Rent at the following rates shall be paid to the Municipal Council for the use of any meter fixed in any house or

premises for each of the quarters commencing on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October of each year :—

3 inch meter Rs. 35 per quarter.

2 inch meter Rs. 20 per quarter.

1½ inch meter Rs. 15 per quarter.

1 inch meter Rs. 7 per quarter.

¾ inch meter Rs. 5·75 per quarter.

½ inch meter Rs. 4·40 per quarter.

⅜ inch meter Rs. 3 per quarter.

For a period of less than one quarter a proportionate rent may be charged, and the balance sum out of the quarter's rent paid under this by-law shall be paid back by the Council to the person making such payment.

The Leave By-laws applicable to Ceylonese officers and servants appointed to the Municipal Service on or after January 1, 1935, published by Proclamation dated October 22, 1935, in *Gazette* No. 8,164 of November 1, 1935, are hereby amended as follows :—

1. In by-law 15 by the deletion of paragraph (iii.) thereof and the substitution of the following for that paragraph :—

“(iii.) In case of illness due to accidents arising out of their employment and not due to their own culpable carelessness, such employees irrespective of length of service may, with the sanction of the Chairman, be granted full-pay leave up to a maximum of one month in a calendar year. If it is considered desirable that such full-pay leave should be extended beyond one month, the sanction of the Council must be obtained.”

2. In by-law 16 by the deletion of paragraph (ii.) thereof and the substitution of the following for that paragraph :—

“(ii.) In case of illness due to accidents arising out of their employment and not due to their own culpable carelessness, daily-paid employees irrespective of service may be granted full-pay leave, with the sanction of the Chairman, up to a maximum of thirty days in a calendar year. If it is considered desirable that such full-pay leave should be extended beyond thirty days, the sanction of Council must be obtained.”

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 15, 1936, at 9 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated August 11, 1936.**

Present : Mr. F. C. Gimson, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. W. Beven ; Mr. O. T. Nettelton ; Dr. D. T. de Kretser ; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar.

1. The minutes of proceedings of the meeting of Council held on July 25, 1936, and of the Special Committee on reforms held on July 30, 1936, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and copies thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1935 to July 31, 1936, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for July, 1936.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate, during the month of July, 1936.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending August 15, 1936.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

- (a) Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during July, 1936.
- (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

3A. With reference to the statement of accounts, the Chairman pointed out that for the first half year of 1936, out of a total expenditure of Rs. 267,000 on the General Revenue Account, only Rs. 4,000 (approximately) represented expenditure on new works. This was due to capital services having been cut down to a minimum owing to the present financial situation. He foreshadowed the necessity to increase the property rates for 1937 for two reasons, viz. :—(1) to make more liberal provision in the next budget for essential schemes of improvement, and (2) to leave a good balance for the reformed Council who would otherwise be faced with the unpleasant duty of enforcing an enhanced rate immediately it comes into being.

3B. Mr. Nettelton drew the attention of the Chairman to the absence of name boards in streets and drives and inquired what action had been taken as he had brought it to the Chairman's notice previously.

The Chairman said that he would call the attention of the Municipal Engineer.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Marikar presented (1) Letter addressed to him by Mrs. Muthammal dated July 30, 1936, stating that a Municipal drain passing through her property (No. 1, Lady Gordon's drive) is in disrepair and causing damage to her property. (2) Petition from Mr. M. A. M. Haniffa, Trustee of the Nittawela Mosque, dated July 30, 1936, stating that the mosque is likely to fall down owing to the washing of the road side drain. (3) Petition from Mrs. Alice Perera addressed to Mr. Marikar complaining of the seizure and removal of movables from her house bearing No. 86 for taxes due on No. 5A, Watapuluwa.

Mr. De Silva presented (4) petition from Mr. J. H. Jayasinghe dated August 14, 1936, offering Rs. 2,500 per annum for the current period of tea restriction and Rs. 3,000 thereafter for the lease of 112 acres of Dunumadalawa estate which forms part of the catchment of the reservoir.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matters referred to in petitions (1) to (3). It was agreed to consider petition (4) with the papers on the subject under item 7.

