BY-LAW.

The by-laws of the Municipal Council of Kandy published by Proclamation in *Gazette* No. 6,165 of January 11, 1907, as last amended by Proclamation dated November 10, 1936, published in *Gazette* No. 8,256 of November 13, 1936, are hereby further amended by the addition, immediately after by-law 131G, of the following :—

131H. (1) The storage of slaked or unslaked lime for purposes of trade at any place within the limits of the Municipal Council of Kandy is hereby declared to be an offensive trade within the meaning of section 212 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

(2) Every licence which the Chairman may in his discretion decide to issue or renew for the purpose of allowing such offensive trade shall expire on the 31st day of December of the year in which it is issued or renewed.

(3) The fee prescribed for the licence aforesaid shall in every case be paid in advance at the time it is issued or renewed.

THE following Act intituled "An Act to prohibit the discharge in or transhipment for Spanish territory of weapons and munitions of war and other articles from certain ships, to prohibit the carriage in such ships of such articles consigned to or destined for Spanish territory, and for purposes connected therewith" which was passed in Parliament on the 3rd December, 1936, is published for general information.

Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1.—(1) No article to which this Act applies shall be discharged at any port or place in Spanish territory or within the territorial waters adjacent thereto from a ship to which this Act applies, and no such article shall be transhipped on the high seas from any such ship into any vessel bound for any such port or place, and no such article consigned to or destined for any such port or place shall be taken on board or carried in any such ship.

Prohibition of the discharge in and transhipment for Spanish territory of munitions of war from certain ships.

(2) The articles to which this Act applies are—

- (a) all articles which were on the twenty-third day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-six, prohibited to be exported from the United Kingdom by an Order in Council made by virtue of section eight of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1921 (which relate to weapons and munitions of war and other articles); and
- (b) all articles which may after the passing of this Act be prohibited to be so exported by any such Order in Council and to which this Act is declared by that Order to apply.

(3) The ships to which this Act applies are—

- (a) all British ships, except ships registered—
 - (i) in any of the following Dominions, that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa and the Irish Free State; or
 - (ii) in any territory administered by His Majesty's Government in any of the Dominions aforesaid; and
- (b) all other ships registered in, or licensed under the law of, any colony or British protectorate or any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

(4) If any article is discharged or transhipped from, or taken on board or carried in, any ship in contravention of this Act, any person being the owner, charterer or master of the ship shall, if he is privy to the contravention, be guilty of a misdemeanour.

(5) Section four hundred and forty-nine of the principal Act (which provides for the forfeiture of dangerous goods carried under a false description and in certain other cases) shall apply in relation to any ship to which this Act applies as if any articles carried in contravention of this Act were dangerous goods carried under a false description.

(6) Any officer mentioned in section seven hundred and twenty-three of the principal Act who has reason to suspect that a ship is contravening or has contravened the provisions of this Act shall, without prejudice to the powers conferred by that section, have the following powers, that is to say:—

- (a) he may go on board the ship and for that purpose may detain the ship or require it to stop or to proceed to some convenient place;
- (b) he may require the master to produce any documents relating to any cargo which is being carried or has been carried on the ship;
- (c) he may search the ship and examine the cargo and require the master or any member of the crew to open any package or parcel which he suspects to contain any articles to which this Act applies;
- (d) he may make any other examination or inquiry which he deems necessary to ascertain whether this Act is being or has been contravened;
- (e) if it appears to him that this Act is being or has been contravened, he may, without summons, warrant or other process, take the ship and her cargo and her master and crew to the nearest or most convenient port in a country to which this Act extends, in order that the alleged contravention may be adjudicated upon by a competent court.

(7) If any ship duly required under the last foregoing subsection to stop or to proceed to some convenient place fails to comply with that requirement, the master of the ship shall be guilty of a misdemeanour, and if a master or any other person fails to do any other thing duly required of him under that subsection or obstructs any officer in the exercise of his powers under that subsection, he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds.

(8) Anything which has been done before the commencement of this Act in purported exercise of any such power as is mentioned in subsection (6) of this section, and which would have been lawfully done if this Act had come into operation on the twenty-third day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-six, shall be deemed to have been lawfully done.

(9) For the purposes of this Act the expression "Spanish territory" shall include the Spanish zone of Morocco.

2.—(1) This Act may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Carriage of Munitions to Spain) Act, 1936.

(2) This Act and the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1932, shall be construed as one, and those Acts and this Act may be cited together as the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1936.

(3) In this Act the expression "the principal Act" means the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

(4) This Act shall extend, not only to the United Kingdom, but also to—

- (a) the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, British India, Newfoundland and every colony; and
- (b) every country to which Part XIII of the principal Act for the time being extends by virtue of an Order in Council made under section five of the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890.

