Scheme for the Improvement of Village Irrigation Works.

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, approved under section 12 (1) (b) at a meeting duly held on January 12, 1938, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Halgolla-amuna irrigation work in the Kandy District, and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, (a) a 20 ft. cement concrete anicut with 3 No. 5 ft. planked bays, (b) a plank controlled head sluice (2 ft. by 1 ft.) with silt reach and scour gate up to the estimated cost of Rs. 1,900 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part agree to repay to the Government a sum of Rs. 600 in part settlement of the cost, incurred by the Government in the construction of the items of work aforesaid, by a construction rate of Rs. 2.32 per acre per annum for a period of six years from the date of completion of the irrigation work or until this sum has been fully paid.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance, and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, (a) construction of a masonry anicut in place of the boulder dam, (b) construction of a controlled Head Sluice with silt traps, &c., up to the estimated cost of Rs. 2,999 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work free of all charges, namely, 200 cubes of earth work, all such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to repay to the Government a sum of Rs. 1,110 in full settlement of the cost, incurred by the Government in the construction of the items of work aforesaid, by a construction rate of Re. 1.73 per acre per annum for a period of ten years from the date of completion of the irrigation work or until the sum has been fully prepaid.

(4) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(5) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

Improved means and methods of drying material and more particularly for withering or drying tea.

Abstract.—The inventors describe an improvement in the method of withering tea in which the drying medium is used in a closed circuit, characterized by the use of an ordinary refrigerating or heat transfer plant.

The refrigerant (also working in a closed cycle) is pumped by means of a compressor and has its temperature raised thereby; it is now made to flow in a unit (termed the condenser) which is placed at the point where the drying medium enters the loft, so that the temperature of the drying medium is raised. The refrigerant now passes through the usual expansion valve, and then to another unit (termed the evaporator) which is placed at the point where the drying air leaves the loft. The drying air is thus cooled and deposits the moisture which it has picked up on its passage through the loft. The size of the units and/or the speed of the compressor motor and/or speed of the fans are so arranged that the mean temperature at which withering takes place is substantially kept constant and the rate of withering adjusted to dry the material in the required time. When it is required to lower the mean temperature in the withering room (irrespective of conditions outside) it is possible to cut out the condenser unit and to switch into circuit another subsidiary unit which, functioning as a condenser, will dissipate the heat to outside, instead of to the drying air. Thus the mean temperature is decreased. Matters can be arranged so that, after filling the loft with fresh leaf, the main and subsidiary units are started up so that the mean temperature falls to an optimum value. Thereafter the subsidiary unit is cut out and the other main unit is switched in so that withering takes place at the reduced temperature, the subsidiary unit being switched on from time to time whenever the mean temperature rises.

Using the same arrangement, by reversing the flow of refrigerant and the draught of air at the same time, the mean temperature of the withering air can be raised above atmospheric conditions instead of being lowered. By using two subsidiary units temperature control can be obtained in either direction with or without reversal of flow of refrigerant and air. Temperature control in either direction can also be obtained by the use of a single subsidiary unit, if suitable piping, valves, &c. are used for either direction of flow of refrigerant and drying air.

The various controls can be operated by hand or automatically. Any of the known devices may be used, such as devices depending for their action on wet and dry bulb temperatures, rate of loss of weight of tea leaf held on a balance, &c. These may be used to control the flow of refrigerant and/or the volume of air passing through the loft. The subsidiary unit may be controlled by devices depending on the humidity, temperature, &c., of the drying air, or the humidity or temperature of outside air.

When the temperature at which the withering is to take place is substantially different from that of the outside, the conduits of the drying medium should be suitably lagged. Shutters can be provided so that when conditions are favourable controlled or natural wither can take place with or without the conditioning of the air.

The inventors state that by suitable modifications and choice of the refrigerant, the above invention can be applied to the firing process also.

Improvements in and relating to apparatus for the treatment of rubber latex.

Abstract.—The inventor describes a settling tank for removing impurities from rubber latex having a conical bottom and a detachable sludge trap at the foot, a valve controlled inlet being in the vicinity of the conical bottom, and an outlet near the sludge trap, means being furnished within the tank (which is preferably closed) for isolating the bulk of the latex from impurities settled in the trap. The tank may form part of apparatus described in application No. 2,978.

Preferably the settling tank is of cylindrical form of capacity about 10,000 gallons with a bottom of the shape of the frustrum of an inverted cone. The cylindrical sludge trap of capacity 2.4 per cent. of the total capacity

of the tank is fixed to the circular opening at the bottom of the cone, and a poppet valve is provided which could isolate the sludge trap from the rest of the tank when required. A stirring device is provided in the tank which takes the form of two perforated discs suspended in counter-poise within the tank.

In use, the tank is charged from a suitable delivery flume with stabilised latex, the stirrers and the dished plate forming the head of the valve having first been raised to a position rear the cover of the tank. After three to seven days, samples are drawn from different layers through discharge cocks placed for the purpose. If desired, latex of higher concentration may be drawn off from the top. The poppet valve is now closed, the latex gently agitated, and the tank emptied into drums for shipment. The sediment may be drawn off from the trap (which has a sloping bottom) and utilized in the manufacture of lower grade crepe.

