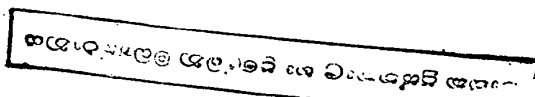

GOD SAVE THE KING.

RULE.

The Colombo Port Rules, 1936, published in *Gazette* No. 8,251 of October 16, 1936, are hereby amended by the insertion, immediately after rule 44, of the following new rule 44A :—

44A. No person shall smoke, or strike a match or light a fire by any other means, in the vicinity of any open hatchway on board any vessel in the Harbour :

Provided, however, that nothing in this rule shall be deemed to prohibit the lighting of a fire in a fireplace specially constructed for the purpose of cooking food on any lighter which is not carrying any explosive, inflammable or dangerous substance.

THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,
No. 13 OF 1896.

Regulations for the Kataragama Imaha Kachchi Festival.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896 entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages", and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Imaha Kachchi Festival commencing in November, 1937.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations "camp area" includes—
 - (a) the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Dewala at Kataragama; and
 - (b) the area within a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama.
2. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Imaha Kachchi Festival, 1937, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to three days, namely, November 16 to 18 inclusive.
 - (b) No pilgrim shall arrive before November 16, or stay after November 18 in the camp area.
3. The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.
4. (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—
 - (a) to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water for drinking and for natural offices;
 - (b) to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
 - (c) to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
 - (d) to regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
 - (e) to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

(2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).

5. No person shall case himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by or with the approval of the Government Agent.

6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Government Agent.

7. No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer.

8. No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits.

9. Every permit issued under regulation 8 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.

10. No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

11. (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.

(2) No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

(3) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Inspector to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

12. (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(2) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purposes of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp.

16. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

FUGITIVE CRIMINAL

THE HUNGARY (EXTRADITION) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1937.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 29th day of July, 1937.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1935, (a) it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 3rd day of December, 1873, between Her Late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals which Treaty was amended by a Declaration signed on the 26th day of June, 1901:

And whereas the said Treaty and Declaration were duly ratified (b):

And whereas a further Treaty was signed on the 18th day of September, 1936, between His former Majesty King Edward VIII and His Serene Highness the Regent of the Kingdom of Hungary, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

TREATY BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY IN RESPECT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM AND HIS SERENE HIGHNESS THE REGENT OF HUNGARY, SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE TREATY OF DECEMBER 3, 1873, REGARDING EXTRADITION.

Budapest, September 18, 1936.

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India and His Serene Highness the Regent of the Kingdom of Hungary, desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Treaty to this end and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Sir Geoffrey George Knox, K.C.M.G., His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Budapest;

His Serene Highness the Regent of the Kingdom of Hungary:

M. Kálmán Kánya de Kánya, Royal Hungarian Minister for Foreign Affairs,

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

Article 2 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Vienna on the 3rd December, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

“Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any act, not being one in respect of which there is an obligation to grant extradition under the preceding provisions of this Article, but which is a crime or offence which is punishable, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, by not less than two years' imprisonment, and for which, according to the said laws, the grant may be made.”

ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Hungary on the one hand and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King may accede to the present Treaty in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Budapest. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Hungary on the one hand, and, on the other, the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Treaty shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Treaty shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and have affixed thereto their seals.

And whereas His Majesty has ratified the said Treaty in respect of, and the said Treaty thereby extends to, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, and British Colonies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 13th day of October, 1937, the said Acts shall apply in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, and British Colonies in the case of Hungary under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, as modified by the Declaration of the 26th June, 1901, and by the Treaty of the 18th September, 1936.

This Order may be cited as the Hungary (Extradition) Order in Council, 1937.

3. cikk.

Attól a naptól kezdve, amicon ez a közlés hatályossá válik, az 1. cikkben megállapított módosítást a kiadási eljárásban alkalmazni kell egyrészl Magyarországra, másrészl az Államközösség illeto Tagjának területe között.

A Brit Államközösség valamelyik Tagja részéről e cikk első bekezdése értelmében tett közlés vonatkozhatik bármely olyan területre, amelynek tekintetében O Felsőge a Nemzetek Szövetsége részéről megbízást fogadott el és amely megbízást az illeto Tagjának gyakorolja.

