Surveying and Levelling Examination.

THE examination for the Surveyor-General's licence in surveying and levelling (Ordinance No. 26 of 1909), will be held in two parts, written and practical. The written examination will begin on October 17, and the practical examination on November 14, 1938.

Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage. Averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.

Algebra.—Symbolical expression of general results in arithmetic algebraic laws and their applications. Factors of simple binomial or quadratic expressions; Equations of the first or second degree, and problems leading thereto. Square root. Graphs of simple rational integral algebraic functions. Arithmetical and harmonical progression. Geometrical progression. Theory of indices, Logarithms and the use of logarithmic tables. Binomial theorem for a positive integral index.

(iii.) *Geometry and Trigonometry*.—one paper.

[*Geometry*.—The subjects of Euclid I.—IV., with simple deductions, including easy loci and the areas of triangles and parallelograms, of which the bases and altitudes are given commensurable lengths. (All proofs of geometrical theorems must be geometrical. Euclid's proofs will not be insisted upon.) Similar figures. Mensuration of the circle. Mensuration of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including the solution of triangles, together with the practical solutions of triangles and applications, and numerical examples involving the use of logarithmic and other tables.]

(iv.) *Surveying*.—one paper.—[Chain surveying. The transit and cradle theodolites, their use and their adjustments. Theodolite and compass traverses. Curve ranging. Subtense methods and tachometry. Plane table surveying. Plane triangulation. The determination of azimuth by astronomical observations.]

(v.) *Levelling*.—one paper.—[The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of levelling. Computation of earthwork. Road and railway surveys and setting out. Surveys for water supply works. Contours and the calculation of contents therefrom.

The percentages of marks required for a pass will be: in papers (i.), (ii.), and (iii.) 40 per cent. in each paper and 50 per cent. in aggregate; in papers (iv.) and (v.) 60 per cent.

The following motion which stood in the name of the Chairman was deferred for consideration at the next meeting :—“Whereas the meaning of resolution 5B of November 21, 1936, is obscure, and whereas its present interpretation under which details of the bookings of the grounds have to be referred to a Committee—has caused much delay and inconvenience to the general public; this Council is of opinion that henceforth the details of bookings should be left to the Chairman, who will consult the Special Committee only if questions of policy are involved. It is also of opinion that the control of the staff should be in the hands of the Chairman and the Works Engineer subject to any general directions which the Committee may convey to them. The Council is further of opinion that, while it has full confidence in the ability of the Committee to act in its best interests, the ultimate control—particularly as regards finance—should be in its own hands.”

Resolution on item (26).

The Chairman tabled a further letter received from Dr. Spaar.

Resolved that the Chairman do inspect and the work be put in hand at once if found necessary and the papers be circulated.

Resolution on item (30).

Resolved that the sum of Rs. 125 be provided as a transfer from Estimate 42/1935.

6. To approve of the draft of agreement proposed to be entered into with Mr. K. K. N. M. Sheikh Mohammed Saibo in respect of the lease to him of an encroachment he has made opposite premises No. 9, Matale road. (O 341).—Resolved that the draft be approved.

7. To appoint a Medical Officer for Maternity and Child Welfare Service. (O 720)—14 applications received were tabled, and three candidates, *viz.*, Dr. M. D. S. Suriyawansa, D.P.H. (London), L.M.S. (Ceylon); Dr. H. M. Vanderwall, D.P.H. (London), L.M.S. (Ceylon); Dr. E. I. B. Seneviratne, L.M.S. (Ceylon); selected by the Chairman, the Provincial Surgeon, and the Medical Officer of Health, after an interview were voted on by ballot. The result of the ballot was as follows :—Dr. Suriyawansa, 6 votes; Dr. Vanderwall, 1 vote; Dr. Seneviratne, 3 votes.

The Chairman declared Dr. Suriyawansa duly appointed for the post, in terms of the advertisement dated March 8, 1938.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office, on Friday, May 20, 1938, at 2.30 p.m.

