REGULATION.

The regulations relating to the Ceylon Mounted Rifles Corps of the Ceylon Defence Force, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,241 of August 28, 1936, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,297 of June 25, 1937, are hereby further amended in Schedule II., Table 1, as follows:—

- (1) under the heading "Order of Dress No. 1A"—

(a) by the substitution, for the item "*Breeches*" wherever that item occurs under that heading, of the following:—

"*Overalls*: Blue cloth, with double scarlet stripe 5/6 inch wide down the seam, fastened under boot with black foot straps";

(b) by the substitution, for the item "*Boots*" wherever that item occurs under that heading, of the following:—

"*Boots*: Wellington, black patent leather."; and

(c) by the substitution, for the item "*Spurs*" wherever that item occurs under that heading, of the following:—

"*Spurs*: Box."; and

- (2) under the heading "Order of Dress No. 2A", by the addition immediately after the words "Other ranks, bandoliers.", of the following:—

"NOTE: Breeches, boots and spurs as detailed above will be worn by members of Sabre Troop only. All other members of the Regiment will wear instead:—

Shorts: Khaki drill spinners shade No. 1 with four loops for the belt, one at each side, one behind, and one immediately on the right side of the fly.

Boots: Ankle, brown with plain toe caps for officers and W. Os., without toe caps for other ranks.

Puttees: Fox's spiral khaki drill shade to finish at the ankle. Tapes to be wound spirally one inch above the boot top to a width of two inches."

3. The free drugs supplied to estate dispensaries by Government are for the use of estate labourers exclusively, and shall not be put to any other use whatever.

4. In requisitioning for free drugs for an estate dispensary, Superintendents of estates must confine themselves to the list of drugs published in Appendix A.

5. The half-yearly requisitions for free drugs, to be despatched within a month, must reach the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services on or before the dates given below:—

For estates in the Central Province: Kandy District on January 10 and June 10; Matale and Nuwara Eliya Districts on February 10 and July 10.

For estates in the Uva and Southern Provinces on March 1 and August 1.

For estates in the Sabaragamuwa and North-Western Provinces on April 1 and October 1.

For estates in the Western and other Provinces on May 1 and November 1.

6. Drugs required between the half-yearly requisitions shall be applied for by an intermediate requisition (Medical Form 166).

7. Quinine and tincture of opium shall be applied for separately from other drugs, on Medical Form 166 for quinine, and on Opium Form No. 1 for tincture of opium.

8. All columns of requisition forms must be accurately filled up. The "Remaining" column must show the actual amount in stock at date of requisition. Requisitions shall be signed by the Superintendent of the estate and be accompanied by a certificate as in Appendix B.

9. Intermediate requisitions referred to in paragraph 6 will be complied with as little delay as possible, provided the cost of the drugs will not exceed the amount allowed by Government.

10. The half-yearly requisitions will be complied with within a month of their receipt.

11. The necessary forms, viz., Medical 11, Half-yearly Requisition; Medical 166, Intermediate Requisition; Medical 159, Requisition for Drugs on Payment; and No. 1 Opium Form can be obtained from the Civil Medical Stores on application.

12. On receipt of an application for drugs on payment, the applicant will first be informed of the cost, and the drugs will be issued without delay when cheque, postal or money order, has been received.

13. All cheques or postal or money orders must be crossed and made payable to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

14. Superintendents of scheduled estates can obtain from the Civil Medical Stores any drug on payment in the manner prescribed in paragraph 1.

15. Medicines will not be compounded at the Civil Medical Stores, but such may be obtained from the district hospitals and dispensaries.

16. All applications for drugs should give full directions how the drugs are to be forwarded.

17. Surgical instruments and appliances, stationery, and equipment will not be supplied by Government.

18. Subject to the approval of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services the appointment of a dispenser to the charge of an estate dispensary, continued employment, leave of absence, and the appointment of a temporary substitute shall rest with the Superintendent, who will also pay his salary and supervise his work.

19. It is to be clearly understood that an estate dispensary and its dispenser form no part of the Civil Medical Department or of Government Service, and that no pension rights are attached to the office.

20. The dispenser may collect for the Superintendent, to be forwarded to the District Medical Officer of the station, all reports of births and deaths on the estate under his charge immediately after they occur. These reports are not to be signed by the dispenser or any other person on the estate, except by the Superintendent himself, or any one acting for him, or, in his absence, by the person acting for him. This is a duty imposed on the Superintendent by section 12 (c) of Ordinance No. 9 of 1912.

21. The Superintendent may note on the death report whether the patient was attended by the estate dispenser; but the fact of his having been so attended does not free the Superintendent of his obligation to send for the District Medical Officer in terms of section 12 (d) of the Ordinance. The attendance of the estate dispenser cannot be considered as fulfilling the requirement of the Ordinance in serious cases.

22. The dispenser shall request the Superintendent of the estate to send for the Medical Officer of the District to see any serious case or cases for which he may require a higher opinion, or in which removal to the hospital might be injurious to the patient, and he shall do so in all cases of prolonged midwifery.

23. The dispenser shall bring to the notice of the Superintendent the condition of the lines or their surroundings likely to injuriously affect the occupants, and suggest remedies.

24. The dispenser shall submit monthly a return to the Provincial Surgeon of the Province of the diseases treated at the estate dispensary on the form which would be supplied him for the purpose.

25. The dispenser shall keep a register of the patients treated by him, and a book in which he is to record all the prescriptions compounded by him.

26. Rules for the guidance of the dispenser as to hours of attending the dispensary and visiting lines on the estate will be drawn up by the Superintendent.

27. The supply of drugs to an estate dispensary will cease when an estate or group of estates will no longer maintain a dispenser.

28. Whenever the District Medical Officer or assistant is sent for to see a case on any of the estates provided with a dispensary, either the one or the other must attend in person. In no case is an unqualified assistant or apothecary to be sent.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF SUPERINTENDENTS OF ESTATES AND OF DISPENSERS IN CHARGE OF ESTATE DISPENSARIES.

An estate or group of estates which maintains a dispenser and a suitable building for a dispensary will be allowed a certain amount of drugs free by Government. Government encourages the establishment of such dispensaries in the hope that treatment being placed within easy reach of the labourer, he will avail himself of it at a much earlier period in his illness than he probably would of that at the Government dispensary, which is, as a rule, at a considerable distance from him.

At the earlier period the illness would most probably yield to such ordinary treatment as the estate dispensers are qualified to give; this would tend to lessen the number requiring hospital treatment, and eventually the hospital mortality, but Estate Superintendents are reminded that the employment of a dispenser does not free them from their obligations to their labourers under "The Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912."

Estate dispensers are not sufficiently trained, and are therefore not considered qualified to treat serious illness, and in all such cases the District Medical Officer should be sent for to see the patient in terms of section 12 (d) of Ordinance No. 9 of 1912. Superintendents are requested to see this rule duly carried out.

1. Superintendents may obtain such drugs as those prescribed in Appendix A at cost price from Government dispensaries to the total value of Rs. 5 for cash with order, provided that no quantity of any one drug of the value of more than Re. 1 shall be supplied at any one time; and from the Civil Medical Stores, Colombo, to any amount on application to the Superintendent on Medical Form 159 accompanied by a remittance.

2. Superintendents of estates having a dispensary with a qualified apothecary may have such prescribed drugs free of payment to the extent of 50 cents worth per head of the estate labour population per annum.

- (a) an applicant for debentures dies before any debenture is allotted to him ; and

- Stalls Nos. 30, 31, 32, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 41, 42, 43, 45, 46, 47, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 56, 57, and 58. Each Rs. 4.50 per month or 1/30th of the month's rent for a day or part thereof.
- Stalls Nos. 33, 40, 44, 48, and 55. Each Rs. 6.50 per month or 1/30th of the month's rent for a day or part thereof.
- Stalls Nos. 59, 60, 61, 64, 65, and 66. Each Rs. 15 per month or 1/30th of the month's rent for a day or part thereof.
- Stalls Nos. 62 and 63. Each Rs. 10 per month or cents 50 per day or part thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 6 of the regulations relating to the use of highways by lorries published in *Gazette* No. 8,208 of March 13, 1936, any person

may, on any highway, situated within the limits of this urban area —

- (1) use a lorry for the purpose of removing furniture or household goods to or from any premises adjoining such highway if—
 - (a) the tare of the lorry together with the weight of the maximum load which it is licensed to carry, does not exceed $1\frac{1}{2}$ tons; and
 - (b) such person has obtained a permit for such use of the lorry from the authority in charge of such highway; or
- (2) use a service lorry if the tare of such lorry together with the weight of the maximum load which it is licensed to carry does not exceed one ton, a service lorry for the purpose of this regulation meaning a lorry maintained and employed by any trading firm solely for the purpose of delivering parcels or goods to customers.

2. No omnibus or lorry shall be driven at a greater speed than 12 miles per hour, and no other motor car shall be driven at a greater speed than 15 miles per hour, on any highway within this urban area.

