### A PROCLAMATION.

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in Us by section 6 (1) of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation establish from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do further, under section 6 (3), wholly exempt the general cemetery so established from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the Ordinance.

9. In Section B a candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds 700 marks must name a subject to be valued on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 700. This option cannot be exercised by a candidate who can reduce his aggregate to 700 by omitting one or more of the subjects he proposes to offer.

10. The following restrictions apply to particular subjects in Section B.

International Relations (25), may not be taken by a candidate who offers European History, Period 3 (8), or Constitutional Law (12).

Greek Literature (60), may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (57), Latin Literature (64) only by those who offer Latin Translation (61), and Buddhist Civilization (89) only by those who offer Pali Language (88).

In subjects 68 to 87 the history or literature paper associated with a language may be taken only by candidates who offer the language itself for examination.

A candidate who offers one or more of the subjects French History (68), German History (71), Spanish or Italian History (74), Russian History (77), may not offer either subject 7 (European History, Period 1 or Period 2) or subject 8 (European History, Period 3).

11. A candidate desiring to offer Experimental Psychology (22), or any of the subjects 37 to 48 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank. For Astronomy (36), Engineering (49), Geography (50), and the Physical Anthropology branch of Special Anthropology (52), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as part of the examination.

A syllabus defining in general terms the character of the examination in the various subjects of the revised scheme which is also published in this *Gazette*.

### SYLLABUS.

To come into force for the examination of 1937.

#### SECTION A.

1. *Essay*.—An essay to be written on one of several specified subjects.
2. *English*.—A paper of questions to test the understanding of English and the workmanlike use of words. An optional exercise in the writing of verse will be included.
3. *Present Day*.—Questions on contemporary subjects, social, economic, political, and scientific. A liberal choice of questions will be given.
 

*Elementary Economics* (for Foreign Office and Consular Service Groups only).—Organization of production; the association of land, labour, and capital in productive enterprise; the chief types of industrial units. Demand and supply; organization of distribution; value. Exchange; an elementary knowledge of the theory of money and the relations of money and prices, and of the nature of banks and their functions. State action; taxation; tariff policy; unemployment.
4. *Vivá Voce*.—The candidate will be interviewed by a Board who will have before them a record of his (or her) career. He will be asked questions on matters of general interest. The object of the interview is to enable the Board to assess his suitability for each of the Services for which he is entered, and in framing their assessment the Board will attach particular importance to his intelligence and alertness, his vigour and strength of character, and his potential qualities of leadership.

#### SECTION B.

**HISTORY.** *Subjects 5–8.*—Candidates should know something of the original authorities, and have such a knowledge of geography as is necessary to the proper understanding of the history.

When a fixed date is given for the beginning of the period, candidates will be expected to know in general outline how the initial position was reached; similarly, when a fixed date is given for the end of the period, candidates will be expected to have some knowledge of the subsequent development of movements which continued beyond the period.

5, 6. *British History*.—Period 1, to 1660; Period 2, 1660 to the present day. The subject will deal with the life of the people as a whole, political, economic, social, literary, artistic, scientific, with the main stress on the political and economic aspects. Candidates will be expected to know so much of European history as will make the external action of this country fully intelligible and will explain those movements at home which had their beginnings abroad, e.g., the Renaissance, the Reformation, and the reactions in this country of the French Revolution. Questions on Scottish history will be set, but such questions will be optional. In subject 6 the outstanding incidents and movements in the history of British possessions will be included.

7, 8. *European History*.—Period 1, from 400 to 1494; Period 2, from 1494 to 1763; Period 3, from 1763 to the present day. The political, economic, social, literary, artistic, scientific aspects will all be included. The history of the United States of America, of India, and of the Far East will be included in so far as it influences European fortunes to an important degree.

9, 10. *Private Law*.—Part 1, the law of real and personal property (including the law of succession). Part 2, contracts and torts. This subject is confined to English law.

11. *Jurisprudence*.—Theories as to the nature of law, including the theory of sovereignty. The sources of law and its development, with particular reference to English and Roman law. The character and classification of rights and duties (legal and equitable). The analysis of the leading conceptions employed in law.

12. *Constitutional Law*.—The constitutional law of the United Kingdom, including the relations between the United Kingdom and other parts of the British Empire.

