#### A Proclamation.

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in Us by section 31 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation, amend, with effect from the 1st day of January, 1937, Schedule I. to the Proclamation under the said section dated September 12, 1935, and published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 8,146 of September 20, 1935, by substituting for the definition of the limits of Colombo town therein appearing and reproduced in Schedule I. hereto the definition appearing in Schedule II. hereto.

# Schedule I.

# WESTERN PROVINCE.

# COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Colombo Town comprising the six following Registration Divisions.

1. Fort Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:

North: Harbour.

East: The canal leading from the harbour to the lake, the spill canal, the lake as far as Bridge street, and a portion of the Church road.

South: Church road, Calle Face drive, and in a straight line westward to the sea.

West: Sea.

Slave Island Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:-

North: Spill canal, lake up to the New Park and Darley road, Union place, Regent street up to Norris canal road, Norris canal road up to Kynsey road, Kynsey road up to Ward place, Ward place and Cotta road up to its junction with East and West Baseline road.

South: East and West Baseline road, Buller's road, Kanatta road, Buller's road, Serpentine road, Laurie's road, Kollupitiya road up to the road leading to the Bambalapitiya railway station, and along this road in a straight line to the sea.

est: Sea, Church street up to Bridge street, and lake.

Wellawatta Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:-

North: A straight line drawn from the sea along the road leading to the Bambalapitiya railway station, to the Kollupitiya road, Kollupitiya road up to Laurie's road, Laurie's road up to Serpentine road, Serpentine road up to Buller's road, Buller's road, Kanatta road, Buller's road up to East and West Baseline road, East and West Baseline road and Cotta road up to Kinda-ela.

East: Kinda-ela as far as the Kelani Valley railway and along the centre of the said railway up to the

Kirillapone canal.

South: The centre of the Kirillapone canal as far as Dehiwala canal and thence along the centre of the Dehiwala canal to the sea.

West: Sea.

Maradana Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:-

North: The canal basin, San Sebastian canal, and the New Urugodawatta road.

East: Eastern limit of North and South Baseline road and Dematagoda-ela and Kinda-ela as far as Cotta road.

South: Cotta road, Ward place up to Kynsey road, Kynsey road up to Norris canal road, Norris canal road up to Regent street, Regent street and Union place up to Darley road.

West: Darley road up the northern boundary of New Park and along this boundary to the lake along

the lake and canal basin.

5. New Bazaar Division comprising the area within the following boundaries :-

North: Harbour and a straight line drawn from the harbour continuing along the centre of Jampettah street, Green street, Barber street, Layard's broadway, Grandpass road, and New Urugoda-Layard's watta road.

East: New Urugodawatta road and San Sebastian canal. South: San Sebastian canal, canal basin, and the lake.

West: The canal leading from the lake to the harbour, and the harbour.

Kotahena Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:-

North: Kelani-ganga.

East: Kelani-ganga, by and including the San Sebastian canal, the Weragoda-ela and a line going south in prolongation of the eastern boundary of the North and South Baseline road.

South: New Urugodawatta road, Grandpass road, Layard's broadway, Barber street, Green street, and a line along the centre of Jampettah street to the harbour.

West: The harbour and the sea.

#### Schedule II.

#### WESTERN PROVINCE.

#### COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Colombo Town comprising the six following Registration Divisions.

1. Fort Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:

North: The southern limits of the Colombo Harbour.

East: A line drawn from the harbour through the centre of the canal joining the lake to the harbour and through the locks and westwards along the edge of the spill canal and the lake spill and thence along the western edge of the lake up to the western end of the bridge over the lake on Bridge street.

South: A line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards through the centre of Bridge street, Church street, and Galle Face drive up to the high water mark of the sea.

West: The high water mark of the sea.

2. Slave Island Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:

North: A line drawn along the northern edge of the lake spill and the northern and eastern edge of the lake up to the northern boundary of Hyde park, thence along the northern boundary of Hyde park, thence along the northern boundary of Hyde park up to the centre of Darley road, thence through the centre of Darley road up to the centre of its junction with Union place, thence through the centre of Union place up to the centre of its junction with Ward place, thence through the centre of Ward place up to the centre of its junction with Karsey place it bence postlywards. junction with Kynsey place, thence northwards through the centre of Kynsey place up to the centre of its junction with Norris canal road, thence eastwards through the centre of Norris canal road up to the centre of its junction with Kynsey road, thence southwards through the centre of Kynsey road up to the centre of its junction with Ward place, thence eastwards through the centre of Ward place up to the centre of its junction with Cotta road, thence eastwards through the centre of Cotta road up to the centre of its junction with Castle street.

