## Town and Place.

Kotte:—Town and the remaining area within the administrative limits of the Kotte Urban District Council in the Colombo District of the Western Province.

## COLUMN II.

## Limits.

North: By the northern limit of Yakbedda village.

## NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

## Sale of Right to Collect and Remove Timber from Crown Forests for Sleeper Supplies to the Railway and for Trading Purposes.

SEALED tenders for the right to fell trees, convert them into sleepers, timber in the log, sawn timber, &c., and collect and remove these from the areas referred to in the annexed schedule, at the rates shown for the respective classes offered for sale, will be received by the Chairman, Tender Board, General Treasury, Colombo, up to midday on Tuesday, November 24, 1936.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover and should be addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, General Treasury, P. O. Box 500, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the General Treasury, Room No. 223, Second Floor, Galle Face Secretariat, Colombo, or be sent through the post preferably under registered cover.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for the Right to Exploit Crown Forests for Sleeper Supply, &c." in the left hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the General Treasury not later than midday on Tuesday, November 24, 1936. Each area shown separately in the annexed schedule should be tendered for separately.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which are to be supplied upon application at any of the Divisional Forest Offices concerned, or the Head Office, and no tender will be accepted unless it is on the recognized form.

6. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

7. A deposit of Rs. 50 must be made either in the office of the Conservator of Forests or in a Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for same before any form of tender is issued. If a person to whom a tender form has been issued fails for no satisfactory reason to submit his tender within the time fixed in Condition 4 above, his tender form deposit of Rs. 50 will be liable to be forfeited at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.

8. A tenderer shall, before making his tender, preferably at the time of obtaining a tender form, examine in the office at which he obtains the tender form, a copy of the agreement he will be required to execute in the event of his tender being accepted and shall sign and deliver a statement to the effect that he has fully acquainted himself with the terms of such agreement and that in the event of his tender being accepted he will, within the time fixed in Condition 13 below, execute an agreement in terms of the specimen agreement. As evidence of his having examined the specimen agreement the tenderer shall sign his name on it in the space provided for the purpose.

9. A tenderer who has not previously held a Forest Department contract, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the Officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property, and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given. A tenderer, who has carried out contracts with the Department but not in the Division or Districts concerned in the notice calling for tenders, should state in which Division or District or Divisions or Districts he has held contracts. A tenderer, who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should state the name of such department and the District in which the service was rendered, as well as the other information required.

10. No tender will be considered unless the conditions laid down above have been strictly complied with. The Government reserves to itself the right without question to reject any or all offers and to accept any portion of an offer. No offers will be entertained from persons whose names appear on the list of defaulting contractors or the list of persons to whom licences are to be refused.

11. The tenderer should quote a lump sum (or premium) both in words and in figures, which shall indicate and include the amount of money the tenderer is prepared to pay for the exclusive right to exploit the area in question, but shall not include the value of the material which the purchaser of the right shall pay to the Forest Department at the time of removal at the reduced royalty rates specified in the schedule annexed. The attention of tenderers is specially drawn to the minimum premium for each area shown in the annexed schedule.

12. Tenderers should, before tendering, satisfy themselves as to the timber contents of the area of exploitation; no representations as to adequacy or quality of such contents will be entertained after an offer has been accepted for the right to exploit the area.

13. The successful tenderer for each area shall, within ten days of being informed in writing that his tender has been accepted, pay in full the amount of his offer and enter into the necessary agreement. He shall also deposit, before signing the agreement the amount shown in the schedule annexed hereto, as security for the due and punctual performance of the agreement. Failure to comply with these requirements may result in the forfeiture of the tender form deposit and the offer of the right to another tenderer. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer.

14. The contract or agreement shall be entered into by the contractor with the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction the area of operation lies, acting for and on behalf of HIS MAJESTY THE KING, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

15. After execution of the agreement, the successful tenderer (hereinafter called the contractor) may commence the felling and conversion of trees and the collection of timber at the wayside Depots established by him in the area with the consent of the Divisional Forest Officer and referred to in the agreement, where, subject to reservation specified in Special Condition 3, payment must be made at the reduced royalty rates referred to in the attached schedule, for the respective classes. Final removal will only be permitted on removal permits in the prescribed form, under the hand of a Forest Officer, and only in respect of timber which bears the Government hammer mark "S". Material transported outside the area of operations shall bear a distinctive property mark, indicating ownership of such material by the contractor who shall register such property mark with the Divisional Forest Officer at the time of signing the agreement. The material found in the area will for purposes of payment be divided into the following classes:—

## A.—Railway Sleepers.

- (i.) Broad Gauge: Satinwood, palu, milla, ranai, and na.
- (ii.) Narrow Gauge: ditto

## B.—Timber in the Log and Timber converted in the Forest.

- (i.) Ebony (cleaned).
- (ii.) Satinwood (below 5 ft. girth at butt end), nedun, jak, and margosa.
- (iii.) Palu, milla, ranai, halmilla, na, hulanhii, kumbuk, kolon, tamarind, pihimbiya, kon.
- (iv.) Other species.

