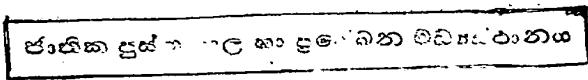

## General Meeting.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated May 26, 1937.

Present : Dr. R. Saravanamuttu the Mayor, presiding ; Mr. Geo. R. de Silva (Deputy Mayor) ; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Mr. M. T. Akbar, K.C. ; Mr. D. R. Bentara-Aratchi ; Dr. A. F. J. Casie Chitty ; Dr. E. A. Cooray ; Mr. J. R. Dharmasena ; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando ; Dr. C. W. S. Fernando ; Dr. S. D. Fernando ; Mr. D. S. Fonseka ; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C. ; Mr. F. G. Husein ; Mr. N. M. M. Isluk ; Mr. C. G. C. Kerr, C.A. ; Dr. A. Ratnapala ; Mr. A. R. A. Razik, J.P., M.S.C. ; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal ; Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam ; Mr. N. Saravanamuttu ; Mr. S. Saravanamuttu ; Dr. V. R. Schokman, and Mr. M. Subbiah.

The Municipal Commissioner (Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S.) was present.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of 5th and those of the first meeting and the General Meeting of the new Council of May 7, 1937, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were laid before the Council.

Mr. Geo. R. de Silva moved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of May 5, 1937, be taken as read and confirmed. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Mr. Geo. R. de Silva moved that the Minutes of the first meeting and of the General Meeting of the new Council of May 7, 1937, be taken as read and confirmed. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The Mayor explained the position as regards an amendment of the minutes of first meeting of Council of May 7, 1937, suggested by Mr. A. E. Goonesinha. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha stated that he did not press the suggestion. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C., M.M.C., presented a petition from the residents of Wanathamulla, praying against the proposal to charge them rates, and pleading that in view of the fact the poorest of the poor—most of them unemployed—reside in this area, having absolutely no benefits such as lights, water, and other amenities enjoyed by city dwellers, and also in view of the fact that Wanathamulla is always subject to floods when their huts are seriously damaged, that this proposal to tax them should be deferred, and requested that it be placed before the appropriate Committee for consideration and report.

3. Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam who had given notice of a petition from the residents of Haig road, Bambalapitiya, stated that she had not brought the petition. The Mayor requested her to present it at the next meeting.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved :—(1) In view of the fact that the conversion of premises 303, Dam street—which was a dwelling house—into a factory, has caused dehousing in this congested area and is creating nuisance and annoyance to the neighbours, this Council recommends the withdrawal of the permit to use this premises as a factory and reconversion of the same into a dwelling house. Dr. S. D. Fernando seconded.

Mr. M. T. Akbar inquired under what by-law the permit was granted. The Mayor stated that he would explain later.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader inquired whether the area was not "Residential." The Mayor explained that it was both a Commercial and a Congested area.

The Mayor explained facts connected with the case, and at the same time by way of reply to a comment made by the mover of the motion mentioned the circumstances which necessitated the restriction in the issue of files to members. He also asked the members to refrain as far as possible from making personal remarks in the open Council against officers of Council.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement and the Law Committee for consideration and report to Council. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

The mover of the motion accepted the amendment which thereupon became the substantive motion.

Mr. C. G. C. Kerr opposed the motion and suggested that it be decided by the Council.

Mr. M. T. Akbar stated that if it was a question of public nuisance the residents had their remedy in resorting to the Courts.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported the motion.

Mr. F. G. Husein suggested that the consideration of the matter be deferred to the next meeting to enable any member who so desired to visit the place, in the meantime. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved :—(2) That in view of the increasing number of serious motor bus accidents in the City this Council urges the immediate introduction of legislation to compel owners of omnibuses plying in the City to insure against third party risks and against injury and loss of life in which passengers travelling in their buses may be involved. Mr. S. Saravanamuttu seconded.

The Mayor stated that the motion was a very good one.