East and South: A line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards through the centre of Castle street and through the centre of Buller's road up to the centre of its junction with Reid avenue, thence southwards through the centre of Havelock road up to the centre of its junction with Laurie's road, thence westwards through the centre of Laurie's road up to the centre of its junction with Galle road, thence southwards through the centre of Galle road up to the centre of its junction with Bambalapitiya station road, thence westwards through the centre of Bambalapitiya station road up to the high water mark of the sea.

West: The high water mark of the sea up to the centre of the road leading from the southern end of the Galle Face drive to the Galle road, thence eastwards through the centre of this road up to its junction with Galle road, thence through the centre of Church road up to the centre of its junction with Bridge street, thence northwards along the western edge of the lake up to the northern edge of the lake spill.

3. Wellawatta Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:

North: A line drawn from the high water mark of the sea eastwards through the centre of Bambalapitiya station road, thence northwards through the centre of Galle road up to the centre of its junction with Laurie's road, thence eastwards through the centre of Laurie's road up to the centre of its junction with Havelock road, thence northwards through the centre of Havelock road up to the centre of its junction with Buller's road, thence a line drawn from the centre of the junction of Havelock road and Buller's road eastwards through the centre of Buller's road up to the centre of its junction with Castle street, thence eastwards through the centre of Castle street up to the centre of its junction with Cotta road, thence through the centre of Cotta road up to the centre of the bridge over the Kinda-ela.

East: A line drawn from the centre of the last mentioned bridge southwards through the centre of the Kinda-ela and Mahawatta-ela up to the centre of its junction with the Kelani Valley railway line, thence along the centre of the Kelani Valley railway line up to the centre of the bridge over the Kirillapone canal, thence westwards through the centre of the Kirillapone canal, thence westwards through the centre of the Kirillapone canal up to the confluence of the Kirillapone and the Dehiwala canals, thence southwards through the centre of the Dehiwala canal up to the centre of its junction with Galle

South: A line drawn from the centre of Galle road through the centre of the Dehiwala canal up to the high water mark of the sea.

West: The high water mark of the sea.

4. Maradana Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:

North: A line drawn from the north-west angle of the canal basin eastwards along the edge of the basin and through the centre of San Sebastian canal up to the centre of the bridge on San Sebastian hill, thence over San Sebastian canal eastwards through the centre of San Sebastian canal up to Stace road, thence eastwards through the centre of Stace road up to the eastern limits of North and South Base-

East: A line drawn from the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of North and South Baseline road up to Dematagoda-ela, thence through the centre of Dematagoda-ela past the lock to the point where the centre line of Cattle Mart road if produced due east in a straight line would meet Dematagoda-ela, thence southwards through the centre of Dematagoda-ela up to the centre of the bridge on Cotta road over the Dematagoda-ela.

South: A line drawn from the last mentioned point west-wards through the centre of Cotta road as far as the centre of its junction with North and South Baseline road, thence westwards through the centre of Ward place up to the centre of its junction with Kynsey road, thence northwards and westwith Kynsey road, thence northwards and west-wards through the centre of Kynsey road up to the centre of its junction with Norris canal road, thence south-westwards through the centre of Norris canal road up to the centre of its junction with Kynsey place, thence southwards through the centre of Kynsey place up to the centre of its junction with Ward place, thence westwards through the centre of Ward place up to the centre of its junction with Union place, thence westwards through the centre of Union place up to

the centre of its junction with Darley road.

West: A line drawn from the last mentioned point northwards through the centre of Darley road, thence westwards along the northern boundary of Hyde park until it meets the eastern boundary of the lake, thence northwards along the eastern and northern boundary of the lake as far as the entrance to the San Sebastian canal basin, thence northwards along the west boundary of the canal and canal basin up to a line drawn eastwards from the north-west angle of the Canal basin.

5. New Bazaar Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:

North: A straight line along the northern boundary of St. Anthony's Church produced west to the harbour and continued southwards along the eastern boundary of that church to meet the centre line of Jampettah street produced, thence a line east-wards through the centre of Jampettah street up to the centre of its junction with Green street, thence southwards through the centre of Green street up to the centre of its junction with Barber street, thence eastwards through the centre of Barber street up to the centre of its junction with Armour street, thence eastwards along a line drawn from the centre of the junction of Armour street with Prince of Wales' avenue, eastwards through the centre of Prince of Wales' avenue, Layard's broadway and Grandpass road up to the junction of Grandpass road and Stage road, thence junction of Grandpass road and Stace road, thence through the centre of Stace road up to the centre of the bridge over San Sebastian canal.

