REGULATION.

The Regulations for the Ceylon Defence Force published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,074 of August 24, 1934, as last amended by Notification in the *Gazette* No. 8,245 of September 25, 1936, are hereby further amended as follows:—

RESEARCH PROBATIONER—AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT.

APPLICATIONS are invited from candidates possessing University Honours degree in Pure Science with Chemistry as the principal subject for appointment to the post of Research Probationer in the Chemical Division of the Department of Agriculture. Applicants must be natural-born British subjects of Ceylonese descent.

2. In the first instance the selected candidate will be attached to the Chemical Division for training. During the period of training he will be paid an allowance of Rs. 2,700 per annum. If he proves suitable, he will be provided at Government expense with a further course

of training abroad. During his period of training abroad he will continue to receive the allowance of Rs. 2,700 per annum, together with such additional allowances and other assistance as may be determined. On satisfactory completion of the period of training the officer will be placed on a salary of Rs. 3,200 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 200 to a maximum of Rs. 6,000 per annum. Officers in this grade will be eligible for appointment to vacancies in the higher Research Staff of the department on the salaries recommended in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934.

3. If in any case the qualifications and experience of the selected candidate are such that further training out of Ceylon is unnecessary, he may be appointed on Rs. 3,200.

4. Applications from persons already in the Government Service will be considered only if forwarded through the Heads of their Departments. Applications, which should give full particulars of age, qualifications, and experience must reach the Chief Secretary before October 31, 1936.

STENOGRAPHERS.

IT is anticipated that there will be vacancies for five stenographers in the Financial Year 1936-37. Salary Rs. 936 per annum rising by 15 annual increments of Rs. 60 and one of Rs. 72 to Rs. 1,908 per annum with an Efficiency Bar the passing of which will be dependent upon an examination test before Rs. 1,476. A qualifying examination for filling posts of stenographers will be held by the Director of Education on November 7, 1936, and the selection thereafter will be made by the Chief Secretary who will consider the previous records of the candidates as well as the results of the examination. Candidates will be required to write an essay: take down in shorthand passages dictated at 100 words a minute for five minutes and to transcribe the record at 10 words a minute. They will also be required to make a correct copy of a passage of 600 words on the typewriter in 20 minutes, i.e., 30 words per minute. Touch typewriting will be regarded as essential. Candidates should bring their own typewriters if possible; otherwise they will be expected to typewrite on any machine provided. Neatness and accuracy will be taken into account in marking the papers. Candidates, unless already in the Government Service, must be between the ages of 17 and 35 on the date of the examination. Applications for admission must be made by letter which must reach the Chief Secretary, P. O. Box No. 500, Colombo, not later than 4.30 P.M. on October 27, 1936. Stamps to the value of Rs. 10 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature over them. All candidates should forward a copy of their birth certificate (which will be returned) with their application. Candidates who are not in Government Service should also attach copies of testimonials to character.

IT is hereby notified that the Public Service Regulations published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, have been amended by the deletion of Regulations 63 to 66 (Correction Slip No. 12) and the substitution of the following therefor:—

63. When any person not already in the Public Service is provisionally selected otherwise than by the Secretary of State or the Crown Agents for the Colonies for appointment to a vacancy on the pensionable establishment, or on probation with a view to permanent pensionable employment, or on the non-pensionable but permanent establishment, the Head of the Department in which the vacancy exists must direct the selected candidate to fill up Form General 169, to hand the form to the nearest Government Medical Officer in charge of a hospital (in Colombo, the Physician, Out-patients' Department, General Hospital; in Kandy and Galle, the Physician of the Hospitals) and present himself for medical examination. No fee is chargeable for this examination.

64. (i.) On the selected candidate presenting himself, the Medical Officer must make a thorough examination, and fill up Form Medical 169, which he will forward to the Provincial Surgeon. The latter will endorse his opinion thereon and forward the form to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, who will send it to the Head of the Department informing him whether the candidate is physically suitable for appointment.

(ii.) Heads of Departments must see that no salary is paid to a newly appointed officer until the form has been received.

