THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,
No. 13 OF 1896.

Regulations for Mandar Festival.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896 entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages", and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Maxwell MacLagan Wedderburn, Officer Administering the Government, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the annual pilgrimage to Mandur in the Porativu pattu of the Batticaloa District.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations "camp area" means the area within the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereto, and "Government Agent" means the Government Agent of the Eastern Province.

2. No person shall camp in any part of the camp area which has been set apart for any other purpose by the Government Agent by special or general order or by notice exhibited on the spot.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area, except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

5. (a) No person shall keep any cattle in the camp area.
(b) No person shall keep any cattle in the immediate neighbourhood of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala, or at a place approved for such use by the Government Agent.

- (c) Every person in charge of cattle shall—
- (i.) cause dung and other refuse to be removed daily from the camp area to such place outside that area as may be provided therefor; and
 - (ii.) keep the place occupied by his cattle clean at all times.
6. Every person who exposes food for sale within the camp area shall keep such food—
- (a) wrapped in, or covered with, clean paper or cloth so as to protect it from contamination by flies or dust; or
 - (b) in closed glass cases; or
 - (c) in such other type of covered container as may be approved by the Medical Officer or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.
7. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.
8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave Mandur and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.
9. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.
10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any specified purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is so set apart.
11. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea and coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.
12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.
13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area, or within a distance of one mile from the boundaries of such area.
14. (1) No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area, except in such slaughtering place as may be provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.
- (2) Every person slaughtering any animal in such slaughtering place shall clean such place immediately after the slaughter.

Schedule.

The area bounded as follows:—

North by the first public lane on the north running parallel to the Mandukkodaimunai road; south by the lake (lagoon) known as Kovilkudah and the village of Palamunai; east by the lagoon facing Mandukkodaimunai temple; west by the Kurunchamunai road.

Deletion of the existing regulation 46A and the substitution of the following therefor:—

46A. Clerks appointed to Class II. of the General Clerical Service on the scale of salaries laid down in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934 (except those referred to in P. S. R. 48B) will be required to pass the examination referred to in regulation 46 before they will be regarded as qualified for promotion over the efficiency bar before the salary of Rs. 1,368 is reached.

Deletion of the existing regulation 48 and the substitution of the following therefor:—

48. The waiting periods of two years on the salaries of Rs. 1,500 and Rs. 2,100 per annum, respectively, in the General Clerical Service scale may be reduced by the Chief Secretary by any period not exceeding one year in the case of officers who have been recommended in their confidential reports for promotion on the ground of special merit. Such recommendations should be confined to the annual confidential reports and may be made in such reports for any of the three years preceding the date when the opportunity for such promotion will arise. No other recommendations or applications for promotion shall be considered.

48A. The waiting periods of two years on the salaries of Rs. 1,260 and Rs. 1,800 per annum respectively, in the scale of salaries laid down in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934 may similarly be reduced by the Chief Secretary.

48B. In the case of clerks previously in Class III. of the General Clerical Service who have passed the second efficiency bar in the scale Rs. 480—48—1,200 or the third efficiency bar in the scale Rs. 480—30—1,200 of that Class, receiving on or after July 1, 1934, promotion to Class II. under Public Service Regulation 39 or appointment to Class II. by examination, the first waiting period of two years will come into operation when they begin to draw the salary of Rs. 1,476.

Deletion of the existing regulation 1A in Appendix B and the substitution of the following therefor:—

1A. Clerks appointed to Class II. of the General Clerical Service on the scale of salaries laid down in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934 (except those referred to in P. S. R. 48B) must pass the same examination to entitle them to proceed beyond the salary of Rs. 1,260 per annum on the scale for that class. Clerks referred to in P. S. R. 48B must pass this examination before they can proceed beyond the salary of Rs. 1,476 per annum.

