Hospital Charges.

THE following amendments to the Hospital Charges and Regulations appearing in *Government Gazette* No. 7,788 of July 4, 1930, are hereby published for general information.

1. The provisions relating to special rates chargeable to "Police Force and Prison Officers" are hereby repealed and the following provisions substituted therefor:—

Police Force and Prison Officers.

- (a) Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors of the European Police Force will be charged only Re. 1 per diem for accommodation in a first class ward.
- (b) Families of these officers will be treated in second class wards of Government Hospitals. (or in first class wards if accommodation in second class wards is not available) on payment of Re. 1 per head per diem.
- (c) Police Sergeants and Constables and Prison Officers.— See General Order 236.
- 2. Paragraph (c) of the series of paragraphs entitled "officers entitled to Free Treatment" is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—
 - (c) Instructors of the Ceylon Defence Force will be treated free in first class wards of Government Hospitals where such exist.

Instructors' families will be treated in second class wards of Government Hospitals (or in first class wards if accommodation in second class wards is not available) on payment of Re. 1 per diem.

3. Rule 1 is hereby repealed and the following rule substituted therefor:— $\,$

Charges will be made for "Extras" not included in the scale of diets, for proprietory drugs and patent preparations, biological products and for the services of special attendants.

4. The following new rule is hereby added between rules 24 and 25:—

24A. At the General Hospital, Colombo, when an X'Ray examination is held after normal working hours, there shall be payable in addition to the charges prescribed under "Scale of charges for Paying Patients in Government Hospitals", "Scale of charges for Naval Patients" and under Rule 24 of the Hospital Charges Regulations, a fee of Rs. 2.50 per examination. This fee is payable to the X'Ray Assistant who carries out the examination.



KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 16, 1937, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated January 12, 1937.

Present:—Mr. T. A. Hodson, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Gco. E. de Silva; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meetings held on December 19, 1936, and on January 5, 1937, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and copies thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
 - The following documents were submitted:-
 - (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1935 to December 31, 1936, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's report for December, 1936.

- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December, 1936.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending January 16, 1937.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the Government Gazette.

- The following papers were laid on the table :- Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, stand pipes and house service taps inspected during December, 1936.
- 3A. Dr. Godlieb suggested that a statement of work done by the Health Visitors and Midwives should be circulated with the Medical Officer of Health's monthly report. This was agreed to.
- 4. Petitions:—Mr. Marikar presented—(1) Petition from contractor L. W. L. John, dated January 9, 1937, complaining that he was unnecessarily harassed in connection with the supply of the gate for the storage tank in Peradeniya.
- Mr. Marikar read the petition with the leave of Council and the Chairman read the Municipal Engineer's report dated January 15, 1937, on a similar petition received by the Chairman.

Resolved that a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Mr. Bradley and Mr. Marikar be appointed to inquire into the complaints made in the petition.

(2) Mr. de Silva presented—Petition from Mr. J. H. Jayasinghe dated January 14, 1937, applying for a reward for his services in bringing to the notice of the Council the existence of the tea land in the catchment area by the leasing of which the Council is about to derive a large revenue.

The Chairman agreed to consider the petition in due course.

Correspondence:—(a) Letter dated December 23, 1936, from the Commissioner of Local Government on the subject of increased taxes on dogs sanctioned by the Council for this year.

Resolved that Government be asked to amend section 5 of Ordinance No. 25 of 1901 to enable this Council to levy an annual registration fee exceeding Rs. 1.50 and that until the amendment is made the same fee as in 1936 be levied.

- (b) Letter of January 8, 1937, from the Secretary to the Minister for Health asking the Council to recommend a member of the Municipal Council for appointment as a Visitor to the Kandy Hospital.
 - Mr. de Silva moved that Mr. Soysa be recommended for appointment. Mr. Marikar seconded.—Carried.
 - 5a. Papers relating to the occupation of quarters near the Lake Spill Stores by Mr. Kaimal, Waterworks Inspector. The Chairman moved the Council into Committee to consider the matter.

In Committee the Chairman explained the action taken by a past Chairman on the complaint made by Dr. Attygall at the meeting held on December 2, 1933.

Thereafter Mr. de Silva moved: -(1) That the Municipal Engineer remove the gate and re-build the wall and recover the cost from Mr. Kaimal; (2) the question of occupation be deferred; and (3) that Mr. Kaimal should make an application for permission to use a part of the store-room as a garage for his car. Mr. Marikar seconded.—Carried.

