1. The regulation made under section 5 of the Holidays Ordinance, 1886, published in *Gazette* No. 7,486 of September 25, 1925, and deemed to have been made under the Holidays Ordinance, No. 1 of 1928, by virtue of the provisions of section 5 (3) thereof, is hereby rescinded.

2. The Post and Telegraph Offices in Ceylon shall, except as to the holidays set forth in the schedule hereto, be excluded from the operation of the Holidays Ordinance, No. 1 of 1928.

THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,
NO. 13 OF 1896.

REGULATIONS under section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," as amended by Ordinance No. 7 of 1897, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Talavillu for St. Anne's Festival in March, 1937.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the spaces within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, tea and coffee boutiques, eating-houses or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose, by or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

Conditions and Forms of Licences to tap, manufacture, and draw Unfermented (Sweet) Toddy.

CONDITIONS and forms of the licences to tap, manufacture, and draw unfermented (sweet) toddy, prescribed by the Governor under section 24 of the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912, in lieu of the conditions and forms set out in Excise Notification No. 256, published in *Gazette* No. 8,029 of January 26, 1934, which is hereby rescinded.

Cottager's Licence to tap, manufacture, and draw Unfermented (Sweet) Toddy.

Subject to the following conditions, the licensee _____ residing at _____ and his authorized tapper (if any) _____ residing at _____ are hereby licensed to tap, manufacture, and draw unfermented (sweet) toddy from the trees mentioned in the schedule hereto from the date hereof until the _____ day of _____, 19—.

CONDITIONS.

1. No unfermented toddy drawn under this licence shall be used for any purpose other than (a) that of manufacturing treacle or jaggery, or (b) that of consumption either by the licensee or the members of his family or by the tapper employed by the licensee to draw the unfermented toddy.

2. (1) The licensee shall mark every tree, which he is authorized to tap, with a band not less than 3 inches wide painted round the trunk of the tree at a height of 5 feet from the ground.

(2) In the case of kitul and coconut trees the band shall be of tar, and in the case of palmyra trees of white paint.

(3) The licensee shall repaint the band, or take such other measures as may be necessary to prevent it from becoming obliterated, while the licence is in force.

3. No tree shall be tapped, nor shall any unfermented toddy be manufactured or drawn therefrom, until such tree has been marked in the manner prescribed in the foregoing condition 2.

4. (1) No tree shall be tapped, nor shall any unfermented toddy be manufactured or drawn therefrom by any person other than the licensee or the authorized tapper.

(2) The licensee shall not employ a temporary substitute for the authorized tapper, unless he has first made an endorsement on the back of this licence, duly signed and dated by himself or by another on his behalf, if he is unable to write, giving the name and address and the date of commencement of the employment of the substitute, and in due course the date of termination of such employment. Provided that no such endorsement shall be deemed to be valid, and no such substitute shall be employed in pursuance thereof—

(a) after the fifteenth day from the date of commencement of such employment ; or

(b) after the licensee is informed in writing by the officer authorized to issue the licence that the substitute is for any reason unsuitable for such employment.

5. Fermentation, in any degree whatsoever, of all unfermented toddy manufactured or drawn under this licence shall be effectually and permanently prevented. The licensee and the authorized tapper may use any substance for such purpose, provided that fermentation is prevented as required above.

6. No unfermented toddy drawn under this licence shall be taken to any place other than that in which it is to be manufactured into jaggery or treacle, and all unfermented toddy taken to such place shall be taken by the shortest route possible.

7. No jaggery or treacle shall be manufactured by the licensee except in the garden called _____ in which he resides, and no jaggery or treacle shall be manufactured by the aforesaid tapper except in the garden called _____ in which he resides.

8. The licensee shall produce or cause to be produced for inspection, on demand made by any Excise Officer or by any Headman—

(1) this licence,

(2) all unfermented toddy drawn under this licence and not converted into jaggery or treacle,

