## REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the spaces within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, tea and coffee boutiques, eating-houses or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

## THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.

RULES under section 12 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors of the tract bounded as follows:—

On the north by the Ridiyagama tank bund reservation

On the east by the Left Bank Irrigation Channel

On the south by the Bolang Koggalla District Road Committee road

On the west by the Ambalantota Ridiyagama Irrigation road,

and comprised in the irrigable area of the Walawe Left Bank Scheme in the Hambantota District of the Southern Province, and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 19 of the Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

## CULTIVATION RULES.

1. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Cultivation Officer” means the officer appointed by the Assistant Government Agent, under section 20A of the Ordinance, to supervise the work of the Irrigation Headmen and to exercise control in accordance with these rules under the instructions of the Assistant Government Agent.

“Vel-Vidane” means the Irrigation Headman elected under section 20, or appointed under section 21, of the Ordinance, to be in charge of a division, or of a tract or a series of tracts of fields.

“Joint Labour” means labour contributed by all the proprietors concerned in each case, in proportion to the extent of their respective holdings.

2. (1) Every Vel-Vidane shall reside within the division or tract or within one mile of the division or tract, in his charge, and shall not absent himself from duty without the permission of the Assistant Government Agent.

(2) On assuming office every Vel-Vidane shall, by the hypothecation either of a cash deposit of Rs. 250 or of lands of that value, give security to the Assistant Government Agent for the proper disposal of Government monies advanced to him or in his charge and for the payment of any compensation that may be awarded by the Assistant Government Agent in respect of any damage caused to any proprietor through any malicious act of the Vel-Vidane.

(3) The term of office of a Vel-Vidane shall be restricted to 3 years but he shall be eligible for re-election.

3. It shall be the duty of every Vel-Vidane (a) to supervise all paddy cultivation within the division or tract in his charge subject to instructions from, and to the control of, the Cultivation Officer, and (b) to enforce these rules and, subject to the instructions of the Cultivation Officer, to enter prosecution for breaches thereof.

4. (1) Every Vel-Vidane shall be entitled to receive, from the proprietors or cultivators of fields within the division or tract in his charge, a huwandiram of 3 kurunies of paddy for each extent on which an amunam is ordinarily sown, that extent being deemed for the purpose of these rules to be equivalent to 2½ acres.

(2) The whole or any portion of the huwandiram may be withheld if, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, the Vel-Vidane has not satisfactorily carried out his duties during the preceding period of cultivation; and the huwandiram or portion so withheld shall be disposed of as the Assistant Government Agent may in each case order.

(3) Any person acting for the Vel-Vidane shall be entitled to a share of the huwandiram proportionate to the time he so acted; and in the event of dispute, this share shall be determined by the Assistant Government Agent.

(4) The huwandiram due in respect of each season, shall, unless the Assistant Government Agent has made any order to the contrary, be handed over to the Vel-Vidane within one month after the reaping of the crop, and before any paddy is removed from the threshing-floor; and a receipt shall be given by him therefor.

5. (1) Cultivation for yala shall begin on March 7 and the sowing shall be completed by May 1 every year.

(2) Cultivation for maha shall begin on September 20 and the sowing shall be completed by November 9 every year.

6. (1) In respect of all tanks, dams, channels, water-courses and the like works which are required by these rules and which are not in charge of the Director of Irrigation—

(a) ordinary repairs shall be carried out by the joint labour of the proprietors benefited, and completed 10 days before the dates fixed for the commencement of cultivation in each season;

(b) repairs which appear to be necessary in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent or the Cultivation Officer, shall be carried out by the joint labour of such of the proprietors as are benefited by the work and are served with a written notice in that behalf, and shall be completed within the time specified in the notice; and

(c) extraordinary works, such as widening, strengthening, or improving, decided upon by the Assistant Government Agent after such inquiry as may be necessary into any suggestions or objections that may be offered or raised by the proprietors in response to a preliminary notice of his intention to have such works carried out, shall be carried out by the joint labour of such of the proprietors as are served with a written final notice in that behalf, and shall be completed within the time specified in that notice.

(2) All channels shall be kept clear and in a state of good repair throughout the period of irrigation by the joint labour of the proprietors benefited thereby.

