THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1935, (a) it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 31st day of March, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the King of Denmark for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals:

And whereas the said Treaty was duly ratified *:

And whereas a supplementary Convention was signed on the 15th day of October, 1935, between His late Majesty King George V and His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty the King and Emperor), and His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland,

From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between the territory of His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland, on the one hand, and on the other the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE,
No. 9 OF 1924.

RULES under sections 29 and 36 of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, made by the Village Committee of the subdivision of Naimana-Makawita in the Matara District, of the Southern Province, and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 30 of the Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULES.

Section 29.

SUB-SECTION (1).

Paths and Roads.

1. Every village path or road within the subdivision shall be constructed and maintained in accordance with the decision of the Committee as to the width of such path or road and the course which it is to take.

2. No person shall interfere with the use of, or injure, damage, obstruct, or encroach upon, or without the permission of the Committee, divert the line of, any village path or road whether constructed or in course of construction.

3. No new building or wall shall be put up at a less distance than 15 feet from the middle of any village path or 25 feet from the middle of any village cart road, nor shall any such building or wall be commenced along any such thoroughfare by any person without first giving 30 days' notice of his intention to the Chairman.

4. (1) It shall be the duty of the proprietors and cultivators of paddy fields to maintain all public footpaths leading through their paddy fields at their customary width.

(2) No person shall cut or encroach upon any such path so as to reduce it to less than its customary width.

5. Where any path or road of a greater width than 3 feet has been constructed by the Committee through any paddy fields no person shall cut into or reduce the width of such path or road.

6. For the purposes of these rules, any path or road for the construction or maintenance of which any money or labour is appropriated by the Committee under section 29 (25) of the Ordinance, shall be deemed to be a village path or road.

SUB-SECTION (1).

Village Works.

1. No person shall obstruct, destroy, damage, pollute, deface, or injure in any way, any bridge, edanda, ambalam, madam, spout, well, watering or bathing place, market, or fair constructed or maintained by the Committee, or any other property whatsoever of the inhabitants of this subdivision.

2. No person shall bathe or wash clothes at, or in any way foul or pollute, any well set apart by the Committee after due notice for the supply of water for drinking purposes only.

3. When the Committee has set apart, by notice exhibited on the spot, special places for each of the purposes of washing, bathing, and the bathing of animals, in any tank, stream, or water-course, no person shall use any such place for any purpose other than that for which it has been so set apart.

SUB-SECTIONS (1) AND (22).

Ferries.

1. (a) New ferries shall be constructed by the Committee only at such places as may be approved by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The construction of every such ferry shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

(c) The Committee shall keep a register of village ferries constructed, regulated, or protected under this Ordinance.

2. (1) All tolls imposed under section 28 shall be collected by the ferry-man appointed in writing by the Chairman.

(2) No toll shall be levied in any case where the ferry boat is not used.

3. No person other than a duly appointed ferry-man, shall carry any goods, vehicle, or animal, which is not his property, or any passenger, who is not in his service, across any river or stream by any boat or other means either at, or within a distance of half a mile above or below any village ferry in respect of which tolls have been duly imposed.

SUB-SECTION (6).

Unwholesome Food.

1. (1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer or person authorized in writing by the Chairman, to seize any meat, poultry, fish, game, vegetable, fruit, or other article of food or any drink introduced into or exposed for sale within any market, fair, bakery, eating-house, tea or coffee boutique, provision boutique or any other place in the subdivision, if such article of food or drink appears to be unwholesome or unfit for human consumption.

(2) If after such consultation as the Chairman may consider necessary with the nearest Government Medical Officer or Government Apothecary or Chief Headman, it is found that any article so seized is unfit for human consumption the Chairman may cause the same to be destroyed or to be so disposed of as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human consumption.

2. No person shall sell or expose for sale any articles of food or drink which are unfit for human consumption.

3. No person shall sell the flesh of any animal that has died of disease or by drowning or that has been killed by the bite of a snake or by a wild beast.

SUB-SECTION (7).

Springs and Water-courses.

1. No person shall fell or destroy any timber or under-wood or open or work any mine or quarry on any land reserved for the conservancy of springs or in the bed or on the bank of water-courses.

SUB-SECTION (8).

Regulation of Fisheries.

1. No person shall kill or catch fish by means of dynamite or other explosives or poison.

2. No person shall for the purpose of catching fish open, block up, or otherwise interfere with any communal canal, tank, embankment, pond, amuna, water-course, or ela, without the permission of the Chairman: Provided that such permission shall not be given if the Chairman, after such consultation as he may consider necessary with the Irrigation Headman or any other officer, is of opinion that the granting of such permission is likely to be detrimental to the cultivation of land in the subdivision.

3. No person shall fish in pools or waters near vihares, pansalas, or other places in which it has hitherto not been the custom in this subdivision to fish.

4. (1) No kraal or stockade or enclosure for catching fish shall be erected or maintained or continued in any river, lake, canal, or other piece of water without a permit under the hand of the Chairman.