4A. With reference to the replies given to Mr. Ismail's questions asked at the meeting of Council held on July 25, 1936, the Chairman tabled the following statement of electricity dues written off as irrecoverable for the years 1925-1935 :—1925, Rs. 650.58 ; 1926, Rs. 885.55 ; 1927, Rs. 2,513.88 ; 1928, Rs. 1,050.25 ; 1929, Rs. 1,388.00 ; 1930, Rs. 338.17 ; 1931, Rs. 414.14 ; 1932, Rs. 585.64 ; 1933, Rs. 214.22 ; 1934, Rs. 196.59 ; 1935, Rs. 17.77.

(12) Papers re Chairman's proposal to provide an extra light at Deyannawela.—Recommended.

(13) Memorandum from the Chairman on the subject of contribution of funds to the Electricity Board by the Council.—Recommended as per Chairman's memo.

Resolution of Council on the recommendations of the Standing Committees.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted, the recommendation under item (3) being amended to read as follows:—"Recommended that Council guarantee that the owner's rights to water will be duly safeguarded."

5A. Ratwatte Adigar left the meeting at this stage with the leave of the Chairman.

5B. With reference to the tenders invited for the construction of a road through Bahirawakande from Lady Manning's drive, Mr. de Silva suggested that it would be possible to get a grant of $\frac{1}{3}$ the cost of earth cutting from the Central Government if unemployed labour were engaged on the work.

The Chairman agreed to consider the suggestion.

6. Report of the Special Committee on amendments necessary to Ordinance No. 60 of 1935, to make it applicable to the Municipality of Kandy, together with a copy of the Ordinance amended on these lines.

The Chairman tabled the report and the draft Ordinance, and indicated that before each member voted, he should seriously consider the various amendments proposed in the draft Ordinance and their implications. He specially urged that it would be in the best interests of the Council to define the duties of the Mayor and the Commissioner placing on the latter the responsibilities of Chief Executive Officer.

Mr. De Silva expressed the Council's appreciation of the valuable guidance and help received from the Chairman in framing the amendments, and indicated that a transference of responsibility in the matter of executive powers from the Mayor to the Commissioner could not be lightly made.

The members then voted in favour of the adoption of the report and the draft amendments. The Chairman abstained from voting.

It was also agreed that the new Ordinance should come into operation from January 1, 1939.

7. Papers relating to the lease of land in the Catchment area of the reservoir.

The Chairman moved the Council into Committee and stated that the question was considered by the Finance Committee that morning and according to a plan prepared by the Municipal Engineer, 112 acres lay outside the effective catchment and it was possible either to sell or lease the area after reserving a strip as a protective zone on the boundary of the effective catchment.

After further discussion and after considering Mr. Jayasinghe's application the Council in Committee agreed to the following resolution:—"That the Council alienate the area of 112 acres shewn in Municipal Engineer's plan dated July 20, 1936, less a reservation to form a protective zone to the catchment, that offers be invited by advertisement for its outright purchase or for a lease for 10 years, with proper reserve prices, and that conditions of tender be circulated to the Council for approval."

The Council resumed and the above resolution passed in Committee was adopted.

2. To consider terms of lease or sale of the area lying outside the effective catchment of the reservoir.

Resolved that Roseneath Bungalow and a right of way from the bungalow to the land in question be also alienated, and the draft conditions of lease or sale as submitted be approved.

3. To consider further question of Municipal Reform arising on a letter from the Commissioner of Local Government.

The Chairman moved that the draft amendment to section 67 of Ordinance No. 60 of 1935 proposed in his memo dated August 26, 1936, be adopted.

The motion was put to the meeting and was lost.

4. To consider the question of unemployment in Kandy and proposed relief works.

(c) Earthwork at Roseneath Intake. Cost to be contributed as follows:— $\frac{2}{3}$ from Municipal Funds, and $\frac{1}{3}$ from Government Funds.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, August 15, 1936, at 9 a.m. pursuant to notice dated August 10, 1936.