The Council resumed and the resolution passed in Committee was adopted.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committee:-

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on October 17, 1936.

- (1) To obtain sanction to write off a sum of Rs. 1,888 96 being market space rents in arrear for periods prior to leasing in 1932, as writs obtained against defaulters cannot be enforced and some defaulters cannot be traced.—Recommended.
- (2) To obtain sanction to write off a sum of Rs. 1,777.17 due on account of market stall rents for 1930-1935, as writs obtained against defaulters cannot be enforced and some defaulters cannot be traced.—Recommended.
- (3) To obtain sanction to write off a sum of Rs. 127.63 due as part rent of grain shed and boutique at Mahaiyawa for April and May, 1934, as the defaulter has bolted.—Recommended.

Mr. Marikar mentioned that he had investigated and was satisfied that the amounts were irrecoverable.

Council thereafter resolved that the amounts referred to in items (1), (2), and (3) be written off.

7. Recommendations of Standing Committees:

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on December 19, 1936.

(1) To consider the desirability of enacting a regulation to enable prosecution of any person using a vehicle in a backlane contrary to the prohibition enforced in the notice exhibited at entrances to backlanes.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on December 19, 1936.

- (2) Papers re proposal to proclaim further areas as residential areas. (O 618).—Recommended as indicated in Municipal Engineer's plan subject to a reservation of 1 chain from Peradeniya road as non-residential in regard to Siebel's Garden area—areas to be properly defined by Municipal Engineer for purposes of proclamation.
- (3) Proposed amendment of By-law 103 so as to dispense with the requirement that a certificate of ownership of cattle brought for slaughter should be attested by a Police Vidane, Constable or other Headman of the District or division from which the animal is removed.—Recommended.

(4) Medical Officer of Health's memo. suggesting that a metered water supply should be required for all eating houses having an annual value of Rs. 300 and over.—Recommended in respect of eating houses of an annual value of Rs. 480 and over.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on December 19, 1936.

- (5) Applications from—(a) Mr. A. E. Ratnayake, Chief Clerk, Works Department, for a promotion to Grade II.—Recommended promotion as from June 1, 1937.
- (b) Mr. L. D. Lewis, Clerk to the Municipal Magistrate, claiming exemption from efficiency bar and promotion to Grade II.—Recommended exemption from efficiency bar and promotion as from January 1, 1937.
- (6) Application from Mr. C. A. Christiansz, Senior Waterworks Inspector, for a revised salary scale.—Recommended that the application be considered at the end of 1937.
- (7) To obtain sanction for the transfer of a sum of Rs. 220 from the savings on Estimate 32 for the purpose of purchasing two drinking fountains to be installed at the Public Market and Railway Approach road bus park.—Recommended.
- (8) Application from the Municipal Engineer for a supplementary vote of Rs. 500 under the Head, Water Services—"House Service Connections".—Recommended.
 - (9) Supplemental Budget No. 2 of 1936.—Recommended.

Extracts from the M inutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on December 19, 1936.

- (10) To obtain sanction for allowing a water service to premises No. 854, Peradeniya road, for building purposes.—
- (11) Applications for metered water service to the following premises:—Hill street 14A; Trincomalee street 32; road between Peradeniya road and Primrose Hill 9.—Recommended.
- (12) Application from Dr. (Miss) D. C. Hay for water services to 2 houses she is constructing at premises No. 18 Victoria Drive, to be rented at Rs. 100 each.—Recommended.
- (13) Petition dated November 15, 1936, from the residents of Watapuluwa asking for various village improvements.—Recommended to reply that Lady Anderson's road is in good condition, that no new roads can be undertaken at present and that the question of wells will be investigated.
- (14) Petition dated November 16, 1936, from the residents of Talwatta asking for various village improvements.—Recommended to build more steps at a cost of Rs. 30 and to consider further improvements including lighting later.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on December 19, 1936.

- (15) To consider the question of reduction of meter rent.—Recommended that the meter rent be reduced to 75 cents per mensem.
- (16) Municipal Electrical Engineer's letter No. P. 34/1277 of December 5, 1936, on the subject of discontinuance of public lights installed outside Municipal limits. (F. 38.)—Recommended to retain the Peradeniya Bridge lights.
- (17) To obtain approval for purchasing coloured jets and lamp holders required for use for the Coronation celebrations from Messrs. Walker & Greig, and to sanction a supplementary vote of Rs. 46 88 for the purpose.—Recommended.