(2) Every such permit shall expire on the 31st day of December each year.

(3) The annual fee for each permit shall be—

	Rs.	c.
(a) For a full kraal (extending from bank to bank) ..	15	0
(b) For a half kraal (extending from bank to bank) ..	7	50

(4) Every such permit shall specify the situation of the kraal and shall be subject to the conditions set out in the rules next following.

5. A fish kraal extending right across from bank to bank shall be provided with at least 3 openings, an inshore gap on each bank not less than 10 yards wide and a central gap 30 yards wide.

6. A fish kraal not extending right across from bank to bank shall have an inshore gap 10 yards wide on the bank and shall not extend to within 15 yards of the centre of the river, lake, canal, or piece of water.

7. The aforesaid central gap shall be free of any obstruction with the sole exception of tender coconut leaves tied to a string 3 feet below the surface of the water, and a submerged tat of 1½ inches mesh at the bottom of the river; and the inshore gaps shall be free of any obstruction other than strings of tender coconut leaves reaching down to the bed.

8. (1) No fish kraal shall be allowed within a distance of 100 yards from any other such kraal.

(2) The extreme ends of the kraal towards the centre of the river, lake, canal, or piece of water shall be marked by high posts flying a flag during the day and by a lantern or other light attached throughout the night.

9. If the kraal is abandoned, or if the permit is refused or not renewed, the stakes, tats, or other appendages pertaining thereto shall be pulled out and removed by the kraal owner within one week of the communication of such refusal or decision.

10. (1) No person shall catch fish by means of gunny bags.

(2) No person shall use the madela, nuldela, or aradela, or any other net which is likely to destroy ova or small fry.

11. Any breach of these rules shall be punishable with the cancellation of the licence and the forfeiture of the fee paid for the year, in addition to a fine.

SUB-SECTION (12).

Cattle Diseases.

1. It shall be the duty of the owner or person in charge of any animal suffering from murrain or other infectious or contagious disease—

- (1) to segregate such animal, and to give immediate information of such disease to the Chairman ;
- (2) to remove such animal to any place specified by the Chairman and to leave it in such place in charge of such person as may have been authorized by the Chairman to tend or treat it ;
- (3) to burn or to bury, at a depth of not less than 6 ft., the dung, litter, and other refuse of such animal, and, in the event of its death, its carcase, and also to disinfect the shed or spot where such animal has lain ;
- (4) to cleanse and disinfect his own person and clothing before he approaches healthy cattle ;
- (5) to take all such precautions and steps as may be necessary to prevent any such animal from mixing with any healthy animal until 14 days have elapsed after complete recovery.

2. On receipt of information given by any person under the foregoing rule the Chairman shall notify the outbreak of such disease in the village or area specified, by posting up written notices under his hand in conspicuous places and by beat of tom-tom ; and 14 days after the death or the complete recovery of the last known case of disease, he shall in like manner notify that such village or area is free from disease.

3. During the period intervening between the notification of an outbreak of disease as aforesaid, and the notification that the village or area is free from disease—

- (a) no person shall bring any cattle into, or remove any cattle from, such village or area ; and
- (b) all owners and persons in charge of cattle in such village or area and in every village or other place within a radius of 1 mile of such village or area, shall keep their cattle tethered or securely penned so as to prevent them from straying.

4. Every person who within an infected area finds the carcase of any animal lying unburied, shall report the fact to the Chairman, who shall forthwith cause it to be buried in the manner aforesaid.

5. No person shall disenter the carcase of any animal which died of any infectious or contagious disease, or remove or keep for any purpose the flesh, hide, horns, hoofs, or other parts of the carcase of such animal.

6. Every owner of cattle in any infected herd or area shall, whenever the Chairman so directs, have his cattle subjected to such treatment or inoculation at such spot and by such person as may be specified by the Chairman in writing.

SUB-SECTION (13).

Cattle Trespass.

1. Every owner or person in charge of cattle shall tie up or pen such cattle at night, and tether or tend them by day.

2. No cattle shall be tethered upon or be allowed in any manner to stray on any village path or road.

SUB-SECTION (14).

Boundaries and Fences.

1. (1) The owner, lessee, occupier, or person in charge of every privately owned land shall mark the boundaries of such land by live fences, or ditches, or stones firmly embedded in the ground.

(2) In the case of any two adjoining lands the owners, lessees, occupiers, or persons in charge of both lands shall be jointly responsible for laying down, making, or erecting such boundaries and for maintaining them in good order : Provided, however, that it shall be lawful for the owner, lessee, or person in charge of either of such lands to erect or repair the boundary between such lands at his own expense in any manner chosen by him, all due precautions being taken to prevent damage being caused to trees or plantations on the other land.

2. Any person ordered by notice in writing by the Chairman to mark his boundary shall do so, in the manner and within the time specified in such notice.

3. If such boundary is not so marked within the specified time, the Chairman may cause the boundary to be defined by a surveyor, and the costs thereof may be recovered from the person making default as a debt due to the inhabitants of the subdivision.

