SCHEDULE.

Limits of the Town of Bogawantalawa.

North by a line from the land mark on the north-western corner of lot 1 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10, approximately 33 yards west of the new bridge over the Norwood-Campion road, running through Kotiyagala estate, north-eastwards along the right bank of the Bridwelloya to the point where it meets the northern boundary of lot 2 in the same plan, approximately due east of the 7½ milestone on the aforesaid road.

East by a line drawn from the last mentioned point eastwards and south-eastwards along the northern boundaries of lots 2 and 3 and the eastern boundaries of lots 3 and 6 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10 and crossing the road to Killarney, to the land mark on its southern boundary, thence north-eastwards along the southern boundary of the said road to the northern boundary (fence) of the C. M. S. School premises, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries (fence) of the said school premises to the land mark on the north-eastern corner of lot 12 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 12 to the northern boundary of lot 1 (coolie lines) in P. Plan No. 7,375, thence eastwards, southwards, and westwards along the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of the said lot 1 to the eastern boundary of lot 20 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10, thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 20 to the northern boundary of lot 21 (burial ground) in the same plan, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said lot 21 to the land mark on the south-eastern corner of the said lot 21, thence southwards and south-westwards along the eastern and the southern boundaries of the estate mason's dwelling house premises (including

the cattle shed), to a point on the eastern boundary of the Norwood-Campion road, 173 feet to the south-east of the 7½ milestone, thence in a straight line across the said road to its western boundary, thence south-eastwards along the western boundary of the said road to a point 363 feet from the 7½ milestone.

South by a straight line drawn from the last mentioned point south-westwards (so as to include the Post Office), to a distance of 112 feet, thence north-westwards for a distance of 305 feet (so as to include the Post Office, estate dispensary, and the new Police Station), to a point 94 feet to the south-west from the western boundary of the Norwood-Campion road, thence south-westwards to a distance of 148 feet thereof (so as to include the D. M. O.'s quarters), thence north-westwards to the P. W. D. boundary stone on the southernmost corner of lot 17 (Govt. Dispensary) in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10.

West by a line drawn from the last mentioned point north-westwards, northwards and thence north-westwards along the western boundaries of lots 17 and 16, southern and western boundaries of lot 10, western boundary of lot 9, and western boundaries of lots 8 (estate roadway) and 1 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10 to the starting point of the northern limit of the town.

THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,
No. 13 OF 1896.

Regulations for the Kataragama Esala Festival.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896 entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages", and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Esala Festival commencing in July, 1938.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, "camp area" includes—

- (a) the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Dewale at Kataragama; and
- (b) the area within a radius of a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama.

2. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Esala Festival, 1938, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to sixteen days from July 27 to August 11 inclusive.

(b) No pilgrims shall arrive before July 27, or stay after August 11, in the camp area.

3. The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.

4. (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power, on the line of march to and from Kataragama, and at Kataragama—

- (a) to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water for drinking, and for natural offices;
- (b) to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
- (c) to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
- (d) to regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
- (e) to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

(2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).

5. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

7. No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.

8. No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits.

9. Every permit issued under regulation 8 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.

10. No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

11. (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.

(2) No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

(3) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Inspector to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

12. (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(2) All cakes, sweet meats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purposes of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure,

or place shall be deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp.

16. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

THE FAUNA AND FLORA PROTECTION ORDINANCE,
No. 2 OF 1937.

It is hereby notified, in terms of section 67 (3) of the Fauna and Flora Protection Ordinance, No. 2 of 1937, that the following regulations, made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands under section 67 of the Ordinance, have been approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor on April 13, 1938.

Regulations under the Fauna and Flora Protection
Ordinance, No. 2 of 1937.

CHAPTER I.—PRELIMINARY.

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “buffalo kraal” includes all steps, acts, preparations, and arrangements taken, done or made for the capture of wild buffaloes in the type of stockade known as a kraal ;
- “block” means a defined portion of an Intermediate Zone declared by the Warden to be a block thereof ;
- “Government Agent” includes an Assistant Government Agent ;
- “hunting” includes tracking for the purposes of discovering the lie of wild animals ;
- “non-resident” means a person other than a resident ;
- “open season” in relation to any species of bird or beast means any part of the year other than a close season defined by the Ordinance or declared by regulation thereunder in respect of that species ;
- “Ordinance” means the Fauna and Flora Protection Ordinance, No. 2 of 1937 ;
- “prescribed animal” means any of the following species of animals, namely, tusker, elephant, buffalo, deer or fowl ;
- “resident” in any context relating to a licence or permit, means a person who has resided in Ceylon for at least six months during the eighteen months immediately preceding the date of an application made by him for such licence or permit.

CHAPTER II.—STRICT NATURAL RESERVES.

1. Every permit authorizing a person to enter or remain within a Strict Natural Reserve for the purposes of scientific research shall be substantially in Form A set out in the schedule hereto, and shall be subject to the conditions attached thereto.

2. Before the issue of a permit in Form A it shall be lawful for the Warden if he considers it advisable, to direct that the application shall be supported by a recommendation from the Director of the Colombo Museum.

