(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, an anicut, channel floor wall with necessary scour gates and low level silt escapes and some rock blasting in channel intake up to the estimated cost of Rs. 680 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work free of all charges, namely, 150 cubes earthwork in improving channel bed and bund to be done before or simultaneous with Government work. All such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

REGULATION.

The Quarantine Regulations made under sections 4 and 5 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,029 of January 26, 1934, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,291 of May 21, 1937, are hereby further amended as follows:—

- (1) in regulation 47, by the substitution for the words "dry dock", of the words "any dry dock or slipway";
 (2) in the schedule to those regulations—(a) in item 1 by the insertion in paragraph B thereof, immediately after the words "At Jaffna if the vessel is more than 10 miles away by sea the minimum fee between 6 P.M. and 6 A.M.—per visit Rs. 10.50" of the following:—

"At Jaffna an additional fee of Rs. 5 per visit is payable in every case where a launch or boat is not provided for the visit by the agent of the vessel, and the Port Health Officer uses a Government boat or launch manned by boatmen working overtime."

(b) in item 2, by the substitution for all the words from "Between the hours" to "payable to him.", of the following:—

"Where the Port Health Officer accompanies the launch on any such visit, an additional fee of Rs. 10 is payable. Where the visit is made between the hours of 6 P.M. and 6 A.M., the Port Health Officer is entitled to the additional fee; in every other case the additional fee shall be credited to revenue";

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 17, 1937, at 8.45 am. in accordance with the notice dated July 13, 1937.**

Present : Mr. E. T. Dyson, Chairman ; Ratwatto Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. W. Reven ; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar ; Dr. E. S. Godlieb ; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the meeting held on June 19, 1937, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1936 to June 30, 1937, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for June, 1937.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate for the month of June, 1937.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending July 17, 1937.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during June, 1937.

3A. (1) Mr. de Silva inquired what action had been taken by the Chairman as regards the proposal to instal an 8 in. main for the transport of water from Peradeniya to Kandy for which the Government had promised a grant of Rs. 75,000.

The Chairman stated that the question had been referred to the Provincial Engineer as technical advice was necessary on two points, viz. :—(i.) The proper size of the main required, and (ii.) the cost of the piping at present market prices. After further discussion Mr. de Silva moved that the Public Works Department be asked to investigate at once and report what size of main was required. Mr. Bradley seconded.—Carried.

(2) Mr. Marikar inquired what action the Chairman had taken to implement Council's decision regarding further investigation of Hunasgiriya Scheme.

The Chairman replied that he had addressed Government asking for the services of an Engineer to carry out the investigations.

4. Petitions :—Ratwatte Adigar presented—(1) Petition from Mr. K. M. Mohideen Pitche, dated June 28, asking for the installation of a public lamp near his houses in Cemetery road.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(2) Petition signed by several Afghan Money Lenders dated July 16, 1937, complaining that Municipal Officers are evading payment of just debts and suggesting an inquiry. (3) Letter from Mr. W. H. Pate addressed to Mr. Wijayatilake dated July 2, 1937, suggesting improvements to Peradeniya road-Railway Approach road junction.

The Council agreed to consider petition (2) with item 5 on the agenda.

Petition (1) was referred to the Electricity Committee, and petition (3) to the Works Committee.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Marikar asked the following questions which the Chairman replied :—Q.—(1) How many employees of this Council have been sued by Afghan Money Lenders from 1935? A.—Several employees have been sued. The exact number cannot be stated as all cases have not been reported to this office. Q.—(2) How many employees have pleaded the benefit of the Public Servants' Liabilities Ordinance? A.—Twelve. Q.—(3) What disciplinary actions the Chairman has taken with regard to such employees? A.—One was interdicted from duty temporarily, and a few others were warned. Q.—(4) Is it consonant or compatible with the efficient administration of the Council's affairs that its employees should be permitted to involve themselves in debt? A.—No. A departmental rule was issued in February, 1936, to the effect that serious notice would be taken if any Municipal Officer or servant was found to be involved in serious financial difficulties. Q.—(5) Will the Chairman call upon the employees of the Council who have pleaded the benefit of the Public Servants' Liabilities Ordinance, to pay the just debts due to their creditors? A.—I am not aware of any case where payment of just debts has been evaded. Where an officer has not been able to meet his debts the Municipal Officers' Benefit Association has rendered assistance either by advancing its funds or by negotiating for payment in instalments. During the last two years sixty-two items of debts to Afghans have been fully paid up by the Association and nine items have been met by payment in instalments.

