THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE, No. 9 OF 1924.

Order.

WHEREAS by Proclamations in that behalf duly published this day, the town of Kelaniya in Siyane korale west, in the Colombo District of the Western Province has, with effect from the thirty-first day of December, 1936, been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892, and brought within the operation of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, and added to the Kelaniya subdivision of the Chief Headman's division of Siyane korale west defined in Schedule B to the Proclamation dated September 24, 1891, published in *Gazette* No. 5,091 of October 2, 1891 :

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers in me vested by section 35A of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, I, Reginald Edward Stubbs, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order, with effect from the thirty-first day of December, 1936—

- (a) transfer to the inhabitants of the aforesaid subdivision the whole of the property and the funds, vested in the Sanitary Board of the Colombo District for the use and benefit of the town of Kelaniya, and specified in Schedule A hereto ;
- (b) assign to the said inhabitants the whole of the debts or liabilities of the Sanitary Board under the contract entered into by the Board for the benefit of that town, and described in Schedule B hereto, and direct that security shall be given by the inhabitants of the said subdivision for the said debts in the manner set out in that schedule ; and
- (c) prescribe that any officer or servant employed by the said Sanitary Board, for any purpose relating exclusively to the town of Kelaniya may be transferred to the service of the Village Committee of the said subdivision upon the terms and conditions set out in Schedule C hereto.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which can be obtained from the Divisional Forest Officers, Jaffna, Colombo, Kurunegala, and Nuwara Eliya, and from the Office of the Conservator of Forests, P. O. Box No. 500, Colombo, either by post or by personal application. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be considered as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made either at the Office of the Conservator of Forests or a Kacheheri, and a receipt forwarded or produced before any form of tender is issued.

7. A lump sum offer for the full period advertised should be made and be written both in words and figures.

8. No tender form will be issued to any person whose name appears on the list of defaulting contractors or on the list of persons to whom permits to fell and remove timber and fuel from Crown forests should be refused.

9. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders and of accepting any portion of a tender. The successful tenderer shall within ten days of receiving notice from the Conservator of Forests or his duly authorized representative that his tender has been accepted, pay the Conservator of Forests the full amount in the tender and in addition a cash security of Rs. 200. He shall also enter into an agreement relative to the right.

10. Should the successful tenderer decline or fail to pay the amount of his tender or the security, or to enter into the agreement as required in the preceding clause his tender form deposit (*vide* clause 6) shall be forfeited and the right shall be resolved. He shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such resale but he shall not be entitled to any claim on any increase in price.

11. The right to transport and export shed horns shall not be assigned or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing; nor shall the purchaser issue a power of attorney to any person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors, published from time to time, for the carrying on of any work under the agreement.

12. As soon as the agreement is completed, the purchaser will be issued permit by the Divisional Forest Officers for transport of shed horns within the provinces under the jurisdiction of the respective Divisional Forest Officers. He or his accredited agents shall concentrate all shed horns transported by him under the permit at a store or stores the situation of which he shall notify the respective Divisional Forest Officers, as soon as the agreement is signed. The horns so concentrated shall always be subject to inspection by Forest Officers as also when they are in transit in any part of the Island. Separate permits should be obtained to transport the shed horns to Colombo from a provincial centre from the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction such centre lies.

13. The purchaser shall submit a list of names of his agents for approval to the different Divisional Forest Officers. Any changes of agents should be similarly reported to the Divisional Forest Officers for their approval. If the Divisional Forest Officers disapprove of the employment of particular persons or agents the purchaser shall immediately discontinue such agents.

14. The purchaser shall produce all consignments of shed horns intended for export for examination at the Central Timber Depot, Kew road, Slave Island, Colombo, and obtain a permit for export from the Divisional Forest Officer, Colombo.

15. The purchaser will be at liberty to vend shed horns within the Island of Ceylon, but vendees cannot on any account export them. The privilege of exporting belongs solely to the purchaser of the right to transport and export.

16. Should any cut horns be found by a Forest Officer in any parcel or consignment in transit or at the purchaser's store or stores, the purchaser will be liable to have the agreement cancelled at once or to pay a fine the amount of which shall be fixed by the Conservator of Forests. The imposition of either form of penalty will be at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests. In the case of cancellation of the agreement, the purchaser shall have no claim whatsoever to a refund of any moneys paid or deposited by him.

17. The purchaser or his agent or agents shall be liable for punishment under the Forest Ordinance for commission of any forest offence in the course of exercising the right acquired by this sale.

18. The purchaser shall indemnify the Crown against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the purchaser, under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934.

19. 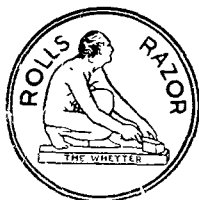

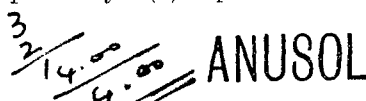

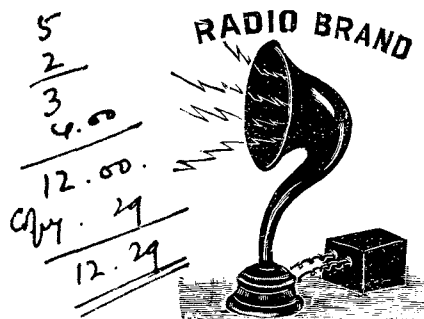