13. *Roman Law*.—Roman private law and its history studied in connexion with the Institutes of Gaius and Justinian, including the history of the legislative and judicial processes. Passages will be set for translation and comment, but credit will not be given merely for capacity to translate the texts.

14. *International Law*.—Public international law.

15, 16, 17. *Metaphysics*.—Paper 1, a general problem paper. Paper 2, questions on the period from Descartes to Kant, both included. Paper 3, questions on ancient philosophy and post-Kantian philosophy; this paper will be arranged in such a way that a candidate can, if he wishes, confine himself to Plato and Aristotle among the ancient philosophers or to post-Kantian philosophy.

18, 19. *Moral Philosophy*.—Paper 1, a general problem paper. Paper 2, a paper on ancient and modern philosophy arranged in such a way that a candidate can, if he wishes, confine himself to either.

20. *Logic*.—The subject will be interpreted in a wide sense. Epistemology in its bearing on logical problems will be included, together with formal logic and scientific method. Questions may be set on mathematical logic, i.e., on the logic of mathematics, symbolic logic, and the logic of probability; and also on the history of logic. A considerable choice of questions will be given.

21. *Psychology*.—Questions on the history of the subject may be included.

22. *Experimental Psychology*.—A candidate who desires to offer this subject must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank.

23. *Political Theory*.—Candidates will be expected to show a knowledge of political theory and its history, including the theory of the state in its relation to kindred studies such as ethics, economics, and political history. A knowledge of the original authorities will be expected. A wide choice of questions will be given so that full credit can be obtained by candidates who confine themselves to the period beginning with the French Revolution.

24. *Political Organization*.—This will include constitutional forms (representative government, federalism, &c.) and public administration, central and local. The history of institutions is not included, but candidates will be expected to know the earlier stages from which existing institutions have developed.

25. *International Relations*.—The subject includes the study of the relations both between governments and between peoples, and of the principles underlying their development; in particular, the study, in connexion with twentieth-century history, of the machinery and processes of international co-operation, including the organization and activities of the League of Nations and other international bodies. A knowledge of the original authorities will be expected.

26. *General Economics*.—Economic theory in general. Candidates will be expected to illustrate theory by facts and to analyse problems by the help of theory. The history of economic thought will be included.

27. *Industry and Trade*.—The organization of industry and trade; the economic theories and practical problems involved.

28. *Money, Banking, and Exchange*.—Systems of currency, banking, foreign exchanges; the theories and problems involved.

29. *Public Finance*.—The subject will deal with matters connected with the raising and spending of revenue and loans by Governments (central and local).

30. *Social Economics*.—The economic aspect of matters affecting labour and social welfare, including social structure and legislation, with special reference to Great Britain.

31. *Economic History*.—Questions will be set on the economic history of England up to 1700 ; but the main stress will be on the economic development of Great Britain since 1700. So much knowledge of developments in the other parts of the Empire British, in the Continent of Europe and in the United States of America will be expected as is necessary to the full understanding of British economic history. A wide choice of questions will be given so that full credit can be obtained by candidates who confine themselves to the period since 1700.

32. *Economic Statistics*.—Elementary methods of handling numerical data. Tabulation. Frequency distributions, averages, deviations. Graphic methods, applied to groups and to time series. Simple interpolation. Index-numbers.

Some knowledge of the nature of the statistical data available from British sources and the principal statistical publications of the League of Nations, in relation to prices, wages, incomes, trade, transport, production, consumption, population, births, deaths, marriages, migration, and of the methods usually applied to analysis of such data.

Elements of the mathematical theory of statistics, with special reference to economic and sociological problems. The mathematical treatment of frequency groups and of time series. The more elementary parts of the method of correlation. Sampling, and measurement of the precision of its results. Such formulas as Pareto's for income and the logarithmic curve. Application of statistical methods to the analysis of elasticity of demand and other theoretical economic concepts.

33. *Lower Pure Mathematics*.—Geometry of two and three dimensions, synthetic and analytical ; a specialized knowledge of particular curves and surfaces will not be required. Descriptive geometry. The method of vectors.

Algebra and trigonometry, including series, complex numbers, the numerical solution of equations.

