### GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

Examination for Stenographers, 1937.

APPLICATIONS are invited for filling vacancies in the posts of stenographers. There are two vacancies at present and more may arise during the course of the year. Salary Scale: Rs. 936 per annum rising by annual increments, fifteen of Rs. 60 and one of Rs. 72 to Rs. 1,908 per annum with an Efficiency Bar the passing of which will be dependent upon an examination test before Rs. 1,476. Some posts are pensionable and others are non-pensionable.

2. A qualifying examination will be held in Colombo by the Director of Education on June 26, 1937, and the selection thereafter will be made by the Chief Secretary who will consider the previous records of the candidates as well as the results of the examination. Candidates must be British subjects whose families are permanently

resident in Ceylon.

- 3. Candidates will be required to write an essay: take down in shorthand passages dictated at 100 words a minute for five minutes and to transcribe the record at 10 words a minute. They will also be required to make a correct copy of a passage of 600 words on the typewriter in 20 minutes, i.e., 30 words per minute. Touch typewriting will be regarded as essential. Candidates should bring their own typewriters if possible; otherwise they will be expected to use any machine provided. Neatness and accuracy will be taken into account in marking the papers. Applications for admission to the examination must be made by letter which must reach the Director of Education, Colombo, not later than 1 r.m. on June 5, 1937. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.
- 4. Candidates, unless already in Government Service, must be between the ages of 17 and 35 years on the date of the examination. Stamps to the value of Rs. 10 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature over them. All candidates should forward a copy of their birth certificate (which will be returned) with their application. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this Examination. Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates. Candidates who are not in Government Service should also attach copies of two testimonials of good character.

5. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5ths the value of

stamps affixed to his application.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination, gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of ½ the value of stamps affixed to his application provided his form of admission to the examination is returned with his notice of withdrawal.

(c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Director of Education at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

### General Clerical Service Examination, August, 1937.

Date of Examination.

1. A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the General Clerical Service will be held in Colombo, Kandy, Galle, and Jaffna, on August 21, 1937.

Places for Competition.

2. The number of places in Class II. assigned for general competition will be notified later. It is expected that there will be about 20 places. Appointments in Class III. will be offered, as vacancies occur, to those who are not selected for Class II., but who are selected for admission to Class III. The names of successful candidates will be published in the Ceylon Government Cazette, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

Applications.

Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Director of Education on forms which may be obtained from his office up to June 11, 1937.

4. Applications must reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on June 22, 1937. Any

applications received after that hour will be rejected.

The Director of Education will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

- 6. The examination will be confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in
- Ceylon.

  7. Candidates other than these eligible under regulation 10 must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed at least—
  - (a) The Cambridge Senior of the London Matriculation or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or

(b) The Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or

(c) The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate (English), Examination and either Examination of either (i.) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination of the London Chamber of Commerce, or (ii.) the Commercial Certificate Examination of the London Chamber of

Their applications must also bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10.

(i.) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 18 nor more than 22 years of age on August 1, 1937, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application.

(ii.) Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted

for this examination.

(iii.) Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv.) In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian, in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895, and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Director of Education that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v.) If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, a certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor, or Notary, or, generally speaking, some person whose name is known

and to whom reference can be readily made.

9. Clerks who are paid directly from "Personal Emoluments" Votes in the Government Estimates (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's, or Railway Departments, Draughtsmen and Stenographers), if within the age prescribed in these regulations will be admitted without fee, but they must have passed the examination or examinations prescribed by Regulation 7 above and provided their

- services since employment under Government have been throughout satisfactory.

  10. Clerks in Class III. of the General Clerical Service and clerks selected for appointment to Class III. of the General Clerical Service on the results of a General Clerical Service Examination and subsequently appointed to semi-Government Departments by arrangement with the Deputy Chief Secretary, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee, although they may not have passed the examination or examinations prescribed by regulation 7 above, provided they have completed three years' service before the date of the examination and provided their service has been throughout satisfactory. Their applications (in the same form) for admission to the examination must be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.
- 11. Clerks of the description given in Regulation 10 who fail to secure places in Class II. in the general competition will be allowed to compete amongst themselves for seven out of every thirty of the appointments offered for competition.