There was provision in the Ordinance for insurance against third party risks in case of motor cars used for hire which included buses, but it was not enforced. He thought that the motion might be amended to include all road motor-traffic. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal agreed to the amendment. Mr. C. G. C. Kerr supported the motion, as amended. The motion, as amended, was put to the meeting and carried.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved : (3) This Council deplores the attitude of the Central Government towards the building up of a new City Central Market and demands the immediate transfer of the factory site, as promised, for the new Central Market. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The Mayor explained the position.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha stated that the matter was under consideration of the Executive Committee concerned and the site would be made available to the Council by the next financial year. The motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

5. Pursuant to notice, the Mayor moved :—“That a Special Committee be appointed to consider and report to the Council what amendments are required of the clauses of the Colombo Municipal Council (Constitution) Ordinance, No. 60 of 1935, relating to the qualifications and registration of voters.” Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved that the following do constitute the Special Committee, with the Mayor as Chairman, who should submit its report to the next meeting of Council.

*The Special Committee.*—(1) The Mayor (the Chairman) ; (2) Mr. Geo. R. de Silva (Deputy Mayor) ; (3) Mr. M. T. Akbar, K.C. ; (4) Dr. E. A. Coorey ; (5) Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando ; (6) Mr. A. E. Goonesinha ; (7) Mr. G. G. Husein. Dr. C. W. S. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

6. The Council proceeded to elect Members for the Four Standing Committees, voting by ballot. The results of the ballot were declared by the Mayor as follows :—

(1) *Standing Committee on Finance.*—(1) Dr. R. Saravanamuttu, Mayor (*Ex-Officio* Chairman of the Committee) ; (2) Mr. Geo. R. de Silva, Deputy Mayor ; (3) Mr. A. E. Goonesinha ; (4) Mr. F. C. Husein ; (5) Mr. C. G. C. Kerr, C.A. ; (6) Mr. A. R. A. Razik.

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Thursday, May 20, 1937, at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated May 15, 1937.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on April 23, 1937, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions :—(1) (a) How many labourers of the conservancy, scavenging, rat-trapping, works and electricity departments respectively signed the pay sheets in receiving their wages this month, and how many affixed their thumb marks instead? (b) Will the Chairman please note that the high percentage of thumb marks from the labourers of the conservancy department, in contrast to other departments, is due to corrupt practice; that even those who are able to sign their names have been instructed not to do so; and that people who have not worked at all are sent up to receive wages which ultimately find their way into the pockets of fraudulent superior officers? (c) What action does the Chairman propose to take in this matter? (2) (a) Is the Chairman aware that the conservancy buckets placed each day in latrines are usually not those that have been washed and cleaned in water? (b) Cannot arrangements be made so that each day the replacing is done with an absolutely clean bucket that has been washed in water and not merely dry cleaned with coir dust? (3) (a) How much of revenue has been deposited by each of the clerks working at the fish auction shed month per month this year? (b) How many surprise visits have the Chairman, the Assistant Chairman, the Secretary, and Chief Clerk paid to the fish auction shed this year? (c) Will the Chairman please take due cognizance of what I have gleaned from reliable sources—that Municipal revenue is being daily robbed at the fish auction shed? (4) (a) What policy guides the Standing Committee on Works in considering applications for water service? (b) As several applications for water service have been refused without sufficient grounds and on flimsy excuses, will the Chairman please see that in future some sort of policy is strictly adhered to? (5) What is the present position with regard to the refundment of moneys due to members of the Galle Municipal Employees' Co-operative Society? (6) (a) In how many Municipal prosecutions this year up to date have the accused been warned and discharged? (b) Will the Chairman please exercise his powers of discretion more often in the future and not sanction prosecutions against poor people for very trivial offences? (7) (a) Is there a list showing the allocation of duties to guide the officers of the Council in their work? (b) If not, will the Chairman please take steps to have such a list prepared? (8) In view of the discovery of the cheopis flea in large numbers in Galle, will the Chairman please invite the attention of Government to the very urgent necessity for the fumigation of rice in the port of Galle?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) (a) According to the check rolls for the month of April the information required is as follows :—Conservancy Department, 107 thumb marks and 1 signature; Scavenging Department, 94 thumb marks and 5 signatures; Rat-trapping Department, 15 thumb marks and 5 signatures; Works Department, 10 thumb marks and 28 signatures; Electricity Department, 3 thumb marks and 39 signatures. (b) The high percentage of thumb marks not only in the Conservancy but also in the Scavenging Department is due to the fact that most of the labourers employed in these two departments are unable to sign their names. In my opinion, however, a thumb impression is more useful for the purpose of identifying the payee in case it becomes necessary to do so. All these labourers receive their wages direct from the Shroff in the presence of the Medical Officer of Health and the supervising officer concerned, who identifies them in cases where the Medical Officer of Health is unable to do so himself, and I understand that such cases are extremely rare. I, therefore, consider that the statements made are unjustified and not warranted by facts. (c) I do not propose to take any action in the matter unless a specific charge is made and sufficient evidence adduced in support of it. (2) (a) and (b) Yes, this is an old practice which is being eliminated by the duplicate system where a washed disinfected conservancy bucket is placed daily in every latrine. Each year this scheme is extended in the conserved area, and the old undesirable practice will soon be completely stopped. (3) (a) A statement giving the information required is tabled. (b) Two by the Assistant Chairman, and six by the Secretary. (c) I do not know what the member has gleaned from reliable sources, but if he will inform me what has come to his knowledge I shall take due notice of it. (4) (a) Each application is considered on its merits, although the general principle is to refuse applications in respect of premises which are assessed at less than Rs. 10 per mensem. (b) Applications have not been refused except in the cases mentioned. It is not desirable to lay down a definite policy until the adequacy of the water supply has been further investigated. (5) I understand that the members of the society are making an attempt to recover the lost money and that they have made further representations to the Registrar of Co-operative Societies who is taking necessary action in the matter. (6) (a) 83 in a total of 406 cases. (b) The fact that in many cases the accused persons have been warned and discharged does not show that the prosecutions were unnecessary. Prosecutions are not sanctioned unless they are justified. (7) (a) and (b) There is such a list, but it needs revision, and this is being done by the Assistant Chairman. (8) I have already addressed Government on this matter, and at the end of October last year I was informed that arrangements will be made in due course to fumigate suspect cargo at Galle. I will again invite attention to the matter.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved :—(1) That the construction of Municipal rat-proof granaries be expedited with all possible speed in view of the discovery of the cheopis flea in large numbers in Galle. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. The Chairman said that it was correct that very little had been done with regard to the question of granaries since last October. He had now been informed, although not officially, that the question of erecting rat-proof granaries in Galle was receiving the attention of Government and that plans and estimates for the same were being prepared by the Ministry of Health. But as he had no definite information on the matter he was unable to supply any details. He would, however, write to the Hon. the Minister for Health at once and ascertain what exactly was proposed to be done. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan also spoke. Mr. J. C. Cooper said that he was definitely aware that plans and estimates for the construction of granaries in Galle were being prepared by the Ministry for Health. The mover replied, and after further discussion it was agreed, in view of what the Chairman had stated, to amend the motion to read as follows :—“That the proposed construction of rat-proof granaries be expedited with all possible speed in view of the discovery of the cheopis flea in large numbers in Galle”.