4. cikk.

A jelen Szerződés megerosítésre szorul. A megerosito okiratokat Londonban, mihelyt lehetséges, ki kell cserélni.

5. cikk.

A jelen Szerződés a megerosito okiratok kicserelését követő három hónap mulva lép hatályba és mindaddig érvényben marad, amig az 1873. évi december hó 3-án kelt Kiadatási Szerződés.

BY-LAWS.

1. No person shall, within the administrative limits of this Council, by operating or causing or permitting any other person to operate any gramophone, wireless loud-speaker, amplifier or other similar instrument, produce or

reproduce or cause to be produced or reproduced any sound which by reason of its volume or its repetition or its continuous nature, causes a nuisance to the occupants of premises in the neighbourhood.

2. Every contravention of the foregoing by-law shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees:

Provided, however, that no proceedings shall be instituted in respect of any such contravention against any person operating or causing or permitting any other person to operate any instrument as aforesaid in any place other than a street, public place, shop or place of business, or a place which adjoins any street or public place and to which the members of the public are admitted, unless—

- (a) complaint of the nuisance is made to the Chairman in writing by not less than three householders of the neighbourhood affected by the nuisance, and
- (b) written notice is served on that person by the Chairman setting out the nature of the complaints received and requiring that person to abate the nuisance forthwith or within a specified period, and
- (c) that person fails or refuses to comply with such notice forthwith, on receipt thereof or within the period specified therein, as the case may be.

BY-LAWS.

I.—Definitions.

In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"warehouse" means any building used mainly for the storing of goods or wares by merchants or traders, but does not include a shop, boutique, or other place used mainly for the sale of goods or wares by retail;

"workshop" means any building where any work of making, altering, ornamenting, finishing, or repairing articles or goods is carried on by manual labour for the purposes of trade;

"factory" means any workshop where mechanical power of any kind is used.

II.—Residential Areas.

The area within the administrative limits of this Council defined in Schedule I. hereto is hereby declared to be a "residential area."

III.—New Buildings in Residential Areas.

1. (1) From and after the date on which these by-laws come into force no new building shall be erected within a residential area, except with the written permission of the Chairman of this Council, for the purpose of being used as a factory, workshop, or warehouse or as a boutique or shop or as tenements, or as a stable, gala for sheep or goats, or cattle pen, or as a pig sty.

(2) Such permission may be refused or withheld by the Chairman unless or until the following conditions are fulfilled, namely :—

- (a) that the site selected for such building is not in close proximity to existing residential buildings;
- (b) that the site selected is not situated in such a prominent place as to make the erection of the building likely to mar the amenities of the residential area;
- (c) in the case of a workshop, that the business or industry for which it is to be used is not likely to create any kind of nuisance whatsoever;
- (d) in the case of a shop or boutique, that the site selected will serve an area really in need of such conveniences, and that the design of the building will harmonize with the surroundings.

2. It shall be lawful for the Chairman by notice in writing to direct that an air space of not less than 7½ feet be provided between each side of any new building and the boundary on that side, irrespective of the question whether there are windows in the wall on that side of the building.

IV.—Existing Buildings in Residential Areas.

1. Within a residential area, except with the written permission of the Chairman—

- (1) no building used for residential purposes at the date on which these by-laws come into force, shall be used for any other purpose whatsoever;
- (2) no building used at that date for the purpose of any one of the following, namely, a workshop, warehouse, boutique, shop, tenement, stable, gala, or pen for sheep or goats, or cattle, or pig sty shall be used for any other of the said purposes; and
- (3) no building shall be used for any of the purposes set out in the foregoing paragraph of this by-law, if at that date it was not in actual use for that purpose.

2. (1) Within a residential area no building used as a factory, workshop, or warehouse, at the date on which these by-laws come into force shall be enlarged, extended, or added to except with the written permission of the Chairman.