Infinitesimal calculus of real variables, including development in series, partial differentiation, multiple integrals, ordinary differential equations, with applications to geometry.

No great skill will be expected in solving complicated problems of an elementary character. The questions will involve the use of drawing instruments.

34. *Lower Applied Mathematics*.—Statics, hydrostatics, dynamics, elementary theory of electricity and magnetism, including the induction of currents. The questions will be of an elementary character, but will not be confined to two dimensions ; they will involve the use of the calculus. Candidates are free to use differential equations, but a knowledge thereof will not be necessary to answer the questions. Attention will be paid to problems which arise naturally and to general principles ; artificial problems will be avoided. The questions will involve the use of drawing instruments.

35. *Higher Mathematics*.—

(1) Geometry, including differential geometry and tensor calculus.

(2) Analysis, including the elements of the theory of functions of real and complex variables.

(3) The calculus of observations, including probability, and the solution of differential and finite difference equations.

(4) Mechanics, including the elementary mechanics of fluids, but excluding elastic solids, the whole being treated from a physical standpoint.

(5) The classical theory of electricity and physical optics.

(6) Thermodynamics. The elements of the quantum theory and the theory of relativity.

Two question papers will be set. In each of them all sections of the syllabus will be represented and in each paper the same number of questions will be set on each section. There will be no restriction on the candidate's choice of questions ; he can, however, obtain full credit by confining himself to any two of the sections.

36. *Astronomy*.—General and spherical astronomy, and the elements of astrophysics, including instruments and observatory practice.

A candidate who desires to offer this subject must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of at least 20 hours' practical training in an observatory.

NATURAL SCIENCE. *Subjects 37-48*.—The standard of the higher division of a science will be that which is required in the main subject for an honours degree at the universities. The standard for the lower division of a science will be that required in a subject subsidiary to the main subject whether required at the final degree examination or at a preceding examination.

A candidate who desires to offer a science must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training in that science in an institution of university rank ; the period of training required is one academic year, whether the candidate offers the higher division of the science or the lower division or both divisions.

43. *Lower Geology*. } Mineralogy will be included in each division.

44. *Higher Geology*. }

49. *Engineering*.—Strength of materials ; theory of structures ; mechanism and dynamics of machines ; heat and thermodynamics ; hydraulics, including hydraulic machines ; electrical technology.

Candidates will be expected to be familiar with graphical methods and to have some skill in drawing.

A candidate who desires to offer Engineering must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of training for at least one academic year in an institution of university rank.

50. *Geography*.—Geography as understood in the universities, not excluding topics which concern geography jointly with other subjects such as economics, history, physics, botany and geology. There will be a practical test which will necessitate a knowledge of cartographical methods and notations, and for this test drawing instruments may be required.

A candidate who desires to offer this subject must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of training for at least one academic year in an institution of university rank.

51. *General Anthropology*.—The study of human cultures, notably in their simpler forms, and the analyses of such cultures into their component aspects : social organization, economics including technology, education, political systems, law, magico-religious ideas and practices, games and recreation, knowledge, language, art ; the analysis should include the common elements in human institutions, customs, and beliefs, and the specific variations characteristic of individual cultures. The application of anthropological knowledge to practical affairs : in administration and economic co-operation ; in missionary and educational work. The candidate will be expected to have some comparative knowledge of anthropological methods and of anthropological theories, including for example the concepts of evolution, diffusion, function, and the influence of environment.

52. *Special Anthropology*.—Candidates will choose between Social Anthropology and Physical Anthropology.

*Social Anthropology*.—The social organization of human societies, with special reference to primitive societies at various stages of development and the effect of the modern conditions of world-wide contact of races and the spread of cultural ideas upon such organization. The constitution of domestic groups, wider kinship units, local communities and tribal systems. Political organization, including problems of leadership, tribal councils, rank ; the working of law and the administration of justice. Economic organization of primary pursuits and industries ; types of distribution, exchange, consumption and land tenure. Educational methods, native and introduced, including the influence of the family ; professional and technical instruction, initiation, age-grades, apprenticeship in occupational groups. Early forms of magico-religious beliefs and ritual in their sociological aspect : ancestor-worship, totemism, conceptions of the soul, eschatology, beliefs in mana, magic, and witchcraft. Tradition, oral or written, in its influence upon the collective behaviour of the group. Apart from a general knowledge of the literature candidates will be expected to have an acquaintance, first hand or from written sources, with at least one ethnographic area.