Resolution of Council on items (1) to (5) and (7) to (17). Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

Resolution of Council on item (6).

Resolved that consideration be deferred and the papers be circulated.

8. To open and consider tenders received—(a) for the Rotary Balancer; (b) for Electricity Meter. Representatives of Messrs. Walker & Greig and Brown & Co. were present.

Nine tenders received were tabled. Of these, 2 tenders received later than 3 r.m. on December 1, 1936, viz. from Messrs. Volkart Bros., Bombay, and Messrs. The Colombo Electric Tramways Co., Ltd., were rejected, and were not opened.

Seven tenders were opened and scheduled by the Chairman and referred to the Municipal Electrical Engineer for report.

9. To consider tenders received for the barbed wire fence in Roseneath. (O. 206.)—Resolved that the tender of Messrs. William Bros. for Rs. 6,709 50 be accepted.

Resolved further that a vote for the amount be granted but that the expenditure should not be incurred until the lease is completed.

- 10. To obtain sanction for the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 95.81 to Suppon, latrine labourer, under section 30A of the Pension Rules. (G. 309.)—Resolved that the payment of the gratuity be sanctioned.
- 11. To consider tender received for improvement to market granaries.—Resolved to accept the tender of contractor Suwaris for Rs. 1,087 50.
- 12. To obtain a vote for the Coronation Celebrations in Kandy.—Resolved to vote Rs. 1,500 as follows:—Contribution to General Celebration Fund, Rs. 500; cost of illuminations, Rs. 500; cost of Loyal Address, Rs. 100; one day's wages to labourers, Rs. 400. The illumination scheme should include illumination of the Town Hall.
- 13. Papers re purchase of 50 ". Tylor's " water meters from Messrs. Walker & Greig.—Resolved that the purchase be approved.
- 14. Papers re tenders received for the lease of land lying to the north of the Kandy Public Market.—Resolved to invite fresh tenders after amendment of the conditions in the following respects:—(1) The Council shall have the right to revise the rent at the end of every 25 years, but any increase shall not exceed 10 per cent. of the rent of the previous period. (2) The buildings shall be erected and completed within a period of 9 months from the date possession is given. (3) Buildings erected shall not be used for shops or boutiques. Cinemas and other entertainment houses, restaurants, petrol service stations, and other similar projects will be permitted. (4) Full rent shall be payable by lessees from the date they are put in possession of the land. (5) Sub-letting of land or buildings shall be subject to the previous approval of Council in writing.
- 15. Report of the Special Committee appointed to formulate a playground scheme in Kandy. Tabled.—Resolved that the report be adopted.
- 16. Mr. de Silva drew attention to the planting of trees in the Victoria Esplanade, and the Chairman agreed to have them re-planted within one foot of the railing.

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, December 12, 1936, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated December 8, 1936.

Present:—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. K. T. S. Gurusinghe, Assistant Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. Ross Bell; and Mr. J. C. Cooper.

- 1. Before proceeding with the business on the agenda the Chairman addressed the Council as follows:---
- "Gentlemen, you are all aware that we no longer have as our King the one to whom we expressed our loyalty and allegiance in January last. It is not for me to refer to the circumstances which have rendered necessary the loss of a sovereign whom the people of Galle as the people of the whole Empire love and respect so greatly. I know that I express the feelings of this Council when I say that we have the same loyalty and devotion to his dear brother and successor who will to-day be proclaimed King George VI. As the Proclamation of the new King's accession has not yet been made in England or in Ceylon I do not propose that any resolution should be passed at this meeting of the Council."
- 2. The Minutes of the Meeting held on November 21, 1936, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.
- 3. Two petitions were presented by Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya and three letters by Mr. W. Dahanayaka. These were tabled, and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.
- 4. At this stage Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab inquired what action had been taken with regard to the repeal of the by-law and regulation prohibiting the parking of vehicles in Main street. The Chairman replied that until the by-law and regulation were repealed the Police were at liberty to take action thereunder. Mr. W. Dahanayaka then suggested that the Police be requested to suspend their activities in this direction for the present. The Chairman said that he would look into the matter.
- 5. The Chairman moved:—(a) That under section 11 of the Municipal Leave By-laws the available full pay leave of 65 days from November 7, 1936, be granted to Mr. W. Jayalath preparatory to his retirement from service with effect from February 4, 1937; (b) that in terms of Rule 2 of the Municipal Pension Minute a pension of Rs. 496 66 per annum be granted to him with effect from February 4, 1937; (c) that the vacancy be filled on the following scale of salary:—Rs. 480—48—1,200.—Carried.
- 6. To sanction the appointment of a temporary clerk in the Municipal Office pending the appointment of an Accountant:—Sanctioned at the rate of Re. 1.50 per working day with effect from December 10, 1936.
- 7. To nominate two members to serve on the Galle Municipal Education District Committee for a period of three years commencing from January 1, 1937:—Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that the two members nominated by the Council should be members of the Council provided they are willing to serve on the Committee. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.—Carried.
  - Mr. A. C. Mohammedo proposed the names of Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya and F. Magdon Ismail.
  - Mr W. Dahanayaka proposed the name of Mr. Wahab.
  - Mr. Wahab proposed the name of Mr. W. Dahanayaka.

