Schedule I to the Proclamation dated September 12, 1935, is hereby amended by the addition, under the heading "Colombo District", immediately after the definition of the limits of "Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Town", of the following definition of the limits of the towns of Kolonnawa and Kotte:

Kolonnawa town comprising the area within the following boundaries:

North: From a point on the eastern limit of the Colombo Municipality at the confluence of the Kittanpahuwa-ela with the Kelani-ganga south-eastwards, and eastwards along the left bank of the Kelaniganga as far as the centre of the railway bridge

over the Kelani-ganga.

East: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre of the railway line as far as the centre of the railway bridge over the Kittanpahuwa-ela, thence south-eastwards and south-wards along the centre of the said ela till it meets the Kolonnawa bund on the Angoda road, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the

Angoda road as far as the eastern limit of Cotatuwa village, thence southwards along the said limit to the north-eastern corner of lot M 2 in preliminary plan No. 4,785.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the northern limit of Kalapaluwawa village to the point where it meets the eastern limit of Yakbedda village, thence northwards and westwards along the eastern and northern limits of Yakbedda village to the eastern limit of the Colombo Municipality.

West: From the last mentioned point north-westwards and northwards along the eastern limit of the Colombo Municipality to the starting point of the northern limit of the Urban District Council area.

Kotte town comprising the area within the following houndaries :-

North: By the northern limit of Yakbedda village.

East: From the eastern extremity of the northern limit southwards along the western bank of the Kolonnawa-ela to the point where it meets the northern limit of the village of Madiwala, thence westwards along the northern limits of the villages of Madiwala and Mirihana to a point 3 chains east of the Kotte-Gangodawila road, thence southwards along the Kotte-Gangodawila road parallel to it and at a distance of 3 chains from it across the Kelani Valley Railway to a point 10 chains south of the junction of Kotte-Gangodawila road and Nugegoda-

South: From the last mentioned point a line drawn due west across the Kotte-Gangodawila road to meet Urban District Council, thence northwards and westwards along the eastern and northern limits of Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council until it meets Dehiwala canal.

West: By the eastern limit of the Municipality of Colombo.

REGULATIONS.

Short title and commencement.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Investigation of Accidents) Regulations, 1937, and shall come into force on the first day of April, 1937.

Application of regulations.

2. Except as otherwise hereinafter provided, these regulations shall apply to any accident arising out of or in the course of air navigation and occurring in or over Ceylon or the territorial waters adjacent thereto, and to any accident to British aircraft occurring elsewhere which would be likely in the absence of these regulations to remain uninvestigated.

Notification of accidents.

- (1) Where an accident to which these regulations apply occurs in or over Ceylon or the territorial waters adjacent thereto and involves the death of, or personal injury to, any person (whether such person was or was not carried in the aircraft concerned at the time of the accident) or serious structural damage to the aircraft concerned, or where any such accident so occurs and is believed on reasonable grounds to have been caused wholly or in part by the failure in the air of any part of the aircraft concerned, the pilot of the aircraft, or if the pilot is incapacitated by injury the person for the time being having control of the aircraft as owner or hirer, shall-
  - (a) send notice of the accident by telegram to the Registrar of Aircraft, and
  - (b) notify the nearest police officer or headman.
- (2) The notice required by paragraph (1) of this regulation to be sent to the Registrar of Aircraft shall be sent as soon as possible, and in every case within twenty-four hours, after the occurrence of the accident, and shall state-
  - (a) the nationality and the registration marks of the aircraft;
  - (b) the names of the owner and of the hirer (if any) of the aircraft;

(c) the name of the pilot of the aircraft;

- (d) the place where the accident took place;
- (e) the day on which and the time at which the accident took place;

(f) the nature of the accident; and

(g) whether death or personal injury was caused by the accident, and, if death or personal injury was so caused, to whom it was caused.

An aircraft which has sustained serious structural damage in an accident not to be removed or interfered with.

4. Where an accident to which these regulations apply occurs in or over Ceylon or the territorial waters adjacent thereto and involves serious structural damage to the aircraft concerned, the aircraft shall not, except under the authority of the Governor, be removed or otherwise interfered with until the expiration of a period of three days from the day on which notice was sent to the Registrar of Aircraft under the last preceding regulation, or, in any case in which the Governor directs that the aircraft shall not be removed or otherwise interfered with until the expiration of any longer period, until the expiration of such longer period:

Proviso I.

Provided that the aircraft or any part thereof may be removed or interfered with so far as is necessary for the purpose of extricating any person or animal involved in the accident, of removing any mails carried by the aircraft, of preventing destruction by fire or other cause, or of preventing the creation or continuance of any danger or obstruction to the public:

Proviso II.

Provided also that goods or passengers' baggage may be removed from the aircraft under the supervision of a police officer or headman, but, in the case of an aircraft which has last come from a place outside Ceylon, shall not be removed from the vicinity of the aircraft except on clearance by, and with the consent of, an officer of customs:

Provided further that, where an aircraft is wrecked on water, the aircraft or any part or contents thereof may be removed to such extent as is necessary for bringing it or them to a place of safety.

