No. 11 OF 1920.

BY-LAWS made by the Kolonnawa Urban District Council under sections 164 and 168 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, and approved by the Local Government Board, and confirmed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section 164 and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

BY-LAWS.

The by-laws relating to dairies published by Notification in the *Gazette* of April 12, 1933, are hereby amended:—

- (1) by the deletion, from the heading of the part or chapter thereof numbered II., of the words "and for sale of milk"; and
- (2) by the insertion, immediately after the aforesaid part or Chapter II., of the following new part or chapter:—

III.—*Regulations for Sale of Milk generally.*

1. No person who is not a licensee of a dairy as aforesaid, shall himself, or by any agent or servant, sell or deliver, or expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, any milk within the administrative limits of the Council, save in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

2. (i.) Every such person, whether resident within or without the limits of the Council, who desires to sell or supply for money milk in any quantity to any person or persons within the limits of the Council, shall cause himself to be registered in the books of the Council as a purveyor or supplier of milk.

(ii.) Such registration shall be free of all fees or charges.

3. Every such person shall, by proper application made for that purpose, further cause registration-cards to be issued annually by the Chairman to each servant, vendor, or agent, whether paid or unpaid, employed by him in the work of selling or delivering milk.

4. Any contravention of, or non-compliance with, the foregoing provisions shall be an offence.

5. (1) The Chairman may in his discretion refuse to register as a purveyor or supplier of milk under the foregoing by-law 2, any person who has not been recommended for registration, after such inspection, as may be necessary, of his premises, his animals, and his utensils and equipment generally—

- (a) if he is a resident within the administrative limits of the Council, by the Medical Officer of Health of the Council; or
- (b) if he is resident in any area outside the limits of the Council, by the Chairman of any duly constituted local authority there may be in such area, or if there is none, by the Medical Officer of Health for the district in which such area lies.

(2) The Chairman may likewise refuse to issue any registration-cards, under the foregoing by-law 3, until a Medical Officer deputed by him has examined and found each such servant, vendor, or agent to be free from any infectious or contagious disease and from diseases of the skin.

6. The registration-cards so issued by the Chairman shall include the following particulars:—

- (a) employer's name and number on register;
- (b) name of vendor or servant or agent, and his thumb impression.

7. It shall be an offence, for any person to deliver milk or to carry or hawk milk for sale within the limits of the Council, unless he has in his possession a registration-card for the current year duly issued as aforesaid.

8. (i.) It shall be an offence for any person delivering milk or carrying or hawking milk for sale within the limits of the Council, to refuse, or to fail for any reason, to produce for inspection a duly issued registration-card for the current year, when called upon to do so by a Sanitary Inspector or by any person specially or generally authorized by the Chairman in that behalf.

(ii.) In the event of any person so refusing or failing to produce such card, it shall be lawful for such Sanitary Inspector or other authorized person to exercise the powers given to peace officers by section 33 (1) of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

9. It shall be an offence for any person to sell or deliver or to expose, keep, hawk, or offer for sale, within the limits of the Council—

- (i.) any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless such milk is contained in a vessel which is distinctly and conspicuously labelled "Skimmed milk" in English, and the equivalent term in Sinhalese and Tamil, and is sold as such.
- (ii.) any milk adulterated with water or any other foreign substance or liquid; provided that milk, to which tea, coffee, or cacao has been added for consumption on the premises of any tea or coffee boutique or eating-house, shall not be deemed to be adulterated for the purpose of this by-law.
- (iii.) any milk contained in bottles of which the mouth is not covered with paper or other impermeable material.

10. If any person found guilty of an offence under the foregoing by-law 9 is proved to be the agent or servant, whether paid or unpaid, of any other person, such other person shall also be liable to be punished for the same offence, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that he had given all necessary instructions and used due diligence to ensure compliance, and that the offence was due to an act or default of his agent, or servant without his own knowledge, consent, or connivance.