Withdrawals and Refunds.

12. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5 the value of stamps affixed to his application.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination, gives notices of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of 1 the value of stamps affixed to his application provided his form of admission to the examination is returned with his notice of withdrawal.

- (c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Director of Education at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.
  - (d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

Leave to Government Officers to attend Examination.

13. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education, leave to present themselves at the examination.

Subjects.

14. The subjects for examination are as follows:--

(1) English Language and Composition.

A one and half hour paper which will include an essay, a precis and questions to test the correct use of the English Language ... 150

(2) General Paper.

A two hour paper in three sections as follows :-

15. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the Vivâ Voce. The number to be called for the Vivâ Voce examination will be fixed by the Deputy Chief Secretary in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified. The Vivâ Voce examination will be held in Colombo.

### Medical Examination.

16. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

### REGULATIONS.

The regulations relating to the Ceylon Garrison Artillery of the Ceylon Defence Force, published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 8,265 of December 23, 1936, are hereby amended as follows:—



The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on April 17, 1937, at 8.45 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated April 14, 1937.

Present: Mr. T. A. Hodson, Chairman; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. Walter Beven; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

- 1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on March 20, 1937, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
- la. To receive a deputation from the Kandy Sports Club, on the subject of the Club's position as regards the booking of Bogambara Recreation Grounds for the next Rugby Football Season. (D 271.)

  The deputation was composed of Messrs. Hudson, Whitelow, Jardine, Campbell, Dr. Anthonisz and Dr. Haig.

Mr. Whitelow spoke on behalf of the Club. He gave a short account of the Club and its relations with the Council in the matter of upkeep of the grounds and suggested that though the agreement with the Club had been terminated as from June 1, 1937, the Club should in the interests of sport be given priority of bookings during the months May to August in each year from 1938 for Rugby Football fixtures. The Club also desired that if such priority were given it should continue for a long term of years.

The Chairman tabled letters received from the Kandy Club. The Queen's Hotel and the Mercantile Community in Kandy complaining of the loss of business as a result of the arrangement made to play rugger matches at Gampola,

instead of in Kandy during the present rugger season. Messrs. de Silva and Marikar speaking in their capacity as members of the Bogambara Grounds Special Committee, justified the action of the Council in cancelling the agreement with the Kandy Sports Club, stating that the ground had not been properly maintained by the Club. They pointed out that in the allotment of bookings the Kandy Sports Club had been very fairly dealt with.

The Chairman then moved that the Kandy Sports Club be given priority for a limited number of bookings not exceeding 12, for Rugby Football fixtures during the months of May to August in each year, provided applications were made by the Club on or before March 15 of each year. Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried unanimously.

The Chairman suggested that this privilege should not be abrogated for 10 years.

The members of the Bogambara Grounds Committee desired that it should be left to the Committee for decision.

After further discussion Mr. de Silva moved that the term during which the Kandy Sports Club should be given priority of bookings be decided by the Bogambara Grounds Committee. Mr. Marikar seconded.

The motion was put to the Meeting and was lost by 5 to 4. Ayes—Messrs. De Silva, Marikar, Soysa and Wijayatilake. Noes—The Chairman, Messrs. Beven, Bradley, Ismail and Dr. Godlieb.

The Chairman then moved that this Council inform the Kandy Sports Club that the priority granted will not be

abrogated for a period of 5 years. Mr. Beven seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried by 5 to 4. Ayes—The Chairman, Messrs. Beven, Bradley, Ismail Godlieb. Nocs.—Messrs. De Silva, Marikar, Soysa and Wijayatilake. and Dr. Godlieb.

# The Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, in terms of section 84 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, on Friday, May 7, 1937, at 5 p.m.