On B (Timber in the log) at a rate per cubic foot calculated by multiplying the square of the quarter girth (measured midway between the two ends of the log) by the length; on B (Timber converted in the forest) at a rate per cubic foot calculated by multiplying the length, breadth, and thickness; and on C (firewood) at a rate per cubic yard.

16. No contract or agreement may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board. In the event of the Tender Board refusing to authorize assignment or subletting of a contract and the contractor not being prepared to carry on work on his own, the right of exploiting the area shall be readvertised and on its resale the contractor's rights shall automatically cease, and he shall not be entitled to refund of any sums paid by him or to any claim whatsoever on account of the resale. The right is reserved to the Conservator of Forests to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person, authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf, or to refuse to recognize a power of attorney if he is not satisfied with the reasons for its issue.

17. The Conservator of Forests may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

18. Special rules for felling, conversion, and removal of material which are to be observed by the contractor, are more fully outlined in the Special Conditions given below. Nothing in these Special Conditions will exempt the contractor from liability under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of a Forest Offence.

19. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim, by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934.

20. The payments to which the contractor may render himself liable under this contract may be deducted by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned from all moneys then due or that may become due to the Contractor under this or any other contract he may hold under Government and/or from the security deposited by the Contractor and hypothecated to the Crown under clause 13 hereof or be recovered from him by action at law.

*Special Conditions.*

(1) The Forest Department will, as far as possible, assist contractors in disposing of material extracted from their areas. The Railway Department will buy direct from the contractors, subject to stipulations shown below, sleepers of the correct specification (copy attached), in respect of species, quality, and dimensions, brought from the felling area to the railway line sides or station yards. The Railway Department will pay the contractors for all accepted sleepers at the following approximate rates:—

It should be understood by tenderers that no guarantee is held out that payment will be made by the Railway Department at the above rates as they are subject to revision. Narrow Gauge sleepers should not be converted except on the orders of the Forest Department which will issue such orders after ascertaining the requirements of the Railway Department. The Contractor shall extract as many sleepers as his coupe could yield. Should he fail to do this he shall be liable to forfeit his security in full or in part.

(2) A Forest Department representative will pass all sleepers for species at the same time that the Railway Department's Inspecting Officer passes them for specification and payment; and the Forest Department will generally advise the contractor during the course of the work as to the specification and standard of sleepers required, but the onus of supplying sleepers which comply with the Railway Department's specification rests on the contractor alone.

(3) Reduced royalty at the rates given in the schedule, fixed after taking into consideration the accessibility of the forest, will be recovered on timber in the log, converted material other than sleepers and firewood at the Wayside Depot, as and when required by the Divisional Forest Officer, and in any case at intervals of not longer duration than one month. The time and place of recovery of reduced royalty on sleepers will be fixed by the Conservator of Forests and his decision on all aspects of this question shall be final.

(4) Sleepers should be delivered at an agreed point on the line side or station yards in batches or parcels of not less than 600, and as sufficient quantities become available for handing over, the Forest Department will intimate the Railway Department to this effect.

(5) The contractor shall, if required by the Divisional Forest Officer, deposit with that officer such sum of money as may be required to secure the due payment of the reduced royalty; and in case of default being made in the payment at the prescribed time of any reduced royalty accrued under the agreement the sum so accrued may be withdrawn by the said officer from the sum deposited and shall then be credited to Forest Revenue.

(6) A plan will be attached to the agreement showing the working area delineated by a red outline. The boundaries of the area and subdivisions of it, as the Divisional Forest Officer may deem necessary, shall be demarcated by the contractor and work shall be confined to such subdivisions as the Divisional Forest Officer may from time to time lay down.