CHAPTER III.—NATIONAL PARKS.

3. Every permit authorizing a person to enter or remain within a National Park for the purpose of studying or observing the fauna and flora therein shall be substantially in the Form B set out in the schedule hereto and shall be subject to the conditions attached thereto, and may be issued by the Warden or by any Forest Officer not below the rank of Forest Guard authorized in that behalf by the Warden.

4. For each permit in Form B there shall be payable a fee calculated at the following rates in respect of each day of the period for which the permit is to be in force :—

Where the applicant is a resident ..	0 50
Where the applicant is a non-resident ..	1 0

5. The period during which a permit in Form B may authorize the holder to remain within a National Park shall in no case exceed ten days.

6. The Warden may, in his discretion, by notice exhibited on the spot and published in such other manner as he may consider necessary or suitable, declare any National Park or part thereof to be closed during any specified period, and where such declaration has been made in respect of any National Park or part thereof, no permit in Form B shall be issued for the purpose of authorizing entry into that National Park or part thereof during the period specified in the declaration.

CHAPTER IV.—INTERMEDIATE ZONES.

7. (1) Any person, who is the holder of a permit in that behalf, may, in accordance with the terms and conditions of that permit, enter an Intermediate Zone and in such Zone—

- (a) carry on any scientific research, study or observation ; or
- (b) hunt without dogs, shoot at, kill or take by means of a trap or otherwise, any wild animal other than a prescribed animal between the hours of sunrise and sunset during the open season ; or
- (c) take or destroy any egg of any bird or reptile or any nest of any bird ; or
- (d) fell, girdle, lop, tap, burn or in any way damage or destroy any plant, or take, collect or remove any plant therefrom ; or
- (e) kindle or carry any fire ; or
- (f) tether, liberate or release any animal introduced by him into such Zone for purposes of transport.

(2) Every application for a permit in Form C shall specify—

- (a) the Intermediate Zone and the block thereof into which the applicant proposes to enter ;
- (b) the date on which the permit is required ;
- (c) the number of days for which the permit is required, and shall be accompanied by a fee according to the following rates :—

	Rs. c.
Where the applicant is a resident ..	10 0
Where the applicant is a non-resident ..	20 0

(3) No application shall be entertained by the Warden which is made more than three months before the date on which the permit is required.

(4) Where any application is rejected the Warden shall refund the fee, and in all other cases the fee shall be credited by him to the general revenue.

(5) Every permit for the purposes of this regulation shall—

- (a) be substantially in Form C set out in the schedule hereto ;
- (b) be under the hand of the Warden ;
- (c) specify the block of the Intermediate Zone into which entry is authorized thereby ;
- (d) be subject to such conditions as may be attached thereto by the Warden.

(6) No person shall be entitled to more than two permits in Form C in any one open season in respect of the same Intermediate Zone.

(7) The period during which a permit in Form C may authorize the holder to remain within an Intermediate Zone shall in no case exceed ten days.

8. The Warden may, in his discretion, include among the conditions attached by him to a permit in Form C any one or more of the following conditions :—

- (1) The permit-holder shall not enter the Intermediate Zone before the first date or remain therein after the closing date of the period specified on the face of the permit.
- (2) The permit-holder shall not do any of the acts authorized by the permit in any part of the Intermediate Zone other than the block specified on the face of the permit.
- (3) The permit-holder shall not introduce into the Intermediate Zone or tether therein any animal other than the animal or animals specified on the face of the permit.
- (4) The permit-holder shall not introduce into the Intermediate Zone any guide, carter, tracker, servant or labourer in excess of the number specified on the face of the permit.
- (5) The permit-holder shall within three days of his entering the Intermediate Zone insert, in the margin of this permit, the names of all guides, carters, servants, and labourers introduced by him under cover of this permit.

(6) The permit-holder shall—

- (a) produce this permit whenever called upon to do so by any officer appointed under the provisions of the Ordinance or the Forest Ordinance, 1907 ;
- (b) return this permit to the Warden within seven days after the date on which the permit expires or after the receipt of a notice of the revocation of the permit under section 54 of the Ordinance.

(7) The permit-holder shall not kill or shoot any wild animal of any species specified as exceptions on the face of the permit.

9. No person introduced by the holder of a permit in Form C into an Intermediate Zone shall shoot at any wild animal or discharge any firearms within that Zone.

10. No person who is not expressly authorized thereto in writing by the Warden shall take any motor vehicle or any professional hunter, or any tracker or guide other than a tracker or a guide approved by the Warden, into an Intermediate Zone.

11. (1) A holder of a permit in Form C may in addition to the trackers, guides, carters, servants, and labourers specified in the permit have a Government watcher attached to his party for the period during which the permit is in force.

(2) Where the Government watcher referred to in paragraph (1) acts as a personal tracker he may charge and levy a fee, calculated at the rate of one rupee for each day he acts as such, from the holder of the permit.

(1) The Warden may, in his discretion, determine the number of permits in Form C that may be issued in respect of any block of an Intermediate Zone or the number of persons who may be authorized to use any camping ground in an Intermediate Zone, and may reject any application for a permit received after he has issued permits or authorized persons to the number so determined by him.

