THE TRUSTS ORDINANCE, NO. 9 OF 1917.

Order under Section 114.

WHEREAS the Dutch Burgher Union Board of the Dutch Burgher Union (hereinafter referred to as "The said Union") hold certain monies and property as Trustees in Trust for "The said Union" the object of which is to promote the moral, intellectual and social well being of the Dutch descendants in Ceylon and to serve purposes allied thereto as set forth in the Constitution of the said Union.

And whereas the members of the said Dutch Burgher Union Board, namely:

Dr. Richard Lionel Spittel, President
Durand Victor Altendorff, Secretary and
William Wright Beling, Treasurer

have applied to the Governor for their incorporation under section 114 of the Trusts Ordinance, No. 9 of 1917.

Now therefore by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by the aforesaid section and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Reginald Edward Stubbs, Governor of Ceylon do by this Order authorize the Incorporation of the said Dutch Burgher Union Board and direct and declare subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule hereto

- (a) That the said Board and their successors for the time being duly appointed under the Constitution of the said Union be a body corporate with perpetual succession under the name and style of "The Dutch Burgher Union Board"
- (b) That by that name and style they may receive, take, hold and dispose of all descriptions of property both movable and immovable on behalf of "The said Union" and
- (c) That they shall be able and competent in law to sue and be sued, to answer and be answered, in any Court or elsewhere in all causes and actions to which "The said Union" is a party.

SCHEDULE.

Conditions.

1. The said Dutch Burgher Union Board shall have and use a corporate seal such seal being only affixed in the presence of the President, the Secretary and Treasurer, and in the absence of any one of them of another member appointed for the purpose in his stead by a vote of the Board for the time being, and the Officers and Members so appointed shall sign their names to the instrument in token of their presence.

2. The monies and property now held by "The said Union" or the said Dutch Burgher Union Board and all monies and other property which may hereafter be acquired by them or the said Dutch Burgher Union Board for the time being shall be vested in the said Dutch Burgher Union Board for the time being with full authority subject to the sanction of the Committee of "The said Union" to invest the same on such security as they may deem fit or otherwise utilize them for the purposes of "The said Union".

3. The said Dutch Burgher Union Board and their successors appointed in accordance with the Constitution of "The said Union" shall hold office for such period as the Constitution of "The said Union" shall prescribe provided that it shall be lawful for any member of the said Board to resign at any time and provided further that on a member of the said Board vacating his office as President, Secretary, or Treasurer, as the case may be of the said Union, he shall cease to be a member of the said board.

4. The accounts of "The said Dutch Burgher Union Board" for the year ending December 31st of each year duly audited by its Auditors shall be published in the Gazette.

5. The office bearers of "The said Union" shall inter alia be a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, elected in accordance with the Constitution of "The said Union".

6. A general meeting of the said Union may from time to time revoke and amend the Constitution of "The said Union" and make amend and revoke new rules for the proper working of "The said Union" and the management, regulation, and control of all its affairs provided that no such rules shall be inconsistent with these "Conditions".

7. This order may be revoked or from time to time be varied, amended, or altered by the Governor.

Text of the Convention.

CONVENTION BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY IN RESPECT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE CONVENTION OF NOVEMBER 11, 1924, TO FACILITATE THE CONDUCT OF LEGAL PROCEEDINGS.

Prague, February 15, 1935.

[Ratifications exchanged at London on July 30, 1935.]

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and The President of the Czechoslovak Republic, being desirous of supplementing the Convention concluded between them for the purpose of facilitating the conduct of legal proceedings which was signed at London on the 11th November, 1924; (1)

Have resolved to conclude a Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Sir Joseph Addison, K.C.M.G., His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Prague, and The President of the Czechoslovak Republic:

Dr. Kamil Krofta, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary, and

Dr. Antonin Koukal, Counsellor in the Ministry of Justice,

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:

I. Preliminary.

ARTICLE 1.