11. Any offence under the foregoing by-laws 1 to 10, inclusive, shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or after service of a written notice from the Chairman, or an officer authorized by the Chairman, of the contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

1. (a) Whenever any tree within the administrative limits of this Council or the branch, fruit, or leaf of such a tree is in the opinion of the Chairman either likely to fall upon any house or building or likely to be dangerous to its occupants, and whenever such tree, branch, fruit, or leaf overhangs any street, the Chairman may, by a notice in writing served on the owner or the occupier of the land upon which the tree stands, require him to cut down the tree, branch, fruit, or leaf, as the case may be; and if such owner or occupier fails within twenty-four hours of receiving the notice to comply with its requirements, any officers or workmen authorized in writing by the Chairman may enter upon such land and at the expense of the owner or occupier do what the owner or occupier was required to do by the notice.

(b) The owner or occupier who fails to comply with the requirements of a notice issued under paragraph (a) above shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Animals Tax for the Year 1937.

RESTHOUSE RULES OF THE CENTRAL PROVINCE.

1. The term "resthouse" shall include the land attached to a resthouse and all the buildings thereon.

2. A fee at the rate set out in the schedule hereto shall be paid by every person using or occupying any part of a resthouse; provided that children under 12 years of age shall be charged only half the aforesaid rates, and that no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—

- (a) an infant in arms;
- (b) a servant who is in attendance on a visitor at a resthouse and sleeps within the resthouse;
- (c) the chauffeur of any car garaged in the resthouse premises, if he sleeps in the car or in the garage.

3. Every visitor shall, on his admission to a resthouse, write his correct name and address in the resthouse collection book, and until this is done a visitor shall not be entitled to use the resthouse and shall not be supplied with refreshments. Every visitor shall, before leaving the resthouse, enter in the collection book the date of departure and other particulars required.

4. (1) No visitor shall occupy any part of a resthouse for a period longer than three consecutive days, without the special permission in writing of the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee.

(2) Every occupier of a resthouse who has not obtained such permission shall on the expiration of such period of three days, forthwith leave the resthouse.

5. The resthouse shall be open for the sale or disposal of any brand or make of wine, spirits, or malt liquor which has been previously approved by the Provincial Road Committee.

6. The resthouse is licensed for the sale for consumption on the premises of foreign liquor (including locally made beer) to persons occupying the resthouse for a night or for any longer period and to *bona fide* travellers who come to the resthouse from a distance of over three miles. Between the hours of 11 P.M. and 8 A.M. liquor will not be sold except to *bona fide* travellers who arrive at the resthouse between those hours after travelling a distance of over three miles. In such cases the sale will be restricted to a period of half an hour subsequent to their arrival.

7. Officers of the Excise Department in uniform who visit a resthouse in their official capacity shall not be liable to pay occupation fees provided that—

- (a) they make no use of the bedrooms, stables, or kennels;
- (b) the duration of their stay does not exceed one hour;
- (c) they sign the Inspecting Officer's book giving all the information therein required;
- (d) they do not take any meal, drink, or other refreshment in the resthouse.

8. No charges other than those payable to the Provincial Road Committee shall be entered in the resthouse books by a visitor.

9. Resthouse fees and charges shall be paid in cash on demand and, in default of such payment, the resthouse-keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supplies.

10. The resthouse-keeper shall not be bound to comply with any telegram requesting meals to be prepared unless the name and address of the sender are set out in the telegram.

11. No bed, sofa, or couch in the resthouse shall be used for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon.

12. The value of all articles damaged or broken by any visitor or his servant shall be paid by that visitor before leaving the resthouse in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

13. (1) Any complaint which a visitor may have to make about the resthouse or resthouse-keeper shall be noted in the complaint book.

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse-keeper to produce the complaint book when called upon so to do.

(3) No remarks or complaints shall be written in the resthouse collection book.

14. (1) No lunch, dinner, garden party, or other reception organized by, or on behalf of, any person or persons shall be held in a resthouse, except with the written permission of the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee.

(2) The Chairman may allow to any person the use of the whole or any part of the resthouse on payment of such special fees and on such conditions as he may in his discretion determine.

15. Persons in actual occupation of a resthouse shall have a prior claim to the use of any garage, stable, or kennel attached to the resthouse, over persons who are not in actual occupation of the resthouse.

