KNOW Ye that in pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 6B (1) of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, with the advice of the Executive Committee of Local Administration, do by this Proclamation—

- (1) divide the subdivision set out in column 1 of Schedule A hereto into the two new subdivisions set out and defined in column 2 of the said Schedule ;
- (2) provide in the manner set out in Schedule B hereto for the matters necessary to give effect to the division so effected ; and
- (3) declare that this Proclamation shall come into effect on the first day of July, 1938.

### SCHEDULE A.

Column 1.

Subdivision of the Chief Head man's Division of Gangaboda pattu in the Galle District of the Southern Province, made by Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 4,251 of September 20, 1878.

Baddegama subdivision consisting of Baddegama North, Hammeliya, Baddegama South, Boralukada, Baddegama East, Ganegama North, Halpatota, Ganegama South, Ganegama East, Walpita North, Walpita South, Ampegama, Diviture, Etkandura, Agaliya, Pataweliwitiya, Udaweliwitiya, Waduweliwitiya, Majuwana, Keradewala, Ginimellagaha East, Telikada and Horagampita.

1. Baddegama subdivision consisting of Baddegama North, Hammeliya, Baddegama South, Boralukada, Baddegama East, Ganegama North, Ganegama South, Ganegama East, Walpita North, Walpita South, Ampegama, Diviture, Etkandura, Agaliya, Pataweliwitiya, Udaweliwitiya, and Waduweliwitiya.

2. Telikada-Majuwana subdivision consisting of Majuwana, Keradewala, Ginimellagaha East, Telikada, Horagampita, and Halpatota.

### SCHEDULE B.

1. The inhabitants of each of the new subdivisions set out in column 2 of the foregoing Schedule A shall be the successors of the inhabitants of the original subdivision set out in column 1 of the said schedule for all such purposes of the Ordinance as may relate to that new subdivision.

2. (i.) Any balance of the moneys deposited with the Government Agent and lying to the credit of the said original subdivision on the 30th day of June, 1938, shall be divided into two equal portions and these portions credited to the respective accounts of the new subdivisions on the 1st day of July, 1938.

(ii.) All movable property of the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall be deemed to be vested in two equal shares in the respective inhabitants of the two new subdivisions.

(iii.) All immovable property vested in the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall be deemed to be vested in the inhabitants of the new subdivision within which the property is situated.

3. All the rights, powers, and duties, debts, liabilities and obligations of the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall so far as they relate to any of the new subdivisions aforesaid be deemed to be transferred to the inhabitants of such new subdivision.

4. All rules now in force under the provisions of the Ordinance in the original subdivision shall be in force in each of the new subdivisions aforesaid, as if they have been made by, or by virtue of the powers delegated by the inhabitants of the new subdivisions.

5. The Committee now in office in the original subdivision shall not be deemed to have been dissolved by reason of the division of the said subdivision into two new subdivisions as aforesaid, but shall remain in office until June 30, 1938, or until the respective fresh Committees elected for the aforesaid new subdivisions come into office.

### THE CEYLON (STATE COUNCIL) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1931.

#### Order under Article 94.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by Article 94 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order delegate to the Legal Secretary—

THE GENEVA CONVENTION ACT, 1937 (COLONIES)  
ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1937.

THE "Geneva Convention Act, 1937", to enable effect to be given to Article 28 of the International Convention for the amelioration of the condition of the wounded and sick in armies in the field and the "Geneva Convention Act, 1937 (Colonies) Order in Council, 1937", are hereby published for general information.

By proclamation dated March 27, 1938, published in the *Gazette, Extraordinary* of March 29, 1938, His Excellency the Governor has fixed the First day of April, 1938, as the day on which the said Order in Council shall come into operation in Ceylon.

TEXTS.

An Act to enable effect to be given to Article twenty-eight of the International Convention for the amelioration of the condition of the wounded and sick in armies in the field done at Geneva on the twenty-seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and for purposes connected therewith. [19th March 1937.] A.D. 1937.

WHEREAS His Majesty has ratified an International Convention for the amelioration of the condition of the wounded and sick in armies in the field which was done at Geneva on the twenty-seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine:

And whereas, in order to give effect to Article twenty-eight of the said Convention, and for purposes connected therewith, it is expedient to make such amendments in the law as are contained in this Act:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1.—(1) It shall not be lawful for any person, without the authority of the Board of Trade, to use for the purposes of his trade or business, or for any other purpose whatsoever—

Prohibition of use of certain designs and words.

(a) any design consisting of a white or silver cross on a red ground, none of the limbs of which extends to the margin of the ground, being the cross comprised in the Arms of the Swiss Confederation; or

(b) any design being a colourable imitation of the design mentioned in the last foregoing paragraph; or

(c) any design being a colourable imitation of the heraldic emblem of the red cross on a white ground mentioned in subsection (1) of section one of the Geneva Convention Act, 1911, or any words so nearly resembling the words "Red Cross" or "Geneva Cross" as to be capable of being understood as referring to the said emblem.