4. No person shall knowingly or wilfully alter, deface, or injure the boundary of any land.

SUB-SECTION (15).

Nuisances.

1. The owner or owners, occupier, lessee, or person in charge of any land in which any well, artificial pit, or quarry is situated, shall cause such well, artificial pit, or quarry to be surrounded with a wall or a secure fence to a height of not less than 2 feet 6 inches above the level of the ground, and shall at all times maintain such wall or fence in a state of repair.

2. In the event of the failure of any person convicted under the foregoing rule, within 10 days of the date of such conviction, to erect or repair the aforesaid wall or fence the Chairman may order such wall or fence to be erected or repaired at the expense of the Committee and the costs thereof shall be recoverable from the said person as a debt due to the inhabitants of the subdivision.

3. The owner, lessee, occupier, or person in charge of every house or land within this subdivision shall keep his premises for a distance of 50 yards from any dwelling house or up to the boundary of his premises whichever is less, clean, and free from all weeds or rank and noisome vegetation, from all refuse or rubbish, and from receptacles likely to form breeding places for mosquitoes.

4. (1) Upon the conviction of any person of an offence under the foregoing rule 3, the Chairman may by notice in writing direct such person to clear his premises as required by the aforesaid rule within a specified time.

(2) In the event of the failure of such person to comply with such notice, the Chairman may authorize any officer or person in writing to enter upon such premises and carry out all the necessary work.

(3) The costs incurred in any such work shall on certification by the Chairman be recovered as a debt due to the inhabitants of the subdivision.

5. (1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman by notice in writing under his hand to order the owner, lessee, occupier, or person in charge of any land situate within the subdivision, within 14 days of the receipt of such notice, to fill in with earth all pits, trenches, holes, or hollows, natural or artificial, upon such land, if water is likely to collect and stagnate therein within 20 yards of any building used for human habitation.

(2) Any person failing or refusing to comply with any such notice shall be guilty of an offence.

6. (1) The Chairman may by order in writing direct any person to refrain from putting, pouring, or discharging any liquid or any other substance into any well, elu, or river or from committing any other act likely to befoul the same.

(2) Any person refusing, failing, or neglecting to obey any such order shall be guilty of an offence.

7. The owner, lessee, occupier, or person in charge of every house within the subdivision shall whitewash his house at least once a year with makulu, lime, or other suitable substance, and at any other time specified by notice in writing by the Chairman if by reason of an outbreak of epidemic disease such steps appear to him to be necessary.

8. No person shall place, deposit, or throw any filth, refuse, manure, timber, mats, garden produce, or other obstructive matter or articles on any village path or road or in any roadside drain.

9. No person shall halt or keep any cart on any village path or road longer than is reasonably necessary for loading or unloading.

10. Whenever the Chairman is satisfied that any tree, or any branch or other part or fruit of any tree is likely to fall upon any house or other building, or is in a condition dangerous to the occupants of any such house or other building or to any property of the inhabitants of this subdivision, or overhangs any paddy field or causes damages to such paddy field, or is near any road or path and is likely to affect the safety of persons going along or using such road or path, he may direct by notice in writing the owner, lessee, or other person in charge of the land on which such tree stands, to cut down and remove such tree, branch, or other part or fruit of such tree within such time as may be specified in such notice.

11. Whenever the Chairman is satisfied that any house, building, wall, or anything affixed thereto is likely to fall upon any house or other building, or is in a condition dangerous to the occupants of any such house or building or to any property of the inhabitants of this subdivision or is near any road or path and likely to affect the safety of persons going along or using such road or path, the

Chairman may by notice in writing direct the owner, lessee, or other person in charge of such house, wall, or building, to repair, take down, or secure such house, building, or wall, or anything affixed thereto, as the case may be, within such time as may be specified in such notice.

12. (1) If any person on whom a notice under either of the foregoing rules 10 and 11 has been served neglects, fails, or refuses to cut down and remove the specified tree, branch, part, or fruit, or to repair, take down, or secure such house, building, or wall, or anything affixed thereto, within the specified time, the Chairman shall refer the matter to the adjudication of the Village Tribunal.

(2) Such Village Tribunal may after such inquiry as may be necessary authorize the Chairman or such person as may be authorized by the Chairman in writing, to carry out the work specified in the notice in respect of which the default was made, and to recover the expenses incurred in carrying out such work by the sale of the tree, branch, part, or fruit cut down or of the materials, house, building, wall, or other thing taken down.

(3) In any case where such sale is for any reason not possible, or where only a part of the amount is realized by the sale, the full amount of the expenses or the balance, as the case may be, may be recovered as a debt due to the inhabitants of the subdivision.

13. (1) No person affected with a contagious or infectious disease shall enter or bathe or wash clothes or any other articles at any public well, spring, or bathing place.

(2) No person shall pollute or foul the water of any public well, spring, or bathing place.

