Orders under Sections 14 and 26.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 14 and 26 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Reginald Edward Stubbs, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby—

- (1) order under section 14 that the administrative limits of the Trincomalee Urban District Council, defined in the manner set out in Column I. of the First Schedule hereto by Order under section 9 of the Ordinance published by Notification in *Gazette* No. 7,910 of March 4, 1932, shall be varied, and that with effect from the first day of January, 1938, the administrative limits of the said Council shall be the limits defined and set out in Column II. of that schedule; and
- (2) order under section 26, that with effect from the first day of January, 1938, the Order relating to the electoral divisions of the said Council published by Notification in *Gazette* No. 7,918 of April 15, 1932, shall be amended by the substitution, for the electoral divisions set out in the schedule to that Order, of the redefined electoral divisions set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

First Schedule.

Column I.

Existing Limits.

North: From a point 19½ chains north-west of the 3rd milestone on the Anuradhapura road eastwards along the landmarked boundary to its junction with Love lane; thence along the western side of Love lane as far as its junction with the North Coast road; thence along the western side of the North Coast road to a point 37 links south of the 3rd milestone on the said road and thence north-eastwards along the landmarked boundary to the sea.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the edge of the sea until it meets the common boundary between Fort Frederick and the Esplanade, thence southwards along the said boundary until it meets the sea and thence along the edge of Dutch Bay to a point 16 chains south-east of the Residency.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the boundary defined with War Department Stones, thence across Court road, thence along the northern bank of the water-course, thence along the northern side of the Inner Harbour to a point 25 links west of the beacon to the south-west of Orr's hill.

West: From the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the eastern side of Yard Cove until it meets the Anuradhapura road, thence north-westwards along the southern side of the said road to the starting point of the northern boundary.

Column II.

Redefined Limits.

North: From a point on the southern boundary of the Anuradhapura road 19½ chains north-west of the 3½th milestone eastwards along the landmarked boundary to its junction with Love lane; thence along the western side of Love lane as far as its junction with the North Coast road; thence along the western side of the North Coast road to a point 37 links south of the 3rd milestone on the said road and thence north-eastwards along the landmarked boundary to the sea.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the edge of the sea until it meets the common boundary between Fort Frederick and the Esplanade, thence southwards along the said boundary until it meets the Dutch Bay and thence along the edge of Dutch Bay to a point 16 chains south-east of the Residency.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the landmarked boundary to the eastern side of Court road, thence across Court road, thence along the northern bank of the water-course, thence along the northern side of the Inner Harbour to a point 25 links west of the beacon to the south-west of Orr's hill.

West: From the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the eastern side of Yard Cove until it meets the Anuradhapura road, thence north-westwards along the southern side of the said road as far as the southern boundary of lot 91 in F. V. P. 15, thence south-westwards and northwards along the southern boundaries of lots 91 and 90, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 92, southern and western boundaries of lot 93, western and northern boundaries of lot 95A and western boundary of lot 87 in F. V. P. 15 to the southern side of the Anuradhapura road, thence north-westwards along the southern side of the said road to the starting point of the northern limit.

Second Schedule.

REDEFINED ELECTORAL DIVISIONS.

Electoral Division No. 1.

North.—The eastern limit of the Urban District Council along Back Bay from the point at which it meets the boundary defined with the War Department Stones, 2½ chains to the east of the junction of Beach road and Dockyard street to the boundary of Fort Fredrick.

East.—From the last-mentioned point along the eastern limit of the Urban District Council adjoining Fort Fredrick and Dutch Bay to its southern extremity.

South.—The southern limit of the Urban District Council from the last mentioned point to the junction of Dyke street and Dockyard street.

West.—From the last mentioned point northwards along the centre of Dockyard street as far as its junction with St. Mary's street; thence along the centre of St. Mary's street as far as its junction with Gaol street, thence along the centre of Gaol street as far as its junction with Dockyard street, thence along the centre of Dockyard street as far as its junction with Beach road, thence along the centre of Beach road to a point 2½ chains to the east of the said junction, thence north-eastwards along the boundary defined with the War Department Stones to the starting point of the northern limit.

Electoral Division No. 2.

North.—From a point on the eastern side of the Inner Harbour in prolongation of the centre of Kachcheri street, along the centre of Kachcheri street as far as its junction with Green road, thence along the centre of Green road as far as its junction with Lusignan street, thence along the centre of Lusignan street as far as its junction with Dockyard street.

East.—From the last-mentioned point along the western limit of Electoral Division No. 1 to its southern extremity.