(5) This Act shall continue in force until His Majesty by Order in Council is pleased to declare that it is no longer necessary or expedient that it should continue in force:

Provided that on the expiration of this Act subsection (2) of section thirty-eight of the Interpretation Act, 1889, (which relates to the effect of repeals) shall apply as if this Act had been repealed by another Act.

Short title, construction, interpretation, extent, and duration.

THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations—

"Council" means the Urban District Council of Panadura;

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council;

"public stand" means any space, within the administrative limits of the Council, which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

2. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing motor cabs or omnibuses to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

3. No vehicle other than a motor cab or omnibus shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

4. No motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in any public place except a public stand.

5. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of motor cabs or omnibuses, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter or be parked in it.

6. No motor cab or omnibus shall remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

7. Where separate passages for entrance and exit have been provided and indicated by notice or signboard at a public stand for motor cabs or omnibuses, no motor cab or omnibus shall enter or leave that public stand except by the appropriate passage.

8. Throughout the period during which a motor cab or omnibus occupies a public stand, the driver or a person authorized to look after the motor cab or omnibus shall remain in charge thereof at the public stand.

9. The driver of every motor cab or omnibus occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such motor cab or omnibus.

10. The driver or other person in charge of any motor cab or omnibus occupying any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

11. All motor cabs and omnibuses parked in a public stand shall be halted one behind the other facing the direction of the main routes along which they are expected to ply, or in such other manner as a police officer may direct, and shall be moved up as vacancies occur in front.

12. No driver of a lorry shall park the lorry on any highway declared by regulation to be suitable for use by lorries except—

(a) in the event of a breakdown and then only so long as may be necessary to enable essential repairs to be effected; or

(b) for the purpose of loading or unloading goods and then only so long as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose.

BY-LAWS.

Interpretation of Terms.

1. In these by-laws—

“the Council” means the Matara Urban District Council;
“the Chairman” means the Chairman of the Matara Urban District Council;

“market area” means any area, declared by by-law to be a market area for any public market established under the control of the Matara Urban District Council.

2. No person shall use or occupy any stall, seat, or space in a public market, unless he is the holder, or the servant or agent of the holder, of a permit or a ticket issued under these by-laws by or by the authority of the Chairman.

3. (1) A permit in form A of the schedule hereto shall be issued in every case where the tenancy of a stall, seat, or space in a public market is to be for a period of not less than one month.

(2) The use or occupation of a stall, seat, or space in a public market for any period less than one month shall be authorized by a ticket issued daily in form B of the schedule hereto and available for the period of issue only.

4. Every holder of a permit or ticket shall pay a rent or fee at the rates hereinafter prescribed.

5. If the Council does not employ an officer to collect the rent and fees it may lease the right of collecting such rents and fees to any approved person—(a) by private treaty, (b) by calling for tenders, or (c) by putting up the right to public auction.

6. (1) The rent or fee for each stall, seat, or space in a public market, shall be paid in advance at the time stated hereunder to the Chairman or to the officer appointed by the Council to collect such rent or fee or to the lessee, or to the person appointed by the lessee, as the case may be.

(2) Such rent or fee shall be paid—

(a) where a permit is issued, either at the time of the issue thereof or in monthly instalments on the first day of each calendar month of the period for which the permit is issued; and

(b) where a ticket is issued, at the time of the issue thereof;

Provided, however, that any holder of a permit may, for good cause, be allowed time not exceeding one week for the payment of any rent due from him; and every such holder shall, after the lapse of such time, be liable to pay the amount due on demand together with an additional rent of 10 cents for each day of the term of the permit during which the rent was in arrears.

7. Every permit or ticket shall be subject to the conditions set out thereon.

8. (1) No holder of a permit or ticket shall without the written permission of the Chairman—

(a) transfer such permit or ticket to any other person; or
(b) sublet any part of the stall, seat, or space allowed to him; or

(c) permit any person, other than his servant or agent, to use or occupy any part of the stall, seat, or space.

(2) No person shall use or occupy any part of any stall or space under any alleged sub-lease without the written permission of the Chairman.

9. Every holder of a permit for any period exceeding one month shall, when he decides to terminate his tenancy, give the Chairman one calendar month's notice of his intention to terminate such tenancy or pay one month's rent in lieu of such notice.

10. Every holder of a permit shall—

(a) cause every bench, shelf, counter, or table, on which articles of food or drink are kept or exposed for sale, to be thoroughly cleaned daily, and every board on which meat or fish is kept or exposed for sale, to be scraped and washed daily;

(b) sweep or cause to be swept, daily the stall or space occupied by him and any open space forming the approach or entrance to his stall or space, and

(c) keep near his stall or space a flyproof receptacle with a close fitting lid, and place or cause to be placed all sweepings, rubbish, and refuse matter therein.