Clause 9.—Amend to read as follows:—

It shall be the duty of any person who desires to open a school to report particulars of such school to the Director at least one month before its opening. Upon receipt of such notice, the Director will take steps to ascertain if in the locality such a school is necessary on educational or religious grounds. If the school is considered by the Director to be necessary, it will be recognized provisionally until it is inspected and its recognition confirmed. If on inspection the school is found unfit for recognition, the provisional recognition will be cancelled, provided that an extension of the provisional recognition may be allowed if, in the opinion of the Director, the defects found on inspection can be remedied within 30 days. A school which is not considered to be necessary but which provides adequate and suitable instruction, will not at any time be recognized or registered but will be certified by the Director as providing adequate and suitable instruction under section 25 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

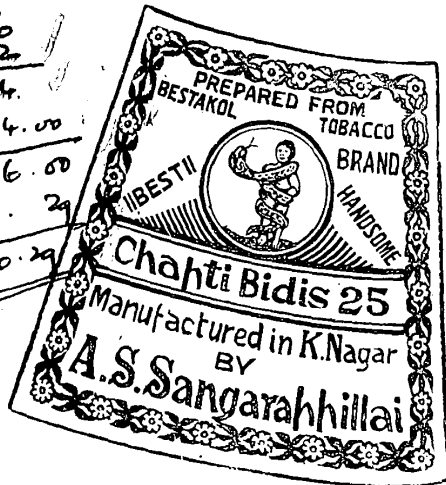

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 21, 1937, at 9 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated August 17, 1937.

Present : Mr. E. T. Dyson, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. W. Beven ; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar ; Dr. E. S. Godlieb ; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 17, 1937, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1936 to July 31, 1937, on account of the Municipal Fund
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for July, 1937.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July, 1937.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending August 21, 1937.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes and house service taps inspected during July, 1937.

3A. (1) Mr. De Silva inquired whether a reply had been received from the Public Works Department on the subject of the provision of a larger water main from Peradeniya to Kandy.

The Chairman read letter No. W. W. 9D dated August 18, 1937, received from the Director of Public Works on the subject, and stated that the information asked for by the Director of Public Works would be furnished within a fortnight. (W/W.W (C)).

(2) On the suggestion of Mr. Marikar it was agreed to invite attention of the Director of Public Works to the letter on the subject of further investigation of the Hunasgiriya Scheme.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Soysa presented—(1) Petition from Mr. K. Pitche of premises No. 164/164A, Colombo street, praying that he be allowed to retain the portion of the building at the junction of Colombo street and Brownrigg street encroaching on the street on payment of rent. Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(2) Letter from Mr. L. H. Mettananda dated August 15, 1937, asking for reduced charges for the supply of current for the purpose of the Kandy Perahera Industries Fair and Carnival. Mr. Marikar presented—(3) Petition from Mr. C. D. William Singho dated July 28, 1937, asking that a well situated near the level crossing at Mulgampola, be properly constructed by the Council.

It was agreed to refer petitions (1) and (3) to the Works Committee, and (2) to the Electricity Committee.

5. Correspondence :—Letter No. B 900 dated August 4, 1937, from the Secretary to the Minister for Local Administration stating that the Executive Committee of Local Administration approves the number of elected members of the Council being fixed at 10 and that as regards the franchise, the Committee had come to certain decision which will be embodied in an Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 60 of 1935. (O 113).—Tabled. It was agreed to await decisions on the question of the franchise before taking steps to divide the town into Wards.

5A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Soysa asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied :—Q.—(1) How many Overseers are employed in the Works Department? A.—5 overseers and 1 sub-overseer. Q.—How are they paid? A.—They are paid at a daily rate on check roll as follows :—1 at Rs. 3 per diem ; 2 at Rs. 2.75 per diem ; 1 at Rs. 2.50 per diem ; 1 at Rs. 2 per diem ; Sub-overseer at Re. 1.25 per diem. Q.—(2) How are their increments given? In what periods? A.—Increments are allowed in the discretion of the Head of the Department on the merits of each case within the minimum and maximum wages prescribed by Council. Q.—(3) When were they given their last increment? A.—To the overseers on June 15, 1937 ; to the Sub-overseer on June 1, 1937. Q.—(4) Is it true that a number of these overseers and others were given increments by the late Municipal Works Engineer just before he left? A.—Yes. Q.—(5) Does the Chairman consider that such increments were just and reasonable? A.—I consider the increments granted are justifiable in view of the work done by these officers, but I consider that they should have been based on some system.