 - (j) To prepare, cure, manufacture, treat, and prepare for market tea, rubber, cocoa, coconuts, plumbago, minerals, and (or) other crops or produce, and to sell, ship and dispose of such tea, rubber, cocoa, coconuts, plumbago minerals, crops and produce, either raw or manufactured, at such times and places and in such manner as shall be deemed expedient.
 - (k) To buy, sell, warehouse, transport, trade, and deal in tea, rubber, coconuts, cocoa, coffee and other plants and seed, and rice and other food required for coolies, labourers, and others employed on estates and other products, wares, merchandise, articles, and things of any kind whatever.
 - (l) To work mines or quarries and to find, win, get, work, crush, smelt, manufacture, or otherwise deal with ores, metals, minerals, oils, precious and other stones, deposits and products, and generally to carry on the business of miners, manufacturers, growers, planters, and exporters of tea, rubber, cocoa, chocolate, coconuts, and other products, or any such business on behalf of the Company or as agents for others and on commission or otherwise.
 - (m) To establish and carry on a dairy farm, and to buy and sell live stock, and to sell and deal in milk and dairy produce, wholesale or retail.
 - (n) To establish and maintain in Ceylon, the United Kingdom, or elsewhere, stores, shops, and places for the sale of tea, rubber, coconuts, cacao, chocolate, coffee, and articles of food, drink, or refreshment, wholesale or retail; and to establish in any part or parts of the world agencies for carrying on or developing the business of the Company or any branch thereof; and generally to carry on the business of merchants, exporters, importers, traders, engineers, or any other trade, business, or undertaking whatsoever.
 - (o) To cultivate, manage, and superintend estates and properties in Ceylon or elsewhere, and generally to undertake the business of estate agents in Ceylon and elsewhere, to act as agents for the investment, loan, payment, transmission and collection of money, and for the purchase, sale, improvement, development, and management of property, including concerns and undertakings, and to transact any other agency business of any kind.
 - (p) To let, lease, sell, exchange, or mortgage the Company's estates, lands, buildings or other property, or any part or parts thereof, whether in consideration of rents, money, or securities for money, shares debentures, or securities in any other company whether such company be registered in Ceylon or elsewhere, or for any other consideration, and otherwise to trade in, dispose of, or deal with the same or any part thereof.
 - (q) To borrow or receive on loan money for the purposes of the Company upon the security of cash credit bonds, or of hypothecation or mortgages of the Company's property or any part or parts thereof, or otherwise, as shall be thought most expedient, and in particular by the issue of debentures, debenture stock, or bonds to bearer or otherwise, either charged upon all or any part of the Company's present or future property (including uncalled capital), or not so charged, as shall be thought best.
 - (r) To cause or permit any debenture stock, bonds, debentures, mortgages, charges, incumbrances, liens, or securities of or belonging to or made or issued by the Company or affecting its property or rights or any of the terms thereof to be renewed, extended, varied, redeemed, exchanged, transferred, or satisfied, as shall be thought fit, also to pay off and reborrow the moneys secured thereby or any part or parts thereof.
 - (s) To draw, make, accept, and endorse bills of lading, warrants, bills of exchange, promissory notes, and other transferable or negotiable instruments for the purposes of the Company.
 - (t) To unite, co-operate, amalgamate, or enter into partnership or any arrangement for sharing profits or union of interests or any other arrangement with any person or company already engaged in or hereafter to be established for the purpose of carrying on any business having objects wholly or in part similar or analogous or subsidiary to those of the Company or to any of them, or capable of being conducted so as to benefit this Company, either directly or indirectly, and to subscribe for or otherwise acquire for the benefit and in the name of the Company or otherwise and pay for in any manner that may be agreed upon either in money or in shares or bonds or otherwise, and to hold any shares, stock, or other interest in any such company, and to promote the formation of any such company.
 - (u) To acquire by purchase in money, shares, bonds, or otherwise, and undertake all or any part of the business, property, assets, and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business in Ceylon or elsewhere which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company.

- (r) To sell the property, business, or undertaking of the Company, or any part or parts thereof, for such consideration as the Company shall think fit, and in particular for shares, stocks, debentures, or securities of any other company whether such company be registered in Ceylon or elsewhere.
- (s) To procure the Company to be registered or incorporated in Ceylon, and, if and when necessary or thought advisable, elsewhere.
- (x) To lend money on any terms and in any manner and on any security, and in particular on the security of plantations, factories, growing crops, produce, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, bills of lading, warrants, stocks, shares, debentures, and book debts, or without any security at all.
- (y) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (z) To promote and establish any other company whatsoever and to subscribe to and hold the shares or stock of any other company or any part thereof.

- (z3) To pay all or any part of the expenses of and preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment and registration of the Company, or of any other Company promoted, formed, established, or registered by or on behalf of the Company, and all commission, brokerage, discount, underwriting, and other expenses lawfully payable which may be deemed expedient for taking, placing, or underwriting all or any of the shares or debentures or other obligations of the Company or of any company so promoted, formed, established, or registered by the Company.
- (z4) To accept as consideration for the sale or disposal of any lands and real or personal, immovable and movable, estate, property and assets of the Company of any land sold or otherwise disposed of by the Company or in discharge of any other consideration to be received by the Company in money or in shares, the shares (whether wholly or partially paid up) of any company, or the mortgages, debentures, or obligations of any company or person, partly one and partly the other.
- (z5) To distribute among the Shareholders specific any property of the Company, whether by way of dividend or upon a return of capital, but so that no distribution amounting to a reduction of capital be made, except with the sanction for the time being required by law.
- (z6) To do all such other things as shall be incidental, or conducive, to the attainment of the objects above mentioned or any of them or any one or more of the objects aforesaid, it being hereby declared that in the foregoing clauses (unless a contrary intention appears) the word "Company" includes companies or corporations, and the word "person" any number of persons, and that the other objects specified in any paragraph are not to be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE COTTAGALLA RUBBER ESTATES COMPANY, LIMITED.

1. The marginal notes hereto shall not affect the construction hereof and in these presents unless there be something in the subject or context inconsistent therewith— Interpretation.

"The Ordinance" means the Joint Stock Companies' Ordinances 1861 to 1909 and every other Ordinance for the time being in force concerning Joint Stock Companies and affecting the Company.

"Special resolution" has the meaning assigned thereto by the Ordinance.

"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy (in cases where by these Articles proxies are allowed) at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.

"The Directors" means the Directors and alternate Directors for the time being.

"The Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

"The Register" means the register of members to be kept pursuant to section 19 of the Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861.

"Dividend" includes bonus.

"Month" means calendar month.

"Proxy" includes attorney duly constituted under a power of attorney.

"In writing" and "written" include printing, lithography, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form.

Words importing the singular number only include the plural number and *vice versa*.

Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine gender.

Words importing persons include firms, partnerships, or corporations.

Table C not to apply.	2. The regulations contained in Table C in the schedule annexed to the Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861, shall not apply to the Company which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

Commissions for placing shares.	7. The Company may at any time pay a commission to any person for subscribing or agreeing to subscribe (whether absolutely or conditionally) for any shares, debentures, or debenture stock in the Company or procuring or agreeing to procure subscriptions (whether absolute or conditional) for any shares, debentures, or debenture stock in the Company, but so that if the commission in respect of shares shall be paid or payable out of capital the statutory conditions and requirements shall be observed and complied with, and the amount or rate of commission shall not exceed 10 per cent. on the shares, debentures, or debenture stock in each case subscribed or to be subscribed. The commission may be paid or satisfied in cash or in shares, debentures, or debenture stock.

Every member shall be entitled to one certificate for all the shares registered in his name, or if the Directors so approve to several certificates each for a proportion of such shares. Every certificate of shares shall specify the number and denoting numbers of the shares in respect of which it is issued and the amount paid up thereon.
As to issue of new certificate in place of one defaced, lost, or destroyed.	16. If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Directors, they may order the same to be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof, and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then, upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be given to the registered holder of the shares to which such lost or destroyed certificate shall relate.
Fee.	17. For every certificate issued under the last preceding clause there shall be paid to the Company the sum of cents 50, or such smaller sum as the Directors may determine.
To which of joint-holders certificate to be issued.	18. The certificates of shares registered in the names of two or more persons shall be delivered to the person first named on the register.

Calls.	19. The Directors may, from time to time subject to the terms on which any share may have been issued make such calls as they think fit upon the members in respect of all moneys unpaid on the shares held by them respectively, and not by the conditions of allotment thereof made payable at fixed times, and each member shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors. A call may be made payable by instalments.
When call deemed to have been made.	20. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such call was passed.
Restriction on power to make calls.	21. No call shall exceed one-fourth of the nominal amount of a share, or be made payable within one month after the last preceding call was payable.

24. If by the terms of issue of any share or otherwise any amount is made payable at any fixed time or by instalments at fixed times whether on account of the amount of the share or by way of premium every such amount or instalment shall be payable as if it were a call duly made by the Directors and of which due notice had been given, and all the provisions herein contained in respect of calls shall relate to such amount or instalment accordingly.

Amount payable at fixed times or by instalments payable as calls.

25. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is, or was when the claim arose, on the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder, or one of the holders of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company, and it shall not be necessary to prove the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever; but the proof of the matters aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

Evidence in action by Company against Shareholders.

26. The Directors may, if they think fit, receive from any member willing to advance the same, all or any part of the money due upon the shares held by him beyond the sums actually called for, and upon the money so paid in advance, or so much thereof, as from time to time exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon the shares in respect of which such advance has been made, the Company may pay interest at such rate not exceeding 6 per cent. per annum as the member paying such sum in advance, and the Directors agree upon. Money so paid in excess of the amount of calls shall not rank for dividends. The Directors may at any time repay the amount so advanced upon giving to such members three months' notice in writing.

Payment of calls in advance.

FORFEITURE AND LIEN.

27. If any member fail to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may, at any time thereafter during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such member requiring him to pay the same, together with any interest that may have accrued and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

If call or instalment not paid notice may be given.

28. The notice shall name a day (not being less than fourteen days from the date of the notice) and a place or places on, and at which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. The notice shall also state that in the event of non-payment at, or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares in respect of which such call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

Form of Notice.

29. If the requisition of any such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, any shares, in respect of which such notice has been given, may, at any time thereafter before payment of all calls or instalments, interest, and expenses due in respect thereof, be forfeited by a resolution of the Directors to that effect. Such forfeiture shall include all dividends declared in respect of the forfeited shares and not actually paid before the forfeiture.

If notice not complied with shares may be forfeited.

30. When any share shall have been so forfeited, notice of the resolution shall be given to the member in whose name it stood immediately prior to the forfeiture, and an entry of the forfeiture, with the date thereof shall forthwith be made in the register, but no forfeiture shall be in any manner invalidated by any omission or neglect to give such notice or to make such entry as aforesaid.

Notice after forfeiture.

31. Any share so forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and the Directors may sell, re-allot, or otherwise dispose of the same in such manner as they think fit.

Forfeited share to become property of Company.

32. The Directors may at any time before any share so forfeited shall have been sold, re-allotted or otherwise disposed of, annul the forfeiture thereof upon such conditions as they think fit.

Power to annul forfeiture.

