- (1) In by-law 67, by the substitution, for all the words from "fixture thereon," to "height.", of the words "fixture thereon."; and
- (2) by the insertion immediately after by-law 72A, of the following new by-law:
  - "72AA. The occupant of a space in a public market shall not in that space-
  - (a) place, or cause or permit any other person to place, goods or wares to a height exceeding six feet; or
  - (b) place or use any table, counter, shelf, bench, showcase, box or other similar furniture for the display of goods or wares, which exceeds four feet six inches in height."

# By-law.

The by-laws published by Proclamation dated January 21, 1903, in the Supplement to Gazette No. 5,901 of January 23, 1903, are hereby amended by the substitution, for the by-laws set out in Chapter II. thereof, of the by-laws set out in the Schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

CHAPTER II.

Conduct of Business.

Adjournment of Meetings.

- 1. The Secretary shall cause notice of an adjourned meeting to be served on each Councillor at least twenty-four hours before the time fixed for such meeting.
- Presence of Strangers.
- 2. Strangers, including the Press, may be present at Council meetings in the places set apart for them, but shall withdraw when called upon to do so by the Chairman, when, in the opinion of the majority of the Councillors present at the meeting, expressed by resolution, such exclusion is deemed advisable.

Order of Precedence.

3. For all purposes connected with the Council, the precedence and seniority of Councillors shall be regulated as follows:—

After the Chairman shall rank the Councillors in the order of the priority of their nomination or election, and

their nomination or election, and case of former Councillors of the case of

Order of Business

- 4. The business of the Council shall be transacted in the following order unless the Council otherwise resolves by a resolution under by-law 10 (i):-
  - (1) Confirmation of the minutes of the last preceding general meeting.
    (2) Memorials, petitions, complaints and
  - communications addressed to the Council.
  - (3) Questions.
  - (4) Motions.
  - Any other matter set down in the agenda.
  - (6) Monthly statements of receipts and disbursements, progress reports of works, and such other documents as are required by the Council shall be laid on the table at the Meeting.

Minutes.

The Secretary shall cause a copy of the minutes of each meeting to be sent to each Councillor after the minutes have been signed by the Chairman. At the next meeting the question shall be put that the minutes be taken as read and confirmed.

Memorials, Petitions, &c.

(a) A Councillor presenting a memorial,

- 6. (a) A Councillor presenting a memorial, petition, complaint, or other communication to the Council shall give three clear days' notice to the Secretary of such presentation.

  (b) The Councillor presenting any communication under paragraph (a) shall be responsible for such communication being in respectful language. Such Councillor may state concisely the purport of such communication and may, when presenting it move that it be referred to the Chairman or to any Committee for disposal or for report to any Committee for disposal or for report to the Council.
- (c) It shall be competent for any Councillor to move that any communication presented

under paragraph (a) be read. In making such motion he shall state concisely his reasons for wishing to have it read.

- (d) No debate shall be permitted on any motion under paragraph (c), and no other Councillor shall speak upon or in relation to any communication presented under paragraph (a) except to second the motion formally.
- (e) On any motion under paragraph (c) being seconded, the question shall be put whether the petition or memorial shall be
- In any case wherein individual rights or Hearing Petitioners. interests may be affected by any act, order, or proceeding of the Council, all parties so affected may be heard upon petition before the Council when in Committee, either in person or by Counsel.
- 8. Where it is intended to examine any witnesses, the petitioner or Councillor requiring such witnesses shall deliver to the Secretary, three days at least before the day appointed for such examination, a list containing the names, residences, and occupations or such witnesses, and the Secretary shall forthwith notify such witnesses in writing to be present for such examination.
- 9. (a) No question other than a question Questions relating to Municipal affairs may be put to the Chairman.
- (b) At least four clear days' notice, exclusive of Sundays and public holidays, shall be given to the Secretary of any question.

  (c) A written reply shall be read by the Chairman to each question.
- (d) No Councillor shall address the Council upon any question nor shall the terms of any question contain any agreement or expression of opinion or statement of fact, except in so far
- of opinion or statement of fact, except in so far as may be necessary to explain such question.