14. No person shall ease himself by the side of any road or path or in any place where he may be visible to the public.

15. (1) Whenever the Committee by resolution defines areas within which all owners, lessees, or occupiers of premises used for human habitation shall be required to construct and maintain latrines, the Chairman may by notice in writing direct each such owner, lessee, or occupier to construct a latrine of such a type and size and in such a position and with such connecting drains as may have been determined by the Committee, and specify all such requirements in the notice.

(2) Every owner, lessee, or occupier of premises situated within such area who fails or neglects within 30 days of the service of any such notice to construct a latrine conforming in all respects to the requirements specified therein shall be guilty of an offence.

16. No pit latrines shall be constructed or maintained within a radius of 100 feet from any well except with the permission of the Chairman.

17. (1) It shall be the duty of the owner or the caretaker of any animal to bury its body in the event of its death.

(2) If default is made or if the owner or the caretaker is absent, the Chairman or any person authorized by him may cause such body to be buried.

(3) The cost of any such burial may in the first instance be met out of the funds of the Committee, but shall thereafter on being duly certified by the Chairman be recovered from the defaulting owner or caretaker as a debt due to the inhabitants of the subdivision without prejudice to the Committee's right to recover any fine that may be imposed for the breach of the rule.

18. No person shall wantonly deposit the carcase of any animal in premises belonging to any other person.

SUB-SECTION (17).

Toddy Drawing.

1. (1) Every owner or lessee of trees from which toddy is drawn, shall in coupling such trees use or cause to be used not less than four separate good and sound ropes for the feet and not less than three separate good and sound ropes for the hands.

(2) Each of the said ropes shall consist of not less than four strands, and at the end of every four months there shall be added two new ropes of this description for the feet and two for the hands.

2. The owner or lessee of every kitul or coconut tree which is tapped for toddy shall cause the pole used for climbing such tree to be renewed at intervals of not more than four months.

3. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or for any officer or person authorized by him in writing, at any time to enter any land whereon trees are being tapped for toddy and to inspect the couplings and poles.

SUB-SECTION (18).

Spring-guns and Traps.

1. (1) No person shall set any spring-gun, trap, or bow, or make any pitfall, without the permission in writing of the Chairman.

(2) The Chairman shall cause such permission to be proclaimed by beat of tom-tom at the expense of the applicant in all villages within a radius of 4 miles of the proposed location of such spring-gun, trap, bow, or pitfall.

SUB-SECTION (19).

Gambling and Cart-racing.

1. No person shall take part in gambling with dice or cards, or in any games of chance played for money or stakes, or in betting of any kind.

2. No person shall allow other persons to gamble with dice or cards, or to play any game of chance for money or stakes, in any house or land or vehicle or vessel occupied by him or under his control.

3. Any person who is found at any place or in any room, building, boat, vessel, or vehicle, in which gambling with dice or cards or any game of chance for money or stakes or betting is carried on to his knowledge, shall be guilty of an offence.

4. (1) No person shall engage in cart-racing on any public thoroughfare or on any village road or path.

(2) No person shall drive any vehicle on a public thoroughfare or on any village road or path in a rash, negligent, or furious manner.

5. No person shall train cocks for fighting or take part in cock-fighting in any place whatsoever within the subdivision.

SUB-SECTION (20).

Disorderly Conduct.

1. No person shall loiter without a light on any path, road, or thoroughfare or in any public place or about any hamlet between the hours of 9 P.M. and 5 A.M. without lawful cause.

2. It shall be an offence for any person to be found drunk and incapable of taking care of himself or behaving in a riotous or disorderly manner in any path, road, thoroughfare, or public place.

3. No person shall use abusive or indecent language with intent to annoy or to provoke any person or class of persons, or knowing or having reason to believe that such language is likely to annoy or provoke any person or class of persons, or to cause annoyance to the public, or to cause a breach of the peace.

4. No person shall cause annoyance to the public by singing indecent songs or making any unreasonably loud noise or creating any disturbance: Provided that nothing in this rule shall be deemed to affect the existing rights of the people in the matter of *bona fide* religious ceremonies and other orderly gatherings.

5. No person shall throw stones or filth at the house or into the compound of any other person, draw caricatures or indecent figures or write insulting expressions on any wall, building, or conspicuous object, or do any other act by which any individual is likely to be insulted or public decency outraged.

6. No person shall speak aloud or make any noise or behave in a violent or disorderly manner within the precincts of any Village Tribunal Court-house, so as to disturb the proceedings.

7. Every owner, possessor, or person having the control of a ferocious dog shall keep such dog muzzled or tied up between the hours of 6 A.M. and 9 P.M.

8. No person shall drive any vehicle or animal on any path or road or in any public place without a light between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

SUB-SECTION (30).

Excise.

1. It shall be an offence for any holder of a licence granted under the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912, or for the keeper of any tavern, to sell or allow any person to sell, to any boy under 16 years of age or to any female any description of spirits or other intoxicating liquor or fermented toddy of any kind or the fermented juice of the sugar-cane.

SUB-SECTION (32).

Loans and Sureties.