South and West.—The southern limit of the Urban District Council from the last-mentioned point to the starting point of the northern limit.

Electoral Division No. 3.

North.—From a point on the eastern side of the Inner Harbour in prolongation of the centre of Channel street, eastwards along the centre of Channel street, thence southwards along the centre of Meer street to its junction with Tanakara street, thence northwards along the centre of Tanakara street to its junction with Oilmonger street, thence eastwards along the centre of Oilmonger street to its junction with Dockyard street.

East.—The western limit of Electoral Division No. 1 from the last-mentioned point to the junction of Dockyard street and Lusignan street.

South.—The northern limit of Electoral Division No. 2.

West.—The southern limit of the Urban District Council from the junction of Kachcheri street and Inner Harbour road to the junction of Channel street and Inner Harbour road.

Electoral Division No. 4.

North.—From the centre of the junction of Oilmonger street and Railway Approach road, eastwards along the centre of Oilmonger street to its junction with Tanakara street.

East.—From the last mentioned point along the northern limit of Electoral Division No. 3 to the junction of Tanakara street and Moor street.

South.—From the last-mentioned point along the northern limit of Electoral Division No. 3 as far as the junction of Moor street and Huskisson street, thence along the centre of Huskisson street as far as its junction with Ebony lane, thence along the centre of Ebony lane to its junction with Birch street.

West.—From the last-mentioned point along the centre of Moor street to the starting point of the northern limit.

Electoral Division No. 5.

North.—The eastern limit of the Urban District Council from the point where it meets the northern boundary of the General Cemetery to the starting point of the northern limit of Electoral Division No. 1.

East.—The western limit of Electoral Division No. 1 from the last-mentioned point to the centre of Beach road.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of Beach road as far as its junction with Oilmonger street thence along the centre of Oilmonger street as far as its junction with Railway Approach road.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of Railway Approach road to its junction with Northcoast road, thence along the centre of Northcoast road to the northern boundary of the General Cemetery, thence along the northern boundary of the General Cemetery to the sea.

Electoral Division No. 6.

North.—The northern limit of the Urban District Council.

In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses may have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

Customs Regulations regarding Passengers' Baggage.

THE following regulations have been framed by the Principal Collector of Customs, under section 82 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, with regard to Passengers' Baggage. The regulations published in *Gazette* of March 12, 1926, are hereby cancelled.

Passengers' Baggage.

1. Passengers' baggage as hereafter defined is exempt from import duty.

2. Passengers' baggage is hereby defined to mean the *bona fide* baggage of a passenger accompanying him or arriving in Ceylon within one month before or after his arrival or within such further period as the Collector of Customs shall in the circumstances deem reasonable.

3. *Bona fide* baggage shall mean and include wearing apparel and personal effects provided that the articles are the property of and imported for the personal use of the passenger or the members of his family travelling with him. Passengers' baggage shall not include articles imported for sale or on behalf of other persons or for gifts to other persons.

4. Subject to the above regulations *bona fide* baggage may include—

- (1) Used instruments, apparatus, and appliances intended for professional use.
- (2) One carpet of a size not exceeding 35 square feet if in use as part of bedding or in lieu of bedding or of a deck chair.
- (3) Bedding and travelling rugs (not floor rugs or carpets).
- (4) Two tennis rackets with 2 presses.
- (5) Two cricket bats with bag.
- (6) Two hockey sticks.
- (7) Two badminton rackets with two presses.
- (8) One set of golf clubs.
- (9) Twenty polo sticks.
- (10) Two fishing rods.
- (11) One set table tennis.
- (12) One portable musical instrument (excludes pedal harmonium).
- (13) 100 gramophone records.
- (14) A used bicycle.
- (15) Two used saddles and a bridle.
- (16) Two used cameras (one of them may be a cinema camera).
- (17) One small cinematograph projector as ordinarily used only in houses.
- (18) A deck chair.
- (19) A used typewriter.
- (20) Small folding table.
- (21) Uniform cases, trunks, suit cases, fitted dressing cases, a trouser press, and the like.
- (22) Camp bed.
- (23) A magic lantern.
- (24) A photo apparatus with a reasonable quantity of films.
- (25) A reasonable amount of provisions for immediate use on arrival.
- (26) Articles of silver, plated or glassware, when of really personal use will not be counted for the allowance under regulation 6, e.g., a cigarette case, a lady's silver-backed mirror or a scent bottle, a glass or silver tooth-brush case, a dressing case with fittings and the like.

(27) Three clocks and time pieces but not large wall clocks or clocks of grandfather pattern. Silver clocks if within the allowance for silverware (*vide* regulation 6).