  (e) Any Councillor may put a supplementary question for the purpose of further elucidating any matter of fact regarding which an answer has been given: Provided that the Chairman shall disallow any supplementary question if in his opinion it infringes mentary question, if, in his opinion it infringes any of the provisions as to the admissibility of questions, and in that case the supplementary question shall not appear on the record of the minutes of the Council.
- 10. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in Motions. writing, signed by the Councillor giving the notice. Unless such notice is given to the Secretary at least three clear days, exclusive of Sundays and public holidays, before the meeting of the Council, the motion shall not be included in the agenda.
- (b) Every notice of motion shall be dated and numbered as received, and shall be entered by the Secretary upon the agenda in the order in which it is received.
- (c) Before any notice of motion is placed on the agenda, it shall be submitted by the Secretary to the Chairman who, if he be of opinion that it is cut of order, shall cause the Councillor giving the notice to be so informed.

(d) Every notice of motion shall be relevant some question affecting the municipal administration of Galle.

- (e) No motion to rescind any resolution which has been passed within the preceding six months and no motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived within the preceding six months, shall be in order, unless notice thereof under paragraph (a) is given and the motion included in the agenda. The notice shall bear, in addition to the signatures of the Councillor who proposes the motion, the signature of three other Councillors and after such motion has been disposed of, it shall not be competent for any Councillors to provess a similar action. for any Councillor to propose a similar motion within a further period of six months.

  (f) No motion shall be deemed to have been
- submitted for debate until it has been proposed and seconded.
- (g) Any Councillor may second a motion or amendment by rising in his place and bowing to the Chair, without prejudice to his right to speak at a later period of the debate.

- (h) When a motion has been made and seconded, and the debate thereon concluded, the question shall be put to the vote by the Chairman.
- (i) Immediately after the motions of which due notice has been given have been disposed of, a Councillor may propose a motion asking the permission of Council to bring forward a motion of which due notice has not been given and in such case he shall hand to the Secretary a copy of such motion.
- 11. A Councillor who has made a motion withdrawal of moved an amendment may withdraw such Motion or Amendment. or moved an amendment may withdraw such motion or amendment by leave of the Council which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any Councillor to speak upon such motion or amendment after the mover has asked for permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission has been refused.

12. A motion which has been withdrawn Reintroduction may be proposed again at any subsequent of Motion. meeting: Provided that no Councillor shall propose any motion which is the same in substance as any motion which, within the period of six months referred to in by-law 10 (e), has been resolved in the affirmative or the negative.

13. (a) Every amendment shall be in Amendments. writing and shall be handed to the Secretary by the Councillor proposing it.

(b) Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

(c) Every amendment shall be read before it is moved.

- (d) No amendment shall be discussed or put to the Council until it has been seconded.
- (e) A Councillor who has seconded an amendment in a formal manner, shall be permitted afterwards to speak upon it.
- (f) Whenever an amendment upon an original motion has been moved and seconded no second or subsequent amendment shall be moved until the first amendment has been disposed of. Where an amendment is carried, the motion, as amended, shall take the place of the original motion, and shall become the question upon which any further amendment may be moved.
- 14. No member may speak to any question after such question has been fully put by the Chairman. A question is fully put when the Chairman. A question is fully voting has been taken thereon.
- 15. (a) The question shall be put by the Voting and Chairman and the votes shall be taken by Recording of Votes. Chairman and the votes shall be taken by a show of hands, and the result shall be declared by the Chairman: Provided that in any case where a Councillor calls for a division, the votes shall be taken by the Secretary asking each Councillor separately, according to the order of precedence, how he desires to vote, and recording the votes accordingly. accordingly.
- (b) On any question being put, either in Council or in Committee of the whole Council every Councillor present shall, unless he declines to vote, record his vote either for the ayes or noes.
- (c) In the event of a Councillor declining to vote, the Secretary, shall, in case a division has been called for, enter the name of such Councillor upon the minutes as having declined to vote.
- (d) The Chairman shall have an original casting vote of vote in common with the other Councillors, Chairman. and also a casting vote if upon any question the votes are equal.
- (e) When the Council is in Committee of the whole Council, the Chairman shall have an original vote in common with the other Councillors and also a casting vote if upon any question the votes shall be equal.
- 16. It shall be competent for any Councillor who is in a minority to have his dissent recorded by the Secretary and subsequently to submit in writing the reasons for such dissent from the opinion of the majority, and such written dissent, if sent to the Secretary within one week after the Council

meeting in question, shall be entered by the Secretary at the end of the minutes of the proceedings.

Preservation of Order.

- 17. (a) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order at all meetings of the Council and his decision on any disputed point of order shall be final.
- (b) Any Councillor deviating from provisions relating to the conduct of business may be immediately called to order by the Chairman, or by any other Councillor rising to a point of order.