(2) Such permission shall be refused by the Chairman—

- (a) in any case in which the building is used for the purposes of any of the dangerous or offensive trades enumerated in Schedule II. hereto; and
- (b) in any case where the boundaries of the premises on which the building stands have not been registered in the books of the Council within six months of the date on which these by-laws come into force.

3. Within a residential area no building shall be used for the purposes of any of the dangerous or offensive trades enumerated in Schedule II. unless it can be shown to have been in use for such purposes on the date on which these by-laws come into force.

V.—Penalties.

The chief occupier of any building who contravenes any of the provisions of the foregoing by-laws or any owner or occupier who fails to comply with any written notice or directions given by the Chairman thereunder, shall be guilty of an offence in respect of each day during which such contravention or non-compliance continues, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for each such offence.

VI.—*Repeal.*

The by-laws made by the Board of Improvement, Nuwara Eliya, published in *Gazette* No. 7,916 of April 1, 1932, and continuing in force by virtue of the provisions of section 247 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, are hereby rescinded.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, September 11, 1937, at 9 a.m., pursuant to notice dated September 6, 1937.**

Present :—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. Kabaduwa; Mr. G. Ross Bell; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. C. Cooper; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of August 13, 1937, were amended as regards item 15 (b) (9) by the deletion therefrom of the words "and lot 1 in P. P. A 393". The Minutes, as amended, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Three petitions were presented by Mr. W. Dahanayaka. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:—(1) (a) Is the Chairman aware that reports of Executive Committees of the State Council leak out to the Press, but that the State Council has not objected to such publication? (b) Does not the Chairman think that such publications are the result of legitimate journalistic enterprise, and that it would be futile for the Chairman to attempt to dictate to the Press in any way? (c) Will the Chairman please table copies of letters he wrote to the Editor of the "Ceylon Observer" and the "Ceylon Daily News" and the replies he received from the Editors? (d) Did the Chairman at any time write down a minute to the effect that if the replies of the Editors proved unsatisfactory he would have to consider the question of not sending advertisements to the "Ceylon Observer" the "Ceylon Daily News" and the "Dinamina"? (e) Will the Chairman please withdraw any minute to that effect? (f) Is the Chairman aware that the "Times of Ceylon" of August 11 and of August 14 published extracts of the Accountants' report to the Finance Committee? (g) Has the Chairman written to the Editor of the "Times of Ceylon" just as he wrote to the other two Editors? (h) If not, why not?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) No. (b) As the first part of this question involves an expression of opinion I am not prepared to answer it. As regards the second part, there is no question of dictating to the Press, but I consider that it is the Chairman's duty to take such action as is possible to prevent the publication of unauthorized reports. (c) The letters referred to are tabled. (d) No reference was made to the "Dinamina". My minute was intended for the Office only and was subject to reconsideration as circumstances demanded. It will be helpful to me in the maintenance of discipline in this Office if the member would let me know the source of his information. (e) No. (f) Yes. (g) No. (h) Because it was not necessary.

Arising out of these replies Mr. Dahanayaka asked the following supplemental question:—What is the exact wording of the Chairman's Minute that refers to the advertisements in the "Ceylon Observer" and the "Ceylon Daily News"? On the Chairman stating that he wanted notice of this question Mr. Dahanayaka gave notice accordingly for the next meeting of the Council. Mr. Dahanayaka also gave notice of the following motion on the same subject:—That all papers connected with the recent publication in the "Ceylon Daily News" and the "Ceylon Observer" of certain Municipal reports be tabled.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman please make a statement regarding the probable cause of the low level of water in the Hiyare Reservoir? (2) What was the capacity of the Reservoir at the time of its construction and what was the daily consumption of water computed at? (3) What was the daily consumption of water when the excessive outflow was discovered? (4) What is the present rate of consumption of water per person as compared to the original computation? (5) Even if the Reservoir gets filled by the North-East Monsoon, will the supply be normally sufficient to meet the requirements during the dry months of February, March, and April? Will it not be advisable to control and restrict the supply of water as from now, during most part of the night and for a few hours during the day? (6) Is the excessive loss of water due to waste or to a leak in the Reservoir or pipe line? What steps does the Chairman propose to take to explore the situation and remedy the defect?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The low level of water in the Hiyare Reservoir at the present time is due to the excessive draw off of water from the Reservoir resulting from an excessive consumption of water in the town. (2) The capacity of the Reservoir at the time of its construction was 126,000,000 gallons. The daily consumption of water was computed at 300,000 gallons. (3) The daily consumption of water was found, from approximate calculations, to be in the region of 1,388,000 gallons. (4) The present rate of consumption of water per person has been found, from the approximate calculations, to be in the region of 69 gallons. The original computation was 15 gallons. (5) If the Reservoir gets filled by the North-East Monsoon the supply will be normally sufficient to meet the requirements of the ensuing dry months. It is nevertheless advisable to cut off the water in the night, as is being done now, as a safety measure. (6) This excessive draw off of water from the Reservoir is in all probability due to waste and invisible leakages from the mains and house services. The steps proposed to be taken to explore the situation and remedy the defects are:—(i.) the installation of a meter system of waste detection and (ii.) the carrying out of a leak detection survey if found necessary by (i.)