33. Any member whose shares have been forfeited shall notwithstanding be liable to pay and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, interest, and expenses, owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at twelve per cent. per annum and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof, without any deduction or allowance for the value of the shares at the time of forfeiture, but shall not be under any obligation to do so.

Arrears to be paid notwithstanding forfeiture.

34. The forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in and also of all claims and demands against the Company in respect of the share, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights as by these Articles are expressly saved.

Effect of forfeiture.

35. A duly verified declaration in writing that the declarant is a Director of the Company, and that certain shares in the Company have been duly forfeited on a date stated in the declaration shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the shares and such declaration, and the receipt of the Company for the consideration, if any, given for the shares on the sale or disposition thereof shall constitute a good title to such shares, and the person to whom the shares are sold shall be registered as the holder of such shares and shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such shares be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture, sale, or disposition.

Evidence of forfeiture.

36. The Company shall have a first and paramount lien upon all the shares registered in the name of each member (whether solely or jointly with others), and upon the proceeds of sale thereof for his debts, liabilities, and engagements, solely or jointly with any other person to, or with the Company whether the period for the payment, fulfilment, or discharge thereof shall have actually arrived or not and no equitable interest in any share shall be created except upon the footing and condition, that Article 12 hereof is to have full effect. And such lien shall extend to all dividends from time to time declared in respect of such shares. Unless otherwise agreed the registration of a transfer of shares shall operate as a waiver of the Company's lien, if any, on such shares.

Company's lien on shares.

37. For the purpose of enforcing such lien, the Directors may sell the share subject thereto in such manner as they think fit, but no sale shall be made until such period as aforesaid shall have arrived and until notice in writing of the intention to sell shall have been served on such member, his executors or administrators or his committee *curator bonis* or other legal curators and default shall have been made by him or them in the payment, fulfilment or discharge of such debts, liabilities, or engagements for seven days after such notice.

As to enforcing lien by sale.

38. The net proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of the debts, liabilities, or engagements of such member and the residue (if any) paid to such member, his executors, administrators committee *curator bonis* or other representatives.

Application of proceeds of sale.

Validity of sales under articles 31 and 37.

39. Upon any sale after forfeiture or for enforcing a lien in purported exercise of the powers hereinbefore given, the Directors may cause the purchaser's name to be entered in the register in respect of the shares sold, and the purchaser shall not be bound to see to the regularity of the proceedings nor to the application of the purchase money, and after his name has been entered in the register in respect of such shares the validity of the sale shall not be impeached by any person, and the remedy of any person aggrieved by the sale shall be in damages only and against the Company exclusively.

Directors may issue new certificates.

40. Where any shares under the powers in that behalf herein contained are sold by the Directors and the certificate thereof has not been delivered up to the Company by the former holder of the said shares, the Directors may issue a new certificate for such shares distinguishing it in such manner as they may think fit from the certificate not so delivered up.

TRANSFER AND TRANSMISSION.

Execution of transfer, &c.

41. The instrument of transfer of any share shall be signed both by the transferor and transferee, and shall contain the name and address both of the transferor and transferee and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof. Each signature to such transfer shall be duly attested by the signature of one credible witness who shall add his address and occupation.

Form of transfer.

42. The instrument of transfer of any share shall be in writing in the usual common form or in the following form, or as near thereto as circumstances will admit:—

I, A B of ——— in consideration of the sum of Rs. ——— paid to me by C D of ———, hereinafter called the said transferee, do hereby transfer to the said transferee share (or shares) numbered ——— in the undertaking called The Cottagalla Rubber Estates Company, Limited, to hold unto the said transferee, his executors, administrators, and assigns, subject to the several conditions on which I held the same immediately before the execution hereof and J, the said transferee, do hereby agree to take the said share (or shares) subject to the conditions aforesaid. Directors may decline to register transfer.

43. The Directors without assigning any reason for such refusal, may decline to register any transfer of shares upon which the Company has a lien and in the case of shares not fully paid up may refuse to register a transfer to a transferee of whom they do not approve.

Transfer to be left at office and evidence of title given.

44. Every instrument of transfer shall be left at the office for registration accompanied by the certificate of the shares to be transferred, and such other evidence as the Directors may require to prove the title of the transferor or his right to transfer the shares and upon payment of the proper fee the transferee shall (subject to the Directors' right to decline to register hereinbefore mentioned) be registered as a member in respect of such shares. The Directors may waive the production of any certificate upon evidence satisfactory to them of its loss or destruction.

When transfers to be retained.

45. All instruments of transfer which shall be registered shall be retained by the Company, but any instrument of transfer which the Directors may decline to register shall be returned to the person depositing the same.

Fee on transfer.

46. A fee not exceeding two Rupees and fifty cents may be charged for each transfer, and shall, if required by the Directors, be paid before the registration thereof.

When transfer books and register may be closed.

47. The transfer books and register of members may be closed during such time as the Directors think fit, not exceeding in the whole twenty-one days in each year.

Transmission of registered shares. As to survivorship.

48. The executors or administrators of a deceased member (not being one of several joint-holders) shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the shares registered in the name of such member, and in case of the death of any one or more of the joint holders of any registered shares, the survivors shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to or interest in such shares but nothing herein contained shall be taken to release the estate of a deceased joint-holder from any liability on shares held by him jointly with any other person. Before recognizing any executor or administrator the Directors may require him to obtain a grant of probate or letters of administration, as the case may be, from some competent court in the Island of Ceylon, having effect in Colombo.

As to transfer of shares of lunatic, infant, deceased, or bankrupt members.

49. Any committee *curator bonis* guardian or other legal curator of a lunatic or infant member or any person becoming entitled to a transfer of shares in consequence of death, bankruptcy, or insolvency of any member upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this Article, or of his title as the Directors think sufficient, may, with the consent of the Directors (which they shall not be under any obligation to give) be registered as a member in respect of such shares, or may, subject to the regulations as to transfer hereinbefore contained, transfer such shares. This Article is hereinafter referred to as "The Transmission Article."

(Transmission Article.)

SHARE WARRANTS.

The Company may issue share warrants

50. The Company may, with respect to fully paid up shares, issue warrants (hereinafter called "Share Warrants") stating that the bearer is entitled to the shares therein specified and may provide by coupons or otherwise for the payment of future dividends on the shares included in such warrants.

The Directors may determine on what conditions share warrants may be issued.

51. The Directors may determine and from time to time vary the conditions upon which share warrants shall be issued and in particular the conditions upon which a new share warrant or coupon will be issued in place of one worn out, defaced, lost or destroyed or upon which the bearer of a share warrant shall be entitled to attend and vote at General Meetings or upon which a share warrant may be surrendered and the name of the holder entered in the Register in respect of the shares therein specified. The bearer of a share warrant shall be subject to the conditions for the time being in force whether made before or after the issue of such warrant.

INCREASE AND REDUCTION OF CAPITAL.

Power to increase capital.

52. The Company in General Meeting may by Special Resolution from time to time increase the capital by the creation of new shares of such amount as may be deemed expedient.

53. The new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such rights and privileges annexed thereto as the resolution creating the same shall direct, and if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to dividends and in the distribution of assets of the Company and with a special or without any right of voting.

On what conditions new shares may be issued. As to preferences, &c.

54. The Company in General Meeting may, before the issue of any new shares, determine that the same, or any of them shall be offered in the first instance and either at par or at a premium to all the then members or any class thereof in proportion to the amount of the capital held by them, or make any other provisions as to the issue and allotment of the new shares, but in default of any such determination or so far as the same shall not extend, the new shares may be dealt with as if they formed part of the shares in the original ordinary capital.

When to be offered to existing members.

55. Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the Original Ordinary Capital and shall be subject to the provisions herein contained with reference to the payment of calls and instalments, transfer and transmission, forfeiture, lien, and otherwise.

How far new shares to rank with shares in Original Capital.

56. If owing to any inequality in the number of new shares to be issued, and the number of shares held by members entitled to have the offer of such new shares, any difficulty shall arise in the apportionment of such new shares or any of them amongst the members, such difficulty shall, in the absence of any direction in the resolution creating the shares or by the Company in General Meeting, be determined by the Directors.

Inequality in number of new shares.

57. The Company may (subject to the provisions of the Ordinance) from time to time by Special Resolution cancel shares which at the date of the resolution in that behalf have not been taken or agreed to be taken by any person, reduce its capital by paying off capital or cancelling capital which has been lost or is unrepresented by available assets or reducing the liability on the shares or otherwise as may seem expedient and capital may be paid off upon the footing that it may be called up again or otherwise; and paid-up capital may be cancelled as aforesaid without reducing the nominal amount of the shares by the like amount to the intent that the unpaid and callable capital shall be increased by the like amount.

Reduction of capital, &c.

SUBDIVISION AND CONSOLIDATION OF SHARES.

58. The Company may, by Special Resolution, subdivide or consolidate its shares or any of them.

Power to subdivide and consolidate shares.

59. The Special Resolution whereby any share is subdivided may determine that, as between the holders of the shares resulting from such subdivision, one or more of such shares shall have some preference or special advantage as regards dividend, capital, voting, or otherwise over or as compared with the others or other (subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the Ordinance).

Subdivision into preferred and ordinary.

SURRENDER OF SHARES.

60. The Directors may accept from any member the surrender on such terms and conditions as shall be agreed of all or any of his shares.

Surrender of shares.

MODIFICATION OF RIGHTS.

61. Whenever the capital by reason of the issue of preference shares or otherwise is divided into different classes of shares, all or any of the rights and privileges attached to each class may be modified, commuted, affected, abrogated or dealt with by agreement between the Company and any person purporting to contract on behalf of that class provided such agreement is ratified in writing by the holders of at least three-fourths in nominal value of the issued shares of the class or is confirmed by an extraordinary resolution passed at a separate General Meeting of the holders of shares of that class and all the provisions hereinafter contained as to General Meetings, shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to every such Meeting, but so that the quorum thereof shall be members holding or representing by proxy one-fifth of the nominal amount of the issued shares of the class. This Article is not to derogate from any power the Company would have had if this article were omitted.

Power to modify rights.

BORROWING POWERS.

