THE COLONIAL AIR NAVIGATION (APPLICATION OF ACTS) ORDER, 1937.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Air Navigation Act, 1920, as amended by the Air Navigation Act, 1936, it is provided as amended by the Air Navigation Act, 1936, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that any of the provisions of the said Air Navigation Act, 1920, other than Section 4, shall extend, with such exceptions, adaptations and modifications, if any, as may be specified in the Order, to the Isle of Man, any of the Channel Islands, any colony, any British protectorate or any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom: Kingdom:

And whereas by Section 35 of the Air Navigation Act, 1936, it is provided that that Act shall be construed as one with the Air Navigation Act, 1920:

And whereas it is expedient to extend certain of the provisions of the Air Navigation Act, 1920, amended as aforesaid, and certain of the provisions of the Air Navigation Act, 1936, to certain colonies and British protectorates and to certain territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Colonial Air Navigation (Application of Acts) Order, 1937".

2.—(1) In this Order and its schedules, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Colony" means and includes for the purposes of this Order any of the colonies, protectorates or mandated territories mentioned in the second schedule hereto; "the Convention" means the Convention for deter-

mining by a common agreement certain uniform rules with respect to international air navigation signed on behalf of His Majesty in Paris on the thirteenth day of October, 1919;
"Governor" means the officer for the time being

administering the Government of the Colony;
"the principal Act" means the Air Navigation Act,

"the Acts" means the principal Act and the Air Navigation Act, 1936.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpre-

tation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The provisions of Sections 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 12A, 14, 17, and 18 of the principal Act and of Sections 4, 5, 13, 14, 30, and 34 of the Air Navigation Act, 1936, adapted and modified as set out in the first schedule hereto, shall be and hereby are extended to the colonies mentioned in the second schedule hereto.

4. The Air Navigation (Colonies and Protectorates) Order in Council, 1922, and the Air Navigation (Mandated Territories) Order in Council, 1927, are hereby revoked.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

#### THE AIR NAVIGATION ACT, 1920.

1. Section 1.—His Majesty may make such Orders in Council as appear to Him necessary or expedient for carrying out the Convention and for giving effect thereto or to any of the provisions thereof, or to any amendment which may be made under article thirty-four thereof.

2. Section 2.—His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the provisions of the Convention for the time being in force, or any of them, and whether or not those provisions are limited to aircraft of any special description or engaged in any special kind of navigation, shall apply to or in relation to any aircraft in or over the Colony or the

territorial waters adjacent thereto.

3. Section 3.—Without prejudice to the generality of the powers hereinbefore conferred, an Order in Council under Part I of the principal Act may make provision-

(a) prescribing the authority by which any of the powers exercisable under the Convention by a Contracting State, or by any authority therein, are to be

exercised in the Colony;
(b) for the licensing, inspection, and regulation of aerodromes, for access to aerodromes and places where aircraft have landed, for access to aircraft factories for the purpose of inspecting the work therein carried on, for prohibiting or regulating the use of unlicensed aerodromes, and for the licensing of personnel employed at aerodromes in the inspection or supervision of aircraft;

(c) as to the manner and conditions of the issue and renewal of any certificate or licence required by the Order or by the Convention, including the examination and tests to be undergone, and the form, custody, production, cancellation, suspension, endorsement and surrender of any such certificate or licence;

, (d) as to the registration of aircraft in the Colony;

(e) as to the conditions under which aircraft may be used for carrying goods and passengers;

(f) as to the conditions under which aircraft may pass, or goods or passengers may be conveyed by aircraft, into or from the Colony, or from one part of the Colony to another;

of the Colony to another;

(g) exempting from the provisions of the Order or of the Convention, or any of them, aircraft flown for experimental purposes, or any other aircraft or persons where it appears unnecessary that the same should apply;

of charges at licensed (h) prescribing the scales aerodromes;

(i) prescribing the fees to be paid in respect of the grant of any certificate or licence or otherwise for the purposes of the Order or the Convention;

(i) supplementing the Convention, in such manner as appears necessary or expedient, by regulations designed to promote the safety of aircraft and of persons and property carried therein, and to prevent aircraft endangering other persons and property;

(k) for the control and regulation of aerial lighthouses, and lights at or in the neighbourhood of aero-dromes and aerial lighthouses, and lights which are liable to endanger aircraft;

(1) regulating the making of signals and other communitherein, and regulating the use of the Royal Air Force ensign, the civil air ensign and any other ensign established by His Majesty in Council for purposes connected with air navigation;

the imposition of penalties (not exceeding (m) for imprisonment for a term of six months and a fine of two hundred pounds) to secure compliance with the Order, and for authorising any steps to be taken for preventing aircraft from flying over prohibited areas or entering the Colony in contravention of the Order which were authorised to be taken in the United Kingdom under section two of the Aerial Navigation Act, 1913, for the purposes of that section.

Section 7 .-- (1) In time of war, whether actual or imminent, or of great national emergency, the Governor may, by order, regulate or prohibit, either absolutely or subject to such conditions as may be contained in the order, the navigation of all or any descriptions of aircraft over the Colony or any portion thereof, or the territorial waters adjacent thereto; and may by order provide for taking possession of and using for the purposes of His Majesty's naval, military or air forces any aerodrome or landing ground, or any aircraft, machinery, plant, material or things found therein or thereon, and for regulating or prohibiting the use, erection, building, maintenance or establishment of any aerodrome, flying school, or landing ground, or any class or description thereof.

(2) An order under this section may make, for the pur-

poses of the order, such provision as an Order in Council under Part I of the principal Act may make for the purposes of the Order in Council by virtue of paragraph (m) of section

three of that Act.

(3) Any person who suffers direct injury or loss, owing to the operation of an order of the Governor under this section,

shall be entitled to receive compensation from the Governor from such public funds as he may havfully apply for the purpose, the amount thereof to be fixed, in default of agreement, by an arbitrator to be agreed upon or failing agreement to be appointed by the Chief Justice or other chief Judicial Officer of the Colony:

Provided that no compensation shall be payable by reason of the operation of a general order under this section prohibiting flying in the Colony or any part thereof.

(4) An order under this section may be revoked or varied by a subsequent order made by the Governor.
5. Section 8.—(1) The Governor shall have power to establish and maintain acrodromes (including power to provide and maintain roads and approaches, buildings and other accommodation and apparatus and equipment for such aerodromes) and to acquire land for that purpose by agreement or in accordance with the provisions of the law in force in the Colony relating to the acquisition of land for public purposes.