11. No holder of a permit or ticket shall—

(a) subject any person resorting to the market to any insult, vexation, annoyance, or delay; or

(b) occupy his stall, seat, or space or take part in any sale therein, while he is suffering from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease, or employ or permit any person suffering from any such disease to occupy the stall, seat, or space or to take part in any sale therein; or

(c) enclose any part of his stall, seat, or space, or erect any screen or awning, or make any alterations whether temporary or permanent in such stall, seat, or space, without the written permission of the Chairman; or

(d) bring into, or keep in, his stall, seat, or space any box, table, chair, or other similar furniture, which is not the property of the Council, or construct any shelves or other fixtures in such stall, seat, or space, without the written permission of the Chairman, or

- (e) expose or keep for sale in his stall, seat, or space, any article which is not specified in his permit or ticket, or which is prohibited by the Council, or which is unwholesome or in any way injurious to the public health; or
- (f) throw any bones, fins, or scales of fish, or any refuse, or any rubbish or sweepings, in any drain or on any part of the market premises; or
- (g) expose the skin or hide of any animal, for the purpose of drying or curing, in any part of the market premises.
12. No person shall, within a public market or its premises—
- (a) carry on any cooking; or
- (b) be found drunk or behaving in a disorderly manner, or create any noise or disturbance, or fight with any other person or use insulting, abusive, or obscene language; or
- (c) beg; or
- (d) loiter without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself, or remain after being ordered to leave by the market keeper or an officer of the Council, or headman or police constable, or any person acting under the lawful orders of the Chairman.
13. No person shall—
- (a) damage or deface any part of the market buildings or the furniture, lamps, or other property of the Council in or about a public market; or
- (b) defile, pollute, or waste the water provided for use in a public market, or wash himself or any animal, clothes, or article in that water.

14. (1) The Chairman shall cause a list of the rents or fees, payable for the occupation of a stall, space, or seat, at a public market, to be exhibited in a conspicuous place in that market.

(2) No market keeper, lessee, or person appointed by the lessee to collect the rents or fees shall—

- (a) demand or take any higher amount, by way of rent or fee than that specified in the aforesaid list; or
- (b) subject any person to unnecessary or vexatious treatment under pretext of performing any duty or exercising any authority imposed or conferred upon him.

15. The Chairman shall have power to inquire into any dispute relating to any rent or fee, and make such order thereon as to him may seem just.

Private Markets and other Authorized Premises.

16. (1) Within any market area no person shall sell or expose for sale, any meat, poultry, fresh fish, fresh fruits, or vegetables except at a public market.

(2) No licence shall be issued for any private market within any market area and no other premises within any such area shall be authorized for the sale of any of the articles specified in paragraph (1) of this by-law.

(3) Nothing in this by-law shall be deemed to prohibit or in any way to affect—

- (a) the sale of poultry, fruits, or vegetables by itinerant vendors as defined in section 163 (5) of the Ordinance, or
- (b) the sale by the licensee of an eating-house or a tea or coffee boutique, of fruits for consumption on the premises, or
- (c) the sale by any person of oranges, ripe plantains, or young coconuts.

GENERAL.

17. No person shall bring into, or expose for sale, or sell at any public market or at any licensed market or other premises within the administrative limits of the Council any carcase or meat of any animal not slaughtered at a public slaughtering-house or at a licensed slaughtering place: provided that this by-law shall not apply to the sale of frozen meat imported into the Island or of game.

18. (1) It shall be the duty of every holder of a permit in respect of a stall at a public market to keep such stall open to the public for business between the hours of 6 A.M. and 9 P.M.

(2) No such permit holder shall wilfully neglect or refuse to serve the public for two or more consecutive days without the written leave of the Chairman.

(3) Any contravention of paragraph (2) above shall be punishable on the second or any subsequent conviction with the suspension or cancellation of the permit in addition to such fine as may lawfully be imposed for the breach of this by-law under by-law 22.

19. The Chairman may in his discretion refuse—

- (a) to issue a permit to any person, who, to his knowledge, or by common repute, is of bad character, or is for any other reason unsuited to be the holder of a permit; or,
- (b) to issue a fresh permit to any person whose permit has been suspended or cancelled, or who has been convicted of any breach of these by-laws.

20. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or for any officer of the Council acting under the authority of the Chairman, to inspect any market and to seize any article of food introduced into or exposed for sale therein, which appears to him to be unwholesome and to convey the same to the Medical Officer of Health, Matara, and if that officer certifies that any article of food so seized is unwholesome, such article may be destroyed without payment of compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized.

