labour, give notice of proposed works, call out labour, apportion work among those liable or attending to perform labour, and to report defaulters to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer;
- (d) to apportion the water from the irrigation works, when it reaches the Vaddai, to the various fields therein; and
- (e) to enforce these rules within his Vaddai and to give information of any breach thereof to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer.

3. No Vaddai Vidanai during his term of office shall hold any other appointment without the sanction of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No Vaddai Vidanai shall hold office for a longer period than three years from the date of his election or appointment, but nothing in this rule shall be deemed to prohibit the re-election or re-appointment of any such officer, if he is otherwise eligible, for further periods of the like duration.

5. The remuneration payable to Vaddai Vidanais shall be at the rates set out below for each acre of land for which dappu has been furnished: Provided, however, that the Cultivation Officer may exempt from payment any land which has remained uncultivated after the furnishing of dappu.

Rates.

In the Police Vidanai's division of Pulmoddai— $2\frac{1}{2}$ measures per acre.

In the Police Vidanai's division of Tennamarawadi and Amarivaya— $2\frac{1}{2}$ measures per acre.

6. Where any Vaddai Vidanai has failed for any reason to attend to his duties, or where the duties have not been performed satisfactorily, the Assistant Government Agent may appoint any person to collect the remuneration payable to such officer and order it to be paid instead to any person who has acted for such Vaddai Vidanai or into the Irrigation Fine Fund and devote any portion of it to meet the cost of collection.

7. Where no order under rule 6 has been made by the Assistant Government Agent, every proprietor shall hand over the remuneration due to the Vaddai Vidanai, or its equivalent in money at the current market rates, within four months of the close of the harvest, and obtain a formal receipt in acknowledgment thereof.

8. (1) As the season for cultivation approaches, whether it be munmari, kala vellamai, pinmari, or other harvest, a meeting of the proprietors of lands concerned shall be convened and presided over by the Assistant Government Agent or some person deputed in writing by the Assistant Government Agent for the purpose.

(2) Of the time and place fixed for the meeting by the Assistant Government Agent or person deputed by him as aforesaid, at least seven days' notice shall be given in such manner as shall appear to him best adapted for giving publicity thereto.

9. The meeting convened under rule 8 shall determine—

- (a) the most suitable dates for the commencement and completion of sowing and irrigation and the clearing of channels;
- (b) the most suitable dates for furnishing dappu;
- (c) the most suitable dates for the completion of fencing and erection of watch huts;
- (d) the extent to be cultivated;
- (e) the last date for issue of water;
- (f) the order in which the different Vaddais shall be sown;
- (g) the method of cultivation;
- (h) the kind of paddy to be sown in each Vaddai;
- (i) the place and manner in which black cattle and buffaloes are to be confined during cultivation; and
- (j) the exemption from cultivation duties to be allowed on applications from proprietors.

10. (1) If for any reason it is not possible to commence cultivation on the date determined under rule 9, or if the supply of water is likely to be insufficient to irrigate the whole area decided on originally, a further date, or the proportion of the tracts to be abandoned, shall be determined at a meeting of the proprietors duly convened for the purpose: Provided that, if after due notice, no proprietors attend, or if the meeting so convened is not able to arrive at a unanimous decision as regards the area to be abandoned, the Assistant Government Agent or such officer as may be deputed by him in writing shall have power to determine the area that is to be abandoned.

(2) Each of the proprietors of the area which it was originally decided to irrigate, shall have a right to cultivate a proportionate share of the reduced area.

11. The Assistant Government Agent or officer deputed by him shall cause the decision of a meeting under rule 9 or rule 10 to be published by beat of tom-tom or by fixing written notices in conspicuous places or by other suitable means. All proprietors shall be bound by the decisions of the meeting.

12. (1) Each proprietor shall deliver to the Vaddai Vidanai not later than the day fixed therefor under rule 9 a list (dappu) of the mullaikkaran and cultivators to be employed in his field.

(2) The list shall be substantially in the form set out in the schedule to these rules, and shall be furnished on the printed forms supplied by the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer, and shall bear the signatures of the proprietor and of the mullaikkaran and cultivators of their marks made before two witnesses.

(3) All the information required by this form shall be accurately filled in, and any person supplying false information shall be guilty of an offence.

(4) From the date of the delivery of the list, the mullaikkaran and cultivators, as well as the proprietors, shall be liable for all works of cultivation, and in the event of neglect or default without sufficient reason, shall be guilty of an offence.

13. In the absence of a legal document showing that another person has been duly placed and is in actual possession of the land, the dappu shall be accepted, in every case from the person who furnished the dappu for the preceding harvest.