1. Any security given by the inhabitants in respect of any loan made to them, shall be signed by the Chairman on their behalf.

SUB-SECTION (34).

General.

1. No person shall wilfully set fire to any land set apart for any communal purpose without a permit in writing from the Chairman.

2. No person shall wilfully destroy or deface any notice, posted up by order of the Committee or the Chairman.

3. No person shall wilfully contravene the directions set out in any notice or remove any notice board, fence, post, or barrier, or other thing put up by the authority of the Chairman in the execution of any work commenced under these rules.

4. No person shall obstruct or resist the Chairman or any officer or person acting by the authority of the Chairman, in the discharge of his duties.

SECTION 36 (1).

Offices.

1. For the purpose of carrying into effect or supervising the working of the rules specified in column 1 of Schedule A hereto, the respective offices enumerated in column 2 are hereby created.

2. For the purpose of assisting the Chairman in carrying into effect or supervising the working of the rules generally, the offices enumerated in Schedule B are also hereby created.

BY-LAWS.

1. In the event of the death or resignation of the Chairman of this Council, it shall be the duty of the Vice-Chairman within three days from the date of such death or resignation to summon a meeting of the Council for a date within seven days of the death or resignation of such Chairman for the purpose of electing a successor. Should he fail or neglect to do so or should there be no Vice-Chairman in office, the Secretary for the time being in office shall summon such meeting within forty-eight hours of the expiry of the said three days for a date within the aforesaid period of seven days.

2. After the expiry of the term of office of the members of this Council, the Secretary for the time being in office shall summon the first meeting of the new Council to be held on a day within ten days from the beginning of the year.

BY-LAWS REFERRED* TO.

Meetings : Notice, Agenda, Quorum, &c.

1. (a) There shall be twelve General Meetings of the Council in every year for the transaction of business.

(b) The general meetings of the Council shall be held at the meeting room of the Council at least once every month on such day and at such hour as the Council may from time to time resolve, or as soon after that hour as may seem expedient to the Chairman.

(c) A special meeting may be held at the place aforesaid on such date and at such hour as the Chairman shall for each such meeting specially appoint.

(d) Notice of every such meeting and of the business to be transacted at it shall be served on each Councillor at least three days—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—before the meeting.

(e) No business shall be brought before or transacted at any meeting, general or special, other than the business specified in the notice of the meeting, without the permission of the Council.

(f) No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum of at least four Councillors is present.

(g) If at any meeting there is not a sufficient number of Councillors present to form a quorum, the Chairman shall adjourn the meeting to such date not more than fifteen days after the date of the meeting so adjourned as he thinks fit, and the business which would have been brought before the meeting so adjourned, if there had been a quorum present, shall be brought before, and disposed of, at such adjourned meeting.

Adjournment of Meetings.

2. (a) The Chairman of any meeting, general or special at which a quorum of the Council is present may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn the meeting from time to time; but no business shall be transacted without the permission of the Council at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which such adjournment took place.

(b) Notice of an adjourned meeting shall be served on members at least twenty-four hours before the time fixed for such meeting unless the original meeting decides to hold the adjourned sitting within twenty-four hours.

Presence of Strangers.

3. Strangers, including the Press, may be present at meetings in the places set apart for them, but must withdraw when called upon to do so by the Chairman, when in the opinion of the majority of the members of the Council present at the meeting, expressed by resolution, such exclusion is deemed advisable in the public interest.

Order of Business.

4. The business of the Council shall be transacted in the following order :—

(a) Confirmation of the minutes of the last preceding meeting.

(b) Memorials, petitions, complaints, and communications addressed to the Council shall be laid before the Council.

(c) Questions of which due notice has been given.

(d) Motions of which due notice has been given.

(e) Any other matter set down in the notice of the meeting in the order in which such matters are set out or in such order as the Council may for special reasons adopt.

(f) Monthly statements of receipts and disbursements, progress reports of works, and such other documents as are required by the Council, shall be submitted to the Council.

5. For all purposes connected with the Council, the precedence and seniority of Councillors shall be regulated as follows :—

After the Chairman shall rank the Vice-Chairman and then the Councillors in order of the priority of their nomination or election and in the case of former Councillors re-elected or re-nominated, of the priority of their continuous membership of Council (such continuous membership being deemed to be unimpaired during the absence of a nominated member for whom a temporary successor has been nominated).

Minutes.

6. The minutes of each meeting shall be circulated. At the next or some subsequent meeting the question shall be put that the minutes be taken as read and confirmed. In the absence of objection or correction, the minutes as recorded shall be confirmed.

Memorials, Petitions, &c.

7. (a) A member presenting a petition or memorial to the Council may state concisely the purpose of the petition or memorial.

(b) No member shall present any petition or memorial or other communication which is not respectful in tone throughout.

(c) It shall be competent for any member to move that such petition or memorial be read. In making such motion he shall state concisely his reasons for wishing to have it read.

(d) No debate shall be permitted on such motion, nor shall any other member speak upon or in relation to such petition or memorial, except to second the motion formally.