16. The owner or hirer of a vehicle, horse, dog, or other animal garaged, stabled, or kennelled in a resthouse, shall, notwithstanding that he himself has not occupied the resthouse, pay the personal occupation fee for the period

during which the vehicle is garaged, or the horse, dog, or other animal is stabled, or kennelled, in addition to the fee for the use of the garage, stable, or kennel.

Provided that any member of the Ceylon Defence Force, who leaves a motor car or motor cycle in a resthouse garage while on military duty, shall not be liable to pay any occupation or garage fees during the period of such duty, but any such car may be removed by the resthouse-keeper from the garage, if necessary, to make room for the vehicle of a visitor paying occupation fees.

17. (1) Any visitor who desires to book any accommodation in advance may do so on giving at least seven clear days' notice.

(2) Such notice shall be accompanied by a remittance of Rs. 7.50, which will be credited to the visitor's account if the accommodation is taken as arranged.

(3) The remittance will be forfeited if the accommodation is not taken as arranged: provided that such remittance may be refunded (less Money Order commission necessary to refund the money) at the discretion of the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee, if in his opinion sufficient notice of cancellation of the booking has been given; but in no case shall any refund be made if the Committee was deprived of revenue which would otherwise have accrued to it, but for the fact that that accommodation had been previously booked.

(4) A notice accompanied by a remittance under paragraphs 1 and 2 will entitle the sender to the use of the accommodation booked, in preference to any visitor who has not similarly booked accommodation in advance.

18. A breach of any of the above rules or others that may hereafter be made by the Provincial Road Committee with the approval of His Excellency the Governor shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

1. The term "resthouse" shall include the land attached to a resthouse and all the buildings thereon.

2. A fee at the rate set out in the schedule hereto shall be paid by every person using or occupying any part of a resthouse: provided that children under 12 years of age shall be charged only half the aforesaid rates, and that no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—

- an infant in arms;
- a servant who is in attendance on a visitor at a resthouse and sleeps within the resthouse;
- the chauffeur of any car garaged in the resthouse premises, if he sleeps in the car or in the garage.

3. Every visitor shall, on admission to a resthouse, legibly write his correct name and address in the resthouse visitors' book and until this is done a visitor shall not be entitled to use the resthouse and shall not be supplied with refreshments.

4. (1) No person shall occupy any part of a resthouse for a period longer than three consecutive days without the special permission in writing of the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee.

(2) Every occupier of a resthouse who has not obtained such permission shall on the expiration of such period of three days forthwith leave the resthouse.

5. No charges other than those payable to the Provincial Road Committee shall be entered in the resthouse books by a visitor.

6. Resthouse fees and charges shall be paid in cash on demand and in default of such payment the resthouse-keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supplies.

7. The resthouse-keeper shall not be bound to comply with any telegram requesting meals to be prepared unless the name and address of the sender are set out in the telegram.

8. No bed, sofa, or couch in the resthouse shall be used for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon.

9. The value of all articles damaged or broken by any visitor or his servant shall be paid by that visitor before he leaves the resthouse in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

10. (1) Any complaint which a visitor may have to make about the resthouse or resthouse-keeper shall be noted in the complaint book.

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse-keeper to produce the complaint book when called upon so to do.

(3) No remarks or complaints shall be written in the book in which resthouse charges are entered.

11. (1) No lunch, dinner, garden party, or other reception organized by or on behalf of any person or body of persons shall be held in a resthouse except with the written permission of the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee.

(2) The Chairman may allow to any person the use of the whole or any part of a resthouse on payment of such special fees and on such conditions as he may in his discretion determine.

12. Persons in actual occupation of a resthouse shall have a prior claim to the use of any garage or stable attached to the resthouse, over persons not in actual occupation of the resthouse.

13. The owner or hirer of a vehicle garaged in a resthouse or parked anywhere within the premises shall, notwithstanding that he himself has not occupied the resthouse, pay the personal occupation fee for the period during which the vehicle is garaged or parked, in addition to the fee for parking the vehicle or for the use of the garage.