Present.—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. C. H. Bradley; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. G. Ross Bell; and Mr. C. E. de Vos.

1. The Minutes of the Meetings held on July 11 and August 4, 1936, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. One petition was presented by Mr. W. Dahanayaka. This was tabled, and the Chairman said that it would receive consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:—(1) (a) Is the Chairman aware that three nurses of the Civil Hospital, Galle, who contracted chickenpox recently were permitted to receive treatment in a room adjoining a patients' ward? (b) Does not section 206 (2) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 authorize the Chairman to cause persons suffering from chickenpox to be removed from "places of public resort" as well as from "buildings where the retention of such persons is likely to prove a source of danger to others"? (c) Will the Chairman please give a ruling for future guidance with regard to chickenpox patients in Civil Hospital, Galle? (2) (a) Will the Chairman please give full details of any available information on the nature and extent of unemployment in Galle? (b) If no such information is available, does not the Chairman think that steps should be taken to obtain such information?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) Two (not three) resident nurses of the Civil Hospital, Galle, who contracted chickenpox were allowed home isolation in the hospital. These cases were reported to the Medical Officer of Health by the Medical Superintendent of the Hospital who added in his reports that the patients had been satisfactorily isolated and that all necessary precautionary measures had been adopted. (b) Section 206 (2) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, gives the Chairman and the Medical Officer of Health the authority to remove any case of infectious disease to the Infectious Diseases Hospital if it is considered that home isolation is unsatisfactory or that the disease is of such a serious nature (*e.g.*, plague, smallpox, or cholera) as to warrant such action. (c) In view of the reply given to (b) I do not consider that any ruling on the matter is necessary. (2) (a) There is no detailed information available on the subject. (b) I am not prepared to answer this question until I know what use is to be made of the information if it can be obtained.

Arising out of the replies to questions (1) (a), (1) (b), and (1) (c), Mr. W. Dahanayaka gave notice of the following supplemental question for the next General Meeting of the Council:—How can it be maintained that the isolation was satisfactory when as a matter of fact the same latrine was used both by the chickenpox patients in question as well as by the patients in the adjoining ward?

Arising out of the reply to question (2) (b), Mr. W. Dahanayaka stated that information on the subject would be necessary if the Council was going to appeal to Government for any kind of assistance.

4. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayaka:—That early steps be taken to buy and maintain a motor ambulance van—the mover said he understood the matter was receiving the attention of the Chairman and that a letter on the subject had been addressed to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. He therefore, asked the leave of Council to withdraw the motion for the present. Permission having been granted the motion was accordingly withdrawn.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) That, as a preliminary to an anti-tuberculosis drive in Galle, this Council respectfully requests the Government Agent, Southern Province, to obtain through the minor headmen as full information as possible on the incidence of tuberculosis in Galle. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded.—Carried unanimously.

(2) That a Special Committee of this Council be appointed to inquire into the causes that contributed to the recent irregularities in the Shroff's Department and make suitable recommendations thereon. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded.—Carried unanimously.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider the personnel of the Special Committee and to consider also item (4) on the Agenda, *viz.*:—“To decide on (1) the method to be adopted in selecting the new Shroff, and (2) the question of making an acting appointment until the new Shroff assumes duties.”

Council in Committee—

Council in Committee recommended (1) that the Special Committee do consist of the Chairman and Messrs. W. Dahanayaka, G. Ross Bell, and A. I. H. A. Wahab, with the Chairman as convener and two members to form a quorum; (2) that another Special Committee consisting of the Chairman and Messrs. J. E. Perera, A. C. Mohammedo, W. Dahanayaka, G. Ross Bell, and A. I. H. A. Wahab (with the Chairman as convener and four members to form a quorum) be appointed to select the names of five candidates for the post of Shroff for submission to the Council at the next General Meeting, or, if necessary, at a Special Meeting; and (3) that the present Assistant Shroff, Mr. Muhusin, be appointed to act in the post of Shroff with retrospective effect from August 3, 1936, until a permanent Shroff is appointed on his furnishing cash security in Rs. 1,000, and that during this period he be paid in addition to his usual salary an allowance at the rate of Rs. 50 per mensem, which is half the initial salary of the former Shroff.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

The Chairman then moved Council into Committee again to consider items 2, 3, 5, and 6 on the Agenda.