In this Convention the words:

(1) "Territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be interpreted:

(a) in relation to His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, as meaning England and Wales and all territories in respect of which the Convention is in force by reason of extensions under article 8 or accessions under article 9; and

(b) in relation to the Czechoslovak Republic, Czechoslovakia.

(2) "Subjects (or citizens) of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be deemed:

(a) in relation to His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, to mean all subjects of His Majesty wherever domiciled, and all persons under his protection;

(b) in relation to the Czechoslovak Republic to mean all Czechoslovak citizens; and

(c) in relation to both High Contracting Parties shall be deemed to include partnerships, companies, societies and other corporations constituted or incorporated under the laws of the territory of that High Contracting Party.

II. Specific Provisions.

ARTICLE 2.

Legal Protection and Access to the Courts of Justice.

The subjects (or citizens) of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territory of the other the same rights in respect of the legal protection of persons or property and shall have free access to the courts of justice for the prosecution or defence of their rights under the same conditions (including the taxes and fees payable) as subjects (or citizens) of the latter High Contracting Party.

ARTICLE 3.

Security for Costs.

The subjects (or citizens) of one High Contracting Party resident in the territory of the other shall not be obliged to give security for costs or court fees in any case where the subjects (or citizens) of the latter High Contracting Party would not be so obliged in similar circumstances.

ARTICLE 4.

Free Legal Assistance.

(1) The subjects (or citizens) of one High Contracting Party shall in the territory of the other enjoy free legal assistance in the same manner as subjects (or citizens) of the latter High Contracting Party, provided they comply with the requirements of the law of the territory where application for free legal assistance is made.

(2) This article applies to criminal as well as to civil and commercial matters.

ARTICLE 5.

Imprisonment for Debt.

The subjects (or citizens) of one High Contracting Party shall not in the territory of the other High Contracting Party be liable to imprisonment as a means of execution for debt or as a conservatory measure in any case where the subjects (or citizens) of the latter would not be so liable.

III.—General Provisions.

ARTICLE 6.

Many difficulties which may arise in connection with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

ARTICLE 7.

The present Convention, of which the English and Czechoslovak texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification.

Ratifications shall be exchanged in London. The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it.

ARTICLE 8.

(1) This Convention shall not apply *ipso facto* to Scotland or Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, nor to any of the Colonies, Overseas Territories or Protectorates of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, nor to any territories under his suzerainty, nor to any mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by his Government in the United Kingdom, but His Majesty may at any time, while this Convention is in force under article 7 by a notification given through his representative at Prague, extend the operation of the Convention to any of the above-mentioned territories.

(2) The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.

(3) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (1) of this article terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.

(4) The termination of the Convention under article 7 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, *ipso facto* terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph (1) of this article.

ARTICLE 9.

(1) The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under article 7 or by virtue of any accession under this article, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any member of the British Commonwealth of Nations whose Government may desire that such accession should be effected, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when the President of the Czechoslovak Republic has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Majesty to which the Convention applies. Any such accession shall take effect one month after the date of its notification.

(2) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (1) of this article, either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the

Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under article 7 shall not affect its application to any such country.

(3) Any notification of accession under paragraph (1) of this article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given; and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph (2) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification of accession in respect of that country.

REGULATION.

The regulations relating to the Transit of Forest Produce published in *Gazette* No. 8,057 of June 8, 1934, as amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,059 of June 15, 1934, are hereby further amended in regulation 5 thereof by the substitution, for all the words from "under the provisions" to "may not be removed without a pass", of the words "for the purposes of section 24 (1) (b) of the Ordinance, as an area within or beyond the limits of which timber of any species specified in that Notification may not when it is obtained from any private land, be removed without a pass."

IT is hereby notified that the persons whose names appear in the schedule annexed hereto have been appointed members of the Divisional Agricultural Associations constituted in terms of the Report of the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands, approved by the State Council and ratified by His Excellency the Governor.