(7) The conditions regarding felling operations, &c., are as follows:—

- (a) In areas which are not Reserved Forests or Proposed Reserves and in areas which are released for the requirements of the Revenue Officer, halmilla trees which exceed 3 ft. 6 in. in girth at breast height and all other trees which exceed 4 ft. 6 in. in girth at breast height may be felled. All sound trees of sleeper species not below 5 ft. in girth at breast height shall be felled.
- (b) In Reserved Forests and Proposed Reserves no tree below 5 ft. in girth at breast height shall be felled, nor shall any tree be felled which has not been previously stamped for felling by a Forest Officer.
- (c) Felled satinwood trees over 5 ft. 6 in. in girth at butt end shall not be sawn into sleepers until passed by the Divisional Forest Officer or by an officer deputed by him. From such trees the Forest Department may select logs for the Central Timber Depot or for supply to Government departments. The contractor shall convert and trim such selected logs and supply them at the nearest railway station loaded into railway trucks, for which service he shall be paid at the following rates:—

An additional sum of 25 cents per c. ft. will be paid for logs over 18 ft. in length and/or over 8 ft. in mid-girth.

The contractor will not be permitted to remove satin logs over 5 ft. in girth at butt end except on indents for Public Departments.

(d) All cleaned ebony logs measuring 2 ft. and upwards in girth shall, if so required, be delivered to the Forest Department and the contractor will be paid for such logs at a rate per cubic foot agreed upon between him and the Divisional Forest Officer at the time of supply; this rate shall be subject to the approval of the Conservator of Forests.

(e) Supplies of other hardwoods for Government departments will be obtained from coupes by the Forest Department which will pay the contractor at the following rates:—

An additional sum of 25 cents per c. ft. will be paid for logs over 18 ft. in length and/or over 8 ft. in mid-girth.

The contractor shall deliver such supplies loaded into railway trucks at the Railway station nearest his coupe. He shall also comply strictly with specifications, &c., connected with each supply. The placing of orders for these supplies shall be entirely at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests. Any logs not so ordered may be otherwise disposed of by the contractor.

(8) (i.) If an agreement-holder in the performance of his agreement does anything contrary to its terms or omits to do anything required thereby, the Conservator of Forests may:—

- (a) in any case in which he is of opinion that such act or omission is a serious irregularity, cancel the said agreement and forfeit, for the use of the Crown, the agreement-holder's security deposit and all timber in the area and the wayside depot, whether paid for or not;
- (b) in any case in which he is of opinion that such act or omission is a minor irregularity, fine the agreement-holder.

(ii.) The Conservator of Forests may give the agreement-holder time to pay such fine. If such fine be not paid within the time allowed for its payment, it will be recovered from the security deposited under General Condition No. 13.

(9) The agreement-holder shall make good any deductions made from the security deposit within such time as the Conservator of Forests may fix. If he fails to do so the Conservator of Forests may cancel his agreement and forfeit the balance of the said deposit.

(10) The contractor shall be liable to pay, at rates obtaining under the contract, for logs left lying in the area at the termination of the contract, which in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer are marketable or capable of being converted.

Any trees which stand unfelled in the coupe at the termination of the contract shall be the property of the Crown and the contractor shall have no claim whatever to them.

(11) All demands for timber and firewood in the vicinity of an area under working shall be met from that area and the contractor will be required to meet those demands and will be allowed to charge any rate not in excess of Full... prescribed by law, for standing timber or firewood. The contractor shall issue licences for felling and removal on his own... which shall be subject to the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Materials thus sold shall bear the Government... other mark and the contractor's property mark side by side.

(12) All produce removed by the contractor or his licensee may be stopped and examined by any Forest Officer, anywhere, and, if there is reason to believe that money is payable to Government in respect of any portion of it, may be detained until such money is paid, or until inquiry regarding it has been made.

(13) The contractor shall have the right to appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of the enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions and the decision of the Conservator of Forests shall be final and binding.

(14) Felling, conversion, collecting, and removal rights under this sale shall commence on January 1, 1937, or the date of signing the agreement whichever is later.

(15) The first consignment of not less than 600 broad gauge sleepers must be ready for delivery to the Railway not later than March 31, 1937. In the case of delay a penalty of Rs. 25 will be imposed for every month or part of a month, after March 31, and until the first consignment is ready for delivery.