(2) For the avoidance of doubts it is hereby declared that one of the purposes for which the Governor may acquire land under this section is the purpose of securing that the land adjacent to the site of an aerodrome which the Governor has established, or is about to establish, shall not be used in such number as to cause interference with, or danger or damage to, aircraft at, approaching or leaving

the aerodrome.

6. Section 9.—(1) No action shall lie in respect of trespass or in respect of nuisance, by reason only of the flight of aircraft over any property at a height above the ground, which, having regard to wind, weather, and all the circumstances of the case is reasonable, or the ordinary incidents of such flight, so long as the provisions of the Acts and any Order made thereunder, being provisions which extend to the Colony, are duly complied with; but where material damage or loss is caused by an aircraft in flight, taking off, or landing, or by any person in any such aircraft, or by any article or person falling from any such aircraft, to any person or property on land or water, damages shall be recoverable from the owner of the aircraft in respect of such damage or loss, without proof of negligence or intention or other cause of action, as though the same had been caused by his wilful act, neglect or default, except where the damage or loss was caused by or contributed to by the negligence of the person by whom the same was suffered:

Provided that where material damage or loss is caused as aforesaid in circumstances in which-

(a) damages are recoverable from the owner in respect of the said damage or loss by virtue only of the preceding provisions of this section, and

(b) a legal liability is created in some person other than the owner to pay damages in respect of the said damage or loss,

the owner shall be entitled to be indemnified by that other person against any claim in respect of the said damage or

(2) Where any aircraft has been bona fide demised, let, or hired out for a period exceeding fourteen days to any other person by the owner thereof, and no pilot, commander, navigator, or operative member of the crew of the aircraft is in the employment of the owner, this section shall have effect as though for references to the owner there were substituted references to the person to whom the aircraft has been so demised, let, or hired out.

7. Section 10.—(1) Where an aircraft is flown in such a manner as to be the cause of unnecessary danger to any person or property on land or water, the pilot or the person in charge of the aircraft, and also the owner thereof, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that the aircraft was so flown without his actual fault or privity, shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds, or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding six months, or to both such imprisonment and fine

For the purposes of this section, the expression "owner" in relation to an aircraft includes any person by whom the aircraft is hired at the time of the offence.

(2) The provisions of this section shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the powers conferred on His Majesty in Council by Part I of the principal Act.

Section 11.—The law of the Colony relating to wreck and to salvage of life or peoperty, and to the duty or rendering assistance to vessels in distress, shall apply to aircraft on or over the sea or tidal waters as it applies to vessels, and the owner of an aircraft shall be entitled to a reasonable reward for salvage services rendered by the aircraft to any property or persons in any case where the owner of a ship would be so entitled:

Provided that provision may be made by order by the Governor with the approval of a Secretary of State for making modifications of and exemptions from the provisions of such law as aforesaid in their application to aircraft to such extent and in such manner as appears necessary or expedient.

8A. In lieu of the preceding section the following section shall have effect as from such date as the Governor may by order appoint :-

Section 11.—(1) Any services rendered in assisting or in saving life from, or in saving the cargo or apparel of, an aircraft in, on or over the sea or any tidal water, or on or over the shores of the sea or any tidal water, shall be deemed to be salvage services in all cases in which they would have been salvage services if they had been rendered in relation to a vessel; and where salvage services are rendered by an aircraft to any property or person, the owner of the aircraft shall be entitled to the same reward for those services as he would have been entitled to if the aircraft had been a vessel.

The preceding provisions of this sub-section shall have effect notwithstanding that the aircraft concerned is a foreign aircraft, and notwithstanding that the services in question are rendered elsewhere than within the limits of the territorial waters adjacent to any part of His Majesty's dominions.

(2) The Governor may by regulations made with the approval of a Secretary of State direct that any provisions any law of the Colony for the time being in force which relate to wreck, to salvage of life or property or to the duty of rendering assistance to vessels in distress shall, with such exceptions, adaptations and modifications, if any, as may be specified in the regulations, apply in relation to aircraft as those provisions apply in relation to vessels.

(3) For the purposes of this section, any provisions of any law of the Colony which relate to vessels laid by or neglected as unfit for sea service shall be deemed to be

provisions relating to wreck.

9. Section 12.--(1) The Governor may make regulations providing for the investigation in the Colony of any accident arising out of or in the course of air navigation and occurring in or over the Colony or the territorial waters adjacent thereto, or to British aircraft occurring elsewhere and likely in the absence of such provision to remain uninvestigated.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provision, regulations under this section may contain

provisions :

(a) requiring notice to be given of any such accident as aforesaid in such manner and by such persons as

may be specified;

(b) applying, with or without modification, for the purpose of investigations held with respect to any such accidents any of the provisions of any law in force in the Colony relating to the investigation of deaths or accidents;

(c) prohibiting, pending investigation, access to or interference with aircraft to which an accident has occurred, and authorising any person, so far as may be necessary for the purposes of an investigation, to have access to, examine, remove, take measures for the preservation of, or otherwise deal

with any such aircraft,

(d) authorising or requiring the cancellation, suspension, endorsement, or surrender of any licence or certificate granted in the Colony under the Acts or any order made thereunder, or the withdrawal or suspension of any validation conferred in the Colony of a licence granted by a duly competent authority elsewhere, where it appears on an investigation that the licence or certificate ought to be cancelled, suspended, endorsed, or surrendered, or the validation withdrawn or suspended, as the case may be; and for the production of any such licence or certificate for the purpose of being so dealt with:

Provided that nothing in this section shall limit the powers of any authority under sections five hundred and thirty to five hundred and thirty-seven inclusive of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or any enactment (including the Acts) amending those sections.

(3) If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any regulations under this section, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not

exceeding three months.

10. Section 12A.—Any Order in Council, order or regulations made under the Acts in relation to aircraft may provide for the detention of aircraft to secure compliance with the Order in Council, order or regulations, as the case may be, or with any provisions of the Acts in connection with which the Order in Council, order or regulations is or are made, and, in the case of an Order in Council made under Part I of the principal Act, provide for the detention of aircraft to prevent aircraft flying when unfit to fly, and may make such further provision as appears to His Majesty in Council or the Governor, as the case may be, to be necessary or expedient for securing such detention.

11. Section 14. -(1) Any offence under the Acts or under an Order in Council or regulations made thereunder and any offence whatever committed on a British aircraft, shall, for the purpose of conferring jurisdiction, be deemed to have been committed in any place where the offender may for the time being be.

(2) The Governor may by regulations make provision as to the courts in which proceedings may be taken for enforcing any claim under the Acts, or any other claim in respect of aircraft, and in particular may provide for conferring jurisdiction in any such proceedings on any court exercising Admiralty jurisdiction and applying to such proceedings any rules of practice or procedure appli-

cable to proceedings in Admiralty.