62. The Directors may from time to time at their discretion raise or borrow and may themselves lend and secure the payment of any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company. Provided that the Directors shall not without the sanction of a General Meeting of the Company so borrow any sum of money which will make the amount borrowed for the Company and then outstanding exceed the sum of Rupees one hundred thousand. Nevertheless no lender or other person dealing with the Company shall be concerned to see or inquire whether this limit is observed.

Power to borrow.

63. The Directors may raise or secure the repayment of such sum or sums in such manner and upon such terms and conditions in all respects as they think fit and in particular by the creation of any mortgage or charge on the undertaking or the whole or any part of the property present or future or uncalled capital of the company or by the issue of bonds perpetual or redeemable debentures or debenture stock of the Company charged upon all or any part of the property of the Company both present and future including its uncalled capital for the time being.

Conditions on which money may be borrowed.

64. Debentures, debenture-stock bonds, and other securities may be made assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

Securities may be assignable free from equities.

65. Any debentures, debenture-stock, bonds, or other securities may be issued at a discount premium, or otherwise, and with any special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, attending and voting at General Meetings of the Company, appointment of Directors, and otherwise.

Issue at discount, &c., or with special privileges.

66. The Directors shall cause a proper register to be kept in accordance with the Ordinance of all mortgages and charges specifically affecting the property of the Company, and shall duly comply with the requirements of the Ordinance in regard to the registration of mortgages and charges therein specified and shall otherwise also duly comply with the requirements of the Ordinance as to the inspection of the said register as therein specified.

Register of Mortgages to be kept.

67. Every register of holders of debentures of the Company may be closed for any periods not exceeding in the whole twenty-one days in any year. Subject as aforesaid every such register shall be open to the inspection of the registered holder of any such debentures and of any member; but the Company may in General Meeting impose any reasonable restrictions so that at least two hours in each day, when such register is open, are appointed for inspection.

Register of holders of Debentures.

Right of holders of preference shares and debentures to Balance Sheet.

Mortgage of uncalled capital.

68. Holders of preference shares and debentures shall have the same right to receive and inspect the Balance Sheets of the Company and the Reports of the Auditors and other reports as is possessed by the holders of ordinary shares in the Company.

69. If any uncalled capital of the Company is included in or charged by any mortgage or other security, the Directors may, by instrument under the Company's seal, authorize the person in whose favour such mortgage or security is executed, or any other person in trust for him to make calls on the members in respect of such uncalled capital, and the provisions hereinbefore contained in regard to calls shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to calls made under such authority, and such authority may be made exercisable either conditionally or unconditionally, and either presently or contingently and either to the exclusion of the Directors' power or otherwise and shall be assignable if expressed so to be.

RESERVE AND DEPRECIATION FUNDS.

Reserve Fund.

70. The Directors may from time to time before recommending any dividend set a part any and such portion of the profits of the Company as they think fit, as a Reserve Fund to meet contingencies and for the liquidation of any debentures, debts, and other liabilities of the Company, for equalization of dividends or for repairing, improving, and maintaining any of the property of the Company and for such other purposes of the Company as the Directors in their absolute discretion think fit conducive to the interests of the Company; and may divide the Reserve Fund into such special funds as they think fit with full power to employ the Reserve Fund or any parts thereof in the business of the Company and that without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets of the Company.

Depreciation Fund.

71. The Directors may, from time to time, before recommending any dividend, set apart any portion of the profits of the Company, as they shall think fit, as a depreciation fund applicable at the discretion of the Directors for providing against any depreciation in the investments of the Company or for re-building, restoring, replacing, or for altering any part of the buildings, works, plant, machinery, or other property of the Company destroyed or damaged by fire, floods, storm, tempest, accident, riot, wear and tear, or other means, and for repairing, altering, and keeping in good condition the property of the Company or for extending and enlarging the buildings, machinery, and property of the Company with full power to employ the assets constituting such depreciation fund in the business of the Company and that without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets of the Company.

Disposal of Reserve and Depreciation Funds.

72. All moneys carried to the Reserve Fund and Depreciation Fund respectively shall nevertheless remain and be profits of the Company applicable subject to due provision being made for actual loss or depreciation for the payment of dividends and such moneys and all other moneys of the Company not immediately required for the purposes of the Company may be invested by the Directors, in or upon such investments or securities as they may select or may be used as working capital or may be kept at any Bank on deposit or otherwise as the Directors may from time to time think proper.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

When General Meetings to be held.

73. The First General Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time (subject to the provisions of the Ordinance) and at such place as the Directors may determine. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as the Directors may determine. The aforementioned General Meetings shall be called "Ordinary Meetings," all other meetings of the Company shall be called "Extraordinary Meetings."

When extraordinary meeting to be called.

74. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, and they shall, on the requisition of the holders of not less than one-tenth of the issued capital of the Company upon which all calls or other sums then due have been paid, forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and in the case of such requisition the following provisions shall have effect—

Requisition.

- (1) The requisition must state the objects of the meeting and must be signed by the requisitionists and deposited at the office and may consist of several documents in like form each signed by one or more requisitionists.
- (2) If the Directors of the Company do not proceed to convene a meeting within twenty-one days from the date of the requisition being so deposited, the requisitionists or a majority of them in value may themselves convene the meeting, but any meeting so convened shall not be held after three months from the date of the deposit.
- (3) If at any such meeting a resolution requiring confirmation at another meeting is passed the Directors shall forthwith convene a further Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of considering the resolution, and if thought fit, of confirming it as a special resolution, and if the Directors do not convene the meeting within seven days from the date of the passing of the first resolution, the requisitionists or a majority of them in value may themselves convene the meeting.
- (4) Any meeting convened under this clause by the requisitionists shall be convened in the same manner as nearly as possible as that in which meetings are to be convened by Directors but shall be held at the office.
- (5) Requisitions by joint holders of shares must be signed by all such holders.

Notice of Meeting.

75. Seven clear days' notice to the members specifying the place, day, and hour of meeting and in case of special business the general nature of such business shall be given either by advertisement or by notice sent by post or otherwise served as hereinafter provided and with the consent in writing of all the members a meeting may be convened by a shorter notice and in any manner they think fit.

Two meetings convened by one notice.

76. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution, the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently on the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

As to omission to give notice.

77. The accidental omission to give any such notice to any of the members shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS.

Business of Ordinary Meeting.

78. The business of an Ordinary Meeting shall be to receive and consider the Profit and Loss Account, the Balance Sheet, and the Reports of the Directors and of the Auditors, to elect Directors, Auditors, and other officers in the place of those retiring by rotation, or otherwise, to declare dividends and to transact any other business which under these presents ought to be transacted at an Ordinary Meeting. All other business transacted at an Ordinary Meeting and all business transacted at an Extraordinary Meeting shall be deemed special.

79. Two members holding ordinary shares present in person or by proxy shall be a quorum for a General Meeting for the choice of a chairman, the declaration of a dividend and the adjournment of the meeting. For all other purposes the quorum for a General Meeting shall be members holding ordinary shares present in person or by proxy not being less than three in number. Quorum.
80. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless the quorum requisite shall be present at the commencement of the business. Quorum to be present when business commenced.
Chairman of General Meeting.
81. The Chairman of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, or if there be no such Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting or is unwilling to act the members present shall choose another Director as Chairman, and if no Director be present or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the members present shall choose one of their number being a member entitled to vote to be Chairman.
82. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting if convened upon such requisition as aforesaid shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place, and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present those members who are present not being less than two shall be a quorum and may transact the business for which the meeting was called. When if quorum not present meeting to be dissolved and when to be adjourned.
83. Every question submitted to a meeting shall be decided in the first instance by a show of hands and in the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall, both on a show of hands and at the poll, have a casting vote in addition to the vote or votes to which he may be entitled as a member. How questions to be decided at meetings.
Casting vote.
84. At any General Meeting unless a poll is demanded by the Chairman or by at least five members or by a member or members holding or representing by proxy or entitled to vote in respect of at least one-tenth part of the issued capital represented at the meeting, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried by a particular majority or carried or lost or not carried by a particular majority and an entry to that effect in the book of proceedings of the Company shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. What is to be evidence of the passing of a resolution where poll not demanded.
85. If a poll is demanded as aforesaid it shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman of the meeting directs and either at once or after an interval or adjournment or otherwise, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. The demand of a poll may be withdrawn. In case of any dispute as to the admission or rejection of a vote the Chairman shall determine the same and such determination made in good faith shall be final and conclusive. Poll.
86. The Chairman of a General Meeting may with the consent of the meeting adjourn the same from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. Power to adjourn General Meeting.
87. Any poll duly demanded on the election of a Chairman of a meeting or on any question of adjournment shall be taken at the meeting and without adjournment. In what cases poll taken without adjournment.
88. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded. Business may proceed notwithstanding demand of poll.
- VOTES OF MEMBERS.
89. On a show of hands every member holding ordinary shares present in person or by an attorney who is not a shareholder shall have one vote and upon a poll every member present in person or by proxy shall have one vote for every ordinary share held by him. Votes of members.
90. Where a corporation is the registered holder of shares in the Company it may, by resolution of its Directors, appoint any of its officials or any person to act as its representative at any meeting of this Company and a copy of such resolution duly signed by one Director and the Managing Agents (if any) and certified as being a true copy shall on production at the meeting be accepted as sufficient evidence and the person so authorized shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of the Company which he represents as if he were an individual shareholder of this Company and he shall not be deemed to be a proxy. Corporations.
91. Any person entitled under the Transmission Article to transfer any shares may vote at any General Meeting in respect thereof in the same manner as if he were the registered holder of such shares, provided that forty-eight hours at least before the time of holding the meeting or adjourned meeting, as the case may be, at which he proposes to vote he shall satisfy the Directors of his right to transfer such shares, or the Directors shall have previously admitted his right to vote at such meeting in respect thereof. If any member be a lunatic, idiot *non compos mentis* or insolvent he may vote whether by show of hands or at a poll by his committee *curator bonis* assignee or other legal curator and such last mentioned persons may give their votes by proxy. Votes in respect of insane deceased and insolvent members.
92. Where there are joint registered holders of any share, anyone of such persons may vote at any meeting either personally or by proxy in respect of such share as if he were solely entitled thereto and if more than one of such joint-holders be present at any meeting, personally or by proxy, that one of the said persons so present whose name stands first on the register in respect of such share shall alone be entitled to vote in respect thereof. Several executors or administrators of a deceased member in whose name any share stands shall for the purposes of this clause be deemed joint-holders thereof. Joint-holders.
93. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or in the case of a company by a representative duly authorized as aforesaid. Proxies permitted.
94. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney, or if such appointor is a Corporation under its common seal or the hand of its attorney. A proxy who is appointed for a specified meeting only shall be called a special proxy. Any other proxy shall be called a general proxy. No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a member of the Company and qualified to vote, but an attorney under a power may attend and vote at meetings without being a shareholder. Holders of share warrants shall not be entitled to vote by proxy in respect of the shares included in such warrant unless otherwise expressed in such warrants. Instrument appointing proxy to be in writing.
Proxies may be general or special.

