PROTOCOL TO THE CONVENTION.

At the time of signing the Convention of this day's date on the stamp laws in connexion with bills of exchange and promissory notes, the undersigned, duly authorised, have agreed upon the following provisions:

The Members of the League of Nations and the non-Member States which may not have been able to deposit their ratifications of the said Convention before the 1st September, 1932, undertake to forward within fifteen days from that date a communication to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations informing him of their situation as regards ratification.

В.

If on the 1st November, 1932, the conditions laid down in Article 5, paragraph 1, for the entry into force of the Convention are not fulfilled, the Secretary-General of the League of Nations shall convene a meeting of the Members of the League and the non-Member States which have

signed the Convention or acceded to it.

The purpose of this meeting shall be to examine the situation and any measures to be taken to meet it.

The High Contracting Parties shall communicate to each other, immediately upon their coming into force, the legislative measures taken by them in execution of the Convention in their respective territories.

1. It is agreed that, in so far as concerns the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the only instruments to which the provisions of this Convention shall apply are bills of exchange presented for acceptance or accepted or payable elsewhere than in the United Kingdom.

2. A similar limitation shall apply in the case of any colonies, protectorates or territories under suzerainty or mandate of His Britannic Majesty to which the Convention may become applicable in virtue of Article 9, provided that a Notification claiming such limitation is addressed to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations before the date on which the application of the Convention to such territory takes effect.

3. It is further agreed that inso far asconcerns Northern Ireland the provisions of this Convention shall only apply with such modifications as may be found necessary.

4. The Government of any Member of the League of Nations or non-Member State which is ready to accede to the Convention under Article 4, but desires to be allowed the limitation graphing in paragraph 1 above may inform the limitation specified in paragraph 1 above, may inform the Secretary-General of the League of Nations to this effect, and the Secretary-General shall forthwith com-municate this notification to the Governments of all Members of the League and non-Member States on whose behalf the Convention has been signed or accessions thereto deposited, and enquire if they have any objection thereto. If within six months of the date of the communication of the Secretary-General no objections have been received, the limitation shall be deemed to have been accepted.

In faith whereof the Plenipotentiaries have signed the

present Protocol.

Done at Geneva, the seventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, in a single copy, which shall be deposited in the archives of the Secretariat of the League of Nations, and of which authenticated copies shall be delivered to all Members of the League of Nations and non-Member States represented at the Conference. ANNEXURE "A".

1. The Laboratory is opened for receipt of specimens between the hours 9 A.M. and 4 P.M., from Monday to Friday, and on Saturday between 9 A.M. and 12.30 P.M.

Urgent specimens only will be received on public holidays and Sundays between 10 and 11 A.M.

Routine specimens received late in the afternoon will be examined that day only if time permits, otherwise they will be placed in cold storage until the following day.

2. All specimens should be accompanied by a note from the Medical Attendant giving name and regular address of patient and kind of test required. In the case of febrile ailments the number of days of duration of the disease may be stated. A brief clinical history of the case will be helpful.

3. Reports will be furnished by letter within 24 hours unless the specimen requires culture. Results may be obtained by telephone from the officer in charge at the time. Reports "per bearer" will be furnished only at the written request of the Medical Practitioner.

In the case of throat swabs for suspected Diphtheria a report on the direct microscopic examination may be obtained by telephone, and if positive will be furnished by letter.

The cultural method being more reliable no reliance should be placed on results of direct examination unless supported by clinical signs and symptoms.

5. Sterile sputum and urine bottles, swabs, faeces collecting tubes, flasks containing culture media for blood culture, test tubes for flood for agglutination tests, &c., will be supplied free of charge for conveyance of specimens to the Laboratory

6. All fees must be paid in advance as far as possible where the description of service and fee is stated and known. Payments are to be made direct to the City Microbiologist and receipts obtained immediately. Where the fee is not known in advance, payment must be made on demand to the Municipal Treasurer.

(7) The Medical Practitioner at whose request the examination is done is responsible for the fee.

(8) All specimens and communications should be addressed to the City Microbiologist and handed in at the office of the Laboratory.