(16) Felling rights shall cease on August 31, 1938, in the case of the three areas known as Kandakadu, Papawa, and Bintenna, and on August 31, 1937, in the case of all other areas, while conversion, collection and removal rights shall cease on December 31, 1938, in the case of the former 3 areas and on December 31, 1937, in the case of all other areas. Applications for extension of time will only be considered in exceptional circumstances and granted at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests, whose decision shall be final. Such extension shall be subject to payment by the contractor of 25 per cent. of the accepted premium for every period of extension of 3 months or less. The Conservator of Forests shall, however, have the power to waive this payment in full or in part, at his sole discretion, but this power will only be exercised in cases where the contractor has displayed commendable zeal and energy, or where his operations have been hindered by circumstances outside his control. Extension of time for felling purposes, however, will not be granted under any circumstances in respect of Akkiriyan, Andankulam, and Irasenthirankulam forests.

Copy of Railway Department's Specification for Sleepers.

(a) The broad gauge sleepers are for the 5 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 9 ft. long, 10 in. wide, and 5 in. deep, subject to a variation in length of 1 in. The narrow gauge sleepers are for the 2 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 5 ft. long, 9 in. wide, and 4½ in. deep, subject to a similar variation in length.

(b) All sleepers shall be cut from well matured trees of the true species of timber. Sleepers must be sawn, and shall be of good sound timber free from heartwood, sapwood, except as provided in (c), dry rot and knot holes shall be cut square out of winding and straight.

(c) Allowance may be made for small surface sunshakes, end shakes up to 6 in.; a few pin holes but not in groups, sound and firm knots up to 2 in. in diameter; sap or wane must not exceed 2 in. on either face and not come under the rail seat.

(d) The sleepers shall not be cut on full quarter and shall be cut with an allowance of ¼ in. in width and ½ in. in thickness to allow for shrinkage and no further allowance on account of size, except as provided above for length, shall be made.

Present :—Mr. F. C. Gimson, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. O. T. Nettelton ; Dr. D. T. de Kretser ; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 15, 1936, and of the Special Meeting held on September 7, 1936, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and copies thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1935 to August 31, 1936, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for August, 1936.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during August, 1936. (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

3 A. The Chairman informed the Council that Mrs. W. Beven has resigned the office of Hony. Secretary to the Kandy Municipal Maternity and Child Welfare Committee as she was leaving the Island on a holiday, and moved—"That the Council place on record its appreciation of the valuable and devoted services rendered by Mrs. W. Beven as Hony. Secretary of the Kandy Municipal Maternity and Child Welfare Committee." Ratwatte Adigar seconded.—Carried.

4. Petitions :—Mr. de Silva presented (1) Petition from Mr. S. M. Mohideen dated September 14, 1936, applying for one of the stalls rendered vacant by the death of the licensee, M. Idroos. (2) Petition from Mr. Meer Kulam dated September 8, 1936, stating that Mrs. Dissanayake, an employee of the Council, avoided payment of a debt by pleading the Public Servants' Liability Ordinance.

Mr. Usoof Ismail presented (3) petition from Mr. B. P. C. Perera dated September 2, 1936, asking that the condition imposed in sanctioning the transfer of a half share of Fish Stall No. 6 in the Katugastota Market be removed.

Mr. Soysa presented (4) petition from Messrs. P. S. Mohamadu Yoosof & Bros., dated September 18, 1936, stating that if the Council is unwilling to transfer the licence of the retail rice depot to Mr. Kanagasabay that they would continue to carry on the trade.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matters referred to in the petitions (1) to (3). Petition (4) was to be considered with item 6 (5) on the agenda.

4 A. Pursuant to notice Mr. Wijayatilake moved—"Referring to the notices issued on house owners of Colombo street, &c., relating to alleged encroachments on land belonging to the Municipal Council, I move that no charge be made where such encroachments have taken place prior to the Town Survey referred to in the notices." Ratwatte Adigar seconded.

The Chairman tabled (a) reports from the Municipal Engineer and the Medical Officer of Health indicating schemes under contemplation; (b) Chairman's memorandum dated September 30, 1936, indicating that there was no scope for raising the annual values of properties as a means of raising the revenue of the Council. He further explained that the Council must choose either progress with an increase of rates, or stagnation on the existing rates. Mr. Geo. E. de Silva and all the elected members opposed the imposition of enhanced rates at the present juncture on the ground that the financial condition of the ratepayers did not justify the increase.