Instrument appointing a proxy to be deposited at the office.

95. The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney (if any) under which it is signed shall be deposited at the office not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting, as the case may be, at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote, but no instrument appointing a special proxy shall be valid after the expiration of twelve months from the date of its execution. Should the power of attorney above referred to have been registered in the Company's books it need not be again deposited.

When vote by proxy valid though authority revoked.

96. A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument appointing a proxy shall be valid notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal, or revocation of the instrument or transfer of the share in respect of which the vote is given, provided no intimation in writing of the death, insanity, revocation, or transfer shall have been received at the office before the meeting: Provided nevertheless that the Chairman of any meeting shall be entitled to require such evidence as he may in his discretion think fit of the due execution of an instrument of proxy and that the same has not been revoked.

Form of instrument appointing a special proxy.

97. Every instrument appointing a special proxy shall, as nearly as circumstances will admit, be in the form or to the effect following, and shall be retained by the Company.

Restrictions on voting.

98. No member shall be entitled to be present or to vote on any question either personally or by proxy or as proxy for another member at any General Meeting or upon a poll or be reckoned in a quorum whilst any call or other sum shall be due and payable to the Company in respect of any of the shares of such member; and no member shall be entitled to be present or to vote in respect of any share that he has acquired by transfer at any meeting unless he has been the registered holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote for at least three months previously to the time fixed for holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote or if such meeting be an adjourned meeting to the time originally fixed for holding the same, but this regulation shall not affect shares acquired under a testamentary disposition or by succession to an intestate estate or under a bankruptcy, or insolvency, or liquidation.

Resolution in writing of Directors in certain cases to be equivalent to resolution of general meeting.

99. Any resolution passed by the Directors, notice whereof shall be given to the members in the manner in which notices are hereinafter directed to be given and which shall within one month after it shall have been so passed be ratified and confirmed in writing by members entitled at a poll to three-fifths of the votes shall be as valid and effectual as a resolution of a General Meeting but this Article shall not apply to a resolution for winding up the Company or to a resolution passed in respect of any matter which by the Ordinance or these presents ought to be dealt with by special or extraordinary resolution.

DIRECTORS.

Number of Directors.

100. Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting the number of the Directors shall not be less than two nor more than seven but this Article shall be construed as being directory only and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

Director's qualification.

101. The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least ten shares in the Company upon which all calls for the time being have been paid and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors.

First Directors.

102. The first Directors of the Company shall be Frank Edward Mackwood, Francis Oswald Mackwood, and John Corlett Kelly, all of Colombo. The first Directors shall hold office till the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when one of their number to be determined in accordance with the provisions of Article 114 shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.

Power of Directors to add to their number.

103. The Directors shall have power at any time and from time to time to appoint any qualified person as a Director as an addition to the Board but so that the total number of Directors shall not at any time exceed the maximum number fixed as above. But any Directors so appointed shall hold office only until the next following Ordinary General Meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Directors may be appointed Managing Director, &c.

104. One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director, or Managing Directors and/or Visiting Agent or Agents of the Company, for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director, or Managing Directors and/or Visiting Agent or Agents. The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be conferred on any Manager of the Company.

Directors may be remunerated for extra services.

105. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services either by way of salary, commission or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

Remuneration of Directors.

106. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding Rupees Three Thousand (Rs. 3,000) annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration granted for special or extra services hereinbefore referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company. The Directors shall also be entitled to be paid their reasonable travelling and hotel and other expenses incurred in consequence of the attendance at Board Meetings and otherwise in execution of their duties as Directors.

Remuneration for extra service.

107. If any Director being willing shall be called upon to perform extra services or to make any special exertions for any of the purposes of the Company or in giving special attention to the business of the Company as a member of a Committee of Directors the Company may remunerate the Director so doing either by a fixed sum or by a percentage of profits or otherwise as may be determined by the Directors and such remuneration may be either in addition to or in substitution for his or their share in the remuneration above provided for the Directors.

108. The continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their body; but so that if the number falls below the minimum above fixed the Directors shall not, except for the purpose of filling vacancies, act so long as the number is below the minimum.

Directors may act notwithstanding vacancy.

109. The office of a Director shall *ipso facto* be vacated—

When office of Directors is vacated.

- (a) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs or compounds with his creditors.
- (b) If he is found lunatic or becomes of unsound mind.
- (c) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit under the Company other than Managing Director, Visiting Agent, or Secretary of the Company.
- (d) If he ceases to have his ordinary place of residence in Ceylon or is absent from the meetings of the Directors during a period of six calendar months without special leave of absence from the Directors and he is removed from office by a resolution of the Board.
- (e) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.
- (f) If he commits any offence punishable under the Ceylon Penal Code and being under the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code of Ceylon non-bailable.
- (g) If by notice in writing to the Company he resigns his office.
- (h) If (not being the *ex-officio* Director) he is requested in writing by all his co-Directors to resign or is removed from office by an extraordinary resolution of the Company.

110. Every Director or officer of the Company and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer shall nor shall the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortuous act of any person with whom any moneys, securities or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

Indemnity of Directors.

111. The Directors shall not be disqualified from contracting with the Company either as vendor, purchaser or otherwise, nor shall any such contract or arrangement entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any company or partnership of or in which any Director shall be a member or otherwise interested be avoided nor shall any Director so contracting or being such member or so interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by any such contract or arrangement by reason of such Director holding that office or of the fiduciary relation thereby established, but the nature of their or his interest must be disclosed by them or him at the meeting of the Directors, at which the contract or arrangement is determined on, if the interest then exists, or in any other case at the first meeting of Directors after the acquisition of the interest: Provided nevertheless that no Directors shall vote as a Director in respect of any contract or arrangement in which he is so interested as aforesaid and if he does so vote his vote shall not be counted, but he shall be entitled to be present at the meeting during the transaction of the business in relation to which he is precluded from voting and shall be reckoned for the purpose of ascertaining whether there be a quorum of Directors present. This provision shall not apply to any contract by or on behalf of the Company to give to the Directors or any of them any security for advances or by way of indemnity against any loss which they or any of them may suffer by reason of becoming or being sureties of the Company. A general notice that any Director is a member of any specified firm or company and is to be regarded as interested in any subsequent transaction with such firm or company shall as regards any such transaction be sufficient disclosure under this Article and after such general notice it shall not be necessary to give any special notice relating to any particular transaction with such firm or company.

Directors may contract with the Company.

112. A Director of this Company may be, or become a Director of any company promoted by this Company or in which it may be interested as a vendor, shareholder, or otherwise, and no such Director shall be accountable for any benefits received as Director or member of such company.

When Director of this Company appointed Director of a subsidiary company.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

113. At the first Ordinary Meeting to be held in each year one of the Directors shall retire from office.

Rotation and retirement of Directors.

114. At every ordinary meeting at which a Director retires by rotation the Director who has been longest in office shall retire. As between two or more who have been in office an equal length of time the Director to retire shall in default of agreement between them be determined by lot. The length of time a Director has been in office shall be computed from his last election or appointment when he has previously vacated office. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election and shall act as Director throughout the meeting at which he retires.

Which Directors to retire. Retiring Directors eligible for re-election.

115. The Company at any ordinary meeting at which any Director retires in manner aforesaid shall fill up the vacated office by electing the retiring Director or any other person to be a Director and without notice in that behalf may fill up any other vacancies.

Meeting to fill up vacancies.

116. If at any ordinary meeting at which an election of Directors ought to take place the places of the retiring Directors are not filled up, the retiring Directors or such of them as have not had their places filled up, shall if willing continue in office until the first Ordinary Meeting in the next year and so on from year to year until their places are filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting on due notice to reduce the number of Directors.

Retiring Directors to remain in office till successors appointed.

117. The Company in General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may alter their qualifications and may also determine in what rotation such increased or reduced number is to go out of office.

Power for general meeting to increase or reduce number of Directors.

118. The Company may by extraordinary resolution remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and appoint another qualified person in his stead, but the person so appointed shall hold office during such time only as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

Power to remove Director by extraordinary resolution.

119. Any casual vacancy occurring among the Directors may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

Directors may fill up casual vacancies.