The Whaling Regulations, 1937.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Whaling Regulations, 1937.

2. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

“the Ordinance” means the Whaling Ordinance No. 2 of 1936;

“whale fishery inspector” means the person appointed by the Governor under section 8 of the Ordinance to be or to act as a whale fishery inspector.

3. (1) Every application for a licence under the Ordinance shall be in the form set out in Schedule A hereto.

(2) Every applicant shall in addition satisfy the Marine Biologist that he possesses or commands sufficient working capital to ensure the proper conduct of the operations for which the licence is required.

4. (1) Every application for a licence authorizing the use of a vessel for the purpose of taking whales shall be accompanied by a fee of one thousand rupees.

(2) Every application for a licence authorizing the use of a vessel or factory for the purpose of treating whales shall be accompanied by a fee of two thousand rupees.

5. Every licence shall be in such one of the forms set out in Schedule B hereto as may be appropriate to the purpose for which the licence is required.

6. (1) For the purposes of section 3 of the Ordinance—

- (a) a sperm whale shall be deemed to be immature, if it is of a length less than 25 feet;
- (b) a blue whale shall be deemed to be immature, if it is of a length less than 60 feet;
- (c) a fin whale shall be deemed to be immature, if it is of a length less than 50 feet.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation the length of a whale shall be the length measured from the tip of the snout to the notch between the flukes of the tail.

7. (1) No person shall appropriate any derelict whale of which he may be entitled to take possession by virtue of section 9 (1) of the Ordinance unless he has, within 24 hours of discovering the whale, given notice of his intention to appropriate the whale to the chief headman of the division in which the whale is found.

(2) Every person who has appropriated a derelict whale in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this regulation shall—

- (a) within such time as may be fixed by the chief headman of the division in which the whale was found, and in a manner that does not amount to a nuisance, dispose of the whole carcase of the whale without waste; and
- (b) pay to the Marine Biologist on demand, as royalty, ten per centum of the commercial value of the whale, as determined by the whale fishery inspector.

1. This licence is not transferable.
2. The remuneration of the gunners and crew of the whale-taking vessel authorized under this licence shall, so far as it is calculated by reference to the results of their work, be calculated by reference to the oil yield and value of the whales, and in such manner as shall exclude remuneration in respect of the following whales the taking of which is prohibited under the Ordinance :—

- (a) any right whale;
- (b) any female whale accompanied by a calf;
- (c) any sperm whale of length less than 25 feet;
- (d) any blue whale of length less than 60 feet;
- (e) any fin whale of length less than 50 feet.

3. The licensee shall not without the sanction of the whale fishery inspector, commence to use the vessel specified in this licence for the purpose of taking whales, until the factory for which that vessel operates is ready to treat immediately such whales as may be taken.

4. The whale fishery inspector may by order in writing prohibit the licensee from using the vessel specified in this licence for the purpose of taking whales, if in his opinion the further taking of whales would lead to a wastage of whales or whale products.

1. This licence is not transferable.

2. The licensee shall maintain in a manner to be approved by the Marine Biologist a record of his operations during the period of his licence, and shall on or before the date of the termination of this licence forward a certified copy of such record to the Marine Biologist. Such record shall state *inter alia* the following particulars:—

- (a) in respect of each whale treated in the vessel or factory specified herein, details as to—
- (i.) date and place of taking;
 - (ii.) species and sex;
 - (iii.) length measured from the tip of the snout to the notch between the flukes of the tail if the whale is taken out of the water, or estimated length if cut up in the water;
 - (iv.) length and sex, if ascertainable, of any foetus present;
 - (v.) contents of stomach if ascertainable;
- (b) (i.) the number and description of whales treated in the vessel or factory specified herein;
- (ii.) the number of gallons of oil of each grade obtained;
 - (iii.) the quantity of baleen obtained;
 - (iv.) the quantity of meal obtained;
 - (v.) the quantity of guano manufactured;
 - (vi.) the nature and quantity of any other products obtained.