Thereafter, Mr. Wijayatilake moved—"That the Council suspend all capital expenditure necessitating an increase of rates until such time as other ways and means for augmenting the revenue of the Council have been fully investigated and reported upon, and that the same rates be levied during 1937 as in 1936." Mr. Ismail seconded and the motion was duly carried. The Chairman abstained from voting.

2. Suggestions for the appointment of a Special Committee to consider the question of economy in expenditure were deferred on the understanding that Mr. Marikar would give notice of a motion on this subject for discussion at the next meeting.

3. To consider letter No. B 900 of September 17, 1936, from the Secretary to the Minister of Local Administration on the question of Municipal Reforms. (O 113).—The Council agreed that the Chairman do take steps (a) to divide the Municipality into Wards after the Hon. the Minister had indicated the number of wards which his Executive Committee considered desirable; (b) to urge on the Hon. the Minister the necessity to consider seriously the change in the franchise suggested by the Council; and (c) to submit to the Hon. the Minister the desirability of due consideration being given to the opinion of the elected members of the Council on the subject of the type of constitution which is best suited to the interests of the constituents whom they represent.

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, September 12, 1936, at 9 a.m., pursuant to notice dated September 7, 1936.

*Present* :—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna ; Mr. C. H. Bradley ; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo ; Mr. W. Dahanayaka ; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab ; Mr. A. Kahaduwa ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; and Mr. G. Ross Bell.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on August 15 and 29, 1936, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Two petitions were presented by Mr. Wahab, two by Mr. Karunaratna, and one by Mr. Magdon Ismail. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Arising out of the replies to the questions asked at the previous meeting regarding the cases of chickenpox in the Galle Hospital, Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following supplemental question :—“ How can it be maintained that the isolation was satisfactory when as a matter of fact the same latrine was used both by the chickenpox patients in question as well as by the patients in the adjoining ward ? ”

The Chairman replied as follows :—“ I am satisfied that satisfactory arrangements were made by the hospital authorities for the proper isolation of the patients in question, and I am not prepared to answer any further questions on the matter.”

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayake asked the following further questions :—(1) (a) Have notices under Regulation 89 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897, been issued to traders in rice, subsequent to July 11, 1936 ? (b) Has not the Council decided that this regulation should be considered and reported on by the Four Standing Committees ? (c) When will the Four Standing Committees meet for this purpose ? (d) In the notices that have been issued, has due cognizance been taken of the amendment to the regulation made in June and the subsequent explanation by the Minister for Health in a communique issued last month ? (2) (a) Will the Chairman please give full details about the securities that have been furnished to the Council by employees now in service, stating in each case the properties concerned, their situation and acreage, their valuations, and by whom the valuations were made ? (b) Is the Chairman satisfied that these valuations are reasonable ? (c) Will the Chairman please give similar details about the security in landed property that had been furnished by the ex-shroff of the Council ? (d) If the landed property in question of the ex-shroff is really worth much less than Rs. 6,000 what action does the Chairman propose to take in order to safeguard the interests of the rate-payers ? (3) (a) Is Asphalt the only emulsion used by the Works Department of the Council in the surfacing and patching of roads ? (b) Is the Chairman aware that at a recent meeting of Engineers held in Colombo, the relative merits of various such emulsions were discussed and that there was a large majority of Engineers in favour of a non-heating emulsion called Colas ? (c) Inasmuch as Colas needs no boiler or firewood for its preparation and can be put into use in any kind of weather free from danger, will the Chairman please instruct the Municipal Engineer to give it a trial in Galle, both for surfacing and for patching work ? (4) (a) Will the Chairman please state whether he can, as a part time officer of the Council, do justice to the important and responsible duties attached to the office of Chairman ? (b) Has not the Chairman often, owing to exigencies of time, delegated to other officers of the Council duties which he should have himself performed ? (c) Will the Chairman please permit me now to move the motion for an Assistant Chairman, which he over-ruled a few months ago ?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) (a) Yes, but only in respect of grain boutiques ; (b) yes ; (c) As soon as it is possible to arrange for a meeting ; (d) Yes. (2) (a) A statement giving the information required is tabled ; (b) I have no reason to think that the valuations are unreasonable ; (c) A statement giving the information required is tabled ; (d) I am not prepared at this stage to answer this question. The matter will have to be considered, if necessary, after the enforcement of the security bond in respect of which an action has already been instituted. (3) (a) Two kinds of road-surfacing materials are used at present by the Works Department, viz., “ Texaco ” Paving Cement No. 96 (for hot application) and “ Socony ” Asphalt Emulsion No. 3 (for cold application) ; (b) No. I am not aware of this ; (c) Colas as supplied by the Shell Co. of Ceylon, Ltd., was used by the Works Department up till the end of 1935 and was found to be satisfactory. At the expiration of the contract with that firm fresh quotations were obtained, and as a result the material now used is Socony Asphalt Emulsion No. 3 which is a cheaper Cold Emulsion than Colas, but has so far proved to be just as satisfactory. It is, therefore, unnecessary to issue any such instructions on the matter as is suggested. (4) (a) I am not prepared to answer this question as it involves a matter of opinion regarding the Chairman's capabilities ; (b) Section 242 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, empowers the Chairman to delegate to other officers of the Council certain powers and duties. I am not aware that I or my predecessors in office have delegated to other officers of the Council any duties which we should have ourselves performed ; (c) The previous motion was ruled out of order by me on the ground that it is contrary to the provisions of the Ordinance for any member of the Council to be appointed an Assistant Chairman. That ruling still holds good as long as the motion is in the same form in which it was originally proposed.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved :—(1) “ This Council invites the attention of Government to the urgent necessity for making the Customs Warehouse at Galle ratproof.” Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded, and Mr. J. E. Perera supported the motion, which was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(2) “ That all materials used for Municipal purposes be obtained by calling for tenders, unless in the case of any particular article the Council decides otherwise.” Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya, C. E. de Vos, C. H. Bradley, and A. C. Mohammedo also spoke. Mr. G. Ross Bell suggested that the words “ the cost of which exceeds Rs. 250 in one financial year ” be inserted after the word “ purposes ”. The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment, and after the matter had been further discussed by the Council in Committee, the motion, as amended, was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

