### SCHEDULE.

The schedule to the aforesaid Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 7,163 of March 18, 1921, is hereby amended as follows:—

(1) by the substitution, for all the words from "*Iranamadu irrigation district*" to "*Murasumoddai village*", of the following:—

"1. The Iranamadu irrigation district, comprising the Iranamadu and Dri-aru tanks and the land occupied by the headworks and the channels, sluices, distribution gates, regulators, aqueducts, siphons, and other structures forming part of the Iranamadu and Dri-aru tanks irrigation works, together with the lands appertaining thereto and the reservations therefor, and the area (of about 20,000 acres) consisting of the villages or those parts of the villages of Iranamadu, Kilinochchi, Murasumoddai, Paranthan, Periyaparanthan, Velikandal, Udupattukandal, Pulinkatevanmurippu, Korakkankaddu, Upparu, Uriyan, Pandimoddai, Puthukulam, and the old paddy tracts of Kunchuparanthan, Periyaparanthan, and Porikkadavai, which are situated within the following boundaries:—

North: Jaffna lagoon between the mouths of the Kanakarayan-aru and the western branch of the Vadali-aru; the Vadali-aru; the Mavadi-aru; Murasumoddai road; Old Pooneryn road and the northern boundaries of the villages of Periyaparanthan and Kunchuparanthan.

East: Kanakarayan-aru.

South: Iranamadu tank bund, Iranamadu Main channel, Dri-aru tank bund; Paranthan channel; Peasant Colony channel; Peasant Colony Access road; the Eastern branch of Neela-aru; the Paranthan channel, and the Wadichehal-aru.

West: Wadichehal-aru as far as the Old Pooneryn road."

(2) by the substitution, for the words "*Karachchi irrigation district* to comprise", of the following:—

"2. The Karachchi irrigation district, comprising".

## BY-LAWS.

1. No person shall, within the administrative limits of this Council, by operating or causing or permitting any other person to operate any gramophone, wireless loudspeaker, amplifier or other similar instrument, produce or reproduce or cause to be produced or reproduced any sound which, by reason of its volume or its repetition or its continuous nature, causes a nuisance to the occupants of premises in the neighbourhood.

2. Every contravention of the foregoing by-law shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees:

Provided, however, that no proceedings shall be instituted in respect of any such contravention against any person operating or causing or permitting any other person to operate any instrument as aforesaid in any place other than a street, public place, shop or place of business, or a place which adjoins any street or public place and to which the members of the public are admitted, unless—

- (a) complaint of the nuisance is made to the Chairman in writing by not less than three householders of the neighbourhood affected by the nuisance, and
- (b) written notice is served on that person by the Chairman setting out the nature of the complaints received and requiring that person to abate the nuisance forthwith or within a specified period, and
- (c) that person fails or refuses to comply with such notice forthwith on receipt thereof or within the period specified therein, as the case may be.

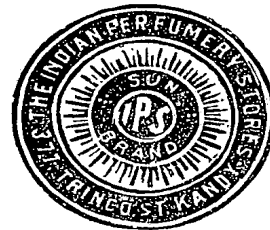

## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

## THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## General Meeting.

Wednesday, March 3, 1937, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated February 24, 1937.

*Present* : Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman ; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal ; Dr. S. Muttiah ; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C. ; Mr. A. R. A. Razik, M.S.C., J.P. ; Dr. S. T. Gunasekera ; Mr. G. K. Thornhill ; Mr. T. A. Owles ; Lieut.-Colonel J. H. Stafford, O.B.E., M.C., R.E. ; Mr. Geo. R. de Silva ; Mr. W. J. Price ; Mr. A. Duncum, A.C.A. ; Mr. K. W. Taylor, A.C.A. ; Mr. D. Gordon, and Mr. John Wilson.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of February 3, 1937, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C., M.M.C., presented a petition from Mr. T. W. R. de Silva, 24, Temple lane, Maradana, complaining against the damage caused to his premises in view of certain road works done by the Council and praying for the re-building of his premises or the granting of compensation and moved that it be submitted to the Works and Finance Committees for consideration and report.