*Physical Anthropology*, with which are included prehistoric archaeology and technology. Candidates will be expected to have such knowledge as may be acquired by laboratory and museum work, consisting mainly in the handling and study of specimens and exhibits. The subject will be treated with special, but not exclusive, reference to peoples of rude culture, including prehistoric civilizations.



A candidate who desires to offer Physical Anthropology must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Commissioners of training in an institution of university rank.

53. *Old and Middle English*.—Candidates should be prepared to show a first-hand knowledge of some of the following works :—the principal anonymous monuments of Old English verse, the Anglo-Saxon Chronicle ; the *Ancerene Wisse*, the *Owl and the Nightingale*, *Havelock*, *Sir Gawain and the Green Knight* ; and of some part of the work or works of *Cynewulf*, *Ælfric*, *Layamon*, *Langland*, *Gower*, *Chaucer*. Questions will be set relative to these works and authors, and to other matters of literary history in the period.

Questions on the history of the language will be included, but will not be compulsory.

54, 55. *English Literature*.—Period 1, 1350 to 1700 ; Period 2, from 1660. Candidates should be prepared to show a first-hand knowledge of some of the works of the following authors and of their place in the history of their country :—

Questions on other writers will not be excluded, but, on the whole, the questions will be directed to the best-known authors and their best-known works. Candidates should know so much of the history as is necessary to understand the literature in its relation to other activities of the nation.

Questions will be set on the history of the language, but will not be compulsory.

56. *Welsh Civilization*.—A general knowledge of the political, social and literary history of Wales from 1100 A.D. to the present day. Candidates will also be required to show a special knowledge of the literature of the period 1350 to 1650, and of the history of the period 1700 to the present day. Candidates will be required to write some of their answers in Welsh.

FOREIGN LANGUAGES AND CIVILIZATIONS.—*Subjects 57–89*.—Greek Literature (60) may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (57), Latin Literature (64) only by those who offer Latin Translation (61), and Buddhist Civilization (89) only by those who offer Pali Language (88). In subjects 68–87 the history or literature paper associated with a language may be taken only by candidates who offer the language itself for examination.

A candidate who offers one or more of the subjects French History (68), German History (71), Spanish or Italian History (74), Russian History (77), may not offer either subject 7 (European History, Period 1 or Period 2) or subject 8 (European History, Period 3).

In history candidates will be expected to show a knowledge of the original authorities. They must also have such a knowledge of geography as is necessary to the proper understanding of the history. In literature candidates will be expected to have a first-hand knowledge of the authors. Passages of literature may be set for comment on matters of social, literary, and historical interest. In French, German, Spanish, Italian, Russian, questions on philology and the older forms of the languages will be set, but will not be compulsory. The papers in both history and literature will deal with the life of the people as a whole, literary, political, social, economic, artistic, scientific.

58. *Greek Composition*.—The paper will be so arranged that candidates may confine themselves to prose composition or to verse composition, or, if they prefer, may take some prose and some verse.

59. *Greek History*.—The main stress will be on the period 510 B.C. to 323 B.C. ; but candidates will be given an opportunity of showing knowledge of the period before 510 B.C.

62. *Latin Composition*.—As for Greek.

63. *Roman History*.—The outlines of the history and development down to 180 A.D. should be known ; but the main stress will be laid on the period 133 B.C. to 117 A.D.

65, 66. *Classical Archaeology*.—Paper 1, Greek and Roman sculpture and architecture. Paper 2, Greek coins down to 322 B.C., Roman coins down to 98 A.D. ; Greek vases ; Greek and Roman painting. A considerable choice of questions will be given in each paper.

67. *French Language*.—Translation, free composition, set composition, conversation.

68. *French History*.—The outlines of the history prior to 1589 should be known ; the period from 1589 to 1660 in somewhat more detail ; but the main stress will be on the period from 1660 to the present day.

70. *German Language*.—As for French. For German composition candidates may use either German or English characters.