12. Section 17.—(1) Notwithstanding that an Order in Council made by virtue of the Acts or a regulation so made by the Governor has effect only as part of the law of the Colony, no provision contained in the Order or regulations shall, on the ground that it would have extra-territorial operation, be deemed to be invalid in so far as it applies to British aircraft registered in the Colony, wherever they may be, or prohibits, requires or regulates-

- (a) the doing of anything by persons in, or any of the personnel of, such British aircraft as aforesaid, wherever they may be, or
- (b) the doing of anything in relation to such British aircraft as aforesaid by other persons being British subjects or British protected persons, wherever they may be.

For the purposes of this subsection the personnel of an aircraft shall be deemed to include the commander or other person in charge of the aircraft, and all other members of the crew of the aircraft.

(1A) His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that any of the provisions of the Acts or of any Order in Council or regulations made by virtue of the Acts being a provision which has extra-territorial operation in relation to British aircraft registered in the Colony shall, subject to such exceptions, adaptations and modifications, if any, as may be specified in the Order made under this subsection, have such operation also in relation to British aircraft registered in the United Kingdom or in any other country or territory, other than the Colony, to which any of the provisions of the Acts can be extended under section four of the principal Act.

(2) An Order in Council under the Acts may be revoked or varied by a subsequent Order in Council.(3) Any Order in Council made under the Acts shall be

laid before each House of Parliament forthwith, and, if an Address is presented to His Majesty by either House of Parliament within the next subsequent twenty-one days on which that House has sat next after any such Order is laid before it praying that the Order or any provision thereof may be annulled, His Majesty in Council may annul the Order or provision, and it shall thenceforth be void, but without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done thereunder.

(4) Any Order in Council under the Acts may authorise the Governor to make regulations for carrying out the purposes of the Order in respect of such matters as may be

specified in the Order.

13. Section 18.—(1) The Acts shall not apply to aircraft belonging to or exclusively employed in the service of His Majestv

Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, apply to any such aircraft, with or without modification, any of the provisions of the Acts or of any orders or regulations made thereunder.

(2) Nothing in the Acts or in any orders or regulations made thereunder shall prejudice or affect the rights, powers, or privileges of any general or local lighthouse authority.

THE AIR NAVIGATION ACT, 1936.

14. Section 4.—(1) The Governor may with the approval of a Secretary of State make regulations:—

(a) requiring any person-

- (i) who carries on the business of carrying passengers or goods in aircraft for hire or reward on such journeys or classes of journeys (whether beginning and ending at the same point or at different points) as may be specified in the regulations, or
- (ii) who is the holder of a licence in respect of a customs aerodrome,

to furnish to such authorities as may be specified in the regulations such information relating to the use of aircraft for the purpose of his said business and to the persons employed in connection with that use, or, as the case may be, relating to the use of the aerodrome and to the persons employed in aircraft arriving thereat or departing therefrom as may be prescribed by the regulations;

- (b) requiring the owner, or the pilot or other person in charge, of any aircraft arriving at, or departing from, any customs acrodrome to furnish to the holder of the licence in respect of that aerodrome such information as may be necessary to enable the holder of the said licence to comply with such of the provisions of the regulations as relate to him
- (c) prescribing the times at which, and the form and manner in which any information required under the regulations is to be furnished:

provided that a person carrying on such a business as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of this subsection shall not be required to furnish information relating to the use of aircraft on journeys wholly outside the Colony, or relating to persons exclusively employed outside the Colony, unless the person carrying on the business is either a British subject or a British protected person resident in the Colony or a body corporate in-corporated under the law of the Colony.

(2) Regulations under this section may provide for imposing on any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of the regulations such penulties (not exceeding a fine of twenty pounds and a further fine of five pounds for every day on which the contravention or non-compliance continues after conviction therefor) as may

be specified in the regulations.

(3) No information with respect to any particular undertaking which has been obtained by virtue of regulations under this section shall, without the consent of the person carrying on that undertaking, be disclosed otherwise than in connection with the execution of such regulations, and if any person discloses any such information in contravention of this subsection, he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to both such imprisonment and such fine or, on conviction on indictment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and such fine.

Nothing in this subsection shall apply to the disclosure of any information for the purposes of any legal proceedings which may be taken by virtue of this subsection or of regulations made under this section, or for the purpose of any report of any such proceedings, but, save as aforesaid, the restriction imposed by this subsection shall, in relation to any legal proceedings (including arbitrations), extend so as to prohibit and prevent any person who is in possession of any such information so obtained from disclosing, and from being required by any court or arbitrator to disclose that information (whether as a witness or otherwise) except with the consent of the person carrying on the undertaking to which the information relates.

(4) In this section the expression "customs aerodrome" means an aerodrome for the time being appointed as a place of landing and departure of aircraft for the purposes. so as to prohibit and prevent any person who is in possession

place of landing and departure of aircraft for the purposes of the enactments relating to customs.

15. Section 5.—(1) The Governor may with the approval of a Secretary of State make regulations:—

- (a) to secure that aircraft shall not be used in the Colony by any person-
  - (i) for plying, while carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward, on such journeys or classes of journeys (whether beginning and ending at the same point or at different points) as may be specified regulations, or
  - (ii) for such flying undertaken for the purpose of any trade or business as may be so specified,

except under the authority of, and in accordance with, a licence granted to the said person by the licensing authority specified in the regulations;

- (b) as to the circumstances in which a licence under the regulations may or shall be granted, refused, revoked or suspended, and in particular as to the matters to which the licensing authority specified in the regulations is to have regard in deciding whether to grant or refuse such a licence;
- (c) as to appeals from the licensing authority by persons interested in the grant, refusal, revocation or suspension of any licence under the regulations;
- (d) as to the conditions which may be attached to such a licence (including conditions as to the fares, freight or other charges to be charged by the holder of the licence), and for securing compliance with any conditions so attached:
- (e) as to the information to be furnished by an applicant, for, or the holder of, such a licence to such authorities as may be specified in the regulations;
- (f) prescribing the fees to be paid in respect of the grant of any licence under the regulations;

and such regulations may make different provision as respects different classes of aircraft and different classes of licences.

(2) Regulations under this section may, for the purpose of securing compliance with the regulations, provide for the imposition of penalties not exceeding, in the case of a first offence against the regulations, a fine of twenty pounds or, in the case of a second or subsequent such offence, a fine of

fifty pounds or imprisonment for a term of three months.

(3) Nothing in this section shall be taken to affect the power under section one of the principal Act of giving effect by Order in Council to any provision or amendment of the Convention, being a provision or amendment which authorises the imposition of restrictions on the use of foreign aircraft.