3. The licensee shall equip the vessel or factory specified herein with plant of a type approved by the Marine Biologist for the extraction of oil from blubber, flesh and bones of whales, and shall keep the plant in good order and efficiently operated.

4. (1) Except in the case of a whale or part of a whale intended to be used for human food, the licensee shall extract oil, by boiling or otherwise from all blubber and from the head and tongue and from the tail as far forward as the outer opening of the lower intestine.

(2) In the case of a land factory the licensee shall make adequate arrangements for utilizing all residue left after the extraction of oil.

5. The number of frenched whale carcasses waiting to be treated at any one time in the vessel or factory specified herein shall not exceed twelve.

*6. If there is in force, in respect of the vessel specified herein, a licence authorizing that vessel to be used for the purpose of taking whales, no pressure boilers on that vessel shall be used for the storage of oil until the taking of whales under that licence has ceased.

*7. The licensee shall not moor whales in any bay or anchorage adjacent to the land factory specified herein without the permission in writing of the whale fishery inspector.

THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892.

REGULATIONS under sections 9c (3) and 9e (2) of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892, made by the Sanitary Board of the District of Kandy and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said sections and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall take water from any public stand-pipe—
 - (a) in any vessel other than a bucket or other similar receptacle; or
 - (b) in such manner as to cause any water to flow into any drain or side channel, or on to the surface of any road, footpath, or land adjoining any road or footpath.
2. No person shall attach any hose-pipe, pipe, tube, shoot or other contrivance of any nature whatsoever either temporarily or permanently to any public stand-pipe.
3. No person shall interfere with the automatic self-closing valve or other automatic appliance attached to or

forming part of any public standpipe, or do any other act likely to prevent either temporarily or permanently the automatic action of such valve or appliance.

4. No person shall take water from a public standpipe for other than domestic purposes.

5. No person shall bathe or wash any part of his body or wash any animal or any vehicle, clothes, utensil, or other article whatsoever, at or near any reservoir, standpipe, fountain, cistern, pipe, or other waterworks for the time being vested in or maintained by the Board.

6. (1) No person shall construct a new private service or alter or extend any such service connected to the waterworks of the Board—

- (a) unless he has made application to the Chairman, not less than one month before the date on which the proposed construction, alteration, or extension is to be commenced, and obtained the written permission of the Chairman for the purpose; and
- (b) except in accordance with the instructions of the Chairman or of some person authorized by the Chairman in that behalf.

(2) No private service shall be connected to the waterworks of the Board except under the supervision and in the immediate presence of the Chairman or of some person duly authorized by him.

7. The cost of any construction, alteration, or extension of any private service shall be borne by the applicant, notwithstanding that the work may have been carried out by the Board.

8. No person shall construct, alter, or extend any private service, unless the Chairman has approved—

- (a) the quality and dimensions of pipes to be used and the manner in which they shall be laid;
- (b) the number, size, pattern, and position of taps to be used; and
- (c) the quality and types of fittings to be used.

9. (1) Any excavation across any public road for the purpose of laying pipes shall be made by sections, and due warning of the existence of any such excavation shall be given both by day and by night. Every such excavation shall be closed up within three days of its being made.

(2) Where any pipe runs across any road which is in charge of the Public Works Department, the pipe shall be laid two feet below the surface of the road, the trench shall be filled up with rubble and the surface of the road restored with metal and tar in a manner approved by the District Engineer of the Kandy District.

10. Every private service shall be provided with an efficient stopcock, of a type approved by the Chairman, which shall be either (a) fixed underground as near as practicable to the premises for which such service is provided, and shall be covered with a cast iron cover and lid, in such manner that it may at all times be accessible; or (b) fixed above ground in some readily accessible place within the building as near as possible to one of its entrances.