(2) The Warden may, in his discretion, by notice exhibited on the spot and published in such other manner as he may consider necessary or suitable, declare any Intermediate Zone or any block thereof to be closed for any season, and when any such declaration has been made in respect of any Intermediate Zone or block, may reject any application for a permit to enter that Intermediate Zone or block.

13. With the written authority of the Government Agent, any person may clear or break up any land in an Intermediate Zone for the purpose of cultivation or mining or for any similar purpose :

Provided however that the Government Agent shall not issue any such authority to any person except with the prior approval of the Warden.

Prescribed Animals in Intermediate Zone.

14. The provisions of sections 11 (1), 11 (3), 13 (5), 15, 16, 17, 24, and 26 of Part II. of the Ordinance, relating to the hunting, shooting, killing or taking of any prescribed animal, are hereby extended to all Intermediate Zones, with the modification that the licence required under any of those provisions shall not be issued to any person other than the holder of a permit in Form C and shall not be in force for any period other than the period for which such permit is in force.

CHAPTER V.—SANCTUARIES.

15. Any person may kill or take any indigenous fish in any portion of a Sanctuary.

CHAPTER VI.—PRESCRIBED ANIMALS.

16. (1) The licence required for the purpose of section 11 of the Ordinance to hunt or take a tusker shall be substantially in Form D set out in the schedule hereto.

(2) A fee of Rs. 500 shall be paid for each licence in Form D.

17. (1) The licence required for the purposes of section 11 of the Ordinance to hunt, shoot, kill or take—

- (a) any elephant or buffalo, or
(b) at any time other than the close season, any deer or fowl,

shall be substantially in Form E set out in the schedule hereto.

(2) For each licence in Form E there shall be paid a fee calculated according to the following rates in respect of each animal which it is the intention of the applicant to shoot, kill or take :—

For each elephant to be shot at or killed	75	0	150	0
For each elephant to be captured	50	0	50	0

Provided that the fee payable for a licence to shoot fowl shall, irrespective of the number of fowls intended to be shot, be Rs. 2.50 in the case of a resident and Rs. 5 in the case of a non-resident.

18. The Warden may waive the fee payable for a licence in Form D or Form E in the following cases :—

- (a) where the Director of the Colombo Museum certifies that a prescribed animal is required for scientific study or investigation or for an educational purpose ; and
(b) Where a District Warden certifies that an applicant for a licence to capture a buffalo for agricultural purposes is by reason of his poverty unable to pay the prescribed fee.

19. (1) The licence required for the purposes of section 12 of the Ordinance to hunt, shoot, kill or take any tusker, elephant, buffalo or deer in any area declared by the Warden as an area within which damage by tuskers, elephants, buffaloes or deer is apprehended, shall be substantially in Form F set out in the schedule hereto.

(2) The Warden may, in his discretion, issue the licence in Form F free of payment or may charge a fee not exceeding the fees prescribed for the corresponding licence in regulations 1 and 2 of this Chapter, or in the case of a licence to shoot a tusker a fee not exceeding Rs. 10.

20. (1) The special licence required for the purposes of section 13 of the Ordinance to pursue any tusker or elephant found trespassing or attempting to trespass in or upon any cultivated land to any place (not being a place within a Natural Reserve) and there to shoot or kill such tusker or elephant, shall be substantially in Form G set out in the schedule hereto.

(2) A fee of Rs. 10 shall be paid for each special licence in Form G.

21. (1) Where any tusker is killed under the authority of any licence issued under the Ordinance, the holder of the licence shall be entitled to buy the tusks at such price as may be assessed by the Warden.

(2) Where the holder of a licence does not buy the tusks at the assessed value, and in every case where a tusker is killed otherwise than under the authority of a licence, the tusks shall be sold by the Warden by public auction.

22. The whole or any part of the carcass of any elephant which is the property of the Crown, or of any tusker exclusive of its tusks, may be given by the Warden free of payment to the holder of a licence who killed the elephant or tusker, or to any other person on payment of such price as may be fixed by the Warden.

23. The special permit under section 13 (2) of the Ordinance authorizing the export of a tusker shall be substantially in Form H set out in the schedule hereto.

24. The royalty to be levied under section 18 (1) of the Ordinance as the export duty on every tusker or elephant exported from the Island to any place outside the Island shall be at the following rates :—

CHAPTER VII.—BUFFALO KRAALS.

26. (1) For the purposes of section 27 of the Ordinance, a buffalo kraal shall not be deemed to have been duly held unless it has been held under the authority of a permit issued in that behalf by the Warden and in accordance with the conditions attached to that permit and with the regulations in this Chapter.

(2) Every application for a permit authorizing a buffalo kraal shall be made to the Warden through the Government Agent, shall specify the number of buffaloes required by the applicant and the purpose for which they are so required, and shall be accompanied by a fee consisting of a fixed amount of ten rupees and an amount calculated at the rate of two rupees per head of the number of buffaloes required by the applicant.

(3) In forwarding an application to the Warden the Government Agent shall not recommend the issue of a permit unless he is satisfied that in the area which is to be enclosed within the stockade, water is available in a quantity sufficient for the number of buffaloes which is likely to be driven into the stockade.