The motion, as amended, was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(2) That the Finance Committee do consider and report on the feasibility of extending the system of office collections for assessment and conservancy rates.

With the permission of Council the mover amended the motion to read as follows :—“ That the Finance Committee do consider and report on the feasibility of extending the system of office collections for assessment rates and conservancy fees ”. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. Carried by 7 votes to 1, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya being in favour of the matter being considered by a Special Committee of the Council.

4. To elect, by ballot, a member of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, to fill a vacancy :—A ballot was taken, and the Chairman declared that Dr. A. T. Kuriyan was elected.

5. Considered a letter from the Government Agent, Southern Province, requesting the approval of the Council for the erection of the New Signal Station and the new Light-house on the proposed sites on Utrecht Bastion :—Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that the erection of the new Signal Station and the new Light-house on the proposed sites on Utrecht Bastion be approved. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya moved as an amendment that consideration of the matter be deferred. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded. The amendment was first put to the meeting and declared lost, 2 voting for and 6 against. Mr. Dahanayaka's motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 6 votes to 2.

6. To approve the draft boundaries of the area of the town served by the water supply scheme.—Resolved that consideration be deferred till the next meeting.

7. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of May 8, 1937.*

(2) Considered a joint report from the Municipal Engineer and the Medical Officer of Health regarding the water carriage systems in the town.—Recommended that the whole question of the water supply to the town be thoroughly investigated with special reference to the following points :—(a) the actual capacity of the Hiyare reservoir at various depths ; and (b) future proposals for water carriage systems in the town.