65. If the person has been found to be physically unsuitable the provisional appointment shall be cancelled but he shall be eligible for salary for the days that he has worked, if any.

66. Persons appointed in a purely temporary capacity will not be required to submit themselves for medical examination.

THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE, No. 19 OF 1915.

THE following resolution passed by the State Council at a meeting held on September 29, 1936, is published for general information:—

This Council resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915, that from and after the first day of October, 1936, the said Ordinance shall be in force within the limits of the Diyatalawa Civil Area, in Mahapalata korale of the Udukinda division of the Badulla District in the Province of Uva, defined by the following boundaries:—

Diyatalawa Civil Area—Schedule of Boundaries.

From the eastern corner of the Rifle Range Butts, a straight line running south-south-east to the Flagstaff on the Crest of Cemetery Hill, thence a straight line running south-east to culvert No. 5/3 on the Boer road from Diyatalawa to Bandarawela, thence a straight line running south-south-west to the 157½ milepost on the Railway line to Bandarawela, thence up the stream to a point 1½ chains east of the big bend on the Diyatalawa-Haputale Main road, south-east of "Arcadia" bungalow, thence to the big bend on the main road and along the main road to a point on it due west of "Rock" Trig. and thence to "Rock" Trig. From Cricket Pitch Trig. a straight line running north-north-east to Chatty Hill, thence a straight line running north-east to the Welgolle kandura, and thence along the Welgolle kandura and Nelligolle kandura and along the Kahagolla village boundary to the Flagstaff on the village boundary above the Rifle Range Butts and thence a line southwards down to the western corner of the Butts.