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:—(1) (a) Is the by-law with regard to the affixing of notices in public places in operation now? (b) How many public notice boards are maintained by the Council? (c) Will the Chairman please see that the number of public notice boards is considerably increased, particularly because auctioneers complain that the present number is inadequate? (2) (a) What precisely are the duties of the Assistant Chairman? (b) On what ground is the Assistant Chairman's presence at meetings justified? (3) (a) Will the Chairman please give a detailed statement of all irregularities that the Council's Accountant has detected? (b) In what items does the Accountant call for a reduction of expenditure? (4) (a) How much was spent on grass for cattle in 1936? (b) For how many cattle was this amount spent? (5) What action has been taken on the complaints outlined in the petition presented by me at the last General Meeting from a large number of cattle owners? (6) (a) Did not the Chairman at the Special General Meeting, held on September 3, state that the Engineer of the Nawalapitiya Urban District Council would be a probable applicant for the post of Municipal Engineer? (b) Is it correct to presume that some one interested in the Engineer of the Nawalapitiya Urban District Council has spoken to the Chairman about him? (c) If so, is not this applicant already disqualified?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) Yes; (b) Seven; (c) I will consult the Works Committee as to the need for additional boards and the sites on which they should be erected. (2) (a) Section 50 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 requires that "the Assistant Chairman shall assist the Chairman in his office." The nature of the assistance required is a matter which should be left to the discretion of the Chairman; (b) In order that he may assist the Chairman. (3) (a) This is a matter which falls within Office administration for which the Chairman is responsible. Any irregularities brought to my notice by the Accountant or any other officer will receive attention; (b) The Accountant has not suggested a reduction of expenditure in any items apart from what he has recommended in his report on the Office Collection System. (4) (a)

Rs. 1,210.33 for cattle and goats; (b) For 2,713 head of cattle and 1,224 goats. (5) The matter has been considered, and a copy of the reply sent to the petitioners is tabled. (6) (a) Yes, as I understand that he had been an applicant for the post of Works Engineer, Kandy; (b) No; (c) This question does not arise.

With regard to 23 other questions of Mr. Dahanayaka relating to premises No. 11, Dangedera, the Chairman stated that the replies were not ready.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved:—(1) That the work of the Anti-plague Clayton Gang and the rat trapping be directed exclusively to the Bazaar area where the *Cheopsis* flea has been found till the conditions improve. Mr. W. Dahanayake seconded. After some discussion on the wording of the motion it was agreed, with the consent of the mover, that the motion should be amended to read as follows:—“That the work of the Anti-plague Gang and the rat trapping be directed more intensively to the areas where the *cheopsis* flea has been found.” The motion, as amended, was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(2) That the defective and damaged drains in the Bazaar area be thoroughly reconditioned, to prevent rats making their burrows and holes in them, and that, if necessary, an estimate be made for the work, to be submitted to Council without delay. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded—Carried unanimously.