Annexure "B".

Bu-law.

The by-laws relating to public performances made by the Municipal Council of Colombo published in Gazette No. 6,956 of July 12, 1918, as amended by by-laws published in Gazette No. 6,972 of October 18, 1918, and Gazette No. 8,057 of June 8, 1934, respectively, are hereby further amended in by-law 52 thereof, as follows:

 by the numbering of the first sentence of that by law as paragraph (i) thereof;
 by the substitution in the aforesaid paragraph (i) for the word "rules" of the word "by laws";
 by the deletion of all the words from "The Chairman may appoint" to "when not specified otherwise in these by laws";

- (4) by the addition, immediately after paragraph (i), of the following new paragraphs:-
  - (2) Every Licensee shall, in the months of June and December of each year, furnish at his own expense, to the Chairman, a certificate from a person approved for the purpose by the Chairman, to the effect that the gas or electrical installation in the licensed building or place is in safe working order.

    (3) If at any other time during the year, the Chairman has reason to believe that the gas or electrical
  - installation in any licensed building or place is faulty or is in a dangerous condition, he may by written notice—(a) require the licensee to furnish, at his own expense, a further certificate to the like effect as the certificate mentioned in paragraph (2) above; or (b) prohibit the use of the licensed building or place until all faults are rectified and the aforesaid certificate is furnished.

(4) Save as otherwise expressly provided in these by-laws, all electrical installations shall be erected and maintained in strict accordance with the latest edition of the rules of the Institution of Electrical Engineers and the Phœnix Fire Office of Great Britain.

#### Annexure "C".

#### Bu-law.

- 1. No box, basket, package, parcel or other article whatsoever, the external dimensions of which exceed 18 inches in length, or 12 inches in width, or 10 inches in height, shall be carried on a bicycle, except on a properly constructed carrier. No bicycle shall have more than one carrier above the front wheel or more than one carrier above the back wheel, or more than two carriers in all.
- (1) A carrier fixed above the back wheel of a bicycle shall not be more than 18 inches in length, or 15 inches in width.
- (2) A carrier fixed above the front wheel of a bicycle where such wheel exceeds 20 inches in diameter shall not be more than 20 inches in length, or 15 inches in width.

  (3) A carrier fixed above the front wheel of a bicycle where such wheel does not exceed 20 inches in diameter, shall
- not be more than 22 inches in length or 18 inches in width.
- 4. Nothing in these by laws shall be deemed to restrict the number of articles that may be carried on a bicycle in the manner hereinbefore prescribed : provided, however, that no such article shall be so placed or stacked as to project over the edge or the sides of the carrier, and that the total height of the articles placed or stacked in a carrier shall not exceed :-
  - (a) 12 inches, where they are carried over the back wheel;
  - (b) 16 inches, where they are carried over the front wheel and the diameter of that wheel does not exceed 20 inches; and
  - (c) 15 inches, where they are carried over the front wheel and the diameter of that wheel exceeds 20 inches.
- 5. The person liable for a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be the person in effective control of the bicycle at the time of such breach.
  - 6. Nothing in these by-laws shall apply to a bicycle which is mechanically propelled.

The Edinburgh Market Area—shall be bounded as follows:—North by Jampettah street and an imaginary line drawn direct westwards from the end of Jampettah street. East by Hill street, Kuruwe street, Hulftsdorp street, San Sebastian hill. South by Norris road, Lotus road. West by the sea.

St. John's Market Area—shall be bounded as follows:—North by Jampettah street and an imaginary line drawn street. San Sebastian hill. South by Jampettah street and an imaginary line drawn street.

The Chairman explained that these amounts were included under the Municipal Treasurer's Department instead of under the Municipal Engineer's Department and the Waterworks Department, respectively, in order to keep all loan items in one place.

At this stage Mr. A. E. Goonesinha enquired why no provision was made for feeding the poor school children on His Majesty's Coronation Day.

The Chairman explained that it would be brought up as a supplementary vote, in due course.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal stated that at the meeting of the Four Standing Committees re 1937 Budget a sum of Rs. 5,000 was specially set apart for this purpose.

