RULE.

The rules relating to Money Orders and Postal Orders published in *Gazette* No. 6,408 of October 28, 1910, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,202 of February 14, 1936, are hereby further amended by the substitution, for rule 5 thereof, of the following new rule:—

"5. The charge for a Telegraph Money Order in addition to the usual rate of commission on an ordinary Money Order shall be—

Inland, Indian, and Burmese Telegraph Money Orders.—

(1) The cost of the telegram of advice calculated at the current rates for Inland, Indian, or Burmese telegrams as the case may be.

(2) A fixed fee of 10 cents irrespective of the amount of the order.

Foreign Telegraph Money Orders (other than Indian and Burmese).—The cost of the telegram of advice calculated at the current rates for Foreign telegrams."

CODE OF REGULATIONS FOR ASSISTED ENGLISH SCHOOLS.

THE following amendments to the Code of Regulations for Assisted English Schools, which have been approved by the Board of Education, are hereby published for general information in accordance with section 10 (2) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

Clause 12.—In line 7 after the number "20" add "pupils of the same denomination as the managing body".

Clause 23.—Delete the words "save in exceptional circumstances three years".

Appendix A.—Delete footnote (g) and substitute the following:—

(g) The salary scales in the above schedule for teachers holding Commercial or 1st Class Drawing Certificates will be assessed for grant only for such teachers who are employed in teaching their special subjects for not less than 15 hours per week and whose appointments as specialist teachers in these subjects have been approved.

In schools having no registered commercial class, the salary scales for commercial teachers will not apply.

CODE OF REGULATIONS FOR ASSISTED VERNACULAR AND BILINGUAL SCHOOLS.

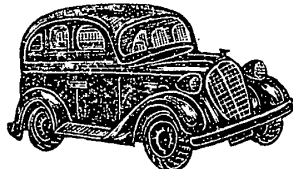

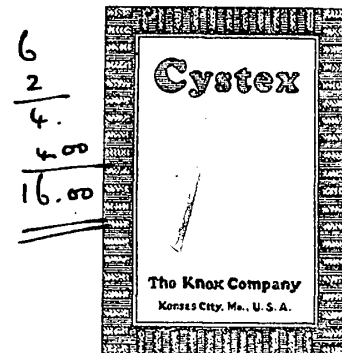