Decision of Questions of Oorder,

18. When the question of order has been stated, the Councillor, who raises it shall resume his seat, and no other Councillor, except by leave of the Chairman, shall rise till the Chairman has decided the question after which, the Councillor who was ad-dressing the Council or Committee of the Council at the time the question was raised shall be entitled to proceed with his speech, if he conforms to the Chairman's ruling. If he does not so conform, the Chairman may refuse to allow him to proceed with his  ${\bf speech.}$ 

Councillor not explaining or retracting.

19. Any Councillor who has used objectionable words and has not explained or retracted such words or offered an apology for the use thereof to the satisfaction of the Council, may be censured or otherwise dealt with as the Council thinks fit.

Chairman speaking.

20. When the Chairman is addressing the Council or Committee of the Council, any Councillor then standing shall immediately resume his seat.

Naming of Councillors.

- 21. (a) The Chairman may name any Councillor immediately after the commission of the offence of disregarding the authority of the Chair, or of abusing the provisions relating to the conduct of business of the Council by persistently and wilfully obstructing the business of the Council, and the Chairman man forthwith put the question, on man may forthwith put the question, on a motion being made by any Councillor or from the Chair (no amendment, adjournment, or debate being allowed) "that such Councillor be suspended from the service of the Council.".
- (b) If any motion referred to in paragraph (a) is carried and any Councillor is suspended under this by-law, his suspension, on the first occasion, shall continue for one month, on the second occasion for two months, and on the third or any subsequent occasion for three months.
- (c) Not more than one Councillor shall be named at the same time, unless several Councillors present together have jointly disregarded the authority of the Chair.

  (d) If any Councillor or Councillors acting
- jointly, who have been suspended under this by-law from the service of the Council, shall refuse, at any time during the period of suspension, to obey the direction of the Chairman to withdraw from the precincts of the Council Chamber, the Chairman may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his decision.

Irrelevance or tedious repetition.

22. The Chairman, after having called the attention of the Council or Council in Committee, to the conduct of a Councillor who persists in irrelevance or tedious repetition, either of his own arguments or of the arguments used by other Councillors in debate, may direct the Councillor to discontinue his speech.

- 23. (1) The Chairman may order any Councillor whose conduct is grossly disorderly to withdraw immediately from the Council Chamber during the remainder of the meeting, and may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his order.
- (2) If on any occasion the Chairman deems that his powers under this by-law are in-adequate, he may name any Councillor in pursuance of by-law 21.

Duty to obey order of Suspension or Withdrawal.

24. Every Councillor who is suspended under by-law 21 or is directed to withdraw under by-law 23 shall forthwith withdraw from the precincts of the Council Chamber.

Rules for Councillors Speaking.

- 25. Closure or an adjournment of the discussion of any question may be moved by a Councillor at any time, and, if seconded, shall be forthwith put to the vote.
- 26. In the case of grave disorder arising in the Council or Committee of the Council, the Chairman may, if he thinks it necessary to do so, adjourn the Council or Committee of the Council without question put, or suspend the meetings for a time to be named by him.

27. In speaking to any matter under consideration of the Council or a Committee of the whole Council, the following provisions shall be strictly observed :-

(1) The business shall be conducted in the

English language.
(2) Every Councillor shall address his observations to the Chairman, and

shall speak standing.
(3) No Councillor who is addressing his observations to the Chairman shall be interrupted, unless such Councillor is out of order.

(4) When a Councillor has finished his observations he shall resume his seat, and any other Councillor wishing to address the Council or Committee of the Council may rise.

(5) A Councillor shall not read his speech but he may read extracts from written or printed papers in support of his argument.

(6) If two Councillors rise at the same time,

the Chairman shall call on the Councillor who first catches his eye.

(7) Every Councillor shall confine his observations to the subject under consideration consideration.

(8) No Councillor shall impute improper motives to any other Councillor.
All personalities shall be avoided.

(10) A Councillor may speak to the question

before the Council or any amendment proposed thereto.

(11) No Councillor shall speak more than once on any proposition before the Council, except in explanation or to order, or when the Council is in Committee, or as is provided by

rule 27 (13).

(12) By the indulgence of the Council a

Councillor may explain matters of a personal nature, although there is no question before the Council, but such matters may not be debated, and such Councillor shall confine himself strictly to the vindication of his own conduct.

