BY-LAWS.

1. In these by-laws "side drain" means a drain which runs along the side of any public street, road, or path.
2. No person shall drive or lead a vehicle over or across a side drain except at such places as are provided with a bridge, platform, or other structure designed to protect the drain and to facilitate such crossing.
3. No person shall construct or place over a side drain any bridge, platform, or other structure of any kind except with the written consent of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions and such directions as to the manner of construction as he may impose or issue.
4. Where the Chairman is of opinion that a bridge, platform or other structure should be constructed over any side drain in order to provide access to any building or premises adjoining such drains he may by written notice direct the owner of the building or premises to construct such bridge, platform or other structure.
5. The occupier of every building or premises to which access from any street is provided by means of a bridge, platform or other structure placed over any side drain, shall keep such bridge, platform or other structure at all times clean and free of any vegetation, refuse or other matter which is likely to fall into the drain or to cause any obstruction to the flow of water therein or any damage thereto.
6. Where the Chairman is of opinion that any bridge, platform or other structure constructed over any side drain for the purpose of providing access to any building or premises adjoining the side drain, is defective or in an unsatisfactory condition, he may by written notice direct the owner of the building or premises or the occupier thereof if such occupier is responsible for the maintenance and repairs of the bridge, platform or other structure, to carry out such works of repair, renovation, or construction as may be necessary for the protection of the side drain.
7. If the Chairman is of opinion that any building or premises used for any purpose whatsoever is from lack of adequate means of drainage likely to expose the inmates thereof to risk of disease or to endanger the public health, he may by written notice require the owner or owners or occupier or occupiers of any such building or premises to build any new drains or to improve, alter, repair, rebuild or fill up any existing drain or to take such other measures for the improvement of the drainage of the premises as may be specified in the notice.

8. It shall be lawful for the Chairman by written notice to require the owner or owners of any yard or ground adjoining a building or the owner or owners of any alley, road, or path between buildings or ranges of buildings—

- (a) to have such yard, ground, alley, road, or path paved to a distance not exceeding 15 feet from any such building or buildings or range of buildings as the case may be, with stone, concrete, asphalt or brickwork rendered with cement or other impervious, hard and durable material approved by the Chairman; and
- (b) to lay sufficient drains or pipes for the purpose of draining such yard, ground, alley, road, or path.

within such reasonable time and in such manner as may be specified in the notice.

9. Every person served with a notice under any of the foregoing by-laws shall comply with the requirements thereof within the time specified therein, or, if no time limit is specified, then within a reasonable time.

10. When any person served with a notice under any of the foregoing by-laws makes default in complying with the requirements thereof, the Chairman may cause the work specified in the notice to be carried out by the officers and servants of the Council, and the expenses incurred therein shall be recoverable from the defaulter.

11. No person shall, without the written permission of the Chairman—

- (a) lead or connect any drain or pipe from any private premises to or with any side drain or public sewer, or
- (b) fill up, divert, alter, reconstruct or in any way interfere, with, any drain, sewer, or pipe.

12. Every contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

BY-LAW.

The by-laws under sections 163, 164, and 168 (12) of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, published in *Gazette* No. 8,057 of June 8, 1934, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) by the substitution, for by-laws 2, 3, 4, and 5 thereon of the following new by-laws:—

"2. No person shall, within the market area defined in by-law 1, sell or expose or offer for sale any meat, poultry, fresh fish, fruits or vegetable at any place other than the Public Markets: Provided that nothing in this by-law shall apply to—

- (a) the sale of pork, fruits or vegetables at authorized premises in accordance with a licence issued by the Chairman;
- (b) the sale of fruits at any licensed eating-house or tea or coffee boutique for consumption on the premises;
- (c) the sale of young coconuts at any place within the market area; or
- (d) the sale of poultry, fruit or vegetables by itinerant vendors who do not sell at fixed places, or do not for the purposes of such sale establish themselves on the public roads or other public places.

3. (1) The licence referred to in paragraph (a) of the proviso to by-law 2 shall be issued by the Chairman in every case in which the Council is satisfied that sufficient facilities are not afforded for the public requirements of the market area by the public markets and any other authorized premises.

