THE REGISTERED STOCK AND SECURITIES ORDINANCE, NO. 7 OF 1937.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 55 of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance, No. 7 of 1937.

REGULATIONS.

- Short title. 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Registered Stock and Securities Regulations, 1937.
- Interpretation. 2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
- "Ordinance" means the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance, No. 7 of 1937;
- "proper demand" means a request in writing made to the Registrar in accordance with these Regulations;
- "Public Debt Office" means the office of the Registrar at the Treasury in Colombo;
- "Registrar" includes any officer to whom any of the powers or duties of the Registrar under the Ordinance or under these Regulations has been delegated under the provisions of section 48 (2) of the Ordinance.

Registered Stock.

3. The register of stock in respect of each issue of registered stock under the Ordinance shall be kept at the Public Debt Office.
4. The Registrar shall enter upon the register of stock the full name, address, and description of every stockholder and the amount of registered stock held by him.
5. (1) No stockholder shall transfer any registered stock except in an amount which is of the nominal value of one hundred rupees or of a multiple of one hundred rupees.
- (2) In the event of a transfer of the whole or any part of any registered stock held by a stockholder, the Registrar shall issue to the transferee a stock certificate or certificates of the same nominal value as that of the amount of stock transferred, and to the transferor a stock certificate or certificates of the same nominal value as that of the balance amount of that stock, if any:
- Provided that on application made to him in that behalf, the Registrar may notwithstanding the provisions of regulation 6—
- (a) issue to the transferee a security or securities of the same nominal value as that of the amount of stock transferred;
- (b) issue to the transferor a security or securities of the same nominal value as that of the balance amount of that stock, if any.
- (3) No stock certificate or security shall be issued to any person under paragraph (2) except upon payment of a fee of one rupee in respect of each stock certificate or security to be so issued.
6. No registered stock shall be exchanged for securities under the provisions of section 41 of the Ordinance—
- (a) unless the form of receipt appearing on the back of the stock certificate relating to that stock is signed by the stockholder and the certificate surrendered to the Registrar;

Register of stock.

Entries on register.

Conditions of transfer of stock.

Conditions of exchange of stock for securities.

- (b) except upon payment of a fee of one rupee in respect of each security to be issued in exchange for that stock.

7. (1) Upon the surrender to the Registrar of any stock certificate or certificates for the purpose of the consolidation or subdivision of any registered stock under section 42 of the Ordinance, the form of receipt appearing on the back of such certificate or certificates shall be signed by the stockholder.

Conditions of consolidation or subdivision of stock.

(2) No new stock certificate shall be issued upon the consolidation or subdivision of any registered stock except upon the payment of a fee of one rupee in respect of each certificate to be so issued.

8. (1) Every application for the issue of a duplicate stock certificate under the provisions of section 36 of the Ordinance shall be accompanied by an affidavit of the applicant stating—

Conditions of issue of duplicate stock certificate.

- (a) that he is the registered holder of the stock to which the certificate relates ;
 (b) that he is not in possession of that certificate ;
 (c) that he has not executed any deed of transfer of the stock to which that certificate relates, and has not hypothecated the stock as security for any purpose whatsoever ; and
 (d) the circumstances in which the stock certificate was lost, stolen, or destroyed.

(2) No duplicate stock certificate shall be issued until the publication, at the cost of the applicant for such certificate, in one issue of the *Gazette*, of a notification in the following form of the loss, theft, or destruction of the original certificate :—

Lost or Stolen or Destroyed

Stock Certificate No. _____ of the Government _____ per cent. loan _____ for Rs. _____ issued in the name of _____ having been lost or stolen or destroyed, notice is hereby given that payment of interest on the stock to which that certificate relates has been stopped by the Registrar, and that application is about to be made to the Registrar for the issue of a duplicate stock certificate in the above-mentioned name.

The public are warned against entering into any transaction of any kind in relation to the above-mentioned stock certificate.

(3) No duplicate stock certificate shall be issued to any person until the expiry of a period of six months from the date of the publication of such notification.

(4) No duplicate stock certificate shall be issued except upon payment of a fee of two rupees.

9. (1) On a proper demand made by a person in whose name any stock is registered, or to whom any registered stock is to be transferred, or who desires to be entered as the proprietor of any registered stock in exchange for securities held by him, that he may be described in the register of stock as a trustee, whether as a trustee of a trust specified in the demand or as a trustee without any such qualification, the Registrar may make such entries in the register of stock, and in any stock certificate issued to such person, as he considers reasonably necessary for the purpose of complying with the demand.

Recognition of trusts.