71. *German History*.—In history candidates should know in outline the history of the Medieval Empire, of the growth of the German cities, of the Reformation in Germany, and of the Thirty Years War ; but the main stress will be on the period from the accession of Frederick the Great to the present day.

73. *Spanish, Italian, Language*.—As for French.

74. *Spanish History*.—The main stress will be on the periods from the Union of Castile and Aragon under Ferdinand and Isabella to the liberation of the Netherlands, and again from 1800 to the present day.

*Italian History*.—The main stress will be on the 15th century and the first half of the 16th century, and again on the period from 1789 to the present day. Sufficient should be known of the earlier period to understand the position of the Pope and the Emperor in Italy, and the rise of the towns.

76. *Russian Language*.—As for French.

77. *Russian History*.—Only the broadest outlines of the history prior to Peter the Great will be required ; the period from the accession of Peter the Great to 1800 should be known in somewhat more detail ; but the main stress will be on the period from 1800 to the present day.

79. *Arabic Language*.—Translation, free composition, set composition, conversation. The examination will be in the modern language.

80, 81. *Arabic History, Arabic Literature*.—The main stress in both history and literature will be on the period from the middle of the 6th century A.D. to the middle of the 13th century A.D.

82. *Persian Language*.—Translation, free composition, set composition, conversation. The examination will be in the modern language.

83, 84. *Persian History, Persian Literature*.—The main stress in both history and literature will be on the period 1000 A.D. to 1500 A.D. Candidates will be expected to have a general knowledge of the history of Persia before 1000 A.D. and from 1500 A.D. to the present time.

85. *Sanskrit Language*. (For the Indian and Ceylon Civil Services only)—Translation, prose composition, and questions on Vedic and Sanskrit grammar. Both Vedic and classical Sanskrit passages will be set for translation ; composition will be required in classical Sanskrit alone.

86, 87. *Indian History, Sanskrit Literature*. (For the Indian and Ceylon Civil Services only)—The history of the civilization and thought of India and Sanskrit literature from the Vedic period to 1200 A.D.

88. *Pali Language*. (For the Ceylon Civil Service only)—Translation from Pali, prose composition in Pali, questions on Pali grammar.

89. *Buddhist Civilization*. (For the Ceylon Civil Service only)—Pali literature and the history of Buddhist civilization and the growth of ideas in Buddhism from the time of the Buddha to 1800 A.D. in India, Ceylon, Burma, and Siam.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Beruwala Urban District Council;

“public stand” means any space within the Urban area of Beruwala which may from time to time be defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

2. No lorry shall be halted on any highway within the Urban area of Beruwala on which lorry traffic is permitted except—

- (a) for such time as may be necessary for effecting essential repairs in the event of a breakdown; or
- (b) for such time as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of loading or unloading goods.

3. No motor vehicle shall be parked on the following roads:—

- (1) Station road.
- (2) Good Shed road.
- (3) Deenagoda road from its junction with Colombo-Galle road up to a point opposite the Deenagoda bazaar.
- (4) Old road from its junction with Customs road up to a point near the Molliyamale mosque.

Provided that a motor vehicle may be parked in Station road for a period commencing fifteen minutes before the time scheduled for the arrival of a train at the Beruwala Railway Station and ending fifteen minutes after the actual departure therefrom of that train.

4. No vehicle other than a motor cab or omnibus shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

5. When a public stand or any portion thereof is reserved for the use of motor cabs or omnibuses, no motor vehicle not belonging to the class for which the stand or the portion thereof is reserved shall enter or be parked therein.

6. (1) No motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in any public place except a public stand; and no motor cab or omnibus shall enter or be parked in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a permit issued by or under the authority of the Chairman authorizing the use of that stand by that motor cab or omnibus.

(2) A fee in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule to these regulations shall be levied and paid for each such permit.

7. No motor cab or omnibus shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit and indicated as such by appropriate notices or signs.

8. (1) All motor cabs or omnibuses using a public stand shall—

- (a) be halted facing the same direction, and
- (b) in accordance with such notice or sign as may be exhibited therein, be parked either parallel to each other or one behind the other in the order of their arrival.

(2) All motor cabs and omnibuses parked one behind the other in a public stand, shall be moved up in due order as vacancies occur in front.