(4) Where the Government Agent does not recommend the issue of the permit for which application is made, the Warden may disallow the application and inform the applicant accordingly and shall refund the whole of the fee paid by him.

(5) Where the Government Agent recommends the issue of the permit for which application is made, the Warden shall submit the application together with his own recommendation thereon, for the decision of the Executive Committee.

(6) (a) Where the Executive Committee decides to refuse a permit, the Warden shall refund the whole of the fee paid by the applicant.

(b) Where the Executive Committee, in deciding to allow a permit, directs, on the ground that buffaloes are required for agricultural purposes or that it is desirable for any reason to reduce the number of buffaloes in that area, that such part of the fee as may have been calculated on the basis of the number of buffaloes required by the applicant shall be waived or reduced, the Warden shall refund to the applicant that part of the fee or the difference between the fee paid by the applicant and the reduced fee, as the case may be.

(c) Where the number of buffaloes captured in any kraal is less than the number required by the applicant, or where the number of buffaloes which the applicant decides to remove from the kraal is less than the number originally specified by him in his application, the Warden shall refund to him the difference between the fee paid by him and the fee payable on the basis of the number of buffaloes actually removed by him from the kraal.

(d) In all other cases the fee shall be credited to general revenue.

(7) The Warden shall not issue any permit under this Chapter, unless the Executive Committee has decided that a permit should be issued.

(8) Every permit under this Chapter shall be substantially in Form J set out in the schedule hereto, shall be under the hand of the Warden, and shall be subject to such conditions, as may be attached thereto by the Warden, relating to all such matters as to him may seem necessary, including the mode of taking the buffaloes and the period within which any buffaloes so taken should be removed from the stockade.

27. Every kraal authorized by a permit under this Chapter shall be held—

(a) in accordance with this Chapter and with such conditions as may be attached to the permit by the Warden; and

(b) under the supervision of the Government Agent and subject to such directions, not inconsistent with this Chapter or the condition attached to the permit, as may in the circumstances of each case be issued by the Government Agent.

28. For the purposes of the supervision of a kraal, the Government Agent may—

(a) by notice exhibited on the spot and published in such other manner as to him may seem expedient, declare any specified area to be the area reserved for the purposes of the kraal;

(b) regulate the entry into the reserved area of persons other than the permit-holder and the servants and beaters employed by the permit-holder, by the issue of tickets of admission free of all charges to persons approved by him or by any officer authorized by him in that behalf;

(c) require any person in the line of beaters to leave such line;

(d) cancel any ticket of admission issued to any person other than the permit-holder and require such person to leave the reserved area within a specified period, in the event of any breach on the part of such person of any of the regulations in this Chapter or of any of the conditions on which such person was admitted into the reserved area, or for other sufficient cause;

(e) regulate the erection of buildings, huts, tents, stands or other structures within the reserved area;

(f) give directions for the destruction of any diseased or injured buffalo taken in the kraal and for the disposal of the carcass of any buffalo so destroyed or killed otherwise in the course of the kraal.

29. (1) No person other than a permit-holder or a servant or beater employed by a permit-holder shall enter any reserved area unless he is the holder of a ticket of admission issued by the Government Agent or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Government Agent.

(2) No person who is required by the Government Agent to leave any reserved area or the line of beaters shall remain therein after the expiry of such period as may have been specified in the order communicated to him by the Government Agent.

30. No person shall erect any building, hut, tent, stand or other structure within any reserved area, unless he has obtained the written sanction of the Government Agent

therefor, or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as may be attached to that written sanction by the Government Agent.

31. No person in the line of beaters shall be in possession of any gun, rifle, slug, bullet or loaded cartridge, without the written permission of the Government Agent.

32. (1) The permit-holder shall not remove any buffalo from the stockade until he has obtained a pass from the Government Agent for the removal of the buffalo.

(2) Upon the removal of a buffalo from the stockade, the pass relating to that buffalo shall be surrendered by the permit-holder to the officer authorized by the Government Agent to regulate the removal of captured buffaloes.

33. Such of the buffaloes captured in a kraal, as are not required by the permit-holder or are not removed by him within the period specified in that behalf in the permit, may, at the discretion of the Government Agent, be either sold by auction or released from the stockade.

CHAPTER VIII.—BIRDS, BEASTS, AND REPTILES

34. The Warden may authorize or permit any act, which is penalized by section 28 or section 29, in the following circumstances:—

(a) when the Director of the Colombo Museum requires, for any scientific study or investigation or for any educational purpose, any bird, beast, or reptile included for the time being in Schedule I. or Schedule II. to the Ordinance, or the egg of any such bird or reptile or the nest of any such bird or beast, or

(b) when any other person requires, for the purposes of any scientific study or investigation or for any educational purpose, any bird, beast, or reptile included for the time being in Schedule I. or Schedule II. to the Ordinance, or the egg or nest of any such bird or reptile, and produces, if he is required so to do by the Warden, a certificate from the Director of the Colombo Museum that such bird, beast or reptile, or such egg or nest, is required for the purposes of any scientific study or investigation or for any educational purpose.

