1. By-law 17 of the Municipal Leave By-laws as amended by by-laws published by Proclamation in *Gazette* No. 7,445 of February 6, 1925, and by Notification in *Gazette* No. 7,852 of May 8, 1931, is hereby further amended by the deletion of paragraph (iii.) thereof and the substitution of the following for that paragraph :—

(iii.) In case of illness due to accidents arising out of their employment and not due to their own culpable carelessness, such employees irrespective of length of service may, with sanction of the Chairman, be granted full-pay leave up to a maximum of one month in a calendar year. If it is considered desirable that such full-pay leave should be extended beyond one month, the sanction of the Council must be obtained.

2. By-law 17A of the Municipal Leave By-laws as amended by by-laws published by Proclamations in *Gazette* No. 7,445 of February 6, 1925, and *Gazette* No. 7,549 of October 8, 1926, and by Notification in *Gazette* No. 7,798 of August 15, 1930, is hereby further amended by the deletion of paragraph (ii.) thereof and the substitution of the following for that paragraph :—

(ii.) In case of illness due to accidents arising out of their employment and not due to their own culpable carelessness, daily-paid employees irrespective of service may be granted full-pay leave, with sanction of the Chairman, up to a maximum of thirty days in a calendar year. If it is considered desirable that such full-pay leave should be extended beyond thirty days, the sanction of the Council must be obtained.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS.

1. The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the Urban area or outside and liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in the form supplied by the Council for that purpose and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such form is addressed.

2. (1) If any person, after having filled up and returned such return acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such return, he shall within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping, or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

(2) Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish information as required by the foregoing paragraph of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance every person who has furnished the return referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of every vehicle or animal entered in such return, to pay the tax for the year for which such return is furnished and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on every vehicle or animal referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicle or animal was acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Any person who has furnished the return required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2 may by written notice given to the Chairman claim to be exempted from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such return or notice.

5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of all vehicles, other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, or mule kept or used within the administrative limits of the Nuwara Eliya Urban District Council.

6. The annual tax aforesaid shall be paid by the persons liable to pay the same at the Office of the Nuwara Eliya Urban District Council whether the same shall have been demanded or not; and any person failing or neglecting to pay such tax after it shall have become due from him shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

7. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued. Provided that when any plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate; and provided further that the Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate has been lost or stolen, issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by him of 50 cents.

8. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the administrative limits of the Nuwara Eliya Urban District Council the owner or person in charge of that vehicle shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifteen rupees.

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situate within the administrative limits of the Council or for any of the heirs or the legal representative of any deceased mortgagee, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council.

2. Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—

- (1) the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased;
- (2) the name and address of the mortgagor; and
- (3) a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it.

3. On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at Re. 1, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for the purpose in the office of the Council.

4. In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses may have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

Regulations for Munnessaram Festival.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept in the camp area, and no cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings within the camp area to be removed to a place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

Date of Examination.—A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the Clerical Service of the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings, in the service of the Electricity Board of Ceylon, will be held in Colombo, on October 2 and 3, 1936.

2. *Places for Competition.*—There will probably be 4 immediate vacancies in Class II. and 11 in Class III. The appointments in Class III. will be offered to those candidates next in order of merit who are not selected for appointment to Class II. Further appointments may be offered if vacancies occur before the fixing of the next examination.

3. *Conditions of Service.*—(1) The salary scales attached to the posts will be the same as for the Government General Clerical Service, viz.:—*Class II.*—Rs. 720 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 108 to Rs. 2,448, subject to two years' halts on Rs. 1,260 and Rs. 1,800 and Efficiency Bars before Rs. 1,368 and Rs. 1,908.

Class III.—Rs. 480 rising by annual increments of Rs. 30 to Rs. 1,200, subject to Efficiency Bars before Rs. 660, Rs. 840, and Rs. 1,020.

(2) The posts will be non-pensionable, but the successful candidates will on appointment become members of a Departmental Provident Fund to which they will contribute 5 per cent. of their salary. The Electricity Board will place annually to the credit of each member in the Fund an amount equal to one and a half times the sum contributed by the member.

(3) The post will not carry rent allowance or holiday warrants.

4. The appointments will be made subject to a probationary period of two years. All officers who do not obtain at least 50 per cent. of the maximum marks for (a) Book-keeping and Accountancy and (b) Typewriting at the Entrance Examination, will be required to pass a Departmental Examination in Typewriting before the payment of their first annual increment and a Departmental Examination in Book-keeping and Accountancy before confirmation. Failure to pass either Departmental Examination by the due date will result in the deferment of the incremental date.