Arising on the questions and answers Mr. De Silva suggested and the Council agreed to refer the matter to the Economy Committee for consideration together with the Auditor-General's report on the account system and economies.

The Council agreed to a transfer with pension rights, as in other similar cases, under section 18 (1) of the Municipal Pension Rules.

12. Letter dated July 12, 1937, from the Hony. Secretary, Kandy Friend-in-Need Society forwarding a copy of a report of a sub-committee on the establishment of a Home for Destitutes and control of vagrancy in Kandy.

The Chairman moved that the Finance Committee of the Council, with Dr. E. S. Godlieb co-opted, be authorized to meet representatives of the Kandy Friend-in-Need Society, the Kandy Social Service League and the Superintendent of Police and discuss the subject. Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.—carried.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, August 28, 1937, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with the Notice dated August 24, 1937, to consider Chairman's Memorandum dated August 23, 1937, on the subject of compensation payable to the Freemason Society for removal of the Henry Byrde Memorial Hall from its present site as a result of the lease of the ground to Mr. C. T. Rust.

Present : Mr. E. T. Dyson, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. Walter Beven ; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar ; Mr. C. H. Bradley.

The Chairman tabled his memo dated August 23, 1937, and connected papers and mentioned that he was unable to address Government for sanction of the lease to Mr. Rust until the question of compensation for termination of the existing lease to the St. John's Lodge was settled.

The Council resolved into Committee to consider the matter.

The deputation produced plans of the new building proposed to be erected on the new site in Victoria Drive.

BY-LAWS.

1. In these by-laws—

- “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Sanitary Board of the Jaffna District;
- “the annual registration fee” means the annual registration fee to be charged under section 5 of the Ordinance; and
- “the owner” of a dog means the person having custody or possession of that dog.

2. (1) The occupier of any house or premises in which any dog is kept, shall, on or before March 1, in each year furnish to the Police Vidane of the division within which such dog is kept a return in the form in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Where any person, after March 1 in any year, commences to keep a dog in any house or premises, the occupier of such house or premises shall forthwith furnish to the Police Vidane of the division within which such dog is kept an additional return in the form in the Schedule hereto.

3. The annual registration fee for each dog shall be as follows:—

- For a male dog .. twenty-five cents
- For a female dog .. one rupee

4. The annual registration fee shall be paid by the owner of each dog—

(a) In the case of a dog in respect of which a return is furnished under by-law 2 (1), on or before March 31 of the year for which the fee is due; or

(b) in the case of a dog in respect of which an additional return is furnished under by-law 2 (2), within fifteen days of the date on which such additional return is furnished.

5. On payment of the annual registration fee, the Chairman shall issue to the owner of the dog—

- (i.) a certificate of registration, and
- (ii.) a metal ticket or collar with the number of the certificate stamped thereon;

Provided that the Chairman may require the production of any dog for the registration of which an application is made, and may refuse to issue a certificate of registration and a metal ticket or collar for that dog—

- (a) if that dog is not produced; or
- (b) if that dog is, in the opinion of the Chairman, so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or
- (c) if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner.

6. The Chairman may, after notice to be left at the address of the owner of any dog for which a certificate of registration has been issued, cancel such certificate—

- (a) if that dog becomes, in the opinion of the Chairman, so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or
- (b) if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- (c) if that dog is permitted by its owner, at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, to associate with any other dog.

7. (1) The owner of any dog, for which a certificate of registration has been refused under by-law 5 or has been cancelled under by-law 6, shall, on being noticed to do so by the Chairman, produce that dog at such a time and place as may be specified in the notice.

(2) Every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Chairman shall think fit.

8. The owner of any dog for which a metal ticket or collar has been issued shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the metal ticket or collar is fastened securely round the neck of that dog at all times during the period for which the certificate of registration issued in respect of that dog is in force.

9. The Chairman may authorize in writing any person to exercise any or all of the powers vested in the Chairman by these by-laws.