(13) The mover of any motion may reply after all the other Councillors present have had an opportunity of address-ing the Council and before the question is put, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering pre-vious speakers and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate. The right of reply shall not extend to the mover of an amendment nor to the mover of an amendment which having been carried has become the substantive motion.

Committee of Council.

- 28. The Council may at any time resolve themselves into a Committee of the whole Council and, on their resuming, the result of their deliberations shall be dealt with by the Council.
- 29. When the Council is in Committee, by-law 27 (11) and (13), shall have no application.
- 30. It shall be competent for any Councillor at any stage of any discussion in Committee to move that the Council shall resume, and on such motion being seconded, the question shall be put to the vote by the Chairman, and if the motion is carried, the Council shall immediately resume from Committee.

Special Committees.

31. (1) In every Special Committee, the quorum thereof shall be three, unless otherwise specially fixed by resolution of Council.

(2) In the absence of the Chairman at a meeting of any Special Committee, the Councillors present shall choose one of them to preside, who shall for that meeting have all the powers of the Chairman.

(3) When a Special Committee has agreed by a majority to a report, such report shall be signed by such majority and shall be submitted to the Council with the dissent or dissents of any Councillors in the minority.

- dissents of any Councillors in the minority.

  (4) In the event of any division taking place in a Special Committee, a record thereof shall be entered in the minutes, together with the motion or resolution proposed, the name of the proposer and the respective votes of the Councillors present.
- 32. The Press shall be excluded from all meetings of Special and Standing Committees.

Notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 158 or regulation 165 of the Public Service Regulations, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, monthly allowances not exceeding in the aggregate the amounts set out in paragraph (iii.) may be paid out of Corps funds to clerks and minor employees as overtime and commuted allowances. The payments will be at the discretion of the Commanding Officer and where such payment has been made, a receipt in support of such payment shall be obtained. All such payments shall be reported monthly to C. D. F. Headquarters for entry in a fees register. A fees register shall also be maintained by all units making payments of this nature.
- (ii.) The payments referred to in paragraph (1) will be in the nature of bonuses fixed at the discretion of the Commanding Officer. Any unspent balance will not be accumulative. Clerks and minor employees in receipt of these allowances will be ineligible for any other allowances of a similar nature from any other source. Existing allowances will cease on the adoption of this regulation.

The unnumbered Excise Notification published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 8,118 of May 3, 1935, is hereby

cancelled.

Licence for the Sale of Arrack in Bulk only in Premises licensed for the Sale of Foreign Liquor other than by Retail (Off) Licence.

- (hereinafter called "the Licensee") is hereby licensed to sell arrack in bulk only at the or bearing Number — in — street, and situated at — in — District 

(a) The cask or other container for arrack shall be kept padlocked, in such manner that no arrack or other liquor can be introduced without unlocking, and the padlock and two keys shall be supplied by the Licensee at his own expense. One key may be kept by the Renter, unless the Renter agrees in writing to leave it with the Licensee, and the other shall be kept by the Superintendent of Excise. In any case the Renter or his representative shall have the right to be present, whenever the cask is opened for replenishment or testing.

(b) The Licensee or Inspecting Officer shall give at least one hour's notice to the Renter or his representative of his intention to replenish the cask or other container, or to test the arrack, as the case may be.

(c) No arrack shall be kept in stock by the Licensee, except in the cask or other container so padlocked, and no arrack shall be sold except from such cask or other container.

The possession by the Licensee of a key to the padlock of the cask is prohibited, unless the Renter has agreed to it in writing.

5. The sale of arrack shall be in bulk only. Sale by the bottle and the breaking open of sealed bottles is prohibited.

6. The Licensee shall not at any one time sell to any one person, or allow any one person to remove, any arrack in

excess of one-third of an imperial gallon:

Provided, however, that, if the maximum limit of sale for removal prescribed in the Foreign Liquor Licence held by the Licensee is less than one-third of an imperial gallon, or if the sale for removal is prohibited in the said licence, such maximum limit or prohibition shall be equally applicable to the sale of arrack by the Licensee for removal, notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing clause of this condition.

7. The sale of arrack shall be subject to the same restrictions, as may be imposed on the sale of foreign liquor by the Licensee as regards the hours of sale, the class of customer and the nature of business

the Foreign Liquor Licence held by the Licensee as regards the hours of sale, the class of customer and the nature of business

permitted.

8. All arrack sold or kept for sale under this licence shall be of a strength not below 27 degrees under proof as tested in compliance with the provisions of Excise Notification No. 178 published in Gazette No. 7,654 of July 13, 1928. No water, and no colouring, flavouring or other matter whatsoever shall be added to the arrack.