When candidate for office of Director must give notice.	120. No person not being a retiring Director shall, unless recommended by the Directors for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any General Meeting, unless he or some other member intending to propose him, has not less than fourteen days or more than two months before the meeting left at the office a notice in writing duly signed signifying his candidature for the office or the intention of such member to propose him.
PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.	
Meetings of Directors and quorum.	121. The Directors shall (as far as practicable) meet together for the despatch of business once a month, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings and proceedings, as they think fit, and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum, provided nevertheless that when all the Directors present at any meeting except one, are disqualified from voting on any resolution by reason of the provisions of Article 111 hereof such one Director shall be a quorum for the purposes of considering and, if thought fit, of passing such resolution. Unless otherwise agreed by all the Directors, all meetings of Directors shall be held at the office.
Directors may summon meeting. How questions to be decided.	122. A Director may at any time convene a meeting of the Directors. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting of Directors to any Director who is not for the time being resident in Ceylon. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
Chairman.	123. The Directors may elect a Chairman of their meeting and determine for what period he shall hold office, and all meetings of Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman if one has been elected and is present; but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.
Powers of quorum.	124. A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers, and discretions by or under the Articles of the Company for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally.
Power to appoint committees and to delegate.	125. The Directors may from time to time delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as they think fit and may from time to time revoke such delegation. Any committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegated, conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed upon it by the Directors.
Proceedings of Committee.	126. The meetings and proceedings of any such committee consisting of two or more members, shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of the Directors so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by any regulations made by the Directors under the last preceding Article.
When acts of Directors or Committee valid notwithstanding defective appointment, &c. Resolution without Board Meeting valid.	127. All acts done by any meeting of the Directors or by a committee of Directors or by any person acting as a Director shall notwithstanding that it shall afterwards be discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of such Directors or persons acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be a Director. 128. A resolution in writing signed or initialled by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon (not being less than two Directors) shall be as valid and as effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of Directors duly called and constituted.
MINUTES.	
Minutes to be made.	129. The Directors shall cause minutes to be duly entered in books provided for the purpose— (a) Of all appointments of officers. (b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors and of any committee of Directors. (c) Of all orders made by the Directors and committees of Directors. (d) Of all resolutions and proceedings of General Meetings and of meetings of the Directors and Committees.
And any such minutes of any meeting of the Directors or of any Committee or of the Company if purporting to be signed by the Chairman of such meeting or by the Chairman of the next succeeding meeting, shall be receivable as <i>prima facie</i> evidence of the matters stated in such minutes.	
POWERS OF DIRECTORS.	
General power of Company vested in Directors.	130. The control of the Company and of the business of the Company shall be vested in the Directors who in addition to the powers and authorities by these Articles or otherwise expressly conferred upon them may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Company and are not hereby or by statute law expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting but subject nevertheless to the provisions of any statute law and of these Articles and to any regulations not being inconsistent with those presents from time to time made by the Company in General Meeting provided that no regulation so made shall invalidate any prior act of the Directors which would have been valid if such regulations had not been made. Provided always however that notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Articles contained no Director for the time being shall whilst resident out of Ceylon have any control over or be concerned with the business of the Company or be entitled to exercise any of the powers and duties by these Articles conferred upon or vested in him other than any powers and duties if any which may be required by Ordinance to be exercised or done by him while a Director and all such powers and duties (save as aforesaid) shall be exercisable only by such of the Directors as may for the time being be resident in Ceylon.
Specific powers given to Directors.	131. Without prejudice to the general powers conferred by the last preceding Article and other powers conferred by these Articles it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have power— (1) To pay the costs, charges, and expenses preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment, and registration of the Company. (2) To purchase or otherwise acquire on behalf of the Company any property, rights or privileges which the Company is authorized to acquire on such terms and conditions as they think fit and at their discretion to pay for any property, rights and privileges acquired by or services rendered to the Company either wholly or partially in cash or in shares, bonds, debentures, or other securities of the Company and any such shares may be issued either as fully paid up or with such amount credited as paid up thereon as may be agreed upon and any such debentures, bonds, or other securities may be either specifically charged upon all or any part of the property of the Company and its uncalled capital or not so charged.

- (3) To sell or otherwise dispose of, deal with, or abandon the whole or any part or parts of the Company's present or future property or rights upon such terms and conditions as may be thought fit.
- (4) To enter into any arrangement with any company, firm, or person carrying on business similar to that of this Company for mutual concessions or for any joint working or combination or for any restriction upon competition or for any pooling of business or profits that may seem desirable and to carry the same into effect.
- (5) To appoint any person or persons (whether incorporated or not) to accept and hold in trust for the Company any property belonging to the Company or in which it is interested or for any other purposes and to execute and do all such deeds, documents, and things as may be requisite in relation to any such trust and to provide for the remuneration of such trustee or trustees.
- (6) To execute in the name and on behalf of the Company in favour of any Director or other person who may incur or be about to incur any personal liability for the benefit of the Company such mortgages of the Company's property (present and future) as they think fit and any such mortgage may contain a power of sale and such other powers, covenants, and provisions as may be agreed.
- (7) To give any person employed by the Company a commission on the profits of any particular business or transaction or a share in the general profits of the Company and such commission or share of profits shall be treated as part of the working expenses of the Company.
- (8) To make, vary, and repeal from time to time by-laws for the regulation of the business of the Company, its officers, and servants.
- (9) To establish, maintain, support, and subscribe to any charitable or public object and any institution, society, and club which may be for the benefit of the Company or its employes or may be connected with any town or place where the Company carries on business.
- (10) To give pensions, gratuities, and charitable aid to any person or persons who have served the Company or to the wives, children, or dependents of such person or persons that may appear to them just and proper whether such person, his widow, children, or dependents have or have not a legal claim upon the Company.
- (11) Before recommending any dividend to set aside portions of the profits of the Company to form a fund to provide for such pensions, gratuities, or compensation, or to create any Provident or Benefit Fund in such or any other manner they may see fit.
- (12) To make and alter rules and regulations concerning the time and manner of payment of the contributions of the employees and the Company respectively to any such fund and the accrual, employment, suspension, and forfeiture of the benefits of the said fund and the application and disposal thereof or otherwise in relation to the working and management of the said fund as they from time to time think fit.
- (13) To delegate all or any of the powers hereby conferred upon them to Agents as they may from time to time think fit.
- (14) To appoint and in their discretion to remove or suspend such managers, agents, secretaries, officers, clerks, and servants for permanent, temporary, or special service as they may from time to time think fit and to determine their powers and duties and fix their salaries or emoluments and to require security in such instances and to such amount as they think fit.
- (15) To institute, conduct, defend, compound, or abandon any legal proceedings by or against the Company or its officers or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Company and also to compound, allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due and of any claims or demands by or against the Company.
- (16) To act on behalf of the Company in any matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents.
- (17) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration and observe and perform the awards.

ALTERNATE DIRECTORS.

132. A Director may at any time appoint any other Director or any other person approved by a majority of the Board to act as alternate for him and may at any time cancel such appointment. A Director or such other person appointed alternate for a Director shall be entitled to perform all the functions of his appointor (including the functions of the Chairman of the Board). A Director appointed as alternate Director shall have an extra vote at all meetings for each Director whom he represents in addition to his own vote as a Director and in the event of his appointor being Chairman of the Board shall be entitled to a casting vote.

Alternate Director.

Any alternate Director shall *ipso facto* cease to be an alternate Director if his appointor ceases for any reason to be a Director.

All appointments and removals of alternate Directors shall be effected by writing under the hand of the Director making or revoking such appointment left at the office.

THE SEAL.

133. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries in the event of a firm or registered Company being the Secretaries being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or company as such Secretaries.

Seal.

AGENTS AND SECRETARIES.

134. Messrs. Mackwoods, Ltd. shall be the first Agents and Secretaries of the Company.

Agents and Secretaries.

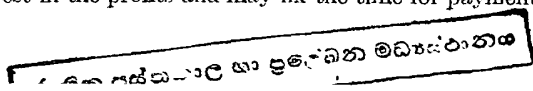
DIVIDENDS, BONUS AND RESERVE FUND.

135. Subject to the right of members entitled to shares (if any) with preferential or special rights attached thereto the profits of the Company which it shall from time to time be determined to divide in respect of any year or other period shall be applied in payment of a dividend on the ordinary shares of the Company but so that a partly paid up share shall only entitle the holder with respect thereto to such a proportion of the distribution upon a fully paid up share as the amount paid thereon bears to the nominal amount of such share and so that where capital is paid up in advance of calls upon the footing that the same shall carry interest, such capital shall not while carrying interest, confer a right to participate in profits.

How profits shall be divisible.

136. The Company in General Meeting may declare a dividend to be paid to the members according to their rights and interest in the profits and may fix the time for payment.

Declaration of dividends..



Restriction on amount of dividend.	137. No larger dividend shall be declared than is recommended by the Directors, but the Company in General Meeting may declare a smaller dividend.
Dividend out of profits only and not to carry interest.	138. No dividend shall be payable except out of the profits of the Company, and no dividend shall carry interest as against the Company.
What to be deemed net profits.	139. The declaration of the Directors as to the amount of the net profits of the Company shall be conclusive.
Interim dividends.	140. The Directors may from time to time pay to the members such interim dividends as in their judgment the position of the Company justifies.
Debts may be deducted.	141. The Directors may retain any dividends on which the Company has a lien and may apply the same in or towards satisfaction of the debts, liabilities, or engagements in respect of which the lien exists.
Dividend and call together.	142. Any General Meeting declaring a dividend may make a call on the members for such amount as the meeting fixes but so that the call on each member shall not exceed the dividend payable to him and so that the call be made payable at the same time as the dividend and the dividend may if so arranged between the Company and the member be set off against the call. The making of a call under this article shall be deemed ordinary business of an Ordinary Meeting which declares a dividend.
Dividend in specie.	143. Any General Meeting declaring a dividend may resolve that such dividend be paid wholly or in part by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company, or paid up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of any other Company, or in any one or more of such ways.
Capitalization of Reserves.	144. Any General Meeting may resolve that any moneys, investments, or other assets forming part of the undivided profits of the Company standing to the credit of the Reserve Fund or in the hands of the Company and available for dividend (or representing premiums received on the issue of shares and standing to the credit of the share premium account) be capitalized and distributed amongst such of the shareholders as would be entitled to receive the same if distributed by way of dividend and in the same proportions on the footing that they become entitled thereto as capital and that all or any part of such capitalized fund be applied on behalf of such shareholders in paying up in full any unissued shares of the Company which shall be distributed accordingly in or towards payment of the uncalled liability on any issued shares, and that such distribution or payment shall be accepted by such shareholders in full satisfaction of their interest in the said capitalized sum.
Fractional Certificates.	145. For the purpose of giving effect to any resolution under the two last preceding articles the Directors may settle any difficulty which may arise in regard to the distribution as they think expedient and in particular may issue fractional certificates and may fix the value for distribution of any specific assets and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any members upon the footing of the value so fixed in order to adjust the rights of all parties and may vest any such cash or specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or capitalized fund as may seem expedient to the Directors. Where requisite a proper contract shall be entered into and the Directors may appoint any person to sign such contract on behalf of the persons entitled to the dividend or capitalized fund, and such appointment shall be effective.
Effect of transfer.	146. A transfer of shares shall not pass the right to any dividend declared thereon before the registration of the transfer.
Retention in certain cases.	147. The Directors may retain the dividends payable upon shares in respect of which any person is under the transmission article entitled to become a member or which any person under that article is entitled to transfer until such person shall become a member in respect thereof or shall duly transfer the same.
Dividend to Joint-holders.	148. Any one of several persons who are registered as the joint-holders of any share may give effectual receipts for all dividends and payments on account of dividends in respect of such share.
Payment by post.	149. Unless otherwise directed any dividend may be paid by cheque or warrant sent through the post to the registered address of the member entitled, or in the case of joint-holders to the registered address of that one whose name stands first on the register in respect of the joint holding and every cheque or warrant so sent shall be made payable to the order of the person to whom it is sent.
Unclaimed dividends.	150. All dividends unclaimed for one year after having been declared may be invested or otherwise made use of by the Directors for the benefit of the Company until claimed and all dividends unclaimed for three years after having been declared may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company, but the Directors may annul the forfeiture whenever they think proper.