The Chairman explained the reason why that amount was not included.

#### I .- Engineer's Department.

(i.) Miscellaneous-Rs. Item 59—Upkeep of Chairman's Motor Car 5,420

Mr. A. R. A. Razik suggested a reduction as the Chairman would be replaced in course of the year by an elected Chairman and the amount seemed excessive.

The Chairman explained that the amount though it appeared large included heavy charges for depreciation and for workshop overheads. He said that it was not intended under this item to provide a car for the future elected Mayor, that the car was required for the use of the present Chairman who would continue as Commissioner until the Council made its own appointment.

Dr. Coorey asked whether it was not a fact that items in this budget relating to the Chairman related to the Chairman under the present constitution and not to the future Mayor.

The Chairman replied in the affirmative. The item was then passed.

(k) Extraordinary (New Works)-

Rs. Item 66-Bridge at Havelock road 100,000 - Mr. Aelian W. Pereira inquired whether this amount could not be reduced.

The Chairman stated that this amount included the cost of shifting of mains, and the diversion of the approaches to the new Bridge to eliminate the existing bend. The item was then passed.

Item 69—Extension of 5th lane to Thurstan road

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal explained that the extension would not be complete unless continued by connecting Deanstone place up to 27th lane, and for this purpose he suggested that a sum of Rs. 635 be provided as soon as funds were available. The Chairman stated that the suggestion would be noted.

Item 94—Sewers—Akbar lane area

Dr. E. A. Coorey desired that this matter be taken up with the road widening estimate as he desired that Torrington avenue should be included for widening next year. He moved that a sum of Rs. 24,000 be set apart for the widening of Torrington avenue and that a token vote of Rs. 10,500 be provided for the sewering of Akbar lane area. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha supported.

The Chairman explained facts and stated that while he did not consider the widening of Torrington avenue as urgent

he considered the sewering of Akbar lane area a matter of urgent necessity.

Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke again.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, November 21, 1936, at 9 a.m. pursuant to notice dated November 17, 1936.

Present.—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. K. T. S. Gurusinha, Assistant Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. C. H. Bradley; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. A. Kahaduwa; and Mr. G. Ross-Bell.

With regard to the Minutes of the Special Meeting held on November 14, 1936, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya pointed out that the names of the members who had voted against the motion proposed by him in item 5 had not been inserted. The Chairman said he thought the minutes were quite clear on the point, but nevertheless gave an undertaking that these details would be mentioned in future whenever a division was called for.

The Minutes of this Meeting and of the General Meeting of October 10, 1936, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Mr. W. Dahanayaka presented a letter from the President of the Gamini Sports Club with regard to the proposed allocation of the Esplanade grounds to the various Clubs. The Chairman said that the letter would be considered in allocation of the Esplanade grounds to the various Clubs. connection with item 11 on the agenda.

Mr. E. M. Karunaratna presented a petition from the staff of the Water Works Department asking that they be given house allowance and overtime pay. It was decided to refer the matter to the Standing Committee on Finance for

consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following question:—Will the Chairman be pleased to inquire from the Medical Department (a) whether there is any foundation for the complaints made by the public that a fly nuisance

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following question:—Will the Chairman be pleased to inquire from the Medical Department (a) whether there is any foundation for the complaints made by the public that a fly nuisance prevails at the Mahamodera Hospital in the neighbourhood of the kitchen which is said to be in proximity to the Dysentery Ward? (b) Whether any patients have contracted typhoid fever or dysentery after their admittance to the Hospital, and if so, the cause which make such a condition possible?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(a) Yes. The Provincial Surgeon informs me that a considerable number of flies are attracted at certain seasons to the Hospital from breeding places outside the premises and invade the wards and the kitchen surroundings. (b) Yes. Probably infection through the agency of these flies. Arising out of the replies given Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked, as a supplementary question, what action the Sanitation Department had taken with regard to the matter. The Chairman said he was unable to answer that question without notice.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman please call for a report from the new Shroff on the working of his department with any suggestions for improvement, and circulate this report among the members with a view to carrying out any further improvements? (2) (a) Will the Chairman please make reliable inquiries and state about how much of the recent defalcations in the Shroff's department can, and about how much cannot, be recovered through the legal proceedings that have been instituted? (b) What action does the Chairman propose to take or suggest the Council should take, so that every cent of these losses may be made good? (3) When an Assistant Chairman is appointed, will the Chairman please consult the Council on the respective duties that should be performed by the Chairman, the Assistant Chairman and the Secretary? (4) (a) What is the annual value of the New Oriental Hotel and how much is paid on i

Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded. In reply to the points raised by the mover Mr. C. H. Bradley explained that the question of enlarging and altering the design of the Hospital kitchen had already been considered, but that he understood that no action had yet been taken in the matter as Government was now considering the question of improving and altering the design of the whole Hospital, and for this purpose land has already been acquired. As regards the disposal of the sewage he was aware that this question also had been previously considered and that it was not such an easy matter as was imagined. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the Meeting and carried unanimously. (2) That the Standing Committee on Works be requested to inquire into the unsatisfactory working at the Pettigala Sump and give instructions to the Department concerned as to the proper working of the scheme. Mr. C. H. Bradley seconded, and Mr. Wahab supported, the motion. On the suggestion of Mr. Dahanayaka the mover, with the permission of Council, amended the motion to read as follows:—"That the Standing Committee on Works be requested to inquire into the unsatisfactory working of the Pettigala Sump and make recom-Working of the scheme. Mr. C. H. Bradley seconded, and Mr. Wahab supported, the motion. On the suggestion of Mr. Dahanayaka the mover, with the permission of Council, amended the motion to read as follows:—'That the Standing Committee on Works be requested to inquire into the unsatisfactory working of the Pettigala Sump and make recommendations thereon to the Council so that instructions can be given to the Department concerned as to the proper working of the Scheme.' The motion, as amended, was then put to the Meeting and carried. (3) That the Municipal Engineer be asked to make a report and an estimate for a scheme to build a concrete drain from the Pettigala Sump up to the Gangarama Temple along the present channel. The Chairman seconded. Messrs. Dahanayaka, Amarasuriya, Kahaduwa, and Karunaratna opposed the motion on the ground that the Council was considering a priority list for new drainage with a view to obtaining a fair distribution of drains throughout the town, and that it was, therefore, not in order for the Council, irrespective of that list, to sanction the construction of any particular drain. The Chairman said that the work contemplated deserved special consideration as he regarded it as a completion of the drainage Scheme which had already been proposed for the area in question. The Provincial Engineer agreed with the Chairman. The mover in reply stated that the work proposed was merely an essential part of the Pettigalawatta Drainage Scheme. The motion was then put to the Meeting and declared lost, four voting for and five against.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) This Council do submit a memorial to Government pointing out the parlous state of the Council's finances and the consequent delay in undertaking many essential works of public utility, and requesting the Government to subsidize the Council each year with a reasonable quota of the Revenue from Port dues and not from Customs duties. He agreed, however, that the Council should obtain greater assistance from Government

(4) This Council invites the immediate attention of the Registrar of Co-operative Societies to the inordinate delay in refunding moneys due to the members of the Galle Municipal Emlpoyees Co-operative Society, particularly the poor labourers among them. Mr. Wahab seconded.—Carried.

Wahab moved :—That electric current for lighting purposes be made available to Churches, Hindu kovils, and Buddhist temples at the rate of 25 cents per unit as from January 1, 1937, and that the minimum payable by each such consumer be Rs. 3 per month including meter rent. Mr. A. Kahaduwa seconded. Messrs. G. Ross-Bell, E. M. Karunaratna, and Thomas Amarasuriya opposed the motion on principle. Mr. W. Dahanayaka supported the motion but suggested that it be amended by inserting the words "bona fide places of public worship" instead of the words, "churches, Hindu kovils, mosques, and Buddhist temples."