(3) all unfermented toddy in the course of manufacture into jaggery or treacle,

(4) all jaggery and treacle in his possession, manufactured from unfermented toddy drawn under this licence.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. In these regulations—
“Council” means the Urban District Council of Anuradhapura.
“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council.
“public stand” means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.
2. No vehicle other than a motor cab or omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.
3. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing motor cabs or omnibuses or lorries to use a public stand and charge a fee according to the rates specified in the schedule hereto in respect of each motor cab or omnibus which uses a public stand. Such fee shall in every case be paid in advance.
4. No motor cab or omnibus or lorry, shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.
5. No motor cab or omnibus or lorry shall be parked in any public place other than a public stand: Provided, however, that any motor cab or lorry whilst engaged on a *bona fide* hire may be parked for a reasonable period in any public place other than a public stand.
6. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of omnibuses or motor cabs or lorries, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.
7. Where a public stand or any portion thereof is reserved for omnibuses proceeding to a particular destination, no omnibus other than one proceeding to that destination shall be parked in such stand or part thereof.
8. Where separate passages for entrance and exit have been provided and indicated by notice or signboard at a public stand for omnibuses or motor cabs, no omnibus or motor cab shall enter or leave that public stand except by the appropriate passage.
9. No omnibus or motor cab or lorry shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any other omnibus or motor cab or lorry entering or leaving the stand.
10. No person other than the driver or the conductor or cleaner or a *bona fide* passenger, shall remain or be allowed to remain in any omnibus or motor cab while it is parked in a public stand.
11. Throughout the period during which a motor cab or omnibus or lorry occupies a public stand, the driver or a person authorized to look after the motor cab or omnibus or lorry shall remain in charge thereof at the public stand.
12. The driver of any motor cab or omnibus or lorry occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a Police Officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such motor cab or omnibus or lorry.
13. The driver or other person in charge of any motor cab or omnibus or lorry occupying any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.
14. No vehicle shall be washed in a public stand.
15. The regulations made for the Urban area of Anuradhapura and published in *Gazette* No. 7,760 of February 14, 1930, are hereby rescinded.

BY-LAWS.

I.—Definitions.

In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- “warehouse” means any building used mainly for the storing of goods or wares by merchants or traders, but does not include a shop, boutique, or other place used mainly for the sale of goods or wares by retail;
- “workshop” means any building where any work of making, altering, ornamenting, finishing, or repairing articles or goods is carried on by manual labour for the purposes of trade;
- “factory” means any workshop where mechanical power of any kind is used.

II.—Residential Areas.

The area within the administrative limits of this Council defined in Schedule I. hereto is hereby declared to be a “residential area.”

III.—New Buildings in Residential Areas.

1. (1) From and after the date on which these by-laws come into force no new building shall be erected within a residential area, except with the written permission of the Chairman of this Council, for the purpose of being used as a factory, workshop, or warehouse or as a boutique or as tenements, or as stables, galas, cattle pens, or dairies.
(2) Such permission may be refused or withheld by the Chairman unless or until the following conditions are fulfilled, namely:—
(a) that the site selected for such building is not in close proximity to existing residential buildings;
(b) that the site selected is not situated in such a prominent place as to make the erection of the building likely to mar the amenities of the residential area;
(c) in the case of a workshop, that the business or industry for which it is to be used is not likely to create any kind of nuisance whatsoever;
(d) in the case of a shop or boutique, that the site selected will serve an area really in need of such conveniences, and that the design of the building will harmonize with the surroundings.
2. It shall be lawful for the Chairman by notice in writing to direct that an air space of not less than 7½ feet be provided between each side of any new building and the boundary on that side, irrespective of the question whether there are windows in the wall on that side of the building.

IV.—Existing Buildings in Residential Areas.

1. Within a residential area, except with the written permission of the Chairman—
(1) no building used for residential purposes at the date on which these by-laws come into force, shall be used for any other purpose whatsoever;
(2) no building used at that date for the purpose of any one of the following, namely, a workshop, warehouse, boutique, tenement, stable, gala, cattle pen, or dairy shall be used for any other of the said purposes; and
(3) no building shall be used for any of the purposes set out in the foregoing paragraph of this by-law, if at that date it was not in actual use for that purpose.
2. (1) Within a residential area no building used as a factory, workshop, or warehouse, at the date on which these by-laws come into force shall be enlarged, extended, or added to except with the written permission of the Chairman.
(2) Such permission shall be refused by the Chairman—
(a) in any case in which the building is used for the purposes of any of the dangerous or offensive trades enumerated in Schedule II. hereto; and

(b) in any case where the boundaries of the premises on which the building stands have not been registered in the books of the Council within six months of the date on which these by-laws come into force.

3. Within a residential area no building shall be used for the purposes of any of the dangerous or offensive trades enumerated in Schedule II. unless it can be shown to have been in use for such purposes on the date on which these by-laws come into force.

V.—Penalties.

The chief occupier of any building who contravenes any of the provisions of the foregoing by-laws or any owner or occupier who fails to comply with any written notice or directions given by the Chairman thereunder, shall be guilty of an offence in respect of each day during which such contravention or non-compliance continues, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for each such offence.

BY-LAWS.

1. No box, basket, package, parcel, or other article whatsoever, the external dimensions of which exceed 18 inches in length, or 12 inches in width, or 10 inches in height, shall be carried on a bicycle, except on a properly constructed carrier.

2. No bicycle shall have more than one carrier above the front wheel or more than one carrier above the back wheel, or more than two carriers in all.

3. (1) A carrier fixed above the back wheel of a bicycle shall not be more than 18 inches in length, or 15 inches in width.

(2) A carrier fixed above the front wheel of a bicycle, where such wheel exceeds 20 inches in diameter shall not be more than 20 inches in length, or 15 inches in width.

