SIR,—I HAVE the honour to inform you that, in accordance with the powers vested in me under sections 3 (c) and 3 (d) of the Official Secrets Act, 1911, I declare the following places in Ceylon to be prohibited places for the purposes of that Act, namely,

The Peninsula of Ostenburg, Great and Little Sober Islands and the intervening water at Trincomali, included in the boundaries from a point in Sandy Bay (lying between Dutch Point and Rocky Point) in prolongation of the rifle range, thence along the southern edge of the rifle range to the Admirals Bridge-Ostenburg Barracks road; thence in a southerly direction along the east side of the new War Department road as far as the first hairpin bend; from thence in a straight line to meet the north-east corner of the Royal Naval Dockyard fence; thence westward along this fence to the inner harbour opposite York Island; thence in a south-west direction to Leeson Jetty on the north of Great Sober Island; the north, west and south coasts of Great Sober Island; from thence a straight line passing south of Little Sober Island to Elephant Point; thence the coast of Ostenburg Peninsula to the starting point.

The declaration made by the Secretary of State for the Colonies in respect of the Peninsula of Ostenburg, Great and Little Sober Islands, and the intervening water area, on the 11th of October, 1912, is hereby revoked.

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.

RULES for the Lemasuriyagama-ela irrigation work, Gangapalata korale, Uda Hewaheta, Nuwara Eliya District, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 60 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

Rules for the Protection of the Lemasuriyagama-ela Irrigation Work and for the Conservation of Water.

1. No person other than a the Director of Irrigation or a person duly authorized by him shall obstruct, divert, cut the sides of, or interfere in any way with, any irrigation or drainage channel or other water-course comprised in the "irrigation work."
2. No person other than the Director of Irrigation or a person duly authorized by him shall encroach upon any irrigation or drainage channel or other water-course comprised in the "irrigation work."
3. No person other than the Director of Irrigation or a person duly authorized by him shall interfere with any sluice, dam, or regulating work comprised in the "irrigation work."
4. No person other than the Director of Irrigation or a person duly authorized by him shall obstruct or interfere with any road or path comprised in the "irrigation work."
5. No person shall in any way damage any irrigation or drainage channel or other water-course, any sluice, dam or regulating work, any road or path, or other engineering work comprised in the "irrigation work."
6. No person shall use more water from the "irrigation work" than is absolutely necessary for the irrigation of his holding and no person other than the Director of Irrigation or a person duly authorized by him shall allow water to run to waste or cause any other person to waste any such water.
7. No person other than the Director of Irrigation or a person duly authorized by him shall control or distribute water or interfere with the distribution or flow of water in the "irrigation work."
8. For the purpose of inspection and of effecting repairs to the "irrigation work" the issue of water for distribution to the fields may be suspended each year between (a) the 1st and the 30th day of April and (b) the 1st and the 30th day of September.
9. The issue of water from any channel, sluice or regulator may be suspended by the Director of Irrigation at any time after consultation with the Assistant Government Agent, should such suspension be necessary in order to carry out repairs urgently needed for any part of the "irrigation work."

## RULE.

The rules for the grant of pensions and gratuities to officers and servants of the Colombo Municipality published in *Gazette* No. 6,408 of October 28, 1910, as last amended by Notification in *Gazette* No. 8,172 of November 15, 1935, are hereby further amended as follows:—

- (1) by the insertion, between rule 21A and rule 22, of the following new rule which shall have effect as rule 21B under the heading "Enhanced Pensions, &c., in Cases of Injuries received in Discharge of Duties":—

"21B. (i.) Rules 22, 23, and 23A are not applicable to persons entitled to compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934, or to their dependants if such persons were newly appointed to the service of the Municipal Council on or after the date on which that Ordinance came into operation: Provided that a person with service prior to that date under the Municipal Council shall not be deemed to have been newly appointed for the purposes of this rule if pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity under these rules is payable in respect of such prior service.