East: A line drawn from the last mentioned point southwards and westwards through the centre of San Sebastian canal up to the centre of the bridge on Skinner's road south, thence a line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards through the centre of San Sebastian canal up to the centre of the bridge on San Sebastian hill.

South: A line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards through the centre of San Sebastian canal and the north edge of the canal basin up to the north-west angle of the canal basin.

West: A line drawn from the last mentioned point through the centre of the canal which joins the lake through the locks to the harbour; thence along the southern and eastern limits of the harbour up to the northern boundary of St. Anthony's Church.

Kotahena Division comprising the area within the following boundaries:

North: The south bank of the Kelani-ganga. East: The west bank of Kelani-ganga and a line drawn along the eastern edge of the Kittampahua-ela up to the bridge over that ela carrying Madampitiya road, thence a line drawn from the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern and northern edge of the Kittampahua-ela to a point due north of the eastern boundary of the North and South Baseline road, thence due south along the eastern boundary of Baseline produced up to the centre of Stace road.

South: A line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards through the centre of Stace road, Grandpass road, Layard's broadway, and Prince of Wales' avenue up to the centre of the junction of Prince of Wales' avenue with Skinner's road north, thence a line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards through the centre of Barber street, Green street, Jampettah street, and along the eastern and northern boundaries of St. Anthony's Church up to the eastern limits of the harbour.

West: The eastern limits of the harbour, the high water mark of the sea and the south bank of the Kels

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in Us by section 6 (1) of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation establish from the date hereof a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do further, under section 6 (3), wholly exempt the general cemetery so established from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the Ordinance.

# By-Law.

- (c) When the owner of any premises applies for a water service to such premises he shall bind himself by an agreement in writing-

# BY-LAW.

The by-laws published in Gazette No. 8,172 of November 15, 1935, are hereby amended by the deletion of by-law 9 thereof and the substitution of the following for that by-law :-

"9. The Council may demand as a condition of the supply of energy a deposit in cash of the equivalent of two months' probable consumption as estimated by the Council.

In lieu of such deposit the Council may accept a guarantee on a form approved by the Council signed by a person resident in Kandy, and owning property in Kandy which is assessed for rates at an annual value of not less than Rs. 300.

The deposit of such security or the acceptance of a guarantee shall not prejudice the right of the Council to disconnect an installation for non-payment of accounts rendered as provided by by-law 8."

# BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The proprietor, trustee, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial ground within the area specified in the schedule hereto, shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Urban District Council to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper (if any) of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises, certified by the Surveyor-General or by a duly licensed Surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of keeper of such burial ground.

2. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, the person on whose application registration of a burial ground is made shall be deemed to be the keeper of that ground and to be responsible for any breach of regulations in respect of

that ground.

In the event of the death of the keeper of a burial ground or his inability from any cause to fulfil his duties, the name of another keeper shall be registered, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until such fresh registration shall have been effected, except on the special permission of the Chairman of the Urban District Council, or in his absence, of his deputy.

4. If the keeper of a registered burial or cremation ground is unable from any cause to perform his duties or if he cannot be found at the time when his services are required, the Chairman may authorize any fit and proper person to perform any of the duties which by these rules are assigned to keepers of registered burial or cremation

grounds.

5. Any person applying to have a burial or cremation in a registered burial or cremation ground shall obey the lawful

orders of the keeper of the said ground.

Any person who is aggrieved by any order given by the keeper of a registered burial ground or by any act or omission on his part, may complain to the Chairman, and the Chairman shall give such orders as may be necessary to secure the proper observance of these rules.

No burial or cremation shall take place in a registered burial or cremation ground without the permission of the keeper of the said ground, who will be held responsible

for the due observance of these by-laws.

No burial or cremation shall take place until the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895, has been produced to the keeper of the burial ground or to the Chairman, or to his deputy, as the case may be, if the burial or cremation is authorized by the Chairman or his Deputy under by-law 3.

- It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out in the premises of which he is the keeper in the form prescribed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council, and within twenty-four hours after any burial or cremation to cause a true extract of the entry of such cremation or burial in his register to be delivered to the office of the Urban District Council.
- 10. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Urban District Council or any person authorized by him in writing for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time any burial ground, and to have access to all books and documents relating thereto.

