ING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS His late Majesty, King George the Fifth, in Council was pleased to make the following Orders (hereafter referred to as the "Treaty of Peace Orders"), namely, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) Order, 1935, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 2) Order, 1935, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of Order, 1935, the Treaty the League of Nations) (No. 3) Order, 1935. the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 4) Order, 1935, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (Jersey) Order, 1935, and the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (Guernsey Order, 1935:

And whereas it is provided by subsection (2) of section one of the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, that any Order in Council made under the said Act may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas the Treasury have made an Order called the Clearing Office (Italy) Order, 1936, under the Debts Clearing Offices and Import Restrictions Act, 1934:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the Treaty of Peace Orders subject to such provisions as are hereafter contained:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Revocation of Treaty of Peace Orders.

- 1.—(1) The Treaty of Peace Orders are hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order, subject to the provisions hereafter contained in this Article.
- (2) The revocation of the said Orders shall not affect
 - (a) the previous operation of any of the said Orders, or anything duly done or suffered under any of them; or
 - y right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or in-(*b*) any curred under any of the said Orders;
 - (c) any penalty, forfeiture or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against any of the said Orders; or
 - (d) any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, penalty forfeiture or punishment as aforesaid:

and any such investigation, legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued or enforced, and any such penalty, forfeiture or punishment may be imposed, as if the said Orders had not been revoked:

Provided that after the commencement of this Order no debt to which the Clearing Office (Italy) Order, 1936, applies ahall be payable to the Controller or Anglo-Italian debts (hereafter referred to as "the Controller"), notwithstanding that it is a debt to which Article 3 of the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 2) Order, 1935, applies and was due before the commencement of this Order.

(3) Any sums in the hands of the Controller at the commencement of this Order or thereafter received by him shall be paid by him into the special account referred to in the proviso to paragraph (5) of the said Article 3.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in this Order accounts shall continue to be prepared by the Controller and audited by the Comptroller and Auditor-General as provided in paragraph (8) of the said Article 3.

Short title, extent, commencement and interpretation.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) Order, 1936

(2) This Order shall extend to the following countries as well as to the United Kingdom,

(a) the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands;

(b) all the colonies, except colonies administered by the Government of a Dominion within the meaning of the Statute of Westminster, 1931;

(c) all British protectorates;

- (d) all territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.
- (3) This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-six.
- (4) The Interpretation Act, amended by any subsequent enactment, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

REGULATION.

The regulations of the Ceylon Defence Force, published in Gazette No. 8,074 of August 24, 1934, as last amended by Notification in Gazette No. 8,210 of March 27, 1936, are hereby further amended as follows:

(1) in regulation 155, by the substitution for all the words from "This concession" to "or not.", of the words "This concession may also be allowed to an instructor who proceeds on leave out of the Island, under regulation 145, preparatory to completing his tour of service; but it will not be allowed to an officer or instructor proceeding on leave out of the Island, when he is to return to the Island.";
(2) by the substitution for regulation 474 of the following

new regulation:

"474. The age of enrolment shall be between 16 years and 20 years. A boy must be a member of a school before he is eligible for enrolment. Except as provided for in regulation 475, a cadet shall cease to be a member of the battalion on leaving school, or on being certified physically unfit or on attaining the maximum age limit as laid down in Corps Orders."; and

(3) in Appendix F, by the insertion in paragraph 14 thereof, immediately after the letters and figure "S. A. T. IV", of the word and figure "Appendix I".

CARNEGIE SCHOLARSHIPS.

THE following information regarding the continuance of the scheme inaugurated by the Trustees of the Carnegie Corporation of New York in order to enable selected officers of the Colonial Service to take a "refresher" year for the purpose of undertaking special studies, is published for general information. ulars regarding the inauguration of the scheme were

published by Notification No. H. 1,360/32 of November 19, 1932, in the *Government Gazette* of November 25, 1932. (Relevant extracts are reproduced below.)