(ii.) In the case of persons entitled to compensation under the said Ordinance, and not newly appointed as aforesaid, and the dependants of such persons, rules 22 and 23 are not applicable except as provided in rule 22 (iv.)."; and

- (2) by the omission of rules 22, 23, and 23A, and the substitution of the three following new rules therefor:—

"22. (i.) Subject to the provisions and exceptions contained in the preceding rule, when a person employed in the Municipal Service, whether serving in a pensionable or in a non-pensionable office is injured:—

- (a) In the actual discharge of his duty;  
(b) Without his own default; and  
(c) By some injury specially attributable to the nature of his duty, it shall be competent for the Council to grant to him in respect of such injury an annual allowance not exceeding the under-mentioned portion of his salary and emoluments at the date of the injury, viz.:—

When his capacity to contribute to his support is:—

- Slightly impaired 5–60ths.  
Impaired 10–60ths.  
Materially impaired 15–60ths.  
Totally destroyed 20–60ths.

(ii.) The award shall be so much less than the amount grantable under the scale given above as the Council shall think reasonable, in case:—

- (a) the usual amount exceeds by not less than Rs. 1,000 a year the rate of retired allowance to which the length of the injured person's service would entitle him; or  
(b) the injured person has continued to serve for not less than one year after the injury in respect of which he retires; or  
(c) the injured person is fifty years of age or upwards at the date of injury; or  
(d) the injury is not the sole cause of retirement, i.e., the retirement is caused partly by age or infirmity.

(iii.) The above award shall be in addition to the pension or the retiring allowance, or gratuity, to which the injured man would be qualified by length of service: Provided that no award shall, together with such pension, or retiring allowance, exceed 50–60ths of his salary and emoluments at the date of the injury:

Provided further that if the officer continues in service after the injury, and the grant of an ordinary pension or retiring allowance is consequently postponed until final retirement, or if an officer once retired with an injury allowance is re-employed, the limitation shall be 50–60ths of his salary at date of final retirement or at date of injury whichever is greater.

(iv.) In the case of a pensionable officer or servant, who not having completed 10 years' gross service, is entitled only to a gratuity he may, if he wish it, be awarded in lieu of such gratuity, an annual allowance of so many 720ths as the months he has actually served, together with the number of 60ths that may be awarded as above on account of his injuries. An annual allowance on account of service as provided in this paragraph may be granted to an officer or servant in a pensionable office who is entitled to compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934, in addition to such compensation.

23. (i.) Subject to the provisions and exceptions contained in rule 21B above, when an officer is killed on duty or dies as a direct result of injuries received while on duty, or of illness the contraction of which was specifically attributable to the nature of his duties, the Council may with the sanction of His Excellency the Governor make an award to the widow and children, which ordinarily may be on the following scale:—

Pension to widow not to exceed 10–60ths of the husband's salary and emoluments, or Rs. 150 a year, whichever is greater; and  
Gratuity to children, not exceeding Rs. 15 multiplied by the total number of their years, starting from the ages at the time of their father's death and ending with 15 years, the total gratuity not to be less than Rs. 150 or more than Rs. 750. In the case of motherless children the award may be of twice the usual rate.

(ii.) If the deceased does not leave a widow, and if his mother or other near relative was wholly dependent upon him for her support, the award which might have been made to the widow may be made to the mother or other such dependent relative.

(iii.) Pensions granted under this rule shall cease on the remarriage of the widow, but may be restored on rewidowhood if the Council, with the sanction of His Excellency the Governor shall so order.

23A. In a case falling under rule 22 of rule 23 where a non-pensionable officer or daily-paid employee is injured or killed, the Council may, in lieu of the other benefits provided in these rules, award compensation in accordance with the rates and principles set out in the schedule and table hereto subjoined, if it shall appear to the Council that the grant of such compensation in lieu of other benefits is in the interests of the beneficiary or beneficiaries concerned: Provided that in the case of the persons mentioned in paragraph (ii.) of rule 21B:—

- (a) this rule shall apply to pensionable officers, and  
(b) the compensation payable under this rule shall be the amount (if any) by which the sum which would otherwise be so payable exceeds the compensation payable under the said Ordinance, and  
(c) if there is no such excess no compensation shall be payable under this rule.

