THE ROAD ORDINANCE, 1861.

Order.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies to sanction the substitution of the following section for the existing section 14 (i.) of the Minutes on the Ceylon Civil Service dated January 13, 1932:

(i.) Cadets, who must be natural-born British subjects of European or Ceylonese descent, or of mixed European and Ceylonese descent, are selected by open competitive examination field by the Civil Service Commissioners. No candidate will be regarded as of Ceylonese descent unless he is the son of Sinhalese, Burgher, Ceylon Tamil, Ceylon Moor, or Ceylon Malay parents.

The Givernor may, however, grant a candidate who is a natural-born British subject, normally resident in Ceylon and whose family connections and interests are in Ceylon, permission to sit for the

examination.

Any person of Ceylonese descent desiring to present himself for the open competitive examination in London will be required to obtain a nomination from the Governor. For the purposes of this and the following sub-sections, candidates of mixed European and Ceylonese descent will be regarded as Ceylonese. A married candidate will not be appointed without prior reference by the Secretary of State to the Governor in the case of candidates examined in London, and without the explicit consent of the Governor in every case. No pledge of eventual appointment will be given to such a candidate in anticipation of the result of the examination.

THE CEYLON STATE MORTGAGE BANK ORDINANCE, 1931.

THE following rule made under section 90 (d) of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank Ordinance, 1931, by the Board of Directors is hereby published for general information.

Delete the rule made ander section 90 (d) of the Ordings published in the lazette of August 12, 1932, and distitute the following therefor:

1. The valuation required in the present fair market value of the property, or in other words, the price the property would fetch if sold in the open market at the date of inspection.

2. Wherever possible the tair market value should be ascertained by the method of capitalization of income.

3. In making valuations allowance should be made for items of capital expenditure that will obviously

for items of capital expenditure that will obviously

- become necessary in the near future.
 4. In valuing Urban properties the properties should be considered as a whole and valuations should not usually be made by adding together the separate values of buildings and land. Valuators should however indicate at what rate they would value similar bare land suitable for buildings situated in the neighbourhood. Where the extent of land on which the building stands exceeds that required as a normal appurtenant to a building of its size, the value of such additional land, if capable of independent development, should be added and details given in the valuation report.
- Valuators should not take into account future ossibilities which may improve the value of the security but which may not mature.
- Valuators should check their valuation by a consideration of one or more of the following methods:
 - (1) The price paid for the same property or a portion of it in recent years, after making all necessary allowances for lapse of time, difference of situation, and any other possible differences between the property sold and that offered as security. Inquiry should also be directed to ascertaining:
 - (a) Whether for any special reason the purchaser has paid a fancy price for it and
 - (b) Whether there has been any rise or fall in the value of land in the neighbourhood since the date of his purchase.
 - (2) The price paid for property of similar description and quality in the vicinity in recent years, after making all proper allowances for lapse of time, advantage of situation, &c. In considering such sales, care should be taken to exclude all transactions in which, taking advantage of the pressing need of the buyer, the seller obtained as the price of the land a much larger amount than its proper value. The buyer may have paid the particular price for the land because no other land suited his requirements. The value to be fixed by the Bank will however be only such an amount as the owner would have been likely to get if he had wanted to sell it in the open market and there had been no neighbour compelled by circumstances to purchase it. When considering the case of neighbouring lands which have been sold, the transactions should be compared with the case of the land to be mortgaged to see in what points they do or do not resemble each other.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, July 11, 1936, at 9 a.m. pursuant to notice dated July 7, 1936.

Present.—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. A. Kahaduwa; and Mr. G. Ross Bell.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on June 20, 1936, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. A petition and a letter were presented by Mr. W. Dahanayaka. These were tabled, and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Before proceeding with the business on the agenda the following question was, with the permission of the Council, asked by Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab:—"Will the Chairman be pleased to make a full statement on the cause and the nature of the electric light failure in the Galle Lighthouse, and how far, if at all, the Council's Electricity Department is to blame for it?"