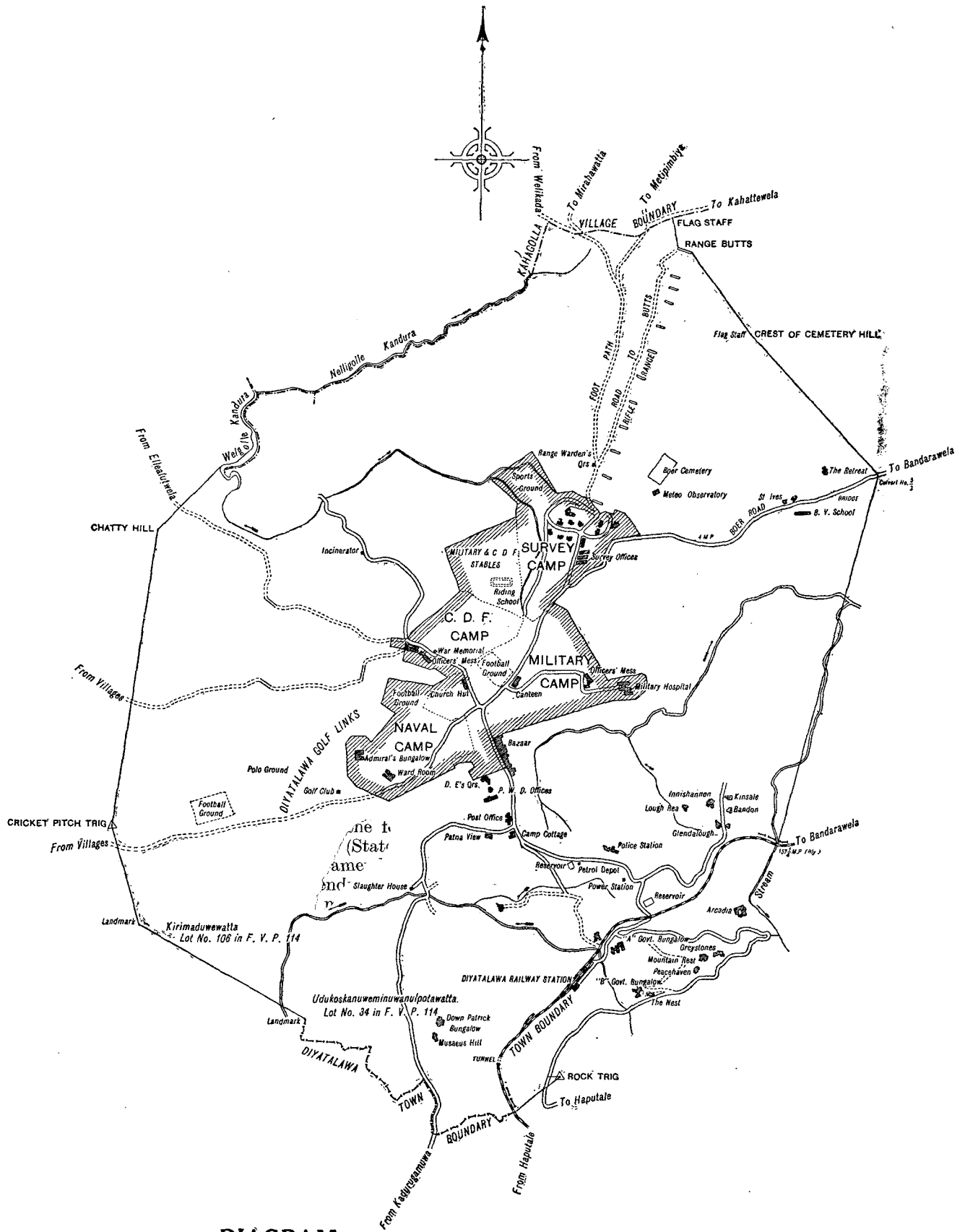


DIAGRAM

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Illmaha Kachchi Festival, 1936, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to three days, namely, November 27 to 29, 1936, inclusive.

(b) Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. The camp shall be under the general control of the Government Agent, Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by a Medical Officer and by a Police Officer.

3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Supervising Officer to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads by which they have to travel.

4. The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

(a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking and for natural offices;

(b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;

(c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;

(d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;

(e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying any lawful order given for any of these purposes by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

5. For the purpose of these rules camp shall mean—

(a) the area within half a mile of the Maha Dewala at Kataragama in every direction.

(b) the area within a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama in every direction.

6. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in the camp, by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the chief officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be guilty of an offence.

8. The issue of such permits shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation, maintaining the health of the camp, and regulating traffic.

9. (1) (a) Any person exposing commodities of any description for sale in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

(b) Any person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the chief officer of Police shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) (a) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the Supervising Officer.

(b) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(c) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or refuse shall be thrown on the ground, but shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(d) Every building, structure, or premises used as a place of trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity in which shall be stored all the garbage and waste matter of the said premises; and except when garbage or waste matter is being deposited or taken from the said bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

10. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or shall fail to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

11. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease and not reporting the same to the Supervising Officer or to the Medical Officer or the chief officer of Police, and any person aiding or abetting in the concealment of such disease shall be guilty of an offence.

12. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Supervising Officer or the chief officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Any person who, without the previous sanction of the Supervising Officer, constructs any booth or extends any building so as to encroach on the main streets of the camp shall be guilty of an offence.

REGULATIONS regarding Bonded Warehouses made by the Collector for the Port of Colombo under section 57 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, and published in *Gazette* No. 7,861 of June 19, 1931, and *Gazette* No. 7,889 of October 23, 1931, are hereby amended as follows:

- (1) by the deletion of regulation 15 and the substitution of the following therefor:—

Importers who are allowed to warehouse dangerous petroleum under this regulation shall sign a bond with two sureties to be approved by the Collector, and make and hypothecate a cash deposit of such sum as may be fixed by the Collector in each case."

General Meeting.

Wednesday, September 2, 1936, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated August 26, 1936.

Present :—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman ; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal ; Dr. S. Muttiah ; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C. ; Mr. A. R. A. Razik, M.S.C., J.P. ; Dr. S. T. 1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of August 5, 1936, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik moved :—“ That an electric lift be installed forthwith in the Municipal building for the use of the public and the Municipality.” Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The Chairman stated that it would be desirable to call for estimates with a view to considering the matter with the Budget for 1937.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader pointed out that it would be necessary to instal two or three lifts.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik, with the consent of the seconder, agreed to the motion being amended as follows :—“ That the question of providing electric lifts in the Municipal buildings for the use of the public and the Municipality be considered with the Budget for 1937.”