9. The licensee shall at all times keep a stock of not less than two gallons of arrack.

10. Arrack shall not be sold by the dram or glass at a lower rate than Rs. 15·36 a gallon, or 32 cents a dram, at

27 degrees under proof.

11. Standard measures approved by the Superintendent of Excise, viz., 1\(\frac{1}{4}\) dram, 1 dram, \(\frac{2}{4}\) dram, \(\frac{1}{4}\) dram, and \(\frac{1}{4}\) dram shall be kept, and shall on demand by any customer be used for measuring the arrack he has purchased.

12. The Licensee shall affix in a prominent place within the Licensed Premises, so as to be capable of being easily read by the customers, a card displaying in bold printed figures and in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil letters the selling price of the arrack offered for sale by the dram.

The Licensee shall keep an account of all arrack bought and sold in the following form :-

14. No cask or other container shall be used for the storage of arrack, unless it bears clearly engraved and painted on it its correct capacity in terms of gallons, and is provided with a correct dip-rod with engraved marks showing gallons and half gallons.

15. No bottle bearing the Government arrack label, unopened or wholly or partially empty, and no Government capsule of the type used for arrack bottles, shall be kept in the Licensed Premises, or any outhouses thereof, or any

buildings appurtenant thereto.

16. The Licensee will be responsible for ensuring that on September 30 of the year in which this licence expires he does not hold a stock of arrack in excess of the average sales for ten days computed on the basis of sales between July 15 to September 15 of the same year, so that an unduly large stock of arrack is not purchased by him from the out-going renter of the arrack tavern referred to in condition I above.

17. Excise Officers not below the grade of Inspector shall at all times, when the premises are open for sale of arrack, be given access to the cask or other container, and allowed to check the strength and quantity of arrack contained

therein as well as the accounts.

18. The Licensee shall be responsible for all acts of his managers, agents, and employees in relation to this licence.

19. This licence is not transferable, except with the written sanction of the Excise Commissioner first had and obtained.

20. The sum of Rs. 50 deposited by the Licensee with his application for this licence shall be held by the Excise Commissioner as security for the due observance of the general and special conditions of this licence, and shall be liable to forfeiture, in whole or in part, at the sole discretion of the Excise Commissioner for any breach of these conditions, in addition to the penalties provided for such breach by the Ordinance.

21. The Licensee shall have or make no claim against the Excise Commissioner or the Government of Ceylon for any failure, whether partial or total, of his supplies of arrack, or for any loss or damage arising from any act or omission of the Rentz, or for any other cause whatsoever.

- 2. Bye-laws and Conditions of Sale of Rubber.—Appendix "H":
- (i) Bye-law No. 1 was deleted and the following substituted therefor:
  - 1. (a) Sales shall be by public auction and shall be held at the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Sale Room at such times as the Committee of the Colombo Rubber Traders' Association (hereinafter referred to as "the Association") shall from time to time decide and shall be subject to the provisions of the Conditions of Sale hereinafter contained;

(b) No rubber shall be put up for sale at the sales except by members as principals;

(c) Only auctioneers who are members shall be en-

- titled to conduct sales;
  (d) For the purposes of these Bye-laws and of the Conditions of Sale hereinafter contained the word "member" shall mean all present and future members of the Association.
- (ii) Bye-law No. 11 (a) was deleted and the following substituted therefor:
  - 11. (a) The privileges of the provisions of Condition of Sale 7 shall be extended only to such members whose stores shall have been approved by the Committee of the Association and thereafter registered with the Secretary of the Association. Provided that such stores shall not be registered unless they shall:
    - (i) be so constructed as to admit of sufficient daylight and possess all the general amenities of a store,

      (ii) possess good scales of adequate gauge and proper weights,

      (iii) have ample facilities for weighing,

(iv) contain adequate space for storing so as to enable 20 per cent. of rubber stored being inspected

easily, and

(v) be situated within a radius of 3 miles of the Colombo Goods Yard and within the local limits of the Municipality of Colombo,

and buyers shall take delivery from such stores as in Condition of Sale 7 provided.

- (iii) Bye-law No. 11 (c) was deleted and the following substituted therefor:-
  - (c) The Committee of the Association shall by a majority of the members thereof have the right to withdraw from any seller the privileges extended to him by the provisions of this Bye-law upon being satisfied that he has committed a breach of this Bye-law or of the Conditions of Sale.