9. The driver of every motor cab or omnibus occupying a public stand, or a person capable of driving the motor cab or omnibus, shall be in charge of it throughout the time it is parked in that stand.

10. The driver of every motor cab or omnibus occupying a public stand, whenever required so to do by a Police Officer, or by a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of that vehicle.

11. The driver or other person in charge of every motor cab or omnibus occupying a public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

## Report of the Directors of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank for the Year ending September 30, 1936.

The Annual Report of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank is submitted with the statement of accounts and balance sheet for the year ending September 30, 1936.

*Debentures.*—To the value of Rs. 2,305,250 were sold during the year ended September 30, 1936, carrying interest at 3½ per cent. Out of this amount 187 debentures of the 3½ per cent. issue to the value of Rs. 56,250 were sold in place of compulsorily redeemed ones.

*Interest to Debenture Holders.*—Amount paid as interest to debenture holders for the year ended September 30, 1936, was Rs. 142,487·80 being Rs. 62,938·22 for half year ended March 31, 1936, and Rs. 79,549·58 for half-year ended September 30, 1936.

*Redemption of Debentures.*—During the year under review 2,156 debentures of the 1st 5 per cent. issue amounting to Rs. 107,800 were redeemed—91 voluntarily and 2,065 compulsorily.

*Loans.*—106 loans were granted during the year ended September 30, 1936, amounting to Rs. 2,509,849 as against 47 loans amounting to Rs. 908,487 during the previous year.

*Securities.*—The securities for these loans consist of 61 properties in town, 15,218½ acres of agricultural lands consisting of 3,923 acres tea, 3,611 acres rubber, 3,806 acres coconut, 419½ acres paddy, 537½ acres other products, and 2,921½ acres undeveloped land.

*Interest received on Loans.*—Interest on loans for the year amounts to Rs. 226,153·93—Rs. 140,130·47 represent interest actually earned during the year and Rs. 86,023·46 accrued interest to September 30, 1936.

*Capital Repayment of Loans.*—Repayment of Principal of loans for the year ended September 30, 1936, was Rs. 170,830·56.

*Cost of Maintaining the Bank.*—The working expenses of the Bank during the year amounted to Rs. 81,435·31 as against Rs. 63,671·49 during the previous year.

*Profits.*—The nett profit for the year ended September 30, 1936, was Rs. 49,070·54.

## KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on October 17, 1936, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated October 13, 1936.

Present: Mr. F. C. Gimson, Chairman; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. O. T. Nettelton; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meetings held on September 19, 1936, and on October 1, 1936, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and copies thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1935 to September 30, 1936, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for September, 1936.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of September, 1936.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending October 17, 1936.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Council's Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during September, 1936. (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

With regard to the report under item (b), the Council agreed that a monthly report was unnecessary and a report should be made at the end of every six months in future.

4. Petitions:—Mr. Usoof Ismail presented—(1) Letter from the Kandy Sri Kalyanodaya Society dated October 11, 1936, addressed to Mr. Ismail asking for his support to obtain a grant from the Council. Mr. de Silva presented—(2) Letter from Mr. Izadeen Baie dated October 16, 1936, addressed to Mr. de Silva asking Mr. de Silva to intervene and secure for Mr. Baie a last chance to continue in the Council's service. Mr. Usoof Ismail presented—(3) Petition from Mr. H. D. Amih dated October 5, 1936, asking for a reconsideration of the Chairman's order of dismissal.

5. (1) Pursuant to notice Mr. Marikar moved:—That a Special Committee of this Council be appointed to investigate into the affairs of the Kandy Municipal Council in general, by receiving representations from the rate-payers of Kandy, if necessary, and to report on and to suggest the various devices which can be adopted to improve the Council's revenue and to promote economy in regard to the expenditure of the Council's finances. Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.

Mr. de Silva spoke in support of the motion and suggested the addition of the following clause to the motion :—  
“and that the Special Committee, be empowered to secure the services of any other person or persons, who in the opinion of the Committee, is or are in a position to give assistance in the investigation.” This was agreed to by the mover, and the motion was unanimously carried.

The following gentlemen were appointed to form the Committee :—The Chairman, Messrs. Geo. E. de Silva, Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail, and M. A. S. Marikar.