(e) Such motion being seconded, the question shall be put whether the petition or memorial shall be read.

Questions.

8. (a) Questions relating to the affairs of the Council may be put to the Chairman.

(b) At least seven clear days' notice—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—shall be given of such questions.

(c) A written reply shall be read by the Chairman to each question.

(d) No member shall address the Council upon any question, nor shall the terms of any question contain any argument or expression of opinion or statement of fact, except in so far as may be necessary to explain such question.

(e) Any member may put a supplementary question for the purpose of further elucidating any matter of fact regarding which an answer has been given.

Provided that the Chairman may disallow any supplementary question if, in his opinion, it infringes the rules as to the subject matter of questions, and in that case the question shall not appear on the record of the minutes of the Council.

Motions.

9. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing signed by the member of the Council giving the notice. Unless such notice has been in the hands of the Secretary seven clear days—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—before the meeting of Council, the motion may not be included in the agenda.

(b) All notices of motions shall be dated and numbered as received, and shall be entered by the Secretary upon the agenda in the order in which they are received.

(c) Before any notice of motion is placed on the agenda paper, it shall be submitted to the Chairman, who, if he be of opinion that it is out of order, shall order that such motion shall not be included in the agenda and shall cause the giver of the notice to be so informed.

(d) Every motion of which notice is given shall be relevant to some question affecting the administration of the Council's affairs.

(e) No motion to rescind any resolution which has been passed within the preceding six months, nor any motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived within the preceding six months, shall be deemed to be in order, unless notice thereof shall have been given and specified in the agenda, and the notice shall bear, in addition to the member who proposes the motion, the signatures of four other members; and when such motion has been disposed of, it shall not be competent for any member to propose any similar motion within the period of six months next following.

(f) No motion shall be deemed to have been submitted for debate until it shall have been proposed and seconded.

(g) Any member may second a motion or amendment by rising in his place and bowing to the Chair, without prejudice to his right to speak at a later period of the debate.

(h) Before any motion of which previous notice has not been given, is moved in Council, it shall be reduced to writing signed by the mover and handed to the Secretary.

(i) When a motion has been moved and seconded and the debate thereon concluded, the question thereupon shall be put to the vote by the Chairman.

Withdrawal of Motion or Amendment.

10. A member who has moved a motion or amendment may withdraw the same by leave of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon it after the mover has asked for permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Re-introduction of Motion.

11. A motion which has been withdrawn may be moved again at any subsequent meeting; but no motion shall be proposed which is the same in substance as any motion which within the period of six months referred to in rule 9 (e) shall have been resolved in the affirmative or negative.

Amendments.

12. (a) Every amendment shall be in writing and handed to the Secretary by the member proposing it.

(b) Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion during the discussion of which it is moved.

(c) Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

(d) No amendment shall be discussed or put to the Council until it shall have been seconded.

(e) A member who has seconded an amendment in a formal manner shall be permitted afterwards to speak upon it.

(f) Whenever an amendment to any motion under discussion has been moved and seconded, no second or subsequent amendment shall be moved until the first amendment shall have been disposed of. If an amendment be carried, the motion as amended shall take the place of the original motion, and shall become the question upon which any further amendment may be moved.

Debate ceases when Question fully put.

13. No member may speak to any question after the same has been fully put by the Chairman. A question is fully put when the voting has been taken thereon.

Voting and Recording of Votes.

14. (a) The question shall be put by the Chairman, and the votes may be taken by a show of hands or by a secret ballot as the Council decides, and the result shall be declared by the Chairman; but in any case where the votes are taken otherwise than by secret ballot, any member may call for a division, and in that event the votes shall be taken by the Secretary asking each member separately, according to the order of precedence, how he desires to vote, and recording the votes accordingly.

(b) On any question being put, whether in Council or in Committee of the whole Council, every member present shall record his vote, either for the ayes or the noes.

Casting Vote of Chairman.

(c) The Chairman shall have an original vote in common with other members whether in Council or Committee of the whole Council, and also a casting vote if upon any question the votes are equal.

Members dissenting.

15. It shall be competent for any Councillor, who is in a minority, to record the reasons for his dissent from the opinion of the majority, and such written dissent, if sent to the Secretary within one week of the meeting in question, shall be entered by the Secretary at the end of his minutes of the proceedings.

Order of the Day.

16. The "Order of the Day" shall include all business, arranged according to rule No. 4. Unless otherwise resolved the business shall be taken in the order printed.

Preservation of Order.

17. (a) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order, and his decision on all disputed points of order shall be final.

(b) Any member of the Council deviating from the rules may be immediately called to order by the Chairman of his own motion or on any other member of the Council rising to a point of order.

Decision of Questions of Order.

18. When the question of order has been stated, the member who raises it shall resume his seat, and no other member, except by leave of the Chairman, shall rise till the Chairman has decided the question, after which the member who was addressing the Council or Committee of the Council at the time the question was raised shall be entitled to proceed with his speech, if he conforms to the Chairman's ruling. If he does not conform, the Chairman may refuse to allow him to proceed with his speech.