## "THE NOTIFICATIONS UNDER PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

Manufacture and application of glycol and polyglycol ethers of isocyclic hydroxyl-compounds.

Abstract.—The invention relates to the manufacture of glycol ethers and polyglycol ethers by the combination of an isocyclic hydroxyl-compound substituted in the nucleus by at least one hydrocarbon or acyl radical containing at least four carbon atoms, with an  $L-\beta$  alkylene oxide or a dorresponding halogen hydrin.

Polyglycol ethers may also be manufactured by causing a previously formed polyglycol ether chain to react with the substituted isocyclic compound thus: the alkali salt of the

hydroxyl compound is made to react with a halogen hydrin, the withing mono-glycol ether is converted into a halogenalkyl-ether and the latter is made to react with a polyglycol

ether in the presence of a caustic alkali.

The substituted iso-cyclic hydroxyl compound may be prepared by the action of an olefine or a mixture of olefines on an aromatic hydroxyl compound. The mixture of olefines may be obtained either by dehydrating a mixture of primary alcohols having about 4-8 carbon atoms produced by the catalytic reduction of carbon monoxide, or by the catalytic polymerisation of an olefine of low molecular

weight.

The new polyglycol ethers are oily to wax-like products. They are partly insoluble in water and form fairly stable emulsions with it. The properties of the ethers can be varied by causing the hydroxyl group contained in them to react with a reactive compound.

The new products have capillary active properties and can be used as wetting, softening, dispersing, emulsifying, washing, and cleaning agents. They may be used either alone or in admixture with other textile assistants such as water-soluble aromatic, hydroaromatic or aliphatic compounds containing an ionogenic group.

Process for treating etherial oils with the aid of extracting agents.

Abstract.—The invention relates to a process for extracting, purifying and concentrating natural etherial oils, by the use of two solvents or mixtures of two solvents flowing counter-currently to each other; the two solvents not being completely miscible under the extracting conditions in the presence of the oil.

of these solvents is a polar solvent which is a preferential solvent for the non-hydrocarbon constituents of the oil. The second of these solvents consists entirely of non polar substances such as hydrocarbons. Preferably

the boiling points or the boiling ranges of the two solvents or solvent mixtures are below that of the oil to be treated; since most etherial oils are destroyed by heat this would be an advantage as the solvents can be distilled off at the lower temperatures.

Among the first class of solvents may be grouped liquid ammonia, liquid sulphur dioxide, and organic compounds containing one or more of the following radicals:— $\equiv$ COH (including primary, secondary and tertiary alcohols),=CO, =C(OH).O.C≡, -NH₂, =NH, ≡N and COOR (when R is an aliphatic or aromatic radical.

The temperature and pressure conditions under which the process is carried out and the relative concentrations of the solvents and the oil are so chosen that two liquid phases are formed. The constituents of the intial oil get distributed over the two liquid phases in different ratios. The liquid phases are withdrawn at spaced points in the extraction zone and the dissolved constituents obtained from them by distillation, rectification, &c.

Any usual type of apparatus for effecting the counter-current contact of liquids may be employed. The initial oil may be introduced into the apparatus either at the ends or at an intermediate point in the extraction zone. The extraction may be carried out as a single process or as a

multiple process applying the countercurrent principle.

The crosscurrent principle may also be employed, i.e., washing with fresh quantities of one solvent solutions containing constituents of the oil dissolved in the second solvent. The extracts obtained may then be mixed and then repeatedly washed with the second solvent and so on.

An improved process to turn out pure white smokeless dried copra.

Abstract.—The inventor describes a drying plant for producing smokeless copra in which a drying chamber is used situated directly above the combustion chamber. The drying chamber has a floor made of two galvanised iron sheets with a 3 in. cover of sand in between. A system of hot air pipes is laid on this floor; these pipes are in communication with the combustion chamber beneath and with the chimney. There is also a damper connecting and with the chimney. There is also a damper connecting the combustion chamber directly to the main chimney which is to be closed as soon as the fuel has partly burned down. Three adjustable outlet ventilators are placed on the top of the drying chamber. In addition, two adjustable wind funnels are arranged so as to deflect any prevailing wind and to discharge the fresh air just over the heated platform. In this way the thermosyphonic action of the heated air is assisted by the blown air from the wind funnels. The inventor claims that by this arrangement an even temperature is attained in the chamber without the

aid of a fan or other auxiliary apparatus.

There are six claims and one sheet of drawings.
