## SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

## Galle District.

Galle town comprising the area within the following boundaries:—

North: Gin-ganga from the Gintota bridge on the Colombo-Galle road up to the mouth of Aturu-ela, Aturu-ela, Koppe-ela from where Aturu-ela branches off to the bridge over that stream on the Gintota-Welipitimodera road, along the eastern side of that road to its junction with Bope road, along the eastern and thence along the northern side of the Bope road, the northern side of the Kelaganga-Kitulampitiya road and the northern side of Hirimbura road to its junction with Morris road at Matipe.

East: Morris road from its junction with the road from Hirimbura to Akmimana to the point where it meets the road to Haliwala also called Hillside road, thence along the southern side of Hillside road to the point where the Dik-ela crosses that road, thence along the Dik-ela to the point where it joins the Lunuwila-ela at its junction with Badal-ela, thence along the Lunuwila-ela to its fall into Wakgalmodera.

South: Wakgalmodera and the Galle harbour.

South-west: Sea.

West: Gin-ganga.

## Galle District.

Galle town comprising the area within the following boundaries:—

West: By the Gin-ganga.

WHEREAS by section 28 of the Courts Ordinance, 1889, as amended by section 2 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1924, it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence, or alleged crime or offence:

For the Western Circuit, four times at least in each year at Colombo and such other places in such circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such Sessions commencing at Colombo on January 10, on March 20, on July 10, and on October 10 in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Kalutara, a place included within the said Western Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Kalutara in the said Western Circuit on or about Monday, March 22, 1937.

THE PETROLEUM ORDINANCE, 1887.

RULES made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 15 of the Petroleum Ordinance, 1887, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

1. These rules may be cited as the Petroleum Service Station Rules, 1937.

2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

"dangerous petroleum" means petroleum having its flashing point below the temperature fixed by the Governor by Notification in the *Gazette* for the purposes of section 3 of the Ordinance;

"Ordinance" means the Petroleum Ordinance, 1887;

"service station" or "station" means a place constructed and equipped for the storage of any quantity of dangerous petroleum not exceeding 2,000 gallons at any one time, for the purpose of sale by retail to the public by means of pumps or in any other manner authorized by these rules.

3. Save as hereinafter expressly provided, every licence issued under these rules shall be in the form set out in the First Schedule to these rules and shall remain in force until the 31st day of December next following the date of its issue.

4. No licence to possess dangerous petroleum in a service station shall be granted by a local authority unless the station is, in respect of structure and equipment, in conformity with the conditions and requirements as to structure and equipment set out in the Second Schedule to these rules :

Provided, however, that a licence to possess dangerous petroleum in any service station which is not in conformity with the conditions and requirements aforesaid, may be issued if that service station has been specially prepared for the storage and handling of dangerous petroleum in accordance with plans and specifications which have received the prior approval of the Governor.

5. (1) The first application for a licence in respect of a new service station or in respect of a service station extended or improved for the purpose of storing an increased quantity of dangerous petroleum, shall be accompanied by plans and specifications of such station drawn to scale, and shall specify the name and situation of the station and the quantity which the applicant desires to keep therein, and in the case of an extended or improved service station, specify also the quantity kept therein under the licence in force before the extension or improvement was made.

(2) Every application for a renewal of a licence shall specify the name and situation of the service station and the quantity which the applicant keeps therein under the licence then in force, and shall contain a declaration that the station is in conformity with the conditions and requirements set out in the Second Schedule to these rules.

6. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be made not less than thirty days prior to the date on which that licence is due to expire, and where an application is so made, the applicant shall be deemed to be duly licensed and to be entitled to store the dangerous petroleum in the service station, in respect of which the application is made, until the renewal of the licence is granted or the decision to refuse the renewal is communicated to the applicant by the local authority.

7. (1) The local authority may inspect, or cause any other officer or person to inspect any service station in respect of which an application is made for a licence or the renewal of a licence, and may in his discretion grant or refuse the licence or the renewal, or issue a licence for the storage or possession of a smaller quantity than is specified in the application or in the licence then in force.

(2) Where a licence or the renewal of a licence is refused by the local authority, the reasons for such refusal shall be communicated to the applicant in writing.

8. Every licence granted or renewed under rule 7, shall be subject to the conditions set out in the Third Schedule to these rules.

9. A fee according to the following rates shall be charged for each licence or renewal of a licence to possess dangerous petroleum in a service station :—

	Rs. c.
Where the quantity to be possessed at any one time does not exceed 160 gallons ..	2 50
Where the quantity to be possessed at any one time exceeds 160 gallons, but does not exceed 500 gallons ..	5 0
Where the quantity to be possessed at any one time exceeds 500 gallons, but does not exceed 2,000 gallons ..	15 0

10. Where dangerous petroleum is stored or possessed, or is to be stored or possessed, in two or more separate service stations simultaneously by any one person, a separate licence shall be obtained by him in respect of each such service station.

11. Nothing in these rules shall be deemed to prohibit or in any way affect the possession of non-dangerous petroleum on the premises of any service station by the licensee of that station, if such licensee is also the holder of a separate licence to possess non-dangerous petroleum issued in accordance with the provisions of the Petroleum (Minor Installations and Transport) Rules, 1935.