(28) One pair of binoculars and the like.

(29) Two woollen blankets.

(30) Jewellery for personal use brought by passengers in reasonable quantity according to the condition in life and rank of the passenger.

(31) Sewing machine if accompanied by a lady passenger.

(32) A perambulator

(33) A baby's cot

(34) Toys and toy carts

(35) Personal effects of a passenger or seaman who dies on the voyage to Ceylon.

5. *Bona fide* baggage shall not be held to include the following articles on which duty must be paid in all cases:—

(a) Arms and ammunition;

(b) Alcoholic liquor exceeding two quarts, and perfumed spirits exceeding one pint;

(c) Cigars and cigarettes exceeding a total of 50 and 100 in number respectively, whether in opened or unopened boxes, and other tobacco exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. in weight;

(d) Pianos, pianolas, harmoniums, gramophones and phonographs and records therefor except as laid down in Regulation 4 (items 12 and 13), carriages, motor cars, motor cycles, and side cars;

(e) Articles for household use such as furniture, pictures, carpets, glassware, crockery, cutlery, cooking utensils, household linen, lamps, house furnishings, curios, food-stuffs, silver and plated ware except such articles (other than furniture, lamps, house furnishings, curios, and carpets) as shall appear to be required for the personal use of the passenger whilst travelling or immediately upon arrival at his destination.

The above free allowances shall be granted only once to each passenger in respect of any one voyage.

7. Free allowances will be granted to each adult passenger provided that not more than two such allowances will be granted to any one family travelling together unless the third member can prove he is going to live in a separate establishment in which case he should make a separate declaration and claim a separate allowance.

8. Passengers' baggage may be passed either after examination by a Charges Officer (at the Baggage Office or in the warehouse as the case may be) or on a declaration made before a Charges Officer, provided that in the latter case an examination of the baggage may be made whenever a Customs Officer considers it advisable.

9. If the baggage is on the ship's manifest, a document of title must be produced before delivery is allowed.

10. Under section 16 (b) (3) of the Customs Ordinance and subject to any special regulations appertaining thereto, visitors to the Island may obtain a refund of full duty on motor cars and motor cycles, and $\frac{2}{3}$ of the duty paid by them on easily identifiable articles imported for their personal use. BY-LAWS for the area within the administrative limits of the Jaffna Urban District Council made under section 5 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901, by the proper authority in that behalf, to wit, the Chairman of the Jaffna Urban District Council.

By-laws.

- In these by-laws—
"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Jaffna Urban District Council;
"the annual registration fee" means the annual registration fee to be charged under section 5 of the Ordinance; and
"the owner" of a dog means the person having custody or possession of that dog.
- The annual registration fee for each dog kept within the administrative limits of the Jaffna Urban District Council shall be as follows:—
For a male dog: Re. 1.
For a female dog: Re. 1.50.
- The annual registration fee shall be paid before May 1 of the year for which it is due by the owner of the dog.

4. On payment of the annual registration fee, the Chairman shall issue to the owner of the dog—

- (i.) a certificate of registration, and
- (ii.) a metal ticket or collar with the number of the certificate stamped thereon;

Provided that the Chairman may require the production of any dog for the registration of which an application is made, and may refuse to issue a certificate of registration and a metal ticket or collar for that dog—

- (a) if that dog is not produced; or
- (b) if that dog is, in the opinion of the Chairman, so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or
- (c) if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner.

5. The Chairman may, after notice to be left at the address of the owner of any dog for which a certificate of registration has been issued, cancel such certificate—

- (a) if that dog becomes, in the opinion of the Chairman so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or
- (b) if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- (c) if that dog is permitted by its owner, at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, to associate with any other dog.

6. (1) The owner of any dog, for which a certificate of registration has been refused under by-law 4 or has been cancelled under by-law 5, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce that dog at a time and place, appointed by the Chairman, to be stated in the notice.

(2) Every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Chairman shall think fit.

7. The owner of any dog for which a metal ticket or collar has been issued shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the metal ticket or collar is fastened securely round the neck of that dog at all times during the period for which the certificate of registration issued in respect of that dog is in force.

8. The Chairman may authorize in writing any person to exercise any or all of the power vested in the Chairman by these by-laws.

9. The by-laws of the Local Board of Jaffna published in *Gazette* No. 6,195, of July 12, 1907, and in *Gazette* No. 6,807 of July 14, 1916, and continuing in force by virtue of the provisions of section 247 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, are hereby revoked.