(3) A carrier fixed above the front wheel of a bicycle where such wheel does not exceed 20 inches in diameter, shall not be more than 22 inches in length or 18 inches in width.

4. Nothing in these by-laws shall be deemed to restrict the number of articles that may be carried on a bicycle in the manner hereinbefore prescribed: provided, however, that no such article shall be so placed or stacked as to project over the edge or the sides of the carrier, and that the total height of the articles placed or stacked in a carrier shall not exceed—

- (a) 12 inches, where they are carried over the back wheel;
- (b) 16 inches, where they are carried over the front wheel and the diameter of that wheel does not exceed 20 inches; and
- (c) 15 inches, where they are carried over the front wheel and the diameter of that wheel exceeds 20 inches.

5. The person liable for a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be the person in effective control of the bicycle at the time of such breach.

6. Nothing in these by-laws shall apply to a bicycle which is mechanically propelled.

BY-LAWS under section 5 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901, and section 245 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, made by the Moratuwa Urban District Council.

BY-LAWS.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch over 6 months of age which is kept within the limits of the Urban District Council, Moratuwa, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Re 1 for each such dog and Rs. 1·50 for each such bitch. For the purposes of this by-law a year shall be computed from April 1 of each year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house situated within the aforesaid limits shall, on or before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person (hereinafter called the Collector) appointed by the Chairman of the said Urban District Council to collect the registration fee, a return in the form A in the schedule hereto in respect of each dog or bitch over 6 months of age which is kept within such house or its premises.

3. The person having custody or possession of any dog or bitch in respect of which an annual registration fee is payable under by-law 1 shall be entitled to obtain from the Secretary of the said Urban District Council, on payment of the said fee to the Secretary or to the Collector, (a) a certificate of registration substantially in the form B in the Schedule hereto, (b) a tablet, which it shall be the duty of the person having custody or possession of the dog or bitch to attach or cause to be attached round the neck of such dog or bitch at all times during which such certificate of registration shall be in force.

4. Every certificate of registration so issued shall be liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the said Urban District Council should the dog or bitch for which such certificate has been issued

- (a) be found straying without a tablet; or
- (b) become so maimed or diseased as to be, in the opinion of the Chairman, unfit to live; or
- (c) be, in the opinion of the Chairman, habitually ill-treated or neglected; or
- (d) be permitted, when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, to associate with any other dog or bitch.

5. The Secretary of the said Urban District Council may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch which in his opinion is (a) so diseased as to be a source of infection to any other dog or bitch; or (b) by reason of age, illness, or injury, unfit to live. Any person dissatisfied with such refusal may appeal to the Chairman of the said Urban District Council, who may confirm, cancel, or modify the same and whose decision shall be final.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch (a) in respect of which a certificate has been refused, or (b) a certificate issued in respect of which is cancelled on the grounds hereinbefore provided, shall on being served with a notice by the Chairman so to do, produce the dog or bitch, as the case may be, at the office of the said Urban District Council at the time specified in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the said Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it, and it shall thereupon be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Chairman of the Local Board, Moratuwa, published in Gazette No. 6,337 of October 29, 1909, and continuing in force by virtue of the provisions of section 247 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, are hereby rescinded.

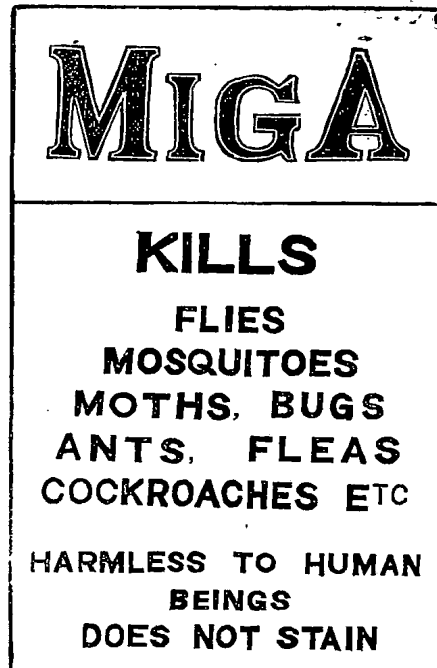

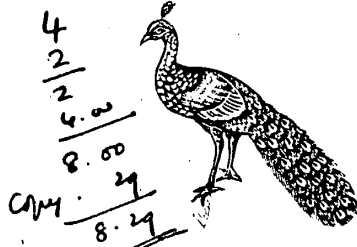

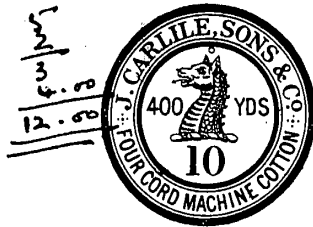