(3) If any of the above mentioned repairs, improvements, or works are not satisfactorily completed within the time specified, such repairs or improvements shall be carried out by the Cultivation Officer after notice to such of the proprietors concerned as are registered under section 14 or section 64A and in the case of works likely to cost over Rs. 50 with the prior approval of the Assistant Government Agent obtained on submission of estimates of the cost.

(4) The Cultivation Officer may for that purpose receive an advance from the Fine Fund, and the expenses incurred shall be recovered from the proprietors concerned, in proportion to the labour due from each of them.

7. (1) Paths between cultivated lands shall be kept clear by the joint labour of the proprietors of those lands, and shall be maintained at a width of at least 2 feet.

(2) All ridges shall be satisfactorily maintained so as to prevent waste of water.

8. Any terrace in a field which by reason of its sloping position or uneven nature causes any wastage of irrigation water, shall be levelled or rectified by the construction of additional ridges by the proprietors of the field so as to prevent the wastage.

9. Wherever it is necessary to avoid irrigation water being taken from terrace to terrace, field channels shall be extended by such of the proprietors, as are directed so to do by the Cultivation Officer.

10. (1) Every proprietor shall deliver to the Cultivation Officer a list of the managers or lessees of his fields within 7 days after the date fixed in rule 5 for the commencement of cultivation in each season: Provided that no list shall be required of any proprietor who informs the Cultivation Officer before that date that there has been no change among his managers or lessees after the last list furnished by him.

(2) (a) The managers of fields shall prepare a full list of the goiyas to be employed in their fields, and no water shall be issued to the fields until such list is delivered to the Vel-Vidane.

(b) The list of goiyas shall be made out on the printed form supplied by the Assistant Government Agent and shall bear the signature of the manager and of all the goiyas.

(c) All the information required by this form shall be accurately filled in.

(d) All changes and additions in the list of goiyas shall be notified to the Vel-Vidane in writing.

(e) All lists of goiyas shall be handed over by the Vel-Vidane to the Cultivation Officer.

11. Every proprietor shall be liable to contribute the labour or carry out the works required by these rules for each season's cultivation, unless specially exempted by the Assistant Government Agent, on written application made in that behalf.

12. Only such varieties of paddy shall be sown either for maha or yala as will not require more than 90 days of water from the date prescribed in rule 5 for the completion of sowing.

13. (1) The sowing of any fields after the dates prescribed in rule 5 without a special permit from the Assistant Government Agent shall be an offence for which the person in charge of the cultivation shall be liable to prosecution.

(2) (a) Such permits may be issued by the Assistant Government Agent upon such terms as he may deem fit in each case.

(b) In ordinary circumstances no extension shall be allowed, which will involve an extension of the irrigation period.

(c) The permit shall specify the extension allowed, the name of the field, and the kind of seed to be sown.

(d) The contravention of any of the conditions of the permit shall be an offence.

14. Subject to the control of the Cultivation Officer, the apportioning of water, after it has left the irrigation works and entered the tracts, shall be performed by the Vel-Vidane.

15. (1) No person shall wilfully or without the permission of the Vel-Vidane prevent water from flowing to the field below his own, or obstruct the flow of surplus water from any field on a higher level, or allow water to flow into a field through any hole or gap in the ridge.

(2) No person shall issue, apportion, cut off or divert, or use the water in any manner except in accordance with the instructions of the Vel-Vidane.

16. (1) (a) The cultivators shall construct the necessary fences and watch huts as directed by the Vel-Vidane and maintain them in good repair and shall keep regular watch in accordance with the orders of the Vel-Vidane.

(b) The fences shall be constructed within one week from the dates fixed in rule 5 for the completion of sowing.

(c) A permit issued under rule 13 shall not be deemed to extend the date for fencing unless it is expressly stated in the permit that it does so.

(d) All fences shall be suitably constructed of barbed wire consisting of at least 4 strands, or of live or dried fence sticks.

(e) Huts shall be so constructed as to be 6 feet from the level of the ground.

(2) The lengths of fencing required shall be apportioned by the Vel-Vidane among the proprietors in proportion to the extent of their respective holdings. A statement of the allocation shall be published in the division.

(3) All fences falling within a particular Vel-Vidane's tract shall be apportioned among the proprietors of the fields lying in that tract.

17. (1) Should any portion of any tract sown by the date prescribed for the completion of sowing, ripen before the rest of that tract, the cultivators of that portion may reap and store their crop but shall continue to keep watch over the fields until the crop of the remainder of that tract is reaped and stored.