(2) If the demand is made by a person in whose name stock is registered or by a person to whom stock is to be transferred, the stock certificate shall be transmitted to the Registrar with the demand.

(3) Where any instrument of transfer, power of attorney, or other document purporting to be executed by a stockholder described in the register of stock as a trustee is produced to the Registrar, the Registrar shall not be concerned to inquire whether the stockholder is entitled under the terms of the trust to give any such power or to execute such instrument or other document, and may act on the instrument of transfer, or power of attorney, or document in the same manner as though the stockholder had not been so described, and whether the stockholder is or is not described in the instrument of transfer, power of attorney, or document as a trustee, and whether he does or does not purport to execute the instrument of transfer, power of attorney, or document in his capacity as a trustee.

10. Subject to the provisions of section 13 of the Ordinance, the interest due on any registered stock shall be paid on interest warrants to be issued by the Registrar to the registered stockholder or to any person to whom the stockholder has by a request duly made to the Registrar in the form set out in Schedule A authorized the Registrar to issue such warrant.

Interest on registered stock.

Promissory Notes.

11. No promissory note shall be exchanged for registered stock under the provisions of section 41 of the Ordinance unless—

Conditions of exchange of note for stock.

- (a) the note is duly indorsed by the holder in favour of the Registrar ; and
 (b) a fee of one rupee is paid in respect of each stock certificate to be issued in exchange for the note.

12. No promissory note or notes shall be subdivided or consolidated under the provisions of section 42 of the Ordinance unless—

Conditions of consolidation or subdivision of notes.

- (a) the note or each of the notes is duly indorsed in favour of the Registrar ; and
 (b) a fee of one rupee is paid in respect of each promissory note to be issued in place of such note or notes.

13. (1) The Registrar may direct the holder of a promissory note to apply for a renewal of that note in any of the following cases :—

Registrar's power to direct application for renewal of notes.

- (a) where no space is available on the back of the note for more than one further indorsement ; or
 (b) when any word is written across any existing indorsement or indorsements ; or
 (c) where the note is torn, or in any way damaged, or crowded with writing, or in the opinion of the Registrar, unfit for any further indorsement ; or
 (d) where any indorsement is not clear or distinct, or does not indicate the payee or payees, as the case may be, by name or in the case of an office-holder, by office, or is made otherwise than in one of the spaces provided on the back of the note for indorsements ; or
 (e) where the cages provided on the back of the note for entries relating to the payment of interest have been completely filled ; or
 (f) where the title of the person presenting the note to the Registrar for examination is, in the opinion of the Registrar, irregular, or not proved to his satisfaction.

(2) No promissory note shall be issued in renewal of a note except upon payment of a fee of one rupee : Provided that no fee shall be payable if the holder of a note has been required to renew it under the provisions of paragraph (1) (e).

Payment of Interest on Promissory Notes.

14. (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2), the interest due on any promissory note shall be paid on interest warrants to be issued by the Registrar after the holder has tendered the note to the Registrar for examination.

The Registrar may for the purpose of such examination retain any note so tendered for a period of five clear working days before issuing an interest warrant in respect of that note.

(2) Where the Registrar has in accordance with section 25 of the Ordinance made arrangements for payment of any interest due on any promissory note through the agency of any Bank in India, the holder of the note shall present it for examination and payment of interest at such Bank.

Conditions of Issue of Duplicate Promissory Notes.

Application for duplicate promissory note.

15. Every application for the issue of a duplicate note in place of a promissory note which is alleged to have been lost, stolen, or destroyed, either wholly or in part, shall be addressed to the Registrar and shall be accompanied by—

(a) a statement of the following particulars :—

- (i.) the number and value of the note and particulars of the loan in respect of which it was issued ;
- (ii.) the last half-year for which interest has been paid ;
- (iii.) the person to whom such interest was paid ;
- (iv.) the person in whose name, if known, the note was issued ;
- (v.) the circumstances attending the loss, theft, or destruction ; and

(b) a statement whether complaint of the loss or theft was made to the Police ; and

(c) the Post Office registration receipt for the letter containing the note, if the note was lost in transmission by registered post ; and

(d) an affidavit of the applicant stating that he—

- (i.) is the last legal holder of the note which has been lost, stolen, or destroyed ;
- (ii.) is not in possession of the note ; and
- (iii.) has not transferred the note to any other person or hypothecated it as security for any purpose whatsoever ; and

(e) any portions or fragments which may remain of the lost, stolen, or destroyed note.

Loss, &c., of promissory note to be notified in Gazette.