A discussion ensued on the question of indebtedness and the disciplinary action necessary to be taken in such cases.

Mr. Marikar moved—“That employees of the Council be required within two months to sign a declaration of freedom from debts or of all liabilities and that if after such declaration, any officer is found to have incurred fresh debts from Afghans he be dismissed from the Council's service.” Mr. Soysa seconded.

Mr. Wijayatilake moved as an amendment—“That employees of the Council be required within two months to sign a declaration of freedom from debt or of all liabilities.” Dr. Godlieb seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried by the Chairman's casting vote.

The division was as follows :—*Ayes*—Mr. Wijayatilake, Dr. Godlieb, and Ratwatte Adigar. *Noes*—Messrs. Marikar, Soysa, and de Silva. Other members did not vote. The Chairman declared the motion lost.

5A. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved :—“That in terms of the resolution passed by this Council to have the town of Kandy divided into ten wards, this Council is of opinion that a scheme of division be submitted to this Council at the next General Meeting.” Mr. Ismail seconded.

The Chairman having pointed out that the Executive Committee of Local Administration had not yet communicated its decision as regards the number of elected members, the Council agreed to ask the Hon. the Minister for an early decision.

6. Letter dated June 2, 1937, from Mr. J. Stanley Garment asking the Council to consider the question of paying him a sum of Rs. 11,550 representing salary withheld from him during 1931–1933. (O 102).

The Chairman explained the circumstances in which the amount was withheld.

Mr. Marikar moved that as Mr. Garment had accepted the terms offered to him for his retirement, this further claim should not be considered. Mr. de Silva seconded.

The motion was carried, Mr. Beven and the Chairman dissenting.

7. To approve of nomination of Miss Z. Bell, Miss H. Beven, and Mrs. Sproule as members of the Kandy Municipal Maternity and Child Welfare Committee. Resolved that their nomination be approved.

8. Letter dated July 5, 1937, from Mr. B. A. Wimaladharmasiri urging that his claim for adequate notice prior to a abolition of post, which has been allowed in case of other officers, be considered by the Council and he be treated on the same footing as others.

Mr. de Silva moved the Council into Committee to consider the item.

In Committee the Chairman explained that Mr. Wimaladharmasiri chose retirement on abolition of his office though he was offered other work on his own salary, and he had been allowed the maximum vacation leave the rules permitted. The Council was satisfied that his case had been fairly dealt with.

The Council then resumed and the Chairman moved that the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 2,932·50 to Mr. Wimaladharmasiri be authorized, subject to sanction of the Governor, the amount being made up as follows :—Gratuity for service for 8 years, 6 months, and 8 days, Rs. 1,955·00; Addition for abolition, Rs. 977·50; Total, Rs. 2,932·50.

9. Letter dated July 1, 1937, from the Principal, Dharmaraja College, forwarding amended plan for erection of stalls, &c., at Bogambara in connection with the carnival. Resolved that the plan be approved.

10. Letter dated June 17, 1937, from Mr. Mettananda stating that as his Committee is of opinion that the carnival will be greatly affected by amusements, which may be held on the Market square, he wishes to use the Market square also and asking that it be allowed to him on a rental of Rs. 800.

Resolved that the Market area be allowed to Mr. Mettananda on a rent of Rs. 1,250 payable by July 25, 1937. If he fails to accept the offer, the Council to lease the area as usual.