Council in Committee—

6. To consider the question of obtaining a report on a Town Planning Scheme for Galle:—Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that consideration of the matter be deferred and that meanwhile inquiries be made from the Hon. the Minister of Local Administration as to whether he could arrange for the services of the Government Town Planner to be available to this Council as soon as such an officer is appointed. Mr. C. H. Bradley seconded.—Carried.

7. To consider the question of erecting rat-proof grain stores in Galle:—Council in Committee recommended (1) that the question of a suitable site for the proposed grain stores be referred back to the Four Standing Committees; and (2) that consideration of the question as to whether or not a loan from Government should be obtained for the purpose be deferred.

8. To consider the question of changing the transformers on the Magalle High Tension Circuit from 30 to 60 K.V.A. in order to cope with the extra demand for lighting and power in this area:—Council in Committee recommended that two transformers on the Magalle High Tension Circuit be changed from 30 to 60 K.V.A. and that a Supplemental Vote of Rs. 2,400 be sanctioned for the purpose. Council in Committee recommended, further, that the quotation of Rs. 1,153 for each transformer submitted by Messrs. Walker & Greig be accepted.

9. To consider the draft by-laws on dairies as further amended by the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects:—The Chairman moved that the draft by-laws on dairies as further amended by the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects be approved. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.

Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that the draft by-laws be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded. The amendment was first put to the meeting and declared lost, 2 voting for and 6 against. The Chairman's motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 6 votes to 2.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above resolutions and recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

(3) To recommend the following supplemental votes under “ Electricity Account ” :—(a) Rs. 600 for the purchase of an earth-tester ; (b) Rs. 275 for the purchase of a reducing air valve ; (c) Rs. 300 for alterations to the Richmond Hill Road Mains as recommended by the Superintendent, Electricity Department ; (d) Rs. 500 under Head E 6: Repairs to Mains, Meters, Switches, &c. ; and (e) Rs. 1,500 under Head E 10: Materials for Service Mains.—Recommended.

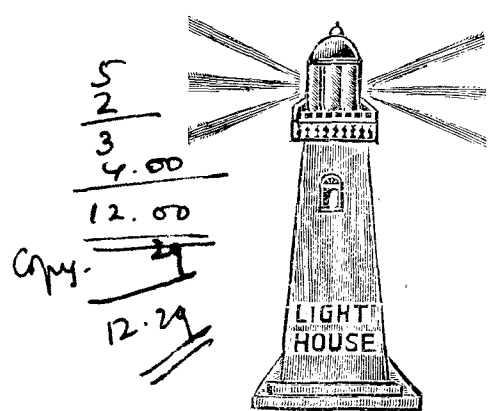

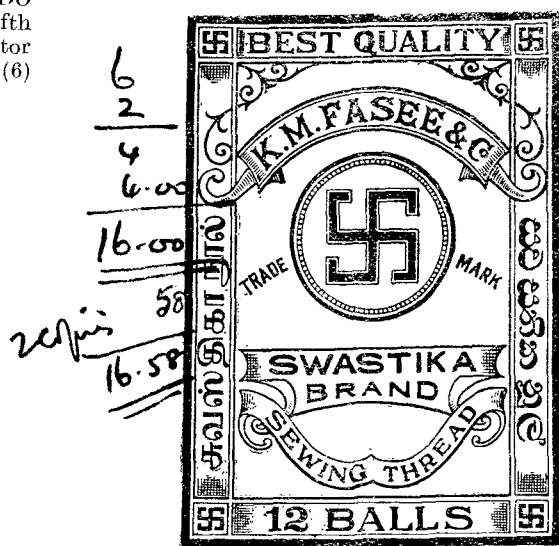