16. Section 13.—If any person trespasses on any land forming part of an aerodrome licensed in pursuance of an Order in Council made under Part I of the principal Act he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not

exceeding five pounds;

Provided that no person shall be liable to any penalty under this section unless it is proved that, at the material time, notices warning trespassers of their liability under this section were posted, so as to be readily seen and read by members of the public, in such positions on or near the boundary of the aerodrome as appear to the court to be

- 17. Section 14 .- (1) If the Governor is satisfied, with respect to any building, structure or erection in the vicinity of an aerodrome to which this section applies that, in order to avoid danger to aircraft flying in that vicinity in darkness or conditions of poor visibility, provision ought to be made (whether by lighting or otherwise) for giving to such aircraft warning of the presence of that building, structure or erection, he may by order authorise (subject to any conditions specified in the order) the proprietor of the aerodrome, and any person acting under the proprietor's instructions-
  - (a) to execute, instal, maintain, operate, and, as occasion requires, to repair and alter, such works and apparatus as may be necessary for enabling such warning to be given in the manner specified in the order, and
  - (b) so far as may be necessary for exercising any of the powers conferred by the order to enter upon and pass over (with or without vehicles) any such land as may be specified in the order:

Provided that no such order shall be made in relation to any building, structure or erection if it appears to the Governor that there have been made, and are being carried out, satisfactory arrangements for the giving of such warning as aforesaid of the presence of the building, structure or erection.

- (2) The Governor shall, before making any such order as aforesaid, cause to be published, in such manner as he thinks best for informing persons concerned, notice of the proposal to make the order and of the place where copies of the draft order may be obtained free of charge, and take into consideration any representations with respect to the order which may, within such period not being less than two months after the publication of the notice as may be specified therein, be made to him by any person appearing to him to have an interest in any land which would be affected by the order; and at the end of that period the order may, subject to the provisions of this section, be made with such modifications (if any) of the original draft as the Governor thinks proper.
  - (3) Every such order as aforesaid shall provide-
  - (a) that, except in a case of emergency, no works shall be executed on any land in pursuance of the order, unless, at least fourteen days previously, the proprietor of the aerodrome to which the order relates has served in the manner prescribed by the order on the occupier of that land, and on every other person known by the proprietor to have an interest therein, a written notice containing such particulars of the nature of the proposed works, and the manner in which and the time at which it is proposed to execute them, as may be prescribed by or in accordance with the order; and
  - (b) that if, within fourteen days after service of the said notice on any person having such an interest, the proprietor of the aerodrome receives a written intimation of objection on the part of that person to the proposals contained in the notice, being an intimation which specifies the grounds of objection, then, unless and except in so far as the objection is withdrawn, no steps shall be taken in pursuance of the notice without the specific sanction of the Governor;

and shall also provide for requiring the proprietor of the aerodrome to which the order relates to pay to any person having an interest in any land affected by the order such compensation for any loss or damage which that person may suffer in consequence of the order as may, in default of agreement, be determined from time to time by a single arbitrator appointed by the Chief Justice or other chief Judicial Officer of the Colony; and, for the purposes of this subsection, any expense reasonably incurred in connection with the lawful removal of any apparatus installed in pursuance of such an order, and so much of any expense incurred in connection with the repair, alteration, demolition or removal of any building, structure or erection to which such an order relates as is attributable to the operation of the order, shall be deemed to be loss or damage suffered in consequence of the order.

(4) The ownership of anything shall not be taken to be affected by reason only that it is placed in, or affixed to, any land in pursuance of such an order as aforesaid; and (subject to the provisions of the next following subsection) so long as any such order in respect of an aerodrome is in force, no person shall, except with the consent of the proprietor of the aerodrome, wilfully interfere with any works or things which, to the knowledge of that person, are works or things executed or placed, in, on or over any

land in pursuance of the order.

If any person contravenes the preceding provisions of this subsection, he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding two hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and such fine; and every person who wilfully obstructs a person in the exercise of any of the powers conferred by such an order as aforesaid shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds.

(5) Nothing in this section shall operate, in relation to any building, structure or erection, so as to restrict the doing of any work for the purpose of repairing, altering, demolishing or removing the building, structure or erection, provided

(a) notice of the doing of that work is given as soon as may be to the proprietor of the aerodrome, and

- (b) the giving of warning of the presence of the building, structure or erection in the manner provided by any order under this section in force in relation thereto is not interrupted.
- (6) Any order under this section may be revoked or varied by a subsequent order made by the Governor in accordance with the provisions of this section, but the revocation or variation of any such order shall not affect the previous operation thereof.

(7) In this section-

(a) the expression "acrodrome to which this section applies" means any premises which, by virtue of an Order in Council made under Part I of the

- principal Act, are for the time being licensed as an aerodrome for public use; and
  (b) the expression "proprietor of the aerodrome" means in relation to any premises used or appropriated for use as an aerodrome, the person carrying on or entitled to carry on the business of an aerodrome in those premises, or, in the case of an aerodrome under the control of the Secretary of State for Air or the Governor, the officer in charge of the aerodrome.
- Section 30.—(1) Nothing in the Acts or in this Order shall be taken to affect the validity of any Order in Council, order or regulations made in pursuance of the principal Act before the date of the entry into force of this Order, any regulations, directions or other instrument made or issued before the said date in pursuance of such an Order in Council or any Order in Council made before the said date applying any such Order in Council or regulations as aforesaid to the Colony; and any such Order in Council, order, regulations, directions or other instrument as aforesaid shall, if and so far as in force immediately before the said date, continue in force until revoked by an Order in Council, order, regulations or other instrument.
- (2) An Order in Council made under any of the provisions of the Acts, or any order or regulations made by the Governor thereunder, may contain such incidental and supplementary provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council, or to the Governor, as the case may be, to be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the Order in
- Council, order or regulations.

  19. Section 34.—(1) In the Acts the expression "land" includes land covered with water and any right in or over
- (2) For the avoidance of doubt it is hereby declared that in the Air Navigation Act, 1936, the expression "loss or damage" and in Section 9 of the principal Act the expression "damage or loss" include, in relation to persons, loss of life and personal injury.

(3) Any reference in the Acts to goods or articles shall be construed as including a reference to mails or animals, and any reference in the Acts to any country or territory shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as including a reference to the territorial waters, if any, adjacent to that country or territory.

THE text of the Merchant Shipping (International Labour Conventions) (Ceylon) Order, 1937, made by His Majesty in Council on the 18th day of March, 1937, is published hereunder for general information.