6. To consider the Interim Report of the Special Committee appointed to inquire into the causes that contributed to the recent irregularities in the Shroff's Department and to make suitable recommendations thereon. The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

*Council in Committee*—

After discussion Mr. E. M. Karunaratna moved that the Interim Report of the Special Committee be adopted and that the necessary action be taken at once to carry out the recommendations made therein. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

*Council resumed*, and the Chairman moved that the above resolution of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

It was further resolved that a supplemental vote of Rs. 275 be sanctioned for enclosing the Shroff's Office and constructing a counter in accordance with the estimate submitted by the Municipal Engineer.

7. To consider the following extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works and Markets and Sanitation of August 4, 1936 :—“ Considered Mr. Dahanayaka's motion at the meeting of Council on July 11, 1936, viz. : “ That a public latrine be erected near the new Bus Stand.—Recommended that a public latrine for males and females be erected in a specially enclosed portion of the Victoria Park opposite the Railway Station, and that tenders for the work be called for as early as possible.” The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

*Council in Committee*—

After discussion, Mr. E. M. Karunaratna moved that a public latrine for males and females be erected on the strip of land adjoining the bridge and lying between Havelock place and the Canal, and that tenders for the work be called for as early as possible. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded.—Carried.

*Council resumed*, and the Chairman moved that the above resolution of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

8. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 29, 1936.*

(2) Considered applications for water service to the following premises :—(a) 46A, Galupiadde.—Recommended that an extension be allowed, as applied for, from the adjoining premises No. 47 belonging to the same owner, but that only one tap be allowed. (b) New building on Circular road belonging to Mr. S. A. Hamad and presently under construction.—Recommended that the application be allowed to 3 taps. (c) 268, Dangedara.—Recommended that the application be allowed but with two taps only. (d) 357, Jakotuwa.—Recommended that the application be allowed but with one tap only. (e) 311A, Dangedara.—Recommended that the application be refused. (f) 104, China Garden.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap. (g) 36, Kaluwella.—Recommended that the application be allowed for two taps. (h) 282, Dangedara.—Recommended that the application be allowed for two taps. (i) 11, Wakwella road.—Recommended that the application be allowed for two taps. (j) New building on Abeysondera road belonging to Mr. G. Abeysondera and presently under construction.—Recommended that the application be allowed for 5 taps. (k) 86D, Kandewatta road.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap.

(3) Considered an application from Mr. G. A. Serasinghe to re-name Donald Jansz road and “Serasinghe road.”—Recommended that the application be refused.