16. No order shall be made under section 37 of the Ordinance for the issue of a duplicate promissory note until the publication, at the cost of the applicant for such duplicate, in three successive issues of the *Gazette*, of a notification, in the following form, of the loss, theft, or destruction of the original note :—

Lost or Stolen or Destroyed

The Government Promissory Note No. — of — the — per cent. — loan for Rs. — ; originally standing in the name of — and last indorsed to — by whom it was never indorsed to any other person, having been lost or stolen or destroyed, notice is hereby given that payment of the above note and of interest thereon has been stopped by the Registrar, and that application is about to be made to the Registrar for the issue of a duplicate note in the name of the last indorsee.

The public are warned against purchasing or otherwise dealing with the above-mentioned promissory note.

Order for issue of duplicate note, &c.

17. (1) After due publication of the notification in accordance with the provisions of the last foregoing regulation, the Registrar, if satisfied of the loss, theft, or destruction, as the case may be, of the promissory note, and of the justice of the applicant's claim, shall cause the particulars of the note to be included in a list as provided in the next following regulation, and, subject to the provisions of section 44 of the Ordinance, shall—

(a) if only a portion of the note has been lost, stolen, or destroyed, and if a portion sufficient for the identification of the note has been produced, make order that a duplicate note shall be issued to the applicant six months after the date of the first publication of the said list ; or

(b) if no portion, or no portion sufficient for the identification, of the note has been produced—

(i.) make order that there shall be paid to the applicant two years after the date of the first publication of the said list, the interest upon the note so lost, stolen, or destroyed, pending the issue of a duplicate note ; and

(ii.) make order that a duplicate note shall be issued to the applicant on the expiry of a period of six years after the date of the first publication of the said list : Provided that if the due date for repayment of the note alleged to have been lost, stolen, or destroyed, falls within the said period of six years, the amount of the note shall not be paid to the applicant until the expiry of the said period.

(2) No duplicate promissory note shall be issued to any person under paragraph (i.) except upon payment of a fee of two rupees.

List of notes in respect of which orders have been made for issue of duplicate notes.

18. (1) The Registrar shall cause to be published in the *Gazette* in the months of January and July in each year, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, a list of the notes in respect of which any order has been made under the last foregoing regulation.

(2) Every note the particulars of which are included in any list published in accordance with paragraph (1), shall be included in every such list published thereafter, until the expiration of six years from the date of the publication of the list in which that note was first included.

(3) Every list published in accordance with paragraph (1) shall be in the form set out in Schedule B.

Registrar may cancel or vary order under regulation 17 (1) (b) (ii.).

19. Where the Registrar has made an order for the issue of a duplicate note under the provisions of regulation 17 (1) (b) (ii.), he may at any time, if satisfied for any reason that such order should be cancelled or varied, cancel or vary such order or direct that the duplicate note shall not be issued until the expiry of such further period not exceeding six years, as he may think fit.

Miscellaneous Provisions.

Payments in respect of stock or securities held by minors or lunatics.

20. Any sum not exceeding five thousand rupees payable by way of interest or as principal in respect of any registered stock or security standing in the name of or held by a minor or lunatic may be paid to any person who is, in the opinion of the Registrar, a fit and proper person to receive such sum on behalf of the minor or lunatic.

Application for information.

21. (1) Where any application is made to the Registrar by any person for permission to inspect, or for any information to be derived from, any register, book, or other document relating to any stock or security

and kept in the Public Debt Office, the Registrar may, subject to the provisions of paragraph (2), grant such permission or furnish such information to such person if he is satisfied that the application is made in good faith and that such person has an interest in such stock or security.

(2) A fee of one rupee shall be payable to the Registrar—

- (a) for information furnished to any person in respect of any stock or security ;
- (b) for each certified copy issued to any person of any entry in any register, book or other document kept in the Public Debt Office.

Interest.—Interest on the loan at the rate of $3\frac{1}{4}$ per cent. per annum will be payable half-yearly on the 15th day of May and the 15th day of November in each year, the first full six months' interest being payable on May 15, 1938.

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO REGISTERED STOCK.

Registration.—The full name, address, and description of every holder of registered stock, and the amount of stock held by him, are entered in a register kept at the Public Debt Office of the Treasury, and a certificate of registration, known as a Stock Certificate, is issued to each stockholder to the effect that he has been registered as the proprietor of a certain amount of stock.