12. Report dated June 24, 1937, from the Medical Officer of Health dealing with the remarks made at the last meeting on matters affecting sanitation. (O 685.) Tabled.

13. Recommendations of the Standing and Special Committees :—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on June 19, 1937.

(1) To obtain a definition of the term “Tenement” in connection with applications for erection of buildings within residential areas. (WPB 214/35.)—Recommended that the ruling of the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, viz., “define tenements as consisting only of a verandah, two rooms, and a cooking place and no more” be adopted.

(2) To approve of procedure recommended by the Council's lawyer as regards acceptance of payment of subsequent rates where a defaulter pays arrears but fails to obtain a reconveyance of the vested property. (A/SB).—Recommended that in such cases rent be also recovered to preserve Council's title—three months' time only to be allowed to obtain reconveyance.

(3) Drafts of agreements proposed to be entered into with house-holders in connection with domestic and other than domestic supplies of water to premises. (C 301).—Recommended.

(4) To obtain a vote for Rs. 42 in respect of annual rent payable to the lessees of the site of the public well at Katugastota and to determine basis of allocation of rent. (O 660).—Recommended vote of Rs. 42 and payment so far as the shares are undisputed: balance to remain in deposit until parties have settled their disputes.

(5) Papers *re* lease of part of premises No. 273, Peradeniya road to Mr. B. W. Mendis. (O 655).—Recommended to reserve lot A in Municipal Engineer's plan dated July 10, 1936, for a path and to sell outright lot B.

(7) Letter from the Secretary, Maternity and Child Welfare Committee, asking for approval to employ a substitute midwife owing to the illness of one of the midwives and her inability to resume work for some weeks.—Recommended.

(8) To obtain sanction for the sale by public auction of the following properties purchased by the Council and vested in it for default in payment of rates by owners:—Peradeniya road, 599; Mavilmada, 178A, 212A, 212C.—Recommended.

(9) Papers *re* lease of part of premises No. 273, Peradeniya road to Mr. B. W. Mendis. (O 655).—Recommended to reserve lot A in Municipal Engineer's plan dated July 10, 1936, for a path and to sell outright lot B.

(10) To obtain a vote for Rs. 35 for re-wiring the Cemeterykeeper's bungalow for lights.—Recommended.

(11) To consider the question of salary of Mechanic at the Municipal Motor Garages and Workshop.—Recommended that he be left on Rs. 60 per mensem but that the post be made pensionable. Mr. Ismail dissenting.

(12) To consider Fire Brigade Officer's memo dated June 15, 1937, detailing arrangements he proposes to make at Bogambara Ground, for protection against fire during the carnival connected with Dharmaraja College, and suggesting recovery of a fee of Rs. 10 per diem from carnival authorities for his services in addition to the police charges of Rs. 3·20 per diem.—Recommended that the charge be Rs. 5 per diem, Rs. 2·50 to be paid to the Fire Brigade Officer and Rs. 2·50 to the Municipal Council, in addition to the police charges.

(13) To obtain a supplementary vote of Rs. 750 for sundry works under Estimate 13 up to the end of the year.—Recommended.

(16) To consider the question of erecting notice boards warning pedestrians to keep to pavements, and the positions for such boards.—Recommended not to provide notices at present as their effectiveness is doubtful.

(17) Applications for metered water services to the following premises:—Katugastota road, 189-194; Peradeniya road, 974.—Recommended.

(18) Application from the Pullayar Kovil authorities for an enhanced free allowance of water. Recommended free allowance of 10,000 gallons per mensem.

(19) To obtain sanction for the payment to the contractor of a sum of Rs. 435·50 in excess of amount in tender for construction of 750 feet of roadside drains in Peradeniya road to permit of steps at entrances of houses to be rebuilt, not contemplated in the contract.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on June 19, 1937.

(20) Papers *re* application of the Hon'y. Secretary, Kandy Branch Ceylon Red Cross Society, for electric lights to be installed at the Ratwatte Sports Pavilion.—Recommended that Rs. 176 be voted for this work.