14. (1) In the event of any proprietor deciding not to cultivate his land for any season and giving his written consent to its being cultivated by any other proprietor or other applicant, the Vaddai Vidanai shall forthwith send information of the fact to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer.

(2) On receipt of such information the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer may in his discretion either—

(a) exclude the land from the tract to be irrigated, and allow it to remain uncultivated for that season, subject to the condition that the proprietor whose land is so excluded continues to be liable to erect his share of the fence, or

(b) permit the land to be cultivated by the other proprietor nominated by the proprietor or by any other proprietor owning lands in that tract, or failing any such proprietor, by any other applicant found to possess the necessary knowledge and experience of paddy cultivation.

(3) No rent or share of produce or other dues shall be payable to the proprietor of the land by any other proprietor or applicant so permitted to cultivate it; but every such other proprietor or applicant shall be liable to perform all irrigation duties and comply with all the requirements of these rules in the same manner as if he were the actual proprietor of that land.

(4) Any proprietor deciding not to cultivate his land and withholding his consent to the land being cultivated by any other proprietor or applicant, shall continue to be liable to perform all irrigation duties and comply with the requirements of these rules.

(5) Where any land remains uncultivated and the whereabouts of the proprietor cannot be ascertained, the Assistant Government Agent may dispense with his consent for the purposes of this rule, and permit the land to be cultivated by any other proprietor or applicant; but the proprietor thereof shall not in that event be entitled to claim any rent or share of the produce or damages from the proprietor or applicant so cultivating it.

15. (1) Every proprietor shall be liable to contribute labour and perform the duties required by these rules for the season's cultivation, unless exempted at the meeting under rule 9.

(2) In the event of any proprietor failing to perform any work, the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer may cause the work to be done; and the actual cost thereof may be recovered in the manner prescribed by section 23 of the Ordinance.

16. All tanks, dams, channels, water-courses, and the like, which are not in charge of the Director of Irrigation, shall be kept in a proper state of repair, and all fields shall be levelled and field-ridges constructed, to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent, by the proprietors in proportion to their respective holdings.

17. Every proprietor shall remove all trees or jungle on his land likely to occasion damage by giving cover to birds or wild animals.

18. (1) All paths between cultivated fields shall be kept open by the proprietors of such fields, according to the limits prescribed by ancient custom, and in proportion to their respective shares.

(2) Inspection-paths through cultivated fields shall also be constructed and maintained by the proprietors, if required by the Assistant Government Agent.

19. (1) When water from the irrigation work has reached any tract, the Vaddai Vidanai thereof may, subject to the control of the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer, cut or close any dam or channel, not in charge of the Director of Irrigation, which impedes the distribution of water to the fields in such tract.

(2) It shall not be lawful for the Vaddai Vidanai at any other time to interfere with any dam or channel outside his Vaddai.

20. (1) No proprietor shall wilfully prevent water from flowing to the field below, or obstruct the flow of surplus water from the field above or in any other way interfere with the general distribution of the water within the Vaddais, or present any obstruction to the customary drainage of a field or tract.

(2) In the event of any person so doing, the Vaddai Vidanai shall proceed to the spot with witnesses and open the gaps or remove the obstruction himself.

21. No person shall issue, apportion, cut off, divert, or use, the water in any manner except in accordance with the instructions of the Vaddai Vidanai.

22. (1) The fence round the whole Vaddai shall be measured by the Vaddai Vidanai, within three days of the completion of the sowing, and the work of constructing the fence shall be apportioned among the several proprietors of the Vaddai in proportion to their holdings, irrespective of the actual position of their fields in relation to the fence.

(2) The Vaddai Vidanai shall forthwith after such apportionment send a list to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer showing the length of fence apportioned to each proprietor.

(3) If fresh sticks are required, the Vaddai Vidanai shall communicate with the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer as early as possible, and obtain through him the necessary free licence to have them cut.

23. The proprietors shall finish the construction of the fence and the necessary watch huts within the time fixed at the meeting under rule 9 and keep both fence and watch huts in repair throughout the season.

24. (1) Every proprietor shall keep regular watch in accordance with the orders of the Vaddai Vidanai.

(2) No person shall be employed as watcher who is under the age of 16 years or suffers from any physical disability.

25. (1) Any proprietor may reap the crop on his fields as soon as it reaches maturity, but such crop shall not be threshed or removed from the tract without the permission of the Vaddai Vidanai.

(2) Every such proprietor shall continue to keep watch over the fields, and to maintain the fence, until the crop on the rest of the tract has been reaped and stored: Provided, however, that no proprietor shall be bound to keep watch or to maintain the fence until the ripening of the crop on any portion which was not sown at the time or with the description of paddy determined under rules 9 and 10.