- (2) Every licence referred to in paragraph (1) shall—
- (a) be substantially in the form set out in the schedule hereto ;
 - (b) be in force for such period exceeding one month and not exceeding twelve months as may be specified in the licence ; and
 - (c) be paid for in advance at the rate of 50 cents for each month for which it is to be in force.

4. (1) Every licensee shall have his name and the names of his salesmen registered at the office of the Council.

(2) No salesman whose name is not registered at the office of the Council shall take part in any sale in any licensed premises.

5. Every contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws shall, if such contravention is not punishable under section 162 of the Ordinance, be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.” ;

(ii) It shall be the duty of the occupier of every grain store in respect of which an order has been made under sub-paragraph (i), to permit the officer or person authorized by the proper authority to enter the grain store and carry out such order, and to render to that officer or person such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of carrying out the order.” ;

- (b) by the substitution for paragraph (c) (10) thereof of the following :—

“(10) Where human or rat plague occurs or is suspected to have occurred at any grain store or at any place within a distance of 100 feet from any grain store, it shall be lawful for the Chairman—

- (a) to order any officer or person authorized thereto by him to carry out any one or more of the following measures in respect of that store or any store adjacent thereto :—

- (i) the disinfection of all grain kept in the store by exposure to the direct rays of the sun ;
- (ii) the disinfection of the store and all grain therein by fumigation or by such other means as may be specified by the Chairman ;
- (iii) the treatment of the store with a pulicide ; and

- (b) to order the owner, lessee or occupier of that store or of any store adjacent thereto, at his own expense, to remove all grain from the store or to clean and repair the store in such manner as may be specified by the Chairman.”

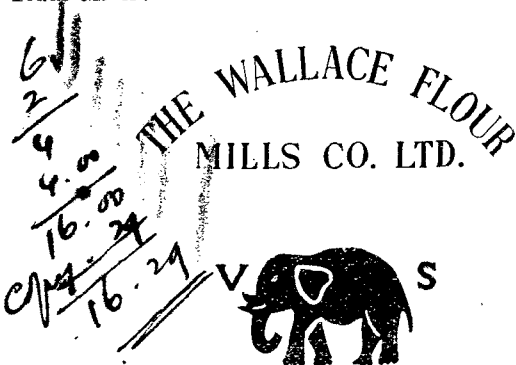

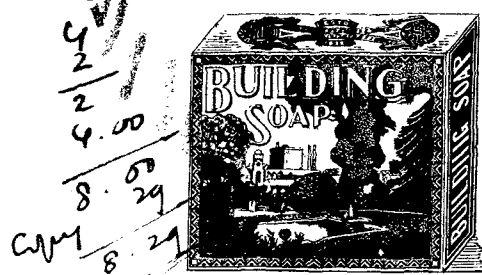

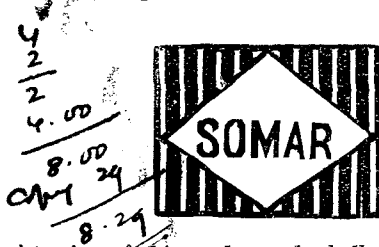

Agostino Rocca.

Machine for coating metal cores with a cement plaster.

Abstract.—The invention relates to machines for forming a cement layer on cylindrical cores. In known machines, the cement (such as asbestos cement) is applied either by the "couple winding process" in which a belt is made to partly embrace the core and feed the cement thereon, or by the "contact process" in which there is only a line contact between the feeding belt and core.

One of the disadvantages of these methods lies in the fact that the cement layer as it is formed tends to take up a conical form, with the result that the pressure on the layer is not evenly distributed along the contact. Elastic coverings on the rollers have been proposed as a means to overcome this defect but are not altogether satisfactory. The main feature of the present invention lies in mounting the rollers pivotally on forks so that the rollers assume the same inclination to the axis of the core as the cement layer itself, and thereby exert substantially even pressure along the lines of contact.

A second feature of the invention is the provision of self centering devices whereby the two rollers on opposite sides of the core move equal distances radially. Pressure is applied to these rollers by hydraulic means, but the two are mechanically interlinked. In the link mechanism, as aforesaid, suitable elastic means may be incorporated so that one roller may move temporarily out of place (due to a hard lump, for instance, in the cement) without affecting the other roller.