The Trustees have sanctioned the grant of a further sum of forty-eight thousand dollars for the continuance of the scheme. This sum will be administered in the same manner, and subject to the same conditions, as the original grant, and it is contemplated that it should be expended over a period of three years.

over a period of three years.

2. In the new circumstances created by the Trustees' decision the Secretary of State for the Colonies considers it appropriate that all Colonial Governments should have a fresh opportunity of submitting applications for awards under the scheme and will be glad to receive, in due course, any applications which His Excellency the Governor may

desire to recommend.

3. The period of study need not necessarily be a full year and applications for grants to cover shorter periods of absence will be entertained. Nevertheless the "refresher" character of the study should be kept prominently in view as well as its bearing on the applicant's official duties and the enhancement of his value to the Government which he serves.

4. The resubmission of previous unsuccessful

4. The resubmission of previous unsuccessful applications is not precluded, but, in considering whether such applications should again be put forward, the fact that preference was accorded to other candidates in allocating the original grant is a factor of which account will be taken, since it is not to be anticipated that competition for awards is likely to be less severe in the future than in the past.

5. The Secretary of State also states that in order that

5. The Secretary of State also states that in order that the expenditure from the fund may be spread over three years, there is no reason why applications should not be forwarded even though the desired award would not come

into operation until a year or two later.

6. Applications from officers in the Public Service desiring to avail themselves of the scholarships should be forwarded to the Chief Secretary through their Heads of Departments as early as possible giving the particulars required by paragraph 5 of the conditions of November 19, 1932.

Relevant Extracts from the Conditions of November 19, 1932.

2. The Trustees contemplate that the period of study should be one year, but they do not propose to draw up any regulations either as to the place at which the studies should be taken or as to their nature, save that the time should be spent on work of a definite kind. They would be prepared to consider applications for assistance to study at a University or similar institution, or to travel or, again, proposals which included study in residence and travel. As instances of their object and the range of applications which they would be prepared to consider, the Trustees have mentioned courses of study in anthropology for administrative officers; scientific courses for medical, agricultural, veterinary, and forestry officers; courses in economics, banking, and currency for Treasury officers; visits to other British Colonies or to the Dependencies of other Colonial powers for the purpose of studying the methods adopted there. These suggestions are mentioned by way of illustration only, and do not exhaust the objects which the Trustees have in view. If it was desired to spend the "refresher" year in the United States, the authorities of the Corporation would do their best to make the visit as pleasant and profitable as possible. The essence of the pleasant and profitable as possible. The essence of the scheme is, however, that no restriction will be placed on an applicant's choice of the place or manner in which the year

will be spent.

3. The Trustees have not suggested any definite conditions of eligibility for officers who may seek to avail themselves of the scheme. They are, however, impressed by the benefits which an officer who has spent ten or more years in the service may derive from a course of study, not only because of its educational value, but also from the point of view of his health and his interest in his work, and so of his advancement in the Service. Generally speaking, preference will be given to promising officers between

thirty and forty years of age.

4. As regards the amount of the assistance which might be given, the Trustees would regard a sum of \$3,000 as on the average an appropriate grant, but would wish to adopt the principle that officers who are selected should neither lose nor gain financially. They suggest that the assistance should be of the amount which would cover the travelling and other expenses not provided by his Government and

any loss in salary due to his absence from duty. The amount must therefore to some extent be dependent upon

the terms upon which an officer is released.

5. The Secretary of State will be glad to receive any applications recommended by His Excellency the Governor. It would be convenient if the applications could be accompanied by as close an estimate as it may be possible to frame of the amount of assistance which would be required from the Fund, based on the suggestion mentioned in paragraph 4 above. Each application should also be supported by a full statement of the officer's career in the Colonial Service as well as of his academic and other qualifications in order that the selecting authorities may be enabled to form an opinion as to his ability to turn to good account the facilities which may be placed at his disposal.