11. No pipe, valve, or other fitting forming part of a private service shall be covered up until it has been inspected and tested by the Chairman or some person duly authorized thereto by him.

12. Every service pipe provided for a private service from the street main up to and including the stopcock shall be deemed for all purposes to be the property of the Board.

13. For the supply of water to any premises within the same curtilage and assessed by the Board as one property, not more than one service pipe shall be connected with the waterworks of the Board without written permission from the Chairman.

14. No person shall cause or permit water drawn from any private service to be used for the purposes of any trade, manufacture, or business, or for the use of cattle, horses, or poultry, or for any ornamental or mechanical purpose, or for purposes of irrigation, without written permission from the Chairman. No private service pipe shall be directly connected with any boiler, condenser, or other mechanical appliance without written permission from the Chairman.

15. Whenever water is found running to waste from any tap, pipe, meter, or other fitting forming part of any private service, the Chairman or any person duly authorized by him in writing may forthwith disconnect that service from the waterworks of the Board, and such service shall not be reconnected until the cause of the waste is remedied.

16. (1) In any case in which the Chairman is satisfied that the arrangement, size, position, nature, or condition of any pipe, tap, valve, meter, or other fitting forming part of any private service is likely to lead to waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water provided from the waterworks of the Board, or is likely to be prejudicial to the proper control and distribution of water from the waterworks, the Chairman may serve a notice upon the owner or occupier of the premises provided with the

private service, directing him to make such alterations as may be specified in the notice; and in the event of such alteration not being made or caused to be made by the owner or occupier to the satisfaction of the Chairman within the period prescribed in the notice, it shall be lawful for the Chairman forthwith to disconnect that service from the waterworks of the Board.

(2) In the event of the name or residence of the owner of any premises being unknown, the notice referred to in paragraph (1) shall be deemed to be duly served on the owner if it is affixed on a conspicuous place upon the premises to which it relates.

17. Where any damage is caused to the stopcock of any private service, such stopcock shall be repaired to the satisfaction of the Chairman, at the cost of the owner or occupier of the premises for which such service is provided; and the Chairman may discontinue the supply of water to such premises until such repairs are made.

18. The Chairman may withhold, suspend, or diminish the supply of water to any premises or disconnect the private service pipe on any premises from the waterworks of the Board—

- (a) at the request of the owner or occupier of such premises; or
- (b) if default is made in the payment of any money due under the provisions of these regulations from the owner or the occupier of such premises; or
- (c) if the construction or any alteration of such service pipe by the owner or occupier of such premises is not carried out in accordance with the provisions of these regulations; or
- (d) if any act or thing is done or omitted to be done by the owner or by the occupier of such premises contrary to the provisions of these regulations relating to damage to or pollution of the waterworks or waste or abuse of the water.

19. The cost of reconnecting any private service which has been disconnected for any reason whatsoever shall be borne by the owner or occupier of the premises for which the service is provided.

20. The approval of any private service pipe or fittings or the grant of any permission or concession under these regulations to the owner or occupier of any premises fitted with a private service, shall not be deemed for any purpose to attach to the Board or to the Chairman any liability for any damage caused by the bursting of any part of the service pipe or by the overflow of water from any part of such service.

21. (1) A charge at the rate of Rs. 10 per half-inch tap per annum shall be made in respect of every private service and shall be paid in advance to the Board by the owner or occupier of the premises in addition to any water rate levied under section 9B (1) of the Ordinance.

(2) It shall be lawful for the Chairman in his discretion to waive or reduce the charge specified in paragraph (1), in any case in which he is satisfied that such private service is of public utility, and to rescind such waiver or reduction at any time.

(3) If any charges or other moneys due to the Board are not paid in accordance with these regulations by the owner or occupier of any premises connected to the waterworks of the Board, such dues shall be recoverable in the manner provided by section 9B (2) of the Ordinance.