21. No person shall resist, obstruct, hinder, or molest, any market keeper, or any officer or person appointed by the Council to superintend any market or to collect rents or fees therein, in the execution of his duty.

22. Any contravention of any of these by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and with an additional fine of ten rupees for each day during which the offence is continued after a conviction thereof or after written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

RULE.

The School Teachers' Pension Rules published in *Gazette* No. 7,631 of February 24, 1928, are hereby amended in rule 11 by the addition at the end thereof of the following:—

(vi.) A teacher whose service under Government in any post or posts specified in the schedule to these rules is continuous with service in an Assisted School may, if retired on abolition of office, be granted for service in Assisted Schools the pension or gratuity for which such teacher may have qualified under these rules by length of service and circumstances of retirement, simultaneously with a pension or gratuity in respect of service under Government, notwithstanding that he or she has not at the date of retirement attained, as required by rule 6, the age of 55 or 50, as the case may be.

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on November 21, 1936, at 8.45 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated November 17, 1936.

Present: Mr. F. C. Gimson, Chairman; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar.

1. The minutes of proceedings of the meetings held on October 17, 1936, and on November 13, 1936, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and copies thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1935 to October 31, 1936, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for October, 1936.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of October, 1936.
- The reservoir readings for the week ending November 21, 1936.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—

Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during October, 1936.

3A. Mr. De Silva drew the attention of the Chairman to the unsatisfactory manner in which the Lotus Pond was being filled up. He suggested that proper drainage with silt chambers should be immediately provided.

Messrs. Ismail and Soysa confirmed what Mr. De Silva said and observed that the present conditions afforded breeding grounds for mosquitoes.

The Chairman said that the complaint would receive his attention.

3B. Mr. Marikar complained of the insufficient water supply in Lady MacCarthy's road.

Mr. Wijayatilake referred to the inconveniences felt in Peradeniya road in the matter of water.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matter.

4. Petitions:—Mr. Soysa presented—(1) petition from Mr. S. B. Kahawatte dated November 11, 1936, stating that he was unjustly discontinued from the Municipal Service.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(2) letter dated November 17, 1936, from Mr. A. H. N. Jirasinghe and several other tenants of the Katukelle Model tenements addressed to Mr. Wijayatilake suggesting the repair of the drain passing through the Model tenement premises, and drawing attention to the necessity for separate kitchens for the houses and repairs to electric fittings. (3) Letter from Mr. B. H. Dunuwille dated November 19, 1936, suggesting the sale of Library periodicals by public auction.

Mr. Marikar presented—(4) petition dated November 16, 1936, signed by Mr. K. Sandanam Pillai and several other residents of Pata Hewaheta asking that the path passing through the village be repaired and that lights and water service be provided. (5) Petition dated November 18, 1936, from Letchimi Amma praying that the notices demanding alterations to her house No. 36 in Deyannawela be not enforced as the house is likely to be demolished when the new road is opened.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Correspondence—Copy of letter No. J 40/34 of November 9, 1936, addressed to Mr. T. A. Hodson by the Chief Secretary, intimating that he has been appointed to act as Chairman of the Municipal Council of Kandy, in addition to his own duties from about November 25, 1936, in place of Mr. F. C. Gimson. (0566).—Tabled.

5A. Mr. Marikar moved the following motion standing over from the previous meeting, viz.:—“In terms of the Council's resolution dated July 19, 1930, a reasonable grant be given annually to the Kandy Sri Kalyanodaya Society, in aid of the Society's Free Vernacular Reading Room.” Mr. De Silva seconded.

The Council agreed to include a sum of Rs. 150 in the Budget for 1937, as a grant to the Society.

5b. With the leave of Council Mr. Marikar moved :—“Owing to the great dissatisfaction prevailing amongst the ratepayers of Kandy over the concession allowed to the Kandy Sports Club in respect of the Bogambara grounds this Council is of opinion that the said concession be forthwith withdrawn and that the Kandy Municipal Council should maintain the said grounds at its own expense so that the same may be available to all schools and clubs within the Municipal limits of Kandy.” Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.

Mr. De Silva suggested amendment of the motion as follows :—“Owing to the great dissatisfaction prevailing amongst the ratepayers of Kandy over the concession allowed to the Kandy Sports Club in respect of the Bogambara grounds, this Council is of opinion that the said concession be withdrawn after 6 months' notice commencing from December 1, 1936, and that the Kandy Municipal Council should maintain the said grounds at its own expense so that the same may be available to all schools and clubs within the Municipal limits of Kandy, and that a Special Committee consisting of 3 members of Council be appointed to control the grounds.” The motion as amended was accepted by the mover and seconded by Mr. Ismail.