7. Officers awarded scholarships will be granted whatever earned vacation and half pay leave they may have available and will thereafter, if necessary, be placed on no pay leave until the end of the course, the pension value for the period of absence being calculated as in the case of ordinary leave to Europe. No passage concessions will be granted beyond those to which an officer is entitled under the leave passage regulations. These conditions should be borne in mind by applicants when framing the estimate

required under paragraph 5 above.

8. No application will be recommended unless it is considered that the course of study proposed would be of use to this Government.

FOREIGN LIQUOR TAVERN RENT SALE CONDITIONS,

THE Governor has, under section 24 of the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912, directed that in addition to the General Conditions published by Excise Notification No. 276 in the Government Gazette No. 8,118 of May 3, 1935, as amended by Excise Notification No. 283 published in Gazette No. 8,214 of April 24, 1936, the following shall be the special conditions for the grant of the privilege of selling foreign liquor by retail under a tavern licence:-

1. (1) Privilege to be Exclusive.

The privilege will be exclusive, and will extend only-

- (a) to the sale of potable foreign liquor under a tavern licence to be obtained from the Government Agent in form Excise F. L. 5 as published by Excise Notification No. 219 in Gazette No. 7,845 of April 17, 1931, and as amended by Excise Notification No. 306 in Gazette No. 8,237 of July 31, 1936; and
- (b) If so desired by the grantee of the privilege for any local area in which the sale of arrack is permitted, and if the Arrack Renter of that area consents in writing, to the sale also of arrack in bulk only under a licence to be obtained from the Excise Commissioner in form Excise A. (F. L.) I as published in an un-numbered notification in the Government Gazette No. 8,118 of May 3, 1935.

The Excise Commissioner shall have the sole discretion to refuse to issue such licence to sell arrack.

(2) The privilege shall not be deemed to be infringed by the sale of foreign liquor within the same area under any class or kind of foreign liquor licence other than the foreign liquor tavern licence.

2. (1) Period of Privilege.

The privilege will be granted for the period from October 1, 1936, to September 30, 1937, or for any shorter period within these 12 months, on application by way of tender or by auction in the form and manner prescribed in these conditions.

(2) Areas for which Privilege granted.—

The privilege may be granted for the local area of an individual tavern, or for the respective local areas of each tavern in a group of taverns as the Government Agent may decide.

Tender Form.

Every tender shall be made on the form prescribed hereinbefore, which may be obtained from the office indicated in the sale notice.

4. Tender Deposit .-

(1) The Government Agent may, if he considers it necessary, require the deposit of a sum not exceeding

Rupees one hundred (Rs. 100) by the tenderer in respect of each tender.

(2) Every tender shall be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of the sum required by the Government Agent under the foregoing paragraph of this condition, and the number and date of the receipt shall be entered on the face of the tender form.

- Prohibition of Tenders by Agents or of more than one tender by any person.—
 - (1) Every tender or bid shall be made by the tenderer or bidder in his own name. No tender or bid, made through an agent, will be accepted.

(2) No person shall send in more than one tender for any one tavern, or group of taverns.

Disqualifications against Acceptance of Tenders.—

No tender will be accepted from any person-

(a) whose name appears on the list of defaulting contractors, or on the list of defaulters in respect of any kind of Excise licences or of toll rents, or on the list of persons precluded for other reasons from having any concern in any Government rent or contract; or

(b) whose name is on the Excise Register of offenders; or
(c) who is a registered criminal within the meaning of the Prevention of Crimes Ordinance, No. 2 of 1926, or who has been convicted of any crime or of any Excise offence; or
(d) who at any the held a licence which has been cancelled under section 26 of the Excise Ordinance,

No. 8 of 1912.

7. Delivery of Tenders.--

Every tender shall be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked in the top left hand corner with the name of the tavern or the description of the group of taverns, in respect of which the tender is made, and its number on the list of sanctioned taverns. The envelope shall be (a) deposited in the Kachcheri Tender Box, or (b) handed to the Government Agent or to his Office Assistant or (c) sent by registered post so as to reach the Kachcheri before the time fixed for closing the tenders.