(21) To obtain sanction for charging the Queen's Hotel on the basis of 450 units of electrical energy consumed at the premises during April, in respect of which the meter had not recorded the consumption owing to its stoppage.—Recommended.

(22) Letter No. E 21/440 dated June 16, 1937, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer inquiring if the Council will now consider the question of additional generating plant.—Recommended that the Municipal Electrical Engineer call for tenders.

(23) Estimate dated July 7, 1937, for the following works was tabled:—(1) For labour for cutting bank, filling, and turfing a part of Bogambara grounds, Rs. 600; (2) supplementary vote for rolling Bogambara grounds for 2½ months (2 bulls and a driver), Rs. 100; (3) for labour for blasting rock for building a section of drain between Bogambara ground and Hospital road, Rs. 300.—Recommended.

14. To obtain a vote for Rs. 231·26 to meet the cost of distribution of water to higher levels up to the end of July, 1937. Resolved that the vote be allowed.

It was suggested by Mr. de Silva that the water taken for distribution should be from a standpost in the river water supply area.

The Chairman undertook to ascertain what the additional cost of distribution (if any) would be.

15. To obtain sanction to entrust the construction of the additional Infiltration Gallery to the contractor who constructed the previous one at the same rates, the total amount of contract being Rs. 13,097·26. Resolved that tenders be invited for the work.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, June 12, 1937, at 9 a.m. pursuant to notice dated June 7, 1937.**

Present :—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman ; Mr. K. T. S. Gurusingha, Assistant Chairman ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna ; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo ; Mr. W. Dahanayaka ; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. J. C. Cooper ; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of May 20, 1937, were amended by the insertion of the name of Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya in the list of members present at the meeting. The Minutes, as amended, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Two petitions were presented, one by Mr. W. Dahanayaka and one by Mr. E. M. Karunaratna. These were tabled, and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions :—

(1) (a) Is the Chairman aware that the existing arrangements at the Customs for the detection, examination, and disposal of damaged rice unfit for human consumption, are defective and open to corrupt practices ? (b) Is it true that the Medical Officer of Health went over to the Customs premises on May 8 to examine a number of bags of damaged rice, but that he did not examine them on that day ? (c) Is it true that the Medical Officer of Health paid a second visit to the Customs premises on May 11 and condemned a few bags of rice as unfit for human consumption ? (d) Will the Chairman please note that between May 8 and 11, a number of bags of damaged rice were secretly transported from the Customs Warehouses to the Galle Bazaar with the connivance and under the very eyes of certain Customs Officers ? (e) Will the Chairman please take all necessary action to eliminate the chances for such corrupt practice, and thus safeguard the health of the people ?

(2) (a) What school buildings or parts of school buildings within the Municipal limits of Galle have been assessed for rates ? (b) Is the Chairman aware that the Supreme Court has held that the term "school building" used in section 115 (1) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 would apply only to such parts of a school building as are used as class-rooms where the classes meet regularly for tuition or private study ? (c) Is the Chairman aware that according to this interpretation some school halls and staff-common-rooms are rateable ? (d) Will the Chairman please take steps to charge rates on such parts of school buildings, or, if he is not prepared to do so, will he please obtain the opinion of the Auditor-General on this subject ?

(3) (a) Will the Chairman please explain why no licence have been obtained on payment of the usual fees for public performances held from time to time in the St. Aloysius' College New Hall, and for one public performance held recently in the Southlands College Hall? (b) Is the Chairman aware that the Managers concerned derive considerable income by letting out their halls on hire for public performances? (c) If the Chairman on his own is unwilling to enforce the Public Performances By-laws on School Managers, will he please consult the Law Committee on this subject?

(4) (a) Has there been a delay in the preparation of the March and subsequent balance sheets? (b) If so, is it not a serious contravention of section 83 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 which states that at each monthly meeting the Chairman shall submit to the Council the balance sheet up to the month preceding the meeting? (c) Will the Chairman please take disciplinary action against all officers responsible for this serious dereliction of duty?