26. (1) After the reaping is over the Vaddai Vidanai shall order the removal of the fence, and shall cause the fence sticks to be heaped by the cultivators in such places as he may direct.

(2) Proprietors may, with the consent of the Vaddai Vidanai, remove the fence sticks from the fields; but in every such case they shall furnish the Vaddai Vidanai with a receipt for the number taken, and return them to the land for the following harvest, whether they cultivate their fields or not, or shall be liable for the assessed value of the sticks so removed.

27. No paddy shall be removed from the fields at the termination of the harvest until the wages due to all persons engaged in the harvest and the hire of cattle and other cultivation charges have been paid, and in the case of a field cultivated for share until the landlord's dues have been paid: Provided, however, that in any case where there is a serious risk of damage to any paddy left on the threshing-floor, the proprietor may remove it after taking such steps as are approved by the Vaddai Vidanai for safeguarding the claims of the other parties concerned.

28. (1) All field-channels and water-courses which are not in charge of the Director of Irrigation shall be in charge of the Vaddai Vidanai acting under the instructions of the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer.

(2) No person shall fill up, or encroach upon, such channels or water-courses or any of their reservations.

(3) No paddy shall be sown in any irrigation or other channel.

29. (1) Any channel, dam, or other work required, whether outside or inside any field, shall be constructed by the proprietors interested in proportion to their holdings.

(2) Where a scheme is in charge of the Director of Irrigation, all applications for permission to construct such works shall be made in writing to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer.

(3) Every proprietor of new lands which have been surveyed and demarcated by land marks with reservations for field-channels, shall construct his proportion of the field-channel intended to irrigate the group of lots in which his holding is situated, in accordance with alignments approved by the Irrigation Officer.

(4) If any proprietor of such lands is unable to obtain water for irrigation owing to the neglect of any other proprietors to cut their shares of the field-channels, such other proprietors shall be called upon by the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer to do the necessary work.

30. (1) Every proprietor shall grant way leave for field-channels, dams, or other works approved by the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer, even though his own land may not be benefited thereby.

(2) All proprietors whose lands are benefited by any such work shall be liable under this rule to pay to the owners of lands, which suffer damage by the construction of the work, compensation for any land taken, or damage done, in proportion to the area of the holdings benefited and according to such rates as may be determined by the Assistant Government Agent.

31. (1) No person shall in any way alter or injure any ridge or boundary between two fields in the same tract.

(2) On receipt of any information that such alteration or injury has been effected, the Vaddai Vidanai shall, after due notice to the owners, proceed to the spot with witnesses, and call upon the owners to restore the boundary to its original state; and in the event of their failing to do so within three days thereafter, the Vaddai Vidanai shall report the matter to the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer.

32. Whenever any new land is declared irrigable, and included in the specification of lands irrigable under any tank or work, the proprietor of such land shall—

- (a) be entitled to water from any part of the existing field-channels without payment of compensation to the proprietors by whom such channels were constructed;
- (b) be entitled to all the rights and privileges enjoyed by the proprietors of the lands already irrigated under the tank or work; and
- (c) be liable to perform all the duties imposed on proprietors by these rules.

33. Every proprietor shall, when required by the Assistant Government Agent, Irrigation Superintendent, or Cultivation Officer, erect bunds or other suitable marks to define the boundaries of his fields.

34. Any proprietor who takes water out of his turn or for a longer period than he is entitled to, or who after having had his full share allows the water to run to waste through negligence, or who misappropriates his neighbour's water through the boundary ridges, shall forfeit the right to his share in the turn next following, and shall be guilty of an offence punishable under Chapter V. of the Ordinance.

35. The customary right of way for taking cattle and agricultural implements, and for transporting fence sticks, paddy, and for other agricultural purposes, shall be allowed to all proprietors under any irrigation work.

36. During the cultivation season it shall be lawful for the Vaddai Vidanai to seize all cattle found on any tank bund or bank of an irrigation channel in his Vaddai, or straying near the fields and likely to endanger the crops, and to hand over such cattle to the local Police Headman to be produced before the Village Tribunal.

37. (1) Every proprietor who employs cultivators, shall keep a book and enter therein all advances of paddy or money paid to his cultivators under the dates upon which such advances are made.

(2) He shall go through the accounts with his cultivators at least three times, namely—

- (a) immediately after the sowing has been completed,
- (b) immediately after the harvest, and
- (c) after the threshing;

and shall take their signatures or thumb marks to the accounts in the books, if these are admitted by them to be correct.

PART II.