(2) Should any portion of a tract not ripen until after the reaping of the crop on the remainder of that tract either on account of sowing after the prescribed date or because of the sowing of a different kind of paddy, the cultivators of the remainder of the tract shall not be bound to continue to keep watch over the field until that portion of the tract ripens.

18. The proprietor shall pay the share due to the cultivator at the threshing-floor immediately after the harvest after deducting any advances that may have already been paid.

19. (1) All field channels and water-courses which are not in charge of the Director of Irrigation, shall be in charge of the Vel-Vidane acting under the directions of the Cultivation Officer.

(2) No person shall fill up or encroach upon such channels or water-courses or any of their reservations.

20. (1) Any channel, dam, or other work required whether outside or inside any field, shall be constructed by the joint labour of the proprietors interested.

(2) (a) Every proprietor shall grant way leave for such channels, dams, or other works even though his own land may not be benefited thereby.

(b) Such works shall be constructed and maintained so as to cause the least damage to the land through which such way leave is granted.

(3) On receipt of a written application for permission to construct any such works the Cultivation Officer may give the proprietors the necessary permission, provided that no work which is likely to affect the general irrigation under the scheme or the lands of proprietors other than the applicants, shall be permitted until the matter has been referred for approval to the Assistant Government Agent acting in consultation with the Divisional Irrigation Engineer.

(4) Before permission is given to construct a field channel through land which is not to be benefited thereby, the proprietor of such land shall be notified of the proposal by the Cultivation Officer.

21. (1) If the proprietor of any land is unable to obtain water for irrigation owing to the neglect of any other proprietor to cut his share of the field channels, such other proprietor shall be called upon by the Cultivation Officer to do the necessary work and in the event of his failing or refusing to perform the work required within a reasonable time the Cultivation Officer shall forward an estimate of the cost of the work to the Assistant Government Agent.

(2) The Assistant Government Agent may advance the amount required from the Fine Fund and direct the Cultivation Officer to carry out the work, and recover the expenses incurred from the defaulting proprietor.

22. (1) Cattle may be kept within the lands of the proprietors until the date prescribed in rule 5 for the completion of sowing.

(2) Within 24 hours after that date, all cattle shall be removed outside the cultivated areas to a distance of at least 2 miles or be securely tethered or penned.

23. No paddy shall be sown in any irrigation or other channel.

24. Every proprietor shall, whenever required by the Assistant Government Agent or the Cultivation Officer, point out the correct boundaries of his land, and shall erect bunds or other suitable marks to define such boundaries.

25. Any Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Officer or Vel-Vidane may take such action as may be necessary to prevent any waste of water occurring in any field.

##### *Scheme for the Improvement of Village Irrigation Works.*

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, approved under section 12 (1) (b) at a meeting duly held on May 13, 1936, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Eruptana irrigation work in the Vavuniya South, Mullaitivu District, and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work free of all charges, namely, (a) 270 cubes earthwork in raising bund to level 116.00, (b) 250 cubes earthwork in forming bund to level 116.00 to close approach to existing left bank spill, all such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

(1) The construction of the Mupathuacre anicut and bridge, and a right bank channel system including a head sluice and such controlled outlets as may be necessary, up to the estimated cost of Rs. 15,000, and the maintenance of the works on completion, are undertaken by the Government.

**KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.****The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 15, 1937, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated May 11, 1937.**

*Present:*—Mr. E. T. Dyson, Chairman; Ratwatte Ailigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. Walter Beven; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Monthly Meeting held on April 17, 1937, and of the two Special General Meetings held on May 7, 1937, and May 10, 1937, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and copies thereof furnished to each member were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman subject to the following addition to item 4 of the Minutes of the meeting of May 10, 1937:—

“ Mr. G. E. de Silva objected to this motion on the ground that no notice was given.

The Chairman held that the item on the agenda covered this motion.

Mr. G. E. de Silva raised the further objection that the Chairman who proposed the original motion and the Provincial Engineer who seconded it both voted for the amendment without withdrawing the original motion ”.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1936 to April 30, 1937, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for April, 1937.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April, 1937.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending May 15, 1937.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of “ The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910 ”, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during April, 1937. (b) Half yearly report of the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

3A. Mr. Beven stated:—(1) That the filling of the lotus pond, which the Council authorized over a year ago has not been completed yet, and the place has become unsightly and insanitary; and (2) That there appeared to be no control of pedestrian traffic in Kandy as people are often seen walking in the centre of the road.