## THE SCHEDULE.

A.—Where permanent total disablement results from the injury:—

- (1) In the case of an adult, a sum equal to forty-two months' wages or three thousand five hundred rupees whichever is less; and  
(2) In the case of a minor, a sum equal to eighty-four months' wages or three thousand five hundred rupees, whichever is less.

B.—Where permanent partial disablement results from the injury :—

- (1) In the case of an injury specified in the table, such percentage of the compensation which would have been payable in the case of permanent total disablement as is specified therein as being the percentage of the loss of earning capacity caused by that injury ; and
- (2) In the case of an injury not specified in the table, such percentage of the compensation payable in the case of permanent total disablement as is proportionate to the loss of earning capacity permanently caused by the injury.

C.—Where death results from the injury :—

- (1) In the case of an adult, a sum equal to thirty months' wages or two thousand five hundred rupees, whichever is less ; and
  - (2) In the case of a minor, two hundred rupees.
- For the purpose of construing this Schedule—
- (a) 'adult' and 'minor' shall mean respectively a person who is not, and a person who is, under the age of fifteen years ;
  - (b) 'permanent total disablement' shall mean such disablement of a permanent nature as incapacitates an officer or employee for all work which he was capable of performing at the time of the accident resulting in such disablement : provided that permanent total disablement shall be deemed to result from the permanent total loss of the sight of both eyes, or from any combination of injuries specified in the table where the aggregate percentage of the loss of earning capacity, as specified in that table against those injuries, amounts to one hundred per cent. ;
  - (c) 'permanent partial disablement' shall mean such disablement of a permanent nature as reduces the earning capacity of the officer or employee in every employment which he was capable of undertaking at that time : Provided that every injury specified in the table shall be deemed to result in permanent partial disablement ; and where more injuries than one are caused by the same accident, the amount of compensation payable for permanent partial disablement shall be aggregated, but not so in any case as to exceed the amount which would have been payable if permanent total disablement had resulted from the injuries.

BY-LAWS.

*Establishment and Regulation of Public Markets.*

1. The Council shall give not less than ten days' notice, by beat of tom-tom, of the date fixed for the opening of any public market it may decide to establish within this area.
2. After the establishment of such public market, no person shall, without a licence granted by the Chairman of the Council, publicly expose for sale any meat, poultry, fresh fish, fresh fruit or vegetables in any place within the limits of the Council other than the public market : Provided that this by-law shall not apply (a) to the sale of poultry, fruit, or vegetables by itinerant vendors as defined in section 163 (5) of the Ordinance, or (b) to the sale by the licensee of an eating-house or tea or coffee boutique of fruits for consumption on the premises.

3. (1) Every licence referred to in the last preceding by-law shall be substantially in the form A in Schedule I. to these by-laws, and shall be in force for such period not exceeding twelve months or less than one month as may be specified in that licence.

(2) Every such licence shall be paid for in advance at the rate of 50 cents for each month for which it is to be in force.

(3) Every licensee shall have his name and the names of his salesmen registered at the Office of the Council.

(4) It shall not be lawful for any salesman whose name has not been so registered to take part in any sale in any licensed premises.

4. (1) No person shall hold, use, or occupy any stall, seat, or space in a public market without a permit in the form B in the schedule.

(2) No person holding a permit shall contravene any of the conditions set out on the back of such permit.

5. Rents or fees at the respective rates set out in Schedule II. to these by-laws shall be payable for the use or occupation of the several stalls, spaces, or seats in the public markets specified therein.

6. (1) There shall be placed in a conspicuous position at each public market a table of the rents, or fees leviable for the use of a stall, space, or seat at that market, printed in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil.

(2) It shall not be lawful for any person to demand or receive higher sums than those authorized by such notice.

7. The several rents and fees payable in respect of stalls, seats, or spaces in a public market shall be paid in advance from time to time to the Council, or their lessee, or any other person authorized by the Council or by the lessee to collect rents and fees.