The Chairman suggested to refer the motion to the Works Committee for a report of the cost of upkeep before a decision is reached.

The mover declined to agree to the Chairman's suggestion.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried, the Chairman dissenting.

The following members were appointed to form the Special Committee :—Messrs. De Silva, Soysa, and Marikar.

6. To nominate two members from the Council to serve on the Municipal Education District Committee for the three years commencing from January 1, 1937.—Resolved that Messrs Soysa and Wijayatilake be renominated for a further term of three years.

7. Chairman's memo dated October 9, 1936, suggesting that Government be approached early for financial assistance in respect of improvement schemes such as the Paving of the Meda-ela, Construction of Back lanes, &c. (G 122).—Resolved that a programme of works in respect of which financial assistance from Government is desired be submitted. Copy to be furnished to Mr. De Silva.

8. To consider Chairman's memo dated October 14, 1936, suggesting the lease of an allotment of Municipal land in Mahaiyawa as a site for the Home for the Aged. (G 307).—Resolved that the allotment of land 1 acre 22 perches in extent be leased on a nominal rent of Re. 1 per annum, subject to the rights reserved by the Crown and the War Department under section 69 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

9. To consider application from Mr. L. H. Mettananda, Principal, Dharmaraja College, dated November 17, 1936, for the use of the Victoria Esplanade for one week during the next Esala Perahera in connection with the Golden Jubilee Celebrations of the College. (D 30 (2).)

Mr. De Silva moved—“That the portion of Bogambara occupied during the last Perahera for purposes of the Industrial Pavilion and Amusement Shows be allowed to Mr. Mettananda for 10 days during the next Esala Perahera on payment of a rent of Rs. 250 for the Golden Jubilee Celebrations connected with the College.” Mr. Wijayatilake seconded, and Mr. Ismail supported.

The Chairman strongly protested against this action as he considered it was illegal and was not in the interest of the ratepayers owing to the loss of the usual income from sites rented by the Council at Bogambara for various amusements during the Perahera Season.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried, the Chairman dissenting.

10. To table the draft budget for 1937 and to fix a date for a Special Meeting for its consideration.—Tabled. Resolved that a Special Meeting be convened for December 5, 1936, at 8 A.M., to consider the budget.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, in terms of section 98 of "The Municipal Council's Ordinance, 1910," as amended by Ordinance No. 21 of 1929, on Monday, December 7, 1936, at 8 a.m., and of the adjourned meeting held at 4 p.m. of the same day, to consider the Draft Budget for 1937.

Present: Mr. T. A. Hodson, Chairman; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. O. T. Nettelton; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb.

Before proceeding to consider the Budget, the Chairman tabled papers and tenders received for the lease of Roseneath estate and bungalow, and moved—"That Mr. D. T. Pelpola's tender for Rs. 30,201 for the lease of Roseneath estate and bungalow for a period of 10 years be accepted subject to the conditions of tender contained in the notice dated October 8, 1936, save that the barbed wire fence along the boundary line of the leased estate and the Municipal land referred to in Clause 13 of the conditions be erected by the Council at its expense, and subject to the further condition that the lessee furnish approved landed property security in Rs. 5,000 for the first two years of the lease." Mr. De Silva seconded.—Carried.

2. The Chairman moved the Council into Committee to consider the Draft Budget for the year 1937, which was tabled at the meeting of Council held on November 21, 1936. Mr. Soysa seconded.—Carried.

3. Proceedings of Council in Committee :—

(1) Mr. De Silva suggested that decisions made on the Budget should be subject to any amendments that may become necessary as a result of the adoption by the Council of any measures of economy on the recommendations of the Special Committee.—This was agreed to by the Council.

(2) The draft Budget was then considered item by item and the following amendments and decisions were made :—

Revenue.

(a) Rs. 2,229 included under General Revenue—Head 12 : Salary Levy, and Rs. 952·50 included under Electricity Department—Sundry Revenue : Salary Levy,—being levy made on the salaries of officers in terms of Municipal Council resolution passed at the meeting held on October 17, 1936, for the 3 months January to March, 1937.—It was agreed that the question of salary levy should be brought up for reconsideration at the meeting of Council to be held in April next.

(b) Head 3—Tolls : Halloluwa.—Substituted Rs. 813 for Rs. 850.

(c) Head 7—Rents.—Market Daily space rents and Fair Day rents.

The Chairman moved that the tender of Mr. V. K. Fernando for Rs. 19,586 for the year 1937 be accepted.