(4) To recommend the appointment of a Clerk of Works for all works carried out on tender and not for drainage works only, as originally decided on.—Recommended that a Clerk of Works be appointed at Rs. 2 per diem for all works done on tender which in the opinion of the Chairman are of sufficient importance to warrant such appointment. Recommended, further, that the employment of a Clerk of Works for the Gangarama bridge, which has already been approved by the Chairman be sanctioned.

(5) Historical Map of Galle Fort.—Recommended that copies of the map compiled by the Superintendent of Surveys, Galle, be obtained from the Surveyor-General and that they be displayed at four selected sites on the Ramparts.—Recommended, further, that a supplemental vote of Rs. 60 be sanctioned for the purpose.

(6) Considered the question of the Council taking over and maintaining the existing footpath from Jail road to the Kaluwella temple.—Recommended that the Council do take over and maintain the footpath in question and that the Municipal Engineer be requested to submit two alternative estimated—one for tarring the footpath and the other for graveling it.

(7) Considered the question as to how the balance of sum of Rs. 3,500 available on the vote for “New Drainage” should be utilized.—Recommended that the construction of two lengths of retaining wall for the side drains on Elliott road, for which an estimate of Rs. 1,075 has already been approved, be taken in hand during the current year and that the expenditure be met from the savings on the vote for “New Drainage.”

(8) Considered a memorandum from the Superintendent of the Electricity Department regarding the changing of all “Earths” on consumers’ premises as recommended by the Chief Engineer and Manager, Electrical Undertakings.—Recommended that the necessary change be made at the expense of the Council and that for the current year a supplemental vote of Rs. 500 be sanctioned for the purpose.

*Resolution.*

With regard to item (5) it was resolved by 12 votes to one that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted, Mr. Dahanayake only voting against.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were also adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of August 29, 1936.*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Wards 2, 3, and 4.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) To waive the assessment rates due for 1936 on the evacuated premises No. 342, Bazaar in the Plague area in Ward No. 3.—Recommended that the rates due for 1936, amounting to Rs. 31·95, be waived.

(4) Considered what action should be taken with regard to the following properties purchased by Council for non-payment of rates.—878A, Galupiadde in Ward No. 3, and 430, Galupiadde in Ward No. 4.—Recommended, as regards 878A, that the occupier be given further time till the end of September, 1936, to pay up the arrears due, and as regards No. 430, that the rates due on the property from 4th quarter, 1935 to 4th quarter, 1936, amounting to Rs. 6·65 be written off on the ground of poverty of the owner.

(5) To recommend supplemental votes under the following heads of expenditure :—(a) *Head 46*—Maintenance of Victoria Park, Esplanade, and public seats.—Recommended a supplemental vote of Rs. 900, 750 being for ordinary maintenance and Rs. 150 for the provision of additional garden seats. (b) *Head 80*—Police Cattle Pound, Contingencies.—Recommended a supplemental vote of Rs. 50. (c) *Head 87*—Fire Protection.—Recommended a supplemental vote of Rs. 100. (d) *Head 88*—Destruction of Stray Dogs.—Recommended a supplemental vote of Rs. 300.

(6) Considered a letter from the Government Valuer on the question of the proposed re-assessment of all properties in the town.—Recommended that all properties in the town be re-assessed by the Government Valuer during 1937 at a cost of approximately Rs. 6,000 and as regards the question of re-numbering, that the Government Valuer be asked to state whether he would be willing to carry out this work as well for a reduced fee of  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. of the total annual value.

(7) Considered the question of a travelling allowance to the 2nd Assistant to the Superintendent of the Electricity Department.—Recommended the payment of a bicycle allowance of Rs. 20 per mensem with effect from July 1, 1936, and the sanction of the necessary supplemental expenditure.

(8) Considered an estimate of Rs. 6,000 for constructing an Office for the Superintendent, Electricity Department.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that the necessary expenditure be provided in the Budget for 1937.

(9) Considered an application from the Galle Child Welfare Association for an extra grant of Rs. 1,400 (being salary of an additional Health Visitor and cost of food, &c.) in order to enable the Association to run clinics both at Magalle and China Garden.—Recommended by 3 votes to one (Mr. Dahanayake being in favour of an additional grant of Rs. 1,400) that an additional grant of Rs. 1,000 be made to the Galle Child Welfare Association from the beginning of next year in view of the opening of the Silver Jubilee Clinic and the consequent extension of Child welfare work in Galle.

(10) To recommend the payment of a gratuity to Y. Sarnelis, Conservancy labourer, who has been condemned by a Medical Board, as unfit for further service.—Recommended, in terms of Rule 21 of the Municipal Pension Minute the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 195·95 for 271 months service under the Council.