BOOKS AND DOCUMENTS.

Books of accounts to be kept.	151. The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Company and the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure takes place and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company.
Where to be kept.	152. The books of account shall be kept at the office or at such other place or places as the Directors think fit.
Inspection by members.	153. The Directors shall from time to time determine whether and to what extent and at what times and places and under what conditions or regulations the account books and documents of the Company or any of them shall be open to the inspection of the members and no member shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by statute or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

ACCOUNTS AND BALANCE SHEETS.

Annual account and balance sheet.	154. (1) At each Ordinary Meeting the Directors shall lay before the Company a Profit and Loss Account and a Balance Sheet containing a summary of the property and assets and capital and liabilities of the Company made up to a date not more than ten months before the meeting from the time when the last preceding account and balance sheet were made up or in the case of the first account and balance sheet from the incorporation of the Company. Every Balance Sheet shall be certified and signed by the Directors or any two of them in accordance with the terms of the Ordinance in that behalf. (2) The Auditor's report (to be prepared in accordance with the provisions of article 160(2) of the Articles) shall be attached to the balance sheet or there shall be inserted at the foot thereof a reference to the report, and the report shall be read before the Company in General Meeting and shall be open to inspection by any Shareholder.
Copies to be sent to members and deposited at the Registered office.	155. A printed copy of such account and balance sheet together with the report of the Auditors shall, at least seven days previously to the meeting, be sent to the registered address of every member of the Company and a copy shall also be deposited at the registered office of the Company for the inspection of members of the Company during a period of at least seven days before the meeting.

156. After the balance sheet has been laid before the Company at the General Meeting a copy thereof signed and certified by the Directors or any three or more of them and by the Managing Agents of the Company shall be filed with the Registrar at the same time as the copy of the Annual List of Members and Summary prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Ordinance in this behalf.

Copies of Balance Sheets to be filed.

AUDIT.

157. Once in every year the accounts of the Company shall be examined and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

Accounts to be audited annually.

158. The Company at the first Ordinary Meeting shall appoint an Auditor or Auditors to hold office until the Ordinary Meeting in the following year. The Company at each Ordinary Meeting shall appoint the subsequent Auditor or Auditors to hold office till the next Ordinary Meeting and the following provisions shall have effect, that is to say:—

Audit provisions.

- (1) A Director or officer of the Company or a partner of such Director or officer or any person in the employ of such Director or officer shall not be capable of being appointed an Auditor of the Company.
- (2) The first Auditors of the Company may be appointed by the Directors before the first Ordinary Meeting and if so appointed shall hold office until such meeting unless previously removed by a resolution of the Shareholders in General Meeting in which case the Shareholders at that meeting may appoint Auditors.
- (3) A person other than a retiring Auditor shall not be capable of being appointed Auditor at an Ordinary Meeting unless notice of an intention to nominate that person to the office of Auditor has been given by a shareholder to the Company not less than fourteen days before the meeting and the Company shall send a copy of any such notice to the retiring Auditor and shall give notice thereof to the shareholders either by advertisement or in any other mode allowed by the Articles not less than seven days before the meeting.

Provided that if after notice of the intention to nominate an Auditor has been so given an Ordinary Meeting is called for a date fourteen days or less after the notice has been given the notice though not given within the time required by this provision shall be deemed to have been properly given for the purposes thereof and the notice to be sent or given by the Company may instead of being sent or given within the time required by this provision, be sent or given at the same time as the notice of the Ordinary Meeting.

- (4) The Directors may fill any casual vacancy in the office of Auditor, but while any such vacancy continues the surviving or continuing Auditor or Auditors (if any) may act

159. The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting except that the remuneration of any Auditors appointed before the first Ordinary Meeting or to fill any casual vacancy may be fixed by the Directors.

Remuneration of Auditors.

160. (1) Every Auditor of the Company shall have a right of access at all times to the books and accounts and vouchers of the Company and shall be entitled to require from the Directors and officers of the Company such information and explanations as may be necessary for the performance of the duties of the Auditors.

Rights and duties of Auditors.

(2) The Auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders on every balance sheet laid before the Company in General Meeting during their tenure of office and the report shall state:—

- (a) Whether or not they have obtained all the information and explanations they have required; and
- (b) Whether in their opinion the balance sheet referred to in the report is properly drawn up so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs according to the best of their information and the explanations given to them and as shown by the books of the Company.

161. Every account of the Directors when audited and approved by a General Meeting shall be conclusive except as regards any error discovered therein within three months next after the approval thereof. Whenever any such error is discovered within that period the account shall forthwith be corrected and thenceforth shall be conclusive.

When accounts to be deemed finally settled.

NOTICES.

162. A notice may be served by the Company upon any member either personally or by sending it through the post in a prepaid envelope or wrapper addressed to such member at his registered place of address.

How notice to be served on members.

163. Each holder of registered shares shall from time to time notify in writing to the Company some place in the Island of Ceylon to be registered as his address and such registered place of address shall for all purposes be deemed his place of residence.

Members resident abroad.

164. As regards any member who has not notified in writing to the Company some place in the Island of Ceylon to be registered as his address, a notice posted up in the registered office shall be deemed to be well served on him at the expiration of twenty-four hours from the time when it is so posted up.

Notices where no address.

165. Any notice required to be given by the Company to the members or any of them and not expressly provided for by these articles shall be sufficiently given if given by advertisement.

When notice may be given by advertisement.

166. Any notice required to be or which may be given by advertisement shall be advertised once in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

How to be advertised.

167. All notices shall with respect to any registered shares to which persons are jointly entitled be given to whichever of such persons is named first in the register, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such shares.

Notice to joint-holders.

168. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day following that on which the envelope or wrapper containing the same is posted, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was properly addressed and put into the post office and a certificate in writing signed by any Director or other officer of the Company that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was so addressed and posted shall be conclusive evidence thereof. Any notice given by advertisement shall be deemed to have been given on the day on which the advertisement shall first appear.

When notice by post deemed to be served.

Transferees, &c., bound by prior notice.

169. Every person who by operation of law, transfer or other means whatsoever shall become entitled to any share shall be bound by every notice in respect of such share which previously to his name and address being entered on the register shall be duly given to the person from whom he derives his title to such share.

Notice valid though member deceased.

170. Any notice or document delivered or sent by post to or left at the registered address of any member in pursuance of these articles shall, notwithstanding such member be then deceased and whether or not the Company have notice of his decease, be deemed to have been duly served in respect of any registered shares whether held solely or jointly with other persons by such member, until some other person be registered in his stead as the holder or joint-holder thereof and such service shall for all purposes of these articles be deemed a sufficient service of such notice or document on his or her heirs, executors or administrators and all persons, if any, jointly interested with him or her in any such share.

How notice to be signed.

171. The signature to any notice to be given by the Company may be written or printed.

Service of process in winding up.

172. In the event of a winding up of the Company every member of the Company who is not for the time being in the Island of Ceylon shall be bound, within eight weeks after the passing of an effective resolution to wind up the Company voluntarily or the making of an order for the winding up of the Company, to serve notice in writing on the Company appointing some householder residing in Colombo upon whom all summonses, notices, process, orders and judgments in relation to or under the winding up of the Company may be served and in default of such nomination the liquidator of the Company shall be at liberty on behalf of such member to appoint some such person, and service upon any such appointee whether appointed by the member or the liquidator shall be deemed to be good personal service on such member for all purposes, and were the liquidator makes any such appointment he shall with all convenient speed give notice thereof to such member by advertisement in some daily newspaper published in Colombo or by a registered letter sent through the post and addressed to such member at his address as mentioned in the register of members of the Company, and such notice shall be deemed to be served on the day following that on which the advertisement appears or the letter is posted. The provisions of this article shall not prejudice the right of the liquidator of the Company to serve any notice or other document in any other manner prescribed by the regulations of the Company.

SECRECY CLAUSES.

Secrecy clause.

173. Every Director, manager, auditor, trustee, member of a committee, officer, servant, agent, accountant, or other person employed in the business of the Company shall, if so required by the Directors before entering upon his duties, sign a declaration pledging himself to observe a strict secrecy respecting all transactions of the Company with its customers and the state of accounts with individuals and in matters relating thereto, and shall by such declaration pledge himself not to reveal any of the matters which may come to his knowledge in the discharge of his duties except when required so to do by the Directors or by any meeting or by a court of law or by the person to whom such matters relate and except so far as may be necessary in order to comply with any of the provisions in these articles contained.

Member not entitled to information.

174. No member or other person shall be entitled to enter upon the property of the Company or to inspect or examine the Company's premises or properties or the books or accounts of the Company without the permission of the Directors of the Company for the time being or to require discovery of or any information respecting any detail of the Company's trading or any matter which is or may be in the nature of a trade secret, mystery of trade, or secret process or of any other matter whatsoever which may relate to the conduct of the business of the Company and which, in the opinion of the Directors, it will be inexpedient in the interest of the members of the Company to communicate.