Special rules relating to the maintenance of irrigation works within the Pulmoddai Irrigation District which are in charge of the Assistant Government Agent and for which no irrigation rate is recovered :—

1. (1) In distributing water from the tank to the fields in a tract, the water shall first be taken to the fields on the higher level and thence to those on the lower level.

(2) No person shall in any way interfere to the prejudice of others with the distribution of water.

2. No person other than the proprietor of any land under the tank shall be entitled to the use of water from the tank for agricultural purposes.

3. It shall not be lawful for any person to issue the water of the tank for the cultivation of any land under any other tank, or for the shareholders of lands cultivated under the tank to utilize for their cultivation the water of any other tank, without first obtaining the sanction of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall cut the bund, or do any act likely to damage the bund, or block up the spill of the tank, without the permission of the Assistant Government Agent or Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent, or carry out any work upon the bund, spill, or channels contrary to the orders of any of these officers: Provided that in any case where such action is necessary to prevent otherwise inevitable damage to the tank, and it is impossible to communicate with any of the above-mentioned officers in time, permission may be dispensed with, but the burden of proving such special circumstances shall lie upon the persons taking such action.

5. No fence shall be put on any part of the tank bund without the authority of the Assistant Government Agent or Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent.

6. For the repair or improvement of the tank and the dams, minor channels, or water-courses, and for such other minor works as the Assistant Government Agent may consider necessary, each proprietor shall be liable to contribute labour in proportion to the extent of his land which is to be benefited by the work in question.

7. The bund spill and sluice of the tank shall be divided among the proprietors of the lands under it in proportion to the extent of land owned by each proprietor, and each proprietor shall keep the portion assigned to him properly turfed and free at all times from jungle, brushwood, and overgrowth of every description, and from white ants' nests.

8. (1) The full amount of labour which each proprietor shall be liable under rule 6 to contribute shall not exceed—

- (i.) 2 cubes of earthwork per acre, or
- (ii.) 4 days' labour per acre, or
- (iii.) a money payment in commutation of such labour, at such rate per acre, in accordance with the rate prevailing in the district at the time, as may be specified by notice in that behalf each year.

(2) A day's labour shall for purposes of this rule be taken to mean a day of six hours at any time between sunrise and sunset.

9. In addition to the ordinary work of the year as above provided for, whenever the Assistant Government Agent, or any person authorized by him to supervise the work, gives notice of the need of labour for any urgent work of repair or of prevention of impending damage, every proprietor shall at once contribute the necessary labour or cause his share of the work to be done at his own expense: Provided that double the ordinary amount of labour prescribed under rule 8 shall not be exceeded in any year under this rule.

10. No person other than the Irrigation Superintendent or Chief Headman, or a person duly authorized by either of these officers in that behalf, shall in any way interfere with, or alter the level of, the spill or sluice of the tank.

11. The tank bed shall not be cultivated, unless the majority of the proprietors under the tank decide to cultivate the bed, and the permission of the Assistant Government Agent is obtained.

12. If any proprietor fails to perform his share of any work required under these rules, the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer may cause the work to be done and the cost thereof may be recovered in the manner prescribed by section 23 of the Ordinance.

The rules published in *Gazette* No. 7,478 of August 14, 1925, so far as they relate to the Pulmoddai Irrigation District of the Trincomalee District are hereby repealed.

1B. 1C. Whenever the Supervisor or Inspector of the Board is satisfied that any aerated water, either manufactured within the limits of the Board or introduced into such limits from outside, is of such bad quality as to be unfit for human consumption, he may seize it and produce it before the Medical Officer or Police Magistrate or President of the Village Tribunal; and if it appears to such Medical Officer or Police Magistrate or President that such water is unfit for human consumption, he may order the same to be destroyed. Any person manufacturing any aerated water which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the court to be unfit for human consumption shall be guilty of an offence."

(2) by the insertion immediately after regulation 18, of the following new regulations:—

"19. Except in the stalls, spaces, or portions set apart for the sale of fish or of meat in any public market in which the sale of such articles is allowed, no person shall keep, expose for sale, or sell fish or meat of any description at such market, and all such stalls, spaces, or portions shall be used exclusively for the keeping, exposing, or selling of such fish or meat respectively.

20. The Board may mark off in each public market such spaces or stalls as may seem to it necessary.

21. The Board may, through the Chairman, lease the stalls of a public market on lease bonds for any period not exceeding 12 months.

22. No person shall take any cattle, sheep, goats, swine, or other animals into any part of a public market, other than such space as may be set apart therefor.

23. No person shall throw offal, dirt, filth or rubbish, or commit nuisance by easing himself, on the premises or in any building, hut, or shed forming part of or belonging to any public market, or on the high roads bordering the same.