6. *Eligibility.*—The examination will be confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in Ceylon.

7. Candidates other than those eligible under regulation 10 must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed at least—

- The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or
- The Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or
- The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate (English), Examination and either Examination of either—
 - the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination of the London Chamber of Commerce, or
 - the Commercial Certificate Examination of the London Chamber of Commerce.

8. Applications must be accompanied by a fee of Ten Rupees remitted either by Money Order or Cheque payable to the Manager, Department of Government Electrical Undertakings. Stamps will not be accepted.

9. (i.) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 18 nor more than 23 years of age on October 2, 1936, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Manager, Department of Government Electrical Undertakings, must be attached to the form of application.

(ii.) Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iii.) Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv.) In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian, in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895, and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Manager, Department of Government Electrical Undertakings, that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v.) If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, a certificate must be submitted from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor, or Notary, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

10. Clerks who have entered Class III. of the Clerical Service of the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings by examination and temporarily clerks who entered the Department on or before May 1, 1936, will be allowed to sit for the examination irrespective of age and

without fee, and although they may not have passed the examination or examinations referred to in regulation 7, provided the Manager, Department of Government Electrical Undertakings certifies that they are in every way fit for permanent employment in Classes II. or III.

11. *Withdrawals and Refunds.*—If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination, a refund will be made of 7/10ths of the fee remitted by him. If a candidate withdraws from the examination on account of illness, the notice of his withdrawal must be received, at the Office of the Manager, Department of Government Electrical Undertakings at least 3 days before the date of the examination accompanied by the approved application form and a medical certificate from a qualified medical officer, in which case the whole fee will be refunded to him. In no other case will a refund be made of the fee remitted by a candidate.

The written examination will be first held and on the results obtained in the two compulsory subjects candidates will be selected to attend the *vivá voce* test. For all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

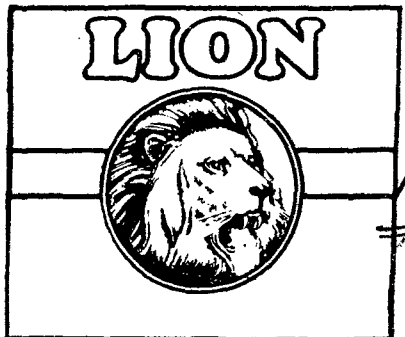

The privileges in respect of the taverns grouped together will be granted either for the area of each individual tavern or for the area of a group of taverns as shown thereunder at the discretion of the Assistant Government Agent, and tenders for these taverns are therefore invited both singly and in groups.

3. Every tender shall be made on the prescribed form obtainable at this Kachcheri, the Chilaw Treasury, and the Kachcheries at Colombo, Kurunegala, and Anuradhapura as well as at the General Treasury, the Excise Head Office, and the Excise Assistant Commissioners' and Superintendents' Offices, and must be made by the tenderer in his own name. No tender will be accepted if made through an agent.

4. A separate tender shall be made for each tavern or for each group of taverns; and no person shall send in more than one tender for any one tavern or group of taverns.

5. Every tender shall be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of a sum of Rs. 100 and the number and date of such receipt must be entered on the face of the tender form.

6. Every tender shall be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked in the top left hand corner with the number and name of the tavern in respect of which the tender is made or the letter attached to the group and the names of the taverns in that group, and handed to the Assistant Government Agent at the appointed place, date, and time. No tender will be considered unless the person making such tender is present in person at the time of sale.

7. The Assistant Government Agent reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all of the tenders received without assigning any reason therefor and in the event of his so rejecting all the tenders, he may call for tenders again or put up the privilege for sale by auction either at once or after further notice. At such auction only those persons shall be allowed to bid from whom tenders have been received whether such tenders be for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege, or who produce a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of a sum of Rs. 100 notwithstanding their failure to submit tenders for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege, provided, however, that no person who is duly declared the purchaser of any privilege, whether by way of tender or of auction, shall use the same deposit receipt for the purpose of a tender or a bid for any other privilege until he has completed in respect of the privilege already granted to him the steps prescribed in the following paragraph.

8. The successful tenderer or bidder shall, immediately on being granted the privilege, sign the Conditions of Sale and pay to the Assistant Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege.

9. Prospective tenderers and bidders are hereby informed that the possession of toddy in any quantity whatsoever will be prohibited, except upon a permit granted by an Excise Officer, in the Sanitary Board areas of Madampe, Marawila, and Nattandiya and in the Vidane Arachchi's division of Otara palata south.