8. (1) Power to reject Tender.

The Government Agent may in his discretion reject any or all of the tenders received; and in the event of his so rejecting all tenders, he may call for tenders again or put up the privilege, either at once or after further notice, for sale by auction.

(2) Restriction of Bidding at Auction.—

At such auction no person shall be allowed to bid, unless he shall have either-

- (a) submitted a tender accompanied by the Treasury or Kachcheri receipt prescribed in condition 4, whether such tender be for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege; or,
- (b) produced the receipt prescribed in condition 4, notwithstanding his failure to submit a tender for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege.

Provided that no person who is duly declared the purchaser of any privilege, whether by way of tender or of until he has completed in respect of the privilege already granted to him the steps prescribed hereinafter in condition 9 (i.) (a).

(3) Power to reject Bid.—

Subject to the proviso that the Government Agent shall have discretion to reject any or all of the bids the privilege shall be granted to the highest bidder at such auction.

(4) Procedure after Rejection of all Bids.—

In the event of the rejection of all bids as aforesaid, the Government Agent may in his discretion—

- (a) call for further tenders for the privilege for any single tavern or for sub-groups of two or more taverns included in any group of taverns, or for any combination of any parts of groups, or combination of whole groups, either at once or after further notice, and accept or reject all or any tenders so received, and thereafter put up for sale by auction the privilege for any single tavern or sub-groups or combinations as aforesaid for which the further tenders were rejected, either at once or after further notice, and accept or reject all or any bids so received; or
- (b) put up for sale by auction the privilege for any single tavern or for sub-groups of two or more taverns included in any group of taverns, or for any combination of any parts of groups, or combination of whole groups, either at once or after further notice, and accept or reject all or any hide so received.
- groups, either at once or after further notice, and accept or reject all or any bids so received; or

 (c) grant the privilege for the tavern, or group, or any single tavern or sub-group of two or more taverns included in a group or for any combination of any parts of groups, or combination of whole groups, to any person, who is approved by the Government Agent, and who agrees to pay by way of rent such amount as the Government Agent may fix.

(5) Procedure after Rejection of further Bids.—

In the event of the rejection of the bids received under paragraphs 4(a) and 4(b) of this condition, the Government Agent may in his discretion take action under paragraph 4(c).

0. (1) (a) Security Deposit.—

The grantee shall, immediately on being granted the privilege, sign these conditions and pay to the Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to two months' rent payable for that privilege.

(b) Signing of Bond.—

The grantee shall also within fourteen days of the sale of the privilege enter into a bond with the Government Agent for the full amount for which he has purchased it, and he shall specially hypotheate by such bond the said security deposit.

(c) Consequences of Breach of Conditions of Bond.—

The said security deposit shall be liable to be confiscated by the Government Agent for breach of any of these conditions or for non-payment of any instalment, and such confiscation shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by these conditions for such breach.

(2) Banking of Security Deposit.—

Security money so paid will be deposited in a bank only on the grantee's application and only at his risk, and when such deposit is made, no withdrawal will be allowed till the date of maturity.

(3) Warrant or Power of Attorney to confess Judgment .--

If the highest bid or tender under condition 8 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000, the grantee shall at the time of the execution of the bond as aforesaid execute, if so required by the Government Agent, a warrant or power of attorney in the form sanctioned by law, to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege, and shall also furnish to the Government Agent within fifteen days of the date of the execution of such warrant or power of attorney a duly certified copy thereof for filing in the District Court under section 32 of the Civil Procedure Code.

(4) Registered Postal Address.--

The grantee shall, on signing these conditions, elect and signify under his hand a post office or postal address to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the privilege may be addressed under registered cover; and all such notices or processes so addressed to such post office or to such postal address, and posted in due course, shall be deemed to have been duly served and be as effectual for all purposes, as if they had been served upon the grantee in person upon the day on which such notice or process was so posted.