24. No person shall kill any animal or flay or disembowel any carcase within the limits of any public market or on the high roads bordering the same."

(1) by the deletion of regulation 1 and the substitution of the following regulations therefor:—

"1. Whenever a public market shall have been established by the Board for any town, no person shall hold a private market within the limits of such town without a licence from the Board.

1A(i). General Meeting.

Wednesday, June 10, 1936, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m. pursuant to notice dated June 1, 1936.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of May 13, 1936, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah asked the following questions which the Chairman answered :—

(1) *Q.*—Will the Chairman ascertain from the Government how long it will be before a “Food and Drug Act” takes a concrete form? Will the Chairman also point out that for about fifteen years this Council has been agitating for this desirable Ordinance and that speedy measures should be adopted to bring this measure into the Statute Book?

A.—The Government will be addressed as suggested.

(2) *Q.*—Will the Chairman be good enough to prepare the list of voters for the next election street by street in each ward (instead of in alphabetical order) as this arrangement which has been the practice in the past for all Municipal Lists will greatly help the candidates of the different wards, and there is nothing contrary to this arrangement in Ordinance No. 60 of 1935?

A.—The list will be prepared street by street as in the past.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee.—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of May 23, 1936, were considered.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer dated April 22, 1936, regarding water mains in private streets stating that Council on March 6, 1935, resolved that further recoveries on account of laying water main in Boswell road, Wellawatta (a pre-1915 street), be waived as this road should be considered a public street from the date of its being taken over by the Council for construction and maintenance and in view of the above precedent being created recommending that out of the sum of Rs. 17,571·96 outstanding on account of water mains in pre-1915 streets taken over by Council during the period 1928-1935, the sum of Rs. 5,071·75 recovered from the property owners subsequent to the taking over of those streets be refunded to them and the balance of Rs. 12,500·21 be waived and that a sum of Rs. 160·14 outstanding on account of water main laid in 42nd Lane, Wellawatta (a post-1915 street), be waived as it is now irrecoverable in view of the reasons given by him. Registered No. 683.—Recommended (1) that all outstanding amounts due on account of water mains laid in pre-1915 streets taken over by the Council be waived. (2) That all recoveries made on account of water mains in pre-1915 streets after such streets have been taken over by the Council be refunded. (3) That parties who have advanced money in excess of their proportion of the cost of the laying of water mains in private streets are not entitled to a refund from other parties who obtained water service after such streets had been taken over by the Council. (4) That the sum of Rs. 5,071·75 be refunded to the property owners concerned, and that the balance of Rs. 12,500·21 on account of water mains in streets that have been taken over by the Council be waived and that the sum of Rs. 160·14 outstanding on account of water main, 42nd Lane, Wellawatta, be waived as irrecoverable.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(6) To consider a memorandum of the Medical Officer of Health dated April 21, 1936, recommending that By-law 55 of Chapter VIII. of Municipal Council By-laws be amended by the addition of the following words :—“or any other piece of water declared by the Chairman as polluted by refuse or sewage.” Registered No. 676.—Recommended that By-law 55 of Chapter VIII. of Municipal Council By-laws be amended by the addition of the following words :—“Or in any other piece of water declared by the Chairman as polluted by refuse or sewage during such period as may be named by him.”

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of May 25, 1936, were considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(18) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer dated March 25, 1936, stating that the contracts for dry and fresh milk terminate on April 10, 1936, and May 14, 1936, respectively, and therefore requesting a decision whether tenders may be called for dried and for fresh milk as only a trial was made with fresh milk at two Centres for one year as decided by Council on December 5, 1934. Registered No. 546.—Recommended that tenders be invited for the supply of dried milk at all the Child Welfare Centres.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha inquired as to why the Committee had abandoned the past policy of inviting tenders for dried milk for some Centres and fresh milk for others, which enabled the Council to encourage, to some extent, the dairy industry.

The Chairman explained the reasons which prompted the Committee to make that recommendation.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha had no objection to the recommendation, in the present instance, but desired that papers should be circulated to Members of Council with a view to making further investigations.

It was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(19) To consider :—(a) A memorandum of the Medical Officer of Health dated April 10, 1936, regarding the Colombo milk supply. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon. Registered No. 480.—Recommended that a Committee consisting of :—Dr. C. V. Aserappa, Chief Medical Officer of Health (Chairman) and Dr. R. J. Little, Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, and subject to their consenting to serve—Dr. D. C. de Fonseka, Medical Officer of Health, Urban Areas of the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services. Mr. Alexander Bruce, Public Analyst, be appointed to investigate the whole question of milk supply of Colombo.

Resolved that terms of reference of the Committee be circulated for approval.