*Resolution.*

With regard to item (5) it was resolved that the supplemental vote be increased to Rs. 1,000.

With regard to item (6) the Chairman informed the meeting that the Government Valuer had written to say that he had been authorized to undertake the work of re-numbering for a reduced fee of  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. It was thereupon resolved that all properties in the town be re-assessed and re-numbered by the Government Valuer during 1937 at a total approximate cost of Rs. 8,000.

With regard to item (7) it was resolved that the allowance be called a “Travelling Allowance” instead of a “bicycle allowance”.

With regard to item (9) Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that the additional grant be increased to Rs. 1,400 from the beginning of 1937. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, six voting for and seven against. The recommendation of the Standing Committee was then put to the meeting and adopted.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

9. With the permission of Council, the following item which was not on the agenda, was next taken up for consideration :—“To consider the question of adopting by-laws for combating the nuisance caused by the inconsiderate use of wireless loudspeakers, gramophones, &c.”—Resolved that the Commissioner of Local Government be informed that the Council approves the form of the draft by-laws sent with his Circular No. B 1,391 of August 17, 1936, but that it does not propose to adopt the by-laws at present without further consideration.

10. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, October 10, 1936, at 9 A.M.

11. The following documents were laid on the table :—

- (1) Statement of receipts and disbursements to end of August, 1936.
- (2) Progress report of works done on estimates during August, 1936.
- (3) Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on Carriages plying for hire during August, 1936.
- (4) Report of the Superintendent of the Electricity Department for August, 1936.
- (5) Diaries of (a) the Medical Officer of Health, (b) the Municipal Engineer, (c) the Inspector of Works, and (d) the Manager, Health Department.
- (6) Letter No. E 698 from the Commissioner of Local Government regarding the services of the Town Planning Expert.
- (7) Papers relating to the provision of a Motor Ambulance for Galle town.

12. In connection with item 8 (a) (5) of the Minutes Mr. W. Dahanayaka, at the General Meeting held on Saturday, October 10, 1936, submitted, in terms of by-law 26, Chapter 2, the following dissent from the opinion of the majority of the Council :—

In terms of by-law No. 26 of Chapter 2 of the by-laws, I hereby record my dissent from the following recommendations of the Council :—“ Recommended that copies of the historical map of the Galle Fort compiled by the Superintendent of Surveys, Galle, be obtained from the Surveyor-General, and that they be displayed at four selected sites on the Ramparts. Recommended further, that a supplemental vote of Rs. 60 be sanctioned for this purpose.”

The suggestion of displaying a historical map was made by Dr. G. H. Arndt on March 30. On March 31, I wrote to the Chairman suggesting that the map the Superintendent of Surveys was said to be preparing at that time should be submitted to a recognized authority on the Dutch and Portuguese periods of Ceylon History for his advice. I mentioned the name of Rev. Fr. S. G. Perera, S.J. as such an authority.

After this, the question was placed before the Works Committee, who, I understand, were not informed of my suggestion. The Works Committee recommended that inquiries should be made from the Surveyor-General with regard to the cost of printing and preparing the map.

This recommendation came up before Council on July 11. On that occasion I attempted to point out the importance of securing a map the historical accuracy of which would be above question. The Chairman then told me that my suggestion could be made after a reply from the Surveyor-General had been received.

I dissent from these recommendations for the following reasons :—Firstly, the Council has not taken sufficient care to see that the map in question is unbiassed and historically accurate. Secondly, when the Council was asked to vote the necessary money, the work had already been completed.

I, therefore, dissent from the recommendations in question, and desire that my dissent be duly recorded.

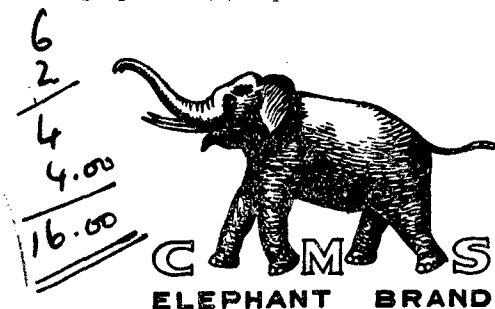

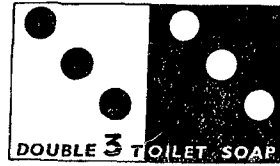