The Chairman replied as follows:—"The electric light failure in the Galle Lighthouse was not due to any fault in the Council's mains or apparatus, but to a defective fitting in the lighthouse itself, which was first discovered at about 7 P.M. on the day previous to the fire. This was not reported to the Municipal Electricity Department as it did not concern the Council's mains, and was attended to by the Covernment Electrical Inspector. At the time the fire occurred, i.e., about 4 A.M., the lighthouse was being operated by oil lamps which caused the fire. The Power Station received a telephone message from the Signal Station at 4:10 A.M. that 'the lighthouse was on fire' and immediately the current in the whole of the Fort area was switched off."

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:—(1) (a) How many cases of tuberculosis and how many deaths from it have been reported in each of the months, January to June, this year? (b) How many of these patients have gone to an anti-tuberculosis institute? (c) Has the Medical Officer of Health visited each case and given the necessary instructions? (d) What, in brief, are the instructions he gives? (e) Will the Chairman please get these instructions printed and distributed? (2) (a) Does not the Chairman consider a flea survey of the town an urgent necessity? (b) Is the Supervisor of the Anti-Plague Campaign competent enough to carry out such a survey? (c) If so, will the Chairman please make arrangements to set him to this work without further delay? (d) If he is not so competent, what other steps does the Chairman propose to take? (3) (a) Has the work in connection with the extention of electric lighting to Hirimbura-Labuduwa been completed within the time specified in the contract? (b) Is it true that the Chairman has given an extension of time to the contractors without consulting the Council? (c) What penalty was laid down in the contract for failure to complete the work by the specified date? (d) Why did the Chairman not consult the Council before giving an extension of time? (e) Will the Chairman please see that no further extension of time is given without the sanction of the Council? (4) (a) Has the attention of the Chairman been drawn to an editorial in the "Times of Ceylon" of June 23, 1936, in which certain criticisms are based on the statistics found in the Chairman's Administration Report for 1934? (b) Will the Chairman please confirm what I discovered while perusing this report, that the infant mortality figures given in it are incorrect, and that the correct figures are as stated in the Administration Report for 1935?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) January: 5 cases and 3 deaths; February: 4 cases and 2 deaths; March: 12 cases and 7 deaths; April: 4 cases and 1 death; May: 1 case and no deaths; June: 11 cases and 4 deaths. (b) Seven. (c) The Medical Officer of Health has not visited each patient, as some of the cases have been reported to him as deaths, whilst others have been reported as being treated in an anti-tuberculosis institute or in a hospital. (d) The instructions given by the Medical Officer of Health relate to (1) the isolation of the patient and the disinfection and proper disposal of any infected materials and discharges; (2) the attention which should be paid to the patient as regards his diet and treatment, in case he is not being treated by a doctor; (3) the advantages both to the patient and the other inmates of the house if the former is removed to an anti-tuberculosis institute or sanatorium; and (4) the danger to which the other inmates are exposed if these instructions are not carried out. (e) Leaflets printed in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil giving

general instructions regarding the precautionery measures to be adopted in the case of infectious diseases are always issued to the chief occupant of a house when an infectious disease is investigated. Arrangements are now being made to distribute special leaflets for Phthisis. (2) (a) Yes, and arrangements were accordingly made in 1935 for the Entomologist of the Medical and Sanitary Department to carry out the work early this year. Unfortunately, the Entomologist has had to postpone the survey until August, owing to pressure of work due to the Malarial Epidemic. (b) It was considered more advisable to have important work of this nature attended to by an expert, such as the Government Entomologist. (c) and (d) In view of the above replies these questions do not arise. (3) (a) No. (b) Yes. (c) The payment by the contractors of a sum of Rs. 25 as liquidated damages, and not a penalty, for each and every day after the expiration of the time agreed upon for the completion of the contract or for each and every day after the final authorized extended date until the work is completely finished. (d) According to the terms of the agreement entered into with the contractors the Chairman is completely finished. (d) According to the terms of the agreement entered into with the contractors the Chairman is empowered at his discretion and for any reason which may appear to him to be reasonable to extend the date specified in the agreement for the completion of the work. An extension of one month's time was allowed on the recommendation of the Government Electrical Engineer who stated that the delay was due to way-leave difficulties at the commencement of the contract and the alteration to the design of the Transformer Kiosk, for which the contractors could not be held responsible. (e) In view of the reply given to the previous question I do not think it is necessary to obtain the sanction of the Council, unless, of course, I consider that any request for a further extension is unreasonable. (4) (a) Yes. (b) The infant mortality figure for 1934 was 177 and the rate per 1,000 births for the same year was 156. The figures mentioned for 1934 in the Administration Report of that year are incorrect owing to a clerical error. The figures as given in the Administration Report for 1935 are correct. Administration Report for 1935 are correct.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab asked the following questions:—(1) Has the Chairman received complaints from the public protesting against the manner in which the regulation made under the Vehicles Ordinance and the Motor Car Ordinance, respectively, prohibiting the parking of vehicles along Main street is being enforced by the Police?