35. (1) (a) The permit, required by section 35 of the Ordinance, to import into the Island any living bird, beast, or reptile other than a domestic animal of a species which is not indigenous to the Island, or the eggs of any such bird or reptile, and

(b) the permit, required by section 38 of the Ordinance, to export from the Island any bird, beast or reptile, whether dead or alive; or the eggs, feathers, or plumage of any bird, the horns or skin of any beast, or the eggs or skin of any reptile, or any other part of any bird, beast or reptile,

shall be substantially in Form K set out in the schedule hereto, and shall be under the hand of the Warden.

(2) The fee payable for a permit in Form K shall be one rupee.

CHAPTER IX.—FLORA.

36. (1) The permit, required by section 40 of the Ordinance, for the purpose of authorizing any person—

(a) to remove, uproot or destroy, or cause any damage or injury to, any plant which is for the time being included in the first column of Schedule III. and—

(i.) is the property of any other person, or
(ii.) is growing in any public place, or

(b) to destroy any plant which is for the time being included in the first column of Schedule III. and is his own property, or

(c) to sell or expose or offer for sale any plant for the time being included in the first column of Schedule III., in any area specified for the time being in the second column of that schedule,

shall be substantially in Form L set out in the schedule hereto, and shall be under the hand of the Warden or the District Warden.

(2) Every permit for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1) (c)—

(a) shall be issued on payment of a fee of ten rupees; and

(b) shall be valid for such period not exceeding twelve months as may be specified therein.

(3) Every permit for any of the purposes specified in paragraphs (1) (a) and (1) (b) shall be issued free of charge.

CHAPTER X.—MISCELLANEOUS.

Licensing of Taxidermists and Traders in Animals, &c.

37. (1) The licence, required by section 47 of the Ordinance, to carry on or exercise the business or trade of a taxidermist or any business or trade for the purchase or

sale of any animal, whether dead or alive, or of any part of any dead animal, shall be substantially in Form M set out in the schedule hereto, and shall be under the hand of the Warden or of the District Warden of the area in which the business or trade is to be carried on or exercised.

(2) The fee payable for each licence in Form M shall be five rupees.

(3) Every licence in Form M shall expire on the 31st day of January of the year next succeeding the year in which it is issued.

Prohibited Roads.

38. Every notification declaring a road in any area outside a National Reserve or Sanctuary to be a prohibited road shall be published in the following manner:—

(1) by posting up notices at either end of the prohibited road and at other places, along the same road or in its neighbourhood, at which the Warden may deem it necessary or expedient to put up such notices;

(2) in such other manner as the Warden may think necessary.

Appeals to the Executive Committee.

39. (1) Every appeal to the Executive Committee under the provisions of the Ordinance shall be preferred by a written statement setting out the grounds of appeal and signed by the applicant.

(2) Every such statement shall bear a stamp of the value of one rupee.

(3) Every statement of appeal shall be delivered or sent by registered post to the Clerk of the Executive Committee within the period of fourteen days next following the date on which the decision appealed against was communicated to the applicant: Provided, however, that the Executive Committee may in its discretion consider any appeal notwithstanding that the statement of appeal was delivered or sent after the lapse of the aforesaid period of fourteen days.

Officers authorized to stop and search a Suspected Offender.

40. For the purposes of section 63, relating to the search of any person suspected of being concerned in any offence, the following officers shall be deemed to be the prescribed officers:—

- (1) all officers appointed under the Ordinance, and
- (2) all officers above the rank of Forest Guard appointed under the Forest Ordinance, 1907.

Advisory Committee.

41. (1) Each member of the Advisory Committee appointed under section 66 of the Ordinance shall hold office for a period of three years: Provided that any member may be removed from office by the Governor, or may resign his office, at any earlier time.

(2) A meeting of the Advisory Committee may be convened by the Warden by notice served on the members not less than two weeks prior to the date fixed for the meeting.

(3) The Warden shall convene a meeting in like manner whenever he is required to do so in writing by five members of the Committee.

(4) The quorum for a meeting of the Advisory Committee shall be four.

(5) The Warden shall have no original vote, but in the event of an equality of votes on any question, he shall have a casting vote.

General Provisions relating to Licences and Permits.

42. (1) No person introduced into a National Reserve by any licensee or permit-holder shall hunt, shoot, kill or take any wild animal therein.

(2) Every licensee or permit-holder shall produce his licence or permit for inspection whenever he is called upon to do so by any officer appointed or authorized under the provisions of the Ordinance or under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, 1907.

(3) Every licensee or permit-holder shall return the licence or permit within seven days after the expiry of the licence or permit or after the receipt of a notice of revocation issued under section 54 of the Ordinance, and shall forward at the same time a statement of the wild animals killed or aken by him under the authority of the licence or permit.

43. Where application for a licence or permit is made by any person to whom a licence or permit under the Ordinance or these regulations has been issued at any time prior to the date of such application, the licence or permit applied for shall not be issued unless or until the applicant has returned the earlier licence or permit and forwarded the statement in accordance with paragraph (3) of this regulation.