The Chairman agreed to take necessary action as regards (1), and to address the Superintendent of Police and put up notices, where necessary, and to circularize Headmen and schools as regards (2).

3B. Mr. Bradley desired the Chairman to direct the Police to maintain better control of both pedestrian and motor traffic in Market street opposite the bus stand for the convenience and safety of the public.

Mr. Marikar drew attention to the unsatisfactory condition of road side drains which had not been properly cleaned and flushed.

The Chairman agreed to look into these matters.

4. Petitions:—Mr. Soysa presented—(1) Petition dated April 16, 1937, from the retail rice depot keepers in Jail road applying for a reduction in the rent; and (2) petition dated April 16, 1937, from Mr. A. R. L. S. V. N. Vellasamy Pillai asking for an enhanced allowance of water.

The Chairman stated that (1) would be considered by the Finance Committee; and (2) would be referred to the Works Committee.

5. To consider Mr. Mahadeva's report on the question of a water supply scheme for Kandy.

Resolved—(1) to defer consideration for the next meeting; (2) to ask the Municipal Engineer to offer his comments on Mr. Mahadeva's report before the next meeting, and the Municipal Electrical Engineer to report on paragraph 21 of Mr. Mahadeva's report; and (3) to authorize the Chairman to ascertain from Government what financial assistance it would be prepared to grant if the Hunasgiriya Scheme were adopted, and whether the Public Works Department could detail an engineer to prepare a firm estimate of the cost of the Scheme.

6. *Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on March 20, 1937.*

*(Item deferred from the last General Meeting.)*

Endorsement No. M.A. 624/37 of March 2, 1937, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Police, suggesting the provision of a motor car stand at the junction of Mutale and Madawela roads. Acquisition recommended. Consideration deferred pending further inspection.

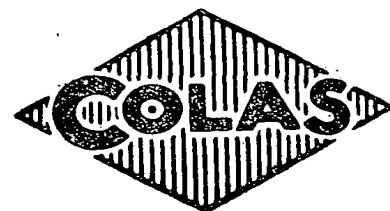

Process and device for fermenting tea leaf.

*Abstract.*—The inventor states that the usual processes for fermenting tea leaf suffer from the drawback that a uniform temperature is not attained in the whole mass of leaf, and that there is no efficient control of fermenting conditions. According to the present application, the inventor proposes to use a system in which air which is conditioned as regards temperature, moisture content, &c., is forced to pass upward through a plurality of trays on which the leaf is spread, so that the temperature attained by the leaf is substantially the same throughout.

Improved manner of making tiled roofs water tight and improved roofing tiles.

*Abstract.*—This invention relates to tiles having corrugations on their surface. In the known type of tile a depression is formed on the upper transverse edge of the tile for collecting any rain water that may be blown up the slope of the tile by gusts of wind. For the purpose of draining this depression an outlet is usually provided on the central longitudinal ridge between the corrugations. The inventors state that this is a disadvantageous position for such an outlet as the bottom of the outlet is on a level with the tile surface lower down and there is a tendency

for water to be blown up this outlet. The main feature of the invention according to the present application consists in providing outlets at or near the centre of the longitudinal corrugations, the bottom of the said outlets being raised above the level of the tile surface lower down. As a further precaution the outlets are set on an angle to the longitudinal edge of the tile. It is claimed that in this way not only the direct undeflected blast of wind up the outlets is prevented, but that the openings of these outlets are guarded from wind action by the overhanging lips of the upper tile.

As an optional feature, the inventors propose to make two secondary depressions in the tile below the main depression into which the lips of the overhanging tile fit, these depressions being formed by interrupted cross-walls which separate them from the hollows of the tile surface. The water that collects in these depressions is discharged through suitable breaches provided in these cross-walls.

Improvements in and relating to the packaging of articles.

*Abstract.*—This invention relates to the packing of small articles such as medicinal pills, in tubes of regenerated cellulose. The articles having been placed at equal intervals along a strip of transparent cellulose the edges of which are treated with transparent sealing material, the sides are folded over and sealed. The feature that is specifically claimed in this application consists in simultaneously sealing and embrittling the portions intermediate between the articles by passing the strip between two heated rollers. If necessary the embrittled portion can at the same time be further weakened by having portions cut off by punches suitably placed in the rollers themselves.
