IT is hereby notified that the Public Service Regulations published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, have been amended by the deletion of Regulation 61 (Correction Slip No. 23) and the substitution of the following new regulation therefor:—

61. When an officer appointed on probation is confirmed in his appointment, the confirmation will date as from his first appointment. Subject to the following provisos, an extension of the probationary period will operate as a deferment of increment by the period of such extension.

Proviso (1). When an officer's failure to qualify for confirmation is judged to be due to reasons *beyond his control*, His Excellency the Governor may allow a further reasonable period within which to qualify for confirmation. If the officer qualifies within that period his confirmation will be antedated to the normal date. Under this proviso an officer will not lose in salary or seniority.

Proviso (2). When an officer fails to qualify for confirmation at the proper time and such failure is judged to be due to circumstances *within his control*, the officer will enter the scale of a confirmed officer on the date on which he qualifies for confirmation and will rank as junior to all officers of his grade in his department who at that time have already been confirmed. The question of restoring to him the salary which he would have enjoyed if his confirmation had not been delayed will, however, receive consideration on the expiration of five years from the conclusion of the normal probationary period, and, if the circumstances of his case are regarded as meriting it, he will thenceforth be allowed to draw salary at the rate which he would have drawn if his confirmation had taken place at the proper time. He will not, however, save in very exceptional cases, be restored to the seniority which he otherwise would have held.

Note: Where an officer's incremental date is not the same as the date of his appointment (as may happen under Financial Regulation 847 in the case of officers promoted on

probation), the effect of an extension of the probationary period (save as provided in proviso (1) above) will be to defer by the period of such extension the next increment even though this increment may fall due after the expiry of the extended probationary period.

1. Customs Clerical Service.

APPLICATIONS are invited to fill one or more vacancies which will occur shortly in the Customs Clerical Service. These posts will be filled in accordance with the regulations published below. Attention is specially invited to regulations 2 (2) and 2 (5) regarding age limits and educational qualifications respectively.

Appointments will be on two years' probation in the first instance and will be on the salary scale recommended by the Select Committee on Salaries and Cadres Commission, 1932, namely, Rs. 576 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 90 and Rs. 96 to Rs. 2,352 per annum. Appointments are pensionable.

Persons appointed, who are new entrants to the Public Service are not entitled to rent allowance, or to commute any part of their pension and will be eligible for leave and holiday warrants in terms of Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934.

CUSTOMS CLERICAL SERVICE.

The following regulations for filling vacancies in the Customs Clerical Service are published for general information:—

Regulations.

1. Vacancies in the Customs Clerical Service (Grade II.) will be filled in one or other of the three following methods:—

- (a) By selection by a Board from candidates successful in an examination for which candidates whether from within or from outside the present Government Service will, subject to the terms and conditions laid down below, be eligible.
- (b) by transfer from other departments, subject to the conditions hereinafter laid down.
- (c) by merit promotion from subordinate appointments in the Customs Service.

Provided that not more than one candidate in four shall be recruited by methods (b) and (c) combined.

2. Vacancies for appointments by method 1 (a).—(1) These vacancies will be advertised in the *Government Gazette* and in such other manner as the Principal Collector of Customs may consider desirable. The advertisements will state the date and time by which all applications must reach the Customs Office, and all applications received after that date will be considered.

(2) Candidates must have completed their twentieth and not have exceeded their 27th year of age on the last day for receiving applications. The production of a birth certificate in support of the candidate's claim to be qualified by age will be an indispensable requirement.

(3) Only British subjects whose families are permanently resident in Ceylon will be eligible.

(4) Candidates must produce a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person. In the case of a candidate who has been educated at a Government or Assisted School the certificate must be signed by the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended. The Principal Collector of Customs will decide whether the certificate is satisfactory or not.

(5) Candidates must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed at least—

- (a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or
- (b) The Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or
- (c) The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate Examination (English), and either (i.) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce, or (ii.) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce.

(6) Applications under 1 (a) must be officially addressed to "the Principal Collector of Customs" in the form prescribed below (which can be obtained from H. M. Customs, Colombo, on application) and must bear a duly cancelled Rs. 10 stamp. Any application personally addressed to any official by name will not receive consideration.

(7) Candidates whose applications are found to be in order will be informed of the place, date, and hour at which they should present themselves for examination. This examination will be conducted by the Director of Education and will consist of an English Essay, and papers in English, Arithmetic with Elementary Mathematics, and a general intelligence test.

No candidate will be considered as having passed who does not obtain a satisfactory standard in English, Handwriting, and Arithmetic.