Provided that any member of the Ceylon Defence Force who leaves a motor car or motor cycle in a resthouse garage

while on military duty shall not be liable to pay any occupation or garage dues during the period of such duty, but any such car may be removed by the resthouse-keeper from the garage if necessary to make room for the vehicle of a visitor paying occupation fees.

14. (1) Any visitor who desires to book any accommodation in advance may do so on giving at least three clear days' notice.

(2) Such notice shall be accompanied by a remittance of Rs. 7.50, which will be credited to the visitor's account if the accommodation is taken as arranged.

(3) The remittance will be forfeited if the accommodation is not taken as arranged: provided that such remittance may be refunded (less Money Order commission necessary to refund the money) at the discretion of the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee, if in his opinion sufficient notice of cancellation of the booking has been given; but in no case shall any refund be made if the Committee was deprived of revenue which would otherwise have accrued to it but for the fact that that accommodation had been previously booked.

(4) A notice accompanied by a remittance under paragraphs 1 and 2 will entitle the sender to the use of the accommodation booked in preference to any visitor who has not similarly booked accommodation in advance.

15. (1) No person occupying any part of a resthouse shall use that or any other part thereof for any immoral purpose.

(2) No resthouse-keeper or other person in charge of any resthouse shall aid or abet or be party or privy to the contravention of this rule by any occupant of any part of the resthouse, or permit any occupant contravening this rule to continue to be in occupation of any part of the resthouse.

16. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee to prohibit the use of a resthouse by any visitor who is convicted of any breach, or of inducing the resthouse-keeper to commit any breach, of any of these rules.

17. A breach of any of the above rules or others that may hereafter be made by the Provincial Road Committee with the approval of His Excellency the Governor shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

18. All rules under section 19 of the Road Ordinance, 1861, hitherto in force, are hereby repealed.

9. The driver of any hiring car occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such hiring car.

10. The driver or other person in charge of any hiring car in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

11. No hiring car shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any hiring cars entering or leaving such stand.

12. The regulations dated August 10, 1932, and published in the *Gazette* of August 12, 1932, are hereby rescinded.

8. The driver of every hiring car occupying a public stand, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge of the car while it occupies the public stand.

9. The driver of any hiring car occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such hiring car.

10. The driver or other person in charge of any hiring car in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

11. No hiring car shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any hiring cars entering or leaving such stand.

12. The regulations dated October 16, 1934, and published in the *Gazette* of October 19, 1934, are hereby rescinded.

5. *Galigamuwa*.—The area within a radius of 100 yards from the Galigamuwa junction on the 45th mile of the Colombo-Kandy road including the portions of the roads to Ruanwella to Colombo and to Kegalla, coming within this area.

6. *Warakapola*.—The area within a radius of 100 yards from the Warakapola junction on the 36th mile of the Colombo-Kandy road including the portions of the roads to Galapitama, to Colombo and to Kegalla, coming within this area.

BY-LAWS.

I.—*Definitions.*

In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“warehouse” means any building used mainly for the storing of goods or wares by merchants or traders, but does not include a shop, boutique, or other place used mainly for the sale of goods or wares by retail;

“workshop” means any building where any work of making, altering, ornamenting, finishing, or repairing articles or goods is carried on by manual labour for the purposes of trade;

“factory” means any workshop where mechanical power of any kind is used.

II.—Residential Areas.

The area within the administrative limits of this Council defined in Schedule I. hereto is hereby declared to be a "residential area."

III.—New Buildings in Residential Areas.

1. (1) From and after the date on which these by-laws come into force no new building shall be erected within a residential area, except with the written permission of the Chairman of this Council, for the purpose of being used as a factory, workshop, or warehouse or as a boutique or as tenements, or as stables, galas, or cattle pens.

(2) Such permission may be refused or withheld by the Chairman unless or until the following conditions are fulfilled, namely:—

- (a) that the site selected for such building is not in close proximity to existing residential buildings;
- (b) that the site selected is not situated in such a prominent place as to make the erection of the building likely to mar the amenities of the residential area;
- (c) in the case of a workshop, that the business or industry for which it is to be used is not likely to create any kind of nuisance whatsoever;
- (d) in the case of a shop or boutique, that the site selected will serve an area really in need of such conveniences, and that the design of the building will harmonize with the surroundings.