Member not explaining or retracting.

19. Any member who fails to explain or to retract any objectionable words used by him, or to offer apologies for the use thereof to the satisfaction of the Council, may be censured or otherwise dealt with as the Council thinks fit.

Chairman speaking.

20. When the Chairman is addressing the Council or Committee of the Council, any member then standing shall immediately resume his seat.

Naming of Members.

21. (a) The Chairman may name any member immediately after the commission of the offence of disregarding the authority of the Chair, or of abusing the rules of the Council by persistently and wilfully obstructing the business of the Council, and the Chairman may forthwith put the question on a motion being made by any member or from the Chair (no amendment, adjournment, or debate being allowed) "that such member be suspended from the service of the Council".

(b) If any such motion be carried and any member be suspended under this rule, his suspension on the first occasion shall continue for one month, on the second occasion for two months, and on the third or subsequent occasion for three months.

(c) Not more than one member shall be named at the same time, unless several members present together have jointly disregarded the authority of the Chair.

(d) If any member or members acting jointly, who have been suspended under this rule from the service of the Council, shall refuse at any time during the period of suspension to obey the directions of the Chairman to withdraw from the precincts of the Council Chamber, the Chairman may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his decision.

Irrelevance or Tedious Repetition.

22. The Chairman after having called the attention of the Council or Council in Committee to the conduct of a member who persists in irrelevance or tedious repetition, either of his own arguments or of the arguments used by other members in debate, may direct the member to discontinue his speech.

Disorderly Conduct.

23. (a) The Chairman may order members whose conduct is grossly disorderly to withdraw immediately from the Council Chamber during the remainder of the meeting, and may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his order.

(b) If on any occasion the Chairman deems that his powers under this rule are inadequate he may name such member or members in pursuance of rule 21.

Duty to obey Order of Suspension or Withdrawal.

24. Members who are suspended under rule 21, or are directed to withdraw under rule 23, shall forthwith withdraw from the precincts of the Council Chamber.

Power to adjourn.

25. An adjournment of the discussion of any question may be moved by a Councillor at any time, and, if seconded, shall be forthwith put to the vote.

26. In the event of grave disorder arising at any meeting of the Council or Committee of the Council, the Chairman may, if he thinks it necessary to do so, adjourn the meeting without putting the question of adjournment to the house, or suspend the meeting for a time to be named by him.

Rules for Members speaking.

27. In speaking to any proposition under consideration of the Council or a Committee of the whole Council, the following rules shall be strictly observed:—

(a) Every member shall address his observations to the Chairman, and shall speak standing except in Committee.

(b) He shall not be interrupted unless he is out of order.

- (c) When he has finished his observations he shall resume his seat, and any other member wishing to address the Council may rise.
- (d) A member shall not read his speech, but he may read extracts from written or printed papers in support of his argument.
- (e) If two members rise at the same time, the Chairman shall call on the member who first catches his eye.
- (f) Every member shall confine his observations to the subject under consideration.
- (g) No member shall impute improper motives to any other member.
- (h) All remarks of a personal nature shall be avoided.
- (i) A member may speak to the question before the Council or any amendment proposed thereto.
- (j) No member shall speak more than once on any proposition before the Council, except in explanation or to order, or when the Council is in Committee, or as is provided by rule 12 (e).
- (k) By the indulgence of the Council, a member may explain matters of a personal nature, although there be no question before the Council, but such matters may not be debated, and he must confine himself strictly to the vindication of his own conduct.
- (l) The mover of any resolution or motion may reply after all the members present have had an opportunity of addressing the Council and before the question is put, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers, and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate. The right of reply shall not extend to the mover of an amendment.

Committee of Council.

28. The Council may at any time resolve themselves into a committee of the whole Council, and, on their resuming, the result of their deliberations shall be dealt with by the Council.

29. It shall be competent for any member at any stage of any discussion in a committee of the whole Council to move that the Council do resume. The question shall be put to the vote by the Chairman, and if the motion is carried, the Council will immediately resume from committee.

Special Committees.

30. (a) The Council may from time to time appoint from among their own number such special or standing committees, consisting of such number of Councillors as they think fit for the purpose of inquiring into and reporting upon any matters connected with the purposes of the Local Government Ordinance.

(b) No such committee shall take any proceedings after the close of the year during which it shall have been so appointed as aforesaid.

(c) The quorum for the meetings of every such committee shall be two, unless otherwise specially fixed.

(d) In the absence of the Chairman at a meeting of any Committee, the members present shall choose one of their own members to preside, and such member shall for that meeting have all the powers of the Chairman.

(e) When a committee shall have agreed to a report the same shall be signed by each of the members thereof and shall, together with the minutes of proceedings, be submitted to the Council.

(f) In the event of any division taking place in a committee, a record thereof shall be entered in the minutes together with the motion or resolution proposed, the name of the proposer, and the respective votes of the members present, and such minutes shall be submitted with the report of such committee.

