RULE.

The rules relating to the grant of pensions and gratuities to officers and servants of the Kandy Municipality, published in *Gazette* No. 6,499 of April 19, 1912, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,309 of August 13, 1937, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) by the substitution for rule 2A (1) thereof, of the following new rule:—

“ 2A. (1) An officer appointed prior to December 1, 1933, to a post declared to be pensionable by a resolution of the Council passed on or before the above-mentioned date, or to a post service in which may render him eligible for a long service allowance under rule 21, and to whom a pension or annuity is granted under these rules, may at his option exercisable as hereinafter provided, be paid in lieu of such pension or annuity a pension or annuity at the rate of three-fourths of such pension or annuity together with a gratuity equal to ten times the annual value of the reduction so made in such pension or annuity.

Provided that no person appointed before the above-mentioned date to a post service in which may render him eligible for a long service allowance under rule 21 shall, if appointed after the above-mentioned date to a post declared to be pensionable by resolution of Council, be eligible to exercise the option referred to above in respect of any pension that may be awarded to him under rule 2 ”; and

(2) by the addition, immediately after rule 23 thereof, of the following new rule:—

“ 23A. No Municipal officer or servant or any dependant of a Municipal officer or servant shall be entitled to an allowance, award, pension or gratuity under the foregoing rules 22 and 23 if his claim to compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934, is admitted by the Council ”.

BY-LAWS.

1. For the purpose of establishing, working, and maintaining the Council's Electrical Distribution System, the Chairman or any contractor or other agent duly authorized in writing by the Chairman, may enter upon any land and cut down any tree or branch which may in anyway injure or which is likely to injure, impede, or interfere with any post, standard, wire, or main of such system.

2. In the exercise of the powers conferred by by-law 1, the Chairman or contractor or other agent shall do as little damage as possible, and when, in respect of any property, the said powers have been exercised, the Chairman shall pay reasonable compensation to all persons interested for any damage sustained by them by reason of the exercise of the said powers, provided that every such person shall make application for such compensation to the Chairman within three months after the damage was sustained.

BY-LAW.

The by-laws published by Notification in *Gazette* No. 7,613 of November 4, 1927, as amended by Notification in *Gazette* No. 8,133 of July 12, 1935, are hereby further amended by the substitution, for the by-laws relating to hairdressing saloons or barbers' shops, of the following new by-laws:—

HAIRDRESSING SALOONS OR BARBERS' SHOPS.

I.—Conditions of Issue of Licence.

No person shall be entitled to obtain a licence to keep a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop unless the building or part of the building to be used for the purpose, and the equipment of the saloon or shop, are in conformity with the following conditions and requirements:—

1. The building or part of the building—

- (a) must be substantially constructed, and must have a floor space of not less than 120 square feet: provided that the requirements of this paragraph shall not apply to any building in which a saloon or shop is carried on or kept at the date of the publication of this by-law in the *Gazette*; and
- (b) must have its walls lime-plastered and lime-washed, its roof provided with a wooden or other similar ceiling painted white, its floor cemented, and the junction of the floor with the walls rounded off with cement; and
- (c) must be well lighted and well ventilated; and
- (d) must be provided with satisfactory drains, and with satisfactory latrine accommodation either within the building or on the premises.

2. If any part of the building is used or is intended to be used for residential purposes, that part must be in conformity with the requirements of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.

3. The saloon or shop must be provided with—

- (a) a sufficient supply of water at all times during which the saloon or shop is open to customers;
- (b) means for securing an adequate supply either of boiling water or of disinfectants, for the purpose of washing or sterilizing the instruments or appliances in daily use;

- (c) facilities for the hairdressers or barbers to wash their hands during the course of their work ;
- (d) a sufficient number of receptacles for the disinfectants to be used for sterilizing instruments or appliances ;
- (e) a sufficient supply of towels and overalls for the use of the customers ;
- (f) a sufficient number of spittoons, kept by the side of the seats in such manner as to be readily available to customers and employees ; and
- (g) a covered and movable dust-bin made of galvanized iron or other impervious material, for the reception of hair-clippings and refuse.

II.—Regulations for Licensed Hairdressing Saloons or Barbers' Shops.

1. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall—

- (a) keep affixed, in a conspicuous position outside the saloon or shop, a board bearing the words "Licensed Hairdressing Saloon" or "Licensed Barber's Shop", as the case may be ; and
- (b) keep affixed, in a conspicuous position within the saloon or shop, a framed copy of these regulations in each of the languages, English, Sinhalese, and Tamil.

2. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall—

- (a) cause the walls of such saloon or shop to be lime-washed and the ceiling painted at least once in six months ; and

3. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall cause every hairdresser or barber employed by him in such saloon or shop—

- (a) to keep his person and his wearing apparel clean ;
- (b) to keep his finger-nails short and free from dirt ; and
- (c) to wash his hands with soap and water immediately before attending to each customer.

4. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall—

- (a) cause every spittoon in such saloon or shop to be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition ;
- (b) cause every hair-brush or comb used in such saloon or shop to be washed or cleaned, and sterilized or disinfected, every day, and to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times ;
- (c) cause every shaving mug or cup, shaving brush, clipper, razor, or other cutting instrument, used in such saloon or shop to be well rinsed and cleaned in hot water after each occasion on which it is used ; and
- (d) cause all hair-clippings and other refuse to be collected after each customer has been attended to, and to be deposited in the dust-bin provided for the purpose.

5. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not use, or permit any hairdresser or barber employed by him in such saloon or shop to use, on any customer—

- (a) any styptic pencil, powder-puff or sponge ; or
- (b) any alum or other material for the purpose of stopping any bleeding, unless such alum or other material is in powder or liquid form.

6. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not supply, for the use of any customer, any towel which is not fresh from the wash or any overall which is not clean.

7. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not—

- (a) knowingly permit any person who is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease of any kind, or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from any such disease, to enter the saloon or shop for any purpose ; or
- (b) employ any person referred to in paragraph (a) in any capacity in such saloon or shop ; or
- (c) knowingly permit any hairdresser or barber employed by him to attend in the saloon or shop on any person referred to in paragraph (a) ; or
- (d) permit any such hairdresser or barber who, by error or accident, attends on any person referred to in paragraph (a), to attend on any other customer unless that hairdresser or barber washes and cleans his hands before attending on such other customer ; or
- (e) permit any instrument that has been used on any person referred to in paragraph (a) to be used on any other person until it is sterilized.

8. No person shall expectorate within any hairdressing saloon or barber's shop, except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

9. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not use or permit any other person to use the licensed premises—

- (a) as a place for taking meals at any time ; or
- (b) as a place for sleeping, except at night when such premises are not open to customers.

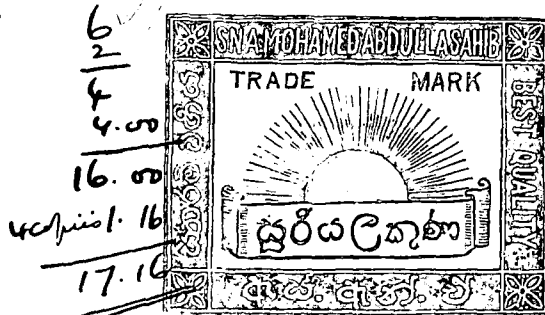

Gerrard Industries Limited.

"Improvements in and relating to wire-tying apparatus for baling, packing and the like."

Abstract.—The inventors describe a wire tying machine the principal feature of which is that the twisting operation is performed by two intergearing levers moving in opposite directions: in such machines the effort of both arms of

the operator is effectively utilized, and there is no tendency for the machine to be displaced as a whole as may happen in a machine with a single lever.

The two intergearing levers operate a rock shaft which is keyed in a unidirectional manner to a clutch wheel. In the operative movement of the levers the clutch wheel moves the twisting pinion through the medium of an intermediate wheel. During the inoperative movement of the levers the clutch wheel is locked against backward rotation. Matters are arranged so that the twisting pinion is rotated through a whole number of revolutions plus a small overtwist (to allow for the inherent springiness of the wire). In the return movement, the twisting pinion rotates back by just the amount of the overdrive, so that the twisted wire can be withdrawn from the slot.

Suitable devices are described for tensioning the wire preparatory to twisting, and for severing the ends of the wire at the end of the operative stroke.

"Semperit" Oesterreichisch-Amerikanische Gummiwerke A. G.

"An improved process and apparatus for purifying, separating and concentrating colloidal dispersions."

Abstract.—The invention relates to a process for separating and concentrating or splitting up colloidal dispersions, and is based on the discovery that in an electric field a layerwise separation can be brought about of substances which are specifically heavier with respect to the starting dispersions from specifically lighter substances. The method is particularly useful in the treatment of rubber latex.

According to the invention, an electrolytic cell is used in which the electrodes are closed off with respect to the colloid by means of two diaphragms which are permeable to the current but impermeable to the colloid. On passing a current the separation takes place, the heavier substances sinking to the bottom and the lighter ones rising to the top from which they are led off by suitable devices. By subdividing the cell by more diaphragms or by a single diaphragm which is guided in convolutions in the cell (in such a manner that the field lines intersect the diaphragm surface as many times as possible) an increase in the velocity of layering can be brought about. The various subdivisions are in communication with each other and have common inlet and outlets. Considerable economy can be effected in current consumption if electrolytes are removed as far as possible from the dispersion for example by dialysis before it is subjected to the electric field.

"Improvements in or relating to medical injections."

Abstract.—The inventor states that in the treatment of chronic ailments like diabetes, the number of injections per day can be conveniently cut down if substances are added to the drugs which prolong the action of the same. It is known that the addition of substances which increase the viscosity of the solution, e.g., protamines from salmon sperm have such prolonging effect.

According to the invention pectin is added to preparations for injection, for instance those containing insulin or pituitrine. Preferably the hydrogen ion concentration is adjusted to weakly acid reaction by the addition of sodium carbonate. The albumen-free pectin does not form any undesirable precipitates, and therefore the solutions can be kept for a long time and are always ready for use. By preparing insulin injections in this manner it has been found that with the same dosage the injections can be cut down from three to two a day.