3. In the absence of Dr. E. A. Coorey, Dr. S. Muttiah asked the following question which the Chairman answered :—

Q.—“ With a view to providing a marine drive alongside the Railway line from Colpetty to Municipal limits on the south, when funds permit, will the Chairman be pleased to take preliminary steps to have street lines laid for the purpose as it is an urgent and necessary improvement to this part of the Town ? ” A.—The Chairman would not feel justified at the present juncture and without a resolution of the Council in taking any steps in this connection, as even a preliminary examination of the proposal would involve much labour on the part of the departments concerned and would take a long time to complete.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik, M.S.C., M.M.C., moved :—“ That this Council is of opinion that the consumption of water shows signs of increasing and is likely to exceed the allowance made for daily consumption ; that the installation of drainage leads to greater consumption as well as a certain quantity of unavoidable wastage, and that in case of increased consumption and any unforeseen causes such as drought the reserve supply in the reservoirs may not at present prove sufficient to meet the increased consumption, and to avert a water famine it is desirable that compulsory drainage should be suspended for the present, till measures contemplated for the increased or assured supply of water are completed.” Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.

The Chairman stated that whilst sympathizing with the object behind the motion he suggested the substitution for the words that compulsory drainage should be suspended that urgent representations be made to the Executive Committee of Local Administration with a view to expediting the Scheme of Augmentation of the water supply now before that Committee. Mr. A. R. A. Razik agreed to the suggestion of the Chairman.

The motion, amended in conformity with this suggestion, was put to the meeting and carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded. Carried.

*The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of February 13, 1937, were considered.*

## MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated November 6, 1936, stating that a gratuity of Rs. 949·38 is payable to the widow or next-of-kin of the late Overseer Mutukisna, B. *Resolution of Council in Committee.*

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha suggested that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees with a view to considering the facts of the case more fully.

The Chairman stated that the facts of the case were very carefully considered by the Law Committee and the Finance Committee and the recommendation of the Finance Committee concurring with the Law Committee was made on the merits of the case. Resolved that the above recommendation of the Law Committee be adopted.

## FIRE BRIGADE.

(3) To consider :—(a) A petition from the staff of the Fire Brigade, stating that since the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance was enforced, if an officer gets injured whilst on duty he receives only half his salary and half the house allowance whereas before the introduction of the Ordinance he received 2 months' leave or more with full-pay and house allowance when so recommended by the Medical Board and, therefore, requesting that the following privileges be granted for reasons given by them :—(1) To grant full-pay and full house allowance when such leave is sanctioned by the Medical Board for the period of treatment, not exceeding two months plus the thirty days sick leave ordinarily allowed. (3) To grant them half pay and full house allowance for any period thereafter when coming under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance. (b) Reports thereon of the Chief Officer, Fire Brigade, and the Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 130.—Recommended :—(a) That sick leave on full-pay be allowed in cases of disability caused through accident but in cases where the disability due to accident exceeds the maximum allowable under rule 13 of the Fire Brigade, the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance will apply from the beginning of the period of disability. (b) That Rule No. 13 be amended so that sick leave shall include absence due to injuries caused by accident in the course of their employment and not due to their own culpable carelessness.

## MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(b) The recommendations of the Municipal Treasurer that the advances be granted on the usual terms, viz., that the amounts be repaid in 18 monthly instalments and that 5 per cent. per annum be charged as interest on the balances outstanding from time to time. *Note.*—In the cases of Mr. Rupesinghe and Mr. H. S. Perera, 7½ per cent. interest is to be charged.—Recommended (1) to (7).

*Leave.*

(29) To recommend that, under section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the excess leave of 7 days over 42 days granted to Mr. S. C. A. Mendis, Clerk Division II., Waterworks Department, be sanctioned. Registered No. 105.—Recommended.

(30) To recommend :—(a) That, under section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the excess leave of 83 days over 42 days granted to Mrs. E. M. Brohier, Playground Instructress of the Charity Commissioner's Department, be sanctioned. (b) That, under section 10 (i) of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, she may be granted 91 days accumulated vacation leave. (c) That, under section 10 (iii.) she may be granted excess leave of 48 days over 91 days to be appropriated out of the vacation leave of 48 days available in respect of 1931–1932 and 1933–1934, and the period from December 12, 1936, to January 6, 1937, be allowed with half-pay. Registered No. 116.—Recommended.

(31) To recommend that, under section 10 (iii.) of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, Mr. W. W. Wickremasinghe, Sanitary Inspector, Public Health Department, be granted 12 days' leave out of the lapsed vacation leave of 71 days available in respect of 1931 and 1932. Registered No. 129.—Recommended.