(3) That an estimate be called for for the construction of a raised footpath round the esplanade, close to the wire fence, for the safety of the people using the road. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded, and Messrs. E. M. Karunaratna and F. Magdon Ismail supported the motion, which was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(4) That a further sum of Rs. 250 be voted for the improvement of the Victoria Park. With the permission of Council the motion was amended by substituting “Rs. 500” for “Rs. 250”. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded—Carried unanimously.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) That the Superintendent of the Electricity Department be asked to submit a revised scale of rates for temporary electric lighting. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded—Carried unanimously.

(2) That the notice prohibiting the sale or exposure for sale of articles in or upon public grounds within the Municipal limits of Galle be withdrawn, inasmuch as such prohibition has taken the bread out of the mouths of over 150 very poor families. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna formally seconded.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee—

After discussion Council in Committee recommended (a) that the Chairman be requested to instruct the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, to suspend action under the notice for the present; and (b) that the matter be referred to the four Standing Committees for consideration.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted—Carried.

The mover then, with the leave of Council, withdrew his motion.

(3) That provision be made in next year's budget for the extension as far as possible, of the new roads through Heenpendola and Galketiya. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded. After discussion the mover, with the permission of Council, amended the motion to read as follows:—“That the extension of the new roads through Heenpendola and Galketiya be considered with the Budget for 1938. The motion, as amended, was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

8. To consider further the report of the Special Committee appointed on May 23, 1936, to submit an early report on the amendments required in Ordinance No. 60 of 1935, to make it applicable to the Galle Municipal Council:—With regard to recommendations (2) (a) dealing with the qualifications of voters, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya moved, as an amendment to the Chairman's motion which was deferred from the last meeting, that the recommendations made by the Colombo Municipal Council be adopted with the following alterations, viz., (1) occupation of qualifying property at a monthly rental of not less than Rs. 4 or ownership of qualifying property of an annual value of not less than Rs. 48; and (2) as an alternative qualification the receipt of a monthly income of not less than Rs. 50. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded. The Chairman accepted the amendment. Mr. W. Dahanayaka opposed the amendment. The amendment was then put to the meeting and carried by 10 votes to 1. Mr. Dahanayaka called for a division which resulted as follows:—*For*:—The Chairman, Messrs. J. E. Perera, F. Magdon Ismail, Thomas Amarasuriya, E. M. Karunaratna, A. C. Mohammedo, A. Kahaduwa, C. E. de Vos, J. C. Cooper, and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan. *Against*:—Mr. W. Dahanayaka.—Recommendation (a) (b) dealing with the qualifications of Councillors was deferred for consideration at a later meeting.

9. Considered the following extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects on July 3, 1937:—“Considered further the draft by-laws on dairies in terms of letter No. B 1311 of January 22, 1937, from the Commissioner of Local Government.—Recommended that the draft by-laws as further amended in accordance with the suggestions made by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services be approved.”—Resolved, Mr. Dahanayako dissenting, that the above recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

10. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of August 24, 1937:—*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Wards 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 1,500 under head E.—12—Materials for service mains.—Recommended.

(4) Considered an application from Mrs. Ludowyk, widow of the late Mr. G. E. Ludowyk, Conservancy Manager, for the payment of a pension and gratuity.—Recommended, under Rule 23 of the Municipal Pension Minute, the grant of a Pension to the widow of Rs. 150 per annum with effect from September 1, 1937, as the Committee is of opinion, in view of the report of the Medical Officer of Health, that the illness of which Mr. Ludowyk died was specifically attributable to the nature of his duties.

(5) Considered the question of charging fees for the services of the Municipal Midwives.—Recommended that a fee of Rs. 5 per case be charged for the services of the Municipal Midwives in cases where the patient or the husband is in receipt of an income of Rs. 60 per mensem or over.

(6) Considered Audit query No. 164 I.M. of August 12, 1937, relating to the expenditure of Rs. 2.95 incurred in excess of the sum of Rs. 60 voted by the Council for the preparation of the Historical map of Galle Fort.—Recommended that the excess expenditure of Rs. 2.95 be sanctioned.

(7) Considered the question as to what amount should be paid as compensation for the acquisition of land in connection with the proposed new road through Bope.—Recommended the payment of a sum not exceeding Rs. 677.12.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of September 3, 1937:—*

(2) To approve the payment of a sum of Rs. 46 as compensation for the acquisition of land in connection with the extension of the electric main along Donald Jansz road.—Recommended that the payment be approved.