#### At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 18th day of March, 1937.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

Whereas by Section six of the Merchant Shipping (International Labour Conventions) Act, 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted among other things that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the provisions of the Act shall, subject to such modifications and adaptations, to be specified in the Order, as appear to

His Majesty necessary or expedient in the circumstances of the case, apply to ships registered in any British possession outside the United Kingdom, other than the Dominions mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Act, as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Act should, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in this Order, apply to ships registered in Ceylon in like manner as they apply to ships registered in the United Einzeley.

United Kingdom:

Now, therefore. His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby

directed, as follows:

1. The provisions of the Act shall apply to British ships registered in Ceylon in like manner as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom subject to the

- (1) In subsection (1) of Section 1 of the Act the words from "be entitled, in respect of each day" to the end of the subsection shall be omitted and the following words shall be substituted therefor:

  "be entitled to receive from the master or owner of the ship wages at the rate at which he was entitled to receive wages at the date of the termination of his service, until he is returned to a proper return port under the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1932, or has in any other way reached his port of departure from Ceylon or a port in the country to which ho belongs
  - (2) Subsection (2) of Section 1 of the Act shall be omitted and the following subsection shall be substituted
    - "(2) A seaman shall not be entitled to receive wages under this section in respect of any period during which he negligently failed to apply to any proper authority within the meaning of the aforesaid Merchant Shipping Acts for relief as a distressed seaman, or during which he was or could have been suitably employed.'
  - (3) In paragraph (a) of the proviso to subsection (1) of Section 2 of the Act, for the expressions Section 2 of the Act, for the expressions "the Board of Trade" and "officers of the Board" there shall be respectively substituted the expressions "the Governor" and "officers

authorized for such purpose by the Governor ".

(4) In subsection (1) of Section 4 of the Act, for the expressions "forty shillings" and "five pounds",

- expressions "forty shillings" and "five pounds", there shall be respectively substituted the expressions "twenty rupees" and "fifty rupees".

  (5) In subsection (2) of Section 4 of the Act, for the words "an officer of the Board of Trade or any other person", there shall be substituted the words "an officer authorized for such purpose by the Governor or any person", and for the expression "twenty pounds" there shall be substituted the expression "two hundred rupees".

  (6) The first paragraph of Section 5 of the Act shall be
- (6) The first paragraph of Section 5 of the Act shall be amended by the substitution for the words "is under" of the words "is in the opinion of the

court by which any case in relation to such person

is tried, under ".

(7) The second paragraph of Section 5 of the Act shall be omitted, and the following paragraph shall be substituted therefor :-

"The expression 'ship' means any sea-going ship or boat of any description which is registered in Ceylon as a British ship, but does not include any tug, dredger, sludge vessel, barge, or other craft whose ordinary course of navigation does not extend beyond the seaward limits of the jurisdiction of the harbour authority of the port at which such vessel is regularly employed, if and so long as such vessel is engaged in her ordinary occupation.'

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (International Labour Conventions) (Coylon) Order, 1937.

#### BOARD. LOAN

#### Report for the Year 1936.

THE annual report of the Commissioners of the Loan Board for the year 1936 is submitted together with the

statement of the Loan Board Funds duly audited by the Auditor-General.

Loans.—Loans amounting to Rs. 451,850 were granted during the year. This includes the amounts received and paid out on conversion loans at the reduced rates of interest.

Repayments. - During the year a sum of Rs. 782,135 was received in repayment of principal, which includes amounts repaid for conversion loans.

Purchase and sale of securities.—During the year 3 securities were bought in for loans aggregating Rs. 87,500 and

securities to the amount of Rs. 76,512 50 were sold in settlement of the relative loans.

Interest.—The amount of interest collected during the year amounted to Rs. 382,572.75. The interest collected was insufficient for the payment of two half yearly dividends of 2½ per cent. each. A sum of Rs. 18,702 38 had to be withdrawn from profits account to enable these payments of dividends.

(u) To carry on the business of an electric light company in all its branches, and in particular to construct, lay down, establish, fix, and carry out all necessary cables, wires, lines, accumulators, lamps and works, and to generate, accumulate, distribute, and supply electricity, and to light cities, towns, streets, docks, markets, theatres, buildings, and

places both public and private.

(v) To carry on the business of electricians, mechanical engineers, suppliers of electricity for the purposes of light, heat, motive power, or otherwise, and manufacturers of and dealers in all apparatus and things required for or capable of being used in connection with the generation, distribution, supply, accumulation, and employment of electricity.

(w) To act as and carry on the business of commission

and general agents.

(x) To work mines or quarries and to find, win, get, work, crush, smelt, manufacture, or otherwise deal with ores, metals, minerals, oils, precious and other stones, deposits and products, and generally to carry on the business of miners in all branches, manufacturers, growers, planters, and exporters of tea, rubber, cocoa, chocolate, coconuts, and other products, or any such business on behalf of the Company or as agents, for others and on commission or otherwise.

(y) To establish and carry on a dairy farm, and to buy and sell live stock, and to sell and deal in milk and

dairy produce, wholesale or retail.
(2) To establish and maintain in Ceylon, the United Kingdom or elsewhere, stores, shops, and places for the sale of tea, rubber, coconuts, cocoa, chocolate, coffee, and articles of food, drink, or refreshment, wholesale or retail; and to establish in any part or parts of the world agencies for carrying on or developing the business of the Company or any branch thereof; and generally to carry on the business of merchants, exporters, importers, traders, engineers, or any other trade, business, or undertaking whatsoever.

(z1) To cultivate, manage, and superintend estates and properties in Coylon or elsewhere, and generally to undertake the business of estate agents in Ceylon and elsewhere, to act as agents for the investment, loan, payment, transmission, and collection of money, and for the purchase, sale, improvement, development, and management of property, including concerns and undertakings, and to transact any other agency business of any kind

kind.

(22) To let, lease, sell, exchange, part with, transfer, deliver, charge, mortgage or otherwise howsoever dispose of or deal with the Company's undertaking estates, lands, buildings or other property, or any part or parts thereof, whether in consideration of rents, money, or securities for money, shares, debentures, or securities in any other company whether such company be registered in Ceylon or elsewhere, or for any other consideration, and otherwise to trade in, dispose of, or deal with the same or any part thereof.

(23) To borrow or receive on loan money for the purposes of the Company upon the security of cash credit bonds, or of hypothecation or mortgages of the Company's property or any part or parts thereof, or otherwise, as shall be thought most expedient, and in particular by the issue of debentures, debenture stock or bonds to bearer or otherwise and either at par, premium, or discount and either redeemable, irredeemable or perpetual either charged upon all or any part of the Company's present or future property (including uncalled capital) or not so charged, as shall be thought best.