(2) Has the Chairman's attention been drawn to the fact that very often Police Constables do not allow vehicles to halt in front of shops to take in goods and unload goods?

(3) Since the public who have business in Main street are the greatly in the Chairman hand goods? inconvenienced, will the Chairman be pleased to instruct the Police to give sufficient time for vehicles to load and unload

The Chairman replied as follows: -(1) Only one such complaint has been received from S. U. Mohammedo Hadjiar of 70 and 71, Main street. (2) The Superintendent of Police reports that vehicles unloading and loading in Main street, between Dickson road junction and Hirimbura road junction, are not interfered with by the Police, except when such vehicles have halted there longer than is reasonably necessary for the purpose of loading or unloading. (3) In view of the

previous reply this question does not arise.

6. The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayaka was, with the permission of Council, withdrawn by the mover as the matter was already on the agenda for consideration:—"That necessary action be taken to ensure a satisfactory service in the sale of mutton."

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) That the Four Standing Committees do consider and report on regulation 89 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance of 1897, with a view to securing certain

amendments in it to suit the conditions in Galle. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.

The Chairman said he did not think it would be any use asking that the regulations be amended for Galle, because it was the intention of the Government to have more or less the same regulations for the whole Island. He had no objection to the Four Standing Committees considering the matter, but he certainly had his doubts that any good would be obtained thereby.

Messrs. J. E. Perera and Thomas Amarasuriya also spoke. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail said that prosecutions under the regulations should not be instituted until the Council has considered the report of the Four Standing Committees. The Chairman gave an undertaking accordingly. The motion was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(2) That a public latrine be erected near the new bus stand. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded. On the suggestion

of the mover it was agreed that the matter be referred to the Standing Committees on Works and Sanitation for joint

consideration.

To consider the following extract from the minutes of the Four Standing Committees of June 6, 1936: consider Mr. W. Dahanayaka's motion of March 14, 1936, viz.:—In view of the fact that Galle is a distributing centre for rice and the central Government derives considerable revenue from this source, this Council requests the central Government to bear half the cost of constructing rat proof granaries in Galle."—Recommended that the site of the "Public Hall," Coal shed, and Cart shed be selected for the purpose of erecting approximately 42 grain stores".

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee-

The Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.

Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved as an amendment that the recommendation be deferred for consideration at some date. Mr. A. Kahaduwa seconded.

The Chairman accepted the amendment which was then put to the meeting and declared lost, four voting for and

Mr. J. E. Perera thereupon moved the following amendment:—That the Central Government be requested to bear half the cost of erecting 42 grain stores in Galle costing approximately Rs. 75,000 and on a site to be selected later in consultation with the Government Health authorities. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried unanimously.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above resolution of the Council in Committee be adopted-Carried.

9. To consider the control of the sale of mutton and the rates fixed by Council therefor. The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee recommended, after discussion, that the "mutton" butchers be dealt with by the Chairman for disobeying the orders of the Council and that they be informed that their complaint about the present rates will not be investigated until such time as they resume the sale of mutton at the rates fixed by the Council.

Council in Committee recommended, further, that the Chairman be authorized to take the necessary steps with regard to the application made by Mr. M. S. D. Ismail for a licence under the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance to

import goats and sheep into Galle.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

(b) Constructing a public latrine for males on the sea beach at the Galle Bazaar.—Rocommended the acceptance of the tender of K. P. Hinniappuhamy for Rs. 998·70.

