## PRELIMINARY.

These regulations may be cited as the Cheetu Regulations, 1936, and shall come into operation on April 1, 1937.

## CHAPTER I.

1 The Registrar shall not register the agreement relating to any cheetu unless the original and the duplicate of that agreement, when they are forwarded to him for registration under section 8, are accompanied—

- (a) by the security bond required by section 17, where the cheetu is promoted or formed by an individual, or
- (b) by a receipt in acknowledgment of the cash or securities deposited under section 34 and by a bond hypothecating such cash or securities to the Crown, where the cheetu is promoted or formed by a company or firm or an individual with a business name.

2 The Registrar shall not accept any security bond hypothecating immovable property for the purposes of section 17, unless the bond is duly attested by a notary and two witnesses and is accompanied by a certificate signed by an advocate or proctor to show that the person claiming to be the owner of that property has good title thereto.

3 The Registrar shall not approve for the purposes of the security required by section 17—

- (1) any immovable property in respect of which a valuation report from a Chief Headman or approved Valuer is not forwarded with the application for approval, or
- (2) any immovable property which is subject to any prior mortgage or other encumbrance, or
- (3) any immovable property other than the following :—
  - (a) any land situated within the administrative limits of a Municipal Council, Urban District Council, or Local Board and certified by the Chief Headman or approved Valuer to be suitable for building purposes ;
  - (b) any house or building or the premises thereof, situated in any area ;
  - (c) any land, estate or garden which is under regular or permanent cultivation ; or
- (4) any undivided share of any immovable property ; or
- (5) any movable property other than the following :—
  - (a) cash equal to twice the cheetu amount, deposited to the credit of the Registrar-General either in the Treasury or in a Kachcheri or in any of the Banks specified in Chapter III. of these regulations ;
  - (b) securities equal to twice the cheetu amount guaranteed by the Government of Ceylon or issued by the Government of Ceylon or of India or of the United Kingdom, deposited in the Treasury or in a Kachcheri.

## CHAPTER II.

1 No appeal by a subscriber from the refusal of a manager to accept security offered under section 18 shall be deemed to have been duly made unless the subscriber has, within ten days of such refusal, delivered or transmitted to the Registrar a statement in writing containing the following particulars :—

- (1) Name and address of the manager, or of the company or firm or individual with a business name, conducting the cheetu.
- (2) Registered cheetu number.
- (3) The Cheetu amount and number of subscribers.
- (4) The nature and assessed value of the security offered.
- (5) The amount the security is intended to cover.
- (6) The reason, or reasons, if any, given by the Manager for his refusal.

2 Every such statement shall be accompanied by—

- (a) the letter, if any, sent by the manager in refusing to accept the security ; and
- (b) such other documents as may be necessary to prove to the satisfaction of the Registrar the correctness of any of the particulars set out in the statement, including, in any case where the parties are at issue as to the value of the property offered as security, a report on the value of the property from a Chief Headman or an approved Valuer or, if the property does not exceed five hundred rupees in value, from a Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udayar.

3 The Registrar shall examine every statement delivered or transmitted under regulation 1 of this chapter, and, if he is satisfied that the subscriber has made out a *prima facie* case, issue or cause to be issued, within six days of the receipt of the statement—

- (a) a notice calling upon the manager to attend at the office of the Registrar at such time and on such date, not earlier than five and not later than twelve days next succeeding the date of the notice, as may be specified therein, and to show cause why the security tendered by the subscriber should not be accepted by him ; and
- (b) a notice calling upon the subscriber to attend at the same time and place to meet the objections that may be urged by the manager at the hearing of the matter.

4 (1) If upon the date and at the time specified in the notice, the manager appears and the subscriber fails to appear, the Registrar may hear the manager and determine the matter according as the manager rebuts or fails to rebut the case presented in the subscriber's statement of appeal.

(2) Where the Registrar in any such case makes order dismissing the appeal, the subscriber shall not be entitled to reopen the matter in any way : Provided that if in any such case the subscriber proves to the satisfaction of the Registrar, within four days of the date of the order, that his absence was due to illness or other unavoidable cause, the Registrar may, once but not oftener, relist the matter for hearing on a date not later than six days thereafter, and shall cause a notice of such relisting and of such date to be served forthwith on the manager.