12. (1) The holder of a licence may, at any time before its expiry, apply to the local authority for permission to transfer it to another person. The local authority, if he approves of the transfer, shall make an endorsement upon the licence to the effect that the licence has been transferred to the person named in the endorsement.

(2) A fee of one rupee shall be charged for the endorsement of each such transfer of a licence.

(3) The person to whom the licence is so transferred shall enjoy the same powers and be subject to the same obligations under the licence as the original holder.

13. Any licence issued in respect of any service station under the rules or regulations in force on the 31st day of December, 1935, may, so long as that station is in conformity with the requirements of those rules or regulations be renewed in like manner as a licence issued under these rules, notwithstanding that such station is not, in respect of structure and equipment, in conformity with these rules: Provided, however, that every licence so renewed shall be subject to the conditions set out in the Third Schedule so far as they are applicable to the service station to which the licence relates.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

##### *Form of Licence.*

Licence to possess Dangerous Petroleum in quantities not exceeding 2,000 gallons in a Service Station.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. The building or premises in which a service station is or is to be established shall not form part of or be attached to any building used as a dwelling house or any school, church, temple, market, or other place of assembly.

2. Every tank for the storage of dangerous petroleum in a service station shall—

- (a) be constructed of mild steel plates welded or well rivetted together and thoroughly caulked;
- (b) be of a capacity not exceeding 1,000 gallons;
- (c) be sunk completely underground in the position shown on the plan submitted to the local authority, the tank being packed round with sand, earth, or clay in such manner as to leave no air space round the tank below ground level and to render the tank invisible;
- (d) be provided with the equipment necessary for the reception of petroleum "under seal", that is to say, through a pipe so screwed or otherwise attached to the tank and to the discharging vehicle as to prevent effectively the escape of any liquid or vapour therefrom;
- (e) be equipped with a vent pipe leading into the open air and having its open end either covered with brass gauze 32 mesh and fitted with a hood, or fitted with an inlet valve and an exhaust valve; and
- (f) have every other opening, whether intended for use as a manhole or for the insertion of any pipe or equipment other than a vent pipe, effectively closed and secured by a cap, cover, or tap.

3. For the purpose of charging the tanks of motor vehicles the dangerous petroleum shall be—

- (a) pumped through strong metal piping by means of approved pumps into measuring tanks of a capacity not exceeding 30 gallons fixed above ground level in approved positions, and thence through sound hose, fitted with secure tap and nozzle, into the tanks of motor vehicles; or
- (b) pumped through strong metal piping by means of approved pumps into service tanks of approved capacity, fixed above ground level in approved positions, and run thence through strong metal piping into measuring tanks of a capacity not exceeding 30 gallons fixed in approved positions, and thence through sound hose, fitted with secure self-closing cock and nozzle, into the tanks of motor vehicles; or
- (c) pumped by means of approved measuring pumps, fixed in approved positions, through strong metal piping and sound hose fitted with secure tap and nozzle, into the tanks of motor vehicles.

4. All pumps, pipes, and fittings in a service station shall be of such materials and such construction as may be approved by the local authority.

5. All service or measuring tanks shall be fitted to the satisfaction of the local authority with approved overflow and emptying pipes returning to the storage tank.

#### THIRD SCHEDULE.

1. The premises of the service station shall be kept at all times clean and free from rubbish and from all articles of a combustible nature other than liquid fuel within the meaning of the proviso to section 14 of the Petroleum Ordinance, 1887, and petroleum of either kind or petroleum products the possession of which is authorized by the licence.

2. All dangerous petroleum in the service station shall be stored in metal storage tanks constructed in accordance with condition 2 of the Second Schedule to the Petroleum Service Station Rules, 1937:

Provided, however, that in order to meet cases of emergency any part not exceeding forty gallons of the aggregate quantity specified in the licence relating to any service station may be stored by the licensee in tins upon the following conditions:—

- (a) such quantity of dangerous petroleum shall be kept only in securely closed metal vessels of a capacity not exceeding two gallons;
- (b) such vessels when filled shall be kept in a storage bin constructed of concrete, stone, or brick and locked and secured except when the vessels are taken out or placed therein;
- (c) the words "HIGHLY INFLAMMABLE" shall be painted conspicuously on the storage bin in English, in Sinhalese, and in Tamil;
- (d) no other goods of any description shall be stored in or upon the storage bin;
- (e) no fire or naked light shall be kindled or lit, and no source of heat shall be allowed, within twenty feet of the storage bin unless it is effectively protected by a wall or screen;
- (f) proper means of ventilation shall be provided so as to carry off any fumes accumulating either in the storage bin or in the room or the building in which the bin is placed.
- (g) the room or building in which the storage bin is placed shall in no circumstances be used for sleeping or for any other residential purposes.

3. (1) Dangerous petroleum shall not be discharged into any storage tank in the service station otherwise than "under seal" as specified in condition 2 of the aforesaid Second Schedule.

