ATTENTION is drawn to the Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of May 14, 1937, by which a Prohibited Area at Trincomalee was created.

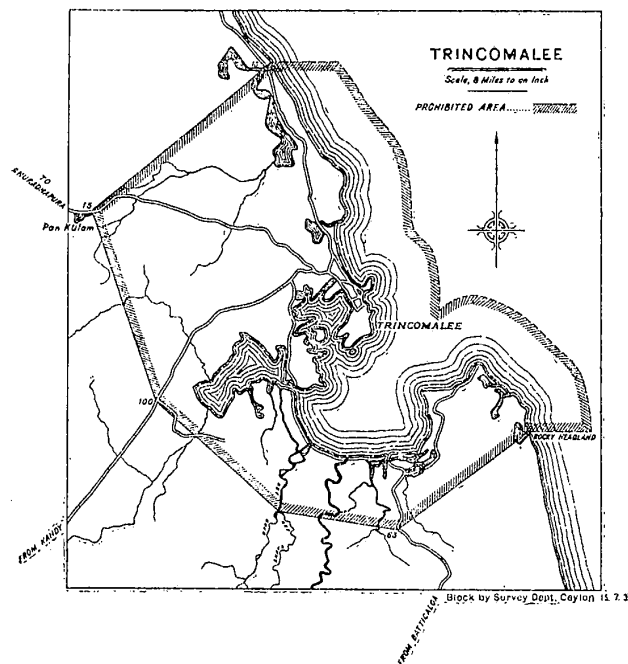
## 2. The area is defined as—

“That part of the Trincomalee District and the territorial waters adjacent thereto which is situate within boundary lines drawn as follows :—

From the inlet 13 miles north of TRINCOMALEE east to the 3-mile territorial limit thence following this limit south-east to a point 3 miles due east of ROCKY HEADLAND. Thence westward through road junctions at 63 milestone on road BATTICALOA-TRINCOMALEE to the junction of SHAVA ARU and UPPU ARU. Thence north-west to road junction at 100 milestone on the road KANDY-TRINCOMALEE-north to PANKULAM (15 milestone on road TRINCOMALEE-ANURADHAPURA) north-east to the starting point.”

Flying over that area is prohibited.

## THE PREVENTION OF CRIMES ORDINANCE, No. 2 OF 1926.

RULES made by the Officer Administering the Government in pursuance of the powers vested in the Governor by section 4 of the Prevention of Crimes Ordinance, No. 2 of 1926, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

## RULES.

The rules made under the Prevention of Crimes Ordinance, No. 2 of 1926, and published in *Gazette* No. 7,685 of January 11, 1929, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,087 of November 2, 1934, are hereby further amended as follows :—

(1) by the substitution, for rule 9 thereof, of the following new rule :—

“9. (1) The Registrar may, with the prior authority of the Deputy Inspector-General of Police, Criminal Investigation Department, cancel and destroy, from time to time, the record—

- (a) of any youthful offender or any criminal who has been convicted of any crime before a Police Court or before a District Court and—
- (i.) punished with a sentence of whipping or of fine or of simple or rigorous imprisonment for any term not exceeding one month ; or
  - (ii.) ordered to execute a bond for keeping the peace or for good behaviour, if such youthful offender or criminal has not thereafter been convicted of any crime for a period of seven years ; or

(b) of any criminal not referred to in paragraph (a), if such criminal has not been convicted of any crime for a period of ten years ; or

(c) of any reconvicted criminal, if he has not been convicted of any crime for a period of ten years.

(2) 'Youthful offender' in this rule means a youthful offender within the meaning of the Youthful Offenders Ordinance, 1886.

(3) The period of years referred to in sub-paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of paragraph (1) shall, in each case set out in column 1 of the Table hereunder, be deemed to commence on the date specified in the corresponding item in column 2 of that Table.

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, masonry anicut and head sluice up to the estimated cost of Rs. 2,300 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work free of all charges, namely, (a) 31 cubes earthwork in forming flood bund, and (b) 165 cubes in cutting new approach channel, all such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutuable labour due under this scheme, the Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

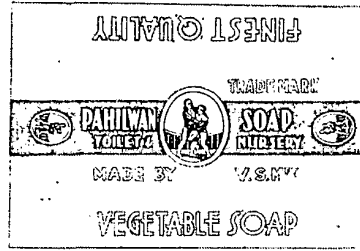

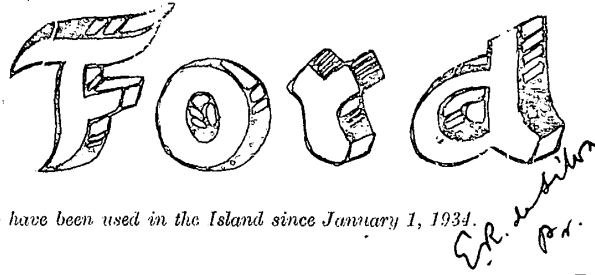