(32) To recommend :—(a) That, under section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the excess leave of 25 days over 24 days granted to Mrs. S. H. Perera, Public Health Nurse (N E), Public Health Department, be sanctioned. (b) That, under section 10 (i.) of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, (N E), she may be granted 48 days accumulated vacation leave. *Note.*—She is not entitled to any lapsed leave as she was appointed on March 21, 1935. Therefore the balance leave of 46 days from December 8, 1936, to January 22, 1937, may be allowed on half-pay. Sanction of Council is necessary. Registered No. 159.—Recommended.

(33) To consider :—(a) An application from Mr. P. G. de Silva, Chief Playground Instructor, Charity Commissioner's Department, for 36 days vacation leave commencing from February 14, 1937, to April 2, 1937. (b) A report of the Municipal Treasurer stating that sanction of Council is necessary under Section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, for the excess leave of 8 days over 42 days vacation leave now to be granted. Registered No. 1,488.—Recommended.

(34) To consider :—(a) An application from the Chief Medical Officer of Health requesting permission to spend 2 months 8 days vacation leave in the Island as the latter portion of his leave of 10 months from March 1, 1937. (b) A report of the Municipal Treasurer stating that the leave may be altered as follows in view of precedents :—(1) Commuted half-pay leave from March 1, 1937, to October 22, 1937. (2) Vacation leave from October 23, 1937, to December 31, 1937. Registered No. 89.—Recommended.

(35) To consider :—(a) An application from Mr. W. E. La Brooy, Veterinary Inspector, Veterinary Surgeon's Department, for three months leave preparatory to retirement in terms of Municipal Council Leave By-law 32. (b) Reports



thereon of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon and the Municipal Treasurer. (c) A memorandum of the Chairman, Municipal Council. Registered No. 220. The Committee is of the opinion that Mr. W. E. La Brooy is not eligible for the three months special leave preparatory to retirement and recommends that he be granted the balance of the current vacation leave that is available, *i.e.*, 65 days.

*Pensions and Gratuities.*

(36) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated November 6, 1936, stating that a gratuity of Rs. 949·38 is payable to the widow or next-of-kin of the late Overseer Mutukisna, B. T. 3,572 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who was employed under the Council for a period of 168 months and died on July 16, 1936, and therefore requesting a decision of Council as to whom should be paid the above gratuity as there are two claims. Registered No. 1,696.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Law Committee of February 13, 1937, item No. 2, be adopted.

(37) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 478·16 to P. Ginoris Silva, B. T. 3,078 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who was condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 150 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 57·38. *Note.*—This labourer's service had been interrupted by breaks, but these can be condoned under second proviso to rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 171.—Recommended.

*The following items having been approved of in circulation by the Members of the Finance Committee are submitted for sanction of Council.*—

(38) To consider:—(a) Letter No. P 9/8 dated January 12, 1937, from the Controller of Labour stating that the total cost of the Bullers road Reclamation Scheme which is now being undertaken as an Unemployment Relief Work is Rs. 80,000 and inquiring what proportion of the above expenditure will be contributed by the Municipality. (b) Letter dated February 17, 1937, from the Chairman, Municipal Council, to the Controller of Labour stating that he agrees, subject to the approval of Council, that the Council should contribute to the present Bullers Road Reclamation Scheme one-third of the total cost including supervision. Registered No. 169.

(39) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated February 18, 1937, requesting sanction of Council to write off the sum of Rs. 33·42 being the balance outstanding on account of a loan for purchase of a bicycle granted to W. D. Leyon Singho, Binder of his Department, who was dismissed from service on December 3, 1936, and whose whereabouts are now not known. The amount will be debited to Vote D—32, Miscellaneous. Registered No. 1,840.

(40) To consider:—(a) Letter No. P 9/20 of November 27, 1937, from the Controller of Labour, inquiring whether the Council agrees to pay one-third of the total cost of the work done at Thimbirigasyaya as Unemployment Relief Work. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 181.

(41) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon recommending (supported by Municipal Treasurer) that Mr. S. Nadarajah, Clerk in Division I., Municipal Veterinary Surgeon's Department, who in addition to his own duties performed the work of Mr. H. D. P. Wijesinghe, Clerk in Division I., who was absent on sick leave from December 21, 1936, to February 21, 1937, be paid Rs. 50 per month which is less than one-third of his salary as allowance, in terms section 25 (3) (b) of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws. *Note.*—Sanction of Council is necessary. Registered No. 257.