(24) To cause or permit any debenture stock, bonds, debentures, mortgages, charges, incumbrances, liens or securities of or belonging to or made or issued by the Company or affecting its property or rights or any of the terms thereof to be renewed, extended, varied, redeemed, exchanged, transferred or satisfied, as shall be thought fit, also to pay off and reborrow the moneys secured thereby or any part or parts thereof.

To draw, make, accept, and endorse bills of lading, warrants, bills of exchange, promissory notes,

and other transferable or negotiable instruments for the purposes of the Company.

(z6) To unite, co-operate, amalgamate, or enter into partnership or any arrangement for sharing profits or union of interests or any other arrangement with any person or company already engaged in or hereafter to be established for the purpose of carrying on any business having objects wholly or in part similar or analogous or subsidiary to those of the Company or to any of them, or capable of being conducted so as to benefit this Company, either directly or indirectly, and to subscribe for or otherwise acquire for the benefit and in the name of the Company or otherwise and pay for in any manner that may be agreed upon either in money or in shares or bonds or otherwise, and to hold any shares, stock or other interest in any such company, and to promote the formation of any such company.

(27) To acquire by purchase in money, shares, bonds or otherwise, and undertake all or any part of the business, property, assets, and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business in Ceylon or elsewhere which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company.

(28) To sell the property, business, or undertaking of the Company, or any part or parts thereof, for such

consideration as the Company shall think fit, and in particular for shares (whether credited as partly or fully paid up or otherwise) stocks, debentures, or securities of any other company whether such company be registered in Ceylon or elsewhere.

(29) To procure the Company to be registered or in-corporated in Ceylon, and if and when necessary or thought advisable, elsewhere.

(210) To lend money on any terms and in any manner and on any security, and in particular on the produce, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, bills of lading, warrants, stocks, shares, debentures, and book debts, or without any security of security at all.

(z11) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be

determined.

(z12) To promote and establish any other company whatsoever and to subscribe to and hold the shares, debentures, or securities of any other company or stock of any other company or any part thereof and to pay all the costs, charges, and expenses of the formation, promotion, or establishment of any such company.

(z13) To open and keep a share register in Great Britain

and to allocate any number of the shares in the

Company to such register.

(214) To pay for any lands and real or personal, immovable or movable, estate or property or assets of any kind acquired or to be acquired by the Company or for any services rendered or to be rendered to the Company, and generally to pay or discharge any consideration to be paid or given by the Company, in money or in shares or debentures or debenture stock or obligations of the Company or partly in one way and partly in another, or otherwise howsoever with power to issue any shares either fully or partly paid up for such purpose.

(2)5) To accept as consideration for the sale or disposal of any lands and real or personal, immovable and movable, estate, property and assets of the Company of any kind sold or otherwise disposed of by the Company or in discharge of any other consideration to be received by the Company in money or in shares the shares (whether wholly or partially paid up) of any company, or the mortgages, debentures, or obligations of any company or person or partly in one of these modes and partly in another or in any other kind or mode whatsoever.

(z16) To distribute among the Shareholders in specie any property of the Company, whether by way of dividend or upon a return of capital, but so that no distribution amounting to a reduction of

capital be made, except with the sanction for the time being required by law.

(217) To pay all or any part of the expenses of and preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment and registration of the Company, or of any other company whether promoted, formed, established, or registered by or on behalf of the Company, or otherwise and all commission, brokerage, discount, underwriting and other expenses lawfully payable which may be deemed expedient for taking, placing, or under-writing all or any of the shares or debentures or other obligations of the Company or of any such other company.

(z18) To purchase or otherwise acquire, issue, re-issue, sell, place, and deal in shares, stocks, bonds, debentures, and securities of all kinds, and to give any guarantee or security for the payment of dividends or interest thereon, or otherwise in

relation thereto.

(219) To administer trust estates and the estates of deceased persons, or bankruptor insolvent estates or estates in liquidation in any part of the world and to undertake the office of trustee, executor, administrator, assignee, inspector, or any similar office and to perform and discharge the duties of any such office for a commission or other reumneration or otherwise.

(z20) To establish and support or aid in the establishment and support of schools, places of workshops, associations, institutions, funds, trusts, and arrangements, calculated to benefit employees or ex employees of the Company or its predecessors in business, or the dependents or connections of such persons, and to grant pensions, gratuities

and allowances and to make payments towards insurance, pension and superannuation funds, and to subscribe or make donations or gratuities to charitable, scientific, public, or benevolent objects, or any objects calculated to promote the interests of the Company.

(221) To do all such other things as shall be incidental, or conducive, to the attainment of the objects above mentioned or any of them or any one or more of the objects aforesaid, it being hereby declared that in the foregoing clauses (unless a contrary intention appears) the word "Company" includes companies or corporations, and the word "person" any number of persons, and that the other objects specified in any paragraph are not to be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph.

The liability of the Shareholders is limited.

The nominal capital of the Company is one Million 5. The nominal capital of the Company is one Million rupees (Rs. 1,000,000) divided into One hundred thousand (100,000) shares of rupees ten (Rs. 10) each with power to increase or reduce the capital. The shares forming the capital (original, increased, or reduced) may be subdivided or consolidated or divided into such classes with any preferential, deferred, qualified, special or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto, and be held upon such terms as may be prescribed by the Articles of Association and regulations of the Company for the time being, or otherwise. being, or otherwise.

#### COMPANY LIMITED BY SHARES. OF ASSOCIATION OF PROPRIETORS AND AGENTS, LIMITED. ARTICLES

- The regulations contained in the Table marked "C" in the Schedule to the Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called Table "C") shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and vice versa and words importing persons shall include corporations.
- 2. The following new regulations shall be inserted immediately before Regulation I of Table " C ", namely :—

#### BUSINESS.

(a) The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted as soon as in the judgment of the Directors a sufficient number of shares shall have been

subscribed or applied for.

(b) No objection shall be taken to any agreement or sale by which the Company may acquire any property or rights or pay for any services rendered on the ground that any party or parties thereto is or is about or are or are about to become a director or promoter or directors or promoters of the Company or that any director having accepted office at his or their request do not constitute an independent board. Every member of the Company present or future shall be deemed to have notice of the contents of any such agreement or sale and to join the Company on this basis.

(c) None of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or lent on shares of the Company and the Company shall not, except as shall be authorized by law, give any financial assistance for the purpose of or in connection as any purchase of shares in the Company.

(d) The shares shall be under the control Directors who may allot or otherwise dispose of the same to such persons and on such terms and conditions as they

think fit.