44. No licensee or permit-holder shall do any act authorized by the licence or permit except within the period specified therein.

45. Any licensee or permit-holder whose licence or permit is lost, destroyed or damaged, may obtain from the officer by whom the licence or permit was issued a certified copy thereof, on payment of a fee of fifty cents in addition to the stamp duty prescribed for certified copies by the Stamp Ordinance, 1909.

Conservancy and Scavenging.

1. The Chairman may, by a notice in writing served on the owner of any premises situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established, require such owner to close any cesspit that may be situated on the premises and substitute for such cesspit a pail latrine of a size and type, and in such a position on the premises, as may be approved by the Chairman.

2. Every owner on whom a notice referred to in rule 1 has been served shall duly comply with the requirements of such notice within such time, in no case to be less than one month, as may be specified in such notice.

3. No person other than a conservancy labourer, employed by the Village Committee shall remove or otherwise dispose of the night soil from any premises on which a pail latrine, in accordance with these rules, has been built.

4. Every occupier of premises served by the conservancy service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Village Committee a conservancy fee at the rate specified in the Schedule to these rules.

5. Upon the establishment of a scavenging service for the whole or any specified part of the subdivision, every occupier of any premises situated within an area for which such service has been established, shall deposit or cause to be deposited all ashes, sweepings and other refuse from his premises, in buckets or bins with suitable covers and of such shape and size as may be approved by the Chairman of the Village Committee.

6. The occupier of any premises referred to in rule 5, shall,—

(1) daily between such hours as the Chairman may from time to time notify by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, place or cause to be placed such buckets or bins by the edge of the road outside such premises but so as to cause no obstruction to traffic on the road; and

(2) remove or cause to be removed such buckets or bins, within half an hour of the emptying of such buckets or bins by the scavenging labourers of the Village Committee.

7. No person shall place any ashes, sweepings or other refuse on any road except in such buckets or bins and at such hours as are referred to in rule 6.

8. Every occupier of any premises served by the scavenging service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Village Committee a scavenging fee at the rate specified in the Schedule to these rules.

9. The conservancy fee referred to in rule 4 and the scavenging fee referred to in rule 8 shall be paid to the Chairman of the Village Committee on or before the 10th day of the month immediately following the month in respect of which they are due* provided that when the occupier has given written notice in advance to the Chairman that the premises will not be occupied during the whole of any specified month, and such occupier subsequently satisfies the Chairman that such premises were in fact not occupied during the month, no conservancy or scavenging fee shall be payable in respect of such month.

RULES made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 10 of the Launches Ordinance, 1907, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULES RELATING TO THE GRANT OF CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY TO ACT AS TINDALS OR AS ENGINEERS OF LAUNCHES.

Preliminary.

1. These rules shall come into force on the 29th day of April, 1938.

Conduct of Examinations.

2. (1) Every person desirous of obtaining a certificate of competency as a tindal or an engineer of a launch under the Ordinance shall forward to the Master Attendant of Colombo an application for the examination of his qualifications therefor and send with such application a statement of such qualifications and the fee prescribed in rule 8.

2. No person who is less than 21 years of age shall be entitled to the certificate referred to in paragraph (1) above.

3. (1) If the Master Attendant is satisfied that the application is in order, he shall appoint a day and time for the examination of the applicant, and notify the applicant of such day and time.

(2) (a) The examination for tindals shall be held at the Office of the Master Attendant, Colombo, and on board a launch.

(b) The examination for engineers shall be held at the Office of the Government Engineer, and on board a launch if the examiners think it necessary.

4. (1) An applicant failing to pass the examination shall not present himself or be permitted by the Master Attendant to present himself for re-examination until after the expiry of three months from the date of such failure.

(2) An applicant shall, on each occasion on which he presents himself for re-examination pay the fee prescribed in rule 8.

Nature and Scope of Examination for Tindals.

5. Every applicant for a certificate of competency as a tindal shall be required—

(1) to produce—

- (a) such documents as may be necessary to prove that he is over the age of 21 years; and
- (b) testimonials as to his character, sobriety, and intelligence;

(2) to pass a test as to his eye-sight and his ability to distinguish colours;

(3) to pass a *vivá voce* examination in the following :—

- (a) the regulations for preventing collision at sea;
- (b) the general management of launches;
- (c) the precautions to be exercised with regard to inflammable fuels; and
- (d) the procedure to be carried out in the event of fire; and

(4) to pass a practical test on board a launch as to his ability to handle a launch in a seaman-like manner.

Nature and Scope of Examination for Engineers.