(2) If any person contravenes the provisions of the last foregoing subsection, he shall, subject as hereafter provided, be guilty of an offence under this Act and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and to forfeit any goods upon or in connection with which the design or words was or were used.

(3) Nothing in this section shall apply to a trade mark registered before the twenty-third day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, and consisting of or containing any such design as is mentioned in paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of this section; and where a person is charged with using such a design for any purpose and it is

proved that he used it otherwise than as or as part of a trade mark registered as aforesaid, it shall be a defence for him to prove—

- (a) that he lawfully used that design for that purpose before the said twenty-third day of December; or
- (b) in a case where he is charged with using the design upon goods, that the design had been applied to the goods before he acquired them by some other person who had manufactured or dealt with the goods in the course of trade, and that that other person lawfully used the design upon similar goods before the said twenty-third day of December.

(4) Where an offence under this Act committed by a body corporate is proved to have been committed with the consent or connivance of any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the body corporate, he, as well as the body corporate, shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

(5) Proceedings under this section shall not be instituted in England without the consent of the Attorney-General or in Northern Ireland without the consent of the Attorney-General for Northern Ireland.

(6) The authority of the Board of Trade under this section may be given by the President, or a Secretary, Under Secretary or Assistant Secretary, of the Board, or any person authorised in that behalf by the President of the Board.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any enactment or rule of law, the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia shall have power to pass a law to give effect to all the provisions of Article twenty-eight of the said Convention, and any such law may enact—

- (a) that the provisions thereof shall extend, not only to the Commonwealth of Australia but also to any territories which are administered under the authority of His Majesty's Government in the Commonwealth of Australia or in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by that Government; and
- (b) that the Geneva Convention Act, 1911, shall cease to extend to the Commonwealth of Australia and to any such territories as aforesaid to which the provisions of the said law extend.

3. His Majesty may by Order in Council provide that section one of this Act shall extend, subject to such modifications (if any) as may be specified in the Order, to the Isle of Man, any of the Channel Islands, Newfoundland or any colony.

4. This Act may be cited as the Geneva Convention Act, 1937, and this Act and the Geneva Convention Act, 1911, may be cited together as the Geneva Conventions Acts, 1911 and 1937.

the amelioration of the condition of the wounded and sick in armies in the field done at Geneva on the twenty-seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and for purposes connected therewith:

And whereas by section 3 of the said Act it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council provide that Section 1 of the said Act shall extend, subject to such modifications (if any) as may be specified in the Order, *inter alia* to any Colony:

And whereas it is expedient that Section 1 of the said Act should be extended to the Colonies named in the Schedule to this Order, and that certain modifications should be made with regard to the application of the said Section 1 to such Colonies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise vested in His Majesty, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Geneva Convention Act, 1937 (Colonies) Order in Council, 1937".

2. Subject to the following modifications Section 1 of the Geneva Convention Act, 1937, shall extend to the Colonies named in the Schedule to this Order:—

- (1) The powers by the said Section 1 vested in the Board of Trade shall be vested in the Governor in Council, or, if there shall be no Executive Council in the Colony, in the Governor.
- (2) Proceedings under the said Section 1 shall not be instituted without the consent of the Principal Law Officer of the Colony, or, if there shall be no such Law Officer, of the Colonial or Chief Secretary.

3. This Order shall come into operation in each Colony on a day to be fixed by the Governor.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. Every application for a grave shall be made to the cemetery-keeper not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial for which the grave is required.

2. The cemetery-keeper shall have power to maintain order within the cemetery.

3. The cemetery-keeper may give directions as to the route to be followed by a funeral party on arrival at the cemetery.

4. (1) Where two or more funeral parties arrive at the cemetery at the same time, the cemetery-keeper may determine, and give directions as to—

(a) the order in which they shall move to the respective graves; and

(b) the order in which the respective burial services shall be held.

(2) For the purpose of preventing the disturbance of any funeral party by any other funeral party in the cemetery, and for no other purpose the cemetery-keeper may direct that a burial service shall not be commenced before the conclusion of a burial service commenced earlier.

5. Every person shall obey the directions given by the cemetery-keeper for any of the purposes of regulations 2, 3, and 4.

6. No grave shall be less than four feet in depth, or at a distance of less than two feet from any other grave.

7. Except upon the orders of a competent court, no person shall re-open—

(a) any grave within a year of the burial of any dead body therein; or

(b) any vault within eighteen months of any interment therein.

8. No person shall bury or cremate a dead body in the Nalluruwa General Cemetery without the permission of the cemetery-keeper; and such permission shall not be granted until the fee payable under these regulations for the burial or cremation has been paid, and until the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895, has been delivered to the cemetery-keeper.

