THE CEYLON IMPORTATION OF TEXTILES (QUOTAS) ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1934 AND 1936.

(Textile (Quotas) Notification No. 37/1.)

REGULATIONS made by the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, in pursuance of the powers vested in the Governor by Article 10 of the Ceylon Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Orders in Council, 1934 and 1936.

REGULATIONS.

1. From and after midnight of August 31, 1937, no textile goods of any of the classes described in the first column of the schedule to the Proclamation issued under Article 4 of the Ceylon Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Orders in Council, 1934 and 1936, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,229 of June 26, 1936, shall be deemed to be exempt from regulation under the Order in Council on the ground that they were manufactured in the Colony of Hong Kong unless the importer thereof shall, at the time of importation, submit to the Principal Collector of Customs a declaration of origin substantially in Form J in the schedule hereto, endorsed by the Superintendent of Imports and Exports, Hong Kong: Provided that no declaration of origin shall be required under this regulation in respect of any textiles for the importation of which, if they were regulated textiles, a licence in Form C would be issued under regulation 12 of the Textiles Quotas Regulations, 1934, as amended by the Textile Quotas (Amending) Regulations, 1936.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any other written law contained, no stamp duty shall be levied or payable in respect of any declaration of origin which is substantially in Form J.

THE ARMS EXPORT PROHIBITION ORDER, 1937.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 8th day of  
June, 1937.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879", (a) it is provided that the following goods may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, be prohibited either to be exported or carried coastwise:— Arms, ammunition and gunpowder, military and naval stores, and any articles which His Majesty shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores, provisions, or any sort of victual which may be used as food for man:

And whereas by Section 17 of the Finance Act, 1921, (b) it is enacted that Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, shall extend to weapons and munitions of war of every description and firearms not being weapons of war, and ammunition for such firearms, as it applies to the goods therein mentioned, and that the said section, as so amended by this section, shall extend so as to give power to prohibit the shipment as ship's stores, whether on vessels proceeding to foreign ports or on coastwise voyages, of any of the goods to which the said section applies:

And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the exportation or shipment as ship's stores on vessels proceeding to foreign ports of the articles hereinafter enumerated:

(a) 42 & 43 Vict. c. 21.

(b) 11 & 12 Geo. 5. c. 32.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. As from the 15th June, 1937, the following articles shall be, and the same are hereby prohibited to be exported from the United Kingdom, or to be shipped as ship's stores on vessels proceeding to foreign ports, that is to say:—

Mustard gas (dichlorethyl sulphide);  
Lewisite (chlorvinylchlorarsine and dichlordivinylchlorarsine);  
Methyldichlorarsine;  
Diphenylchlorarsine;  
Diphenylcyanarsine;  
Diphenylaminechlorarsine;  
Phenyldichlorarsine;  
Ethyldichlorarsine;  
Phenyldibromarsine;  
Ethyldibromarsine;  
Monochlormethylechlorformate;  
Trichlormethylechlorformate (diphosgene);  
Dichlordimethyl ether;  
Dibromdimethyl ether;  
Cyanogen chloride;  
Ethyl bromacetate;  
Ethyl iodacetate;  
Brombenzyleamide;  
Bromacetone;  
Brom-methylethyl ketone;  
Chlorpicrin.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this Order shall not apply to any exportation or shipment as ship's stores which shall be expressly permitted by a licence given by the Board of Trade, and in accordance with the conditions (if any) of such licence.

2. The Merchant Shipping (Carriage of Munitions to Spain) Act, 1936 (c), shall apply to all articles enumerated in Article (1) of this Order.

3. (1) This Order may be cited as the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1937.

(2) This Order and the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, shall be construed as one, and that Order and this Order may be cited together as the Arms Export Prohibition Orders, 1931-37.

Within a radius of two miles of any village market, established by this committee, no market commodities shall, on any day on which such market is held, be sold within this subdivision at any private market or fair: Provided that nothing in this rule shall be deemed to prohibit the sale of such commodities on such days—

## AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 11.—Insert a new second paragraph as follows:—

When a school is considered unnecessary, no application for inspection for registration will be entertained until the school has been maintained for at least five years as a school certified by the Director of Education as providing adequate and suitable instruction.

Clause 37.—Delete sub-clauses 37 (d) and (e), and substitute the following as Clause 37 (d):—

(d) All Vernacular schools should normally provide a course of optional English. The teacher of this course shall be either—

- (i.) A Vernacular Trained or Certificated Teacher on the eligible staff who has passed in the Language and Literature sections of the Senior School Certificate (English) examination or an equivalent examination. The salary of such a teacher will be in accordance with Appendix A of the Code for Vernacular and Bilingual Schools.

Additional increments may be granted one increment in the case of a teacher who has passed the Language and Literature section of the Senior School Certificate (English) examination, and two increments in the case of a teacher who has passed the Language and Literature section of the English Teachers' Certificate examination; or

- (ii.) In the absence of such a teacher, a teacher on the eligible staff who has passed the Senior School Certificate (English) examination with a Vernacular language, or who holds an equivalent or higher qualification in English together with a pass in a Vernacular language at a stage at least equivalent to the Senior School Certificate examination. The salary of such a teacher will be on the scale Rs. 480—24—504; or

- (iii.) In exceptional cases in areas in which, in the opinion of the Director, teachers qualified as above are not available, a teacher on the eligible staff who has passed the Junior School Certificate (English) examination with a Vernacular language. The salary of such a teacher will be Rs. 360 per annum (non-incremental). This salary will apply only to teachers who have been approved by the Director of Education in respect of the school in which they are employed.

The salary scales in (ii.) and (iii.) of the above sub-clause will be reckoned for grant in respect of not more than one teacher in each Vernacular school.

Managers of schools which have come under this sub-clause shall not charge fees for optional English. The grant payable on account of the English teacher shall be the scale salary of the teacher without the Manager's contribution.

Clause 39B (ii.).—In line 1 of paragraph 2 delete the words "other Vernacular or".

Clause 76.—In paragraph 2 delete the last line: "Satisfactory service as a Second Class Certificated teacher prior to entering a Training School will be counted for this purpose".

- (c) sent by registered post so as to reach the Badulla Kachcheri

before the time fixed for closing the tenders. Every tenderer should be present at the Badulla Kachcheri at the time fixed for closing of tenders.

3. The privilege for each tavern will be granted separately and a separate tender form must be used in respect of each tavern.

4. No person shall submit more than one tender for each tavern.

5. Every tender must be made by the tenderer in his own name. No tender shall be accepted if made through an agent.

6. Every tender shall be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of a sum of Rs. 50 and the number and date of the receipt must be entered on the face of the tender form.

7. The Government Agent reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all tenders and of putting up the privilege for sale by auction.

8. The grantee shall immediately on being granted the privilege sign the conditions of sale and pay to the Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege.