31. The Press shall be excluded from all meetings of special and standing committees.

- (vii.) act as travel agent in order to increase tourist traffic to Ceylon; and
- (viii.) perform such other duties in connection with trade matters that may be imposed on him from time to time by the Registrar-General and Director of Commercial Intelligence.

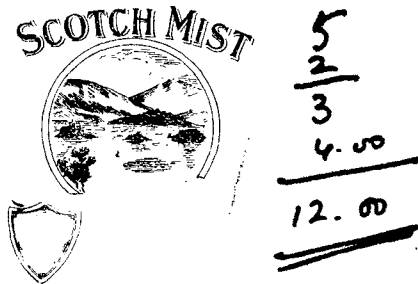

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 25, 1936, at 8.45 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated July 21, 1936.

Present: Mr. F. C. Gimson, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. W. Beven; Mr. O. T. Nettelton; Dr. D. T. de Kretser; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar.

The Chairman on behalf of the Council congratulated Mr. W. A. B. Soysa on the honour conferred on him—J.P. for the Province—on the occasion of His Majesty the King's Birthday.

Mr. Soysa replied and thanked the Chairman and Members.

1. The minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on July 16, 1936, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1935 to June 30, 1936, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for June, 1936.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June, 1936.
- (e) Reservoir readings for the week ended July 25, 1936.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—

- (a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during June, 1936.
- (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

4. Petitions:—Mr. Usoof Ismail presented (1) Petition from Mr. R. Kamaldeen for a common water tap to his premises Nos. 1A-N, Slaughter-house road, and 211-212E, Peradeniya road. Mr. Marikar presented (2) Petition from Mr. H. A. Charles Singho re closing of the water tap No. 3, in Malabar street.

Ratwatte Adigar presented (3) Petition from Mrs. W. G. S. de Mel re Fish Stall No. 68, Public Market.

Mr. De Silva presented (4) Petition from Mr. J. H. Jayasinghe intimating his willingness to pay Rs. 6,000 for the right to obtain coupons for the portion of tea land in the catchment area up to December, 1936.

(5) Petition from Mr. T. V. Upanis for the block of land he had leased from Government in Bahirawakanda.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the petitions and take necessary action.

4A. Mr. de Silva brought to the notice of the Chairman that the Minister for Labour stated in the State Council that in Kandy there were only 81 unemployed and inquired whether this was officially conveyed.

The Chairman pointed out that the letter to the Controller of Labour was to the effect that only 81 applied for work.

Mr. de Silva gave notice that he would bring up a motion on the question of unemployment at the next meeting.

4B. Pursuant to notice Mr. Ismail asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied:—

Q.—(a) What sum was outstanding as electricity arrears not recovered from consumers when the Electricity Department Accounts were transferred to the office of the Council, and what part of this amount has been recovered and what part of it written off as irrecoverable?

A.—Electricity Department accounts were transferred to the Account's Department in the Town Hall in several stages. The bulk of the accounts were transferred on June 1, 1926. On this date the arrears amounted to Rs. 38,138.78. A statement of irrecoverables written off is being prepared and will be submitted at the next meeting.

Q.—(b) What amount has been written off from year to year since as irrecoverable?

A.—A statement is being prepared and will be submitted at the next meeting.

Q.—(c) What sum is outstanding as arrears unrecovered from January up to May 31, 1936?

A.—The arrears outstanding on July 24, 1936, in respect of the 5 months, January to May, 1936, are as follows:— January Rs. 12.65, February Rs. 28.48, March Rs. 49.93, April Rs. 117.36, May Rs. 525.57.

Q.—(d) Whether it is true that actual work connected with the computation of amounts involved in the reading of meters and on job works executed for customers is still attended to by the Electricity Department, and that these statements are sent to the Head Office only for purposes of necessary ledger entries?

A.—No.

Q.—(e) How many clerks are employed (i.) at the Power Station under the Municipal Electrical Engineer?

A.—5 clerks under the Municipal Electrical Engineer.

Q.—(ii.) at the Municipal Office under the Accountant, exclusively for the Electricity Department Accounts work?

A.—7 clerks under the Accountant.

4c. Pursuant to notice Mr. Wijayatilake asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied:—

Q.—Will the Chairman be pleased to state—(1) If the Committee appointed to formulate a Playground Scheme held any meetings during the past 12 months?

A.—A meeting of the Committee was held on December 14, 1935.

Q.—(2) If so, if any decision was arrived at by such Committee?

A.—The Committee considered the grounds available for games and the nature of games.

Q.—(3) If any decision was arrived at why it has not been reported to this Council?

A.—The Committee has made no report to the Council. The Secretary states that further meetings of the Committee were not convened on his initiative in view of the late Chairman's remark that he was in favour of starting the Scheme in 1937.

5. To sanction the expenditure of Rs. 527.14 incurred on the storage tank in excess of the amount contracted for. Resolved that the excess expenditure be sanctioned.
