The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920.

Orders under Sections 11, 26, and 38.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 11, 26, and 38 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Reginald Edward Stubbs, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby revoke with effect from the first day of January, 1938, the Order relating to the number of members and to the electoral divisions of the Matara Urban District Council made under sections 11 and 26 of the Ordinance, and published in Gazette No. 7,263 of June 16, 1922, and—

- (1) order under section 11 that with effect from the first day of January, 1938, the said Council shall consist of twelve members, namely, eight elected and four nominated members;
- (2) order under section 26 that with effect from the first day of January, 1938, the administrative area of the said Council shall be divided into eight electoral divisions with the local limits defined in the schedule hereto; and
- (3) order under section 38 that for the purposes of the general election of members who are to come into office on the first day of January, 1938, and for the purposes of the application of the provisions of Chapter III. of Part III. of the Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, the Orders under sections 11 and 26 hereinbefore set out shall be deemed to be operative on any date prior to the first day of January, 1938, on which it may be necessary that those Orders should be so operative.

ELECTORAL DIVISIONS.

Matara.

Division No. 1.

North.—From a point on the centre of Nilwala-ganga south-east of the centre of the mouth of Nupe canal eastwards along the centre of Nilwala-ganga to a point north of the centre of Elliott road.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards to the centre of Elliott road, and thence along the centre of the said road to the southern limit of the Urban District Council area.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban District Council area including Pareyduwa to the centre of the mouth of Nilwalaganga.

West.—From the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the centre of Nilwala-ganga including Kiralapanaduwa to the starting point of the northern limit of the division.

Division No. 2.

North.— From the northern extremity of the eastern limit of Division No. 1 eastwards along the centre of Nilwala-ganga till it meets the eastern limit of the Urban District Council area.

East.—From the last-mentioned point south-eastwards and south-westwards along the eastern limit of the Urban District Council area till it meets the southern limit of the said area.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban District Council area till it meets the eastern limit of Division No. 1.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 1 to the starting point of the northern limit of the division.

Division No. 3.

North.—From a point on the centre of Hakmana road castwards along the northern limit of the Urban District Council area to its eastern extremity.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban District Council area as far as the northern limit of Division No. 2.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the northern limit of Division No. 2 to a point south-east of the south-eastern corner of lot 85 in Town Survey Sheet No. O 25/50 1 East, thence to the said south-eastern corner of lot 85, thence north-westwards along the eastern boundary of the above-mentioned lot 85 and thence along the centre of the 1st Cross road at Uyanwatta to the centre of its junction with Circular road, thence north-eastwards and northwards along the centre of Circular road to the centre of its junction with Weragampita Cross road, thence westwards along the centre of Weragampita cross road to the centre of its junction with Weragampita road, thence northwards along the centre of Weragampita road to the centre of its junction with Uyanwatta road near the school, thence south-westwards along the centre of Uyanwatta road to the centre of its junction with Hakmana road.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of Hakmana road to the starting point of the northern limit of the division.

Division No. 4.

North.—From the western extremity of the southern limit of Division No. 3 north-eastwards along the said limit as far as the centre of the junction of Uyanwatta road with Weragampita road near the school.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the southern limit of Division No. 3 till it meets the northern limit of Division No. 2.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the northern limits of Divisions Nos. 2 and 1 to the centre of the bridge on the Main street over the Nilwala-ganga.

West.—From the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre of Main street to the centre of its junction with Broadway, thence along the centre of Broadway to the centre of its junction with Hakmana road, thence along the centre of Hakmana road to the starting point of the northern limit of the division.

Division No. 5.

North.—From the centre of the culvert on Broadway over Nupe canal eastward along the centre of Broadway till it meets the western limit of Division No. 4.

East.—From the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the western limit of Division No. 4 till it meets the northern limit of Division No. 1.

North.—From the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban District Council area south-eastwards along the said limit till it meets the western limit of Division No. 6.

East.—From the last-mentioned point south-eastwards and south-westwards along the western limits of Divisions Nos. 6, 5, and 1 to the southern limit of the Urban District Council area.

South.—From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the southern limit of the Urban District Council area to the centre of Paramulla road south of the public latrine.

West.—From the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the centre of Paramulla road to the centre of its junction with Main street, thence westwards along the centre of Main street to the centre of its junction with Seventh Cross street, thence northwards along the centre of Seventh Cross street and thence crossing Broadway northwards and north-westwards along the centre of Akuressa road to the western limit of the Urban District Council area, thence north-westwards along the said western limit to the starting point of the northern limit of the division.

Division No. 8.

North.—From a point on the north-western corner of lot 3 in Town Survey Sheet O 25/41 3 East, eastwards along the western limit of the Urban District Council area to the centre of Akuressa road.

East.—From the last-mentioned point south-eastwards, southwards, and south-westwards along the western limit of Division No. 7 to the southern limit of the Urban District Council area.

The Chairman, when specially empowered thereto by resolution of the Board, may, by a notice in writing served on the owner or occupier of any premises, require such owner or occupier to close any cesspit that may be situated on the premises and substitute for such cesspit a dry-earth closet of such size and type, and in such a position on the premises, as may be approved by the Chairman.