5. (2) Pursuant to notice Mr. Marikar moved :—Owing to the present financial condition of the Kandy Municipal Council, the salaries of all Municipal employees who are in receipt of a monthly salary of over Rs. 100 be reduced by ten per cent. until such time as improvements to the Council's finances are effected. Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.

Messrs. Wijayatilake and de Silva spoke in support of the motion.

The Chairman and Mr. Nettelton spoke against the motion. The motion was put to the meeting and carried by 5 to 2. *Ayes*.—Messrs. Marikar, Usoof Ismail, Wijayatilake, de Silva, and Soysa. *Noes*.—The Chairman, and Mr. Nettelton.

5 A. Pursuant to notice Mr. Marikar moved :—In terms of the Council's resolution dated July 19, 1930, a reasonable grant be given annually to the Kandy Sri Kalyanodaya Society in aid of the Society's Free Vernacular Reading Room. Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.

After some discussion, further consideration of the motion was deferred for the next meeting of Council.

#### 6. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

(2) Proposed amendment of by-law 144 to enable the Chairman to fix a meter and levy meter rents and excess water charges in respect of any premises whose annual value falls below Rs. 1,200 after it has been allowed a water service on the basis of its annual value being not less than Rs. 1,200.—Recommended.

##### *Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on September 19, 1936.*

(3) Chairman's memo dated August 26, 1936, on the subject of the Municipal Free Ayurvedic Dispensary. (G 69).—Proposal recommended.

(4) Memorandum dated August 21, 1936, from the Medical Officer of Health on the question of the provision of more public conveniences in Kandy. (H/G 156).—Recommended.

(5) Application dated August 21, 1936, from Mr. V. M. Kandavanam for the vacant stall No. 37, Public Market. (D/St 38).—Recommended to grant the application on usual terms as he is the only registered applicant for the stall.

(6) Chairman's memo dated September 1, 1936, on the subject of the development of markets. (W/M 22/34).—Tabled.

##### *Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on September 19, 1936.*

(7) Papers *re* the proposal to take over from the Freemason Society the site in the market area where the Byrde Memorial Hall stands which is held by them on a long lease from the Council. (O 603).—Recommended to invite tenders for the market site, the tenderers to state what use will be made—boutiques to be prohibited.

(8) Papers *re* the proposal to amend section 115 of “The Municipal Council's Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910” to permit it to levy different rates for different areas within the Municipality. (O 651).—Recommended to inform the Commissioner of Local Government that no amendment is desired as the existing legal provisions are adequate for an equitable adjustment of the incidence of rates in the Kandy Municipality.

(9) Papers on the subject of revenue lost by the exemptions granted from rates under Ordinance No. 25 of 1934 in respect of buildings used wholly or mainly for religious purposes. (A 100).—Recommended to address Government and ask for compensation for the loss of revenue.

(10) To obtain authority to write off Rs. 34·80 shown as due in the Assessment books in respect of No. 84, Siyambalagastenne as the premises had been assessed with No. 73 since 1913. (A/SB).—Recommended.

(11) To obtain sanction to write off a sum of Rs. 16·34 being rates up to 4th quarter, 1934, on premises No. 16, Lady Torrington road as the premises have been assessed under other numbers and rates recovered thereon.—Recommended.

(12) Papers *re* the proposal of the Medical Officer of Health to declare the storage of slaked and unslaked lime for purposes of sale within Municipal limits, as a Dangerous and Offensive trade. (C 296).—Recommended.

(13) To obtain a supplementary vote of Rs. 1,500 for the purpose of carrying out house service connections up to the end of the year.—Recommended.

(14) To obtain a vote of Rs. 310 to meet the cost of translating and printing of notices relating to Plague Regulations. (O 332).—Recommended.

(15) To obtain sanction to write off a sum of Rs. 26·25 due from Mr. W. H. Ridley for the upkeep of the grave of his child, as his whereabouts are not known, and to abandon upkeep. (M1).—Recommended.

(16) To obtain a supplementary vote of Rs. 21·28 being the wages of the substitute librarian employed at the Municipal Free Library during the absence of the librarian on sick leave from June 28 to July 16, 1936. (O 103).—Recommended.

(17) Report dated September 2, 1936, from the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon applying for a sum of Rs. 500 for the purchase of veterinary instruments for the examination and treatment of animals. (O 21).—Not recommended.