(3) If on the date fixed under paragraph (2) of this regulation the subscriber fails to appear, the order made under paragraph (1) shall be final and conclusive ; and the subscriber shall not be entitled to reopen the matter in any way thereafter.

5 (1) If upon the date and at the time specified in the notice, the subscriber appears and the manager fails to appear, the Registrar may make order allowing the appeal and declaring that the security tendered by the subscriber is sufficient and should be accepted by the manager, and the Registrar shall send or cause to be sent a copy of such order by post to the registered address of the manager.

(2) If within four days of the date of such order, the manager appears before the Registrar and shows good cause for his absence on the specified date, the Registrar may relist the matter for hearing on a date not later than six days thereafter, and shall cause a notice of such relisting and of such date to be served forthwith on the subscriber.

(3) If on the date fixed under paragraph (2) of this regulation the manager fails to appear, the order made under paragraph (1) shall be final and conclusive ; and the manager shall not be entitled to reopen the matter in any way thereafter.

6 Where both the manager and the subscriber appear, whether on the date originally specified or on the date fixed for the hearing of a relisted matter, the Registrar shall hear both parties and make such order as the justice of the case may require.

7 (1) At the hearing of any matter under these regulations, any party may appear either in person or by agent duly appointed by him in writing.

(2) The failure of any party, or of his duly appointed agent on his behalf, to attend at the office of the Registrar on any date on which his attendance is required by any notice issued by or by the authority of the Registrar, shall not be deemed to be a default in appearance until due service of that notice on that party is proved to the satisfaction of the Registrar.



(3) Any notice under these regulations which is not served personally on a party, shall be deemed to have been duly served if it is sent by registered post to the registered address of that party or the address last furnished by him to the Registrar.

8 In the computation of any period of time under these regulations, Sundays and public holidays shall be excluded.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated January 27, 1937.

1A. With the permission of Council, Dr. E. A. Coorey presented a petition from Mr. John Fernando of Dickman's lane, Bambalapitiya, praying for a reconsideration of his application for a refund of the money paid by him for a water main in Dickman's lane, and requested that the petition be referred to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) for consideration and report.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey moved :—" That this Council re-asserts its opinion that Mr. J. W. Eagar, Municipal Printer, is deserving of injury allowance and respectfully requests H. E. the Governor to reconsider his decision ". Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah moved :—" This Council accepts the principle that one or more Municipal Swimming Baths should be established in the City ". Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha supported.

Mr. Aelian W. Pereira also supported and suggested that the water should be chlorinated so as to prevent skin disease among people who patronize the baths. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

Registered No. 91.—Recommended.

(5) To consider whether section 58 of Ordinance No. 20 of 1927 confers the necessary powers to make regulations for the establishment of silence zones in Colombo. Registered No. 7.—The Law Committee is of opinion that no powers at present exist in the Motor Car Ordinance of No. 20 of 1927 whereby such regulations may be made. The Committee, therefore, recommends that the Ministry be requested to obtain an amendment by adding the necessary sub-section to section 59 of the Ordinance to enable such regulations to be made.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that a Sub-Committee consisting of the Chairman, Dr. S. Muttiah, Mr. A. R. A. Razik and himself be appointed to inquire into the matter and report to the Four Standing Committees. Mr. M. L. M. Reygal seconded.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, to recommend to the Council that Mr. P. G. de Silva, Chief Playground Instructor, be retired under Rule 13 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules with the full pension for which his length of service qualifies him.

Six members voted in favour of the amendment and 6 against.

The Chairman gave his casting vote in favour of the amendment which was declared carried.

The Chairman put the amendment as the substantive motion and it was carried.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, Mr. M. L. M. Reygal, Dr. S. Muttiah, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha and Mr. A. R. A. Razik dissented from the recommendation.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committees and moved that a Special Committee be appointed to inquire into the matter and report to Council.

(Lt. Col. J. H. Stafford and Dr. E. A. Coorey left the meeting at this stage.) Mr. A. R. A. Razik seconded.

Mr. Aelian W. Pereira moved, as an amendment, that Mr. P. G. de Silva be called upon to tender an unreserved apology and that his salary be reduced by 2 increments. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded. Mr. Geo. R. de Silva supported.