WINDING UP.

Distribution of assets.

175. If the Company shall be wound up and the assets available for distribution among the members as such shall be insufficient to repay the whole of the paid-up capital such assets shall be distributed so that as nearly as may be the losses shall be borne by the members in proportion to the capital paid up or which ought to have been paid up at the commencement of the winding up on the shares held by them respectively. And if in a winding up the assets available for distribution among the members shall be more than sufficient to repay the whole of the capital paid up at the commencement of the winding up the excess shall be distributed amongst the members in proportion to the capital at the commencement of the winding up paid up or which ought to have been paid up on the shares held by them respectively. But this article is to be without prejudice to the rights of the holders of the shares issued upon special terms and conditions.

Provisions to apply on winding up, &c.

176. If the Company shall be wound up whether voluntarily or otherwise the liquidator or liquidators may with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may with the like sanction vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator or liquidators with the like sanction shall think fit and if thought expedient any such division may be otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the members of the Company and in particular any class may be given preferential or special rights or may be excluded altogether or in part and the liquidator or liquidators shall be entitled to sell all or any of the assets of the Company in consideration of or in exchange for shares, ordinary, fully paid, part paid, or preference, in the purchasing Company but in case any division otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories shall be determined on or any sale made of any or all of the assets of the Company in exchange for shares in the purchasing company either ordinary, fully paid or part paid or preference any contributory who would be prejudiced thereby, shall have a right to dissent as if such determination were a special resolution passed pursuant to the section 192 of the Companies Act of 1929 in England but for the purposes of an arbitration as in the sub-section 6 of the section 234 and 243 of the said Companies Act of 1929 provided the provisions of the Ceylon Arbitration Ordinance, 1866, and of the Ceylon Ordinance, No. 2 of 1899, shall apply in place of the English and Scotch Acts referred to in the said sub-section 6 of the said section 234 and the said sections 234 and 243 save as herein excepted shall be deemed to be part and parcel of these present Articles.

Shareholders may purchase in event of winding up, &c.

177. Any Shareholder, whether a director or not, and whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property, of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 19, 1937, at 9 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated June 15, 1937.

Present: Mr. E. T. Dyson, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. W. Beven; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. Before proceeding to the business of the meeting the Chairman moved—"That the Council place on record its sense of sorrow at the death of Mr. G. E. Mutukisna, who served the Council faithfully for 40 years and retired from the post of Assistant Secretary in 1923, and convey to the widow its sympathy." The motion was passed, all members standing.

1A. The minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on May 15, 1937, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1936 to May 31, 1937, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for May, 1937.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of May, 1937.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending June 19, 1937.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes and house service taps inspected during May, 1937.

3A. (1) Mr. Beven drew attention to the prevalence of diphtheria in the town and suggested that it was due to bad sanitation.

The Medical Officer of Health was called in and stated that two cases had been reported recently and that necessary steps were taken. He explained that the disease was due to a germ, and that bad sanitation may be a contributory cause.

Mr. de Silva stated that there was a great deal of irresponsible criticism.

The Chairman stated that the Medical Officer of Health and his officers were doing their best.

Dr. Godlieb agreed with the Chairman and drew Council's attention to the improvements necessary to the Public Market, Slaughter-house and the Meda-ela to promote good sanitation and public health. He also suggested the provision of more clinics and better supervision of Health Visitors and Midwives.

(2) Mr. Beven stated that the electric lights in streets and bungalows were not maintained at maximum efficiency.

The Municipal Electrical Engineer was called in and explained that he kept the mains at full pressure except at the Hotel Suisse and round the lake where they cannot be maintained at full pressure without effecting certain improvements to the mains.

It was agreed that the Electricity Committee should consider the proposed improvements.

4. Petitions:—The Chairman presented—(1) Petition handed to him by Mr. Romanis Perera dated June 18, complaining that Mr. Jayasinghe had closed a path near Lady Torrington road which had been used by villagers for generations.

Mr. Marikar presented—(2) Letter from Mr. D. A. W. Bandaranayake dated May 24, 1937, objecting to certain improvements which the Medical Officer of Health had noticed him to effect to latrines at No. 2, Lady MacCarthy road and No. 17, Malabar street. (3) Petition from Rev. B. Pannajoti and several others dated June 15 objecting to the establishment of a motor stand at the junction of Madawela and Matala roads.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(4) Petition from Mr. M. Azam Bai dated June 4, complaining that Mr. F. R. Bandaranayake and Peon E. A. Siriweera had obtained a loan of Rs. 200 on a promissory note dated September 25, 1936, and had failed to repay the loan, except for Rs. 12.

Mr. Marikar presented—(5) Petition from Mr. Alim Bai, attorney of Rafeek Bai, dated June 9 complaining that Mr. H. M. Appuhamy of the Electricity Department had pleaded the Public Servants Liabilities Ordinance, when the Bai sued him for recovery of a debt.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(6) Letter from Mr. W. H. Pate dated June 4 addressed to Mr. Wijayatilake indicating the manner in which the beggar problem should be solved.

As regards (1) the Chairman explained that the Council's action against Mr. Jayasinghe for obstruction was dismissed and there was nothing further that the Council could do.

Petitions (2) and (6) were referred to the Sanitation Committee, (4) and (5) to the Law Committee, and petition (3) was to be considered with item 7 on the agenda.

4A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Marikar asked the following questions which the Chairman replied:—(1) Q.—How many engines worked in the Electricity Department during the visit of H. R. H. the Duke of Gloucester? A.—Four including the Katugastota engine during the peak load. (2) Q.—How many engines worked in the Electricity Department during the coronation of His Majesty King George VI? A.—Four including the Katugastota engine during the peak load. (3) Q.—What was the peak load during the visit of H. R. H. the Duke of Gloucester? A.—938 Amps D. C. 6 Amps A. C. equal to 458 K.W. (4) Q.—What was the peak load during the coronation of His Majesty King George VI? A.—956 Amps D. C. 7 Amps A. C. equal to 479 K.W. (5) Q.—Did the Municipal Electrical Engineer repair any of the engines before the coronation? A.—Yes. No. 1 Ruston (as per estimate accepted by Council). If so Q.—(a) By whom was it repaired? A.—Messrs. Brown & Co., Ltd. Q.—(b) What are the costs of such repairs? A.—Bills not received up to date. Q.—(c) What the costs of new parts replaced, if any? A.—Bills not received up to date. (6) Q.—How many applications for illuminations during coronation were turned down by the Municipal Electrical Engineer? A.—Four applications in writing and many personal. (7) Q.—Was an application for illuminations of the public market for the coronation refused by the Municipal Electrical Engineer? If so, why? A.—Yes, a verbal application by the Chief Revenue Inspector Mr. Abeyasinghe, due to load required being great and also the application was made after the prescribed date. (8) Q.—Is it a fact that illuminated crowns were offered for hire by the Municipal Electrical Engineer at certain rates, even after the refusal of the application for illuminations by the traders of the public market? A.—Yes, crowns were offered for hire; they were booked by the various business firms before the prescribed date.

Arising on the reply to question No. 5 Mr. Ismail observed that it was the Municipal Electrical Engineer's duty to repair the engine.

The Municipal Electrical Engineer who was questioned stated that competent mechanics were not available in the department.

After some discussion the matter was referred to the Electricity Committee for inquiry.

4B. The Chairman stated that replies to the following questions notice of which had been given by Mr. Marikar would be tabled at the next meeting:—(1) How many employees of this Council have been sued by Afghan Money Lenders from 1935? (2) How many employees have pleaded the benefit of the Public Servants' Liabilities Ordinance? (3) What disciplinary actions the Chairman has taken with regard to such employees? (4) Is it consonant or compatible with the efficient administration of the Council's affairs that its employees should be permitted to involve themselves in debt? (5) Will the Chairman call upon the employees of the Council, who have pleaded the benefit of the Public Servants' Liabilities Ordinance, to pay the just debts due to their creditors?

4C. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva was to move:—“This Council is of opinion that immediate steps should be taken to instal an eight inch pipe along Peradeniya road as adumbrated in the original scheme and recommended by Messrs. Garment and Mahadeva.” Mr. de Silva agreed to the Chairman's proposal to consider the motion with item 5 on the agenda.

5. To consider Mr. Mahadeva's report on the question of a water supply scheme for Kandy, with report from the Municipal Engineer dated June 3, 1937.

The Chairman tabled the report of the Municipal Electrical Engineer dated June 16, 1937, and two letters of the Commissioner of Local Government dated June 15, 1937, for consideration with this item.

After a lengthy discussion both in Council and in Committee, the following motions were proposed:—Mr. Marikar moved—“That this Council adopt the Maha-oya gravitation scheme referred to in the Director of Public Works' report dated October 26, 1928, as the major scheme for augmentation of water supply and request the Government to allow the services of an Engineer to investigate the scheme in detail and prepare an estimate of cost.” Dr. Godlieb seconded.—Carried unanimously.

Mr. de Silva moved—“That this Council sanction the construction of another infiltration gallery at a cost not exceeding Rs. 13,500 as suggested by the Municipal Engineer to ensure the full supply of 250,000 gallons per diem from the Minor (River) Pumping Scheme.” Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Ismail, and Dr. Godlieb dissenting.

The Chairman moved—“That this Council gratefully accepts the Government offer of Rs. 75,000 as a grant to be utilized for purposes of laying a larger main in Peradeniya road for the transport of water from Peradeniya subject to investigations being made as to the nature of main required.” Mr. Bradley seconded.—Carried.

6. Letter from Mr. B. A. Wimaladharmasiri dated June 7, 1937, stating that he is unable to accept the post in the Accounts Department offered to him, and asking to be retired with adequate notice as the post of Head Clerk, Electricity Department, for which he was recruited has been abolished by Council. (O 682.)

Resolved that Mr. Wimaladharmasiri be retired as from August 9, 1937, on the expiry of the vacation leave due to him up to that date, with compensation for abolition of his office.