#### CAPITAL.

(e) The nominal capital of the Company is Rupees One million (Rs. 1,000,000) divided into 100,000

of Rupees Ten (Rs. 10) each.

The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified or other rights, privileges or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

(g) Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise; as if it had formed part of the original capital.

(h) The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

3:. The following new regulations shall be added after Regulation 10 of Table " C ", namely :—

10 (a) The Board may, in their absolute and uncontrolled discretion, refuse to register any proposed transfer of shares and in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

10 (b) Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two Rupees and fifty cents or such sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 10 (a) shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

10 (c) The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders, without the necessity of any

meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

10 (d) In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only if at all, upon the transferce.

4. The following new regulations shall be added after the Regulation 20 of Table "C", namely:—

#### Borrowing Powers.

- 20 (a) The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's business, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company.
- 5. Regulations 21 and 22 of Table "C" are expressly excluded.
- Regulation 24 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely, "Subsequent General Meetings shall be held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors."
- Regulation 29 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation shall be substituted therefor, namely :-
  - 29. Subject as hereinafter in this clause provided seven days' notice at the least specifying the place and the hour of the meeting and the purpose for which any

meeting is to be held shall be given by notice to the Shareholders in the manner in these Articles provided or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed Whenever it is intended to pass a by the Company. special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice and it shall be no objection that the notice only convenes the second meeting contingently on the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting. A General Meeting or Extraordinary General Meeting may with the consent in writing of all the members for the time being be convened on a shorter notice than seven days or without written notice and notice of an adjourned meeting shall not be requisite in any case.

- 8. A quorum at any General or Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company shall consist of not less than two Shareholders and Regulation 32 of Table "C" is modified accordingly.
- 9. Regulations 39, 42, 43, and 44 are expressly excluded and the following regulations substituted therefor, namely:
  - (a) On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. On a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.

    (b) No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any
  - General Meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.
  - (c) On apoll votes may be given either personally or by

proxy or attorney.

(d) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorized in writing or if the appointor is a corporation either under the common seal or under the hand of an officer or attorney so authorized.

(e) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.

(f) An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form or in any other form which the Directors shall approve :-

- 10. The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 44 of Table "C", namely:—
  - 44 (a) A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers and discretions by or under the regulations of the Company for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally.

    The presence of two or more Directors shall form a quorum at any Directors' meeting.

44 (b) A resolution in writing signed by all of the Directors then resident in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted and every such resolution shall be as soon as practicable entered in the

- minutes of the Directors' meetings.

  44 (c) The Seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of one or more of the Directors, and the Secretary or Secretaries who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or company as such Secretaries.
- 44 (d) A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary or Secretaries of the Company, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors but not
- before his office shall become vacant.

  44 (c) The remuneration of the Directors shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services the

Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services (over and above the remuneration fixed as aforesaid) either by way of salary. commission or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

- Regulation 48 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:
  - 48. The office of Director shall be vacated---
  - (a) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs or compounds with his creditors.
  - (b) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
  - No Director shall be disqualified by reason of his holding office from contracting with the Company either as vendor, purchaser or otherwise nor shall any such contractor arrangement entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Director or with any Director shall be Director or a member or be in any way interested be a tolded nor shall any Director so wattracting of being such Director or member or so interested nor any company or parafership of or in which he had be a Director or member or be in any way interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by any such contract or arrangement by reason of such Director he thing that office or of the fiduciary relation thereby established. Any Director or y company or partnership of which a Director is or hereafter may be a Director or member or in which he is or Company either as vendor, purchaser or other-Me may be a Director or member or in which he is or hereafter may be in any way interested may enter into contracts or arrangements with this Company and any Director of this Company may vote as a Director or Shareholder in respect of any contract or arrangement mentioned in this Article and retain for his own use or for the use of such company or partnership profits made by him under any such contract or arrangement. Provided always that he must disclose his interest to his co-Directors before the contract or arrangement is entered into by the Directors unless the nature of the Director's interest appears on the face of the contract or arrangement.
- 12. A Director may be removed from office by an ordinary resolution passed by the Company in General Meeting and Regulation 63 of Table "C" is modified accordingly.
- Regulation 64 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely :-
  - 64 (a) The Directors may at such times as the circumstances of the Company warrant the same declare dividends to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the number of their shares and the amount paid up or deemed to be paid up thereon respectively.
  - 64 (b) The Directors may if they shall think fit declare from time to time such interim dividends as in their opinion the position of the Company justifies.
- Regulation 66 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely :
  - 66 The Directors may, before recommending any dividend, set aside, out of the profits of the Company, such sums as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for special dividends, or for repairing, improving, and maintaining any of the property of the Company, and for such other purposes as the Directors shall in their absolute discretion think conducive to the interests of the Company; and may invest the several sums so set aside upon such investments (other than shares of the Company) as they may think fit, and from time to time deal with and vary such investments, and dispose of all or any part thereof for the benefit of the Company, and may divide the reserve fund into such special funds as they think fit and employ the reserve fund or any part thereof in the business of the Company and that without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets.

66 (a) Any General Meeting declaring a dividend may resolve that such dividend be paid wholly or in part by the distributior. of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures or debenture stock of the Company, or paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of any other company, or in any one or more of

such ways.

66 (b) Any General Meeting may resolve that any moneys, investments, or other assets forming part of the undivided profits of the Company standing to the credit of the reserve fund or in the hands of the Company and available for dividend (or representing premiums received on the issue of shares and standing to the credit of the share premium account) be capitalized and distributed amongst such of the Shareholders as would be entitled to receive the same if distributed by way of dividend and in the same proportions on the footing that they become entitled thereto as capital and that all or any part of such capitalized fund be applied on behalf of such Shareholders in paying up in full any unissued shares of the Company which shall be distributed accordingly or in or towards payment of the uncalled liability on any issued shares and that such distribution or payment shall be accepted by such Shareholders in full satisfaction of their interest in the said capitalized sum.

66 (c) For the purpose of giving effect to any resolution under the two last preceding articles the Directors may settle any difficulty which may arise in regard to the distribution as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of any specific assets, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any members upon the footing of the value so fixed or that fractions of less than one rupee may be disregarded in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such cash or specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or capitalized fund as may seem

expedient to the Directors.

15. Regulations 85, 86, and 87 of Table "C" are expressly excluded and the following Regulations added after Regulation 84 of Table "C":—-

#### NOTICES.

85 A notice may be served upon any Shareholder whose registered address is in Ceylon either personally or by posting it in a post office to such address in Aprepaid envelope.