*The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together of February 25, 1937) were considered.*

(3) With reference to the resolution of Council of December 2, 1936, regarding the compulsory provision of Arcades to consider, part (b) of the recommendation of the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement of November 30, 1936, item No. 2, *viz.*, "(b) That Arcades be provided in Second Cross street from Bankshall street to Maliban street junction only, to a depth not exceeding 12 feet from the present street frontage." Registered No. 1,336.—Recommended that Arcades be provided in Second Cross street from Bankshall street to Maliban street junction only, to a depth not exceeding 12 feet from the present street frontage.

(4) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer, dated November 17, 1936, regarding a new staff appointment for the Municipal Engineer's Department. Registered No. 1,672.—Recommended that the question be brought up before the new Council.

(5) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated January 29, 1937, regarding the row of boutiques in premises No. 10-32, Green Path, acquired by Council for the Colpetty Road Duplication Scheme. Registered No. 1,422.—Recommended that, subject to 6 months' notice being given to the lessee, the Chairman's suggestion be approved as follows:—"That after due notice these boutiques should be closed and demolished and the portions of the site that lie outside street lines be sold by public auction for development by the erection of buildings of a better class in keeping with the surroundings,

(6) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer, dated January 26, 1937, stating that the following by-law and regulation be sanctioned for the removal of congestion of traffic in Main street, Pettah:—By-law under section 18 (2) of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916: "During the hours between 9 A.M. and 7 P.M., the use by bullock carts of the road known as Main street, Pettah, between its junctions with Front street and Fourth Cross street within the Municipality of Colombo, is prohibited." Regulation under section 58 (1) of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 20 of 1927. "During the hours between 9 A.M. and 7 P.M. the use by motor lorries of the road known as Main street, Pettah, between its junctions with Front street and Fourth Cross street within the Municipality of Colombo, is prohibited." Registered No. 128.—Recommended.

(7) To consider the question of the re-erection of the public lavatory adjoining St. Peter's College, Wellawatta, that is about to be demolished in connection with the Galle road widening. Registered No. 258.—Recommended that the lavatory be not re-erected.

*The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of February 25, 1937, was considered.*

(5) To consider :—(a) A memorandum of the Municipal Engineer dated January 28, 1937, with regard to the construction of Gower street suggesting that the following resolution be adopted and requesting sanction of Council to the detailed estimate for Rs. 4,750 :—“ That this Council having considered the objections made regarding the construction of Gower street in pursuance of notice issued in accordance with Council's resolution of June 2, 1936, approves the scheme and the apportionment of cost made by the Chairman and published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,247 of October 2, 1936.” (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Treasurer stating that sanction of Council is also necessary for the option of repayment to be spread over a period not exceeding 10 years together with interest at 6 per cent, per annum. Funds are available. Registered No. 236.—Recommended.

(6) To consider :—(a) Memoranda of the Municipal Engineer dated February 26, 1937, and February 4/5, 1935, regarding the construction of Alfred House avenue, Alfred House gardens, Ripon road and 7th lane, Kollupitiya, submitting an amended estimate for Rs. 25,000 for the above work together with an apportionment of the cost as in plan No. 2024 of January 28, 1937, for sanction of Council. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Treasurer dated February 27, 1937, recommending that in the above case the option of re-payment may be spread over a period not exceeding 10 years together with interest at 6 per cent, per annum. *Note*.—Funds are available. Sanction of Council is necessary. Registered No. 01256.—Recommended and that the following resolution be adopted :—“ That this Council having considered the objections made regarding the scheme for the improvement of Alfred House avenue, Alfred House gardens, Ripon road and 7th lane, Kollupitiya, in pursuance of notice issued in accordance with the Council's resolution of November 7, 1934, approves the scheme and the apportionment of cost made by the Chairman and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,271 of February 12, 1937.”

6. The Chairman moved in Committee :—That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

7. The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

At this stage the Chairman inquired from the Council whether it would like to appoint a Special Committee to select the design for the Loyal Address and Casket to be presented to H. M. the King in connection with the Coronation Celebrations or leave the matter to him. The Council decided that the matter be left to the Chairman.