Improvements in or relating to the treatment of rubber latex.

Abstract.—The inventor describes a process for treating latex before shipment.

The day's collection of latex as brought in is passed through a filter into a reception or ammoniation tank having a capacity preferably of 1,000 gallons. In the tank ammoniating or otherwise rectifying the pH value of the latex takes place. Preferably a predetermined quantity of ammonia is passed to the bottom of the tank through a hose having a perforated distributor. A stirring plate is also provided and is to be used after the requisite amount of ammonia has been added.

From the reception tank the latex is lifted by means of a chamber operated by compressed air to a distributing flume and is passed on to a battery of settling tanks with sludge traps described in application No. 2,977. From these, after settling, the latex is run off into drums through a discharging device, the latex passing through two filters and a screen (to withhold froth) before passing into the drums through pipes leading to the bottom of the drums.

The discharge arrangement takes the form of a wheeled vehicle with pneumatic tyres carrying the discharge flume, strainers, &c., and can be moved into position so as to empty any one of the settling tanks. Arrangements are described for thoroughly washing and flushing out the settling tanks with water.

Improvements in or relating to shot gun cartridges.

Abstract.—The invention relates to making waterproof shot gun cartridges and consists in making both the tubular portion forming the case and the end closure out of thermoplastic mixtures such as are described in specification No. 2,981 and joining the two together by heat under pressure or by cementing.

According to one method, the case is first filled in, and a card (overshot card) is placed on top of the shot. The edges of the case are now turned over or crimped, and the cartridge placed in a suitable water cooled die. A steam heated punch is now brought to bear on the crimped portion, so that the thermoplastic substance flows over the overshot card and forms a seal. Cooling water may now be circulated through the punch and the cartridge removed. By varying the length of the portion that is crimped or turned over the bursting pressure of the cartridge can be adjusted. Alternatively, the punch may be so formed as to leave an annular groove in the end closure, or a suitable groove may be machined on the case after manufacture.

According to another method, a disc of plastic material may be placed on the overshot card and the plastic surfaces of the disc and case joined by the use of a solvent. Instead of a plastic disc a quantity of moulding powder treated with solvent may be used.

In a further modification, the plastic disc and the portion of the case that is turned over may be cemented together with waterproof adhesive. It is also possible to make the case as a cup shaped unit, and having filled it, to close it by means of a closure member containing the percussion cap; the closure member, which is preferably also of moulded plastic material, may be bounded to the case, by suitable cement, or by the use of an adhesive.

Improvements in or relating to the manufacture of cartridge cases.

Abstract.—The inventor states that though mouldable material such as cellulose, cellulose acetate, cassein and the like have been proposed as material suitable for cartridge cases, commercially successful cases have not so far appeared on the market. The reason for this is that, as the cartridge experiences an internal pressure of the order of half a ton per square inch at the moment of firing, cases made of substances mentioned will not be able to contract sufficiently after the pressure is removed to ensure easy ejection.

Satisfactory cases can be made by the use of a thermo-plastic mixtures containing:—(a) a binder such as cellulose acetate, cellulose derivative or mixed esters or ethers of cellulose, or vinyl or acrylic acid derivatives, (b) a plasticiser or plasticisers such as tri-ethyl-citrate, triacetin ethyl phthalate, di-amyltartrate, tri-phenyl phosphate, or, tri-cresyl phosphate and (c) a filler or fillers such as ground cereal, french chalk, carbon black and the like.

The essence of the invention lies in the correct proportioning of the plasticiser and binding medium. The ratio should be 45-75 parts of the former to 100 parts of the latter. The filler should preferably not exceed 75 per cent. of the binding medium. The usual methods employed in the manufacture of products moulded from cellulose derivatives may be used in making the cartridge cases. When it is required to make the cases water resisting, non-hygroscopic substances such as french chalk, carbon black, &c. may be used alone or in combination with wheat flour or other cereals as the filler. Such cartridge cases have been found to be as water resisting as metal case.

Three examples of mixtures suitable for ordinary cartridge cases are given, and one example of a mixture suitable for water proof cases.

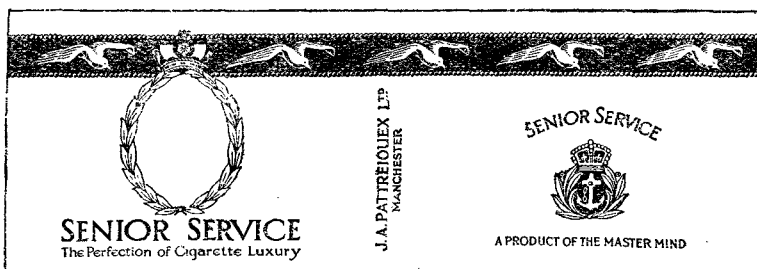

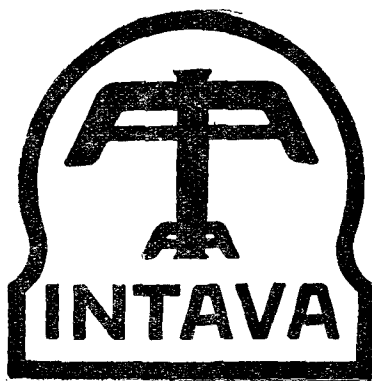
