- (b) declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the First day of January, 1939.

SCHEDULE.

Schedule I. to the Proclamation dated September 12, 1935, is hereby amended by the substitution, for the definition of Weligama town in the Matara District of the Southern Province, therein appearing and reproduced in Column I. of the definition appearing in Column II. hereunder.

Column I.

Limits as defined by Proclamation dated September 12, 1935.

Weligama town comprising the area within the following boundaries:—

North: Midellawela, Kumburuyaya, Pahalawela, Medawela, Ihalawela, Patawatta, Hapuwagewatta, Tandalaowita, Kotudurageliyadde, Indipelawatta, and Godellawatta.

East: Dutch canal, Polwatta-ganga, Bandarakelle, Denepitiya, Gandaharawatta, and Pelabandarawatta.

South: The seashore from Pelabandarawatta to Managewellahena.

West: Managewellahena, Tummuniyamulla, culvert on the high road. Hellawa, Manawanagahakumbura, Medahena, Ambagahakanattadeniya, Deniyawatta, Talbot estate, Epitawatta, Usgodawatta, Acharigewatta, Orawelawatta, Upasekagoda, Korahakumbura, Medagodahena, and path from Medagodahena to Dempeyaya.

PILGRIMAGE TO THE DEWUNDERA SRI VISHNU Maha Dewale.

Rules made under Pilgrimages Ordinance, No. 13 of 1896.

In the event of any disease of a contagious, infectious, or epidemic nature breaking out at Dondra or in its vicinity before or during the pilgrimage or at any other place in the Southern Province, from which, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, it is likely to be conveyed to Dondra during the pilgrimage, it shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to prohibit the pilgrimage or to declare the pilgrimage at an end, and to direct all visitors to leave Dondra at once, and return to their homes and to prescribe the routes by which they shall travel. Any person disobeying the order of the Assistant Government Agent shall be guilty of an offence.

2. Any person suffering from an infectious or contagious

disease, and not forthwith reporting the same to the Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence to the senior officer of Police present at Dondra, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such

disease, shall be guilty of an offence.

- 3. Any person selling meat, fish, or fresh vegetables at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board, and any person selling meat, food, or drink of any kind condemned as unwholesome by a Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence by the Mudaliyar or senior officer of Police present at Dondra, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 4. All cakes, sweetmeats, and other food stuffs exposed for sale at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases or other fly-proof receptacles. All such receptacles shall be kept clean.
- The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds 5. used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the erection of proper latrine accommodation on a site and of a type approved by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board sufficient to last during the continuance of the pilgrimage, for which purpose he shall forward plans and specifications for the approval of the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman, Sanitary Board, at least ten days before the pilgrimage commences. He shall further be responsible for the supply of coir dust, or sand, and disinfectants of a quality approved by the Assistant Government Agent, and for the proper conservancy and cleaning of the latrines at least twice a day during the continuance of the pilgrimage. In the event of the proprietor or lessee contravening any of the provisions of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person who shall during the pilgrimage use any other place for the offices of nature than that set apart for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Sanitary Board or the proprietor or lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the collection and removal of all straw, rubbish, cattle dung, or any kind of litter at least once every day during the continuance of the pilgrimage, and such rubbish and litter shall be burned or buried at a place approved by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board. Any proprietor or lessee failing to carry out or to cause to be carried out the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence. regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

8. No booth or other building for the purpose of the pilgrimage shall be erected at Dondra within a space of 12 feet from the side drain of the main road from Matara to Tangalla and of the approach road to the dewale, and no stall-holder, vendor, or betel-seller shall expose any article for sale within such space. Any person contravening this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

9. No booth or other building shall be erected at Dondra on such portion of the ground as may be reserved by the Assistant Covernment Agent, Matara, for the accommodation of visitors or vehicles. Any person contravening the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the spaces within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with

the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.
4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

(a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government

Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied

by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudically the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the

camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government, Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, tea and coffee boutiques, eating-houses or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach

on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose, by or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

"Improvements in Machines for Drying Tea Leaf or the like."

Abstract.—The inventors describe an arrangement of baffles designed to prevent the flow of drying medium past the ends of the conveyors in endless chain presure drying machines. These baffles operate in conjunction with the usual transverse baffles fixed to the cheek plates of the machine.

The baffles at the charging end are of the articulated type consisting of two hinged portions each and are attached to and move with the bearing slide blocks when the tension of the conveyor belts is being adjusted, but maintain frictional contact with the fixed baffles in so doing. At the driving end semicircular baffles operate in conjunction with swing or shaker baffles to seal off the ends of conveyors. The shaker baffles also serve to receive any leaf which may have adhered to the trays when passing over the sprockets. Provision is made for operating all the swing baffles simultaneously from the outside of the machine, so as to relieve them of the material.

The use of swing baffles and their mode of operation is disclaimed.

"Improvements in machines for drying tea leaf or the ıike.

Abstract.—The inventors state that a rotary valve for discharging tea from the base of a drying machine suffers from the disadvantage that it induces friction between the dried leaf and valve casing. A discharge valve is also known which comprises a single valve plate on which falls the dried material from the lowest conveyor and which is periodically operated by a cam so as to discharge the material therefrom; suitable springs or counterweights are used for closing the valve plate after each discharge of leaf. In such cases the escape of drying air when the valve is open cannot be prevented.

The present application refers to a discharge device which comprises a valve box and three hinged and counter-balanced valve plates. Of the latter two open into the valve box and deliver to it the material swept out from the base of the machine and the material dropped from the lowest conveyor respectively. The third valve plate discharges the contents of the valve box to the outside. The valve plates are operated periodically in correct sequence by means of the cam mounted on the drive shaft of the lowest conveyor. No two valves are open at the same time and there is thus no loss of drying air.

"Improvements in Machines for Drying Tea Leaf or the

Abstract.—The invention relates to improvements in the means adapted for clearing the floor of a tea drying machine of material which has fallen on to it from the conveyor bands above. It is customary to provide the base of the machine with a conveyor belt with projecting blades which move over the floor and sweep the material to the discharge

The improvement consists in providing curved guides at one end of the conveyor belt so that the blades are tilted and in the subsequent motion over the floor the free end of the blades precede their pivotal axes. The inventors of the blades precede their pivotal axes. The inventors state that scraping or abrasive action on the fine material is avoided by the use of their invention.