2. Every owner or occupier on whom a notice is served under regulation I shall duly comply with the requirements of such notice within such time, not less than one month,

as may be specified in such notice.

3. The Chairman may give permission in writing to the occupier of any premises on which a dry-carth closet has been built, to have night soil from such premises buried, or otherwise disposed of on such premises. Such permission may be revoked at any time by the Chairman.

4. Every occupier of premises on which a dry-earth closet has been built, other than an occupier who has been granted the permission referred to in regulation 3, shall cause the night soil from such premises to be removed daily to a depot, appointed by the Board, for the disposal of the night soil.

5. (1) Where the occupier of any premises employs the services of a conservancy labourer of the Board for the

removal of night soil from such premises, such occupier

shall pay to the Board a conservancy fee of one rupee per month for each bucket in which such night soil is deposited.

(2) The conservancy fee shall be paid to the Chairman on or before the 10th day of the month immediately following that for which the fee is due.

6. (1) Where the occupier of any premises employs any person other than a conservancy labourer of the Board for the removal and disposal of night soil from such premises, such occupier shall register, at the office of the board, the name of the person so employed by him.

(2) No occupier referred to in paragraph (1) of this regulation shall without the permission in writing of the

- (a) use any place, other than a depot referred to in regulation 4 for the disposal of night soil; and (b) dispose of night soil in any manner which has not

(b) How many witnesses have made this allegation? (c) Will the Chairman please give the figures month per month from January to December, 1936, showing the revenue collected by each of the clerks employed at the Fish Auction Shed? (d) Do not these figures together with the allegation referred to above make one suspect that the clerk in question has been systematically embezzling the funds of the Council? (c) Is the Chairman aware that the clerk in question has been systematically embedding the funds of the Council? (c) Is the Chairman aware that this clerk, before he was taken on to the service of the Council, had been dismissed for dishonesty from two posts which he had held? (f) Is the Chairman as the chief custodian of the ratepayers money justified in retaining the services of this clerk a day longer? (g) Will the Chairman please investigate into the system of work at the Fish Auction Shed with a view to eliminating the chances of embezzlement that are undoubtedly present to-day under the existing arrangements of work? (6) (a) Is the Chairman aware that there have been several authenticated letters in the "Observer", "Daily News", and "Dinamina", complaining bitterly against the behaviour of the Police at the Passengers' Jetty on December 5 on the occasion of the Emden's visit to Galle? (b) Is the Chairman aware that the complaints are to the effect that the Police violently pushed ladies and children out of the Passengers' Jetty and permitted their friends and high officials only to make use of the Jetty? (c) As other cruisers are likely to visit Galle in the near future and as the good name of the town for courtesy and fair play rests chiefly with the Council, will the Chairman please get into communication with the Police and ensure more satisfactory arrangements on such occasions in the future?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) and (b) This is a matter which directly concerns the Child Welfare Association. At my request, however, the Honorary Secretary of the Association has submitted a report, approved by the Committee of the Association, detailing the facts of the case referred to, and a copy of this report is tabled. (c) I do not consider a question worded in this manner deserving of an answer. (2) (a) The Public Health Nurse employed by the Child Welfare Association does make such a statement in her diary for October 20, 1936. (b) No action was taken by me. (3) The Medical Officer of Health reports that the first batch of fleas was sent up for identification in November last year. Out of a total of 168 fleas identified only one Cheopis (Plague flea) was found. These fleas were obtained from the rats caged and destroyed in various parts of the town. Proposals for the future will depend on the full summary of the results when the survey has been completed. (4) (a) No, as it is not possible to get tenders in advance for the possible feeding of contacts of whom there may be none in a year. (b) The practice has been for the Medical Officer of Health to obtain raw materials on the spot from sundries boutiques paying the suppliers at the rate of 15 cents for morning tea, 20 cents for the mid-day meal, and 20 cents for the evening meal for each adult and half these amounts for a child under 12. The contacts have always desired that raw materials be given to them so that each family might do its own cooking. (c) This question does not arise. (5) (a) to (d) and (f) An inquiry into the matter is being held by the Assistant Chairman, and I am therefore, not in a position at present to answer these questions. The report of the Assistant Chairman will be available to the members in the course of next week. (e) No. (g) The question as to whether such an investigation is necessary will depend on the report of the Assistant Chairman who will no doubt comment on the present system of work at the Fish Auction Shed. (6) (a) I have been informed that there were some letters in the newspapers mentioned. (b) No. (c) I am not aware that other cruisers are likely to visit Galle in the near future. The matter complained of is not one to be dealt with by this Council. The Superintendent of Police is the one to whom any aggrieved person should have made his complaint.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) That this Council earnestly appeals to the Ministry of Education to exhibit the regalia of the Sinhalese Kings at Galle; a deputation of the Council do wait upon the Hon. the Minister of Education in this connection. (2) Resolved to refer the matter to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works to recommend how the resolution can best be given effect to.

(3) That this Council invites the attention of the Hon. the Minister for Communications and Works to the great need for an approch road to the Railway Station at Richmond Hill. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded and Mr. E. M. Karunaratna upported the motion which was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.