Messrs. De Silva and Wijayatilake pointed out that the clause prescribing the period of the Fair was not correctly stated in the Sinhalese notice and that the tenders should be readvertised. This was agreed to.

Other Lands, Buildings and Encroachments.—Substituted Rs. 15,020 for Rs. 12,000, the increase being the lease rent of Roseneath estate and bungalow for one year.

(d) Head 11—Miscellaneous Services : Registration of Dogs.—Registration fee was fixed at Rs. 2 per dog and Rs. 3 per bitch, and Rs. 1,000 was substituted for Rs. 500 in the Budget.

(e) Back Lane Account.—Grant from Government, Rs. 70,395, was deleted as the Central Government has not sanctioned the grant.

Expenditure : General Revenue Account.

(f) Head 1—Administrative : Personal Emoluments.—Substituted Rs. 144,580·42 for Rs. 144,880·42 the reduction of Rs. 300 being the salary provided in the Draft Budget for the post of outdoor peon, Health Department, since abolished.

(g) Application from outdoor peons for provision of coats as in the case of other peons was considered and disallowed.

(h) Head 2—Administrative : Other Charges, Stationery.—Rs. 2,700 substituted for Rs. 2,800, and the use of cheaper stationery was suggested.

Dalton Adding Machine.—Deleted item of Rs. 450.

Telephone Charges.—Rs. 1,050 substituted for Rs. 1,200, reduction being effected by change over of the Chairman's telephone from a direct line to a connection from the main office.

(i) Dr. Godlieb observed that the temporary Infectious Diseases Hospital was unsatisfactory and that Government should be addressed on the subject. This was agreed to.

(j) Head 5—Scavenging streets : Upkeep of Lorries.—Repairs. Substituted Rs. 2,843·66 for Rs. 3,093·66, and the employment of a mechanic on a monthly pay of Rs. 60 in a non-pensionable capacity was approved in place of the present daily-paid mechanic.

(k) Head 6—Conservancy of Latrines.—Rs. 625 included for tarring District Road Committee road to Gohagoda.

(l) Roads, buildings, &c. : Maintenance of roads.—Substituted Rs. 25,498 for Rs. 25,438 in adjustment of clerical error.

(m) It was agreed that tenders should be invited for emulsified asphalt used in tarring roads.

(n) Maintenance of Parks, &c.—Rs. 420 included for employment of a gardener as suggested by the Curator, Royal Botanical Gardens, for improvement of Kandy road side trees and open spaces at Rs. 35 per mensem.

(o) Estimate 12 B : Esplanade and Playgrounds.—Substituted Rs. 219·50 for Rs. 379·50, reduction being in wages of caretaker.

(p) Estimate 12A : Upkeep of Bogambara Green.—Substituted Rs. 1,381·60 for Rs. 860, and it was agreed that no improvements should be effected without reference to the Special Committee appointed to control the ground.

(q) Estimate 27.—The Council agreed that the vote for removal of silt from the lake might be utilized to provide relief work to the unemployed.

(r) Estimate 29A : Orderly for Municipal Engineer.—Substituted Rs. 23·25 for Rs. 273·75, the Orderly to be given one month's notice of discontinuance. It was noted that he should be given priority of consideration in the event of a vacancy occurring.

(s) Head 9 : Public lighting.—Included Rs. 300 for re-wiring of 15 houses to the Katukelle Model tenements.

The Council then adjourned till 4 P.M.

Proceedings of Council in Committee of the adjourned meeting held at 4 P.M.

(t) Head 8—Maintenance of Buildings, Est. 6.—It was agreed that provision made in Estimate 6 for repairs to Mr. Kaimal's bungalow should not be incurred until the Council has decided on representations received from 3 members as to the use of the bungalow.

(u) Head 10—Water Service.—The proposal to institute a Depreciation Fund in respect of waterworks was considered and deferred for consideration with the Budget for 1938.

(v) Head 15—Fire Brigade : Upkeep of Fire Engine.—Substituted Rs. 1,100 for Rs. 1,300.

The Chairman agreed to address the Colombo Municipal Council on the subject of charges made for half-yearly inspections of the Brigade by the Chief Officer of the Colombo Fire Brigade.

(w) Head 19—Poor Relief, &c.—Municipal Free Ayurvedic Dispensary ; Oils, drugs, and medicinal herbs.—Substituted Rs. 2,000 for Rs. 2,400.

Grants—Grant to Evelyn Nurseries.—Substituted Rs. 500 for Rs. 460.

Grant to Sri Kalyanodaya Society.—Included Rs. 150.

Vagrants.—On the suggestion of Dr. Godlieb, the Chairman agreed to inquire from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, whether a system of registering vagrants could be started with a view to keeping out vagrants who are not domiciled in Kandy.