Payment of Interest.—Interest on registered stock will be paid half-yearly by means of interest warrants, which will be issued by the Public Debt Office, without any action on the part of the stockholder. On the day before the due date for payment of interest, an interest warrant will be posted to the address given by the stockholder in the form of application, transfer, &c. If payment is desired to be made at some other address or to some other person, bank or firm on his behalf, an "interest request form" obtainable at the Public Debt Office should be completed by the stockholder and forwarded to the Office when the interest warrant will be posted to the address or to the person, bank, or firm named in the "interest request form". In the case of joint stockholders, the interest warrant will be

made out in the name of the stockholder whose name first appears on the register, unless either the Registrar has reason to believe that such first named person is dead or under legal disability or "an interest request form" has been received from him desiring payment to be made to some other person.

N.B.—Stockholders who do not receive the interest warrant on the day on which it is due should notify the Registrar without delay.

Cashing of Interest Warrants.—Interest warrants may be presented in person or sent by post or through a Bank for payment at the General Treasury, or at any Kachcheri, or by the Crown Agents for the Colonies in London. In India interest warrants will be cashable at any of the Branches of the Imperial Bank at par without deduction.

Transfers or Sales.—Stock certificates are not negotiable by endorsement. A sale or transfer of stock (which must be made in sums of Rs. 100 or multiples of Rs. 100) can be effected only by means of an instrument of transfer signed by the transferor and the transferee and forwarded to the Public Debt Office along with the relevant stock certificate duly receipted in the form shown on the back of the certificate. The instrument of transfer is merely a printed form, copies of which can be obtained at the Public Debt Office, and does not require to be stamped. When the transfer has been registered at the Office the transferee will receive a stock certificate for the amount transferred and the transferor a new stock certificate for the balance, if any. If the transferee and the transferor so desire promissory notes will be issued in place of the new stock certificates.

Consolidation, Sub-division and Exchange.—Stock certificates can be consolidated or sub-divided at any time at the option of the stockholder, subject to the condition that each new certificate is for Rs. 100 or a multiple of Rs. 100. Stock certificates can also be exchanged at the option of the stockholder for promissory notes. When it is desired to consolidate, sub-divide or exchange, an application in the proper form, which is obtainable at the Public Debt Office, should be made to that Office accompanied by the relevant stock certificate or certificates, duly receipted in the form shown on the back of the certificate.

Loss of Stock Certificate.—A duplicate stock certificate in place of one lost, stolen, or destroyed, will be issued only after satisfactory evidence has been produced that the stock certificate has actually been lost, stolen, or destroyed and after the lapse of six months from the date of publication in the *Gazette* of a Notification of the loss. In certain circumstances an indemnity bond may be required from the applicant. In the event of loss or destruction of a stock certificate, the fact should immediately be notified to the Registrar, who will direct what steps the applicant should take before a duplicate certificate can be issued to him.

Fees.—The following are the prescribed fees :—

- (i.) for transfer, consolidation, sub-division and exchange—Re. 1 for each new Stock Certificate or Promissory Note to be issued ;
- (ii.) for duplicate certificate—Rs. 2 for each certificate.

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO PROMISSORY NOTES.

Promissory Notes, which are issued in fixed denominations of Rs. 100, Rs. 200, Rs. 500, Rs. 1,000, Rs. 5,000, Rs. 10,000, Rs. 50,000, and Rs. 100,000, contain a promise by the Government to pay to the holder a specified sum on a specified date, and to pay interest thereon at a certain rate half-yearly up to that date.

Payment of Interest.—Interest on promissory notes will be paid half-yearly by means of interest warrants which will be issued by the Public Debt Office after the holder has tendered his note for examination. A period of 5 clear working days will ordinarily be required for examination of notes and issue of interest warrants, but to avoid delay holders should as far as possible send in their notes for examination at least 15 clear days before the due date for payment of interest. Notes may be tendered for examination to the Public Debt Office either in person or through the post, and acknowledgments should be obtained from the Office for all notes tendered for examination. If the note is found to be in order after examination an interest warrant will be made out in favour of the last holder appearing on the note when tendered for examination.

Delivery of Interest Warrants.—The due date for delivery of interest warrants (which will be 5 clear working days after the note has been tendered for examination or the day before the due date for payment of interest, whichever is later) will be mentioned in all acknowledgments issued by the Public Debt Office when notes are tendered for examination. Where notes have been sent for examination by post, the interest warrant, together with the promissory note or notes, will on the due date for delivery of the interest warrant be posted to the address of the last holder given in the spaces provided for that purpose on the back of the note. Where notes are tendered for examination in person, the holder should on the due date for delivery of the interest warrant present the acknowledgment at the Public Debt Office when the interest warrant and the promissory note or notes will be handed over to him.

N.B.—Holders who do not receive the interest warrant on the day on which it is due for delivery or on the day following should notify the Registrar without delay.