8. No person shall keep or expose for sale in any market any article the keeping or sale of which therein is prohibited by the Council by notice under the hand of the Chairman posted in the market in pursuance of these by-laws.

9. No person shall sell or expose for sale in any stall or portion of any public market reserved for any specified article or class of articles, any other article or class of articles.

10. No occupant of a stall, seat, or space in any public market shall (1) enclose in any way any portion of such stall or market or erect any awning or screen or fixture of any kind, or (2) leave any goods in the market outside his own stall between the hours of 9 P.M. and 6 A.M. without first having obtained the sanction of the Chairman.

11. (1) Every occupant of a stall, space, or seat in any public market shall keep such stall, space, or seat clean and free from filth or rubbish.

(2) No person who is affected with or is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall occupy any stall, seat, or space in any public market or expose for sale thereat any provisions whatsoever.

12. No person using or occupying any public market shall—

(a) behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about such market; or

(b) carry on any cooking in such market; or

(c) remain in or loiter about such market after the place is closed for business without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself; or

(d) damage, or in anywise deface, any portion of the buildings, stalls, lamps, or any property of the Council in or about such market, or defile or pollute in any way the water provided for use in such market, or sit on the platform on which fish is intended to be exposed; or

(e) introduce or cause to be introduced or keep any dog, cat, domestic animal or bird or reptile in such market.

13. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer acting under his authority to inspect any market and to seize any unwholesome articles of food introduced into or exposed for sale in any market and to convey the same to the Medical Officer of Health or in his absence to the District Medical Officer or if there be no such officers to the Magistrate and if it appear to such Health Officer or District Medical Officer or Magistrate that any article of food so seized is unwholesome or unfit for human food, he shall order the same to be destroyed, or to be so disposed of as to prevent it being exposed for sale or used for such food, without the payment of any compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized.

14. All public markets shall be open daily from 6 A.M. to 9 P.M.

15. (1) It shall be the duty of the market-keeper or of the lessee of a public market to maintain order within the limits of the market.

(2) It shall be an offence to obstruct or resist in the execution of his duty any person appointed by the Chairman or by the Council to superintend any public market, or to collect the rents, tolls, or fees, or to enforce order or cleanliness therein.

16. Whenever the Council, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer, decides that the use or consumption by the public of any particular kind of fish is injurious, or that during the prevalence of any epidemic the use or consumption of any particular kind of fruit or vegetable is harmful, and by beat of tom-tom or other sufficient notice prohibits for such time as may appear necessary the sale or the introduction of any such fish, fruit, or vegetable in any market or other place within the limits of the Council, it shall be lawful for any authorized officer of the Council to seize and destroy, in such manner as the Council or the Chairman may direct, any such article sold or exposed for sale in contravention of such prohibition.

17. No licensed butcher shall sell or keep for sale any meat or any portion of a slaughtered animal in any place other than a public market or in any part of a public market other than the stall rented by him.

18. No cart or vehicle shall remain within any market premises for a longer period than is necessary for loading or unloading.

19. Every person occupying a stall in a public market shall keep on or near such stall a fly-proof covered receptacle, and shall deposit therein all rubbish and refuse matter.

20. No person shall throw or deposit any rubbish, refuse, bones, skins of animals, or other articles likely to be offensive or injurious to public health, in or upon any public market or its premises except into a receptacle provided for such purpose.

21. No meat of any animal not slaughtered at the public slaughter-house provided by the Council, shall be brought into or sold or exposed for sale in any public or private market or any place specially licensed, except with the special written authority of the Chairman: Provided that this by-law shall not apply to frozen meat, game, or fish imported into the Island.

22. It shall be an offence for any person occupying a stall in any public market, wilfully or without reasonable cause, to neglect or refuse to serve the public during two consecutive days.

23. On the second or any subsequent conviction of any person of a breach of any of these by-laws, the court may in its discretion cancel the licence issued to such person.

24. In the event of non-compliance with the provisions of any of the foregoing by-laws or of the cancellation of any licence by a competent court, it shall be lawful for the Chairman to refuse a licence or a fresh licence, as the case may be.