(x) Head 20—Pensions.—Item of Rs. 359·60 was deleted owing to the death of Pensioner A. S. Perera, and items of Rs. 79·08 and Rs. 67·50 were included on account of Kiri Ukkuwa's and Solay's pensions respectively.

(y) Chairman was authorized to grant small rewards to Municipal Servants for giving information as regards unregistered dogs for the purpose of stimulating the registration of dogs.

(z) Head 22—Miscellaneous Services.—The continuance of Mr. Spencer, Licensed Surveyor, on a temporary basis until the completion of encroachment surveys was sanctioned, and it was agreed that Assessment surveys for purposes of vesting should be carried out by the Assistant Municipal Engineer.

(aa) Head 23—Capital Expenditure.—(i.) Acquisition of land for the construction of hot water baths was authorized as the proposed arrangement to lease the land has not been satisfactory. (ii.) Substituted Rs. 3,000 for Rs. 6,000 for erecting one Night Soil Depot only in Ampitiya. (iii.) Substituted Rs. 2,500 for Rs. 10,000 for a public latrine near bus park in Railway Approach road—Plan and estimate to be submitted for approval. Messrs. Ismail and Nettelton opposed any provision being made. (iv.) Constructing road side drains in Peradeniya road—Substituted Rs. 2,750 for Rs. 3,000 for constructing 850 feet of road side drain from Mount Pleasant junction towards Getambe. (v.) Rs. 5,000 for improvements to Lady Havelock's drive was deleted. (vi.) Included—Rs. 3,000 for improvements to labour lines. Rs. 1,000 for a new road through Deyannawela to connect on to road constructed by relief labourers outside Municipal limits (token vote).

Messrs. De Silva and Wijayatilaka undertook to procure the necessary land free. It was agreed that no expenditure should be incurred unless the land could be obtained free.

Opening of Halloluwa tunnel.—Municipal Engineer was asked to investigate proposal.

(bb) Mr. Soysa's proposal to erect a danger signal board at the Hantane-Hospital road junction was referred to the Provincial Engineer.

(cc) At this stage petitions were presented by Mr. Wijayatilake—(i.) regarding drain passing through the Katukelle Model tenements which the Chairman undertook to investigate ; by Mr. Ismail (ii.) regarding improvements to Watapuluwa village which the Chairman undertook to investigate ; and by Mr. Marikar (iii.) regarding the neglected condition of Alutgantota road on which the Municipal Engineer was asked to report.

(dd) Capital Expenditure (provided from Back Lane contributions).—Rs. 55,205 was substituted for Rs. 125,600 for acquisition of land for Back Lane block B.

(ee) The Waiting List of Estimates was then considered and the following items were included :—(i.) Rs. 200 for upkeep of road to Trig. Station at Mahayaya. (ii.) Rs. 80 for providing a rickshaw stand near Bus Park in Railway Approach road. (iii.) Rs. 140 being half cost of providing an iron railing for Bo tree near Railway Approach road Bus Park, provided other half is contributed by the public. (iv.) Rs. 2,000 for a public path along Railway line in Huduhumpola including a foot bridge. (v.) Rs. 600 for 3 public notice boards. (vi.) Rs. 55 for acquisition of a strip of land as an access to the Trig. Station at Mahayaya. (vii.) Rs. 1,000 for constructing side drains in Galagedara and Madawela roads. (viii.) Rs. 260 for replastering and repairing a section of Meda-ela by the side of Hantane road. (ix.) Rs. 1,150 for rebuilding the collapsed culvert in Lady Havelock's Drive at Lewella end. (x.) Rs. 900 for regrading the barrel drain in Trincomalee street near premises Nos. 187 and 188. (xi.) Rs. 645 for purchase of iron structures for erection of latrines during Perahera Season. (xii.) Rs. 175 for repairs to Band Stand in the Victoria Esplanade. (xiii.) Rs. 120 for repairs to the Social Service Hall at Mahaiyawa Model tenements.

(ff) As regards fee for exhibiting notices on Public Notice Boards the Council approved of a charge of 50 cents per square foot per board for a period of 14 days or less subject to a minimum charge of Re. 1.—Chairman was authorized to grant special terms to regular advertisers.

(gg) The Council approved of tenders being invited for erecting the barbed wire fence at Roseneath referred to under item 1 above, and the amount of the tender being provided as a supplementary vote.

(hh) With regard to the proposal for erecting a retaining wall and railing at Bahirawakande the Chairman was asked to ascertain from owners of property served by this road whether they would contribute towards the cost.

Electricity Department—Expenditure.

