"vehicle" means any artificial contrivance, whether

AIR NAVIGATION.

THE CARRIAGE BY AIR (PARTIES TO CONVENTION) ORDER, 1937.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 29th day of July, 1937.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS a Convention for the unification of certain rules relating to international carriage by air was on the twelfth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, signed at Warsaw on behalf of His Majesty:

And whereas provision is made by the Carriage by Air Act, 1932,(a) for giving effect to the said Convention:

And whereas by subsection (2) of section one of the said Act His Majesty may by Order in Council from time to time certify who are the High Contracting Parties to the said Convention, in respect of what territories they are respectively parties and to what extent they have availed themselves of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention:

And whereas since the date of the Carriage by Air (Parties Convention) Order, 1936, (b) the ratification of the said Convention by Belgium, the accession to the said Convention by His Majesty in respect of The Federated and The Unfederated Malay States, North Borneo, Sarawak, Tonga, and the Dominion of New Zealand and the accession to the said Convention by Hungary have been deposited or notified and it is therefore expedient that the said Order should be superseded by a more comprehensive Order

And whereas Burma and Aden became separated from India on the 1st day of April, 1937:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. It is hereby certified that the High Contracting Parties to the said Convention and the territories in respect of which they are respectively parties are as specified in Part I of the Schedule to this Order, and that the only High Contracting Party who has availed himself of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention is the High Contracting Party specified in Part II of the said Schedule, who has availed himself of those provisions to the extent specified in the said Part.
- 2. This Order supersedes the Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) Order, 1936, which is hereby revoked.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) Order, 1937.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF VIJAYA TILES, LIMITED.

The regulations contained in the table marked "C" in the Schedule to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861" shall apply with the following additions and alterations :-

After section 1-

(a) Shares may be registered in the name of a firm or partnership and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies in respect of shares registered in the name of the firm or partnership.

(b) Shares may be registered in the names of two or

more persons jointly.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, July 10, 1937, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated July 4, 1937.

Present: -Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. K. T. S. Gurusingha, Assistant Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. A. Kahaduwa; Mr. J. C. Cooper; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

- 1. The Minutes of the meeting held on June 12, 1937, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member were taken as read and confirmed.
- 2. Two petitions and a letter were presented by Mr. W. Dahanayaka and one petition by Mr. E. M. Karunaratna . These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:

(1) What school buildings or parts of school buildings within the Municipal limits of Galle have been assessed for rates? (2) Is the Chairman aware that the Supreme Court has held that term "School Building" used in section 115 (1) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, would apply only to such parts of a school building as are used as class rooms where the classes meet regularly for tuition or private study? (3) Is the Chairman aware that according to this interpretation some school halls and staff common rooms are rateable? (4) Will the Chairman please take steps to charge rates on such parts of school buildings, or, if he is not prepared to do so will be please obtain the opinion of the Auditor Charge rates of school buildings, or, if he is not prepared to do so, will he please obtain the opinion of the Auditor-General on this

The Chairman replied as follows:-

- (1) It is not possible to ascertain from the existing assessment list exactly what portions of the several school premises within the Municipal limits of Galle have been assessed for rates. (2) Yes, if the member is referring to the case of Dr. Coudert v. The Colombo Municipal Council reported in 8 New Law Reports at page 338. (3) School halls or staff common rooms may or may not come within the exempting proviso of section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. In every instance the question will have to be decided on the merits of each case. (4) The Government Valuer is aware what parts of school buildings should, and what parts should not, be rated for purposes of assessment; and as all properties in the town are now being reassessed by his Department I have no doubt that proper steps will be taken to ensure that such parts of school buildings as should be assessed for rates are so assessed.
- Pursuant to notice Mr. F. Magdon Ismail asked:—What steps have been taken regarding the improvement of the Small Esplanade in the Fort.

The Chairman replied as follows:—An estimate for the work was prepared and submitted to the Works Committee, but consideration was deferred until proper levels had been taken.

This has now been done, and the matter will be considered again by the Works Committee at its next meeting.

- Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:-
- (1) What was the infant mortality rate in each of the last five years, and in the first six months of this year? (2) (a) Is the Chairman aware that great inconvenience is felt by householders in some parts of the town as a result of restriction of the water supply during certain hours of the day? (b) What is the cause for this and what action does the Chairman propose to take over this matter?

The Chairman replied as follows:-

- (1) According to information obtained from the Registrar-General, the infant mortality rate per 1,000 births during the last 5 years was as follows:—1932—150; 1933—133; 1934—156; 1935—159; and 1936—140. The information in respect of the first six months of this year has not yet been obtained. (2) (a) I am aware that complaints about a deficiency in the water supply have been received from residents in the Fort. (b) A full report on the matter by the Municipal Engineer is tabled for the information of the members. The suggestion made in paragraph 5 thereof will be submitted to the Works Committee for consideration.
 - Pursuant to notice Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following questions:-
- (1) (a) What is the cause of the low pressure in the water main and pipes of the Galle Fort? (b) Has there been any manufacture of the valves at the main source at Hiyare or Bikke to reduce the outflow of water? (2) (a) Why were any manipulation of the valves at the main source at Hiyare or Bikke to reduce the outflow of water? (2) (a) Why were the water mains in the Fort not scraped as undertaken by the Municipal Engineer in April last? (b) Will the Chairman please cause the mains to be scraped at an early date? (3) Is the Chairman aware of the insanitary condition of the Havelock Place and China Garden road drains caused by the inflow of foul and offensive matter from the canal?

The Chairman replied as follows:-

- (1) (a) This is chiefly due to the water mains and pipes in the Fort being obstructed with growths of tubercles caused by the presence of organic matter in the water. (b) Yes, the opening of the 10-inch sluice valve feeding the town has been reduced from 7 inches to 6 inches. This was done only after the water level at the reservoir fell to 3 feet below spill level, with the object of avoiding a water shortage. (2) (a) Because the firm that submitted the lowest quotation for the supply of the pipes which are required when the old pipes are taken out, was unable to supply them till the end of last week, although the order was placed more than seven weeks ago. (b) The work of scraping the mains is now in hand. (3) I am aware that during high tide water from the canal overflows into all the drains leading into it and that this water carried considerable quantities of floating matter and rubbish which are frequently left deposited in the drains when the tide runs out. The drains are cleaned twice daily.
- 7. To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed on May 23, 1936, to submit an early report on the

Magdon Ismail moved as an amendment that the northern boundary of the proposed new ward 3 be Halls road instead of Talapitiya road. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded. Messrs. Wahab and Dahanayaka opposed. The amendment was then put to the meeting and declared lost—2 voting for and 8 against. Mr. Dahanayaka called for a division which resulted as follows:—For: Messrs. F. Magdon Ismail and A. C. Mohammedo. Against: The Chairman, and Messrs. J. E. Perera, Thomas Amarasuriya, E. M. Karunaratna, W. Dahanayaka, A. I. H. A. Wahab, J. C. Cooper, and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

Into this is placed a cross member whose section may be of an inverted U or any other preferred form. The side wall of the cup is then subjected to axial compression in such a way that the ends of the cross member gets firmly embedded therein.