Proviso III.

5. Where an accident to which these regulations apply occurs in or over Ceylon or the territorial waters adjacent thereto and involves serious structural damage to the aircraft concerned, the Governor may authorize any person, for the purposes of any investigation under these regulations and so far as may be necessary for the said purposes, to take measures for the preservation of the aircraft and to have access to and to examine, remove, or otherwise deal with the aircraft.

Power of Governor to authorize any person to do acts in Selation to an aircraft to which an accident has occurred.

6. (1) In the case of any accident to which these regulations apply, a person generally or specially appointed by the Governor for the purpose (in these regulations referred to as an "inspector") may, whether such accident is or is not an accident of which notice is required to be given under these regulations, hold a preliminary investigation of such accident.

Preliminary investigation of accidents.

- (2) A preliminary investigation under this regulation shall be conducted in such manner that, if a charge is made or is likely to be made against any person, that person shall have an opportunity of being present at the preliminary investigation and of making any statement or giving any evidence which he may desire to make or to give, and of producing any witness whom he may desire to produce; and the inspector shall record the statement or evidence of such person and the evidence of any mitness so produced. witness so produced.
- (3) For the purpose of a preliminary investigation under this regulation the inspector making it shall have power
  - (a) by summons under his hand to require the attendance of any person who is the owner, hirer, or one of the owners or hirers, of any aircraft concerned in the accident, or who is in the employment of any such owner or hirer, and whom he thinks fit to call before him and to examine, and to require answers or returns to such inquiries as he thinks fit to make from any such person;

    (b) to require any such person as aforesaid to make and sign a declaration of the truth of the statements made by him upon examination;

    (c) to require the production of all books, papers, and documents which he considers material to the preliminary investigation and which are in the possession or control of any owner or hirer of any aircraft concerned in the accident:

of any owner or hirer of any aircraft concerned in the accident;

(d) to have access to and to examine any aircraft concerned in the accident and the place where the accident occurred.

- (4) At the conclusion of a preliminary investigation under this regulation, the inspector by whom it has been made shall submit a report thereon to the Governor, and such report may include a recommendation for the cancellation, suspension, or endorsement of any licence or certificate granted in Ceylon to any person concerned in the accident, or the withdrawal or suspension of any validation conferred in Ceylon of any licence or certificate granted to any such person by a duly competent authority elsewhere.
- (5) A person served with any summons or requisition issued by an inspector making a preliminary investigation under this regulation, shall not without reasonable excuse (proof whereof shall lie on him) fail to comply with such summons or requisition.
- 7. The Governor may, if he thinks fit, order that a formal investigation be held of the circumstances of any accident to which these regulations apply, whether a preliminary investigation of such accident has or has not been made under the last preceding regulation, and with respect to every such formal investigation the following provisions shall have effect:—

(a) The Governor shall appoint a competent person (in these regulations referred to as an "inquirer") to hold the formal investigation, and may appoint a person or persons possessing legal, aeronautical, engineering, or other special knowledge to be assessor or assessors, as the case may be, to the inquirer.

(b) The inquirer shall hold the formal investigation in public, in such manner and under such conditions as he thinks most effectual for ascertaining the causes and circumstances of the accident and enabling him to make the report hereinafter

mentioned.

(c) The inquirer shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Governor under section 1 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1872, intituled "An Ordinance to empower Commissioners, appointed by the Governor to inquire into any matter referred to them for inquiry, to hear evidence thereon ", by the issue of a commission under the seal of the Island of Ceylon, to inquire into and report upon the accident, and the provisions of the

or Ceylon, to inquire into and report upon the accident, and the provisions of the said Ordinance shall apply accordingly.

(d) For the purpose of the formal investigation the inquirer may enter and inspect, or authorize any person on his behalf to enter and inspect, any place or building the inspection of which appears to him to be necessary for the said purpose.

(e) Every assessor shall have the same powers of entry and inspection as the inquirer.

(f) Where under this regulation a formal investigation is ordered to be held of any accident

a preliminary investigation of which has already been made under the last preceding regulation, the inspector upon whose report such formal investigation has been ordered to be held shall superintend the management of the case on behalf of the

Governor, and shall superintend the management of the case on behalf of the Governor, and shall render to the inquirer such assistance as is in his power.

(g) The formal investigation shall be conducted in such manner that, if a charge is made or is likely to be made against any person, that person shall have an opportunity of being present and of making any statement or giving any evidence which he may desire to make or to give, and of producing any witness whom he may desire to produce; and the inquirer shall record the statement or evidence of such person and the evidence of any witness so produced.

(b) The inquirer shall make a report to the Governor, stating his findings in regard to the

(h) The inquirer shall make a report to the Governor stating his findings in regard to the cause of the accident and to the circumstances thereof, and shall add thereto any observations and recommendations which he thinks fit to make with a view to the observations and recommendations which he thinks fit to make with a view to the preservation of life and to the prevention of similar accidents in future; and such recommendations may include a recommendation for the cancellation, suspension, or endorsement of any licence or certificate granted in Ceylon to any person concerned in the accident, or the withdrawal or suspension of any validation conferred in Ceylon of any licence or certificate granted to any such person by a duly competent authority elsewhere.