(ii) The Assistant Municipal Electrical Engineer was asked to report whether public lighting could be controlled from Power House or in sections.

(jj) Management : Printing and Stationery.—Substituted Rs. 1,700 for Rs. 1,800.

Quarterly Inspections.—Substituted Rs. 300 for Rs. 400.

(kk) The Assistant Municipal Electrical Engineer was asked to make arrangements to start Katugastota Supply from Katugastota Power Station from 6 P.M. instead of 6.30 P.M.

(ll) Question of reduction of meter rents was referred to the Electricity Committee for consideration.

(mm) Estimate 31—Copper for alteration to existing Switch Board.—Rs. 250 ; Estimate 32—One Rotary Balancer set, 150 amps. middle wire.—Rs. 4,000 ; Estimate 33—One 2,000 ampere Switchboard type Watt hour meter.—Rs. 2,000—were transferred to Capital Expenditure provided from Profits Account from Capital Expenditure from Loans and Reserves Account.

(nn) Item of Rs. 2,500 for purchase of a crane was deleted.

(oo) Item of Rs. 125,000 for purchase of a new engine set was retained in the Budget, but purchase to depend on decision that the Council will make at the next meeting after further data have been supplied.

(pp) The following estimates were included :—Rs. 600 for extending lights along Lady McCallum's Drive. Rs. 393 for extending lights along Asgiriya path. Rs. 50 for providing 2 additional lights in Lady Manning's Drive.

4. The Chairman moved that the Council do resume, and the Budget for 1937 as amended in Committee be adopted. Mr. Soysa seconded.—Carried.

The aggregate revenue and expenditure is shown in the Schedule below.

5. The Chairman moved that the Council place on record its sense of appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Mr. O. T. Nettelton, Provincial Engineer, as a member of the Municipal Council. Mr. De Silva seconded. Mr. Wijayatilake supported the motion.—Carried.

Property Rate for 1937.

IT is hereby notified that the Batticaloa Urban District Council has, in terms of "The Local Government Ordinance No. 11 of 1920" imposed for the year 1937, the following rates, being the same as were in force during the preceding year, within the administrative limits of the Batticaloa Urban District Council, subject to the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance.

Under section 171 (1) (a): a rate of 10 per centum payable on March 31, on June 30, on September 30, and on December 31, for the quarter ending on the said days, respectively, on the annual value of all immovable property within the administrative limits of the said Urban District Council, subject, however, to the limitation, qualification and condition that all properties situated within the area defined in the schedule hereto, shall pay a rate of 5 per centum in the manner and on the dates specified above.

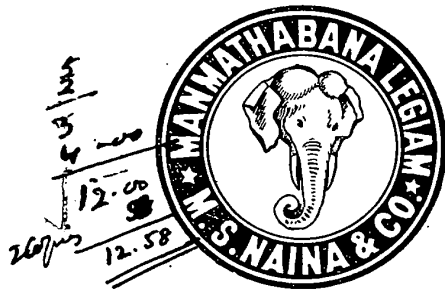

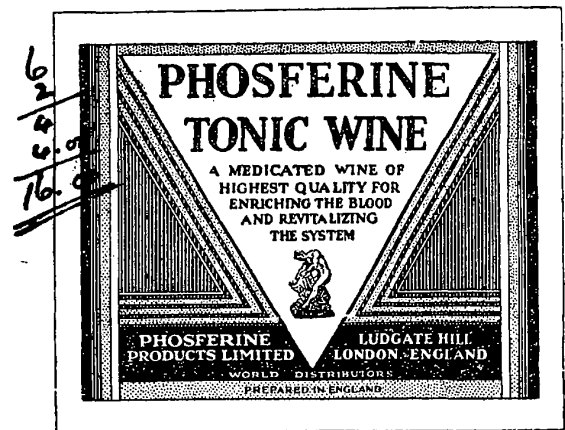

RESOLUTION REFERRED TO.

That this Council resolves under section 11 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 that from and after the date on which the sanction of the Secretary of State to this resolution is notified in the *Government Gazette*, import duty upon the goods specified in the first column of the schedule to this resolution shall be levied and paid at the general rate prescribed in the third column of that schedule, and that such general rate shall be levied and paid upon such goods in lieu of the import duty payable thereon at the date of this resolution:

Provided that import duty at the preferential rate prescribed in the second column of the schedule shall be levied and paid upon such of the aforesaid goods as may be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal Collector of Customs to have been produced or manufactured in, and to have been consigned from, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Dominions, India, the territories administered by His Majesty's Governments in the Dominions under Mandate or otherwise, the British Colonies, the British Protectorates and protected States, or the Mandated Territories of Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British Mandate and Togoland under British Mandate.