The motion, as amended, was put to the meeting and carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved :—“ That this Council recommends the Chairman to bring up the question of the compulsory reservation of public arcades in Commercial Areas (section 28 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915), before the Housing and Town Improvement Committee for consideration.” Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

The Chairman explained facts and stated that if the motion contemplated consideration of the general question he had no objection, but if it was intended to require matters which are left to his discretion under the Ordinance to be referred to the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement, he would oppose the motion.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader having accepted the suggestion of the Chairman, the motion as amended by the insertion of the word “ general ” before “ question ” was put to the meeting and carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee :—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of August 20, 1936, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider :—(a) A memorandum of the Municipal Engineer, dated May 23, 1936, requesting that a post of Sub-Inspector for the supervision of electrical work, &c., be created on Scale 9, Group 1 of the 1934 Salaries Scheme, viz., Rs. 1,200 × 80 × 2,000 and a travelling allowance of Rs. 480 per annum for the use of a motor cycle, and stating that the qualifications for this post be the same as for Sub-Inspectors in accordance with the 1924 Salaries Scheme and Electrical experience in addition to count in selection. (2) Recommended (a) that the examination at the Municipal Laboratory of public health specimens submitted by practitioners resident outside the Municipal Limits of Colombo should cease after due notice; and (b) that the examination of all other clinical specimens that is now carried out at the Laboratory should continue only until the work is taken over by the Bacteriological Institute and should then cease.

(3) Recommended that the examination of water, milk, and other samples of a similar nature for private parties or for other Public Bodies at the Municipal Laboratory should cease and that in future when any applications for such examinations are received either by the City Microbiologist or the Analyst the applicants should be directed to apply to the Bacteriological Institute,

(2) From Flower road to Green path junction to a width of 60 ft. As depicted on plan No. 3,130A of May 26, 1936, and signed by him. Registered No. 1,292.—Recommended the laying down of street lines under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 for two sections of Turret road as depicted on plan No. 3,130A signed by Mr. Stanley Fernando, M.B.E., Chief Assistant Municipal Engineer, and dated May 26, 1936, as described hereunder—(a) From Circular road to Flower road to a width of 66 ft., (b) from Flower road to Green path junction to a width of 60 ft.

Messrs. M. L. M. Reyald, A. E. Goonesinha, and A. R. A. Razik dissented, pending amendment of the Land Acquisition Ordinance as regards the compensation payable for land falling within street lines.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that this matter be deferred, pending amendment of the Land Acquisition Ordinance as regards compensation payable for land falling within street lines. Mr. M. L. M. Reyald seconded.

The Chairman opposed and moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader and Mr. K. W. Taylor spoke in support of the motion.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyald spoke again.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha stated that it would be desirable when submitting questions relating to street lines to give all information as to the number of owners of property affected and extent of land involved.

The Chairman's amendment was then put to the meeting and declared lost.

The motion of Mr. A. E. Goonesinha was thereupon put to the meeting and carried.

(6) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer, dated August 18, 1936, submitting for consideration and sanction by Council, under powers in section 18 (4) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, street lines 50 feet in width for the section of Grandpass road from De Waas lane to Stace road as depicted on plan No. 3,160 of July 3, 1936, and signed by him. Registered No. 1,290.—Recommended the laying down of street lines under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 for the section of Grandpass road from De Waas lane to Stace road as depicted on plan No. 3,160 from A to B (width of 50 feet) signed by Mr. Stanley Fernando, M.B.E., Chief Assistant Municipal Engineer, and dated July 3, 1936. Messrs. M. L. M. Reyal, A. E. Goonesinha, and A. R. A. Razik dissented pending amendment of the Land Acquisition Ordinance as regards the compensation payable for land falling within street lines.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Resolved that the matter be also deferred pending amendment of the Land Acquisition Ordinance.