(c) Cutting and filling along and within the trace of the new Kanampitiya road.—Recommended the acceptance of the tender of R. W. H. Robert, provided he undertakes to carry out the whole work for Rs. 3,400 which is the amount of

the Municipal Engineer's estimate.

Resolution.

With regard to item (4) (a) it was resolved to accept the tender of P. Weerasinghe for Rs. $1,034 \cdot 25$ and with regard to item (4) (c) it was resolved to accept the tender of R. W. H. Robert for Rs. 3,400 inclusive of the item of Rs. 300 for "Contingencies."

The recommendations of the Standing Committees with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

(b) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of June 30, 1936.

(3) List of demolished buildings in Wards 4, 5, 5A, and 6.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(4) Considered the question of waiving the rates due for 1936 on property No. 335, Kumbalwella, on the ground of poverty of the owner.—Recommended that the rates due for 1936 amounting to Rs. 3.99 be waived on the ground of poverty of the owner.

(5) Considered a proposal for doing away with the appointment of a Tax Collector for the Fort Ward.—Recommended (1) that the appointment of a Tax Collector for the Fort Ward be dispensed with as from October 1, 1936; (2) that as an experiment another officer (who should be called "Clerk and Distraining Officer") be appointed with effect from that date on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem for a period of one year; and (3) that the Chairman be authorized to interview the present acting Collector and ascertain whether he would be suitable for the new post in case he wishes to apply for it.

(6) Considered an application from the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, for two stopwatches for use

within Municipal limits.—Recommended that two stopwatches be supplied at a cost of Rs. 72.

(7) Considered the question of increasing the annual tax on female dogs.—Recommended that with effect from January 1, 1937, the annual tax on female dogs be increased from Re. 1 50 to Rs. 2 and that the necessary steps be taken to amend the by-law accordingly.

The Chairman, however, was of opinion that the annual tax on female dogs should be increased to Rs. 3.

(8) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 800 for the purchase of a portable insulating oil-testing apparatus for the Electricity Department.—Recommended.

(9) To approve the appointment of a temporary canvasser for a period of six months in connection with the Assisted Wiring Scheme which has been sanctioned by the Council.—Recommended that a temporary canvasser be appointed for a period of six months from August 1, 1936, on a salary of Rs. 30 per mensem and an additional payment of a bonus of 50 cents per lamp in respect of each new consumer canvassed by him.

Resolution.

With regard to item (5) recommendations (1) and (2) were adopted, and as regards recommendation (3) Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved that K. Warusawitharana, the present acting Collector, be appointed to the new post with effect from October 1, 1936. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item (7) Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved as an amendment that the annual tax on female dogs be increased to Rs. 3 from January 1, 1937. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, four voting for and five against. It was then resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to this item be adopted.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were also adopted.

(c) Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of June 30, 1936.

(2) Considered further the draft by-laws on dairies in accordance with the suggestions made by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.—Recommended that the draft by-laws, as amended, be approved.

Resolution.

Resolved that consideration be deferred till the next meeting and that meanwhile the draft by-laws, as amended, be circulated to the members.

11. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, August 15, 1936, at 9 A.M.

12. At the conclusion of the business of the meeting the Chairman moved that in terms of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, Mr. C. H. Bradley, who having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings of the Council, had ipso facto cased to be a Member, be restored to office. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Extract from the Statutes.

The duties of every Professor shall include original work by the Professor himself and the general supervision of research and advanced work in his subject and department.

The Professor shall reside within the University during six months at least in each academical year, between the first day of October and the ensuing first day of August, and shall lecture or hold classes in each Term during that period.

He shall give, or hold, not less than thirty-six lectures, or classes, in each academical year, of which not less than twenty-eight shall be lectures. His lectures or classes shall extend over a period not less in any Term than six weeks and not less in the whole than twenty weeks, and in two of the three Terms he shall lecture, or hold classes, at least twice a week in each of six weeks.

The Professor of Social Anthropology shall lecture and give instruction in Social Anthropology and shall have charge of the Library of Social Anthropology, of which the collections of books presented by Sir E. B. Tylor and Dr. W. Sanday form part.

The Professor may be permitted from time to time by the Visitatorial Board to take a period of absence for travel and research without loss of income.