(43) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 352·36 to Karuppie, widow of the late Karuppan, B. T. 281, of the Public Health Department, who died on October 27, 1935. The gratuity is based on his service of 215 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 29·50. *Note.*—This labourer's service had been interrupted by breaks but they can be condoned under second proviso to Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 839.—Recommended.

(44) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 278·18 to Sankaran, B. T. 694, of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who was condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 128 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 39·12. *Note.*—This labourer's service had been interrupted by breaks, but they can be condoned under second proviso to Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 837.—Recommended.

(45) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 276·84 to Mama, B. T. 1,730/3,608, of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who was condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 182 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 27·38. *Note.*—This labourer's service had been interrupted by breaks, but they can be condoned under second proviso to Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 860.—Recommended.

Commuted gratuity already paid, Rs. 1,517·75; commuted gratuity now payable, Rs. 1,560; difference payable, Rs. 42·25; reduced pension paid per annum, Rs. 455·32; reduced pension now payable per annum, Rs. 468; difference payable, Rs. 12·68. *Note.*—A break in service from September, 1898, to January, 1899, may be condoned. The sanction of Council as well as that of His Excellency the Governor is necessary for payment of the above enhanced gratuity and pension as from December 10, 1932.—Registered No. 871.

(47) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer dated May 28, 1936, stating that Council on September 5, 1934, sanctioned the payment of a pension of Rs. 5,545·83 per annum under Rule 18 (1) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules to Mr. P. H. Lanaway, retired Superintendent, Fire Brigade, Colombo Municipality, with effect from December 17, 1931, and in view of the service of 4 years and 107 days of Mr. Lanaway in the London Fire Brigade and the Controller of Establishment's recent ruling, Mr. Lanaway's pension should be computed as if the whole of his service had been under the Colombo Municipality and, therefore, the pension which may be paid to Mr. Lanaway is Rs. 5,715 per annum calculated as follows:—

(3) To consider the applications received for the post of Assistant City Microbiologist, Public Health Department. Registered No. 751.—Recommended that Dr. S. Tyagaraja, M.A. (Cantab), L.R.C.P. (London), M.R.C.S. (England), M.B. Bch., M.D. (Cantab) be appointed to the post.

(4) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated May 15, 1936, regarding the proposed Central Market suggesting that the Council should proceed with the design of the market. Registered No. 698.—Recommended that Messrs. Edwards, Reid and Booth be requested to state their terms for the preparation of alternative sketch designs for the approval of the Council, and for the supervision of the work if entrusted to them as architects. Also decided that the Hon. the Minister for Communication and Works be informed that the Council emphatically protests against any further delay in handing over the site and that his attention be drawn to the present condition of the Edinburgh Market and the serious delay that has already taken place in the carrying out of the pledge given to the Council by the Government.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(7) To consider the question of filling the vacancy of Grade II. Engineer, Municipal Engineer's Department, caused by the transfer of Mr. C. M. Jennings as Assistant Engineer, Waterworks Department. Registered No. 705.—Recommended that Mr. Stanley Mack be promoted to Grade II. to fill the vacancy caused by the transfer of Mr. C. M. Jennings. The Chairman dissented.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

The Chairman moved that Mr. R. Kumaranayagam be given the promotion instead of Mr. Stanley Mack in view of the fact that Mr. Kumaranayagam possessed the qualifications prescribed by the Council for promotion to Grade II. and that Mr. Mack did not. Lieut.-Colonel J. H. Stafford inquired whether Mr. Stanley Mack counted longer service than Mr. Kumaranayagam. The Chairman replied in the affirmative. Lieut.-Colonel J. H. Stafford seconded the motion.

Mr. Aelian W. Pereira inquired whether Mr. Stanley Mack would have to work under Mr. Kumaranayagam. The Chairman stated that he did not think that would be the case.

The Hon. Mr. F. J. Soertsz enquired whether there was any hard and fast rule regarding these promotions. The Chairman replied in the negative.

The Chairman's motion was put to the meeting and carried.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on May 23, 1936, at 9 a.m., pursuant to notice dated May 18, 1936.**

Present :—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. Kahaduwa; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; and Mr. G. Ross Bell.

1. Before proceeding with the business on the agenda the Chairman extended a welcome to Mr. G. Ross Bell who had been nominated by His Excellency the Governor to a seat in the Council in place of Mr. D. I. Durham who had resigned. Mr. J. E. Perera also spoke a few words welcoming the new member. Mr. Ross Bell in reply thanked the Chairman and Mr. Perera for their kind words.