The Chairman spoke and stated that he did not agree either with the substantive motion or with the amendment. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha replied.

The Chairman put the amendment of Mr. Aelian W. Pereira, to the meeting. 8 Members voted in favour of the amendment and 8 Members against. The Chairman gave his casting vote against the amendment, which was declared lost.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees viz., that Mr. P. G. de Silva, Chief Playground Instructor, be retired under Rule 13 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules with the full pension for which his length of service qualifies him, be adopted.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

The amendment was thereupon put to the meeting as the substantive motion and declared carried.

4. No body shall be buried in any grave in which any other body has already been buried, except after the following periods:—

- where such other body has been buried without a coffin, 12 months;
- where such other body has been buried in an unlined coffin of any wood other than teak or oak, 2 years;
- where such other body has been buried in a coffin of teak or oak or any other wood lined with tin or other metal, 7 years.

5. (1) For burial in a family vault which is intended to be used for further burials, the body shall be enclosed in a hermetically sealed metal coffin, and other burials may thereafter be effected in the same vault at any time, so long as there is accommodation for such burials therein.

(2) Where any body is buried in a vault other than a family vault, it shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Council, after taking into consideration the structure of the vault and the nature of the coffin used at the last burial, to prohibit the burial of any other body therein for such time as he may think necessary to ensure that such other body may be buried in a decent manner.

6. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth, or at a less distance than two feet from any other grave.

7. All graves shall be dug in regular lines and shall be properly filled in.

8. The keeper of the cemetery shall indicate the line to be followed by a funeral party arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one funeral party arrive at the same time, the order in which they are to move to their respective graves, and every funeral party shall obey such directions as may be given by him in that behalf.

REGULATIONS made by the Sanitary Board of the Kalutara District, the proper authority in that behalf, under sections 18 and 23 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, in respect of the cemeteries at Neboda and Tebuwana.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. Every application for a grave shall be made to the cemetery-keeper not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial of a person for whom the grave is wanted.

2. No person other than a person employed or approved by the cemetery-keeper shall dig a grave.

3. The cemetery-keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and where two or more funeral parties arrive at the same time, the cemetery-keeper shall decide the order in which they are to move to the respective graves.

4. For the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by any other funeral party and for no other purpose, the cemetery-keeper may require that one burial service should be concluded before the other is commenced.

5. The cemetery-keeper shall maintain order within the cemetery and every person shall obey any directions given by him in that behalf.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT NOTICES.****The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899.**

REGULATIONS made under sections 18 and 23 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, by the "proper authority", to wit, the Urban District Council of Moratuwa, in respect of the general cemeteries at Rawatawatta and Koralawella.

**Regulations.**

1. (1) All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery at least six hours before the time fixed for the burial: Provided that the Chairman of the Council may in his discretion entertain an application at any later time.

(2) Every application shall be accompanied by the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895.

2. A fee in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule to this regulation shall be paid in advance to the office of the Council and if the office be closed to the keeper of the respective cemetery for each burial or cremation in any part of the cemetery which has not been sold or set out apart by deed for the special use of any religious denomination: Provided (i.) that vagrants or unidentified persons dying in any public place or paupers shall be buried without payment of a fee on the production of a certificate

6. No grave shall be dug which is less than five feet in depth, or which is at a distance of less than four feet from any other grave.

7. Except on the orders of an authority competent to order the disinterment of any corpse, no person shall reopen (a) any grave within three years of the burial of any dead body therein; or (b) any vault within six months of any interment therein.

8. No person shall bury or cremate a dead body without the permission of the cemetery-keeper, and such permission shall not be granted until all fees due in that behalf have been paid and a report of death from the headman of the division where the death occurred is produced.

9. Except as provided in Regulation 10, the fees specified in the Schedule hereto, shall be paid to the cemetery-keeper in advance by the person making the arrangements for any burial or cremation.

10. On production of a certificate signed by a person especially authorised in writing in that behalf by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board to the effect that the relatives and friends of any deceased person are not able to pay the fee specified in the schedule hereto for the digging of a grave, the cemetery-keeper shall cause a grave to be dug and the dead body to be buried therein free of charge.