10. Failure to complete Purchase of Privilege.—

If any tenderer or bidder, on being declared to be the purchaser of the privilege, declines or fails to sign these conditions of sale, or fails to furnish the security prescribed in condition 9 (i.) (a) when called upon to do so, the deposit made under condition 4 will be declared forfeited, and the defaulter will render himself liable to have his name entered in the list of defaulters in respect of Excise licences. Subject to this exception, the deposits of all tenderers or bidders will be returned, after the conditions of sale have been signed and the aforesaid security given by the successful tenderer or bidder.

11. Grantee to have no Interests in Arrack and Toddy Sales .--

The grantee shall have no concern or interest direct or indirect (a) in the sale of arrack, except as provided for in condition 1 (b), or (b) in the purchase of any privilege of selling arrack, or (c) in the purchase of any privilege of selling toddy within the local area to which the lege of selling foreign liquor relates.

12. (1) Opening of Tavern on Due Date and Approval of Site .--

(a) The grantee shall open the tavern or taverns on the day on which the privilege commences to run.

(b) The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being able to procure a site.

(c) The grantee shall not open a tayern on any site otherwise than with the approval of the Government Agent, such approval being obtained from the Government Agent at least 14 days before the privilege commences to run.

(2) Obtaining of Licences for Sale of Foreign Liquor and Arrack.

The grantees shall, not less than five days before the date on which the privilege commences to run, obtain from the Government Agent a licence or licences for the sale of foreign liquor by retail at the tavern or taverns within the local area covered by this privilege, and if the grantee desires to sell arrack he shall also obtain a licence as provided in condition 1 (b) in respect of all or any of his taverns within the area in which the sale of arrack is permitted.

13. (1) Payment of Rent.-

The grantee shall pay the purchase money or rent to the Government Agent in twelve equal monthly instalments.

(2) Due Date of Instalment.-

The first instalment of the rent shall be deemed to be due and payable on September 30, 1936, and succeeding instalments shall be deemed to be severally due and payable on the last day of each succeeding month.

(3) Interest.

Interest at the rate of 9 per centum per annum shall be payable in respect of all arrears.

14. (1) Payments not valid without Kachcheri Receipt.

No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be deemed to have been duly made, unless the grantee produces a Kachcheri receipt in respect thereof.

(2) Money left with Officers not reckoned as Money paid.

No money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of any Shroff or any other officer of any Kachcheri shall be deemed to be money paid under this contract.

15. Limit of Sale and Transport of Arrack, if allowed.-

The limit of sale by retail of arrack in bulk only, if allowed under condition 1 (b) above, with respect to the whole Island and as regards purchasers generally shall be one-third of an imperial gallon, and no arrack in excess of that quantity may be removed at any one time from the tavern by any person without a valid permit or pass.

16. (1) Purchase of Arrack, if sale of Arrack allowed.—

If a licence to sell arrack in bulk only by retail has been granted by the Excise Commissioner, the grantee shall buy all such arrack-

(a) only in bulk;

(b) only from the arrack tavern to which his foreign liquor tavern is assigned;

(c) at a price to be mutually agreed upon between the grantee and the renter of the said arrack tavern;

(d) in quantities not less than the quantity specified in the licence

(e) only on a valid transport pass issued by the Superintendent of Excise.

(2) Supervisory Rights of Renter of Arrack Tuvern.-

Where a renter of an arrack tavern so supplies arrack to the grantee, such renter will, for the protection of his own exclusive privilege of sale of arrack, have the supervisory rights provided for in the conditions of the licence form Excise A (F. L.) 1.

17. Grantee to account for all Foreign Liquor and Arrack: Wastage Allowance.—

The grantee shall account for all foreign liquor and arrack purchased by him from time to time. The allowance made on account of wastage for all kinds of foreign spirits and arrack stocked in bulk, will in no circumstances exceed two per centum of the total quantity purchased since the last date of stock-taking.

18. Grantee responsible for Agent's Acts.-

The grantee shall be responsible for all acts of his agents or employees in relation to the privilege.