22. (1) Every cistern to which water is supplied from the waterworks of the Board shall be provided with—

- (a) an "equilibrium" ball-valve of a pattern approved by the Chairman and so adjusted as to close the supply when the level of the water in the cistern is two inches below the opening of the overflow pipe;
- (b) an inlet or supply pipe fixed above the water level of the cistern; and
- (c) an overflow pipe which shall be led to the outside of the building in which the cistern is situated, and shall terminate in a conspicuous place where any leakage may easily be detected.

(2) No overflow pipe of any cistern shall be connected with any drain or sewer or with the waste pipe of any bath, sink, or any other sanitary appliance, or with the overflow pipe of any other cistern.

23. The outlet of every draw off tap shall be in some open and conspicuous place where leakage may be easily detected, and shall be below the top water-level in any cistern, tank, or other vessel into which the tap delivers water.

24. The inlet of every bath, lavatory, basin, or sink shall be separate and distinct from the outlet, and the inlet shall be situated at the top of or above such bath, lavatory, basin, or sink.

25. No person shall cause or permit the water in any reservoir, fountain, cistern, standpipe, pipes, or other

waterworks belonging to the Board to be in any degree polluted, fouled, or diminished; and no person shall in any way damage or tamper with any such works.

26. The Chairman may diminish, withhold, suspend, stop, turn off, or divert the supply of water through or by means of any pipe, service, public fountain, or other appliance connected to the waterworks of the Board whenever the Chairman is satisfied—

- (a) that the water available from the waterworks of the Board is insufficient; or
- (b) that such action is expedient or necessary for the purpose of extending, altering, or repairing the mains or waterworks of the Board, or for the purpose of the connection of any water service;
- (c) that such action is expedient or necessary by reason of any damage caused to a public standpipe or any pollution or waste of the water thereof; or
- (d) that damage is caused, or likely to be caused, to the waterworks by an outbreak of fire.

27. Where the Chairman acting under the powers conferred by any of these regulations withholds, suspends, diverts, stops, turns off, diminishes, or in any other way interferes with the supply of water through any public pipe, service, fountain, or other appliance or the supply of water to any private premises, such action shall not in any way affect or prejudice the water rate levied under the provisions of the Ordinance or any payment made or due or to become due under these regulations.

28. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

- "Board" means the Sanitary Board of the District of Kandy;
- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board;
- "Ordinance" means the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892;
- "private service" means a water service on any private premises connected to the waterworks of the Board.

29. The regulations under section 9C (3) of the Ordinance made by the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District, and published in *Gazette* No. 7,632 of March 2, 1928, are hereby repealed.

GENERAL.

Local Authorities : Urban District Council, Chilaw.—The position with regard to the repayment of the loan remains the same as in 1934-35 except for the payment of a sum of Rs. 11,844·60 as balance interest on the loan for the year 1933 and part payment of interest for 1934. The amount due as instalment and interest in respect of the loan at the end of September 30, 1936, was Rs. 64,129·81. The question of the commencement of the repayment of loan has been deferred until the Purification Plant has been fully installed. According to a report from the Director of Public Works this work will be completed by the end of September, 1937.

Co-operative Societies : The Jaffna White Burley Co-operative Sale Society, Ltd.—At the end of September 30, 1936, a sum of Rs. 10,965·97 remained unpaid of which Rs. 10,308·33 represents principal and the balance Rs. 657·64 interest. The Registrar of Co-operative Societies has forwarded an application to the Hon. the Minister for Agriculture and Lands for a vote in the State Council to meet the loss and for a settlement of the amount due to the Fund in view of the assurance given by the State Council to make good any loss not exceeding a sum of Rs. 20,000.