(2) Dangerous petroleum shall not be discharged into any storage tank in the service station between the hours of sunset and sunrise except from a tank lorry in respect of which a licence to transport dangerous petroleum is for the time being in force.

4. No person shall be permitted to smoke or to light matches or to carry unprotected lights, and no inflammable goods of any kind, except petroleum, dangerous petroleum, or other inflammable oils and packing materials used in connection therewith, shall be stored inside the service station. Notices in English, in Sinhalese, and in Tamil prohibiting smoking, the lighting of matches, and the carrying of unprotected lights must be provided and fixed in prominent positions in and about the premises.

5. All operations within the service station shall be conducted under the supervision of a responsible agent or supervisor.



6. The service station shall not be kept open, and no work shall be done or permitted therein, between sunset and sunrise, unless the station is equipped with electric lighting.

7. A supply of sand, not less in quantity than four buckets each of two-gallon capacity, shall be kept ready for immediate use in a service station, for the purpose of extinguishing fires.

8. All due precautions shall be taken for preventing any person who is not authorized in that behalf by the licensee or by the local authority from having access to any dangerous petroleum or to receptacles which contain or have recently contained dangerous petroleum.

9. No fire or naked light shall be lit or kept in any part of the service station for any purpose whatsoever.

10. No person in charge of, or working in, a service station shall, unless it is reasonably necessary for a lawful purpose, commit, or permit any other person to commit, any act which is likely to cause any outbreak of fire or any explosion.

11. If the local authority, by written notice served on the licensee, specifies any repairs, alterations or improvements necessary for the safety of the service station, the licensee shall comply with such notice within such time as may be stated therein or such further time as may be allowed by the local authority upon application made by the licensee.

12. Before any storage tank in the service station is repaired, it shall be cleared of all dangerous petroleum and of all dangerous vapour arising therefrom.

13. (1) Where dangerous petroleum is supplied otherwise than by filling the tank of a motor vehicle brought for that purpose to the service station, the quantity supplied to any one person shall not exceed—

- (a) ten gallons, if that person is the registered owner, or the servant or authorized agent of the owner, of any licensed motor cycle, motor car, or motor launch; or
- (b) forty gallons, if that person is the holder of a licence to possess petroleum under section 7 of the Petroleum Ordinance, 1887; or
- (c) two gallons in any other case.

(2) For supplying dangerous petroleum under paragraph 1 of this condition no receptacle shall be used which is not constructed of metal in accordance with the following specifications as to the minimum thickness thereof:—

Where the capacity does not exceed 2 gallons	27 B.W.G.
Where the capacity exceeds 2 gallons but does not exceed 4 gallons	22 B.W.G.
Where the capacity exceeds 4 gallons but does not exceed 8 gallons	20 B.W.G.
Where the capacity exceeds 8 gallons but does not exceed 20 gallons	16 B.W.G.
Where the capacity exceeds 20 gallons but does not exceed 30 gallons	14 B.W.G.
Where the capacity exceeds 30 gallons	12 B.W.G.

#### RULE.

The Petroleum (Minor Installations and Transport) Rules, 1935, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,133 of December 18, 1935, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) by the renumbering of rule 1 thereof as paragraph (1) of rule 1, and by the addition of the following as paragraph (2) of that rule:—

“(2) Nothing in these rules shall be deemed to apply—

- (a) to the possession of dangerous petroleum in a service station that is to say, a place constructed and equipped for the storage of any quantity of dangerous petroleum not exceeding 2,000 gallons at any one time, for the purpose of sale by retail to the public by means of pumps or in any other manner authorized by the Petroleum Service Station Rules, 1937, or any other rules for the time being in force relating to such place; or
- (b) to the possession or transport of dangerous petroleum by any person in accordance with the Petroleum Special Regulations, 1937, solely for the propulsion of any motor car, motor cycle, or launch owned or used by that person;

(2) in rule 2—

The registered owner of any motor car, motor cycle or motor launch duly licensed for the time being in accordance with any written law relating to the licensing of such car or cycle or launch, or any person acting as the servant or authorized agent of such owner, may, for the purposes of the propulsion of such car or cycle or launch, possess, transport and use, without the licences required in that behalf by the Ordinance, dangerous petroleum—

(a) in the tank fitted to such car or cycle or launch in any quantity up to the maximum capacity of that tank, and

(b) in addition, a reserve supply not exceeding ten gallons at any one time, on the condition that such reserve supply shall in every case be kept or transported in vessels which are made of metal not less than 27 B.W.G. in thickness, are fitted with a faucet body and a faucet cap, and do not exceed two gallons in capacity.

3. The regulations under section 38, published by Notification in *Gazette* No. 6,062 of July 7, 1905, are hereby rescinded.

4. The regulations under section 38, published by Notification dated June 10, 1926, in *Gazette* No. 7,530 of June 11, 1926, as amended by Notification in *Gazette* No. 7,634 of March 16, 1928, shall cease to be in force on the date on which, by virtue of section 32 of the Ordinance, the Petroleum Service Station Rules, 1937, made under section 15 of the Ordinance and published in *Gazette* No. 8,275 of March 5, 1937, come into force.