(5) (a) With reference to the answers to my questions Nos. (1) (a), (b), and (c) at the last General Meeting, does the Chairman contend that a thumb impression is more useful for purposes of identification than a signature seeing that the Municipal Officers have not had the training to identify thumb marks? (b) Why does not the Chairman test the truth of my allegation that some labourers who can sign their names have been instructed not to do so? (c) Has not a case been detected of a labourer who had not worked but who went up to receive wages?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a), (d), and (e). These are not matters which come within my jurisdiction as Chairman of the Municipal Council, but I will obtain a report from the Customs authorities and table it at the next meeting. (b) Yes, I understand that the Medical Officer of Health did so at the request of the Customs authorities, but when he got to the warehouse he found that the rice had not been sorted. He, therefore, advised the Sub-Collector to get rice sorted under Customs supervision and to inform him when the work had been completed so that he could visit again and express his opinion. (c) Yes.

(2) (a) to (d) These questions will be answered at the next meeting as the notice given has been insufficient. It was received only on Tuesday afternoon.

(3) (a) As the member has already been informed on a previous occasion, it has been the practice to issue licences in these cases under By-law 7 (c) of the by-laws relating to Public Performances. This by-law states that "the Chairman may at his discretion, and subject to such conditions as he may consider necessary, grant a licence (anything in these by-laws to the contrary notwithstanding) for the temporary use of any premises for the purposes of a public performance, without a formal application under section 2, free of charge or otherwise." (b) I am aware that in some cases a fee is charged by the school authorities. (c) I will put the matter to the Law Committee for its opinion.

(4) (a) Yes, due to the difficulties experienced in the preparation of these statements by the clerk who was acting as Accountant from November, 1936, to April, 1937. (b) It is a contravention of section 83 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. (c) Such disciplinary action as is necessary will be taken by me.

(5) (a) Yes, because a thumb impression will be positive evidence for identifying the payee should an investigation be necessary. It is true that the Municipal Officers have not had the training to identify thumb marks, but they would experience the same difficulty in identifying signatures, as they are not handwriting experts. (b) Because the necessity does not arise. The practice is for the Medical Officer of Health to ascertain from each payee whether he is able to sign his name or not. Thumb impressions are obtained from those who are unable to sign. (c) No, but there was an instance detected by the Medical Officer of Health and brought to my notice where an incorrect entry had been made regarding the attendance of a substitute labourer. The officer responsible for the carelessness was suitably punished by me.

4. To approve the draft boundaries of the area of the town served by the water supply scheme.—Resolved that the draft boundaries be approved.

5. Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved:—That in order to regularize the system of rating in Galle this Council resolves to levy throughout the town from the beginning of the year 1938 a consolidated rate of 17½ per cent. which includes a water rate of 6 per cent. and to exempt from the said water rate all lands and buildings situated outside the area served by the water supply scheme. Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya, W. Dahanayaka, E. M. Karunaratna, A. I. H. A. Wahab, and J. E. Perera opposed the motion. Messrs. Magdon Ismail, A. C. Mohammedo, and C. E. de Vos supported the motion. With the permission of Council Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that a deputation of the Council do wait upon the Hon. the Minister for Local Administration to urge upon him the necessity for amending the law to enable the Council to charge a lighting rate. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, five voting for and six against. Mr. Dahanayaka called for a division which resulted as follows:—*For*: Messrs. W. Dahanayaka, Thomas Amarasuriya, E. M. Karunaratna, J. E. Perera, and A. I. H. A. Wahab. *Against*: The Chairman, Messrs. F. Magdon Ismail, A. C. Mohammedo, C. E. de Vos, J. C. Cooper, and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

Mr. F. Magdon Ismail then moved as a further amendment that a consolidated rate of 17 per cent. instead of 17½ per cent. be levied throughout the town. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded. The Chairman in reply stated that he was unable to support this amendment because the decrease suggested would give very little relief and was quite insufficient to justify an alteration. He had no objection to consideration of the question being postponed, if the members so desired, because even if his present motion was defeated he would have to bring up another motion on the matter in an amended form at the next meeting. In view of the Chairman's remarks Mr. Magdon Ismail, with the leave of Council, withdrew his motion.

Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya then moved as another amendment that a consolidated rate of 14 per cent. which includes a water rate of 6 per cent. be levied throughout the town. Mr. Wahab seconded and Mr. W. Dahanayaka supported this amendment.

At this stage Mr. E. M. Karunaratna moved that the Chairman's motion be adjourned for discussion at the next meeting. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) Inasmuch as there is reason to suspect that the embezzlement of Municipal Revenue still continues at the Fish Auction Shed, this Council requests the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation to inquire into the system of work prevailing at the Fish Auction Shed and make to Council suitable recommendations thereon. Mr. Wahab seconded. The Chairman said he had no objection to the motion provided that the words "inasmuch as there is reason to suspect that the embezzlement of Municipal Revenue still continues at the Fish Auction Shed" were deleted. The mover agreed, and, with the permission of Council, amended his motion accordingly.

Mr. Wahab then moved as an amendment that the matter be referred to a Special Committee of the Council instead of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation. Mr. Magdon Ismail seconded.—Carried. On the suggestion of the Chairman it was agreed that, the Special Committee should consist of the following Members:—The Chairman (or Assistant Chairman), Messrs. W. Dahanayaka, A. I. H. A. Wahab, and Thomas Amarasuriya, with the Chairman as convener and two members to form a quorum.

(2) That the by-laws and regulations of the Municipal Council of Galle revised up to date be made available in the form of a printed book. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—(1) Carried, (2) resolved that the matter be referred to the Law Committee.

7. The Chairman moved:—(1) That in terms of letter No. B1,242 from the Commissioner of Local Government dated March 17, 1937, the suggested further amendments to the proposed new section 19 of Ordinance No. 18 of 1907 be approved; and (2) that in terms of letter No. B1,242 from the Commissioner of Local Government dated June 7, 1937, the amendment suggested by the Legal Draftsman to section 10 of the same Ordinance be also approved.—Carried.

8. To approve the transfer of Mr. S. M. Haniffa from the Municipal Council, Kandy, to the Municipal Council, Galle, with effect from May 1, 1937, with pension rights under Rule 18A of the Council's Pension Rules.—Resolved that the transfer be approved.

9. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :-

(a) *Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of June 2, 1937.*

(2) Considered the question of rat-proofing and future leasing of the stalls in the Fruit Market.—Recommended—(1) That all the stalls of what is now known as the "Fruit Market" be improved and rat-proofed to conform with the regulations for grain boutiques, irrespective of whether they are used for storing grain, or fruit and sundries; (2) that these improvements be carried out as far as possible between July and December this year—two or more stalls being dealt with at a time; (3) that such stalls as are available be leased out month by month at the present rentals and as far as possible to the present stall holders, up till the end of the year; (4) that the leases of all the stalls for the period February to December, 1938, be sold by public auction at an upset price to be decided later; (5) that the Anti-plague regulations be enforced from January, 1938, in respect of all stalls in which grain is kept or sold; and (6) that no stall holder be allowed to keep or sell any other commodities in any stall in which more than five bags of grain or forage mixture are stored.

Resolution.

With regard to the above item Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that recommendations (4) and (6) be referred back to the Standing Committee for reconsideration, but there was no seconder. The recommendations of the Standing Committee were then put to the meeting and adopted, Mr. Dahanayaka being opposed to recommendations (4) and (6).

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of June 4, 1937.*

(2) To recommend a revote of Rs. 4,500 being the unpaid amount for 1936 under Head 4—Interest and Sinking Fund, Water Works Loan.—Recommended.