(3) Temporary allowance for Clerical work in connection with the collection of conservancy fees.—Recommended that the temporary allowance of Rs. 10 per mensem sanctioned by the Council on August 13, 1937, be paid to Mr. K. Warusawitharana, Clerk and Distraining Officer for the Fort Ward, with effect from September 1, 1937.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(c) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of September 1, 1937:—*

(2) Considered the petition of L. O. E. de Silva and other stall holders of the Fruit Market with regard to the conditions of lease of the Fruit Market Stalls for the year 1938.—Recommended (1) that for the period February to December, 1938, the present stall holders be allowed the lease of the stalls which they now hold subject to the rents being increased

and the lease being so arranged that the holder of two stalls will have them adjoining; (2) that the following resolutions passed by the Council on June 12, 1937, be adhered to, viz., (a) that the Anti-plague Regulations be enforced from January 1938, in respect of all stalls in which grain is kept and sold; and (b) that no stall holder be allowed to keep any other commodities in any stall in which more than five bags of grain or forage mixture are stored; (3) that the rents of the stalls for 1938 be as follows:—Rs. 20 per mensem for each of the stalls bearing Nos. 1, 2, 21, and 22, and Rs. 12·50 per mensem for each of the remaining stalls; (4) that if the present stall holders are not willing to pay the increased rents, the stalls be put up for sale by public auction; and (5) that a stall holder be allowed to store up to 15 bags of grain in his stall provided that no other commodities are kept and sold in the same stall.

(3) Considered the question of appointing a supervising Medical Officer for Midwives in terms of Regulation 2 (1) of the Midwives Regulations published in *Government Gazette* of April 26, 1929.—Recommended that the Council's Medical Officer of Health be appointed the local Supervising Officer for the Galle Municipal area in terms of Regulation 2 (1) of the Midwives Regulations published in the *Gazette* of April 26, 1929.

(4) Considered Mr. Dahanayaka's motion of August 13, 1937, viz., "That two more qualified midwives be appointed as the present service does not extend to Ward 5 and parts of Wards 7 and 4.—Recommended that another qualified and registered midwife be appointed temporarily from January 1, 1938, on a salary of Rs. 20 per mensem plus a fee of Rs. 2 for each delivery conducted by her.

Resolution.

With regard to item (2) it was resolved by 10 votes to 1 that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted, Mr. Dahanayaka being against as he was not in favour of recommendations 2 (b) and (5).

With regard to item (4) it was resolved by 10 votes to 1 that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted, Mr. Dahanayaka being opposed to it as he was in favour of the appointment of two additional midwives.

The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to item (3) was adopted.

(d) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of September 1, 1937:—

(2) Considered the following applications for water service or for extensions of water service:—(1) 97A, Elliott road.—Recommended that the application be refused; (2) 272A, Richmond Hill road.—Recommended that the extension applied for be refused; (3) 284, Kaluwella.—Recommended that the application be refused; (4) 34, Church street.—Recommended that the extension applied for be refused; (5) 12, Chando street.—Recommended that the extension applied for be allowed as the supply is controlled by meter and paid for; (4) To sanction the use of "Asano" brand of Cement for works of a certain nature.—Recommended that the purchase of "Asano" brand of cement for works of a certain nature be sanctioned.

(5) Considered the question of erecting a Street Island at the junction of Esplanade road and the Colombo-Galle road opposite the new bus stand.—Recommended that the matter be considered with the budget for 1938.

(7) Considered a petition from D. S. Fernando asking for compensation for the loss sustained by him as contractor for the Gangarama Bridge.—Recommended that the contractor be informed that the Council regrets that no further payment can be made to him beyond the extra sum of Rs. 340 which has already been allowed.

(8) Construction of side drains along the northern side of Kandewatta road from the culvert near the Tamil School to the Railway crossing.—Recommended that the original scheme be adhered to and that the lowest tender received, viz., Rs. 2,771 by R. B. de Silva be accepted.