(i) Where an assessor or assessors has or have been appointed, the assessor, or each

assessor, as the case may be, shall either sign the report with or without reservations, which shall be stated in writing, or state in writing his dissent from the report and his reasons for such dissent; and every such statement of a reservation or of dissent

and reasons for dissent shall be sent to the Governor with the report.

8. (1) Where a report submitted by an inspector under regulation 6, or by an inquirer under regulation 7, includes a recommendation for the cancellation, suspension, or endorsement of any licence or certificate granted in Ceylon to any person concerned in the accident or the withdrawal or suspension of any validation conferred in Ceylon of any licence or certificate granted to any such person by a duly competent authority elsewhere, and the recommendation is approved by the Governor with or without modification or variation, the Governor may require-

(a) the Registrar of Aircraft to cancel, suspend, or endorse such licence or certificate or

to withdraw or suspend such validation, in accordance with the recommendation or the modification or variation thereof approved by the Governor; and

(b) the holder or other person having the possession or custody of the licence or certificate to surrender the licence or certificate to the Registrar of Aircraft for the purpose of being dealt with accordingly.

- (2) Every person who is required to produce any licence or certificate for the purpose of being dealt with under paragraph (1) shall comply with such requirement within a reasonable time.
- 9. No person shall voluntarily obstruct or impede any inquirer, assessor, inspector, or other person acting under the authority of the Governor in the exercise or performance of any power or duty conferred or imposed upon such inquirer, assessor, inspector, or other person by these regulations:
- 10. Any power vested in the Governor by these regulations, other than the power to appoint inspectors or inquirers thereunder, may be exercised by any person authorized in that behalf by the Governor.
- 11. (1) Nothing in these regulations shall limit the powers of any authority under sections 530 to 537 inclusive of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or under any enactment, including the Air Navigation Act, 1920, amending those sections.
- (2) Nothing in these regulations shall apply to aircraft belonging to or exclusively employed in the service of His Majesty.
- 12. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires "serious structural damage",
- in relation to an aircraft, means-
  - (a) the telescoping or breaking apart of the fuselage; or

(b) the breaking of a main spar; or (c) the breaking of any part of the controls; or

(d) damage by fire to any part of the aircraft.

    - Q.—Is an inquiry being held in the Kirillapone quarry by two Members of the Works Committee? A.—No.
       Q.—Has the Commissioner delegated his powers to these Members to do so? A.—Does not arise.

Mr. M. L. M. Royal asked a supplementary question whether two Members of the Committee were permitted to visit the place and make an informal inquiry and if so whether it was in accordance with the circular recently issued to Members

The Mayor replied that he did not permit any Member to visit the quarry and that no Member had yet visited the quarry.

4. In the absence of Dr. S. D. Fernando, the Mayor answered the following questions which stood in his name:-

The Mayor stated that it was not a fact that the salary proposed had been worked out on the basis of the salaries paid to the Commissioners of Bombay and Madras Corporations. This information had been collected after the Council fixed the salary and quoted for purposes of comparison. The revenue of the Bombay Corporation was just over twice the revenue of the Colombo Municipality. The salary of the former Chairmen was fixed by the Governor at Rs. 2,000 a month with no increments to whatever class of the Civil Service he belonged. The salary now proposed for the Commissioner was actually Rs. 1,230 less than the salary and allowances paid on account of the former Chairmen. Under the new Council the Commissioner would be burdened with more orders and he would have very much work to do. He would practically he doing the same kind of work as the former Chairmen. In the case of the Indian Corporations the would practically be doing the same kind of work as the former Chairmen. In the case of the Indian Corporations the salary of the Commissioners was fixed by the Corporations and then a Civil Servant on that scale was seconded. In arriving at the salary proposed he did not at all consider the question of the salaries of the Indian Commissioners. He was solely guided by the salary drawn by a First Class Civil Servant, the type of man to be attracted, &c. For the next ten years he did not think that there would be any Ceylonese Civil Servant on the scale for new entrants who would have gained sufficient administrative experience available to the Council as its Commissioner. With regard to the delegation of powers to the Commissioner several ratepayers and State Councillors, including Ministers had informed him that the action taken by the Council had been in accordance with the intentions of the new Constitution.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal stated that it was not correct to say that the salary proposed was Rs. 1,280 less than the

#### By-law.

The by-law for the control of vehicular traffic by light signals, published by Proclamation dated April 5, 1937, in Gazette No. 8,282 of April 9, 1937, is hereby amended by the addition at the end of that by-law, of the following:-

- "driver" in the case of a bicycle or tricycle, whether propelled by mechanical power or otherwise, means the rider thereof; in the case of a hand-cart or push-cart, the person drawing or pushing the cart; and in the case of a jinricksha, the person drawing the jinricksha"
- "vehicle" means any artificial contrivance, whether propelled by mechanical power or otherwise, used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on land".