Cashing of Interest Warrants.—Interest warrants may be presented in person or sent by post or through a Bank for payment at the General Treasury, or at any Kachcheri, or by the Crown Agents for the Colonies in London. In India interest warrants are cashable at any of the Branches of the Imperial Bank at par without deduction.

Enfacement of Notes.—For the convenience of holders in India, promissory notes will at the request of such holders be enfaced for payment of interest at the Imperial Bank of India at Calcutta, Bombay, or Madras. This means that notes so enfaced may be tendered for examination and payment of interest at the Bank instead of being sent to the Public Debt Office at Colombo.

Transfers or Sales.—Promissory notes are transferable free of stamp duty by endorsement, spaces for which are printed on the back of each note. The following precautions should be observed in regard to endorsements :—

- (a) no endorsement should be made otherwise than on the note itself ;
- (b) every endorsement must be written clearly and legibly in one of the endorsement cages ;
- (c) an endorsement should be made in proper and valid form—
" Pay to ————— (or order), " and signed by the lawful owner of the note or by the person legally qualified to dispose of the note ;
- (d) all cancellations, alterations, and erasures must be duly authenticated.

N.B.—If any doubt arises as to the ownership or validity of a promissory note, it is always possible for the holder to have it renewed at the Public Debt Office.

Renewal.—A promissory note may be renewed,

- (a) if no room remains on the back of the note for more than one further endorsement, or
- (b) if the cages provided on the back of the note for entries relating to payment of interest have been completely filled, or
- (c) if the note is mutilated, or torn, or in any way damaged or defective, or
- (d) for any other sufficient reason, either at the instance of the Registrar or of the holder.

Application for renewal should be made on the proper form, obtainable at the Public Debt Office, and should be accompanied by the relevant promissory note duly endorsed in favour of the Registrar, Public Debt Office.

Consolidation, Sub-division and Exchange.—Promissory notes can be consolidated or sub-divided at any time at the option of the holder, subject to the condition that the new notes will be in the usual denominations. Promissory notes can also be exchanged at the option of the holder for stock certificates. When it is desired to consolidate, sub-divide or exchange, an application in the proper form, obtainable at the Public Debt Office, should be made to that Office accompanied by the relevant promissory note or notes, duly endorsed in favour of the Registrar, Public Debt Office.

Loss of Promissory Notes.—A duplicate promissory note in place of one lost, stolen or destroyed can be obtained only after satisfactory evidence has been produced that the note has actually been lost, stolen or destroyed. The circumstances in which duplicate notes will be issued and the procedure to be followed are set out in the regulations framed under the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance. In the event of loss or destruction of a promissory note the fact should immediately be notified to the Registrar, who will direct what steps the applicant should take before a duplicate note can be issued to him.

Fees.—The following are the prescribed fees :—

- (i.) for renewal, consolidation, sub-division and exchange—Re. 1 for each new Stock Certificate or Promissory Note to be issued, except in the case of a renewal when all the interest cages have been filled when no renewal fee is payable ;
- (ii.) for duplicate notes—Rs. 2 for each note.

*Excise Notification No. 313.***General Description of Licences to manufacture—****(I.C.) Country Made 'Foreign' Spirits from Spirits distilled from the Coconut or any of its Products other than Toddy.**

IT is hereby notified that Excise Notification No. 218 published in *Gazette* No. 7,845 of April 17, 1931, as amended by Excise Notification No. 295 published in the *Gazette* No. 8,256 of November 13, 1936, is, with the approval of the Governor, amended from the date hereof, by the addition of the following paragraph after paragraph I.B. thereof:—

"I.C. Licence to Manufacture Country Made 'Foreign' Spirits from spirits distilled from the coconut or any of its products other than toddy.—

This licence may be granted, subject to the approval of the Excise Commissioner, by the Government Agent to holders of bottling and wholesale licences for the manufacture of country made 'foreign' spirits on payment of a fee of Rs. 500 for the 12 months ending September 30, or Rs. 250 for any period commencing after April 1, but ending September 30 in any year. This licence differs from the ordinary licence to manufacture country made 'foreign' spirits, referred to in item 1A in respect of (a) the higher fee payable, and (b) the fact that it is a licence both to distil and to manufacture, the spirit used as a base being distilled from the coconut or any of its products other than toddy."

Preliminary Report on the Vital Statistics of Ceylon, 1936.

(N.B.—Figures are subject to revision.)