The Jaffna Malayalam Tobacco Co-operative Sale Society, Ltd.—Loans have been granted to this Society for financing the tobacco crop for 1934, 1935, and 1936 and the Board of Ministers have agreed to make good any loss in the transaction by a vote from the State Council. The position at the end of September, 1936, was that a sum of Rs. 590,000 had been advanced for this purpose, of which Rs. 140,000 was in respect of 1934 crop, Rs. 230,000 for 1935, and Rs. 220,000 for 1936. The loan for 1934 crop has been settled in full and a further sum of Rs. 15,572·69 in part repayment of the loan for 1935 crop, thus leaving a balance of Rs. 434,427·31 outstanding on that date.

Other Co-operative Societies.—On September 30, 1936, a sum of Rs. 4,806·94 representing instalment and interest on loans was outstanding in respect of 57 societies, of which 13 societies are in liquidation and consequently the settlement of the loans is overdue.

Government Servants.—During the year under review as a result of defaults in repayment of loans, the Commissioners were compelled to purchase at Fiscal's sales two properties mortgaged to the Commissioners. These properties are situated one at Nugegoda and the other at Kelaniya. The one at Kelaniya is being transferred to an officer in the Railway Department.

Appropriation of the Net Profit of the Fund.—To assist in the balancing of the budget for 1936-37, the Board of Ministers have resolved that the net income of the Local Loans and Development Fund for the year 1935-36 should be transferred to revenue. Their resolution was submitted to His Excellency the Governor and he has ordered, in terms of section 7 (3) (b) of Ordinance No. 22 of 1916, the transfer to general revenue of the sum of Rs. 262,416·11 being the net profit of the Fund for the year 1935-36.

A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 18 nor more than 22 years of age on August 1, 1937, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General, must be attached to the form of application.

(ii.) Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iii.) Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv.) In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian, in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895, and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v.) If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, a certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor, or Notary, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

9. (a) Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department, who joined subsequent to 1919 and

prior to 1934, and who have completed three years' service and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible to enter for the examination, irrespective of the age and preliminary educational qualifications, &c., laid down in paragraph 7 and without fee.

(b) They will be allowed to compete amongst themselves for not more than 50 per cent. of the vacancies advertised above for Class II., and will be eligible for promotion if they obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. in each of the subjects laid down in paragraph 13.

(c) Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. appointed subsequent to 1934, on completion of 3 years' satisfactory service will be allowed to compete with the above for the same vacancies, but will have to obtain a minimum of 50 per cent. in each of the subjects.

10. All Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department will always be allowed to compete on the same terms as outsiders but without fee if they fulfil all the necessary conditions as regards age, qualifications, &c.

Withdrawals and Refunds.

11. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5 the value of stamps affixed to his entry.

(b) (i.) Except in cases referred to in Regulation 11 (a) no refund will be made, but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in the Surveyor-General's Office, Colombo, by July 27, 1937, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination, without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the Regulations are complied with in other respects.

(ii.) Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers as in (i.) provided the notice of withdrawal is received in the Surveyor-General's Office, Colombo, before the examination commences, and is accompanied by the approved application form and a medical certificate from a qualified Medical Officer.

Leave to Government Officers to attend Examination.

12. Heads of Departments are requested to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Surveyor-General, leave to present themselves at the examination.

Subjects.

13. The subjects for examination are as follows:—

(1) English Language and Composition. Marks.

A one and a half hour paper which will include an essay, a precis and questions to test the correct use of the English Language 150

(2) General Paper.

A two hour paper in three sections as follows:—

- 20 minutes. A test of accuracy with figures including Tots and additions of various kinds 150
- 50 minutes. A test of general intelligence ..
- 50 minutes. A test of general and local knowledge ..

(3) Draughtsmanship or Typewriting, as alternative subjects, i.e. only one is to be taken and candidates must state clearly which of the two they select.