6. Every applicant for a certificate of competency as an engineer of launches propelled by steam shall—

(1) produce—

- (a) such documents as may be necessary to prove that he is over the age of 21 years; and
- (b) testimonials as to his character, sobriety, and intelligence;

(2) produce satisfactory certificates showing that he has served as a fireman or engine attendant in a steam ship, or steam launch or a factory in which a steam engine is installed and operated, for a period of not less than 12 months, or has been actively employed in the manufacture or repair of the boilers or engines of such ships, launches or factories, for a period of not less than 2 years;

(3) be required to pass a *vivá voce* examination in the following :—

- (a) the various parts of a steam engine and their separate functions;
- (b) the interpretation of the readings on the various gauges whether fitted to the engines or to the boilers;
- (c) the procedure for starting, stopping, and running steam engines, and the functions of the different valves and cocks with which they are usually fitted;
- (d) the execution of minor maintenance repairs;
- (e) the tests for the density of the water in the boiler, and in the event of the water being too dense, the methods of blowing down and the circumstances in which such methods may be used; and
- (f) the maintenance of feed pumps or injectors in working order and the measures to be adopted in the event of their failure; and

(4) be taken on board a steam launch, if the examiners think it necessary, and be questioned on the functions of the different parts of such launch.

7. Every applicant for a certificate of competency as an engineer of launches propelled by internal combustion engines shall—

(1) produce—

- (a) such documents as may be necessary to prove that he is over the age of 21 years; and
- (b) testimonials as to his character, sobriety, and intelligence;

(2) Produce satisfactory certificates to show that he has served at least 18 months as engine attendant on a motor vessel, motor launch or factory in which a motor engine is installed and operated or has been actively engaged in the repairs and maintenance of such vessels, launches or factories for a period of not less than 2 years;

(3) be required to pass a *vivá voce* examination in the following :—

- (a) the functions of the clutch, reversing gear, carburettor, ignition system (magneto or coil) and throttle and the cycle of action in petrol engines;

- (b) the functions of the clutch and reversing gear, fuel system, governor, governor prop, compressor and valve action in heavy oil engines ;
- (c) the maintenance of the lubricating and the cooling systems of petrol and heavy oil engines in efficient working order ;
- (d) the procedure for starting, running, and stopping petrol and heavy oil engines and the sequence of operations to be followed in each case ;
- (e) the execution of minor repairs to, and the maintenance of, petrol and heavy oil engines in a clean and efficient condition ; and
- (f) the precautions to be taken against fire on vessels using petrol or other inflammable fuel and the measures to be adopted in the event of an outbreak of fire ; and
- (4) be taken on board a motor launch, if the examiners think it necessary, and be questioned on the functions of the different parts of such launch.

8. The fee for each examination or re-examination shall be at the following rates :—

10. The rules under section 10 of the Ordinance published in *Gazette* No. 6,205 of September 6, 1907, are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS under sections 18 and 23 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, in respect of the Minuwangpitiya General Cemetery situated within the administrative limits of the Panadure Urban District Council, made by the proper authority in that behalf, to wit, the Panadure Urban District Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. Every application for a grave shall be made to the cemetery-keeper not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial for which the grave is required.

2. The Cemetery-keeper shall have power to maintain order within the cemetery.

3. The cemetery-keeper may give directions as to the route to be followed by a funeral party on arrival at the cemetery.

4. (1) Where two or more funeral parties arrive at the cemetery at the same time, the cemetery-keeper may determine, and give directions as to—

(a) the order in which they shall move to the respective graves; and

(b) the order in which the respective burial services shall be held.

(2) For the purpose of preventing the disturbance of any funeral party by any other funeral party in the cemetery, and for no other purpose the cemetery-keeper may direct that a burial service shall not be commenced before the conclusion of a burial service commenced earlier.

5. Every person shall obey the directions given by the cemetery-keeper for any of the purposes of regulations 2, 3, and 4.

6. No grave shall be less than four feet in depth, or at distance of less than two feet from any other grave.

7. Except upon the orders of a competent court, no person shall reopen—

(a) any grave within a year of the burial of any dead body therein; or

(b) any vault within eighteen months of any interment therein.

8. No person shall bury or cremate a dead body in the Minuwangpitiya General Cemetery without the permission of the cemetery-keeper; and such permission shall not be granted until the fee payable under these regulations for the burial or cremation has been paid, and until the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895, has been delivered to the cemetery-keeper.

9. A fee in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule hereto, shall be paid to the cemetery-keeper by the person making the arrangements for any burial or cremation, at the time application is made by that person for permission to conduct such burial or cremation:

Provided that no fee shall be payable for the burial of—

(a) any pauper who dies in the Government Civil Hospital, and whose body is buried by the hospital contractors under the directions of the cemetery-keeper; or

(b) any deceased person whose relatives and friends are certified in writing by a Minister of any Christian denomination, or by a Mudaliyar, or by a Justice of the Peace, or by an Inquirer appointed under the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898, or by a Member or the Secretary of the Panadure Urban District Council, to be unable to pay the fee prescribed by these regulations for the burial of such person.

10. The regulations of October 28, 1904, made by the proper authority for the time being, and published in Gazette No. 6,013 of October 28, 1904, are hereby rescinded.

NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

Amendments made and allowed.

No. 2,897—*Gewerkschaft Auguste*: In pursuance of leave granted on January 13, 1938, the above-named Specification has been amended in the following manner:

Deleting claims 1 to 19 and substituting 8 new claims as follows:—

1. A process of producing hydrocarbons from carbon or carbon compounds, characterised in that the starting material is acted upon at a temperature not exceeding 390°C with methane or a gas mixture, which contains methane, under a pressure which suffices to cause a polarisation of the methane present, the molecular proportions being so chosen that under the operating conditions the free energies of the conversion reactions, which are intended to take place, correspond to a value, which, if calculated according to the method of Lewis and Randall does not exceed 5000 gram-calories per mol of hydrocarbon produced and which may also be negative.