86 Each holder of registered shares whose registered place of address is not in Ceylon may from time to time notify in writing to the Company an address which shall be deemed his registered place of address within the meaning of these Articles of Association.

87 As regards those Shareholders who have mo registered place of address in Ceylon a notice posted up in the office shall be deemed to be duly served on them at the expiration of twenty-four hours after it is so posted up.

88 Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day following that on which the envelope or wrapper containing the same is posted and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was properly addressed and put into the post office. And a certificate in writing signed by any Manager, Secretary or other cofficer of the Company that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was so addressed and posted shall be conclusive evidence thereof.

89 Any notice or document delivered or sent by post to or left at the registered address of any Shareholder in pursuance of these presents shall notwithstanding such member be then deceased and whether or not the Company have notice of his decease be deemed to have been duly served in respect of any registered shares whether held solely or jointly with other persons by such Shareholder until some other person be registered in his stead as the holder or joint holder thereof and such service shall for all purposes of these presents be deemed a sufficient service of such notice or document on his or her heirs, executors or administrators and all persons if any jointly interested with him or her in any such share.

#### EVIDENCE.

90 On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, in the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

## PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

91 Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not, and whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them."

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Friday, April 23, 1937, at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated April 17, 1937.

Present:—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. K. T. S. Gurusingha, Assistant Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. A. Kahaduwa; and Mr. J. C. Cooper.

- 1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on March 17, 1937, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.
- 2. Two petitions were presented by Mr. W. Dahanayaka, and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.
- 3. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following question:—(1) (a) Will the Chairman please give consumers of electricity reasonable time, extending up to over six months, to carry out the improvements in their installations suggested by the Superintendent of the Electricity Department? (b) Is it true that Government has asked for time to carry out the improvements in the installations of Government buildings in Galle? (c) Should not the Government be pressed to carry out their part of the work with the least possible delay?
- (2) (a) Under what conditions have certain portions of the cemetery at Dadalla been allotted for the special use of (2) (a) Under what conditions have certain portions of the cemetery at Dadalla been allotted for the special use of the various Christian denominations? (b) What charges, if any, are made from the respective churches for the exclusive use of portions of the cemetery? (c) Does not the Council spend to keep even these portions of the cemetery clean and in good order? (d) Is the Chairman aware that the Roman Catholic Church charges as much as Rs. 100 for a reserved grave? (e) Is the Chairman aware that the present position is as follows? The Council who owns these portions of the cemetery spends money on them and gets no revenue therefrom; but the Roman Catholic Church does make money on the portion allotted to them free of charge by the Council. (f) Will the Chairman please take steps to revise the conditions of trust so that such exploitation by a Christian Church will become impossible in the future?

- of trust so that such exploitation by a Christian Church will become impossible in the future?

  The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) At present as much as 3 months is allowed to carry out the improvements. I consider this sufficient in nearly all cases. (b) Yes. (c) Yes.

  (2) With regard to these questions the Chairman stated that they were received on the morning of April 20, 1937, thus giving over 72 hours' notice but this did not comply with the requirement of notice of 3 clear days. As he was, however, prepared to answer them, he requested the permission of Council to give the replies. The Council agreed thereto and the Chairman replied:—(a) In 1899 portions were vested in the Roman Catholic Church and the Anglican Church for their exclusive use. In 1903 a portion was sold to the Wesleyan Church. (b) No charges are made. (c) No. As far as I am aware the Council spends only on maintaining the outer wall of the cemetery which is in places the boundary wall of the portions belonging to religious denominations. (d) I am not aware what charges are made by the Roman Catholic Church for reserved graves. (e) The first part of the statement made in this question is not correct. - 4. The Chairman moved:—That in terms of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, Mr. G. Ross Bell, who having failed to attend 3 consecutive meetings of the Council, had ipso facto ceased to be a member, be restored to office. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.
- The Chairman moved:—That this Council approves of the retention of Mr. K. T. S. Gurusingha as Assistant Chairman for a further period of six months with effect from May 16, 1937. Mr. A. Kahaduwa seconded.

The Chairman explained the conditions under which the Assistant Chairman had been appointed and theroupon Mr. A. C. Mohammedo agreed to withdraw this amendment with the permission of the Council. 18. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee appointed to submit an early report on the amendment required in Ordinance No. 60 of 1935 to make it applicable to the Galle Municipal Council held on October 6, 1936, and April 9, 1937 :-

Number of Wards:—It was agreed that the number of wards should be increased from 7 to 10.

Number of Members :-- The Chairman moved that the Council under the Reformed Constitution should consist of 10 elected members and not more than 4 nominated members. Mr. J. E. Perera moved as an amendment that the Council should consist of 10 elected members and 3 nominated members. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded. The amendment was first put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 5 against. The Chairman's motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 5 votes to 3.

Franchise: --Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:--"That the franchise for the reformed Municipal Council be the same as the present franchise for the State Council

After discussion the motion was put to the neeting and lost, I voting for and 8 against.

Mr. J. E. Perera next moved that the qualification of voters in the reformed Municipal Council of Galle be the same as that laid down at present as the qualification for voters in the Colombo Municipal Council (Constitution) Ordinance. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded. Messrs. W. Dahanayaka and A. I. H. A. Wahab spoke against the motion which was then put to the meeting and carried 7 voting for and 2 against.

Resolved that the extracts of the Special Committee be not considered pending a full report on the matter at the conclusion of the Special Committee's deliberations.

Provided that the Chairman may require the production of any dog for the registration of which an application is made, and may refuse to issue a certificate of registration and a metal ticket or collar for that dog-

(a) If that dog is not produced; or

- (b) if that dog is, in the opinion of the Chairman, so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or
- (c) if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner.
- 5. The Chairman may, after notice to be left at the address of the owner of any dog for which a certificate of registration has been issued, cancel such certificate-
  - (a) if that dog becomes, in the opinion of the Chairman, so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or
  - (b) if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
  - (c) if that dog is permitted by its owner, at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, to associate with any other dog.
- 6. (1) The owner of any dog, for which a certificate of registration has been refused under by-law 4 or has been cancelled under by-law 5, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce that dog at a time and place, appointed by the
- Chairman, to be stated in the notice.

  (2) Every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Chairman shall think fit.
- 7. The owner of any dog for which a metal ticket or collar has been issued shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the metal ticket or collar is fastened securely round the neck of that dog at all times during the period for which the certificate of registration issued in respect of that dog is in force.
- 8. The Chairman may authorize in writing any person to exercise any or all of the power vested in the Chairman by these by-laws.
- 9. The by-laws made by the Weligama Urban District Council published in Government Gazette No. 7,976 of April 12, 1933, are hereby revoked.




