RULE under section 91 (d) of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank Ordinance, 1931, made by the Board of Directors, approved by the Governor and published as required by section 91 of the Ordinance.

RULE.

The rules under section 91 (d) of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank Ordinance, 1931, published in *Gazette* No. 7,939 of August 12, 1932, as amended by Notification in *Gazette* No. 8,017 of November 10, 1933, are hereby further amended as follows:—

- (1) in rule 7, by the substitution for the words "with such evidence" of the words "with the fee hereinafter prescribed and such evidence";
- (2) by the substitution for rule 8 of the following new rule:—
- "8. The fee payable under rule 7 for a transfer of debentures shall be—
- 50 cents when the face value does not exceed Rs. 500;
- Re. 1 when the face value does not exceed Rs. 5,000;
- Rs. 2.50 when the face value exceeds Rs. 5,000."

CONDITIONS WITHIN REFERRED TO.

- The registered holder or holders will be regarded as exclusively entitled to the benefit of this debenture, and all persons may act accordingly.
 - Any person becoming entitled to this debenture in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of the registered holder may, upon producing such evidence as the Bank may reasonably require, and subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed transfer this debenture to himself or any other person.
 - The registered holder or holders of this debenture, or in the event of the death of a registered holder or holders, his or her or their legal representative, will be entitled to transfer the same by an instrument in writing in the prescribed form. Regulation 2 under the heading “ Markets ” published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,479 of August 21, 1925, is hereby cancelled, and the following substituted therefor :—

“ 2. Whenever a public market shall have been established by the Board for any town, no person shall hold a private market within the limits of such town without a licence from the Board.

2A (i.). After any such public market shall have been established and opened, no person shall, without a licence granted by the Board, expose for sale any meat, poultry, fish whether fresh or salted, fresh fruit, or vegetables in any boutique, private market, stall, or place within the limits of the Board, other than the public market: Provided that any itinerant vendor may sell fresh fruit or vegetables within the limits of the Board provided he does not sell at a fixed place or does not for the purpose of sale take up a permanent position on a public road or other public place.

2A (ii.). It shall be lawful for an Inspector of the Board to seize any such meat, poultry, fish whether fresh or salted, fresh fruit, and vegetables exposed for sale contrary to the provisions of this regulation, and to remove the same to the office of the Board or to a Police Court, or Village Tribunal to be disposed of as the Chairman or the Magistrate or the President respectively may direct.

2B. All licences referred to in the last preceding regulation shall be in the form set out hereunder, and shall be in force only for such period, not exceeding 12 months and not less than one month, as may be specified therein. Such licences shall be paid for in advance at the rate of 50 cents for each month.

No. 2,871 of December 11, 1935 (Date applied for under Section 50 of the Ordinance, January 14, 1935).

Rubber Producers Research Association.

Improvements in and relating to the concentration of latex.

Abstract.—The invention comprehends the use of hemicelluloses including the polyuronides as creaming agents. Hemicelluloses are defined by one authority as polysaccharides soluble in dilute alkalis and convertible into simple sugars by heating with dilute acids at atmospheric pressure.

Hemicelluloses which are satisfactory creaming agents can be extracted from oat, barley, and wheat straws, brewers' grains yeast, soya bean meal, cotton and linseed meal cake, and beech saw-dust.

The crude extract is obtained by treating, say, oat straw with 1½ per cent. caustic soda for 2 hours at 100°C. The disadvantage of the crude extract is that it colours the latex but it may be purified by precipitating the creaming agent with alcohol, filtering and washing in alcohol, and drying in air.

Other methods are described for preparing the creaming agent from brewers' grains, &c.

A process for the manufacture of bitumen dispersions.

Abstract.—The present invention concerns a process for the manufacture of bitumen dispersions of a relatively high stability so that, when applied in road-making they are suitable for being mixed with very fine mineral aggregates.

According to the invention the preferred process for the manufacture of bitumen dispersions of high stability comprises incorporating into the bitumen a suitable quantity of a specially prepared calcium or analogous water insoluble soap of solid rosin and thereupon dispersing the bitumen thus treated in a neutral or alkaline, aqueous solution of an alkali, (potassium or sodium) soap of solid rosin.

According to the invention also the said bitumen dispersions can be stabilized further by the addition of a calcium chloride solution preferably in an amount chemically equivalent to the amount of alkali rosin soap emulsifier used. In a similar way also other normally coagulative electrolyte solutions capable of acting upon the alkali rosin soap emulsifier, such as aluminium chloride, may be used instead of calcium chloride.

Improvements in and relating to Fountain Pens.

Abstract.—The invention relates to self filling fountain pens in which a rubber sac or receiver is incorporated, the pen being filled by the releasing of the lateral pressure of a flexible metal strip.

By unscrewing a section of the barrel furthest from the nib and then pressing this section the metal strip is flexed and this collapses the sac in the barrel. Ink is drawn into the sac when the pressure is released and the section is then screwed back.

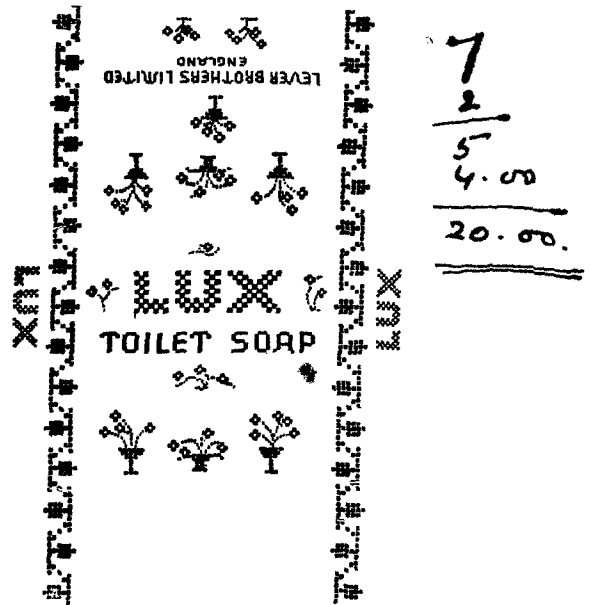