(a) Draughtsmanship—a three hour paper—Each candidate will be required to ink up in Indian Ink the faint outline of the plan supplied. A specimen of the type of plan to be inked up can be examined by prospective candidates at S. G. O. and at the Provincial Survey Offices at Galle, Kandy, Kurunegala, Anuradhapura, Ratnapura, and Badulla (candidates are required to bring Indian Ink and drawing materials) 150

(b) Typewriting—Candidates will be required to type accurately from a given document. The time taken will be taken into consideration in marking the paper. (Candidates are required to bring their own typewriters) 150

(4) *Viva Voce* Test 75

14. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination under heads (1) to (3) above is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the *viva voce* under head (4). The number to be called for the *viva voce* examination will be fixed by the Surveyor-General in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified. The *viva voce* examination will be held in Colombo.

Medical Examination.

15. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

Salaries, &c.

16. Candidates, on selection, will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve on probation for a period of three years in the Department. Each candidate will during such period diligently and efficiently discharge all duties which he may be required to do and shall enter into a bond for the payment of (Rs. 450) Rupees Four hundred and Fifty, in the event of leaving the Department before the expiration of three years. He shall be bound by all rules and regulations applicable for the time being to the Department. The appointments are pensionable; officers do not however acquire pension rights until they are confirmed on the satisfactory completion of their period of probation.

17. Appointments to Class II. will be made on the salary scale of Rs. 720 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 103, to Rs. 2,448 per annum with Efficiency Bars and two years' halts at Rs. 1,260 and Rs. 1,800 respectively; appointments to Class III. on Rs. 480, per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 30 to Rs. 1,200 per annum with Efficiency Bars before Rs. 660, 840, and 1,020. Leave and Holiday Warrants in accordance with the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934. No rent allowance is payable to new entrants to the Public Service and economic rent will be charged if Government quarters are allotted.

18. Clerks and Draughtsmen are required to pass a test in Draughtsmanship before they are eligible for their first increment. Facilities for training in Draughtsmanship are provided by the Department.

19. (a) (1) A Departmental "Test", entirely on departmental subjects, will be held at the same time, and may be taken by the Class III. officers specified in paragraphs 9 (a) and 9 (c), as an alternative to the "outside" examination referred to in those paragraphs. The syllabus of the "Test" will be published departmentally and the "Test" will be held entirely by the Survey Department. Old Entrants and New Entrants alike, must obtain a minimum of 50 per cent. of the marks in each of the subjects taken and satisfy the examiners that they have attained a sufficiently high standard in all their subjects before they can be passed. The whole examination must be taken at once each time and subjects cannot be taken singly or in groups. Successful candidates must be suitable for the promotion in every way, in addition to passing the examination, before they can be promoted to Class II.

(2) The number of vacancies to be allotted to the candidates being examined under each of the paragraphs 9 (a), 9 (c), and 19 (a) (1) above will be in proportion to the number of candidates entered under each of these paragraphs, amounting in the aggregate to 50 per cent. of the total vacancies, as laid down in paragraph 9 (b).

(b) Class II. officers recruited from outside and appointed under these regulations will be confirmed in their appointments only after they pass a test in Departmental subjects, of the same standard as that referred to in (a) above.

(c) Promotion of Clerks and Draughtsmen appointed under these regulations, over the first Efficiency Bar in Class II. will be by a higher test somewhat similar in nature to the one in (b) above. Any or all the subjects may be taken at one sitting.

Abstract.—The inventors state that in a known process of this kind cotton fabrics are immersed in an ammoniacal solution of copper for a definite period of time, and afterwards hot-pressed between rollers to modify their properties. According to the invention described in this specification, however, fabrics (pretreated to modify their absorbent qualities) are allowed to take up only a limited quantity of the solution. This is accomplished either by spraying the fabrics or immersing them for a short time in a bath, generally for 10-60 seconds. The fabrics are then passed between rollers to remove excess solution, thereafter they are treated with acid, washed and dried. It is claimed that this treatment may be applied to all fabrics, whether bleached or unbleached and whether mercerised or unmercerised, and that a fine and linen-like finish can be obtained.