THE main features of the Vital Statistics of 1936, are as follows :—

- the marriage rate, 10·2, is considerably higher than the rate for 1935 ;
- the birth rate, 34·1, is the lowest after 1912 ;
- the death rate, 21·8, is one of the lowest recorded since 1900 ;
- the infant mortality rate, 166, is one of the lowest in the present century, and is 97 less than in 1935.

Population.

2. The estimated population of the Island on December 31, 1936, was 5,678,000. The births registered during the year exceeded the deaths by 69,020 and the emigrants exceeded the immigrants by 7,965.

Marriages.

3. The number of General and Kandyan marriages registered during 1936, was 26,779 (21,334 under the General Marriage Ordinance and 5,445 under the Kandyan Law), and indicated a rate of 10·2 per 1,000 of the population (excluding Muslims) as against 9·1 in 1935. There were 1,549 Muslim Marriages which were equivalent to an approximate rate of 8·2 per 1,000 of the Muslim population as against 7·2 in the previous year. There were 131 divorces under the General, and 710 under the Kandyan Law.

Births.

4. The number of births registered during the year was 192,060* (97,879 males and 94,180 females). The birth rate was 34·1 per 1,000 of the population, as against 34·4 in the previous year. The sex ratio at birth was 1,039 males to 1,000 females. In the City of Colombo the birth rate was 37·6 as against 33·4 in the previous year. There were 27,804 births on estates as against 28,474 in 1935.

* Sex not distinguishable in one case.

Deaths.

5. 123,040 deaths (63,026 among males and 60,014 among females) were registered in the year. The death rate was 21·8 per 1,000 of the population as compared with 36·6 and 22·9 in the years 1935 and 1934, respectively. The death rate in the City of Colombo was 27·2 as against 29·9 in 1935, and 28·7 in 1934. On the estates there were 14,158 deaths as against 20,048 in the previous year, and 14,946 in 1934. The high death rates of 1935, were due to the epidemic of malaria.

Infant Mortality.

6. The number of deaths of infants under one year of age registered in 1936 was 31,789. The infant mortality rate was 166 per 1,000 births as against 263 in the previous year and 173 in 1934. The city of Colombo had a rate of 150 and the estates 176 as compared with 163 and 203 respectively in the previous year.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on February 20, 1937, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated February 16, 1937.

Present: Mr. T. A. Hodson, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 16, 1937, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1936 to January 31, 1937, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for January, 1937.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of January, 1937.
- The reservoir readings for the week ending February 20, 1937.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during January, 1937.

4. Petitions:—Mr. Marikar presented—(1) Petitions from Essa Bai and Naim Bai, dated January 30, 1937, stating that two employees of the Council have pleaded the Public Servants Liabilities Ordinance and avoided payment of their debts, and suggesting that the two officers be dealt with. Mr. Ismail presented—(2) Petition from Mr. A. Z. A. Jaldin, dated February 18, 1937, applying for the post of Caretaker of the Ratwatte Pavilion at Bogambara.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Correspondence:—Letter No. B. 900 of February 15, 1937, from the Commissioner of Local Government inviting the deputation in connection with the Municipal reforms to meet the Executive Committee of Local Administration on February 26, 1937, at 9.30 A.M.—Tabled.

Resolved to inform the Commissioner of Local Government that a deputation consisting of the Chairman, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. de Silva, with possibly one other member, will meet the Executive Committee of Local Administration on the 26th instant, at 10 A.M.

6. Municipal Electrical Engineer's letter No. E. 21/38 of January 15, 1937, stating that a decision is necessary regarding the steps to be taken to prevent the overload of plant during 1937.

Chairman moved the Council into Committee to consider this item, together with item 21 on the agenda, viz.:—"Municipal Electrical Engineer's letter dated February 11, 1937, stating that a sum of Rs. 5,238.25 is necessary for carrying out repairs to the No. 1 Ruston Engine 4 V.G."

Decision of Council in Committee.

The Municipal Electrical Engineer, who was present at the meeting, was questioned at length as regards the repairs required, and the extent of the connected load and the maximum demand at the last Ferahera, and during the visit of the Duke of Gloucester.

Thereafter, it was resolved—(1) that a vote of Rs. 5,238.25 be granted for repairs of the No. 1 Ruston Engine—Mr. de Silva dissenting, (2) that applications for new connections should be generally rejected until after the Coronation Celebrations, and (3) that the Municipal Electrical Engineer be asked to furnish a scheme indicating what sections should in his opinion be disconnected in the event of overload.

The Council resumed and the resolutions passed in Committee were adopted, Mr. de Silva dissenting from (1).