(3) Considered applications for water service to the following premises :—(a) 92, Galupiadde.—Recommended that the extension applied for be refused. (b) 238, Magalle.—Recommended that the application be allowed for two taps ; (c) 258, Magalle.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap ; (d) 259, Jail road.—Resolved that consideration be deferred until certificate of conformity is obtained ; (e) 188, China Garden Middle road.—Recommended that the application be refused ; (f) 22, Middle street.—Recommended that the application be allowed for two taps only ; (g) 26, Pedlar street.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap ; (h) 22A, Middle street.—Recommended that the application be allowed for two taps only ; (i) 100, 101, Kaluwella.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap.

(4) Considered an application to install the water carriage system at premises No. 9, Lighthouse street.—Recommended that the application be not granted at present in view of the demand of these installations on the town water supply.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (2) it was resolved that the investigation be made by the Municipal Engineer with the assistance and advice of the Provincial Engineer.

With regard to item (4) Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that the application be granted. Mr. J. C. Cooper seconded.—Carried.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining item were adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of May 8, 1937.*

(2) Considered the question of writing off the rates due on the following properties on account of poverty :—29, Galupiadde and 131, Dadalla.—Recommended that the rates due on both premises for 1937, and 4th quarter, 1936, amounting to Rs. 5·83 be written off on the ground of poverty of the owners.

(3) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 115 under Head 41—Capital Expenditure—Electric Megger.—Recommended.

(4) To recommend the grant of a pension of Rs. 285·60 to scavenging overseer, N. A. Charles, who has applied for permission to retire from service.—Recommended.

(5) Considered Mr. W. Dahanayaka's motion at the meeting of the Council on April 23, 1937, viz. :—“ That the deposit of Rs. 20 against electricity supply accounts be reduced to Rs. 10.—Recommended that, in the case of new consumers, deposits be taken according to the following scale suggested by the Superintendent of the Electricity Department :—domestic consumers : 6 lights and under, Rs. 10 ; 12 lights and under, Rs. 15 ; over 12 lights, Rs. 20 ; business places, Rs. 20 irrespective of the number of lamps installed.

(6) To recommend the leave on full pay granted to Beach Patrol Batcha for 3 days in February and 2 days in March.—Recommended.

(7) Considered an application from Mr. J. Nanayakkara, Clerk, Municipal Engineer's Office, for an allowance as Storekeeper.—Recommended the payment of an allowance of Rs. 60 per annum with effect from May 1, 1937. (This recommendation was made by the Chairman's casting vote, two members of the Committee being in favour of the payment of an enhanced allowance of Rs. 120 per annum).

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (7) Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that the allowance be increased to Rs. 120 per annum. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 5 against. The recommendation of the Standing Committee was then put to the meeting and adopted.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

8. To consider the acceptance of a tender for the construction of an Electric Meter Testing Room.—Resolved that the tender of Messrs. Walker Sons & Co., Ltd., for Rs. 1,256 be accepted.

9. To approve the draft report of the Special Committee on reforms :—Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that the draft report of the Special Committee on Reforms be considered as tabled. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded. The motion was put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 6 against. Mr. J. E. Perera then moved that the report be approved for submission to the Council subject to any riders which the members may wish to add. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded. This motion was put to the meeting and carried by 6 votes to 3. Mr. T. Amarasuriya called for a division which resulted as follows :—*For* : The Chairman, Messrs. J. E. Perera, A. C. Mohammedo, C. E. de Vos, J. C. Cooper, and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan. *Against* : Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya, W. Dahanayaka, and A. I. H. A. Wahab.

10. With the permission of Council the Chairman moved :—“ That in view of the fact the necessary fittings for the Coronation illuminations have not all been dismantled, the illuminations on the R mparts be allowed on the nights of the 24th and 25th instant (from 6.30 P.M. to 1 A.M.) on the occasion of the Buddhist Wesak at a special rate of 50 cents a night inclusive of labour costs ; and that in case of any interruption in current a reduction at the rate of Rs. 4·50 per hour be allowed. Mr. W. Dahanayaka, in seconding, complimented the Council's Electricity Department for the brilliant scheme of Coronation illuminations on the Ramparts. The motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

11. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, June 12, 1937, at 9 A.M.

12. At the conclusion of the meeting the Chairman gave notice of the following motion for the meeting of Council on June 12, 1937 :—“ That in order to regularise the system of rating in Galle this Council resolves to levy throughout the town from the beginning of the year 1938 a consolidated rate of 17½ per cent. which includes a water rate of 6 per cent. and to exempt from the said water rate all lands and buildings situated outside the area served by the water supply scheme.”