*2. It shall be lawful for the Chairman by notice in writing to direct that an air space of not less than 7½ feet be provided between each side of any new building and the boundary on that side, irrespective of the question whether there are windows in the wall on that side of the building.

IV.—Existing Buildings in Residential Areas.

1. Within a residential area, except with the written permission of the Chairman—

- (1) no building used for residential purposes at the date on which these by-laws come into force, shall be used for any other purpose whatsoever;
- (2) no building used at that date for the purpose of any one of the following, namely, a workshop, warehouse, boutique, tenement, stable, gala, or cattle pen, shall be used for any other of the said purposes; and
- (3) no building shall be used for any of the purposes set out in the foregoing paragraph of this by-law, if at that date it was not in actual use for that purpose.

2. (1) Within a residential area no building used as a factory, workshop, or warehouse, at the date on which these by-laws come into force shall be enlarged, extended, or added to except with the written permission of the Chairman.

(2) Such permission shall be refused by the Chairman—

- (a) in any case in which the building is used for the purposes of any of the dangerous or offensive trades enumerated in Schedule II. hereto; and
- (b) in any case where the boundaries of the premises on which the building stands have not been registered in the books of the Council within six months of the date on which these by-laws come into force.

3. Within a residential area no building shall be used for the purposes of any of the dangerous or offensive trades enumerated in Schedule II. unless it can be shown to have been in use for such purpose on the date on which these by-laws come into force.

V.—Penalties.

The chief occupier of any building who contravenes any of the provisions of the foregoing by-laws or any owner or occupier who fails to comply with any written notice or directions given by the Chairman thereunder, shall be guilty of an offence in respect of each day during which such contravention or non-compliance continues, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for each such offence.

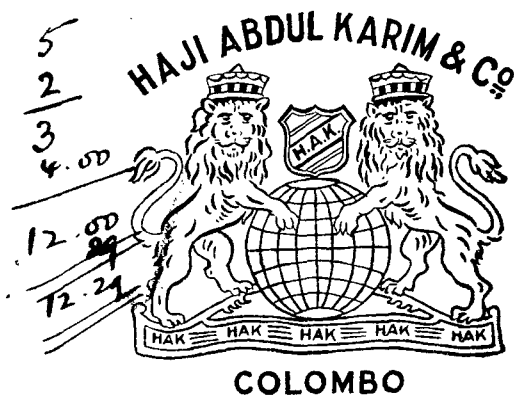

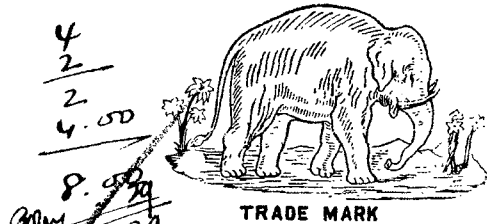

4. The Public Works Department will maintain the crossing of some 550 yards and the jetties in good condition—the minimum depth of water at the landing jetty at low water being 3 feet.

5. Rates to be charged according to the schedule under section 4 of Ordinance No. 3 of 1896.

6. The purchaser must keep the motor-boat constantly available and in use at all times except on occasions of genuine break-down.

7. Any break-down must be reported to the Government Agent at once and repairs carried out as speedily as possible.

8. Between the hours of 8 A.M. and 6 P.M. the motor boat shall make one crossing of the ferry at least every quarter of an hour; between the hours of 6 P.M. and 8 A.M. it shall be permissible for the renter to provide a rowing boat instead of the motor-boat; but at any time the renter shall be penalized if he fails to provide a passenger with a means of crossing within half an hour of his arrival at the jetty.

The horse ferry must be available night and day and must cross on demand on the arrival at the jetty of one motor car or of not less than two carts. The horse ferry must be taken across the ferry at once even though empty when signalled for from the other side.

9. On occasions when for good reasons the mechanical services cannot be used adequate arrangements must be made for the transport of passengers and vehicles by other means as at present.