(3) Considered Audit Query No. 137 I.M. of May 18, 1937, regarding the payment made on vouchers Nos. 989, 1062, and 1505 for Rs. 3.25, Rs. 12, and Rs. 15, respectively in connection with the Armistice Day Celebrations and a performance of the "Emden" Band.—Recommended that the payments made be sanctioned.

(4) Considered an application from Mr. E. H. Jansen for a loan of 3 months' salary to purchase a car.—Recommended that a loan of three months' salary be granted on the following conditions:—(1) Repayment to be made in 18 equal monthly instalments; and (2) interest at 2½ per cent. to be charged on the amount outstanding.

(5) To approve the payment from this year's vote of a sum of Rs. 6.85 to W. K. James Silva, former Road Overseer, being the balance unpaid wages due to him for August, 1935.—Recommended that the payment from vote 42 be approved.

(6) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 750 under Electricity Head 30—Meters.—Recommended.

(7) Considered the question of amending the Council's Pension Rules so that awards shall not become payable both under Rules 22 and 23 and also under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934.—Recommended that the Pension Rules be amended by the addition of the following new rule to be known as Rule 21A:—"Rule 22 and 23 are not applicable to persons entitled to compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934, or to their dependants if such persons were newly appointed to the service of the Municipal Council on or after the date on which that Ordinance came into operation: provided that a person with service prior to that date under the Municipal Council shall not be deemed to have been newly appointed for the purposes of this rule if pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity under these rules is payable in respect of such prior service; and provided, further that in the case of non-pensionable officers and daily paid employees who were in the service of the Council on August 1, 1935, the allowance or award payable under rules 22 and 23 shall be the amount if any, by which the sum which would otherwise be so payable exceeds the compensation payable under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance."

(8) Considered Mr. W. Dahanayaka's motion of May 20, 1937, viz., that the Finance Committee do consider and report on the feasibility of extending the system of office collections for assessment rates and conservancy fees.—After a preliminary discussion on the matter it was resolved to defer consideration till the next meeting.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

With regard to item (8) it was resolved to amend the minutes of the Standing Committee by the addition of the following:—"and to ask Mr. S. M. Haniffa to submit in the meantime for the information of the Committee a report in general on the system prevailing in the Kandy Council with regard to the payment of assessment rates at the office and his suggestions for adopting a similar system suitable for Galle."

10. To submit the following letters:—(a) Letter No. A 383/37 dated May 5, 1937, from the Secretary to the Minister for Home Affairs regarding the site selected by the Council for the proposed Town Hall; and (b) Letter dated June 3, 1937, from the Secretary to the Minister for Health regarding the erection of granaries in Galle, and the provision of accommodation for the fumigation of grain cargoes submitted.

Arising out of this item Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that a Special Committee of the Council be appointed to submit a report as early as possible on the sites for the granaries and the Town Hall, respectively, and on how the funds for these two purposes are to be raised. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—(1) Carried; (2) resolved that the Special Committee do consist of Messrs. J. E. Perera, E. M. Karunaratna, Thomas Amarasuriya, A. J. H. A. Wahab, and W. Dahanayaka, with Mr. Dahanayaka as convener and three members to form a quorum.

11. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council:—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, July 10, 1937, at 9 A.M.

12. To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed on May 23, 1936, to submit an early report on the amendments required in Ordinance No. 60 of 1935, to make it applicable to the Galle Municipal Council.

Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya took objection to the report on the ground that the minutes of the last meeting of the Special Committee had not been confirmed. The Chairman said he did not think that fact would invalidate the report and pointed out that it would be open to the member to move any amendments he wished when the report was considered.

Mr. J. E. Perera then moved that the report be considered at the next General Meeting of the Council Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded.

Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved that the report be considered at a special meeting of the Council. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.

Mr. E. M. Karunaratna suggested that the matter be put down for consideration at the next General Meeting and that it be taken up first. This suggestion was agreed to by all the members, and adopted.