A ballot was then taken, and the Chairman declared that Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya and F. Magdon Ismail had headed the ballot. It was accordingly resolved that Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya and F. Magdon Ismail be nominated to serve on the Galle Municipal Education District Committee for a period of three years commencing from January 1, 1937.

- 8. To submit the draft budget for 1937 as approved by the Four Standing Committees: --- Submitted.
- 9. Considered the question of appointing a Public Health Nurse for Galle:--Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that applications be invited by advertisement in the press for a qualified nurse with certificates in midwifery, Mr. Wahab seconded.—Carried.
- 10. Considered the appointment of a Tender Board to deal with tenders for the supply of stores and materials for Municipal Departments:—Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that the Tender Board should consist of the Chairman, the Provincial Engineer, and Messrs. J. E. Perera, Thomas Amarasuriya, and A. I. H. A. Wahab, with three members to form a quorum, and that this Board should function till December 31, 1937. Mr. Wahab seconded.—Carried.
- 11. To confirm the appointment of Mr. M. E. S. B. Lekamge as Chief Clerk:—The Chairman moved that Mr. Lekamge be confirmed in his appointment as Chief Clerk.—Carried.
- 12. Considered a letter from the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, requesting that necessary steps be taken to prohibit the sale of articles on certain roads within the town:—Resolved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation for consideration.
  - 13. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:-
  - (a) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Finance and Assessment of November 28, 1936.
  - (2) List of demolished buildings in Wards 3, 4 and 5A:--Recommended that the rates be struck off.
- (4) Considered a circular from the Commissioner of Local Government regarding the assessment of the railway track:—Recommended that the Commissioner of Local Government be informed that the Council favours the assessment of the railway track on the basis of train miles.
- (5) Application from Peon Alexander for an increased bicycle allowance:—Recommended the payment of an increased bicycle allowance of Rs. 5 per mensem with effect from January 1, 1937.
- (6) Considered the question of hiring out electrical appliances to householders:—Recommended with effect from January 1, 1937—(1) that electrical appliances be hired out at the following rates:—Cookers: two to four persons, Rs. 4 per mensem; three to five persons, Rs. 5 per mensem; six to eight persons, Rs. 6 per mensem; 3½ Cubic Feet Refrigerators: Rs. 10 per mensem; Two Plate-Table Cookers: Rs. 2 per mensem; Three Plate-Table Cookers: Rs. 2·50 per mensem; Plate Warmers: Re. 1 per mensem; 1½-Gallon Water Heaters: Rs. 2·50 per mensem; 5-Gallon Water Heaters: Rs. 3·50 per mensem; 5-Gallon Water Heaters: Rs. 3·50 per mensem; Thomastic Safety Cookers: 75 cents per mensem; Water or Milk Boilers: 50 cents per mensem; Hot Plates: 50 cents per mensem; Electric Ovens: Rs. 1·50 per mensem; Automatic Smoothing Irons: 40 cents per mensem; (2) that the additional connection fee for domestic power be reduced from Rs. 5 to Rs. 2·50 and; (3) that there be no minimum charge in respect of domestic appliances.
- (7) To approve in terms of By-law 9 of the by-laws relating to leave the appointment of a temporary clerk to perform the duties of Mr. W. Jayalath, Clerk, Municipal Office, who has applied for permission to retire from service:—Recommended the appointment of a temporary clerk at Rs. 1 50 per working day with effect from November 9, 1936, and until such time as the vacancy is filled.