2. A process according to claim 1, characterised in that the operation is carried through under a total pressure of more than 500 atmospheres above normal, or in the case where more than 20 per cent. by volume ethylene or acetylene are present in the methane or in the gas mixture containing methane, of more than 250 atmospheres above normal.

3. A process according to claim 1 or 2, characterised in that the partial pressure of the methane is chosen far higher than the sum of the partial pressures of the gaseous compounds reacted with it.

4. A process according to any one of the preceding claims, characterised in that the treatment is effected in the heterogeneous system, the liquid phase participating in the reaction.

5. A process according to claim 4, characterised in that the liquid phase is formed by an added substance which is liquid under the conditions of the reaction.

6. A process according to any of the preceding claims, characterised in that monovalent or polyvalent alcohols, phenols, cresols, organic acids, wood cellulose, cotton, colloidal hydrocarbons such as caoutchouc, petroleum or fractions or residues of petroleum, tars of any kind (mineral coal tar, browncoal tar, coke oven tar, wood tar, oil slate distillates), natural bitumen and/or natural asphalt or coal of any origin (mineral coal, browncoal, charcoal, lignite, peat) are used as starting material.

7. A process according to claim 5 or 6, as applied to carbon compounds which readily separate low molecular paraffine, characterised in that the liquid phase is added in the form of higher molecular paraffine or that a further liquid phase is provided.

8. A process for producing hydrocarbon substantially as hereinbefore described.

"Improvements in the construction of buildings with metal skeletons."

Abstract.—The inventors describe a mode of construction of a large shed (aeroplane hanger or the like) formed of ribs in which the vertical columns and roof trusses are of box girder construction composed of units of one or two standard lengths, the unit being made of members comprised within a minimum set of standard parts. Sheds of varying sizes may be assembled as the number of sections that form the vertical or sloping portions of the rib may be varied according to requirements. Suitable corner units, ridge units and foundation units are described and illustrated.

The mode of erection may be either by assembling the whole rib on the ground and raising it to an upright position, or by building up the upright columns (held temporarily in position by guy wires) building out the sloping portions of the roof from both sides (as cantilevers) and finally fixing the ridge unit in place. Adjacent ribs can be connected by purlins of light section, since the rigidity of the structure lies in the ribs themselves. Cross bracing may be used between the ribs or only in the end bays of the structure.

The shed may be covered over with light covering such as corrugated sheets which are also of standard dimensions.

Among the advantages claimed are facility and ease of construction under adverse conditions such as in war time, and the lightness and ease of transport of the standard units and their interchangeability. The box girder construction is claimed to give rigidity to the structure, enabling sheds of relatively large spans to be constructed.

Improvements relating to grading and like apparatus.

Abstract.—The invention relates to an apparatus for the sifting or grading of tea leaf or like material having a plurality of frames each with a different mesh arranged so that the inclination of the frames can be individually varied in the body of the apparatus. One end of each of the frames is pivotally mounted, and the other end is supported by removable pegs against the oscillating side member. By varying the angle of inclination of the frames the rate of travel of the material over the meshes can be controlled increasing the angle resulting in a diminution of the rate of travel and *vice versa*, decreasing the angle increasing the rate of travel.

The meshes can be arranged in plain or overlapping sequence. Deflector plates prevent the material passing

through any one mesh from falling on the succeeding frame. Guides are also arranged so that the material passing over the top of each frame is directed substantially over the pivotal end of the succeeding frame.

Air-Depolarized Cell and Electrodes Therefor.

Abstract.—

The invention relates to improvements in air-depolarized cells, and deals particularly with ventilation of the porous electrode, and treatment of certain portions of it to prevent creepage and/or penetration by the electrolyte.

Cells of the type referred to have usually a container, a cap for the said container, a metallic anode, a porous cathode having a shoulder bearing against the cap, and a seal which seals the electrode in the cap. A groove is generally provided in the electrode to make the seal more effective. Before assembly, the porous cathode is impregnated so as to render it impervious to the electrolyte but not to air.

The improvements embodied in the invention are as follows :—

- (a) Providing the cathode with one or more cavities extending to about the level of the electrolyte.
- (b) Treating portions of the cathode above water level (particularly portions adjacent to the groove) with a substance such as kerosene, paraffine oils, turpentine, fish oil, nitrobenzene, azoxybenzene or mixtures thereof. This treatment is additional to the impregnation referred to earlier.
- (c) Treating portions adjacent to the cavities by waterproofing material to prevent liquid infiltration. Suitable substances are benzene solutions containing rubber and an oil and paraffine dissolved in benzene. After treatment the solvent is removed by heating.

The depolarizing activity of the cell is greatly improved by the provision of the ventilating cavities. Higher concentration of treating material can be applied as in (b) to the ventilated type of electrode as the breathing action takes place largely through the holes.