19. Non-transferability of Privilege.

The privilege shall not be transferable otherwise than with the sanction of the Excise Commissioner first had and obtained.

20. (1) (a) Cancellation of Licences and Privilege for Non-payment of Rent, &c .-

If any instalment or part of any instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, or other sum due to the Crown from the grantee remains unpaid after the date on which it becomes due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after fifteen days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so, without further process of law, to cancel the foreign liquor licence issued to the grantee and to sell the privilege at the risk of the grantee.

(b) Notice of Cancellation.-

Such notice may be served personally on the grantee, or addressed under registered cover to the post office or postal address elected and signified under condition 9 (4), and duly posted, as the Government Agent thinks fit.

(c) Where the foreign liquor licence is so cancelled, the Excise Commissioner shall have power to cancel the

arrack licence also, after the like notice served in like manner.

(2) Regrant of Privilege between Cancellation and Resale.-

In the event of the cancellation of the foreign liquor licence, the Government Agent shall have power to grant the privilege of the sale of foreign liquor to any person approved by him for any period intervening between such cancellation and the resale of the privilege for the sale of foreign liquor, and for this purpose he may issue to such approved person a temporary licence upon such terms as he may think fit.

The Excise Commissioner may in such case issue, if he thinks fit, the arrack licence referred to in condition 1 (1) (b) to such approved person if any such arrack licence had been issued to the holder of the foreign liquor tavern licence which is cancelled.

(3) No Remission of Rent.—

No remission of the rent payable in respect of the privilege will be granted on any plea of the grantee's having overestimated the value examy tavern or on any other ground.

(4) No Compensation for Losses.

The grantee shall not have or make any claim to any reduction, or to the remission, of any sum due and owing by him to the Crown by reason of any loss alleged to have been sustained by him-

(a) whether on account of any closing of the tavern or taverns during the passage of troops, or during the encampment of troops in the vicinity of the tavern or taverns, or during the holding of any poll; or

(b) whether on account of the opening of any new arrack or toddy tavern, or estate canteen for arrack or toddy or foreign liquor, or premises licensed for the sale of foreign liquor under any class or kind of foreign liquor licence other than a foreign liquor tavern licence after the sale of the privilege under these conditions; or

(c) whether on account of the manufacture and drawing of fermented toddy on special licences issued by the Assistant Commissioner for bona fide domestic consumption on medical grounds, and not for sale; or

(d) whether on account of the manufacture and drawing of fermented toddy within the area or areas of the privilege hereby granted for supply to licensed vinegar manufactories; or

(e) through any other cause whatsoever.

21. Conviction of Grantee or Agents.

If the grantee, or any agent, or person employed by the grantee is, during the continuance of the privilege, convicted of an offence under Chapter XIII. of the Ceylon Penal Code, the Government Agent may take any of the steps prescribed by section 30 of the Ordinance.

Termination of Privilege.

The privilege shall terminate on (a) the expiry of the term for which it is granted, (b) the death of the grantee, or (c) a breach of any of the conditions governing it.

- 3a. Mr. de Silva and Mr. Wijayatilake drew the Chairman's attention to certain articles that appeared in the Press regarding the Water Scheme and suggested that a statement might be made by the Chairman explaining the true

The Chairman indicated that it was somewhat premature for him to venture to make a statement and that the position could be made clear when the report from the Director of Public Works is received.

3B. Mr. Nettelton drew Chairman's attention to the absence of street name boards in all streets.

The Chairman agreed to go into the matter with the Municipal Engineer.

- 4. Petitions: -Mr. Wijayatilake presented (1) petition from Mr. A. N. P. Widyasekera, Chief Physician, Municipal Free Ayurvedic Dispensary, dated June 19, 1936, applying for an enhanced scale of salary
- Mr. Soysa presented (2) petition from residents of Halloluwa, Pitakanda, &c., suggesting that electric lights should be extended to their area.