(18) Petition dated July 11, 1936, from the Muslims occupying tenements in the Mahaiyawa Model Tenements asking for a tenement to be used as a common room by them in connection with their religious performances and prayers.—Recommended to lease site referred to in the Municipal Engineer's report dated September 18, 1936, with permission to erect a building 20 ft. by 20 ft. to be used for the teaching of Quoran to the Muslim children living in the model tenements only. The building should not be consecrated as a religious building and the Council to reserve the right to demolish it on 24 hours' notice.

(19) To sanction the conditions of sale by auction of the right to obtain a lease of the plot of ground being part of premises No. 273 Peradeniya road, vested in the Council after purchase for default in payment of rates.—Recommended.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on September 19, 1936.*

(20) Municipal Engineer's memo asking for approval to expend a sum of Rs. 367 from the savings on General Contingencies vote allowed for the Minor (River) Pumping Scheme for the purpose of providing a water-proof hatchway in connection with the dry well for housing machinery. (W S 4/32.)—Recommended.

(21) Memo dated September 14, 1936, from the Chairman on the subject of excess of expenditure on the contract for the construction of the "Bus Park in Railway Approach road. (WM 14/34.)—Recommended to pass the excess.

(22) Letter dated September 5, 1936, from the Chairman, Home for the Aged Building Fund, Kandy, requesting the Council that the playground at Mahaiyawa be placed at their disposal for the erection of the Home for the Aged. (G 307.)—Not recommended.

(23) Estimate from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for Rs. 240 for the erection of a "Pillar of Fire" at the Peradeniya Bridge, and cost of removal and transport of the present lamp standard in connection with traffic direction. (F 319.)—Recommended subject to half cost being met by the Public Works Department.

(24) Application for metered water services to the following premises:—Malabar street 13, 13A; Peradeniya road 5, 293, 323, 334, 854A, 855, 856, and 935.—Recommended service to No. 5, Peradeniya road. Other applications not recommended owing to annual values being below Rs. 250.

(25) Petition dated July 11, 1936, from the Muslims occupying tenements in the Mahaiyawa Model Tenements asking for a tenement to be used as a common room by them in connection with their religious performances and payers.—Recommended to lease site referred to in the Municipal Engineer's report dated September 18, 1936, with permission to erect a building 20 ft. by 20 ft. to be used for the teaching of Quoran to the Muslim children living in the Model tenements only. The building should not be consecrated as a religious building and the Council to reserve the right to demolish it on 24 hours' notice.

(26) Application from Mr. M. B. W. Mediwake for a water service to premises No. 31A, Hewahetta Talwatta. (W/PW 253.)—Recommended subject to payment of water rates.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on September 19, 1936.*

(27) Draft of amended Electricity by-law No. 9 to enable consumers of electricity at private premises to give a guarantee from an owner of property in Kandy as an alternative to the cash deposit. (E/NR 112.)—Recommended.

(28) Letter dated September 4, 1936, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer applying for approval to sell by public auction the old plant, which is not in use now, in order to make room for the installation of additional new plant. (F 268.)—Recommended to call for tenders for scrapped material.

(29) Application dated July 16, 1936, from Mr. W. Winter to learn work as an apprentice at the Electric Power Station with report thereon from the Municipal Electrical Engineer. (EE 90.)—Not recommended.

(30) Estimate from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for Rs. 240 for the erection of a "Pillar of Fire" at the Peradeniya bridge, and cost of removal and transport of the present lamp standard in connection with traffic direction. (F 319.)—Recommended subject to half cost being met by the Public Works Department.

(31) Letter dated September 14, 1936, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer applying for authority to allow private firms to advertise on Council's Electric Cable Pillar Boxes on payment of Rs. 7.50 per mensem per box. (E 1,199.)—Recommended on payment of an annual rent of Re. 1 and a monthly charge of Rs. 6.50.

Resolution of Council on the recommendations of the Standing Committees.

Items (18) and (25) substitute "one month" for "24 hours".

Item (31)—Right to revise charges at the end of 12 months and to terminate the lease on notice of one month to be reserved.

(b) that the fee for a licence for storage of lime referred to under item (12) be fixed at Rs. 25.