#### ANNEXURE A.

##### SCHEDULE.

###### *By-law for the Control of Vehicular Traffic by Light Signals.*

The driver of every vehicle shall obey any light signal which may be used for the control of vehicular traffic in accordance with the following system :—

- (1) A white line, hereinafter called “ the stop line,” drawn across any portion of the road, is provided in conjunction with every light signal.
- (2) For the purpose of giving a signal one or more of the following lights or signs are used facing the stream of traffic which the signal is intended to control, namely :—
  - (i) a red light with the word “ STOP ” on the lens of the lamp,
  - (ii) an amber light,
  - (iii) a green light with the word “ GO ” on the lens of the lamp,
  - (iv) an illuminated green arrow.
- (3) The lamps showing the coloured lights or signs aforesaid are arranged vertically, the lamp showing a red light being the uppermost, and that showing a green light the lowermost.

- (4) The sequence of the signal lights shown for the purpose of controlling vehicular traffic is as follows :—
- Red ; or Green arrow and Red together ;
  - Amber and Red together ;
  - Green ;
  - Amber.
- (5) The significance of the light signals aforesaid is as follows :—
- The red signal indicates that except as provided in paragraph (b) no vehicular traffic is to proceed beyond the stop line until the green signal is shown.
  - The green arrow with the red signal indicates that all vehicular traffic proceeding in the direction indicated by such arrow, may, notwithstanding the prohibitory significance of the red signal, pass such signal and proceed in that direction with due regard to the safety of other users of the road.
  - The amber-with-red signal indicates an impending change in the signal from red to green and is a direction to drivers of vehicles in the stream of traffic controlled by the signal to be in readiness to proceed, but it does not alter the prohibitory significance of the red signal.
  - The green signal with the word " GO " indicates that all vehicular traffic may pass such signal and proceed straight on or turn to the left or to the right, with due regard to the safety of other users of the road, and subject to the directions of any Police Officer or other duly authorized person who may be engaged in the regulation of traffic.
  - The amber signal indicates that no vehicular traffic is to proceed beyond the stop line : provided however that this prohibition shall not apply in the case of any vehicle which, when such signal first appears, is so close to the said line that it cannot safely be stopped before passing the line.

## ANNEXURE " B ".

*The Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916.*

By-laws for the Municipal Town of Colombo made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 18 (2) (g) of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

*By-laws.*

- All vehicular traffic in that portion of Keyzer street, which lies between the junction of that street with Fourth Cross street and the junction of that street with Second Cross street, shall proceed in the direction of Second Cross street only, and, when not in motion, shall be halted facing that direction only and as near as possible to the left or near side of that street.
- Every cart used on that portion of Keyzer street, which lies between the junction of that street with Second Cross street and the junction of that street with Front street, shall proceed in the direction of Front street only, and, when not in motion, shall be halted facing that direction only, and as near as possible to the left or near side of that street.
- The by-law under section 18 (2) (g) of the Ordinance published in *Gazette* No. 7,553 of October 29, 1926, is hereby amended by the omission of the words " Keyzer street, towards Front street ".

*The Motor Car Ordinance, 1927.*

Regulations for the urban area comprised within the administrative limits of the Municipality of Colombo, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 58 (1) of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

*Regulations.*

- Every motor car used on that portion of Keyzer street, which lies between the junction of that street with Fourth Cross street and the junction of that street with Second Cross street, shall proceed in that direction of Second Cross street only, and when not in motion shall be halted facing that direction only and as near as possible to the left or near side of that street.
- Every lorry used on that portion of Keyzer street which lies between the junction of that street with Second Cross street and the junction of that street with Front street shall proceed in the direction of Front street only, and, when not in motion, shall be halted facing that direction only and as near as possible to the left or near side of that street.
- The Regulations under section 58 (1) of the Ordinance, published in *Gazette* No. 7,670 of October 19, 1928, are hereby amended :—
  - in column I. of the Schedule thereto, by the omission of the words " Keyzer street " ; and
  - in column II. of that Schedule, by the omission of the words " Facing Front street ".

B. A. Weerakoon and several other residents of Siyambalagastenna asking for a road to be constructed through the village of Siyambalagastenna.

Chairman agreed to consider petitions under items (1) and (2) and to refer to the Village Improvements Committee the petition under item (3).
