**ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF "CEYLON POTTERIES, LIMITED".**

The regulations contained in the table marked C in the Schedule to "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861", shall apply with the following additions and alterations:—

1. After section 1.

(a) Shares may be registered in the name of a firm or partnership and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies in respect of shares registered in the name of the firm or partnership.

(b) Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons jointly.

(c) In case of the death of any one or more of the joint holders of any shares the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

(d) The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not being a firm, shall be delivered to the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares.

## 2. In place of section 6.

Any one of the joint-holders of a share other than a firm or partnership may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-holders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole shareholder and if the joint-holders cannot arrange among themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares, shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers, provided, however that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island the first Registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

## 3. After section 7.

The Directors shall have the power at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion to decline to register any transfer of share or shares whatsoever.

The Directors shall in no case be bound to inquire into the validity legal effect or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming the transfer of any share and they shall not be liable in any case for the registration of any transfer.

## 4. After section 19.

(a) The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all monies for the time being due to the Company by such holder or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders or in respect of any other debt, liability or engagement whatsoever and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others and including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make although the time appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived: and when any share is held by more persons than one the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any such persons, and the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.