2. The Minutes of the Meeting held on April 25, 1936, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

3. Three petitions were presented, one each by Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya, W. Dahanayaka, and A. I. H. A. Wahab. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

4. The following questions stood in the name of Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab:—(1) What is the total population of the town? (2) Is it a fact that there has been a steady decrease in the town's population during the last 5 years? (3) What is the total number of deaths registered in the town for each of the last 5 years? (4) What are the principal causes of deaths? (5) How many cases of phthisis, enteric fever, continued fever, dysentery, pneumonia, and other lung diseases have been registered within the Municipal limits during each of the last three years? (6) How many deaths have been registered from the diseases mentioned above during each of the last three years? (7) What is the maternal mortality rate of the town per 1,000 births for each of the last three years? (8) What is the infant mortality rate of the town per 1,000 births for each of the last three years? (9) How many infants under one year have died of convulsions, debility, prematurity, bronchitis, and pneumonia during each of the last three years? (10) What are the causes of the town's high infant and maternal mortality rates? (11) How many persons have died of influenza, malaria, and malarial cachexia, tetanus, ancylostomiasis, and diseases of intestinal parasites other than hookworm during each of the last three years?

The Chairman's reply was as follows:—All the information required will be found fully set out in the report of the Medical Officer of Health for the year 1935, copies of which are now being circulated to the members.

5. To consider letter No. J56/34 of April 30, 1936, from the Deputy Chief Secretary on the question of payment for the services of the Chairman:—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item, Mr. W. Dahanayaka alone being opposed to the matter being discussed in Committee.

Council in Committee:—

After a full discussion in Committee, Mr. J. E. Perera moved the following resolution:—Whilst appreciating the services of the Chairman and thanking Government for the same, this Council regrets that, in the present state of its finances, it is not prepared to pay the sum of Rs. 6,000 per annum as suggested. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded.—Carried by 11 votes to 1, Mr. A. C. Mohammedo alone dissenting.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above resolution of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

6. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayaka:—(1) This Council respectfully requests His Excellency the Governor to appoint an Assistant Chairman from among the elected members of the Council, and begs to submit the name of Mr. J. E. Perera, the senior member, as the best fitted for this post.

The Chairman ruled the motion out of order on the ground that it is contrary to the provisions of the Ordinance for any member of the Council to be appointed an Assistant Chairman.

7. To submit letter No. B 901 of May 4, 1936, from the Commissioner of Local Government on the question of Municipal Reforms.—Submitted.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) That the next elections of this Council due in December, 1938, be held under the reformed Municipal Constitution. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded. Messrs. F. Magdon Ismail and A. C. Mohammedo were opposed to the motion in the form in which it was worded. After the Chairman had expressed his views on the matter, Mr. J. E. Perera suggested that the motion be amended to read as follows:—“It is the opinion

of this Council that its next elections due in December, 1938, should be held under a reformed Municipal Constitution." The mover agreed, and, with the permission of Council, moved the motion in the form suggested. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded, and Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya supported the motion, which was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(2) That a Special Committee of this Council be appointed to submit an early report on the amendments required in Ordinance No. 60 of 1935, to make it applicable to the Galle Municipal Council. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried unanimously.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider the personnel of the Special Committee.

Council in Committee :—

Council in Committee recommended that the Special Committee do consist of the Chairman and all the members, with the Chairman as convener and five members to form a quorum.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendation of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

9. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. J. E. Perera :—That the esplanade filling be done according to the levels in the scheme prepared and submitted to the Council.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee in order that the Municipal Engineer might be questioned on the matter. After this had been done, Council resumed, and the mover then, with the permission of Council, withdrew the motion on the assurance given by the Municipal Engineer that the filling had not yet been completed and that it was being done in accordance with the levels in the scheme prepared and submitted to the Council.

10. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved :—That the Municipal Engineer be asked to submit a report on ways and means of making sea-bathing at Galle safer and more attractive than it is at present. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

11. Pursuant to notice, Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved :—(1) That the Municipal Engineer be directed to report as to what repairs and improvements are necessary for the sea-bathing place for men by the Ramparts. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.—Carried.

(2) That the Municipal Engineer be directed to report on the possibility of converting the plot of ground opposite the Flag Staff into a playground. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded.—Carried.

12. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab moved :—This Council requests the Ministry of Health to open a dispensary at Talapitiya in Galle. Mr. A. Kahaduwa seconded, and Messrs. W. Dahanayaka, J. E. Perera, F. Magdon Ismail, and E. M. Karunaratna supported the motion, which was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

13. Considered the question of recovering the costs due to the Council in D. C., Galle, case No. 33,425 :—Resolved, in view of the report of the Council's Lawyer, that no action be taken in the matter.