No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a

distance of less than 3 feet from any other grave.

12. The ashes and remains at the spot where any cremation has taken place shall be buried within three days of cremation at a depth of not less than 3 feet.

13. All registered burial grounds shall be kept properly fenced and free from jungle and clean to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

14. The by-laws under section 38 of the Ordinance in

respect of the public cemetery at Ambalangoda, published in Gazette No. 6,605 of February 6, 1914, and continuing in force by virtue of the provisions of section 247 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, are hereby repealed.

Any offence under the foregoing by-laws I to 10, inclusive, shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or after service of a written notice from the Chairman, or an officer authorized by the Chairman, of the contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws."

P. 992), thence south-eastwards and south-westwards along the said village limit as far as the village limit of Dandagomuwa (F. V. P. 64), thence southwards and eastwards along the last-mentioned village limit to the centre of the bridge on Madampe-Kurunegala road, thence north-eastwards in a straight line to the northern bank of Wehene-ela at the south-western corner of lot 2m in F. V. P. 979, thence eastwards and south-eastwards along the said bank to the western limit of the present Sanitary Board area.
    - -From the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the western limit of the present Sanitary Board area to the village limit of Kadurugashena (F. V. P. 979), thence south-westwards and northwestwards along the said village limit to a point due north-east of the north-western corner of lot 50A in F. V. P. 64, thence south-westwards in a straight line to the north-western corner of the said lot 50A and thence in a straight line for a distance of 6 chains to a point due north of the north-eastern corner of lot 3 I in F. V. P. 64, thence southwards in a straight line for a distance of 3 chains to the north-eastern corner of the said lot 31, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of lot 31 and westwards along the southern boundaries of lots 31, 31, 28, 2A, 1D, and 1c in F. V. P. 64 and crossing Madampe-Pannala road to the village limit of Kanadulla (F. V. P. 992) thence south-westwards along the said village limit to the north-western corner of lot 53 in F. V. (ii.) Any vehicle facing such colour be stopped before reaching such stop line shall proceed at a reasonable speed. (ii.) Any vehicle facing such colour displayed and about to cross the stop line in respect of such signal shall approach as near as practicable to but shall not pass such stop line and shall then remain stationary until the signal changes so as to display the colour "Green" and the word "GO". (e) No vehicle shall turn to the right from Kollupitiya road into Turret road except when the colour "Green" is displayed in the portion of the road where the vehicle is and when it can do so with safety to the public. 2. In connection with item 8 (a) (5) of the minutes of the General Meeting of the Council held on September 12, 1936, and the resolution of the Council contained therein, Mr. W. Dahanayaka, submitted, in terms of By-law 26 of Chapter ii., a written dissent from the opinion of the majority of the Council.

3. Two petitions were presented by Mr. W. Dahanayaka and one by Mr. J. E. Perera. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab asked the following questions:—(1) Is it a fact that the aged Muslim who died at the Infectious Diseases Hospital on August 24, 1936, was buried without the performance of a religious service according to the Islamic rites? (2) How many hours after his death was he buried? (3) What efforts were made by the authorities to see that facilities were given for a proper religious burial? (4) To avoid such incidents which deeply hurt the religious susceptibilities of Muslims, will the Chairman please lay down for future guidance a practicable procedure whereby Muslims who die in the Infectious Diseases Hospital will be accorded proper burial rites?

(3) Has the Chairman received any petitions from the residents of Magalle complaining against the insanitary condition of the Pettigala Sump and the channel beyond it?

#### By-Laws.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Hatton-Dikoya, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Re. 1 and Re. 1.50 respectively. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hercinafter called the collector) particulars required in the annexed form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid Collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

4. The Collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the Collector or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may conform, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz.:—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council—

- (a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- (b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
- 6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused, or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dog shall then be dealt within the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Urban District Council of Hatton-Dikoya under the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, dated January 21, 1933 (Gazette No. 7,968 of February 17, 1933) are repealed.

4. Every certificate of registration so issued shall be liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the said Urban District Council should the dog or bitch for which such certificate has been issued-

(a) be found straying without a tablet; or

(b) become so maimed or diseased as to be, in the opinion of the Chairman, unfit to live; or

(c) be, in the opinion of the Chairman, habitually ill-treated or neglected, or(d) be permitted, when it is suffering from any infectious

or contagious disease, to associate with any other dog or bitch.




