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## PASSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

No. 18 of 1936.

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 28 of 1871, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the Registration of Domestic Servants".

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Registration of Domestic Servants (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 18 of 1936.

Amendment of section 1 of Ordinance No. 28 of 1871.

2 Section 1 of Ordinance No. 28 of 1871, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), is hereby amended by the substitution for the words "This Ordinance", of the words "This Ordinance may be cited as the Registration of Domestic Servants Ordinance, No. 28 of 1871, and".

Insertion of new section 15A in the principal Ordinance.

3 The following section is hereby inserted immediately after section 15 of the principal Ordinance and shall have effect as section 15A of that Ordinance :—

Registrar authorised to enter convictions in pocket register of servants.

15A Where a servant has at any time been convicted by a court of any offence specified in the Schedule, it shall be lawful for the Registrar to enter particulars of such conviction in the pocket register of that servant. Every entry so made shall be authenticated by the signature of the Registrar who may, if he thinks fit, draw attention to such entry by one or more endorsements made in that pocket register in writing or by means of a rubber or other stamp.

Addition of a Schedule to the principal Ordinance.

4 The following Schedule is hereby added to the principal Ordinance immediately after section 22 thereof :—

## DRAFT ORDINANCES.

### MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

#### An Ordinance to amend the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Government Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1936.

Short title.

2 Section 55 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, is hereby amended as follows :—

Amendment of section 55 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920.

- (1) by the renumbering of that section as sub-section (1) of section 55 ; and
- (2) by the addition of the following new sub-section as sub-section (2) of that section :—

“(2) Subject to such directions as may be given by the Governor from time to time by Order published in the Gazette, each District Council shall be the administrative authority for the purposes of the protection of any principal thoroughfares that may be situate within the administrative limits of that Council, and shall be entitled for such purposes to exercise or perform, in relation to any such principal thoroughfare, any of the powers or duties conferred or imposed by sections 84 to 104 (both inclusive), relating to buildings along thoroughfares, obstructions to thoroughfares, encroachments on thoroughfares, injuries to thoroughfares and nuisances on thoroughfares.”

#### *Objects and Reasons.*

When the Governor, by Proclamation under section 8 of the Road Ordinance, 1861, declares any road to be a principal thoroughfare, the power to deal with any encroachments that may be made on any part of it which is situated within the administrative limits of a Municipal Council or a Local Board is vested by section 4A of that Ordinance in such Council or Board. An Urban District Council, however, even where it is the successor of a Local Board, cannot be said to be vested with this power, in view of the terms of section 239 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, which provides that from the date on which an Urban District Council is established in any area the Road Ordinance shall, for the purposes of that area, be repealed. Further, the power given to an Urban District Council by sections 84 to 104 of the Local Government Ordinance to deal with

encroachments on and obstruction or injuries to thoroughfares, is expressly limited to those thoroughfares which are under the control of the Council; and sections 55 and 57 make it clear that an Urban District Council is not the general administrative authority for the purposes of principal thoroughfares and that these thoroughfares are not vested in such a Council.

2. It has been decided, therefore, that the responsibility for the prevention and removal of encroachments and obstruction in the case of principal thoroughfares within an urban area should, as in the case of ordinary thoroughfares, be undertaken by the Urban District Council of that area. The object of this Bill is to make the necessary amendment, and clause 2 sets out the new sub-section which is to be inserted in section 55 of the Local Government Ordinance for the purpose.

### MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

#### An Ordinance to prohibit the employment of females on underground work in mines.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Mines (Prohibition of Female Labour Underground) Ordinance, No. of 1936.

Prohibition of employment of females on underground work in mines.

2 (1) No female, of any age, shall at any time—

- (a) perform or be employed on any underground work in any mine; or
- (b) enter or remain in the underground parts of any mine for the performance of any work therein.

(2) Nothing in sub-section (1) shall apply to any female or any class of females exempted by regulation from the prohibition contained in that sub-section.

Power of Executive Committee to exempt classes of females from operation of section 2 (1).

3 The Executive Committee may, by regulation, exempt from the prohibition contained in section 2 (1) all or any of the following classes of females:—

- (a) females holding positions of management who do not perform manual work;
- (b) females employed in health and welfare services;
- (c) females who in the course of their studies spend a period of training in the underground parts of a mine;
- (d) any other females who may occasionally have to enter the underground parts of a mine for the purpose of a non-manual occupation.

Regulations.

4 (1) The Executive Committee may make regulations for or in respect of all or any of the following matters:—

- (a) the definition or description of any class of females which may be exempted under section 3;
- (b) the issue to females of any class exempted under section 3 of permits to enter, work, or remain in the underground parts of any mine;
- (c) the terms and conditions upon which and the persons by whom such permits shall be issued;
- (d) the inspection of mines for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this Ordinance or of any regulation made thereunder; and
- (e) all matters incidental to or connected with the matters or subjects specifically referred to in this sub-section.

(2) Every regulation made by the Executive Committee shall be brought before the State Council by a motion that such regulation shall be approved, and if so approved, shall be submitted to the Governor for ratification. No regulation made by the Executive Committee shall have effect until it has been approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor. Notification of such approval and ratification shall be published in the Gazette.

(3) A regulation made by the Executive Committee when approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor shall, upon the notification of such approval and ratification in the Gazette, be as valid and effectual as if it were herein enacted.

5 (1) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any regulation made thereunder shall be guilty of an offence.

Offences.

(2) In the event of the contravention by any person of any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any regulation made thereunder, the owner, agent and manager of the mine shall each be guilty of an offence unless he proves that he had taken all reasonable means to prevent such contravention, by publishing and to the best of his power enforcing the provisions of this Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder.

6 Every person who is guilty of an offence under this Ordinance shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and if any such person is the owner, agent or manager of a mine, such person shall, on conviction after summary trial before a Police Magistrate, be liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred rupees.

Penalties.

7 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—  
 “Executive Committee” means the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce;  
 “mine” includes any undertaking, whether public or private, for the extraction of any substance from under the surface of the earth;  
 “regulation” means a regulation made under this Ordinance by the Executive Committee.

Interpretation.

8 The provisions of this Ordinance shall be in addition to and not in substitution or derogation of the provisions of any other written law relating to the employment of females in mines in so far as such other written law is not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Application of Ordinance.

#### *Objects and Reasons.*

The object of this Bill is to prohibit the employment of females on underground work in mines of all kinds in order to enable effect to be given in Ceylon to a draft Convention adopted by the General Conference of the International Labour Organisation on the 21st June, 1935.