9. A fee in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule hereto, shall be paid to the cemetery-keeper by the person making the arrangements for any burial or cremation, at the time application is made by that person for permission to conduct such burial or cremation:

Provided that no fee shall be payable for the burial of—

(a) any pauper who dies in the Government Civil Hospital, and whose body is buried by the hospital contractors under the directions of the cemetery-keeper; or

(b) any deceased person whose relatives and friends are certified in writing by a Minister of any Christian denomination, or by a Mudaliyar, or by a Justice of the Peace, or by an Inquirer appointed under the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898, or by a Member or the Secretary of the Panadure Urban District Council, to be unable to pay the fee prescribed by these regulations for the burial of such person.

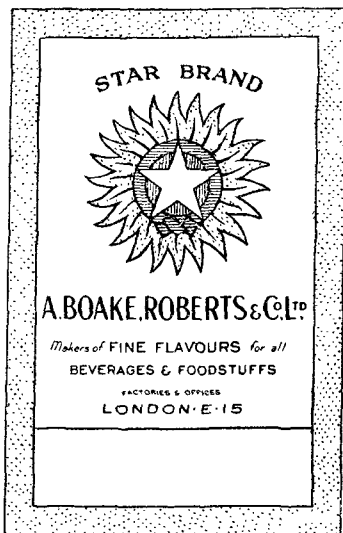

Improvements in Tea Rolling Machines.

*Abstract.*—The Rolling device consists of a table with a projection extending into the tea-container, the said projection working in a groove of the pressure member, which is shaped to allow the relative orbital movement of table and roller with reference to each other. In a preferred form the projection is of conical shape and fits into an annular groove in the pressure cap such that cross section of the pressure cap in a vertical plane is of the form of an inverted W on the underside. Improvements in Tea Rolling Machines.

*Abstract.*—The object of this invention is to provide an improved means for applying pressure to and removing pressure from the tea contained in a rolling machine and is particularly described with reference to a single acting roller, but can also be adapted to double acting rollers.

According to the invention, the pressure cap operating mechanism is connected by means of a driving shaft to a two speed (forward and reverse) gear box which comprises of a pair of bevel pinions associated with a driving pinion which is integral with the female part of a clutch the axis of which is vertical. The male part of this clutch is fixed to an arm which is rotatable about a vertical shaft carried on a bracket fixed to the table. The pressure operating device thus derives its motion from the orbital movement of the container, and can be put in forward (pressure applying) or in reverse (pressure releasing) gear, or be disengaged by the clutch. Generally the forward rate is arranged to be slower than the backward rate. The crosshead carrying the pressure member is mounted on two standards about one of which it is pivotally mounted so that it can swing clear of the container when required.

In an alternative form of construction, the pressure operating mechanism is connected by means of a two speed gear box to a vertical shaft which carries a gear pinion A which moves in planetary motion relative to another pinion B carried by a vertical shaft rotatable about a bracket fixed to the table. The pinion B has braking mechanism to prevent rotation. With the brake applied the pressure operating mechanism is constrained to apply or release pressure according to the gear that is engaged. The pinion A may, when necessary, be moved out of engagement with B to enable the crosshead to be swung clear.

Improvements in Machines for Drying Tea Leaf or the like.

*Abstract.*—The inventors state that when admitting the material into a tea-drying machine, it is essential that turbulence which may be created by the upward rush of drying air be avoided. They propose a rotary inlet valve consisting of a plurality of vanes, mounted on swivel pins round a drive shaft and co-operating with a valve casing in such a way as to form an air-lock. The drive shaft is driven preferably by chain and sprockets from the shaft of the automatic conveyor in such a way that before one of the trays of the latter tilts, one of the vanes of the valve assumes a horizontal position to receive the discharge. As one vane discharges its contents through the outlet port of the rotary valve, the next following vane has already assumed a horizontal position thus forming an air seal on that side. After discharging its content the vane trails, resting on the round back of the succeeding vane and contacting with the valve casing on its free edge. Only necessary working clearances are maintained between the backs of the vanes and the drive shaft, and the vane members and end plates. If necessary, strips of felt may be fitted to minimise leakage.

Improvements in machines for Drying Tea Leaf or the like.

*Abstract.*—The inventors describe a spreader mechanism for use in endless chain pressure drying machines as follows:—The spreaders which are preferably of the rotary type, are mounted on shafts carried by blocks bearing on the cheek plates of the machine. At the charging end, the spreader which operates on the upper run of a conveyor is connected by links to the baffle which operates on the lower run of the same conveyor and which prevents the escape of drying medium past the top of the material at this point. At the other end, the spreader for the bottom run of a conveyor is connected with the baffle for the top run of the same conveyor. The bearing blocks at each end on each cheek plate are linked together. Thus the spreaders and baffles at each end of the machine are simultaneously adjustable, but provision is made to allow each spreader to be adjustable relatively to the others and each baffles to be adjustable relatively to its associated spreader. This precaution is necessary owing to the shrinkage of the drying material. The rotary spreaders are driven by chain and sprockets, and jockey sprockets are arranged for tensioning the chains. The tension once adjusted is not altered by the adjustment of the spreaders and/or baffles. A worm gearing is used for the simultaneous adjustment of the baffles and spreaders.