Present: Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. A. C. Mohammado; Mr. Thomas Amarasureiya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratne; Mr. W. Dahanayake; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. G. Ross Bell; Mr. J. C. Cooper; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting held on April 1, 1938, and of the Special Meeting held on May 3, 1938, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayake asked the following questions:—(a) Has the Chairman obtained particulars from various Municipal employees with regard to their indebtedness? (b) Is it true that in some cases the Chairman has asked the employees concerned to show cause why they should not be discontinued? (c) Would it not be better to help such employees to tide over their present difficulties, and warn them only as regards indebtedness in the future?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) Yes. (b) Yes. (c) This is a matter of opinion.

3. The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayake was ruled out of order by the Chairman on the ground that the Council, by a previous resolution, had already decided the matter:—“That members of this Council should not give recommendations, certificates of character, &c., to those who are applicants for posts in the Municipality”.

4. Considered the recommendations made by the Four Standing Committees on January 28, 1938, with regard to the question of amending regulation 89 of the regulations made in August, 1925, under the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897:—

Grain Stores.

With regard to regulation 10 it was resolved by 8 votes to 3 that the recommendation be adopted.

With regard to regulation 15 it was resolved that the enforcement thereof be suspended pending the construction of Municipal Grain Stores.

With regard to the remaining regulations it was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

Grain Boutiques.

With regard to regulation 12 it was resolved by 10 votes to 2 that the recommendation be adopted.

With regard to the regulation 13 it was resolved by 9 votes to 3 that the recommendation be adopted.

With regard to regulation 16 it was resolved by 10 votes to 2 that the recommendation be adopted.

With regard to regulation 17 the Chairman moved that the recommendation be disapproved and that no amendment be made.—Carried by 9 votes to 3.

With regard to the remaining regulations it was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

5. Considered the following extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 22, 1938:—“Considered the report of the Assistant Chairman on the proposed office collection system.—Recommended, in view of the report, that no change be made in the present system”.

Mr. W. Dahanayake moved as an amendment “that the office collection system of rates and conservancy fees, as outlined by the Accountant in his report dated July 28, 1937, be adopted as early as possible, and that a rebate of 2 per cent. be given to all payers at the office”, but the amendment fell through for want of a seconder. The recommendation of the Standing Committee was then put to the meeting and adopted by 11 votes to 1, Mr. W. Dahanayake dissenting.

6. To submit letter dated April 7, 1938, from Dr. F. Abeysuriya regarding the late Mr. G. E. Ludowyk, Manager, Conservancy Department.—Submitted.

7. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of May 11, 1938.*

(2) Considered Audit Query No. 62 I.M. regarding expenditure on works in excess of the accepted tenders.—Recommended that the total excess expenditure amounting to Rs. 232.31 be sanctioned.

(3) Considered a letter from the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, suggesting the adoption of the system of no parking on either side of Main street on alternate days owing to the congestion of traffic.—Recommended (1) that the system be adopted in respect of that section of Main street lying between Dickson road and Talapitiya Cross road, and (2) that the draft by-law and the draft regulation under the Vehicles Ordinance and the Motor Car Ordinance respectively be approved.

(4) Considered the desirability of reserving space on the Esplanade for the parking of motor cars.—Recommended that a strip of land be marked out along the Minor Esplanade to serve as a parking ground for cars.

(5) Considered an estimate of Rs. 400 for constructing two lengths of roadside retaining walls on Elliott road near the bungalow of Mr. J. A. de Silva.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that a supplemental vote be sanctioned.

(6) Considered an estimate of Rs. 262 for repairs to the tunnel at the Hiyare Reservoir.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that a supplemental vote be sanctioned.