Resolution.

With regard to item (4) it was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted with the addition of the words "during the year 1936" after the word "nature".

With regard to item (7) Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 8 against. The recommendation of the Standing Committee was then put to the meeting and adopted, Mr. Dahanayaka being against.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

11. To reconsider the second part of recommendation 5 of the Special Committee appointed to inquire into the system of work prevailing at the Fish Auction Shed in view of the protests made by the owners of the fish.—Resolved (1) that the deal wood boxes supplied by the Council be utilized only for weighing small mixed fish which is brought to the Auction Shed in cartloads; (2) that in other cases the fish be weighed in the usual boxes or baskets in which it is brought, making an allowance for the weight of the box or basket; and (3) that this procedure be sanctioned as from September 1, 1937.

12. With the permission of the Council the Chairman moved:—That in view of the great increase of typewriting and other work in connection with Council and Committee Meetings, an additional typist-clerk be employed from October 1, 1937, on an initial salary of Rs. 40 per mensem which may be increased to Rs. 60 if the selected candidate has a knowledge of Shorthand.—Carried.

13. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, October 16, 1937, at 9 A.M.

14. The following documents were laid on the table:—

- (1) Letter No. E 608 dated August 23, 1937, from the Commissioner of Local Government regarding the request made by the Council for the services of the Government Town Planner.
- (2) Letter No. C. W. 26/37 dated August 30, 1937, from the Secretary to the Hon. the Minister for Communications and Works regarding the proposed approach road to the Richmond Hill Railway station.
- (3) Letter No. C 1266 dated September 2, 1937, from the Commissioner of Local Government regarding the Council's application for a Government Grant towards the cost of erecting rat proof granaries.
- (4) Statement of receipts and disbursements to end of August, 1937.
- (5) Progress report of works done on estimates during August 1937.
- (6) Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on Carriages plying for hire during August 1937.
- (7) Report of the Superintendent of the Electricity Department for August 1937.
- (8) Diaries of (a) the Medical Officer of Health, (b) the Municipal Engineer, (c) the Inspector of Works, and (d) the Manager, Health Department.

15. In connection with item 10 (c) (4) of the Minutes Mr. W. Dahanayaka at the General Meeting held on October 21, 1937, submitted in terms of By-law 26, Chapter 2, the following dissent from the opinion of the majority of the Council:—

"The Council resolved that one new midwife should be appointed in 1938. I am of opinion that the number should be two.

"The present service of Municipal midwives does not extend to Ward 5 and parts of Wards 4 and 7. These portions of the town are overlooked in many respects; in them live large numbers of the poorest, to whom the free services of a midwife would be an undoubted boon. Further, it will be impossible for one new hand to work efficiently in such a scattered area.

"The appointment of two new midwives was urged by me in a motion at the August General Meeting. My motion was referred to the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, who recommended the appointment of only one. When this recommendation came up for consideration at the September General Meeting, I rose to move an amendment that the number should be two. For no reason whatsoever, the Chairman over-ruled my amendment. There is, I feel, nothing so sacrosanct about a decision of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, as to make the Chairman defend its views by flouting the most elementary rules of procedure."

(This fee includes the use of towels, linen, beds, mosquito curtain, lights, &c.)

(2) Garage and Stabling.

For a vehicle of any description garaged, or for any horse stabled, a fee of 25 cents for each complete period not exceeding 24 hours.

(No fee is charged in respect of any vehicle brought into the compound.)"



All steel ceiling frame with ventilation to hold Asbestos Sheets.

Abstract.—The inventor states that the customary type of asbestos ceiling used in the tropics consists of asbestos squares held in wooden framework, with sometimes a ventilation opening in the centre. He proposes instead an all metal framework consisting of H irons laid from wall to wall in parallel rows and angle irons bolted at suitable intervals between them, both on the level of the upper flanges and lower flanges respectively. On the squares thus formed are laid asbestos sheets alternately on the top flange and bottom flange so that there is sufficient overlap. The inventor claims that this ceiling is white ant-proof and fire-proof, is easily dismantled and has a uniform ventilation suitable for tropical climates.