- (8) Considered an application from the staff of the Water Works Department (excluding the officers employed at the Hiyare Reservoir) for house allowance and overtime:—Recommended that no house allowance be granted, but that with effect from January 1, 1937, overtime at the usual rates be paid to the staff of the Water Works Department (excepting the Town Overseer) in respect of work done between 6.30 P.M. and 6 A.M.
- (9) Considered an application from W. V. Ginasena regarding the rate previously tendered by him for the supply of coconuts:—Recommended that the rate be increased to Rs. 4 88 per 100 coconuts.
- (10) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation tenders for the lease of Meat Market Stall for 1937 :--Recommended that the tenders received for stalls 1, 2, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14 be accepted and as regards the remaining stalls that they be sold by public auction at the spot at an upset price of Rs. 60 for each.
- (11) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation the results of the sale of Fish Market Stalls, Offal Market Stall, Tea Boutique in the Fort, &c., for 1937 :-- (a) Fish Market :-- Recommended that the sales be confirmed. (b) Offal Market :--Recommended that the sale of the room and stalls Nos. 3 to 6 be confirmed and that no further action be taken for the present with regard to the remaining stalls for which there were no bids. (c) Tea Boutique in the Fort:—Recommended that the offer of the present lessee to renew the lease at the same rental, viz. Rs. 251 be accepted. (d) Betel Shed in the Bazaar:—Recommended that no action be taken for the present with regard to leasing it out for 1937. (e) Fruit Trees:—Recommended that the sales be confirmed.

With regard to item (6) Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted but that "refrigerators" be omitted from the list of appliances mentioned in the recommendation (1). Mr. Wahab seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item (10) it was resolved (a) that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted; (b) that the results of the sales by public auction of stalls 3, 4, 5 and 6 be confirmed; and (c) that no action be taken for the present with regard to stalls 7 and 8 for which there were no bids.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

- (b) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of November 28, 1936.
- (2) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment tenders for the lease of Meat Market Stalls for 1937:—Recommended that the tenders received for stalls 1, 2, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14 be accepted, and as regards the remaining stalls that they be sold by public auction at the spot at an upset price of Rs. 60 for each.
- (3) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment the results of the sale of Fish Market Stalls, Offal Market Stalls, Tea Boutique in Fort, &c. for 1937:—(a) Fish Market:—Recommended that the sales be confirmed. (b) Offal Market:—Recommended that the sale of the room and stalls Nos. 3 and 6 be confirmed and that no further action be taken for the present with regard to the remaining stalls for which there were no bids. (c) Tea Boutique in the Fort:—Recommended that the offer of the present lessee to renew the lease at the same rental, viz. Rs. 25 be accepted. (d) Betel Shed in the Bazaar:-Recommended that no action be taken for the present with regard to leasing it out for 1937. (e) Fruit Trees:—Recommended that the sales be confirmed.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (2) it was resolved (a) that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted; (b) that the results of the sales by public auction of stalls 3, 4, 5 and 6 be confirmed; and (c) that no action be taken for the present with regard to stalls 7 and 8 for which there were no bids.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

- 14. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council :--Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, January 16, 1937, at 9 A.M.
- 15. With the permission of the Council the Chairman moved that the services of a Lawyer be retained to assist the Council's Lawyer in the prosecution of the criminal case against the former Shroff Jamaldeen, the cost of such services not to exceed Rs. 52.50.—Carried.
- Lease of Fruit Market Stalls for 1937:—With the permission of the Council the Chairman moved :—(a) That the leases to the present stall holders be renewed for 6 months only from January 1 to June 30, 1937, at the same rentals as in 1936; and (b) that the question of rat-proofing and future leasing of the stalls be reconsidered by the Council and that the matter be referred in the first instance to the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation for early report.
  - 17. The following documents were laid on the table :-
    - (1) Progress report of works done on estimates during November, 1936.

    - Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on carriages plying for hire during November, 1936.
       Report of the Superintendent of the Electricity Department for November, 1936.

A budget containing (a) an estimate of the available income, and (b) details of proposed expenditure for the year 1937 was laid before the Council.

The Chairman stated that the budget, as presented showed a deficit of Rs. 64,887 which would have to be met from the surplus balances of the Council except in so far as the profits of the Electricity Department can be utilized.

On the suggestion of the Chairman it was agreed that the sum of Rs. 2,580 provided under vote 92 should appear under the heading "Child Welfare" instead of as a contribution to the Galle Child Welfare Association.

There being no other amendments, Mr. A. C. Mohammedo proposed that the Budget, as presented to the Council, be adopted, and that the taxes enumerated on page 9 be imposed and enforced. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded.—Carried.