(7) Considered the question of installing meters in premises where there is an excessive consumption of water.—Recommended that in terms of by-law 20 of the water service by-laws, meters be installed in the following six premises where it has been found that the consumption is excessive:—17, Rampart street (Mr. H. de S. Kularatne), 26, Lighthouse street (Mr. H. Jayasundera), 22, Church street (Mercantile Bank), 15, Queen street (Clark Spence's bungalow), 41, Lighthouse street (Mr. S. S. Sultan Bawa), and 13, Cloisenberg road (Mrs. Francis Perera).—Recommended, further, that a supplemental vote of Rs. 250 be sanctioned for the purchase of six $\frac{3}{4}$ in. meters.

(8) Considered the procedure to be adopted in future in carrying out works on contract.—Recommended (1) that a fee not exceeding Rs. 2 be charged for each tender form and specification; (2) that at the time of submitting their tenders all tenderers be required to make a deposit of Rs. 10 which will be returned to them after the acceptance of a tender; (3) that the successful tenderer be required to deposit 5 per cent. of the estimated cost of the work as security for the due performance of the contract; (4) that 5 per cent. be deducted from all payments due to the contractor as “retention money”; and (5) that the Municipal Engineer be instructed to keep a Register of approved contractors.

Resolution.

With regard to item (3) Mr. W. Dahanayake moved as an amendment that the Muslim Merchants' Chamber, the Galle Merchants' Chamber, and the Swadeshiya Traders' Union be written to for their opinions on the system recommended by the Superintendent of Police. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, and Mr. E. M. Karunaratne supported the amendment which was then put to the meeting and carried.

With regard to item (7) it was resolved that the supplemental vote be increased to Rs. 350 as the Municipal Engineer had since reported that the cost of each meter is Rs. 57.

With regard to item (8) (5) it was resolved that consideration be postponed for the present.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of May 11, 1938.*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Ward No. 7 for first quarter, 1938.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) Considered what action should be taken with regard to the following properties which have been purchased by and vested in the Council for non-payment of rates:—228E, 228F, 228G, and 228D, Galupiadde.—Recommended that the properties be put up for sale by public auction.

(4) Considered the terms of appointment of Dr. N. de Fonseka as Acting Medical Officer of Health from May 2 to May 26, 1938.—Recommended that Dr. de Fonseka be paid a salary of Rs. 10 per day (including Sundays) and a travelling allowance of Rs. 50 for the period.

(5) Considered the question of recovering conservancy fees for 1938 according to the annual value of houses for 1937.—Recommended that, in view of the revision of assessments, conservancy fees for 1938 be recovered according to the annual values of premises for 1937 except in cases where it will be necessary to reduce the fee as a result of a reduction in the annual value.

(6) Considered an application from the Honorary Secretary, Galle Friend-in-Need Society for an increased grant.—Recommended that the grant be increased from Rs. 750 to Rs. 1,000 with effect from 1938.

(7) Considered an application from Mr. V. B. Sathe, Municipal Engineer, to be paid the travelling expenses of himself and his family from Jalgaon (India) to Galle.—Recommended that Mr. Sathe be paid a sum of Rs. 294.36 as per statement of particulars submitted by him.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayake asked the following questions:—(1) (a) What is this Council's rule about the passing cows for slaughter? (b) Was this rule broken recently, leading to a threatened breach of the peace? (c) In view of very strong objections from Buddhists and Hindus to the slaughtering of cows and also for economic reasons, will the Chairman please see that no cows whatsoever are passed for slaughter in future whether or not they be in a state of pregnancy?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) By-law 2 of Chapter VII. which provides that the Medical Officer of Health shall inspect the animals brought to the Municipal cattle pound for slaughter and shall reject all cows in calf. (b) There is no rule or by-law prohibiting the slaughter of cows. In 1934, on the suggestion of the Honourable the Minister for Agriculture and Lands, the Council resolved to amend by-law 2 of Chapter VII. so as to prevent the slaughter of cows, but the Attorney-General ruled that the proposed amendment is not within the scope of the existing law. (c) Does not arise.

9. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayake moved:—(1) That By-laws 9 and 10 of Chapter VI. be amended by the deletion of the words "or fish" so as to permit the hawking of fish without a special licence from the Council. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded. Mr. J. E. Perera suggested that permits be issued without the payment of any fee. The Chairman explained that in accordance with a resolution of 1931 the practice was to issue permits only to stall-holders of the fish market on payment of a fee of 50 cents a month. He had no objection to the issue of free permits, but he certainly objected to unrestricted hawking. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 9 against. Mr. Dahanayake called for a division which resulted as follows:—For: Messrs. W. Dahanayake, F. Magdon Ismail, and A. I. H. A. Wahab. Against: The Chairman, and Messrs. J. E. Perera, Thomas Amarasuriya, A. C. Mohammado, E. M. Karunaratne, G. Ross Bell, J. C. Cooper, R. L. Ephraums, and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

(2) That a Special Committee of this Council do inquire into and report on the allegations of bribery and corruption made against an officer of this Council by five contractors, and that the report and recommendations of this Special Committee be made available to the Council in time for its next General Meeting.—Mr. Wahab seconded, and Mr. F. Magdon Ismail supported the motion. Messrs. J. E. Perera and Thomas Amarasuriya also spoke. The Chairman said that there was no reason why there should be any departure from the ordinary procedure whereby petitions of this nature would be inquired into by the Chairman. After discussion Mr. E. M. Karunaratne moved as an amendment that the petition be inquired into by the Chairman in the first instance and that the report be submitted to the Council. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. The mover said he had no objection to the amendment provided that the petition would be inquired into by the Chairman personally. The amendment was then put to the meeting and carried.

10. The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayake was withdrawn by the mover on the Chairman pointing out that the Commissioner of Local Government had written that there was no intention of extending the Council's term of office by more than a few months only:—"This Council strongly objects to the extension of the term of its office by more than four months, which, it has been calculated is the maximum extension necessary for the introduction of reforms".

11. To submit letter No. B. 901 of May 11, 1938, from the Commissioner of Local Government regarding the amendments desired by the Council to sections 10 and 67 of Ordinance No. 60 of 1935.—Submitted.

12. To approve the appointment of six temporary clerks at Rs. 1.50 each a day in connection with the preparation of the voters' and Councillors' list under Ordinance No. 60 of 1935:—(1) Approved. (2) Resolved that a supplemental vote of Rs. 1,000 be sanctioned for expenses in connection with the application of Ordinance No. 60 of 1935 to Galle.

13. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council. Agreed that the next General Meeting be held on June 17, 1938, at 2.30 P.M.

14. The following documents were laid on the table:—

- (1) Statements of receipts and disbursements to the end of March and April, 1938.
- (2) Progress report of works done on estimates during April, 1938.
- (3) Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on Carriages plying for hire during April, 1938.
- (4) Report of the Superintendent of the Electricity Department.
- (5) Diaries of (a) the Medical Officer of Health; (b) the Municipal Engineer; (c) the Inspector of Works; and (d) the Manager, Health Department.

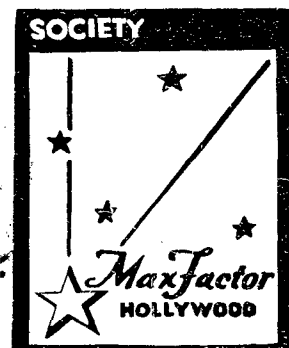

He will also be required to deposit money to pay the fees of the Crown Counsel for examining and giving his opinion on the title deeds of properties tendered by him as security, and for examining and settling the security bond, and the fees charged by the Crown Counsel for examining documents and drawing the security bond and also the expenses of appraising the properties and of registering the security bond.

5. He will be further required to furnish through his Proctor a warrant of attorney to confess judgment on Form G.A. C 81 (*vide* article 2, Conditions of Sale of the Ferry Tolls).

6. All title deeds tendered as security should be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the Registrar of Lands that the lands to which they relate are unencumbered.

This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering security.