As an extension of the above principle, when tubes of relatively large diameter are coated, one or both of these rollers may be replaced by an interlinked pair of rollers. Suitable link mechanism is described for keeping the movement of the rollers radial, irrespective of the diameter of the coated core. Each roller may be a contact roller, or a pair may form a couple winding element.

Large cores in the process of being coated may be supported by a supplementary belt over two rollers mounted on forks the axes of which are inclined at equal angles in opposite senses to the direction of the axis of the core. This belt passes over idler pulleys and a main pulley which may or may not be driven. If the latter, rotary and transitional movement is imparted to the core by this means, which reduces the strain on main belt, and the strain tangential to the plaster in the formation zone.

Improvements in or relating to rails.

Abstract.—The object of this invention is to prevent rail creep. Two main members of L section abut upon the webs of the two rails, and form with the two inner fish plates and two diagonal members a rigid rectangular

framework. Such frameworks are bolted on at intervals of 20 to 30 rail joints apart. Rail creep is prevented but normal movement of rails due to temperature changes is permitted and the rails are maintained in correct spaced relationship.

A method of and means for storing and/or displaying articles in showrooms, ware-rooms and the like.

Abstract.—The object of this invention is to economize space in storing or displaying articles. In known methods, articles are stored in fixed shelves in parallel rows, with gangways between. The inventor proposes to place the rows in juxta-position, but to have the back row of shelves fixed, and the front rows made up of movable shelves or units; the total width of any of the front rows being less than the width of the back row by at least the width of one movable unit. In the centre of a room two fixed rows may be placed back to back, and rows of movable shelves placed in front of each. If there are pillars in the building supporting the floor above, the fixed shelves may be built in between the pillars, and movable units may be placed so that in the normal or "at rest" position alternate spaces are left between the movable shelves equal to the width of a unit, and intermediate spaces equal to half the width or thereabouts. This facilitates handling as the operator can pull against a unit in one row while pushing against that in front of it, in the next row.

For displaying small articles, posters, &c., which can be pinned to boards, the board at the back is made into a continuous fixed unit, and smaller movable units or boards are arranged in front, with a canopy from which changing coloured electric light may be thrown on to the articles displayed. Suitable mechanism is described for moving the units in a predetermined sequence.

When the units of a warehouse are too large to be handled they may be moved to and fro by being clutched on to moving endless ropes or bands. The units are provided with suitable brakes, buffers handles or handholes and are adapted to run on rails laid on the floor.

Improvements in concentrating latex.

Abstract.—Rubber latex is concentrated by causing a film of substantially uniform thickness to raise by rotation about a vertical axis and removing volatile constituents from the film by evaporation. The term latex includes natural and artificial dispersions of rubber guttapercha and the like.

Latex is continuously supplied by a pipe to the bottom of a paraboloidal vessel which is rotated about its vertical axis. The rotation causes latex to rise in a thin film along the inner surface of the vessel and to flow over the top of the vessel into a circular gallery having an outlet pipe. The outside of the vessel is heated by means of a water jacket, and the interior by heated air passing down a pipe which surrounds the latex input pipe. To prolong the period during which the latex is exposed to evaporation deflector blades are arranged at intervals which just clear the inner surface of the rotating vessel and deflect some of the latex back to the base of the vessel.

Improvements in concentrating latex.

Abstract.—This is a modification of British Patent No. 454326 in the following respects:—(a) provision is made for the hot air to be given a swirling motion and to flow in close contact with the latex film (b) the vessel, which is water jacketed, is made stationary, and a structure provided with vanes is made to rotate in it so that the latex is spread by the vanes over the inner surface of the vessel

as a thin film (c) the containing vessel needs to approximate only to the paraboloidal shape and may conveniently have a hemispherical lower part and a frustro-conical upper part.

Latex is introduced into a sump at the base of the vessel, and rises by gravity till it comes under the action of the vanes. The vanes closely follow the contour of the vessel and sweep the latex into a thin film, progressing it upwards into the lid from which it escapes through an outlet conduit. Hot air introduced through a pipe rising through the bottom of the vessel, impinges on a conical disc which forms the base of a frustro-conically shaped drum. This drum with the vanes attached forms the rotating structure mentioned earlier.

The hot air is constrained to pass between the outer surface of the drum and the inner surface of the vessel, and thereby comes into close contact with the film of latex. Moreover, the vanes impart a swirling motion to the air, and this accelerates the process of concentration.