25. Any person contravening any of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 20 and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or after written notice from the Chairman drawing attention to such contravention.

## Conditions on which the Permit or Licence is granted.

1. The permit-holder and his registered salesmen shall occupy a stall, a space or a seat in the public market subject to the U. D. C. by-laws.

2. The permit-holder shall pay the rents, tolls, or fees at the time and manner appointed for payment by the Chairman.

3. The permit-holder shall not assign, transfer, mortgage nor under-let the stall, the space, the seat, or any part thereof without the consent of the Chairman.

4. The permit-holder shall not have any direct or indirect interest in any other stall, space, or seat used for the sale of the same class of articles unless he has obtained a permit therefor.

5. All salesmen employed by the permit-holder in a stall, space, or seat shall be engaged subject to the approval of the Chairman.

## TIMBER OR FIREWOOD DEPOTS OR STORES.

## I.—Conditions of issue of Licence.

No person shall be entitled to a licence for keeping a timber or firewood depot or store unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) That the premises are not less than 50 feet distant from the nearest building and are not structurally connected to it.
- (b) That the site is approved by the Chairman.
- (c) In the case of timber or firewood depots or stores surrounded by walls, that the average height of every wall is not less than 10 feet and the height is in no place less than 7 feet and the walls are built of brick, stone, or cabook and that the inner surface of the walls is cement-plastered to a height of 4 feet from the floor and that the remaining portion of the inner surface of every wall and the outer surface thereof are limed-plastered and lime-washed.
- (d) That the ground floor is of cement concrete not less than four inches thick.

## II.—By-laws for storing of Timber and Firewood.

1. Every licensee of a timber or firewood depot or store shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with his name and the words "Licensed Timber Depot", "Licensed Timber Store", "Licensed Firewood Depot", or "Licensed Firewood Store", as the case may be, legibly painted in English.

2. He shall maintain on the premises such number of sand buckets or fire extinguishers, or both, as may be specified by the Chairman for the purposes of dealing with any outbreak of fire.

3. In the case of timber or firewood depots or stores surrounded by walls—(a) no timber or firewood shall be stacked to a height within three feet of any wall plate of the building, and (b) the roof shall not be ceiled and no lofts or any similar structures made under the roof.

4. In the case of timber or firewood depots or stores not surrounded by walls, no timber or firewood shall be stacked or stored except on platforms approved by the Chairman.

5. The licensee shall not stack or store any timber or firewood in the licensed premises in any manner capable of preventing—

- (a) the inspection of the walls and floor for the purpose of ascertaining whether there are rat-holes or other harbourage for rats, and
- (b) the fumigation of the premises for the purpose of destroying rats.

assisted estate labourers), into Ceylon from India and other countries and in particular to consider the following questions :—

And We do further hereby authorize and empower you, Our said Commissioner, to make all necessary inquiries in the said matter and to report to Us under your hand, as early as possible, upon the matters referred to you as aforesaid.

And We do request and require all public officers and other persons to whom you may apply for such information or advice as may properly be given to be assistant to you in your inquiries.

### THE DOG REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1901.

BY-LAWS made by the Sanitary Board of the Mullaittivu District under sections 5 and 6 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901.

The Kachcheri, M. F. DE S. JAYARATNE,  
Mullaittivu, September 29, 1936. Chairman.

### BY-LAWS.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of any Sanitary Board town in the Mullaittivu District, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of 25 cents and 50 cents respectively. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1, of one year to March 31, of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within such town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the collector) particulars required in the annexed form A, in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the form B, shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid collector or at the office of the Sanitary Board.

4. The collector (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which in his opinion is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the collector may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Sanitary Board, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz. :—This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board—

- (a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- (b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused, or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at such time and place as stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Sanitary Board authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

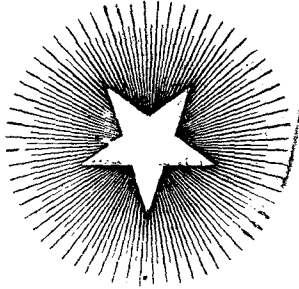