14. To submit the report of the Auditor-General for the year ended December 31, 1935.—Submitted.

15. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of April 29, 1936.*

(2) Considered one application for water service :—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap.

(3) Considered a proposal made by the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, that telephone call boxes directly connected with the Police Station should be installed at important junctions in the town :—Recommended, in view of the high cost involved, that no action be taken in the matter.

(4) Considered the question of providing "Life Saving Apparatus" at suitable places along the coast :—Recommended that a "Life Saving Apparatus" be provided at a suitable place near the Victoria Park and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 100 be sanctioned for the purpose.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of April 29, 1936.*

(2) Considered the beggar nuisance in the town :—Recommended that inquiries be made from the Municipal Councils of Colombo and Kandy as to how the problem is tackled in those towns and as to whether any steps are being taken by them at present to obtain the necessary legislation so as to permit of the establishment of Municipal Houses of Detention.

The Committee also considered the question of establishing a local House of Detention.

(3) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment the question of appointing additional Seabeach Patrols for the section of the beach between the Victoria Park and Eddystone House :—Recommended the appointment of one additional Sea Beach Patrol on the same terms for the section of the beach between the Victoria Park and Eddystone House.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(c) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of April 29, 1936.*

(2) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation the question of appointing additional Sea Beach Patrols for the section of the beach between the Victoria Park and Eddystone House :—Recommended the appointment of one additional Sea Beach Patrol on the same terms of the section of the beach between the Victoria Park and Eddystone House.

(3) To recommend under rule 21 of the Municipal Pension Minute, the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 224.54 to W. V. James, Conservancy Labourer, who is to be retired from service on the ground of age.—Recommended.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

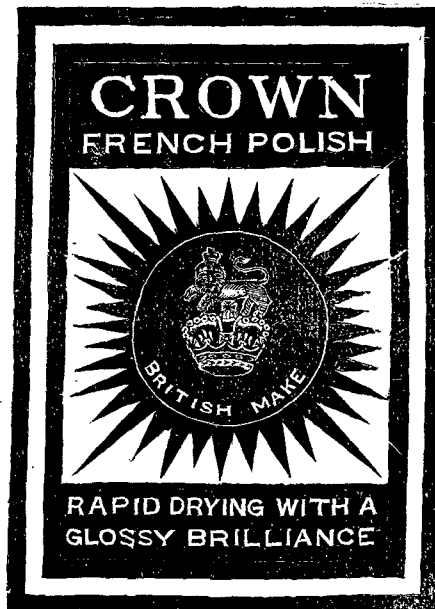

A method of bruising or rolling tea leaf or similarly treating other cellular fibrous material which comprises passing the material a plurality of times through the space intervening between moving members (which include an outer rotary member enveloping an inner rotary member or members) and, in addition, imparting intermittent movement to the material in an axial direction with respect to such space.

2. The privileges in respect of the taverns grouped together will be granted either for the area of each individual tavern or for the area of a group of taverns as shown thereunder at the discretion of the Assistant Government Agent, and tenders for these taverns are therefore invited both singly and in groups.

3. Every tender shall be made on the prescribed form obtainable at this Kachcheri, the Chilaw Treasury, and the Kachcheries at Colombo, Kurunegala, and Anuradhapura as well as at the General Treasury, the Excise Head Office, and the Excise Assistant Commissioners' and Superintendents' Offices, and must be made by the tenderer in his own name. No tender will be accepted if made through an agent.

4. A separate tender shall be made for each tavern or for each group of taverns; and no person shall send in more than one tender for any one tavern or group of taverns.

5. Every tender shall be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of a sum of Rs. 100 and the number and date of such receipt must be entered on the face of the tender form.

6. Every tender shall be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked in the top left hand corner with the number and name of the tavern in respect of which the tender is made or the letter attached to the group and the names of the taverns in that group, and handed to the Assistant Government Agent at the appointed place, date, and time. No tender will be considered unless the person making such tender is present in person at the time of sale.

7. The Assistant Government Agent reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all of the tenders received without assigning any reason therefor and in the event of his so rejecting all the tenders, he may call for tenders again or put up the privilege for sale by auction either at once or after further notice. At such auction only those persons shall be allowed to bid from whom tenders have been received whether such tenders be for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege, or who produce a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of a sum of Rs. 100 notwithstanding their failure to submit tenders for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege, provided, however, that no person who is duly declared the purchaser of any privilege, whether by way of tender or of auction, shall use the same deposit receipt for the purpose of a tender or a bid for any other privilege until he has completed in respect of the privilege already granted to him the steps prescribed in the following paragraph.

8. The successful tenderer or bidder shall, immediately on being granted the privilege, sign the Conditions of Sale and pay to the Assistant Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege.