7. To obtain formal sanction to accept the tender of Messrs. Walker & Greig, Ltd., for Rs. 2,777 for the Rotary Balancer, and Rs. 998 for the Electricity Meter, as recommended by the Municipal Electrical Engineer.—Resolved that the tenders be accepted.

8. Estimate from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for Rs. 370 for the extension of electric cable along Gregory road to enable lights to be installed to premises No. 17/2A belonging to Mr. G. F. Buultjens.—Resolved that the vote be granted in this case, and that future policy regarding similar applications should be definitely settled after ascertaining the practice in Colombo and Galle.

9. To approve of the recommendation of the Economy Committee on Municipal Electrical Engineer's letter No. 1/84 of January 29, 1937, suggesting that all public lights except those in Ward street, Peradeniya road, Victoria Drive, and Public Market, be lit for 10½ hours (instead of the present arrangement of 11½ hours and 4½ hours) as it did not involve any additional cost in the public lighting bill.—Resolved to approve of the recommendation, but substituting "10 hours" for "10½ hours".

10. Application from Mr. Tambiraja, Rat Campaign Overseer, for the quarters at the Lake Spill Stores, which Mr. Kaimal is vacating.—Resolved that the application be rejected.

11. Letter No. 657/4 (PT) of January 25, 1937, from the Financial Secretary in reply to representations made to Government as to the desirability of reimbursing the Council for the loss sustained by it as a result of the abolition of the toll consequent on the erection of the footbridge.—Consideration was deferred.

12. Papers relating to the inquiry held by the Special Committee into the allegations made by contractor L. W. L. John.—Tabled.

13. Tenders received for—(1) the supply of emulsified asphalt, (2) the provision of a path and footbridge at Huduhumpola, and (3) the survey of the Mahaiyawa General Cemetery. The Chairman tabled the tenders received at the Finance Committee meeting under items (1) and (2) and a further tender received under item (1) from The Standard Vacuum Oil Co. was opened.—Resolved that the tenders be referred to the Municipal Engineer for report. No tenders were received under item (3).

14. *Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on December 19, 1936.*

Application from Mr. C. A. Christiansz, Senior Waterworks Inspector, for a revised salary scale.—Recommended that the application be considered at the end of 1937.

Resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(1) Letter from the Commissioner of Local Government No. B. 1242 of December 22, 1936, on the subject of amendment of section 19 of the Colombo Municipal Council's Waterworks Ordinance, No. 18 of 1907.—Recommended adoption of the revised draft of section 19, and the further proposal to amend the Ordinance to legalize metering of supplies for domestic purposes.

(14) Resolved that from and after June 1, 1937, the Committee should prescribe the fee for the use of the ground in each case subject to a maximum of Rs. 10 and in respect of matches in which a gate fee is taken special terms should be laid down according to the circumstances of each case.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Special Committee on the Administration of Bogambara Grounds held on February 1, 1937.

(15) To consider letter received from the Kandy Sports Club dated January 14, 1937, on the subject of neglect of the grounds.—Recommended—(i.) that judging from the condition of the ground and Municipal Engineer's report dated January 25, 1937, the playing of polo caused damage to the ground and it should be prohibited in the interest of other games; (ii.) that the use of the grounds as a public path should be prohibited and pedestrians should use the bank by the water-course; (iii.) that car driving practice, horse and cycle riding practice, fire engine practice, on the grounds should be prohibited; (iv.) that the parking of cars within the grounds should be prohibited; (v.) that public notices should be erected indicating the prohibitions; and (vi.) that the Pavilion Watcher should be appointed as a cattle seizer under "The Thoroughfares Ordinance", and that all cattle straying into the grounds should be seized and delivered at the Police Station.

(16) To consider Municipal Engineer's report on the subject of improvement to the ground—For purposes of upkeep of the grounds.—Recommended—(1) to hire a pair of bulls for the roller at a daily rate, (2) to appoint temporarily of the following staff:—One Pavilion Caretaker and supervisor on Rs. 20 per mensem. Three labourers on Rs. 15 per mensem each, (3) to authorize the Municipal Engineer to purchase the new lawn mower in time to be available for use on June 1, 1937.

(18) Letter dated February 10, 1937, from the President, Kandy District Association Football League, suggesting that—(1) one Saturday in each month be allotted to the League; (2) the League be allowed to store their goal posts, nets, &c., in one of the rooms in Ratwatte Pavilion; and (3) the ground be allowed to the League for November 11, for a Charity Soccer Match.—Recommended to reply—(1) that as the application was not received in time arrangements cannot be made for any Saturdays up to September. Commencing from October, the first Saturday of each month will be provisionally reserved for the League, but bookings must be confirmed on application which should be made at least one month in advance of the date; (2) that goal posts, nets and equipment, &c., can be stored in a room under the care of the Pavilion Watcher on payment of a reasonable rent; and (3) that the ground will be allowed to the League on November 11, free of rent.