Mr. Marikar presented (3) petition from Mr. D. Molagoda dated June 5, 1936, addressed to Mr. Marikar, asking him to intervene and stay the sale of his properties 53/2 to 53/5, Galagedera road, for non-payment of taxes. - (3) Papers relating to the proposed amendment of by-law 292 relating to burials outside Municipal limits.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on May 16, 1936.

(4) Papers re the desirability of appointing an Entomological Assistant for the Health Department to be in charge of anti-malarial work. (H/G 2278).—Recommended that Mr. K. B. Kulatunge be sent for three months' training and that Council restore the original cadre of Sanitary Inspectors.

(Note.—There are now 5 Ward Inspectors and 1 Anti-Plague Inspector. In 1932 there were 6 Ward Inspectors and 1 Anti-Plague Inspector).

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on May 16, 1936.

- (5) To consider the point raised by the Auditor-General in connection with the paving of the bed of the stream near the Judge's bungalow disputing the right of the Municipal Engineer to incur expenditure in excess of an amount contracted for without specific sanction of Council although such excess amount is within the vote granted by Council. (W/M 11/35).—Recommended that Audit be informed that such variations are within the discretion of the Municipal Engineer in accordance with clause 9 of the specification attached to all Municipal contracts. The Council's authority should only be required when the variation exceeds 20 per cent. of the sum named in the contract.
- (6) To obtain sanction for writing off a sum of Rs. 14 · 86 incurred by the Council in the survey of premises No. 32, Yatinuwera, Talwatte, for purposes of vesting. (A/SB).—Recommended.
- (7) To obtain covering sanction for Rs. 12,446.90 written off during 1935 under consolidated rates on account of remissions on vacant premises, reductions on objections, &c.—Recommended.
- (8) To obtain a vote of Rs. 646 36 for installing lights in the 'Bus Park at the Railway Approach road.—Recommended. Concrete posts to be substituted for Karri timber.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on May 16, 1936.

- (9) To obtain a vote of Rs. 58·00 to meet the cost of putting up an additional 'bus halting place notice board on Peradeniya road at its junction with Heerasagala road. (B 73).—Recommended.
- (10) Report from the Municipal Engineer dated May 1, 1936, submitting two statements of extra works which are found necessary to be done in connection with the contract for the laying of 6-in. and 8-in. pipes for the Minor (River) Pumping Scheme, owing to additions and variations in the work, and applying for authority to incur the expenditure of Rs. 1,184 35 against savings on the vote for laying pipes.—Recommended.
- (11) To obtain sanction for allowing metered water services to the following premises:—Peradeniya road, 39, 40, 205, 251, 419/420, 539, 539a/1, 872/873, 884; Trincomalee street, 151, 152-154, 314.—Recommended.

Resolutions of Council on Recommendations of the Standing Committees-

Resolved that both recommendations be adopted.

Resolution on item (9). Resolved that a vote of Rs. 28.00 be granted in view of the lower quotation since received.

Resolution on items (3), (6) to (8), (10) and (11). Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

(6) Report of the Auditor-General on the Kandy Municipal Accounts for the Year 1935.—Tabled.

Mr. de Silva made observations on (1) amounts not spent within the year, (2) earnings of the Electricity Department, (3) meter rents, and (4) accounting system and the Chairman offered explanations.



The Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901.

BY-LAWS made by the Sanitary Boards of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts under sections 5 and 6 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901.

The Kachcheri, Puttalam, July 20, 1936. A. E. CHRISTOFFELSZ, Chairman.

By-laws.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of any Sanitary Board town in the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of 25 cents and 50 cents respectively. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1, of one year to March 31 of the year following.

March 31, of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within such town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Sanitary Boards to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the collector) particulars required in the annexed form A in repsect

of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid collector or at the office of the Sanitary Boards.

4. The collector (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which in his opinion is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the collector may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Sanitary Boards, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz.:—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Sanitary Boards-

- (a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live: or
- (b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually illtreated or neglected by its owner; or
- (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious
- The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused, or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at such time and place as stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Sanitary Boards authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.