(7) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer, dated August 18, 1936, submitting for consideration and sanction by Council, under powers in section 18 (4) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, street lines 66 feet in width for Vauxhall street, as depicted on plan No. 3,165 of July 8, 1936, and signed by him. Registered No. 1,291.—Recommended the laying down of street lines under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 for Vauxhall street (to a width of 66 feet) as depicted on plan No. 3,165 signed by Mr. Stanley Fernando, M.B.E., Chief Assistant Municipal Engineer, and dated July 8, 1936.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Dr. S. Muttiah moved that this matter be also deferred pending amendment of the Ordinance. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Carried.

MUNICIPAL ASSESSOR'S DEPARTMENT.

(8) To consider the petition presented in Council on August 5, 1936, by Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C., M.M.C., from the owners of properties situated at Kolonnawa lane, Dematagoda, in Maradana Ward, praying that the present name of the lane be changed to "Gnanawimala road." 7. The Chairman moved that the Hon. Mr. F. J. Soertsz, K.C., who ceased to be a Member in consequence of having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings, be restored to office, under the provisions of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

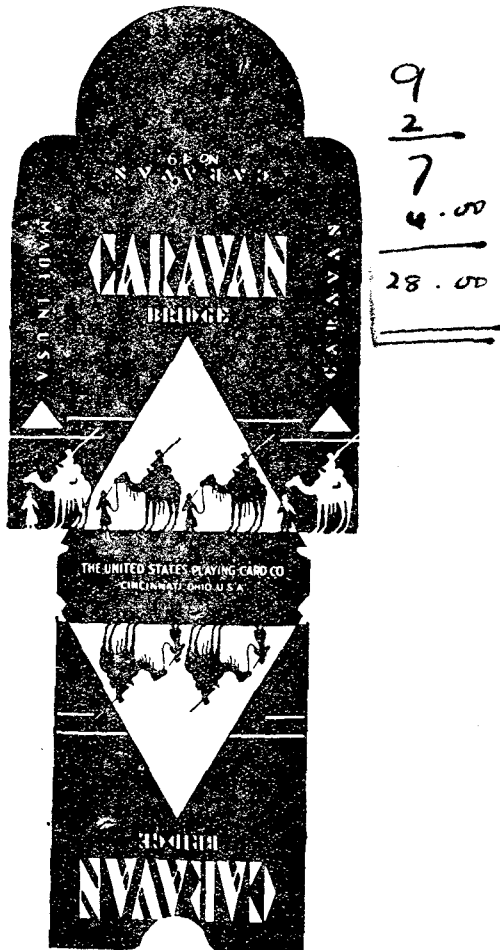

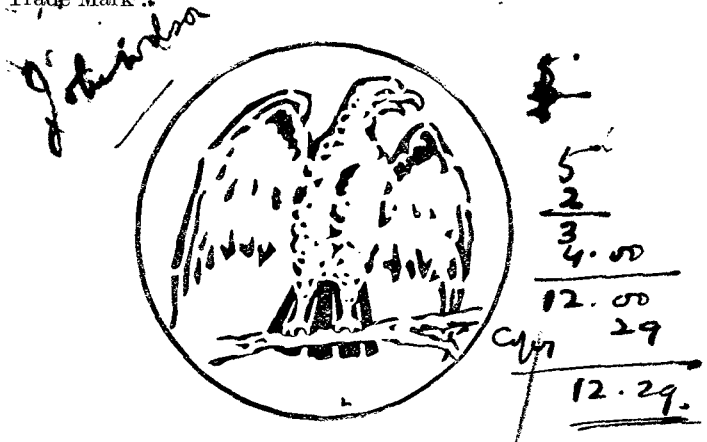

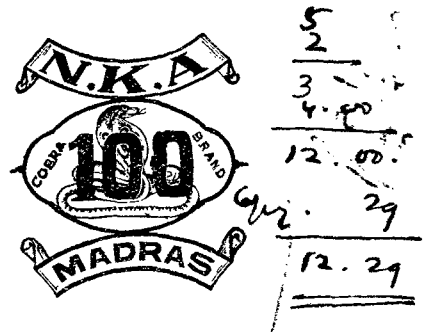