Present: Mr. T. A. Hodson, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. Walter Beven; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

Mr. Marikar made the following comments in regard to the minutes of the meeting of the Economy Committee held on April 22, 1937, copies of which had been furnished to the members of the Committee :-

- (1) The statement that the Committee desired the exact amount of compensation payable to Mr. Garment if his post were abolished as from December 31, 1937, to be computed was incorrect.
  - (2) The statement that the draft report tabled by the Chairman was accepted by the Committee was incorrect.(3) The reservation made by the members to submit further suggestions for consideration at the Council meeting
- was not mentioned in the minutes. The Chairman pointed out that as regards (1) the Committee definitely desired a computation to be made, as regards (2) the Chairman's draft report was accepted by the two members present with minor amendments and as regards (3) the Chairman was unaware that the right to make further suggestions was reserved except as regards Mr. Garment.

Mr. Soysa supported Mr. Marikar's contentions as regards (2) and (3).

2. To consider draft conditions for the lease of the Market grounds.

The Council resolved into Committee to consider the conditions. The Council's Lawyer, Mr. G. B. de Vos, was also present.

The Chairman read the conditions one by one and the suggestions made by Mr. Rust whom he had interviewed, and the conditions were passed subject to the following:-

(1) The deposit required on acceptance of tender should be limited to one year's rent.

(2) A minimum rent need not be indicated in the notice calling for tenders.

(3) A limited number of shops, the number and type to be approved by the Council, to be allowed.

(4) Amount to be expended on proposed buildings to be stated by tenderer.

The Council then resumed.

The Chairman moved—"That tenders be invited on the conditions approved." This was agreed to.

3. To consider the report of the Economy Committee. Mr. Ismail moved that consideration be deferred for May 10, as the members of the Economy Committee have not been able to complete their report embodying their suggestions. Mr. Marikar seconded.

This was agreed to subject to the report being submitted to the Chairman by 4 P.M. on May 8, at the latest.

4. To reconsider the question of salary levy in terms of the resolution passed at the Budget meeting held on

December 7, 1936.

The Chairman moved that the salary levy be removed as from April 1, 1937.

Mr. Marikar moved that consideration be deferred till May 10. Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.

The Chairman agreed to the proposal on the guarantee given by Messrs. Wijayatilake, Ismail, and Soysa that they would agree to restoration if the matter was deferred till May 10.

5. To table Mr. Mahadeva's report on the question of a water supply scheme for Kandy.—Tabled. Resolved that consideration be deferred for the General meeting fixed for May 15.

6. To table the Chairman's Administration Report for the year 1936.—Tabled.

7. Arrangements for the presentation of the Council's address to His Majesty King George VI at the Coronation. Resolved that the Chairman be deputed to present the address to His Excellency the Governor at the Queen's House on May 12 to be forwarded to His Majesty the King.

Before proceeding to the business of the meeting, the Chairman referred to item 1 (3) of the Minutes of the Special Meeting held on May 7, 1937, and stated that he was in error when he said that the Members did not reserve the right to make further suggestions at the Economy Committee Meeting held on April 22, 1937, when the Chairman's Draft Report was considered, and he expressed regret for his mistake.

2. To consider the Chairman's summary of the decisions of the Economy Committee, and the further report of four Members of the Committee dated May 8, 1937.

After certain general remarks had been made by the Chairman and Mr. de Silva, it was agreed that the recommendations contained in the further report of the four Members should be considered first individually.

### (1) ELECTRICITY DEPARTMENT.

Recommendation of four Members:—(a) We feel that two Electrical Engineers are redundant and therefore we recommend the immediate suppression of the post of the Chief Electrical Engineer, who draws a sum of Rs. 12,000 per annum excluding house and car allowances, which amount the Council is not justified in paying, and further recommend that the maximum salary attached to the post of the Municipal Electrical Engineer should not avoid Rs. 7 200 per annum. that the maximum salary attached to the post of the Municipal Electrical Engineer should not exceed Rs. 7,200 per annum.

