- 1. In these by-laws "open space" means any open space or place for public recreation vested in or under the control of the Kurunegala Urban District Council.
- Except with a permit under the hand of the Chairman and except in accordance with the conditions of such permit, no open space shall be used by any person for-
  - (a) holding a public meeting or reception;

  - (b) grazing any cattle; or
    (c) selling or exposing or hawking for sale any article of any description whatsoever.
  - No person shall, in any open space-
  - (a) commit any disturbance or behave in such manner as to annoy any other person; or

  - (b) commit any nuisance; or (c) use, for any purpose other than that of sitting, any seat provided by the Council, or place his foot on any such seat.

- 4. No person shall uproot or cause any damage to any tree, plant or shrub, or, without the written permission of the Chairman, pluck any flower from any tree, plant or shrub, growing in any open space.
- 5. No person suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease shall use any seat provided in any open space by the Council.
- 6. No person shall creep through or climb, jump or step over any fence erected on or on the boundary of any open space.
- 7. No person over 18 years of age shall use any part of the Esplanade set apart and equipped as a playground for children, or any of the fixtures or apparatus for games and recreation erected or provided in such playground.
- Every contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and in the case of a continuing offence, with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees, for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction,

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. No omnibus shall enter or be parked in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit issued in respect of it by the Chairman of the Sanitary
- 2. (1) The Chairman of the Sanitary Board shall issue the permit referred to in regulation 1 on payment of a fee of Re. 1 per annum.
- (2) Every permit issued under paragraph (1) shall contain the number of the omnibus in respect of which it is issued and shall be valid for a period of one year from the
- The person in charge of each omnibus occupying a public stand shall, whenever required to do so by a Sanitary Board Inspector or a Police Officer in uniform, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of such omnibus.
  - In these regulations—

"Sanitary Board" means the Sanitary Board of the

Kandy District; "public stand" means any space within the urban area of Kadugannawa which may from time to time be defined and reserved for the parking of omnibuses by a notice signed by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board and exhibited at the spot.