(7) Considered the appointment of two installation and Meter Inspectors and two labourers for the Electricity Department.—Recommended that the appointment be made with effect from 1937.

(8) Considered the salary of the Park-keeper.—Recommended that with effect from October 1, 1936, the Park-keeper's salary be paid on the following scale and that he be granted a bicycle allowance of Rs. 5 per month:—Rs. 480—30—600 per annum.

-600 per annum.

(9) To write of as irrecoverable a sum of Rs. 569.75 being arrears of conservancy fees for 1935.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 569.75 be written off as irrecoverable.

- (11) Considered an application from Mr. G. S. A. P. Sahabandu, Electrical Inspector for a loan of Rs. 360 for the purchase of a car.—Recommended that a loan of Rs. 360 be granted on the following conditions:—(1) Repayment to be made in twelve equal monthly instalments and (2) interest at 2½ per cent. to be charged on the amount outstanding.

  (13) Considered an application from Overseer G. L. Hinni-Babun for an increase of salary and making his post pensionable.—Recommended (a) that he be granted an increase of salary of Rs. 12 per annum until he reaches the maximum salary of Rs. 540 per annum, the first increment to be granted with effect from January 1, 1937, and (b) that his post be made pensionable and that the period of service from his first appointment as Overseer be reckoned for pension purposes.

#### Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

- (c) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of November 2, 1936.
- (2) Considered an application from the Child Welfare Association that the Council should consider the appointment of a properly qualified and trained Public Health Nurse and that the combined grant of Rs. 2,080 which will be available in 1937, be diverted from the funds of the Child Welfare Association and put towards the cost of the Public Health Nurse. In this connection the Committee received a deputation consisting of the President and two Honorary Joint Secretaries of the Child Welfare Association.

The necessity for a fully qualified Public Health Nurse in Galle and the advisability of the Municipal Council employing its grant mainly for this purpose was discussed. The desirability of improving the ante-natal clinical work with a view to reducing infantile and maternal mortality rather than the supply of food for babies which is a Social Service

measure was emphasized.

Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka proposed:—(1) It is recommended that the Council expresses its appreciation of the good work done by the Galle Child Welfare Association since its inception and welcomes its co-operation in an auxiliary capacity; and (2) that the Council take charge of the Child Welfare work in Galle from the beginning of 1937, and utilize for the

purpose the sum of Rs. 2,580 or other sum which it was proposed to allocate to the Association in 1937.—Carried.

The Chairman proposed :—It is recommended (1) that the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services be asked to lend to the Council a Public Health Nurse on the usual terms until the Council has its own Public Health Nurse ready; and (2) that applications be called for a qualified nurse holding the certificate of Midwifery and General Nursing issued by the Medical Department, to be the Public Health Nurse at Galle, the selected applicant will be sent for training as a Public Health Nurse if not already so trained. The post to be pensionable. Initial salary not to exceed Rs. 75 a month, and allowances not to exceed Rs. 50 a month.—Carried.

### Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted with the following amendment as regards the appointment of a Public Health Nurse:—"Initial Salary not to exceed Rs. 100 a month."

- 12. The following recommendation of the Special Committee appointed to inquire into and report on the infant and maternal mortality in Galle was adopted.—Recommended the appointment of one more midwife for next year with the probability of yet another one for 1938.
- 13. Considered the following recommendations of the Special Committee apointed to report on the future development of the Galle Esplanade:—(1) With regard to applications for allocation of portions of the Galle Esplanade for playgrounds by the Galle Bazaar Buddhist School and the Sports Club of Messrs. Colin Thome & Co., Ltd., it was recommended that their applications be refused.

  (2) With regard to the claims of other clubs, it was recommended that the grounds be allocated as follows:-

## Western Portion of the Esplanade.

St. Aloysius College—Tuesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays.

Galle Police—Mondays and Thursdays.

Gamini Sports Club—Wednesdays and Sundays.

### Eastern Portion of the Esplanade.

Galle Hockey and Footbal Club—Tuesdays and Saturdays. All Saints College—Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.

Swadeshi Sports Club-Thursdays and Sundays.