Proceedings in Council:—Mr. de Silva moved that the recommendation be adopted and steps be taken as early as possible to dispense with the services of Mr. Mottram subject to payment of such compensation as was due to him on abolition of office. Mr. Marikar seconded.

Mr. Wijayatilake spoke in support of the motion while the Chairman, Mr. Beven and Mr. Bradley spoke against

the motion. The motion was put to the meeting and lost by the Chairman's casting vote.

roccedings in Council:-The Chairman pointed out that the number would be automatically reduced to three as the Municipal Electrical Engineer had now four Clerks and one Storekeeper, and the decision of the Economy Committee was to transfer two of them to fill existing vacancies in the Accounts Department at the Town Hall, temporarily.

Mr. de Silva pointed out that their enquiries disclosed that the highly paid Head Clerk had no work to do and moved that the recommendation be adopted. Mr. Marikar seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried by 6 to 4.

The division was as follows:—Ayes:—Messrs de Šilva, Marikar, Usoof Ismail, Soysa, Wijayatilake, and Ratwatte

Adigar. Noes:—The Chairman, Dr. Godlieb, Messrs. Beven and Bradiey.

The Chairman stated that if he found the decision impracticable, he would report the matter to the Commissioner of Local Government.

Recommendation of four Members:—(c) That the Electrical Storekeeper's post should be abolished in view of our recommendation that all Municipal goods of whatever nature should be stored in one place under one Storekeeper.

Proceedings in Council:—Mr. de Silva moved that the designation of "Storekeeper" should be removed from the

Electricity Office staff and that the Electricity Stores and General Stores should be kept in one central store. Mr. Marikar seconded

Mr. Bradley pointed out that Electricity Stores should be readily available to the Engineer in case of a break-down and they should not be removed from the Power House.

Proceedings in Council:—Municipal Electrical Engineer was called before the meeting and questioned as regards

the duties of the Installation Inspector and a suggestion was made that his duties should be added to those of the Assistant Municipal Electrical Engineer. The Chairman moved the Council into Committee to consider the further mendations. This was agreed to.

Proceedings of Council in Committee:—Resolved unanimously that the post of Installation Inspector be abolished recommendations.

We are further of opinion that Mr. Garment is not entitled to claim any compensation in view of, inter alia, (i.) the report of the Engineering Assistant, P. W. D., dated March 22, 1937, on the Kandy Waterworks River Pumping Scheme; (ii.) the unsatisfactory nature of the Principal Capital Works carried out under his supervision.

Proceedings of Council in Committee :--Comments made by the Engineering Assistant, P. W. D., (Mr. Mahadeva) in his report as regards the execution of the Minor (River) Pumping Scheme were considered and it was agreed that they did not reflect on Mr. Garment.

The Chairman moved that the office of "Municipal Engineer" be abolished with effect from February 1, 1938. and Mr. Garment be retired with the compensation due to him on abolition of 'Office' and that he be further granted seven months' full pay leave (vacation and commuted) commencing from July 1, 1937, with Rs. 600 towards the cost of a single passage home, the total payments due to him under this arrangement being as follows:-



Dry cells and processes for making the same.

Abstract.—This invention relates to dry cells such as are used for flash lights, which are provided with thin covers generally of metal. In the usual type, a brass cap fits on the centre carbon electrode having a flange which bears on an insulating washer; the metal closure is firmly fixed to the container electrode and rests on the other side of said washer. It is stated that a disadvantage in such cells has been that the creepage of salts along the cover and between the cover and electrode led to internal short circuiting and destruction of the cell. The invention proposes to avoid this by covering the whole or portion of the closure and electrodes with moisture repelling substance which prevents the creepage. This is accomplished by means of either (1) a thermoplastic substance in the form of a washer which is fitted inside the cell during assembly, the cell being then inverted and heat applied thereto or (2) a Thermoplastic substance applied hot, the cell being then inverted and left to cool, (3) a ploymerisable substance which is applied before closure, the cell being inverted and left till reaction is