Resolution on item (3).—Resolved to adopt the recommendation and if the stall offered to Mr. Segu Mohamadu is not accepted by him, to offer it to Mr. S. M. Mohideen, subject to usual premium.

Resolution on item (5).—Resolved that the recommendation be adopted, Messrs. Wijayatilake and Ismail dissenting.

Resolution on item (7).—Resolved that the recommendation be adopted and the refund be made subject to Mr. Ismail Lebhe waiving all claims in respect of the Council's action.

Resolution on item (13).—Resolved that the recommendation be adopted subject to the exception that in an emergency the Secretary may allow an application after consulting one member of the Committee, if possible.

Resolution on item (14).—Resolved that the fee per booking be fixed at Rs. 5 for all Clubs, except that in respect of League Football matches the fee should be Rs. 2.50, and that in respect of matches in which a gate fee is taken, the normal fee should be Rs. 10 but the Council reserves the right to fix a fee not exceeding Rs. 25 in special cases.

Resolution on item (15) (i.).—The letter dated February 3, 1937, received from the Hony. Secretary of the Kandy Race and Gymkhana Club on the subject of the use of the ground for Polo and Gymkhana events was read by the Chairman. The motion was put to the meeting and carried by a majority of 1 vote. *Ayes*—Messrs. De Silva, Soysa, Marikar, Wijayatilake, and Usoof Ismail. *Noes*—The Chairman, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Bradley, and Dr. Godlieb.

Resolution on item (15) (ii.).—Resolved that the use of portions of the ground as pathways should be discouraged.

Resolution on item (15) (iii.).—Resolved that persons be forbidden to drive cars or ride horses on the grounds.

Resolution on item (15) (iv.).—This recommendation was after some discussion withdrawn by Mr. de Silva with the approval of other members of the Special Committee.

Resolution on item (17).—Resolved that the recommendation be adopted. In this connection the Chairman made a statement indicating that Mr. Methananda, by his letter dated February 16, 1937, had undertaken to pay a further sum of Rs. 500 for the use of the Bogambara Grounds for the Golden Jubilee Fair of the Dharmaraja College and he was, therefore, withdrawing his objection to the lease granted by Municipal Council resolution of November 21, 1936, and had addressed the Commissioner of Local Government accordingly.

16. Letter from the Minister for Health requesting that arrangements be made to provide a separate water supply to the Kandy Civil Hospital of 20,000 gallons per diem.—Resolved that the application be allowed subject to the conditions contained in Municipal Engineer's report dated February 12, 1937.

17. To sanction the establishment of a rickshaw stand as follows:—Stand on Railway Approach road bounded on the north by masonry drain, east by Approach road leading to Bus Park, south and west by Railway Approach road, for rickshaws not exceeding six in number.—Resolved to sanction the establishment of the Rickshaw Stand accordingly.

18. To obtain formal sanction to accept the quotation of Messrs. Lee Hedges & Co., Ltd., for the purchase of 41 Karri timber poles at a cost of Rs. 1,312.—Resolved to sanction acceptance of the quotation.

Rock Removal 1936-1937.

Closing of Watering Point Berth.

(1) The following Rocks have been removed :—

(a) $4\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms situated 2,100 feet 101° from the extremity of Aurora Bastion. $4\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms situated 2,000 feet $99\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ from the extremity of Aurora Bastion. $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms situated 1,920 feet $97\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ from the extremity of Aurora Bastion.

The area surrounding these rocks has been swept to a least depth of 32 feet.

The black conical buoy situated 2,150 feet 101° from the extremity of Aurora Bastion has been withdrawn.(b) $4\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms situated 1,920 feet 79° from the extremity of Aurora Bastion.

The area surrounding this rock has been swept to a least depth of 31 feet.

The Central and Eastern Channels have been swept to a least depth of 34 feet.

A red conical buoy has been permanently moored 420 feet 308° from Katta Gala Rock and named INNER KATTA.The buoy situated 620 feet 203° from Katta Gala Rock has been named OUTER KATTA.

(2) Watering Point berth will be closed for the period of the South-West Monsoon from April 1, 1937, and the spherical and Can buoys Imbu Ranne Gala will be withdrawn.

(3) Ships not exceeding 25 feet draught and 430 feet in length will be able to use the Port during the forthcoming South-West Monsoon subject to favourable weather conditions.