The Galle Town Club to be given two days in the week on the Circus grounds.

(3) With regard to the application for a site for a tennis Court by the Public Services Recreation Club, it was recommended that it was not desirable that Tennis Courts should be laid on any part of the Esplanade grounds opposite the Ramparts.

(4) As pedestrains are now exposed to the danger of heavy traffic on the roads round the Esplanade, it is recom-

(4) As pedestrains are now exposed to the danger of neavy trains on the roads round the Esplanade, it is recommended that a pavement be constructed by the road alongside the hedge for their use.

(5) It is further recommended (1) that a pavement be constructed on the southern side of the Esplanade road from the bridge near the Railway Station to the New Gate and that a similar pavement be constructed from the New Gate to the Customs road on the Rampart side of that part of the Esplanade road; (2) that the portion of the Esplanade road referred to be super-elevated at the bend; and (3) that a row of suitable shade trees be planted on the southern side of this road as a protection for the newly grown hedge from the sea-breeze.

#### Resolution.

With regard to items (1) and (3) it was resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

With regard to item (2) it was resolved that the recommendation be adopted with effect from January 1, 1937.

With regard to items (3) and (4) it was resolved that these matters be referred to the Works Committee for consideration.

- 14. Town planning Scheme for Galle:—Resolved that if the Chairman cannot obtain an assurance from the Hon. the Minister for Local Administration that the services of the Government Town Planner will be available for Galle by July next year, the Council do make other arrangements to engage the services of a qualified Town Planner.
- 15. To fix a date for the next General Meeting and for the Special Meeting to consider finally the Budget for 1937:—Agreed that the next General Meeting be held on December 12, 1936, at 9 a.m. and the Special Meeting on the same day immediately after the General Meeting.
- 16. At the conclusion of the meeting the Chairman moved that they do place on record their sincere appreciation of the valuable services rendered to the Council by Mr. C. H. Bradley who was shortly leaving Galle on transfer. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried.

## By-laws.

1. In these by-laws—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Jaffna Urban District Council;

"the annual registration fee" means the annual registration fee to be charged under section 5 of the Ordinance; and

"the owner" of a dog means the person having custody
or possession of that dog.

2. The annual registration fee for each dog kept within the administrative limits of the Jaffna Urban District Council shall be as follows:—

For a male dog: Re. 1. For a female dog: Re. 1.50.

The annual registration fee shall be paid before May I of the year for which it is due by the owner of the dog.
4. On payment of the annual registration fee, the

Chairman shall issue to the owner of the dog-

(i.) a certificate of registration, and (ii.) a metal ticket or collar with the number of the certificate stamped thereon:

Provided that the Chairman may require the production of any dog for the registration of which an application is made, and may refuse to issue a certificate of registration and a metal ticket or collar for that dog-

(a) if that dog is not produced; or

- (b) if that dog is, in the opinion of the Chairman, so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or (c) if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by
- its owner.
- 5. The Chairman may, after notice to be left at the address of the owner of any dog for which a certificate of registration has been issued, cancel such certificate
  - (a) if that dog becomes, in the opinion of the Chairman so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or
  - (b) if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
  - (c) if that dog is permitted by its owner, at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, to associate with any other dog.
- (1) The owner of any dog, for which a certificate of registration has been refused under by-law 4 or has been cancelled under by-law 5, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce that dog at a time and place, appointed by the

Chairman, to be stated in the notice.

(2) Every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Chairman shall think fit.

7. The owner of any dog for which a metal ticket or

- The owner of any dog for which a metal ticket or collar has been issued shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the metal ticket or collar is fastened securely round the neck of that dog at all times during the period for which the certificate of registration issued in respect of that dog is in
- force.
  8. The Chairman may authorize in writing any person to exercise any or all of the power vested in the Chairman by these by-laws.
- 9. The by-laws of the Local Board of Jaffna published in Gazette No. 6,195 of July 12, 1907, and in Gazette No. 6,807 of July 14, 1916, and continning in force by virtue of the provisions of section 247 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, are hereby revoked.