(8) Candidates who are successful in the above examination will be interviewed by a Board consisting of the Principal Collector of Customs, the Director of Education, and the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services or senior officers of their departments nominated by them, who will make the final selection.

(9) Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

3. Vacancies for appointment by method 1 (b).—(1) Vacancies will be notified by circular to the Heads of those Departments which have in their cadre members of the General Clerical Service and other departmental clerical hands eligible for appointment to the Customs Department. They will not be gazetted or otherwise advertised. Applications may be made by letter through the Head of the Department, and no special form is required. The final date for receipt of applications will be stated in the notice.

(2) Candidates who are otherwise eligible under 3 (1) must have served at least five years under Government, and must not have attained the age of 30 years before the final date notified for receipt of applications.

(3) Candidates must produce a certificate signed or countersigned by the Head of their Departments that they have served with competence and intelligence and that their educational standard is sufficient for the due performance of clerical duties.

(4) Candidates should state which, if any, of the qualifications specified in rule 2 (5) they possess, and must be prepared to produce proof of such possession if called upon to do so.

(5) After examination of all applications received within due time the Principal Collector of Customs will call on such candidates as appear therefrom to be *prima facie* likely to be suitable to appear before him or before a Staff Officer nominated by him for a personal interview. Thereafter the Principal Collector of Customs will make his final selection in terms of Public Service Regulation 26.

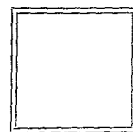

RULES made by the Ratnapura Urban District Council, under section 60 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920, and approved by the Local Government Board, are published for general information.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. The resthouse is intended primarily for the use of travellers. Every person using any part of it as an office or place of business during his occupation of the resthouse shall pay a special charge of 50 cents for each hour or part thereof for each such use of any part of the resthouse. Every person so using the resthouse shall desist from doing so upon being requested by the resthouse-keeper, whose duty it is to consult the comfort and convenience of the occupants of the resthouse. Resthouse fees are payable by all persons using the resthouse and/or garage. Provided, however, that it shall be competent for the Chairman to permit the use of the resthouse or any part thereof on special occasions at a charge of Rs. 10 for occupation only.

2. Every person other than infants, using the resthouse or garage is separately chargeable for occupation, provided that—

(a) The servant of a traveller who occupies the resthouse may be allowed to sleep within the resthouse without the payment of any occupation fees.

(b) A chauffeur, whose car or whose master's car is garaged in the resthouse premises, may be permitted to sleep in the car or in the garage without the payment of the said fees.

3. Each visitor must sign his or her name in the resthouse book on entering the resthouse, and until this is done a visitor shall not be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments.

4. No person shall occupy any portion of the resthouse for more than 3 consecutive days, without the special authority in writing of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

5. Travellers shall note in the resthouse book only those resthouse charges which are payable to the Urban District Council.

6. The resthouse fees shall be in accordance with the tariff appended hereto, and shall be paid in cash on demand. In default further supplies will be refused. The attention of visitors is invited to Ordinance No. 33 of 1908, a copy of which shall be exhibited, together with these rules, in some conspicuous place in the resthouse.

7. No room shall be reserved unless engaged at least one day in advance, but when so engaged shall be paid for whether occupied or not, provided that until the arrival of the person or persons engaging accommodation, the accommodation shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.

8. The resthouse-keeper is authorized to take no notice of telegrams asking him to prepare meals, when the name and address of the sender are not given.

9. Beds, sofas, or couches in the resthouse shall not be used for the purpose of sleeping without sheets. A breach of this rule will involve a charge of Rs. 5.

10. The value of all articles damaged or broken by visitors is to be paid in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

11. Any complaint which a traveller may have to make about the resthouse or the resthouse-keeper, should be noted in the complaint book, which the resthouse-keeper is bound to produce when asked for, or should be communicated to the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

12. The resthouse-keeper will exercise ordinary care for the safety of luggage brought to the resthouse by visitors but the Council accepts no liability for any loss of such luggage or other property so brought in by them.

13. Visitors are not permitted to bring dogs into resthouse.

14. A breach of any of the above rules will render the offender liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 50, unless a lesser penalty is provided by the particular rule, and such penalty shall be recoverable as a fine as provided by section 11 (1) (b) of Ordinance No. 21 of 1901.

15. The rules dated November 6, 1922, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,296 of November 10, 1922, and the rule dated October 14, 1925, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,493 of October 23, 1925, are hereby repealed.

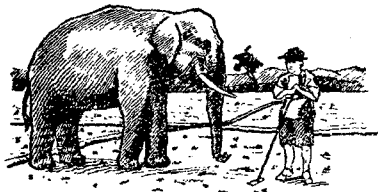
